
Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- · Auburn is 38-9 all-time in season openers and 26-3 when opening the season at home
- Auburn has won 39 straight home openers, dating back to 1977-78
- Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 6-1 in season-openers at Auburn and 10-4 in her career
- Auburn is in its 48th season of women's basketball and has 914 program wins
- This is the third meeting between Auburn and Grambling State; Auburn leads the series 2-0
- Auburn won the last meeting between the teams 92-42 in Auburn on Nov. 17, 2014
- The last meeting between the teams resulted in the highest point total (92) and largest margin of victory (50) for Auburn in the Terri Williams-Flournoy era
- Auburn is 38-2 all-time against current members of the SWAC, 28-0 at home
- This is Auburn's first game on Nov. 6 and also marks the earliest start to a season by three days
- Auburn is 135-39 all-time in the month of November; Coach Flo is 27-12 in November at Auburn
- · The Tigers' first two games of the season come against 2018 conference champions from Louisiana Grambling State (2018 SWAC Champion) and Nicholls State (2018 Southland Champion)
- After Friday, Auburn will have played 9 of the 12 Division I schools from Louisiana in the last three seasons LSU, Tulane, Louisiana Tech, Grambling, ULM, ULL, Nicholls, Southern, Southeastern Louisiana - along with NAIA opponent Xavier (La.)
- Auburn returns four starters and six letterwinners from the 2017-18 squad that finished 14-15 overall (5-11 SEC)
- Auburn finished the 2017-18 season ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals/game (13.2) and No. 3 in turnovers forced
- · Auburn is 67-29 in non-conference games under Terri Williams-Flournoy
- Senior guard Janiah McKay and sophomore forward Unique Thompson were named Preseason All-SEC (2nd team)
- McKay is Auburn's leading returner in scoring (16.6 ppg), assists (4.4/game) and minutes played (32.3/game)
- McKay was top-10 in the SEC in free-throw percentage last season at 82.8% (130-157)
- · Thompson averaged 11.5 ppg last year and recorded 7 double-doubles, tying DeWanna Bonner for the Auburn freshman record; she was named to the All-SEC Freshman Team
- Junior guard Daisa Alexander averaged 14.2 ppg last season and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game; she was named to the SEC All-Defensive Team
- · Auburn's 2018-19 freshman class was ranked the No. 13 signing class in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz
- · Coach Terri Williams-Flournoy begins her seventh season at Auburn, her 15th as a head coach, and her 27th overall in
- In SEC preseason polls, Auburn was picked to finish 8th by both the media and the league's coaches

2018-19 AUBURN WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

OPENING TIP

- Auburn opens its 48th season of women's basketball on Tuesday, Nov. 6, as the Tigers host Grambling State at Auburn Arena.
- >> Auburn finished the 2017-18 season at 14-15 overall (5-11 SEC).
- Grambling State finished with a 19-14 overall record (13-5 SWAC) in 2017-18 and was the SWAC Tournament Champion, advancing to the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

LAST TIME OUT

- » For the second time in 2018, Auburn gave Tennessee all it could handle for 40 minutes. But a banked-in 3-pointer with less than a second to play gave the 12th-ranked Lady Vols a 64-61 win Thursday night in the second round of the SEC Tournament.
- Auburn (14-15) saw its 2017-18 season come to an end after a game that saw 14 ties, 15 lead changes, a 24-point night from Janiah McKay and a pair of tiebreaking buzzer-beaters.
- McKay's 24 points led all scorers on a night when the Tigers shot 41.9 percent from the field and forced Tennessee (24-6) into 24 turnovers. Auburn converted those into 23 points. Daisa Alexander added 16 points and six steals on the night.

UP NEXT

- Auburn plays host to Nicholls State at 6 p.m. CT Friday, Nov. 9, in the first round of the Preseason Women's NIT.
- The winner of Friday's game will play the winner of New Mexico/Texas State on Sunday, Nov. 11, at a site to be determined.

AN AUBURN WIN WOULD...

- » Boost the Tigers' record in season openers to 39-9 overall, 26-3 when opening the season at home.
- » Be Auburn's 40th straight win in a home opener.
- >> Improve Coach Flo's record in season-openers at Auburn to 6-1 and her overall record in openers to 11-4.
- >> Give Auburn a 28-0 home record against opponents from the SWAC.

AUBURN-GRAMBLING SERIES

This is the third meeting all-time between Auburn and Grambling State. Auburn won each of the prior two meetings in 2004 and 2014.

SCOUTING GRAMBLING STATE

- Grambling State finished with a 19-14 overall record (13-5 SWAC) in 2017-18 and was the SWAC Tournament Champion, advancing to the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- The Lady Tigers were picked to repeat as SWAC Champions after a 2017-18 season that saw them make their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1999
- " Grambling is the only SWAC school to ever win a postseason game as they defeated Ole Miss in the 2017 WNIT first round.
- >> Last season, the Lady Tigers averaged 66.4 points per game and shot 39.4% from the floor. They pulled down 35.3 rebounds per game but gave up 44.2.
- » Senior Shakyla Hill, a 5-7 guard, returns as Grambling's leader in scoring (16.8 ppg), rebounding (7.5/game), assists (5.7/game), steals (4.8/game) and blocked shots (0.3/game). Hill had 158 steals last season to rank No. 2 in the nation. She was also the fourth player in Division I history to record a quadruple double with 15 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists and 10 steals in a win over Alabama State on Jan. 3.

LAST MEETING (Nov. 17, 2014): AUBURN 92, GRAMBLING STATE 42

- Tra'Cee Tanner's career-high 31 points led three Tigers in double-figures as Auburn defeated Grambling State 92-42 at Auburn Arena.
- >> Tanner scored 12 of the first 14 points for Auburn as a small Grambling lineup had no answer for the 6-3 junior. She would finish with 31, a career-high.
- Auburn never trailed in the game and controlled the action from the opening tip. Auburn shot 59.4 percent for the game, holding Grambling to 28.3 percent from the field. The homestanding Tigers also outrebounded the visitors 47-24, holding Grambling to just seven offensive rebounds.
- A whopping 74 of Auburn's 92 points came in the paint as Auburn took full advantage of their edge in size. Auburn also forced Grambling into 25 turnovers while committing just 15 of their own. Auburn led 46-20 at halftime.

SCOUTING AUBURN

- » Auburn returns four starters (Daisa Alexander, Emari Jones, Janiah McKay, Unique Thompson) and two other letterwinners (Abigayle Jackson & Erica Sanders) from its 2017-18 team that finished 14-15 overall, 5-11 in SEC play.
- The Tigers' incoming freshman class was ranked No. 13 by ESPN HoopGurlz and included two top-50 prospects in Robyn Benton (#17 overall; #6 guard) and Brooke Moore (#42 overall; #11 guard).
- Senior point guard Janiah McKay is the Tigers' leading returning scorer for the second straight season after averaging 16.6 ppg last season. She was also Auburn's leader in assists (4.4/game) and minutes played (32.3/game). She led the Tigers in scoring 16 times last season and enters her senior season 24th on the Auburn scoring list with 1,199 career points.
- Sophomore forward Unique Thompson looks to build on a stellar freshman campaign that saw her named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. She averaged 11.5 points and a team-best 8.4 rebounds, which led all SEC freshmen. Thompson recorded 7 doubledoubles last season, tying DeWanna Bonner for the Auburn freshman record.
- yy Junior Daisa Alexander had a breakout sophomore season where she scored 14.2 points/game and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game, earning a nod to the SEC All-Defensive Team.
- Senior Emari Jones started 16 games last season, averaging 5.0 points. She transferred to Auburn prior to the 2016-17 season after a year at Shawnee CC in Ullin, Ill., where she was the nation's leading junior college scorer with 746 points in 2015-16.

AUBURN IN SEASON OPENERS

- In 47 previous seasons, Auburn has put together a 38-9 record in season openers (home or away) and sports a 26-3 record when opening the season at home.
- » In the SEC era (since 1980), Auburn is 34-4 in season openers.
- The Tigers are winners of their last 26 season openers at home with the last time Auburn lost being a 71-56 loss to Talladega in the 1977-78 opener. Auburn has also won their first home game of the season 39 straight years.
- Head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy is 5-1 in season-openers at Auburn. She holds a 10-4 record in season-openers as a head coach, winning eight of her last nine.

TURNING UP THE PRESSURE

- Auburn ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals (13.2/game) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9) for the 2017-18 season.
- Last year, the Tigers forced at least 20 turnovers in 23 of 29 games last year, including 10 games with at least 25 opponent turnovers. Auburn was 8-2 last year and has won 26 of its last 29 when forcing at least 25 turnovers.
- Auburn's season high of turnovers forced last year was 35 against ULM, which tied for the secondmost by Auburn under Coach Flo and the eighth-most in program history.
- » Last season, 24 of 29 Auburn opponents were held at or below their season scoring average.

PRESEASON HONORS

- .> Auburn senior Janiah McKay and sophomore Unique Thompson were selected to the Preseason All-SEC Second Team by the league's coaches.
- >> The Tigers were picked to finish eighth in the SEC by both the media and the coaches.

TIGERS TO PLAY IN PRESEASON WNIT

- Auburn is playing in the Preseason Women's NIT for the first time this season, opening the 16-team event Friday, Nov. 9, at home vs. Nicholls State.
- The Tigers are part of a field that includes Delaware, Hartford, Iowa State, Marquette, Miami, Montana State, Morgan State, New Mexico, Niagara, Nicholls State, Northern Illinois, Northern Iowa, Stephen F. Austin, Texas State and Yale.
- >> First-round games take place Nov. 8-9 with second-round games on Nov. 11. Dates, times and locations of upcoming games will be announced after each round is completed. Each team in the tournament is guaranteed three games.
- >> The championship game is Sunday, Nov. 18, at 3:30 p.m. CT and will be televised on CBS Sports Network.

ON THIS DATE

- This is the first time Auburn has played on Nov.6.
- Tonight's game marks the earliest season opener for Auburn women's basketball in program history by three days; the Tigers have played twice before on Nov. 9 (and will again this year).

IN NOVEMBER

- Auburn is 135-39 all-time in the month of November (records begin in 1978-79 season, not all dates provided prior to or during that year).
- >> Under Coach Flo, the Tigers are 27-12 in November.

NEW FACES

Auburn welcomes four newcomers to the roster for 2018-19, all freshmen.

- >> Joining the Tigers this season are Robyn Benton (G, 5-9, Conyers, Ga.); Brooke Moore (G, 5-7, McDonough, Ga.); Erin Howard (G/F, 6-1, Madison, Wis.); and Natalie Kelly (F, 6-3, Albany, La.).
- >> The Tigers' 2018-19 freshman class was rated the No. 13 signing class in the country by ESPN HoopGurlz.
- » Redshirt junior G Crystal Primm (West Palm Beach, Fla.) is eligible this season after sitting out last year under NCAA transfer rules. She transferred to Auburn from Duke in the summer of 2017 and has two years of eligibility.
- » Redshirt freshman Kiyae' White (Macungie, Pa.) will be in action this season after sitting out last year while rehabbing an injury.

TIGERS IN THE PROS

- DeWanna Bonner completed her ninth season in the WNBA in 2018, all with the Phoenix Mercury, after taking the 2017 season off for the birth of her twins. Bonner had one of her best pro seasons, averaging 17.3 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists while starting all 34 games. She was a beast in the 2018 playoffs, averaging 24.0 points and 11.1 rebounds in seven postseason games. Bonner was named the Associated Press' WNBA Comeback Player of the Year.
- » Brandy Montgomery is playing in Europe for her second season, currently on the roster of Luxembourg side Etzella Ettelbruck. Last year, she played for Visby in Sweden, averaging 16.3 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists while helping her team to the league semifinals.
