PREVIEWING TUESDAY

Head coach Richie Riley on Auburn

On officially starting the season: "I'm excited to get started. With the new rules, we get a lot of practices. It used to be Oct. 15 and now we get started earlier. We needed that time to improve and they needed that time to get accustomed to how we do things, so I'm excited to get out there for a real game. We got a lot out of our two exhibition games – the one here and the closed-door – and learned a lot about our team. I'm excited to go play somebody else, even though it's the No. 11 team in the country at their place opening night. It'll be a tall task but I'm excited to see how our guys respond. We're going into the game ready to compete."

On his takeaway from the exhibition: "Our lack of focus and not having that edge to us to really go finish someone off. I know we won by 23 points, which is a pretty large margin of victory, but in my opinion, it should have been more. That's not taking anything away from Tuskegee, but we had opportunities when we got the game to 32 to extend our lead, and instead we became disinterested. You can't do that, not if you're going to be a really good team. You have to maintain your focus and operate at your highest level for 40 minutes. I don't think we did that; I think we operated at a high level for about 20-25 minutes. We certainly can't do that on Tuesday against Auburn. You have to put together a whole 40 minutes of operating at a high level."

On Auburn: "They're really good all the way around. They have great depth and talent, and have recruited really well. Bruce Pearl is one of the best coaches in the country. He's not only a coach but a program builder. He took them from where they were when he inherited the job, which was not a consistent NCAA Tournament team, to where they're expected to go to the Sweet 16 and beyond. Their size is something we don't see a lot in this league. They have two outstanding guards that make up what I think is a top-five backcourt in America in Jared Harper and Bryce Brown. Brown made over 100 3s last year at 38 percent and Jared Harper is their catalyst. He can do a lot and gets other guys great shots, and can score. We're excited. We go into every game expecting to win because we've worked hard. We feel like we work as hard if not harder than anyone in the country. We feel like we do a good job of preparing, so we go into every game expecting to play our best and be there at the end with a chance to win the game."

On the atmosphere: "It's going to be an incredible atmosphere because that's what Pearl does; he builds programs. It'll be a sellout up there – they're preseason No. 11 in the country – and the atmosphere is something we're trying to prepare our guys for the best we can. Obviously we can't bring in 10,000 people to watch us practice, but we're trying to prepare them for that because in these games, it's the biggest obstacle. You come in and the environment overwhelms you. We're trying to get our guys to block that out and just focus on playing the game; don't let that affect you or have a part in beating you."

SOUTH ALABAMA'S LAST GAME

South Alabama 63, Tuskegee 40 - October 27, 2018

MOBILE, Ala. — The University of South Alabama men's basketball team held Tuskegee to 30.2 percent shooting and 18 first-half points in a 63-40 victory in an exhibition game Saturday afternoon at the Mitchell Center.

Senior Rodrick Sikes led a three-Jaguar contingent in double-digit points with 13. Junior Josh Ajayi and graduate Kory Holden added 10 points each.

After a slow start, the Jaguars took a double-digit lead for good with 4:53 to play in the first half on a layup from sophomore R.J. Kelly. That was part of an 11-1 run to end the half and sent USA into the break up 18.

South Alabama held Tuskegee to just one field goal in the first 11:25 after halftime and used an 18-4 spurt to go up 32 midway through the period.

GAME FACTS

- It was a two-point contest through seven minutes of play until the Jaguars reeled off 10 unanswered points over a four-minute stretch, capped off with a free throw from John Pettway

- The Golden Tigers answered with eight of the next 12 points – five from Myles Thomas – to trail by eight with 6:26 left

- Riley Hamilton's triple to finish off the 8-4 run would be TU's last of the half as the Golden Tigers missed their final eight attempts before halftime and went just 1 for 4 from the line

- The Jags weren't much better, shooting 3 for 10 from the floor, but Sikes scored the last five points, hitting a trey with 1:17 remaining and a jumper with 29 seconds left

- Tuskegee's cold streak extended into the second half with misses on three consecutive shots until a short jumper from Thomas Massey with 14:19 left; by then South Alabama had extended its lead to 24 and tacked on 10 more for a 32-point advantage after a steal and layup from Holden

THEY SAID IT

OPENING TIP

- South Alabama is 34-16 in season openers and 11-39 in road openers in its 50-year history. The Jaguars are 2-2 the last four times they've opened a season on the road, with wins at No. 25/24 Florida State in 2012-13 and at UNLV in 2016-17.
- The last time USA opened a season against Auburn, the Jags lost 120-67 on Nov. 27, 1987 in Birmingham.
- The Jaguars are 3-5 against in-state Division I non-conference opponents since 2006-07.
- South Alabama is 14-45 all time against current members of the SEC. Since defeating Arkansas and No. 18 Florida in 2009-10, USA is 1-6 vs. the SEC, with an overtime win at LSU in 2011-12.
- USA is 3-5 in its last eight games against ranked opponents dating back to the 2005-06 season. Tuesday's game will be its first against a ranked school since Nov. 28, 2014 at No. 17/20 Miami (L 87-75).
- The Jaguars have more wins against Auburn (4) than any other SEC school.
- Last season, USA posted the third-best field-goal percentage defense (.407) and 3-point percentage defense (.305) in school history.
- In the Sun Belt, South Alabama led the conference in 3-point defense and ranked third in field goal defense and fourth in scoring defense (69.3). Nationally, the team finished sixth in 3-point defense and 22nd in field goal defense.
- On the other end of the floor, the Jags attempted the most 3-pointers (779) in school history and made the third most (252).
- Rodrick Sikes, who was named Second Team Preseason All-Sun Belt, set a new school record last season with five 30-point performances. Three of those came against league competition.
- Included in those five 30-point games was a career-high 38-point outing at ULM, the second-most by a Sun Belt student-athlete in 2017-18.
- In league games only, Sikes placed second with 20.2 ppg.
- Sikes' 597 points are tied for sixth in school history, and his 88 3-pointers and 153 made free throws are fifth. His scoring average of 18.7 is 19th.
- Among all South Alabama juniors, Sikes ranked second in 3s, third in free throws made and tied for third in points.
- Sikes earned Second Team all-Sun Belt honors at the end of the season.
- Josh Ajayi also earned preseason all-conference honors after being voted to the third team.
- Ajayi was the team's leading rebounder (6.7 rpg) a season ago and ranked ninth in the Sun Belt in league games only (7.1 rpg).
- Ajayi recorded a team-best six double-doubles and grabbed 10 or more in a game seven times. He set a new career high with 14 at ULM then tied that a few weeks later at Appalachian State.
- Trhae Mitchell led the team last year with 45 blocks, the third-highest total by a sophomore in school history. He was third in the league in blocks per game (1.4).

pointing. I thought we had moments where guys, especially our first unit, played really well. We were able to stretch the lead to 32 and then we subbed down the stretch and didn't play well at all. There was a lack of attention to detail and a lack of urgency. We just didn't play our best basketball to be honest. When you have 10 guys that are active and one goes out early in the game and you're down to nine, then you have to have nine guys willing to operate at a high level as far as playing and focus and everything that goes into winning. We didn't. We were nowhere good enough to the standard we need to play at."

On how far away they are from the standard: "I think pretty far (away). Shooting 19 of 36 from the free-throw line is a lack of focus. We have better shooters than that. I think 4 of 18 from the '3' is not good; most of those were clean looks and we have to make those. Eight assists to 10 turnovers is not good. We want to be 2-to-1 every single night. I know we held them to 40 points on the stat sheet. It looks good. Everything looks good 63-40, but when you're coaching to try and build a championship culture and a championship team, this is not good enough; nowhere close. I made sure our guys knew that. They felt that after the game. I'm disappointed. On Monday it's on in there. We're changing some things because we play the No. 11 team in the country the following Tuesday. If we play anything like we did tonight we're in trouble."

On some of the bright spots: "I loved our first unit at times. I think R.J. Kelly is a kid with a high-level of play. When you look at his offensive numbers they don't jump off the page, but him in our press just changed the energy. His willingness to just bring juice. He had four offensive rebounds. I thought Kevin Morris was a bright spot except for his free throws. He makes more free throws in practice. I told him, 'You worked on your craft over the summer. You have to take advantage of it.' It's not his free throw stroke anymore, it's more mental than anything. When he goes 2 for 8 it's like a turnover. When you go 0 for 2 at the line, it's like a turnover. I like those guys. Josh Ajayi had some moments where he really showcased what he can do, but he became disinterested. That's something we do at times. We got up 32 and became disinterested in the game. Great teams don't do that. Great teams punish people from tip to finish. If you get a chance to beat somebody by 40 or 50, then they beat teams by 40 or 50. We're not there yet. We don't have that mentality. We've got a way to go in those areas, but those were the bright spots. Our first unit was fine and had good moments, but you can't play with five guys the whole game; you need some off the bench."

AUBURN'S LAST GAME

Auburn 76, Lincoln Memorial 62 - November 2, 2018

AUBURN, Ala. — The No. 11 Auburn men's basketball team defeated Lincoln Memorial, 76-62, in an exhibition Friday night inside Auburn Arena.

Jared Harper led the way with 22 points, while Chuma Okeke stuffed the stat sheet with 11 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and four blocks.

Horace Spencer chimed in with 14 points and eight rebounds. In his first action back from injury, Anfernee McLemore totaled 13 points and six rebounds.

The Railsplitters, ranked No. 3 in Division II to begin the season, provided a tough test for the Tigers to begin the season.

Auburn was forced into 15 turnovers and shot just 26% from behind the arc (6-for-26) in the 40-minute affair.

"It was quite an exhibition game," head coach Bruce Pearl said. "I am disappointed on how we played; we didn't play well. Lincoln Memorial played really well, and I want to thank [head coach] Josh [Schertz] because I knew they would give us a good test.

"They played hard, their guards are really quick, Josh runs some really good stuff and overall that was a great challenge. They were fast, they were quick, and we are bigger and slower, and it was exactly what we needed."

On the defensive end, the Tigers were disruptive and forced 19 turnovers.

Auburn got to the line 26 times Friday night and knocked down 18, led by Harper's 6-for-6 showing at the charity stripe.

IT'S A NEW ERA AT SOUTH ALABAMA

Richie Riley became South Alabama's 10th head coach in March 2018 after a two-year stint at Nicholls State... Riley went 35-28 in his two seasons in Thibodaux, La., and in 2017-18, won the school's first conference championship

SIKES, AJAYI TABBED TO PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT TEAM

Rodrick Sikes and **Josh Ajayi** were voted to the Sun Belt preseason team released in October... Sikes, who was a second-team selection after the 2017-18 campaign, was again a second-team pick, while Ajayi was named to the third team.

YOUTH GONE WILD

In South Alabama's season opener on Nov. 6, the USA coaching staff will have an average age of 33 years and 67 days, making them the third-youngest staff in Division I, trailing only Bethune-Cookman (31 years, 19 days) and Nicholls State (32 years, 53 days).

CAUSING CHAOS

Head coach **Richie Riley** has developed a defensive style that emphasizes pressure and forcing turnovers... Last season, Nicholls State ranked third in the nation in steals per game (9.6) and fourth in turnovers forced (17.25)... The Colonels had two players — **Jahvaughn Powell** (2.31 spg, 12th) and **Kevin Johnson** (1.91, 47th) — rank in the top 50 individually in steals per game.

TURNAROUND ARTIST

With South Alabama not having a winning season in five years, head coach **Richie Riley** will be faced with another rebuilding job... When he took over at Nicholls State, the school had not won a conference title since 1998 or had a winning season since 2008-09, but in his second year, Riley led the Colonels to a 21-11 overall record and a 15-3 mark in the Southland Conference... The 15 league wins were the most by the program since 1997-98.

MINIMUM TWO YEARS EXPERIENCE PREFERRED

The Jaguars will go into the 2018-19 season without a single freshman on the roster... In fact, every player on the ros-

ter, with the exception of junior college transfers **Rodrick Sikes** and **Abdul Dial**, has a minimum of two years experience at the Division I level... Sophomore **R.J. Kelly** played the 2016-17 campaign at Savannah State, then redshirted last season after transferring to South Alabama... Sophomore **John Pettway** redshirted his freshman season in 2016-17 before playing in 24 games last year... Sikes, a senior spent two seasons at Southwest Mississippi Community College before turning in an all-Sun Belt performance in 2017-18, and Dial played at St. John's in 2015-16 then went to Mississippi Gulf Coast.

30-SOMETHING

With his 32-point effort against Arkansas State on Feb. 10, **Rodrick Sikes** broke the school record for 30-point games in a season with five, breaking a tie with **Augustine Rubit**, **Demetric Bennett**, **Jeff Hodge** and **Terry Catledge**... Sikes' first 30-point outing came against Stetson, when he poured in 32 points in the overtime loss... He topped that with 34 at Tulane, with 23 points coming after halftime, then in his next time out, tallied 31 in the Jaguars' Sun Belt opener vs. Georgia State, and again scored 23 points in the second half... His performance against the Panthers made him the first Jaguar since Catledge in 1984 to record back-to-back 30-point games... Sikes just missed making it three straight after scoring 27 against Georgia Southern, but recorded his fourth 30-point effort with a career-high 38 points at ULM.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

The Jaguars were one of the Sun Belt's top defensive teams last season, ranking in the top four in scoring defense, field goal percentage defense and 3-point percentage defense... South Alabama was first in 3-point defense (.305), third in field goal defense (.407), and fourth in scoring defense (69.3 ppg)... Nationally, USA was sixth in Division I in 3-point defense and 22nd in field goal defense... The team's field goal and 3-point defensive percentages both ranked third in school history.

WAITING IN THE WINGS

The Jaguars have three players that transferred into the program over the summer that will be sitting out the 2018-19 campaign: **Andre Fox**, **Don Coleman** and **Josh Ayeni**... Fox and Coleman have one season of eligibility remaining while Ayeni has two... Fox spent three seasons at High Point where he was an all-Big South Second Team selection and scored over 1,015 points... Coleman led California in scoring last year with 14.2 points per game... Ayeni averaged 6.1 points and 2.7 rebounds in two seasons at St. Bonaventure.

ONE AND DONE

Kory Holden's time in Mobile will be short as the Salisbury, Md., native will be spending just the 2018-19 season with South Alabama as a graduate transfer... Holden transferred to USA after two seasons at South Carolina... He spent his freshman and sophomore seasons at Delaware then sat out the 2016-17 campaign due to transfer rules before appearing in 14 games at USC last year... Holden averaged 17.7 points as a sophomore at UD, earning Second Team all-CAA honors, and was a CAA all-Rookie team pick as a freshman after averaging 12.4 points and 5.0 assists per game.

SIKES NAMED TO 2017-18 ALL-SUN BELT TEAM

Rodrick Sikes was voted Second Team all-Sun Belt at the conclusion of the 2017-18 regular season... Sikes is the program's first student-athlete to be named second team or better since 2014-15, and the first Jaguar newcomer to earn all-conference honors since Augustine Rubit in 2010-11.

AMONG THE BEST

Rodrick Sikes placed himself among elite company in South Alabama's single-season record book last year... Sikes scored 597 points, tied for sixth in school history, and his 18.7 points-per-game average ranked 19th... He converted 88 times from 3-point land and made 153 free throws, both fifth-best at USA.

SIKES, AJAYI EARN 2017-18 PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Rodrick Sikes and **Josh Ajayi** have both been voted player of the week in the Sun Belt Conference... Sikes was named player of the week on Jan. 2 — the first for a Jaguar in almost three years — after averaging 26.2 points over four games in December, including back-to-back 30-point outings against Tulane and Georgia State... Ajayi picked up the weekly honor on Jan. 23 to give the Jaguars multiple recipients for the first time since 2012-13... Ajayi averaged 21.0 points and 11.5 rebounds in two victories, with two double-doubles and a 60.0 field-goal percentage.

REUNITED (AND IT FEELS SO GOOD)

Herb McGee and **Jordan Andrews** were high school teammates at Riverside Academy in Reserve, La. ... The pair played on three state championship teams in their time together... Andrews played his freshman season at Youngstown State before transferring to South Alabama prior to the 2016-17 season.

In his one season with the Penguins, Andrews made 19 starts, averaged 7.9 points and broke the school's freshman 3-point record with 50 triples... He shot 36.7 percent from long range and hit three treys or more seven times.

HOME OPENING SUCCESS

In the 49 years of the program, the Jaguars have a history of successful home openers... USA sports a 42-8 record in its home opening contests and has won 26 in a row... The last loss was 81-75 to Southern Miss in 1991... The streak was extended in November with a 81-49 win over Mobile... Spring Hill is the most frequent victim during the streak, losing three times... The Jaguars have defeated Abilene Christian, Alabama State, Alcorn State and Prairie View A&M twice each in season lid-lifters.

JAGUARS PICKED SEVENTH IN PRESEASON POLL

In a poll of the league's coaches, South Alabama received 80 points in the preseason poll and was voted seventh... Georgia State garnered 144 points and all 12 first-place votes... Georgia Southern and Louisiana tied for second with 125 points, and ULM and Troy tied for fourth with 89 points.

ACCURACY IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS

Since the start of the 2013-14 season, South Alabama is 52-17 (.754) when compiling a higher shooting percentage than its opponent —32-13 (.711) vs. SBC schools — but 13-78 (.143) — 7-48 (.127) vs. Sun Belt teams — when being outshot... Last season, South Alabama was 12-3 with a higher percentage and 2-15 with a lower one.

THAT 70s SHOW

When scoring 70 or more since the start of the 2013-14 season, the Jaguars are 47-31 (.603), but 16-63 (.203) when scoring 69 or fewer... In 2015-16, the Jaguars were 11-5 with 70-plus and 3-14 when under 70... The season prior, South Alabama was 10-5, its lowest win percentage when scoring 70-plus in the last eight years, and was 2-16 when scoring 69 or fewer.

AT HOME IN THE MITCHELL CENTER

Since the facility opened in 1999, the Jaguars have established a winning tradition on their home floor, the Mitchell Center... In 15 seasons, South Alabama has a 190-89 (.681) record and has eight seasons of 10 or more wins... In 2007-08 the Jags posted a 17-1 slate in front of their home fans (17-0 in the regular season), the second-most home wins in school history (19, 1973-74).

NICE TO MEET YOU

South Alabama will be taking on two first-time opponents this season: Huntingdon and Southeast Missouri State.

SPANNING THE COUNTRY

Nine states and two countries are represented on the USA roster... There are two players from Louisiana, Alabama, South Carolina, Maryland and Georgia, and one each from California, Mississippi and Florida... Josh Ayeni is from Zaria, Nigeria.

1st Season

After helping Nicholls to its first regular-season Southland Conference championship since 1998 this year, Richie Riley was announced on March 8 as the new University of South Alabama head men's basketball coach by Jaguar Director of Athletics Dr. Joel Erdmann.

Riley, 35, is the 10th head coach in the history of the program.

Riley has been the head coach the last two seasons at Nicholls, compiling a 35-28 overall record and a 22-14 mark in the Southland Conference. This season, he led the Colonels to the regular-season co-championship with a 15-3 record in league play and an overall mark of 21-11; it was the program's first winning season since the 2008-09 campaign.

Nicholls led the conference in scoring with an average of 82.5 points per game, and was among the top three in the league in eight other statistical categories including second in field-goal percentage (47.2%), 3-point field goals per game (8.1), steals per game (9.6) and scoring margin (+7.2 ppg). Not only was the team among the top five in the country in total steals, steals per game and turnovers forced, it ranked among the top 25 nationally in scoring average and top 50 in field-goal percentage as well.

Under his guidance, Roddy Peters became the Colonels' first first-team all-league selection since 2013 this season, with two other student-athletes earning all-Southland recognition during Riley's two years at the helm of the program.

Peters, who was also the league's newcomer of the year, joined fellow all-Southland honoree Tevon Saddler in the top six in the conference in scoring, with 19.7 and 15.8 points per game, respectively. Peters was second in scoring and sixth with 4.2 assists per contest, while Sadler, a second-team selection, was sixth in points and ninth with 6.6 rebounds per game.

The Colonels' tenacity on defense led to three players listed in the conference's top 11 in steals, including all-defensive team member Jahvaughn Powell, who led the SLC in steals per game (2.3), and Kevin Johnson, who ranked third (1.9).

The season before, the team went 7-11 in league play and 14-17 overall, but led the Southland in both blocks (6.1) and 3-pointers (9.0) per game. The Colo-

nels were fourth in steals per game (7.5), but Powell was second individually (2.0), and Johnathan Bell ranked third (1.9).

Powell paced the SLC in assists per game (5.0) and Liam Thomas was the statistical champion in blocks (4.2).

Prior to taking over at Nicholls, he was an assistant for two seasons at Clemson. In his first season on the staff, he helped the Tigers to eight Atlantic Coast Conference wins — with one coming at NCAA Sweet 16 participant North Carolina State — as well as a pair of victories over NCAA Tournament teams from the SEC, including a top-25 Arkansas squad. The following year Clemson won 10 ACC games for only the fifth time in program history, while his efforts in recruiting helped the Tigers sign both ESPN 4-star top-100 prospect Ty Hudson and the No. 2 national junior-college prospect, Legend Robertin.

As an assistant at Alabama-Birmingham from 2012-14, Riley played a key role in the Blazers signing a top-25 recruiting class that would provide the core of a team that advanced to the third round of the 2015 NCAA Tournament; the group included three individuals who would go on to earn all-Conference USA honors as well as the league's 6th Man-of-the-Year Award. His time at UAB was highlighted by a 63-59 victory over No. 16 North Carolina during the 2013-14 season.

Riley's efforts with the Blazers led to his selection to attend the prestigious Villa 7 Conference for rising assistants.

In his lone season at Eastern Kentucky in 2011-12, he was part of a staff that led the Colonels to a 16-16 record. But his efforts in recruiting for the program played a part in signing a class that would help ECU advance to the NCAA Tournament in 2015; the group included Corey Walden, who would go on to twice be chosen the Ohio Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Year and the 2014 OVC Tournament Most Valuable Player in addition to being voted first-team all-league in '15.

Riley's first experience at the NCAA Division I level came at Coastal Carolina, where he was an assistant on Cliff Ellis' staff from 2009-11. In his two years with the program, the Chanticleers posted a 56-13 mark overall and 31-5 record in the Big South Conference, winning a pair of regular-season titles, advancing to the conference tournament championship game twice and making an appearance in the National Invitation Tournament each season.

After beginning his coaching career as an assistant at Georgetown (Ky.) from 2003-05, Riley also served as an assistant at Hawaii-Pacific during the 2005-06 campaign before a three-season stint at Pikeville (Ky.) from 2006-09. While at PC he received the honor of 'Top NAIA Assistant' from RecruitingRumors.com.

A 2005 Eastern Kentucky graduate with a degree in special education and human behavior, Riley and his wife Jess have two sons, Reese and Rock.
