VANDERBILT QUICK HITS

- Last time out, the No. 12 Commodores tied with No. 9 South Carolina, 0-0, that was a defensive battle and ended after two overtimes
- It was the first time the Dores had been held scoreless since the first game of the season against Florida State, and the Dores were also the first team to shutout South Carolina this season. Lauren Demarchi posted three saves and earned her third shutout of the year. Her performance in that game earned her SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- The Commodores were on a 13-game winning streak, the longest streak in program history after passing the 11-game winning streak set in 2005. Now they are on a 14-game unbeated streak, which is also the longest streak in program
- In the team's unbeated streak, they have outscored their opponents, 34-7.
- The Commodores are currently first in the SEC with a 6-0-1 record and 19 points.
- Paola Ellis scored the game-winning goal in the 88th minute against Florida and it earned her SEC Player of the Week honors for the first time. The Dores defeated Florida, 2-1, for the first time since 1997.
- At one point during the winning streak, the Commodores posted four straight shutouts, with eight total this season .
- Haley Hopkins is fresh off a medical redshirt and she has excelled so far this season. In the team's unbeaten streak, she has scored a team-high 11 goals and assisted on four different occasions, which ties for second on the team. She has four multi-goal games, which is the most on the team. She is also tied for 6th nationally in game-winning goals with four.
- Hopkins was the SEC Freshman of the Week after her two-goal performance against Georgia. She also received SEC Offensive Player of the Week after the wins over No. 25 Mississippi State and No. 9 Tennessee.
- Madison Elwell has been doing her part to help the Dores excel in their winning streak. She has posted four asissts and four goals, which is third on the team
- Kaylann Boyd has had a hot start to the season. After her opening goal against Georgia, she now has seven, which is good for second on the team right behind Hopkins.

 Hopkins is currently 2nd in the SEC with 11 goals. She is 3rd in points (26). Boyd is tied for 6th in goals (7). During
- SEC play, Hopkins is first in goals and points with 6 and 13.
- Leila Azari is tied for 9th in the SEC with five assists
- Hopkins is also tied for 3rd in the SEC with four game-winning goals
- Lauren Demarchi is one of the top goalies in the SEC. She is 1st in save percentage (.914) and is 1st in goals against average (0.29). In the NCAA stars, she is 6th in goals against average and 9th in save percentage
- This will be the 21st meeting between the two schools with the last meeting coming in 2017 with a 2-1 Vanderbilt
- Vanderbilt was picked to finish ninth in the SEC in the preseason poll by the league's 14 head coaches
- Lauren Demarchi posted a career-high five saves in the team's lone loss to Florida State.
- The Dores are unbeaten at home in 11 straight games, dating back to last season.
- The Commodores find themselves in the rankings for the fourth straight week at 12 in the United Soccer Coaches Poll. It's the highest the team has been ranked since the 1998 team was ranked 8th.

Tallahassee, Fla. - Vanderbilt soccer fell in its season-opening match to No. 10 Florida State, 1-0, on Thursday at the Seminole Soccer Complex.

The Seminoles outshot the Commodores, 12-2, with six shots on goal. The Commodores registered two shots on goal with both coming in the second half.

"I'm extremely proud of the fight and tenacity of our defending tonight against a very, very good and very patient Florida State team," head coach Darren Ambrose said. "We knew they would have the ball more than we did, and we did a pretty good job of handling that.

"We did a good job of settling the nerves against arguably one of the best teams the country," Ambrose said. "However, the result was disappointing. After working so hard, we fell asleep at a key moment in the game on their free kick and gave up a set piece goal."

The Commodores proved why they could have one of the top defenses in the SEC, allowing just one goal in the 56th minute from FSU's Natalia Kuikka

The Dores used two goalkeepers in the game. Lauren Demarchi got the start for the Commodores, and she registered five saves in the first half. Taiana Tolleson played the

"Both of our keepers have had great preseasons and it's tough to separate them right now," Ambrose said. "Lauren did make a couple of impressive saves tonight to keep us in the game."

Freshman Peyton Cutshall's header was saved in the 78th minute, and the other best chance for the Commodores came from a Kaylann Boyd shot in the 85th minute that hit

"In the last seven minutes we did a good job of generating some set pieces in their half, and one almost paid off," Ambrose said. "The disappointing piece is that while we fought and defended well, we gave up a goal off a set piece and at the other end didn't quite have the bounce in one of our own set pieces, and that was the margin of victory on the scoresheet. It's a great learning opportunity for our kids."

Up next, the Commodores take on Jacksonville on Sunday at noon CT. That game will stream live on ESPN+.

IACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Vanderbilt defeated Jacksonville, 3-0, to wrap up its Florida road trip on Sunday at Southern Oak Stadium and earn its first victory of the 2018 season.

The Commodores (1-1) came out aggressive from the start and outshot Jacksonville, 19-1, over 90 minutes of play. Nine of those shots registered on goal, while the Dolphins (0-2) managed just a single shot on goal against VU's defense.

The Dores dominated possession throughout the game and kicked the scoring off on a set piece in the 18th minute. Olivia Simmons got the play started with a throw-in all the way to box, which Haley Hopkins flicked on to Madison Elwell. Elwell finished the play off with a shot into the lower left-hand side of the goal. While the rest of the half remained scoreless, the Dores held possession for the majority of the time.

Vanderbilt put its foot on the gas in the second half and got its second goal of the game when Leila Azari set up Simmons with a cross to the right side of the box. Simmons turned and fired it right past Jacksonville's goalie at the near post in the 67th minute.

Azari threatened for the entire game down the right-hand side of field. It was another great service from Azari after Carline Saltmarsh fed a clever ball behind the Dolphins' back line. Azari's first-time cross found Kaylann Boyd at the far post, where she tapped it in for a

Azari finished with two assists, while Boyd, Elwell and Simmons all earned their first goals of

Vanderbilt's defense proved to be stifling in allowing just a single Jacksonville shot for the

Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal and after recording a career-high five saves against Florida State, she only had to make one save against Jacksonville. Taiana Tolleson entered the game for Demarchi in the 72nd minute to record a little action.

Vanderbilt won't return to game action until the program's home opener later this week. Miami (Fla.) comes to visit Nashville in the Music City Invitational on Aug. 24, and the game is slated to kickoff at 7:30 p.m. CT.

"This win has meaning," Ambrose said. "Tonight, they gained a little bit of confidence and realization when they really decide to compete and play soccer, they're a dangerous team

The Dores (2-1) took the lead for good on a game-winning header from Hayley Hopkins in the 88th minute. Olivia Simmons set Hopkins up after dribbling down the right side of the field and putting up a cross to Hopkins waiting in the box. Hopkins received the cross and delivered a strike into the middle of the goal for her first goal of the year.

Hopkins continued to get good looks throughout the game. She led the Dores with four shots and always seemed to be leading the offensive charge throughout the game.

"It felt really good to get that game-winner," Hopkins said. "Our team has really embodied the word fight, and I don't think it got any better than that. We can come back and really push to the end in a

"I was pleased with the way we came out," head coach Darren Ambrose said. "I thought we possessed the ball really well and created a few chances. I thought we did really well."

The game was delayed due to lightning in the area, but that didn't slow the Dores (3-1) down at all. The odores struck first in the fourth minute when Haley Hopkins weaved through the defense and led Madison Elwell with a through ball on the left-hand side of the goalie box. Elwell struck a one-timer past the outstretched goalkeeper into the lower right-hand side of the goal for her second goal of the season.

Vanderbilt struck again in the 64th minute of the second half with Leila Azari earning her third assist of the season. Azari received a pass from Elwell and drove up the right side of the field. She turned and at the corner of the box, launched a pass into the middle of the box right to Kaylann Boyd. Boyd raised her leg and deflected it into the lower left side of the net for her second goal this season.

Ohio (1-2-1) would later add a goal in the 81st minute off a header from Alivia Milesky.

The Dores maintained possession for most of the game and outshot Ohio, 18-4, with nine of those shots

Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal for the Dores, and she only had to make one save in the first half to move to 2-0 on the season. Taiana Tolleson came in for her in the second half and recorded one save.

Vanderbilt finished the tournament with a perfect 2-0 mark. Miami finished second with a 1-1 record. Ohio took third place with an 0-1-1 record, and Lipscomb was fourth with the same record. Ohio managed one more goal than Lipscomb to finish third.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt defeated St. Louis, 2-0, on Friday at Vanderbilt Soccer Complex to extend its winning streak to four games.

"Friday night games are always against good teams," head coach Darren Ambrose said. "We made adjustments through the game. It was gutsy. We toughed it out. As the game went on we became more physical and started to think a step ahead, too."

The victory was the second shutout of the season for the Dores (4-1) and also their fourth straight multi-goal game.

The scoring began in the 23rd minute with Haley Hopkins turning defense to offense and generating a breakaway for herself. She stole the ball from a Billiken defender at midfield and dribbled it the length of the field. From just inside the box, she launched a strike right through the goalie's legs for her second goal of the season.

Hopkins has registered a goal or assist in four straight games.

"They pushed us really hard in the first 15 minutes," Hopkins said. "We didn't get a lot of chances. I think that goal came from a sudden burst of really good defense from the team

Kaylann Boyd scored for the second straight game to give her a team-high three goals on the year. In the 50thminute, Caroline Saltmarsh sent a cross deep in the box where Boyd intercepted it before the goalie could get her hands on it. After that, Boyd kicked it past a Billiken defender to make it 2-0.

The Commodores once again employed their two-goalie system. Lauren Demarchi recorded the start and the win, playing the first half and registering three saves. Taiana Tolleson came in at the start of the second half and registered one save on the evening.

Vanderbilt did a good job of limiting St. Louis's scoring chances, but its closest opportunity came in the 70thminute when a Billiken defender took a shot that deflected off Tolleson. Freshman Ella Shamburger hustled into the box, chased down the ball and kicked it away before it could land in the net.

Up next, the Commodores look to keep their win streak alive when North Alabama travels to Vanderbilt Soccer Complex at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday.

The Dores didn't wait around too long before striking in goal again in the 12th minute. This time it was Nia Dorsey driving down the left side of the field, weaving between UNA defenders. From the left side of the box she delivered a strike to Grace Jackson in the middle of the box, who proceeded to kick it right past the goalie for her first goal of the season.

Neither team scored again for 64 minutes until Elwell beat a handful of Lions defenders down the left side of the field. She turned into the box and attempted to set up a teammate with a cross before being

That set up a penalty kick, where Kaylann Boyd took the shot and delivered a strike in the left-hand side of the net for her fourth goal of the season

Another penalty kick was set up in the 88th minute and again Elwell contributed on the play. Madi Allen streaked up the right sideline, made her way into the box and delivered a cross right to Elwell, who took a shot that was handballed by a Lion defender.

Hopkins took the ensuing penalty kick and scored her second goal of the day with a shot into the righthand side of the goal. Boyd and Hopkins now lead Vanderbilt with four goals apiece on the season.

Vanderbilt's defense proved to be tough once again, pitching its second straight shutout. That defense limited UNA to just three shots all game, with none registering on goal. In the last couple of games, Elwell has provided a spark on offense for the Dores. In her last game against North Alabama, she had one assist and also drew two penalty kicks.

With the win, Vanderbilt (8-1, 1-0) clinched its eighth straight victory, the program's longest winning streak since 2005, when the Dores won 11 in a row

"We came here to challenge them. We've got one game against Florida," head coach Darren Ambrose said. "It's a tremendous moment for this team and our program. It's a good win on the road against them and it showed a lot of character to respond. I'm just really proud to be a part of this team."

After Vanderbilt took an early 1-0 lead on Sunday, Florida (2-6-1, 0-1) evened the score up in the 78th minute. The Dores responded with late-game heroics courtesy of Paola Ellis, who recorded her first goal of the season at the perfect time. Lauren Demarchi started in goal for the Dores and recorded three saves in the first half. Taiana Tolleson checked in for her at the start of the second half and posted one save to earn the win and move to 2-1 this season.

Florida outshot the Dores, 12-6, but Vanderbilt was more accurate in its shooting. The Commodores posted just three shots on goal with two finding the back of the net.

A physical matchup between SEC foes featured three yellow cards and 20 fouls. Kaylann Boyd and Madiya Harriot recorded their first yellow cards of the season.

Up next, the Commodores continue to extend their winning streak when Alabama visits Nashville on Thursday, Sept. 20, at 7:00 p.m. CT on the SEC Network.

The Commodores' nine wins in a row marks the longest such streak in program history since the 2005 team captured 11 straight victories.

"A win in this league, I don't care how it comes about," head coach Darren Ambrose said. "It's about winning. This group is special. There's something about them. They don't know when to quit. They're never beaten.

Vanderbilt's initial goal came late in the first half after Simmons stole the ball from an Alabama defender and delivered a strike just outside the box for her third goal of the

Alabama responded quickly to Vanderbilt's first two goals. The Crimson Tide netted their first goal early in the second half and then scored 30 seconds after Hopkins' first goal of

Once again, Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal for the Dores recorded a perfect first half, making two saves. Taiana Tolleson had a very busy second half. She claimed five saves and ended up getting the win to move to 3-1 on the season.

The Dores will go on the road this Sunday in search of their 10th straight victory when they face Missouri. The game, which starts at 1 p.m. CT, can be viewed on SEC Network+.

Vanderbilt (10-1, 3-0) sits first in the SEC standings with nine points, and its 10-game winning streak is the longest in program history since the 2005 team won 11 in a row. The Commod (4-4-2, 1-1-1) four-game winning streak.

"At halftime we felt we could win the game and there was no doubt in our mind that if we could just eliminate one-two small mistakes, we'll make that happen," head coach Darren Ambrose said.
