VANDERBILT QUICK HITS

- Last time out, the No. 12 Commodores tied with No. 9 South Carolina, 0-0, that was a defensive battle and ended after two overtimes
- It was the first time the Dores had been held scoreless since the first game of the season against Florida State, and the Dores were also the first team to shutout South Carolina this season. Lauren Demarchi posted three saves and earned her third shutout of the year. Her performance in that game earned her SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- The Commodores were on a 13-game winning streak, the longest streak in program history after passing the 11-game winning streak set in 2005. Now they are on a 14-game unbeaten streak, which is also the longest streak in program history.
- In the team's unbeaten streak, they have outscored their opponents, 34-7.
- The Commodores are currently first in the SEC with a 6-0-1 record and 19 points.
- Paola Ellis scored the game-winning goal in the 88th minute against Florida and it earned her SEC Player of the Week honors for the first time. The Dores defeated Florida, 2-1, for the first time since 1997.
- At one point during the winning streak, the Commodores posted four straight shutouts, with eight total this season.
- Haley Hopkins is fresh off a medical redshirt and she has excelled so far this season. In the team's unbeaten streak, she has scored a team-high 11 goals and assisted on four different occasions, which ties for second on the team. She has four multi-goal games, which is the most on the team. She is also tied for 6th nationally in game-winning goals with four.
- Hopkins was the SEC Freshman of the Week after her two-goal performance against Georgia. She also received SEC Offensive Player of the Week after the wins over No. 25 Mississippi State and No. 9 Tennessee.
- Madison Elwell has been doing her part to help the Dores excel in their winning streak. She has posted four assists and four goals, which is third on the team
- Kaylann Boyd has had a hot start to the season. After her opening goal against Georgia, she now has seven, which is good for second on the team right behind Hopkins.
- Hopkins is currently 2nd in the SEC with 11 goals. She is 3rd in points (26). Boyd is tied for 6th in goals (7). During SEC play, Hopkins is first in goals and points with 6 and 13.
- Leila Azari is tied for 9th in the SEC with five assists
- Hopkins is also tied for 3rd in the SEC with four game-winning goals
- Lauren Demarchi is one of the top goalies in the SEC. She is 1st in save percentage (.914) and is 1st in goals against average (0.29). In the NCAA stats, she is 6th in goals against average and 9th in save percentage
- This will be the 21st meeting between the two schools with the last meeting coming in 2017 with a 2-1 Vanderbilt victory
- Vanderbilt was picked to finish ninth in the SEC in the preseason poll by the league's 14 head coaches
- Lauren Demarchi posted a career-high five saves in the team's lone loss to Florida State.
- The Dores are unbeaten at home in 11 straight games, dating back to last season.
- The Commodores find themselves in the rankings for the fourth straight week at 12 in the United Soccer Coaches Poll. It's the highest the team has been ranked since the 1998 team was ranked 8th.

NASHVILLE – Vanderbilt extended its winning streak to nine games with a thrilling 3-2 victory over Alabama on Thursday at the Vanderbilt Soccer Complex.

The Commodores' nine wins in a row marks the longest such streak in program history since the 2005 team captured 11 straight victories.

"A win in this league, I don't care how it comes about," head coach Darren Ambrose said. "It's about winning. This group is special. There's something about them. They don't know when to quit. They're never beaten."

The Doers (9-1, 2-0) and Crimson Tide (6-4-1, 0-2) enjoyed a back and forth game until Haley Hopkins put it away late for Vanderbilt. In the 84th minute, Leila Azari streaked up the right sideline and delivered a cross to Hopkins, who beat a defender to send in what became the game-winning goal. Azari now has a team-high five assists and Hopkins has four game-winning goals.

Hopkins scored two goals on Thursday, giving her a team-high seven on the season. Her first goal of the game came in 71st minute on a breakaway goal as she beat the goalie on a loose ball to kick it into the wide-open net.

"It took us awhile to get into our game," Hopkins said. "We stuck it to them. They kept us on our heels for a little bit. But Olivia Simmons really opened up the game with her first goal, and I think that really created the momentum for us."

Vanderbilt's initial goal came late in the first half after Simmons stole the ball from an Alabama defender and delivered a strike just outside the box for her third goal of the season.

Alabama responded quickly to Vanderbilt's first two goals. The Crimson Tide netted their first goal early in the second half and then scored 30 seconds after Hopkins' first goal of the game.

Once again, Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal for the Doers recorded a perfect first half, making two saves. Taiana Tolleson had a very busy second half. She claimed five saves and ended up getting the win to move to 3-1 on the season.

The Doers will go on the road this Sunday in search of their 10th straight victory when they face Missouri. The game, which starts at 1 p.m. CT, can be viewed on SEC Network+.

COLUMBIA, Mo. – The Commodores came from behind to extend their winning streak to 10 games in defeating Missouri, 2-1, on Sunday at Audrey J. Walton Soccer Stadium.

Vanderbilt (10-1, 3-0) sits first in the SEC standings with nine points, and its 10-game winning streak is the longest in program history since the 2005 team won 11 in a row. The Commodores ended Missouri's (4-4-2, 1-1-1) four-game winning streak.

"At halftime we felt we could win the game and there was no doubt in our mind that if we could just eliminate one-two small mistakes, we'll make that happen," head coach Darren Ambrose said. Give the credit to our kids. They battle and they believe but they fight really hard. It's not luck. It's belief and hard work and a commitment to each other that's making a difference for this team."

With the game all tied up at 1-1, Madison Elwell streaked up the left sideline and delivered a cross in the front of the box. Haley Hopkins had a beat on the ball as a Missouri defender tried to deflect the ball out of play, but Mizzou's player wound up scoring an own goal to give the Doers a 2-1 lead in the 83rd minute.

The Doers were not fazed by an early deficit. They held a 10-1 corner kick advantage, and one of those corners led to the equalizing goal in the game. Elwell took the corner kick in the 60th minute and delivered a perfect cross to Olivia Simmons who headed it toward the goal. Bethany Coons from Missouri raised her hand to block the shot, earning a red card.

On the ensuing penalty kick, Kaylann Boyd stepped up and notched her sixth goal of the season with a shot into the lower left-hand section of the goal.

"I think as a team we played really well not giving up," Elwell said. "Although we didn't start and keep the same urgency that we've had in the last games, we didn't let that get to us. Coming out in the second half we were able to reinstall that and play the way we planned to."

Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal for the Doers, recording two saves in 90 minutes of work. Her lone miscue came after a shot hit the crossbar and found its way to a Tiger who headed it into the back of the net.

The two teams were even in shots and fouls with 12 apiece, but the Doers held a 5-3 shots on goal advantage. It remained a physical play with numerous cards being handed out, all of which came in the second half.

Ella Shamburger and Hopkins received yellow cards for the Doers while Madison Lewis, Cassidy Nurnberger and the Tigers' bench received yellow cards.

The Commodores are back home next Sunday when they face Georgia (4-3-3, 1-0-1) at 4:00 p.m. CT on

NASHVILLE – The No. 19 Commodores made history on Thursday in defeating No. 25 Mississippi State, 1-0, to extend their winning streak to 12 games. The 12 consecutive wins sets a new Vanderbilt program record.

Vanderbilt moved to 12-1 overall and 5-0 in conference play to stay in first place in the standings. That start is the Dores' best in conference play since the 2005 team also started 5-0.

The Dores outshot the Bulldogs (8-3-1, 1-2-1) with a mark of 15-7, but the game remained scoreless until the 76th minute. Nia Dorsey flew up the right sideline and tried to send a cross into the box, but it was deflected and came right back to her. She recovered the rebound, sent another cross and, after glancing off a Bulldog defender, bounced it right to Raegan Kelley.

The freshman Kelley proceeded to head the ball into the far left side of the goal. Kelley's first-career goal proved to be the difference-maker in the game, and the Dores held on the rest of the way.

The Commodores' defense was once again strong in the contest, only allowing one shot on goal. The shutout marked the seventh time this season the Dores have shut out their opponent, and their second straight.

Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal and saw little action aside for a single save early in the second half. She moved to 9-0 this season, recording her second straight shutout.

Vanderbilt notched it's 10th straight win at home dating back to last season.

Up next, the Dores travel to Knoxville to take on No. 9 Tennessee for their second straight ranked matchup of the season.the SEC Network.

KNOXVILLE, Tn. – No. 19 Vanderbilt knocked off No. 9 Tennessee, 3-1, on Sunday at Regal Soccer Stadium to maintain its perfect conference record atop the SEC standings.

Vanderbilt improved to 13-1 overall, and 6-0 in conference play after winning a program-record 13th straight game. The Commodores have now beaten the Volunteers four times in a row and have secured back-to-back wins against ranked opponents for the first time this season.

The Dores jumped out to an early lead in the ninth minute thanks to the foot of Haley Hopkins. Hopkins received a pass from Grace Jackson, beat a Volunteer defender and fired a shot that ricocheted into the goal for her 10th goal this season.

Vanderbilt's defense stayed solid until it surrendered a goal in the 69th minute. But the Dores bounced back quickly and managed to take the lead minutes later.

In the 75th minute, Nia Dorsey broke away on the right sideline and delivered a cross into the box where Peyton Cutshall outjumped a Volunteer defender to head the ball into the net. It was the second straight game that features an assist for Dorsey and the first-career goal for Cutshall.

The Commodores stayed on the attack and added another goal 30 seconds later. Hopkins delivered a pass to Olivia Simmons who fired a shot on goal. The ball deflected off the goalie before Hopkins gathered the rebound and fired a shot into the open net for her 11th goal this season.

"We were able to come back and fight until the end," Hopkins said. "Our defense's soccer IQ is so high, and I know I trust them to get the ball up there. I owe it to them to try my hardest and run super hard."

It was the fourth multi-goal game this season for Hopkins, who was recently crowned SEC Freshman of the Week.

Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal for the Dores, and the junior moved to 9-0 the season after collecting the win.

Up next, the Dores come home to face No. 12 South Carolina on Friday at 7:00 p.m.

NASHVILLE – The No. 12 Commodores tied with No. 9 South Carolina, 0-0, in double overtime on Friday night at the Vanderbilt Soccer Complex. Vanderbilt also set the program's attendance record with 1,177 fans at the game.

Vanderbilt (13-1-1, 6-0-1) maintained its undefeated record in conference play in the defensive battle. The Dores kept their lead in first place in the SEC after earning a point tonight. Texas A&M and South Carolina are right behind them with 16 points.

Lauren Demarchi got the start in goal for the Dores and continued her hot play. She recorded three saves and negated a several scoring chances for the Gamecocks early in the first half.

"I'm honestly proud of how we came out today because we didn't start the game off strong," Demarchi said. "They had the better of us in the first half. We really turned it around and I thought we were the better team in the second half."

South Carolina (11-2-1, 5-1-1) came out the aggressor in the first half, fielding three excellent scoring chances right from the start. However, Demarchi stayed strong in goal. After those first few chances, the Dores settled down and ended up outshooting the Gamecocks, 12-11, and holding a 5-3 edge in shots on goal.

The Dores went into overtime, and they saw a lot of good scoring chances thwarted by South Carolina's goalkeeper. Raegan Kelley, who scored the game-winner last week against Mississippi State, had two shots on goal that were stopped on exceptional saves.

"South Carolina is a very good team," Vanderbilt head coach Darren Ambrose said. "We hung on in the first half, and in the second half I was proud. We created as many good chances as they did. They had one good chance in the second half and we had three. Credit to their goalkeeper, she made two or three saves that kept them in it."

The Commodores became the first team this season to shutout South Carolina. The Dores extended their unbeaten streak to 14 games after tonight's draw.

"The environment here was nothing like I've experienced," Demarchi said. "It was amazing to have so many fans, and to have the band here. It was so cool, and I hope we can keep growing that attendance."

Up next, the Dores hit the road to face Auburn on Oct. 18 at 6:30 p.m. The game can be viewed on SEC Network+.
