#25/24 UW (1-0) AT No. 11/12 AUBURN (1-0)

UW hits the road for its first true road contest of the season this Friday, November 9 as it faces preseason No. 11/12 Auburn in Alabama at Auburn Arena. The game will be televised by SEC Network at 6:30 p.m. PT with Richard Cross and Daymeon Fishback on the call. Fans can also tune into 1000AM KOMO/97.7 FM to listen to the official Husky Radio Broadcast from Tony Castricone and Jason Hamilton. This is the first meeting between the two programs.

THE COACH

Head Coach Mike Hopkins is in his second year at Washington, and second as a head coach after becoming the 19th head coach in UW history. After spending 22 years as an assistant at Syracuse, Hopkins oversaw teams that reached the NCAA Tournament 16 times including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s along with four NIT berths. Syracuse never dipped below a 55.0 percent record while Hopkins was on staff. In his first year at UW, Hopkins earned the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year Award while leading the Huskies to a 21-13 record ending in the second round of the NIT.

QUICK HITTERS

- UW opened the season with an 18-point victory over Conference-USA preseason favorite Western Kentucky which saw the Hilltoppers score just 19 points in the second half and 55 overall
- Matisse Thybulle, UW's career steals leader at 206, has now recorded at least one steal in 47-straight games
- Thybulle's six blocks against WKU tied his career high and were the most by a Husky since he had six in the season opener against Yale on Nov. 13, 2016
- This will be the first non-conference meeting for a ranked UW team against a ranked opponent since Dec. 20, 2014 when the No. 16 Huskies defeated No. 15 Oklahoma, 69-67, in Las Vegas.
- Washington currently has two 1,000 point scorers on the team with the potential to add a third as Matisse Thybulle is 74 points away. Only two rosters in UW history have had three 1,000 point scorers at the same time, 2008-09 (NCAA Round of 32) and 1998-99 (NCAA Round of 64). Noah Dickerson currently has 1,183 career points which ranks 27th while David Crisp has 1,080 career points which ranks 33rd.
- Seniors Matisse Thybulle and David Crisp played in their 100th career games on against WKU and it was also Thybulle's 100th career start as he has started every game of his career ... against Auburn, senior Noah Dickerson will be playing in his 100th career game
- UW has representatives on three of the Naismith Starting Five National Award Watch Lists in sophomore Jaylen Nowell (Jerry West Shooting Guard Award), senior Matisse Thybulle (Julius Erving Small Forward Award) and senior Noah Dickerson (Karl Malone Power Forward Award). UW is one of 11 schools nationally to have representatives on three of the 11 awards joining Kentucky, Duke, Tennessee, Virginia, Kansas, Nevada, Auburn, Oregon and Gonzaga.
- With 285 boards this year, Noah Dickerson can become only the 15th member of the Pac-12's 1,000 career rebounds club. Dickerson, who has 715 boards in his career, grabbed 284 boards as a junior in 2017-18.
- With another 100-steal season, Matisse Thybulle could become only the second member of the Pac-12's 300 career steals club. Thybulle, who has 206 career thefts following 101 as a junior in 2017-18, would join OSU's Gary Payton (321) as the lone members.
- Washington's 2018-19 schedule features two non-conference road tests against teams ranked in the AP preseason top 25 (at Auburn, at Gonzaga). Additionally, Washington will face eight teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament a year ago.
- UW's senior class of Dominic Green, David Crisp, Noah Dickerson and Matisse Thybulle have combined to play in 392 career games including 254 career starts which is the most by any four seniors at a Power 5 school
- With his 106 assists a year ago, junior David Crisp became the 40th player in UW history to record 100 assists in a single season ... he is 51 away from entering UW's career top 10 list as he has 266 total assists
- Washington posted its first 20-win season since 2011-12 with its 21-13 record last season ... it was the biggest jump win jump between seasons since 1936-37 to 1937-38 after UW went 9-22 the season prior (2016-17) ... it was also the biggest jump (eight wins more) in conference play in UW history as UW went from 2-16 to 10-8 a year ago

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

Along with three players being placed on national award watch lists, the Huskies as a team were ranked No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Preseason Poll and No. 25 Associated Press Preseason Poll. It is the first time since the 2010-11 season UW has been ranked in the AP preseason poll.

100 CAREER GAMES

Against Auburn, senior Noah Dickerson will be playing in his 100th career game. Seniors Matisse Thybulle and David Crisp recently played in their 100th career games against Western Kentucky.

THYBULLE'S STREAK

Junior Matisse Thybulle has started every game of his UW career which now spans 100 games. Next on the UW list of consecutive starts is all-time leading scorer Chris Welp who started in 121-straight games from 1983-87.

20 WIN SEASONS

Washington recorded its first 20-win season since 2011-12 last year as it went 21-13 en route to a second round appearance in the NIT. Washington has posted 28 20-win seasons in program history.

392 GAMES PLAYED

Between UW's four seniors, David Crisp, Noah Dickerson, Dominic Green and Matisse Thybulle, they have played 392 career games with 254 career starts. The 392 career games is the most by a senior class (that has been at the same institution all four years) amongst any team in the Power 5 Conferences.

200 STEALS + 100 BLOCKS

Senior **Matisse Thybulle** is the only active player in NCAA Division 1 to have over 200 steals and 100 blocks in their career ... **his 206 steals rank third amongst the NCAA active career leaders in that category.** Only two other Pac-12 guards have accomplished that career feat since 1992-93 in (via SportsReference)

STEAL PRODUCTION

Out of his UW-record 206 career steals, Matisse Thybulle is creating scoring on 54.8 percent of the direct next possessions ... last season that number was 57.4 (58 of 101).

SEASON 95 STEALS + 40 BLOCKS

Additionally, in a single season, **Thybulle**, with his 101 steals and 49 blocks last year made him the only player in the country with those two numbers on his stat sheet. In the last 25 years (since 1992-93, via SportsReference) only three other **guards** have done that in a season

TWO 1K SCORERS + 1 ON THE WAY

UW has two 1,000 point scorers on its roster as senior Noah Dickerson is at 1,183 while senior David Crisp is at 1,080. Additionally, senior Matisse Thybulle is 76 points away from the 1K-point club as he is at 924. In UW history, only two rosters in UW history have had three 1,000 point scorers at the same time, 2008-09 (NCAA Round of 32) and 1998-99 (NCAA Round of 64).

NOAH'S DOUBLE DOUBLES

Senior Noah Dickerson recorded 10 double-doubles in 34 games last season after recording six over his first 64 games. He nearly averaging a double-double with 15.5 points and 8.4 rebounds per outing last year ... his 10 are the most in a season by a Husky since Aziz N'Diaye had 11 during the 2012-13 campaign.

Senior Noah Dickerson has posted five 20/10 double doubles in his career against the following opponents. He is the first player to do so since Matthew Bryan-Amaning who posted eight in his career (2007-11)

LENGTH, LENGTH, LENGTH

2018 PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR

In just his first year as a head coach in his career, Washington's Mike Hopkins was named the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year in a vote done by the league's coaches. He was the fourth Husky coach to earn the honor and first since 2012. Hopkins was also just the sixth Pac-12 Coach to earn the honor in their first year at their university joining Stanford's Dick DiBiasi (1976), UCLA's Gary Cunningham (1978), Oregon State's Jim Anderson (1990), California's Ben Braun (1997) and Washington State's Tony Bennett (2007).

2018 PAC-12 DEFENSIVE POY

Senior Matisse Thybulle made history last season as he was named the 2018 Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year becoming the first Husky to earn the honor. He was also named to the Pac-12 All-Defensive Team.

2018 PAC-12 ALL-CONFERENCE

A trio of Huskies also earned Pac-12 All-Conference Honors last season in Noah Dickerson who picked up Pac-12 First Team All-Conference honors along with Jaylen Nowell who was an All-Conference honorable mention. Nowell was also named to the All-Pac-12 freshman team while Thybulle was on the All-Defensive Team.

NEARING 1K WINS AT AAA

The Dawgs currently have 990 wins inside Alaska Airlines Arena. Washington's 990 wins are the most by any Division I team at its current home arena. The Huskies started playing in their arena on Dec. 27, 1927.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

UW's 10 wins in non-conference play last season tied for the second most since 2005-06 ... UW also had 11 wins in 2014-15, 10 in 2006-07 and 10 in 2005-06.

HUSKIES IN THE NBA

UW's presence in the NBA remains strong as the Dawgs boast seven former players holding spots on rosters this season - 2017 No. 1 pick Markelle Fultz (Philadelphia 76ers), Marquese Chriss (Houston Rockets), Justin Holiday (Chicago Bulls), Dejounte Murray (San Antonio Spurs), Terrence Ross (Orlando Magic), Quincy Pondexter (San Antonio Spurs) and Isaiah Thomas (Denver Nuggets).

THE FRESHMEN

Mike Hopkins welcomed his first full recruiting class this season adding Jamal Bey, Bryan Penn-Johnson, Nate Roberts and Elijah Hardy. Washington also welcomed preferred walk-ons Riley Sorn and Travis Rice (redshirt sophomore transfer from Northern Arizona).

FROM 2-16 TO 10-8

After going 2-16 in Pac-12 play during the 2016-17 season, the Huskies finished 10-8 in league action last year. Via Elias Stats/Pac-12 Conference, **over the last 40 seasons, only two league schools began its conference slate 6-3 or better the season after having no more than two conference victories. Stanford started 1993-94 with a 6-3 record after going 2-16 in 1992-93.**

WIN JUMP

Not only did UW have a huge change in their record during conference play a year ago, but its jump from a 9-22 record to 21-13 was the biggest since the difference between the 1936-37 and 1937-38 seasons when the Huskies went from 15-11 to 29-7.

RETURNING SCORING

2018-19 UW Men's Basketball – Coach Mike Hopkins

Coach Mike Hopkins (2nd Year)

Mike Hopkins took over the helm of the University of Washington men's basketball program prior to the 2017-18 season and immediately made his mark. He led the Huskies to their first 20-win season since 2011-12 as the Dawgs went 21-13 and 10-8 in Pac-12 play.

In his first year, Hop was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year becoming just the sixth coach in league history to earn the honor in their first year at their institution and first since 2006-07. He also picked up NABC District 21 Coach of the Year honors.

Hopkins led a team that went from 9-22 to 21-13 with almost entirely the same roster and helped guide Matisse Thybulle to Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year honors, the first Dawg to earn the award. Noah Dickerson was named to the All-Pac-12 First Team while freshman Jaylen Nowell picked up All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention and All-Pac-12 freshman team accolades. Thybulle was also named to the All-Pac-12 Defensive Team.

Washington made history in Hopkins' first year as the Huskies defeated No. 2 Kansas in Kansas City marking their first-ever win over a top-2 team away from Seattle in program history. Additionally, it was the sixth win over a top-2 opponent in UW history, regardless of place. During the season, Washington also picked up a road win at USC, its first since 2012.

On the weekend of Feb 1-3, Washington knocked off back-to-back ranked opponents in No. 25 Arizona State and No. 9 Arizona at home, making it the first time since the 2006-07 season that the Dawgs have defeated ranked teams at home in back-to-back games.

The Dawgs also started Pac-12 play at 7-3 after going 2-16 in 2016-17. Over the last 40 seasons, only two league schools began its conference slate 7-3 or better the season after having no more than two conference victories. Stanford started 1993-94 with a 6-3 record after going 2-16 in 1992-93.

In year one for Hop, Washington also saw two student-athletes reach 1,000 career points in Noah Dickerson and David Crisp and saw Matisse Thybulle set the single-season and career record for steals.

Hopkins came to Washington from Syracuse University, where he spent 22 seasons alongside Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim. In 2015 Syracuse named him head coach designate, set to take over the Orange program after Boeheim's retirement following the 2017-18 season.

"I'm extremely excited to welcome Mike and his family to Seattle," UW Athletic Director Jennifer Cohen said. "His resume and reputation within the basketball community made him stand out to us, but ultimately it was his vision for Washington, his passion for teaching and developing student-athletes and his close alignment with the core values of our institution and department that made it more than clear that he was the right fit for us."

Hopkins, 48, had been a member of the Syracuse Orange coaching staff since 1995 and will be the 19th head coach in Washington Basketball history.

"The University of Washington is such a unique place, with a world-class University, an exciting basketball history and unbelievable fan support," Hopkins said. "Together, I believe we can build something very special in Seattle, and I can't wait to get started."

During his time in New York, Syracuse advanced to postseason play in all but one year. He was a part of 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s, along with four NIT berths. Additionally, Syracuse never dipped below a .550 record while Hopkins was on staff.

"I can't express enough thanks to Coach Boeheim for so many years of mentorship and guidance," Hopkins said. "The timing is right for me and my family to make this move."

With the Orange, Hopkins spent his time in New York heavily involved in recruiting and overseeing the development of the SU guards before switching to overseeing the posts during the last four years. He played a key role in the recruitment and success of Carmelo Anthony, Rakeem Christmas, Johnny Flynn, Jason Hart, Gerry McNamara, Andy Rautins and many more who all were able to pursue professional basketball careers either in the NBA or overseas. Additionally, six players earned consensus All-American honors while Hopkins was on staff.

The Syracuse alum not only made an impact with the Orange, but he also played a major role in the success of Team USA Basketball. Hopkins has been a court coach for nine various Team USA staffs which have gone on to win six championships.

He first started with the 21-and-under team in 2000 and 2001 helping with player evaluation for the club that went on to win gold. In 2006, he was with the Senior Men's team before rejoining the staff in 2010 where he travelled with the team en route to their World Championship Title in Turkey.

Hopkins was named the co-coach of the USA Basketball Select Team in 2012 and helped the squad prepare for the Olympics in London, where he served as a court coach as USA won gold. Most recently he played a role in gold medal finishes at the 2014 World Championships and the 2016 Summer Olympics.

As a student-athlete himself, Hopkins became the Orange's starting shooting guard his junior year en route to the team winning the 1992 Big East Championship. 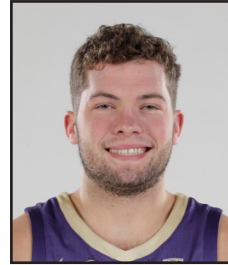

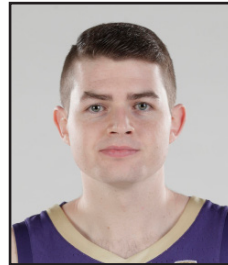

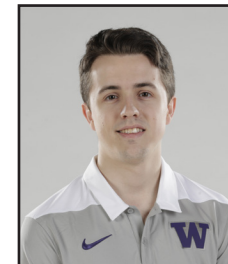
