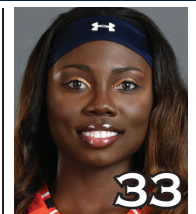

Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- Auburn and Elon will meet for the first time in women's basketball
- The Tigers are 6-1 all-time against opponents from the Colonial Athletic Association
- At 10-1, Auburn is off to its best start since the 2008-09 season, when the Tigers won their first 20 games en route to an SEC Championship
- Auburn's 7-game winning streak matches the longest under Coach Flo (also won 7 straight in 2017-18)
- The Tigers have five players averaging double-figure scoring, more than any other SEC team
- Auburn is 77-30 in non-conference games under Terri Williams-Flournoy and has won 17 out of their last 18
- The Tigers have won 12 consecutive home non-conference games dating back to the 2016-17 season
- Auburn is 237-55 all-time in the month of December; Coach Flo is 37-9 in December at Auburn
- Auburn's win over North Carolina on Dec. 20 was the Tigers' first overtime game since 2017 and improves Auburn's all-time overtime record to 20-20
- The Tigers scored 38 points off turnovers in a win over North Carolina on Dec. 20, the most since scoring 40 points off turnovers vs. George Mason on Dec. 23, 2015
- Thursday's win over North Carolina snapped a 10-game losing streak for Auburn against ACC opponents
- Tuesday's win over Coastal Carolina snapped an eight-game losing streak for Auburn in games played in the state of South Carolina that dated back to 2010
- Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 5-0 when scoring at least 90 points and 29-1 when scoring at least 80 points
- Auburn has topped the 80-point mark six times this season; the Tigers scored 80+ in just six games combined over the previous two seasons
- Auburn has forced 20 or more turnovers in 8 of 11 games this season
- Senior Janiah McKay passed Linda Godby and Sherrell Hobbs for 15th all-time in scoring at Auburn with 21 points vs. North Carolina; she now has 1,373 points
- Sophomore Unique Thompson has recorded six double-doubles in 11 games, including three straight against New Mexico, Iowa State and UL-Lafayette
- With 11.9 rebounds per game, Thompson is 2nd in the SEC and ranks 13th in the nation
- The Tigers forced a season-high 29 turnovers in a 73-46 win over Samford on Dec. 16
- Auburn set a school record with 13 3-pointers in the win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2; previous record was 12 vs. Colgate in 2007
- Since 2001, Auburn has made at least 10 3-pointers in a game on 10 occasions; five of those have come under Coach Flo
- The Tigers' 95 points against Oklahoma (Dec. 2) were the most against a Power-5 conference opponent since 1990 (def. Vanderbilt 96-93 in 2OT)
- Auburn's win over Oklahoma snapped an eight-game losing streak to Big 12 opponents
- The Tigers' win at Xavier (La.) was the 250th career coaching victory for Auburn head coach Terri Williams-Flournoy

» Auburn is 10-1 on the season; the Tigers have won seven straight and are coming off a thrilling 86-81 overtime victory over North Carolina on Thursday night in Myrtle Beach, S.C.

» Elon enters Saturday's game at 5-5 overall; the Phoenix defeated North Carolina A&T 73-64 on Tuesday in their last game.

LAST TIME OUT

» Jannah McKay and Unique Thompson both scored 21 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team fought back from a late deficit to earn an 86-81 overtime victory over North Carolina Thursday night in the Carolinas Challenge.

» Trailing for most of the fourth quarter, Auburn hit their final four shots of the half and forced the extra period when McKay found Robyn Benton for a layup with 10 seconds to play to tie the score at 69-69. The Tigers (10-1) never trailed in overtime, getting nine points and a huge late steal from McKay to win their seventh in a row.

» Auburn led by as many as 11 points in the third quarter, but the Tar Heels (8-5) chipped away, including a 7-0 run to end the quarter, to bring the deficit down to one point headed to the fourth. UNC took its first lead of the half with 5:26 to play on a 3-pointer to make it 56-54.

» Auburn never led again in regulation, but after a missed UNC free throw led to Benton's layup with 10 seconds left, the Tigers never trailed in overtime. UNC threatened late, hitting a pair of 3-pointers in the final minute, but McKay sank five free throws over the final 44 seconds to salt away the win.

UP NEXT

» Auburn closes out non-conference play on Saturday, Dec. 29, at home against Alabama State. Game time is noon CT at Auburn Arena.

AN AUBURN WIN WOULD...

» Be Auburn's 17th non-conference win in its last 18 games.

» Give the Tigers an 11-1 start, their best of the Coach Flo era and the best since Auburn won its first 20 games to open the 2008-09 season.

» Extend the Tigers' winning streak to eight games, which would be the longest under Coach Flo.

» Be Auburn's fourth win in seven days.

AUBURN VS. ELON

» This is the first meeting between Auburn and Elon in women's basketball.

» The Tigers are 6-1 all-time against current members of the Colonial Athletic Association.

» Auburn has won its last two games played in the state of North Carolina and is 8-5 all-time in games played in the Tar Heel State.

SCOUTING THE PHOENIX

» Elon is 5-5 on the season. The Phoenix have wins over NC Central, NC A&T, Hampton, Davidson and Chowan so far this year.

» The Phoenix are averaging 70.3 points/game and giving up 69.1. As a team, Elon shoots 41.5% from the field.

» Three players average just over 11 points per game for Elon: Emily Maupin (11.5), Ariel Colon (11.3)

and Lexi Mercer (11.1).

» Auburn and Elon have one common opponent - North Carolina. The Tigers defeated the Tar Heels 86-81 in overtime on Thursday night; UNC downed Elon 100-69 in the season opener on Nov. 6.

SCOUTING AUBURN

» Auburn is 10-1 on the season. Since dropping a 3-point decision at Iowa State on Nov. 13, the Tigers have won seven straight games.

» Senior point guard Jannah McKay averages a team-leading 15.8 points/game and has topped 20 points in each of her last four outings. She is also fifth in the SEC with 5.1 assists/game. McKay is the Tigers' leading returning scorer for the second straight season after averaging 16.6 ppg last season. McKay ranks 17th in career scoring at Auburn with 1,331 points.

» Sophomore forward Unique Thompson is a force under the basket and has been key to Auburn's success early this year. She has six double-doubles in 11 games and averages 13.8 points and 11.9 rebounds. As a freshman last season, she averaged 11.5 ppg and 8.4 rpg with 7 double-doubles, tying the Auburn freshman record.

» Junior Daisa Alexander had a breakout sophomore season where she scored 14.2 points/game and led the SEC with 2.8 steals/game, earning a nod to the SEC All-Defensive Team. So far this season, Alexander is averaging 11.5 points/game and had a career-high 8 assists vs. Louisiana-Lafayette.

» Senior Emari Jones has been one of Auburn's most consistent scorers so far in 2018-19, averaging 11.2 points/game and scoring in double-figures in six games so far. In 2017-18, she started 16 games and averaged 5.0 points. She transferred to Auburn prior to the 2016-17 season after a year at Shawnee CC in Ullin, Ill., where she was the nation's leading junior college scorer with 746 points in 2015-16.

» Redshirt junior Crystal Primm has given Auburn consistent minutes through her first 11 games on The Plains, averaging 11.1 points and 3.6 rebounds. A transfer from Duke after the 2016-17 season, Primm scored a career-high 18 points against her former school's archrival, North Carolina, on Dec. 20.

» The Tigers' incoming freshman class was ranked No. 13 by ESPN HoopGurlz and included two top-50 prospects in Robyn Benton (#17 overall; #6 guard) and Brooke Moore (#42 overall; #11 guard). Benton is averaging 7.4 points/game and Moore is scoring 6.0/game.

BALANCED SCORING RETURNS

» Through the first 11 games, Auburn has five players averaging double-digit scoring, more than any other SEC team. Jannah McKay, Unique Thompson, Daisa Alexander, Emari Jones and Crystal Primm - Auburn's starting five - all average at least 11 points per game.

» For the first time since 2008, Auburn had six players finish in double-figures in the Tigers' 97-48 win over Grambling on Nov. 6.

» Junior Jannah McKay and freshman Robyn Benton led the way with 16 points, followed by junior Crystal Primm (15), sophomore Unique Thompson (14), and junior Daisa Alexander and senior Emari Jones (13).

» The last time Auburn had at least six players score 10+ points, seven players did it against Sam Houston State on Dec. 5, 2008, when the Tigers set a school record with 119 points. That night, it was KeKe Carrier (19), DeWanna Bonner (18), Alli Smalley (16), Whitney Boddie (13), Reneisha Hobbs (13), Chantel Hilliard (13) and Sherell Hobbs (13).

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

» With 97 points in the season-opening win over Grambling, Auburn hit the 90-point plateau for the fourth time in the Coach Flo era and the first since scoring 92 on Nov. 17, 2014 - also against Grambling.

» The Tigers have scored at least 80 points in six games this season; Auburn scored 80+ in six games combined over the previous two seasons.

» Auburn's 95-point effort against Oklahoma on Dec. 2 gave the Tigers two 90-point games in the same season for the first time since the 2008-09 season, when Auburn topped the 90-point mark six times.

» The Tigers' 95 points against Oklahoma were the most scored by Auburn against a Power-5 conference opponent (SEC, ACC, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12) since 1990, when the Tigers beat Vanderbilt 96-93 in 2 OT.

» Under Coach Flo, Auburn is 5-0 when scoring at least 90 points and 29-1 when scoring at least 80 points.

» Auburn's total of 887 points through 11 games (80.6 average) are its most since the 2008-09 season, when the Tigers scored 907 in their first 11 contests (82.5 average).

SEEING DOUBLE

» Auburn players have recorded seven double-doubles through 11 games with six coming from sophomore Unique Thompson.

» Thompson played a career-high 43 minutes and scored 21 points with 18 rebounds in an 86-81 OT win over North Carolina on Dec. 20.

» Thompson earned her fifth double-double with 14 points and 17 rebounds in a 95-79 win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2.

» Thompson had 16 points and 13 rebounds for her third straight double-double and fifth of the season vs. Louisiana-Lafayette (11/25). She has now had 3 straight double-doubles in back-to-back seasons.

» With her 19-point, 14-rebound effort at Iowa State, Thompson recorded her 10th career double-double. She had reached the milestone by halftime with 16 points and 10 rebounds in the opening 20 minutes; it was the second time in her career she had a double-double by halftime.

» Thompson's 19-point, 19-rebound double-double at New Mexico was her second of the season and marked a career-high in rebounding for the Auburn sophomore.

» Thompson picked up where she left off in 2017-18 with her eighth career double-double, notching 14 points and 13 rebounds in the season-opener against Grambling. And Janiah McKay earned the second of her career with 16 points and 10 assists.

» The last time two Auburn players had a double-double in the same game was Dec. 13, 2015, at Marquette, when Tra'Cee Tanner (13 pts/12 rebs) and Brandy Montgomery (24 pts/12 rebs) did so.

TURNING UP THE PRESSURE

» The Tigers are 4-0 this season and 48-8 under Coach Flo when forcing at least 25 turnovers.

» Auburn has forced at least 20 turnovers in eight games so far in 2018-19.

» The Tigers scored 38 points off 27 North Carolina turnovers in an 86-81 OT win on Dec. 20 in Myrtle Beach.

» Auburn forced a season-high of 29 turnovers against Samford on Dec. 16, turning those into 30 points. The Tigers then forced 23 turnovers by Coastal Carolina two days later, scoring another 30 points.

» Auburn ranked No. 2 in the nation in steals (13.2/game) and No. 3 in turnovers forced (22.9) for the

2017-18 season.

» Last year, the Tigers forced at least 20 turnovers in 23 of 29 games last year, including 10 games with at least 25 opponent turnovers. Auburn was 8-2 last year and has won 26 of its last 29 when forcing at least 25 turnovers.

» Auburn's season high of turnovers forced last year was 35 against ULM, which tied for the second-most by Auburn under Coach Flo and the eighth-most in program history.

RAINTHREE COUNTY

» Auburn set a school record with 13 made 3-pointers in a 95-79 win over Oklahoma on Dec. 2. The Tigers got four apiece from Emari Jones and Robyn Benton, three from Daisa Alexander and two from Brooke Moore.

» The previous record for a single game was 12, set on Dec. 5, 2007, in a 99-47 win over Colgate. Since 2000, the Tigers have made at least 10 treys in a game 10 times; the most recent was an 82-75 win at Florida on New Year's Day in 2017 when Auburn hit 11 from long range.

» Auburn is averaging 7.0 made 3-pointers per game this season with 77 makes through 11 games. The program record for 3-pointers in a season is 181 (5.7/game), set during the 2016-17 season.

WORKING OVERTIME

» Auburn played its first overtime game since 2017 on Dec. 20, defeating North Carolina 86-81 in the Carolinas Challenge in Myrtle Beach, S.C. It was Auburn's first OT win since defeating Arkansas 71-60 on Jan. 24, 2016.

CROSS-COUNTRY TREK

» From Nov. 10-14 as part of the Preseason WNIT that featured road games at New Mexico and Iowa State, the Tigers traveled 3,741 miles and visited six states in five days:

- Auburn to Atlanta Airport: 100 miles
- Atlanta to Albuquerque: 1,271 miles
- Albuquerque to Phoenix: 330 miles
- Phoenix to Des Moines: 1,155 miles
- Des Moines to Ames (and back): 80 miles
- Des Moines to St. Louis: 237 miles
- St. Louis to Atlanta: 468 miles
- Atlanta to Auburn: 100 miles

» Auburn has also made treks to New Orleans and Philadelphia in the non-conference season, and is in the midst of a 6-day trip to Myrtle Beach, S.C., and Elon, N.C.

» Auburn welcomes four newcomers to the roster for 2018-19, all freshmen. Joining the Tigers this season are Robyn Benton (G, 5-9, Conyers, Ga.); Brooke Moore (G, 5-7, McDonough, Ga.); Erin Howard (G/F, 6-1, Madison, Wis.); and Natalie Kelly (F, 6-3, Albany, La.).

» The Tigers' 2018-19 freshman class was rated the No. 13 signing class in the country by ESPN HoopGurlz.

» Redshirt junior G Crystal Primm (West Palm Beach, Fla.) is eligible this season after sitting out last year under NCAA transfer rules. She transferred to Auburn from Duke in the summer of 2017 and has two years of eligibility.

» Redshirt freshman Kiyae' White (Macungie, Pa.) will be in action this season after sitting out last year while rehabbing an injury.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

» Auburn signed five players to NLI's during the early signing period in November.

» The Tigers will welcome **Lauren Hansen** (5-8, G, Setauket, N.Y.); **Annie Hughes** (5-9, G, Pisgah, Ala.); **Maliya Perry** (6-0, G/F, Pickerington, Ohio); **Morgan Robinson-Nwagwu** (5-8, G, Norcross, Ga.); and **Sania Wells** (5-7, G, Hurley, Miss.) to The Plains beginning in the fall of 2019.

TIGERS IN THE PROS

» DeWanna Bonner completed her ninth season in the WNBA in 2018, all with the Phoenix Mercury, after taking the 2017 season off for the birth of her twins. Bonner had one of her best pro seasons, averaging 17.3 points, 7.2 rebounds and 3.2 assists while starting all 34 games. She was a beast in the 2018 playoffs, averaging 24.0 points and 11.1 rebounds in seven postseason games. Bonner was named the Associated Press' WNBA Comeback Player of the Year.

» Brandy Montgomery is playing in Europe for her second season, currently on the roster of Luxembourg side Etzella Ettelbruck. Last year, she played for Visby in Sweden, averaging 16.3 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists while helping her team to the league semifinals.

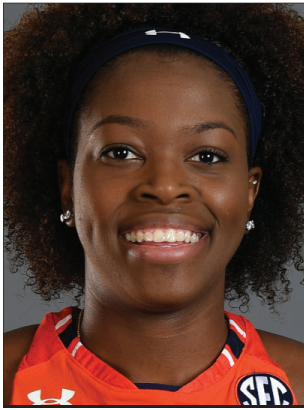

AUBURN --Janiah McKay and Unique Thompson both recorded double-doubles as the Auburn women's basketball team posted its highest scoring output of the Terri Williams-Flournoy era with a 97-48 victory over Grambling State Tuesday at Auburn Arena.

Led by 16 points from McKay and freshman Robyn Benton, Auburn (1-0) had six players in double figures, the first time for the Tigers to hit that mark since the 2008-09 season.

Along with the 16 points from McKay and Benton, the Tigers got 15 points from redshirt junior Crystal Primm in her Auburn debut, 14 points from Thompson, and 13 each from Daisa Alexander and Emari Jones.

Thompson posted her eighth career double-double with a team-high 13 rebounds to go with her 14 points. And McKay recorded the second double-double of her career, notching 10 assists to go with her 16 points. It was the first time for Auburn to have two players with a double-double in the same game since the 2015-16 season when Tra'Ce'e Tanner and Brandy Montgomery pulled off the feat.

Auburn shot 53.5 percent from the field, scored 97 points and had 53 rebounds - all higher totals than in any game last season. The Tigers' 97 points were the most of the Coach Flo era and the highest output since scoring 119 against Sam Houston State in 2008 - also the last time the Tigers had at least six players in double-figures.

Every player that dressed for Auburn scored. Sophomore Abigail Jackson had four points along with five rebounds, and freshmen Kiyae' White (3 points, 4 rebounds), Erin Howard (2 points, 3 rebounds) and Natalie Kelly (1 point, 1 rebound) found the stat sheet in their Auburn debuts.

After Grambling scored the first four points of the game and took a 6-3 lead, Auburn went on a 16-1 run over the next four-plus minutes to take a 19-9 lead. Grambling would get no closer than 9 points the rest of the way. Auburn ended the first half on a 12-0 run to take a 44-20 lead to the break.

AUBURN -- Auburn jumped out to a big early lead and had another strong offensive performance Friday night in an 80-59 win over Nicholls State in the first round of the Preseason Women's NIT.

It was Auburn's second-straight game scoring at least 80 points; the Tigers scored 80 or more just twice all of last season. Despite a cold fourth quarter, Auburn shot 45.1% from the field and made 12-of-13 free throws.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- Sophomore Unique Thompson had 19 points and a career-high 19 rebounds as Auburn won a thriller at New Mexico, 79-76, to advance to the semifinals of the Preseason Women's NIT.

With 17 seconds to play and the score tied 76-all, junior Daisa Alexander hit a baseline jumper, got fouled, and made the free throw to give the Tigers (3-0) a three-point lead. New Mexico (1-1), who had hit 12 3-pointers in the game, had two looks at a tying try in the final three seconds but missed both as the clock expired.

Thompson's 19-point, 19-rebound effort marked her second double-double in three games and the ninth of her career. The 19 rebounds were the most by an Auburn player since Tra'Ce'e Tanner also had 19 at Florida Gulf Coast during the 2015-16 season.

Auburn took advantage of early New Mexico fouls, hitting 8-of-12 free throws in the first quarter and 15-of-20 in the first half. Those points were sorely needed because the Tigers managed just 30.3 percent from the field in the opening half. Despite that, Auburn finished the second quarter on a 7-0 run - a 3-pointer from Emari Jones and four points from Janiah McKay - to take a 36-33 lead to the break.

The foul count went down and the shooting percentages went up in the second half as the Tigers shot 52.9 percent in the final 20 minutes. The lead changed hands 10 different times during the second half alone - including the closing seconds of the third quarter. The Lobos took a 56-54 lead with five seconds to play on a pair of free throws, but freshman Erin Howard drained a buzzer-beating 3-pointer to give the Tigers a 57-56 lead through three periods.

Auburn then moved ahead by as many as five points with 4:40 to play, taking a 70-65 lead out of the final minute timeout on a pair of Thompson free throws. But in a span of two New Mexico possessions, the Lobos were back ahead 71-70 on a pair of 3-pointers.

McKay hit a jumper to give the Tigers a 76-73 lead with exactly a minute to play, but the Lobos answered with their 12th 3-pointer of the game to knot the score at 76-76, setting up Alexander's game-winner.

AMES, Iowa -- A furious comeback by the Auburn women's basketball team fell just short Tuesday night as the Tigers dropped a 67-64 battle at Iowa State in the Preseason WNIT semifinal.

Trailing by 10 with less than two minutes to play, senior Jannah McKay made three straight 3-pointers in less than a minute - the last coming with 41 seconds left - to tie the game at 64-all. But the Tigers were unable to get a shot away in their final two possessions, and a Cyclone layup with 9 seconds to play was the difference.

Sophomore Unique Thompson had her second straight double-double and third of the season with 19 points and 14 rebounds. Emari Jones matched a season-high with 15 points, and McKay's late flurry gave her a 14-point night.

Auburn was playing its third game in five days in three different states and will have traveled over 3,700 miles since Saturday by the time the team returns home Wednesday.

Thompson dominated both ends of the floor in the first half, racking up 16 points and 10 rebounds by halftime. Meanwhile, Iowa State started cold, shooting 18 percent in the first quarter and 28 percent in the first half as the Tigers were able to build an early lead. Auburn led by as many as 15 late in the second quarter before the Cyclones cut the lead to nine at the break, 38-29.

A 3-pointer from Jones to start the second half pushed the Tigers' lead to 12. But from there, the Cyclones caught fire. A 10-0 ISU run cut the lead to two with 6:34 left in the quarter, and a buzzer-beating 3-pointer tied the game at 45-45.

The Cyclones took their first lead nine seconds into the fourth quarter and never trailed again, going on an 8-0 run to push the advantage to 10 points at 64-54 with 2:21 to play. But after a Jones free throw cut the deficit to nine, McKay, who had been quiet most of the night, hit three 3-pointers in a span of 47 seconds to tie the game.

Auburn shot 41.1% for the game, but just 31% in the second half. Meanwhile, Iowa State shot 47% in the second half, including 40% on 3-pointers. The Cyclones won the rebounding battle 42-36, including 16 offensive rebounds which turned into 14 second-chance points.

AUBURN -- Returning to the court for the first time in 12 days, the Auburn women's basketball team picked up a 71-59 victory over Louisiana-Lafayette at Auburn Arena on Sunday afternoon.

The win was the 10th straight home non-conference victory for Auburn (7-1), dating back to the 2016-17 season.

Sophomore Unique Thompson recorded her third straight double-double and fourth of the season grabbing 13 rebounds while dropping 16 points; she also led the team with four steals.

Freshman Robyn Benton added 15 points going 2-for-3 from beyond the 3-point line. Senior Jannah McKay finished with 13 points and six assists. Emari Jones had eight points and a career-high 10 rebounds, and Daisa Alexander finished with a career-high eight assists.

Auburn jumped out to a quick 15-5 lead behind five points apiece from Thompson and Benton in the opening five minutes. Louisiana (2-3) answered back to cut the Tigers' lead to four at 17-13 after the first quarter. Auburn again pushed ahead by as many as 12 following a Benton jumper with 59 seconds remaining in the half. Louisiana hit a late pair of free throws to cut the Auburn advantage to eight at the half, 34-26.

After the two teams exchanged buckets for much of the 3rd period, the Tigers began to pull away in the fourth quarter opening on an 11-3 run to increase their lead to as much as 16 points at 61-45 with just over five minutes to play. But the Cajuns answered back with a 16-5 run of their own to cut the Auburn lead to as little as five points with 1:25 to play. Auburn would force five turnovers in the last 85 seconds and took advantage of free-throw opportunities to seal the win.

The Tigers forced a season-best 26 turnovers, scoring 27 points on those takeaways. Auburn shot 44.3 percent from the floor and held the Cajuns to 33.3 percent.

Louisiana was paced by Ty/Reona Doucet, who finished with 13 points along with 13 rebounds. Brandi Williams finished with 15 points for the Ragin' Cajuns.

NEW ORLEANS -- Senior Emari Jones scored 16 points to lead three Tigers in double-figures as Auburn women's basketball defeated Xavier (La.) 77-58 Wednesday night.

It was the 250th career head coaching victory for Auburn's Terri Williams-Flournoy, now in her seventh season at Auburn and 15th as a collegiate head coach.

Auburn (5-1) took advantage of 25 turnovers by the Gold Nuggets, turning those into 24 points. The Tigers also used a big early run in the third quarter to break open what had been a nine-point game at the half.

Jones' 16 points led all scorers; she also added four rebounds and a pair of assists. Unique Thompson finished with 15 points and a game-high eight rebounds, and Daisa Alexander used a 10-point third quarter to finish with 13 along with six rebounds and five assists. Jannah McKay had a team-leading seven assists along with nine points and five rebounds.

The Tigers shot 43.9 percent from the floor and hit a season-high 10 3-pointers - four from Jones - and had 22 assists on their 29 field goals. Auburn also recorded 14 steals; Thompson and Alexander had three apiece.

Auburn opened the third quarter on a 7-0 run to push a nine-point halftime lead to 16 at 46-30. The Gold Nuggets would cut the lead to as few as nine late in the period, but a 3-pointer at the buzzer from Alexander gave Auburn a 59-44 lead headed to the fourth.

Auburn saw balanced scoring through a well-played first half on both sides that saw the Tigers take a 39-30 lead to the break. Jones had 10 first-half points and 10 of 11 Auburn players scored as the Tigers shot 46.9 percent from the floor. But Xavier was hot from outside, hitting four 3-pointers to keep things within single-digits.

All 11 players in uniform saw extended playing time, including 14 minutes from freshman Brooke Moore, who had three points in her Auburn debut.

Jas Hill led Xavier with 13 points and Nahrie Pierce added 10. The Gold Nuggets played the game as an exhibition, but the records and statistics count for Auburn.

AUBURN-- Auburn hit 13 3-pointers to set a new school record Sunday afternoon as the Tigers defeated Oklahoma 95-79 at Auburn Arena in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge.

Led by a double-double from sophomore Unique Thompson, five players scored in double-figures for the Tigers (6-1), who snapped an eight-game losing streak against Big 12 opponents and earned their 11th straight home non-conference win.

The Tigers made 13 3-pointers on the night, breaking the previous record of 12 that was set Dec. 5, 2007 - nearly 11 years ago to the day - against Colgate. Daisa Alexander's third triple of the night with 3:48 to play gave the Tigers an 83-65 lead and set the new program mark.

Thompson finished with 17 points and 14 rebounds for her fifth double-double of the year. She now has 12 double-doubles for her career, tied for 12th in Auburn history. Alexander led the Auburn attack with 19 points and also had a game-high five assists along with five rebounds.

Emari Jones hit four of Auburn's 13 treys and finished with 16 points, and Crystal Primm and Robyn Benton added 14 points apiece; Primm had a team-leading three steals, and Benton also knocked down four 3-pointers.

Auburn got off to a slow start as the Sooners opened up with a flurry of 3-pointers, taking a 24-17 lead after one quarter. But the Tigers started the second period on an 11-0 run to take a lead they would never relinquish. Auburn shot 52.6 percent in the second quarter and held the Sooners to just 2-of-11 from the field, outscoring Oklahoma 27-6 in the period to take a 44-30 halftime lead.

The Tigers' lead ballooned to as much as 22 points early in the third quarter at 52-30, but the Sooners mounted a charge with a 19-2 run over the next five minutes to cut the deficit to as few as five points.

Auburn let loose in the fourth, shooting 64.7 percent in the final 10 minutes to put the game away. The Tigers hit three straight 3-pointers in a stretch of less than three minutes, pushing the lead to 18 on Alexander's record-setting shot with 3:48 to play.

PHILADELPHIA -- Jannah McKay scored a season-high 21 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team held off a furious late rally by St. Joseph's to pick up an 81-70 win on the road Thursday night.

At 7-1, the Tigers are off to their best start of the Terri Williams-Flournoy era and their best since the 2008-09 SEC Championship team won their first 20 games. But the victory was not without its tense moments as St. Joseph's (3-6) went on a tear in the second half to nearly erase a 15-point Auburn lead.

McKay's 21 points led all scorers and she was key in the fourth quarter when she scored nine points and hit 6-of-8 free throws in the closing minutes.

Auburn had five total players in double-figures for the second straight game. Daisa Alexander finished with 16 after an 11-point first quarter, Crystal Primm scored 14, Unique Thompson had 12 and Brooke Moore added a season-high 10. Thompson was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.

The Tigers led by as many as 15 in the third quarter at 49-34 but saw St. Joseph's go on a furious tear, hitting eight shots in a row and 12-of-14 over a stretch that spanned the third and fourth quarters, to cut the lead to just one at 65-64 with just over six minutes to play.

But Auburn would finally get some defensive stops and put some distance between themselves and the Hawks, going on a 9-0 run to take a 74-64 lead with 2:52 left. The run was punctuated by a steal and fast-break basket by redshirt freshman Kiyae' White, drawing a huge cheer from a group of friends and family from her nearby hometown of Macungie, Pa.

St. Joe's cut it to four points again at 74-70 after a pair of treys, but Auburn took care of business at the free-throw line in the final minute to put the game away.

AUBURN -- The Auburn women's basketball team forced a season-high 29 turnovers and turned in their best defensive performance of the season in a 73-46 win over Samford Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (8-1) improved to 5-0 at home and won their 12th straight home non-conference game, and did so in convincing fashion despite shooting below 40 percent for the first time this season.

Senior Jannah McKay scored a game-high 20 points, her second straight game with at least 20 in the scoring column. She also had a team-leading four steals and four assists. Daisa Alexander added 16 points, and Robyn Benton scored 10 off the bench. Unique Thompson was Auburn's leading rebounder with six.

The Tigers shot 39.1 percent, their lowest of the season, but limited Samford (3-8) to a 37-percent day and fewer scoring opportunities. Auburn also took advantage of several opportunities at the free-throw line, hitting 17-of-20 (85%) on the day. Auburn turned those 29 Samford turnovers into 30 points. Samford's 46 points were also the fewest allowed by Auburn this season; the Tigers held the Bulldogs to single-digit scoring in each of the first three quarters before a 22-point outburst by Samford in the fourth.

Auburn jumped out to a 9-0 lead, and Samford would pull no closer the rest of the game. The Tigers led 20-8 after one period and 36-17 at halftime after holding the Bulldogs, who rely heavily on the 3-point shot, to just one trey in the first half.

The Tigers led by as many as 32 in the third quarter and took a 56-24 lead to the final period. Samford found its shooting touch in the final 10 minutes, hitting five 3-pointers to cut the final margin to 27.

Natalie Armstrong had a double-double for Samford with 10 points and 16 rebounds. Shaunta Battle was the Bulldogs' leading scorer with 11.
