DAYTON TRAVELS TO NO. 8 AUBURN FOR FIRST ROAD TEST

The University of Dayton Flyers play their first true road game Saturday, Dec. 8 when they travel to Auburn, Alabama to visit 8th-ranked Auburn. Game time is 8:30 p.m. ET. Dayton is 5-3 this season, with the losses to No. 4 Virginia, Oklahoma and No. 25 Mississippi State.

The game will be carried by WHIO Radio, and televised by the SEC Network. Streaming audio, streaming video and stats will be available at DaytonFlyers.com.

THE NEARLY-TRANSFORMED UD ARENA

The University of Dayton is past the halfway point of a \$72 million renovation of its Arena. The transformation of University of Dayton Arena will occur in three phases - from 2017 to 2019. Phase II included new entrances on three of the four sides, a new box office, new seats in the 300 and 400 levels on the east side and a new and expanded concourse on the east side.

#TRENDING

- Redshirt freshman forward Obi Toppin came off the bench in UD's 98-59 win over Detroit Mercy to set a UD record with eight dunks in the game. Toppin had the second double-double of his career with 22 points and 11 rebounds in 25 minutes.
- Dayton had a team-record 12 dunks as well, besting the old record by three.
- Saturday's Auburn game will be the first time the Flyers played at a Top Ten team since Dec. 31, 2006, when the Flyers played at No. 2 North Carolina. UNC won 81-51.
- Saturday's game will be UD's third game against a ranked opponent in the last five. That has not happened for the Red & Blue since February of 2003.
- Jalen Crutcher was Dayton's top performer at the Battle4Atlantis, reaching double figures all three games, and averaging 15.0 points and 5.2 assists per contest. UD was fourth at B4A.
- Crutcher scored 20 in the Butler win, and has 88 points in his last six games. He scored 18 in the first two games of the season. He has made 20 of 41 3-pt. FG (.488) after missing his first six three-pointers of the season.
- Dayton shot .543 (25-46) in the Virginia game, the highest FG% against UVa. in the last two seasons. That was in the Battle4Atlantis semifinals. Virginia won the tournament.
- After missing the first two games of the year with a hand injury, Josh Cunningham led UD with 20 points (9-10 FG) and eight rebounds in his 2018-19 debut vs. Purdue Fort Wayne.
- Cunningham did not practice for four days (Nov. 24-28) due to food poisoning, but came off the bench for 11 points and five rebounds in 25 minutes vs. No. 25 Mississippi State.
- Ryan Mikesell currently averages 13.0 ppg, at home, and 4.3 away from UD Arena.

UP NEXT

- After exam week, UD will play Tulsa in the Basketball Hall of Fame Holiday Classic on Sunday, Dec. 16. That is part of a tripleheader at Mohegan Sun Casino. Tip time is 3:30 p.m. ET.
- Dayton will then return home for four straight home games, beginning with Western Michigan on Dec. 19.

PLAYER NOTES

ALL-CONFERENCE CUNNINGHAM

- Josh Cunningham missed the season's first two games, but led UD with 20 points (9-10 FG) and eight rebounds in the PFW win.
- He scored 18 with another 8 boards vs. Butler.
- Cunningham led UD with 15 vs. Virginia.
- Had 20 points in the Detroit Mercy win.
- Josh Cunningham was named First Team Preseason All-Atlantic 10 at A-10 Media Day.
- He is the ninth Dayton player named to the preseason first team in the last 15 years.
- The others are Charles Cooke (2016), Jordan Sibert (2014), Kevin Dillard (2012), Chris Wright (2010 and 2009), Brian Roberts (2007), Monty Scott (2005) and Keith Waleskowski (2003).
- Bounced back from a horrific ankle injury early in the 2016-17 season to have an all-conference type of season in 2017-18.
- Cunningham was Second Team NABC All-District and Third Team All-Atlantic 10.
- Led the Flyers in scoring (15.6), rebounding (8.4) and field goal percentage (.646).
- That .646 FG% was fifth nationally.
- Set a program record with 22 consecutive field goals during a three-game stretch (Dec. 3-9) last year. The previous mark was 18 held by Sean Finn during the 2002-03 season.
- Had 10 double-doubles last year.
- Three-time captain.
- Transfer from Bradley.
- Including his season as a Brave, now has 890 points in his college career.

POWER OF THREE

- The three scholarship players in Dayton's senior and junior classes are UD's 2018-19 team captains.
- Redshirt senior Josh Cunningham is a captain for the third season. He is only the second three-time captain in school history (former teammate Scoochie Smith was the other).
- Redshirt junior Ryan Mikesell and true junior Trey Landers are the other two captains.
- The captains were selected in a vote of the members of the team.

TREY IN UPRIGHT & LOCKED POSITION

- Trey Landers earned UD's Chris Daniels Memorial Award in 2017-18, which goes to Dayton's most improved player.
- Landers qualified for it in two ways; He was Dayton's most improved player from the 2016-17 season to 2017-18 season, and he was also the most improved Flyer from the beginning of last season to the end.
- He was the only freshman on UD's 2016-17 team, playing in nine games and averaging 3.0 points and 1.4 rebounds.
- One year later, Landers was third on the team in scoring (11.3) and second in rebounding (5.6).
- Over the final 10 games of the year, the Dayton native was the Flyers' top player, averaging 15.8 points and 7.1 rebounds, while shooting .634 (64 of 101) from the field, .391 (9 of 23) from beyond the arc and .724 (21 of 29) from the line.
- Landers had a double-double of 12 points and 10 rebounds vs. Oklahoma.
- Played 19 minutes vs. Detroit, with eight points (2-2 FG, 3-4 FT), six rebounds and five assists.
- Dayton's most physical and emotional player.
- One can only imagine games in the driveway between him and his brother, Ohio State defensive tackle Robert Landers.

WHAT IS HIP?

- Ryan Mikesell sat out all of 2017-18 while rehabbing surgery on both of his hips that was performed during the summer of 2017.
- Mikesell scored 18 points and 10 rebounds vs. Coppin State for his second career double-double.
- He had 15 points and seven rebounds vs. No. 25 Mississippi State.
- The improvement in his lateral quickness and overall mobility after the surgeries is clear.
- Even though he missed all of 2017-18, he has played more games in a Dayton uniform than anyone else on the team. Mikesell has played in 61 games, ahead of Josh Cunningham (47) and Trey Landers (45).
- Mikesell played in all 32 games and started 24 (after Cunningham's injury) in 2016-17.
- He averaged 5.7 points and 3.9 rebounds as a soph.
- Would play guard on most teams due to his court vision and ball-handling ability.

DELIVERING IN THE CRUTCHER

- Jalen Crutcher opened the season with nine points, seven rebounds, and four assists in a team-high 38 minutes against North Florida.
- Crutcher led UD with 20 points (6-8 FG, 3-4 3-pt.) with a team-high three assists against Butler.
- He had 11, 7 and just 1 turnover vs. Virginia.
- Played 111 out of 120 minutes in three days at the Battle4Atlantis.
- Had 16 points and six assists in the Detroit win.
- Crutcher was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team as a freshman in 2017-18.
- Played in all 31 games, starting 22.
- Was UD's fourth-leading scorer at 9.2 points per game, and led the Flyers in assists (4.4).
- The 4.4 assists were the second-best mark ever by a Flyer freshman.
- In his first career start, he led UD with 18 points at Mississippi State, much to the delight of the nearly 100 family and friends who made the drive from his hometown of Memphis.
- Came close to recording Dayton's first ever triple-double with 12 points, 10 assists and eight rebounds at home against VCU.

AIR JORDAN

- Jordan Davis opened the 2018-19 season with 16 points (2-2 from 3-pt.) vs. North Florida. He also led UD with two steals.
- He had 12 points and six rebounds vs. Oklahoma.
- Had 13 points and led UD w/seven assists and held Mike Davis, Jr. to a season-low 18 points vs. UDM.
- Davis has 19 assists against just seven turnovers so far in 2018-19.
- As a freshman, Davis played in all 31 games, starting 22 as a freshman in 2017-18.
- He was Dayton's fifth-leading scorer (8.0).
- His .394 (56 of 142) three-point shooting percentage led UD, was ninth overall in the A-10 and was the top mark in the conference among freshmen.
- Davis has already shot 20 free throws in seven games, after taking just 26 in 31 games as a freshman.
- He is the first-ever Flyer from South Carolina.

YOUTH WAS SERVED

- Classmates Jalen Crutcher and Jordan Davis both started 22 games in their rookie season.
- The combined 44 starts were easily the most by a pair of freshmen in Dayton basketball history.
- Not only did Davis and Crutcher start a combined 44 games, they had the best two assist-to-turnover ratios on the team (Davis 2.48, Crutcher 2.11).

TIP TOPPIN

- Obadiah (please call him "Obi") Toppin set a Dayton record with eight dunks en route to a 22-point, 11 rebound performance vs. Detroit Mercy.
- He had three dunks in the first five minutes of his college career.
- Had 10 dunks in the first three games of his career, now 21 for the season.
- He is the only freshman in the country this season to dunk on his first two career field goal attempts.
- Is shooting .692 (46-65) from the floor, .581 (25-43) on non-dunk FG's and .800 (8-10) FT. He's even 1-for-1 on three pointers.
- Toppin had 19 points (8-10 FG) vs. Coppin State.
- He was named A-10 co-Rookie of the Week after Week One.
- Toppin had 13 points (6-7 FG) against Virginia.
- He was an academic redshirt in 2017-18, but he didn't just get smarter, he got bigger and better, adding 24 pounds while setting a high standard for work ethic in practice.
- Even though he sat out 2017-18, he was awarded UD's Dr. George Rau Spirit Award and was the first non-active player to win that award. (NOTE: "Rau" rhymes with "cow")
- Was 6-foot-2 as a high school junior, 6-foot-5 as a senior and is now UD's tallest player at 6-foot-9.
- Played one season of varsity HS ball, and another prep season before coming to UD.
- Averaged 20.6 points, 8.1 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.0 steals as a senior in high school
- At Mt. Zion Prep in Baltimore in 2016-17, averaged 17 points, eight rebounds and four assists.

CINDERELLA STORY

- Obi Toppin was a mini-social media sensation over the summer when he put on a show in a run with some NBA players in a gym in mid-town Manhattan.
- Toppin, who is from the New York area, was invited to play at NBA trainer Chris Brickley's "Black Ops" games when they were going to be short a player.
- Among the players there that day were Carmelo Anthony, C.J. McCollum and Enes Kantner.
- Toppin more than held his own and when video of his dunks, step-back jumpers and blocked shots were posted (along with another video of him taking off from the free throw line and dunking after the games were over), he got some unexpected, if welcome, attention for him and the program.

JHERY! JHERY! JHERY!

- Jherly Matos suffered two torn ligaments in his left foot in the Oklahoma game and following surgery, will miss the remainder of the 2018-19 season.
- Matos played a key role off the bench in the PFW win, getting seven points, six rebounds and four assists in 28 minutes.
- He was also in at crunch time in the Butler win, getting four points and three rebounds in 24 minutes of action.
- Matos comes to Dayton after a standout season at Monroe Community College in Brighton, NY.
- He was a Third Team NJCAA All-American.
- Matos averaged 17.7 points, 6.2 rebounds and 3.0 assists in his only season at Monroe.
- He shot 43.1% from the field, 35.8% from three-point range and 71.3% from the free throw line.
- A native of Santo Domingo, Matos has played for the Dominican Republic's U19 team and has trained with the national team.

DON DONOHER RECEIVES USBWA'S DEAN SMITH AWARD

- National College Basketball Hall of Famer Don Donoher was named the winner of the 2017 Dean Smith Award given annually by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association.
- He was the third individual to receive the honor. Former Georgetown coach John Thompson was the first recipient, followed by Michigan State coach Tom Izzo.
- This year's winner is Temple coach Fran Dunphy.
- Donoher retired in 1989 after 25 years as Dayton's head coach with 437 career victories, the most in UD history.

THE KID FROM CLEVELAND

- Dwayne Cohill is a four-star recruit from Holy Name High School in Cleveland.
- He scored 2,182 points at Holy Name, graduating as No. 31 in Ohio high school career scoring.
- As a senior, he averaged 21.9 points, 5.2 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 3.4 steals.
- A versatile guard, he averaged 22.9 points, 6.9 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.5 steals per game as a junior.
- Cohill was a two-time First Team All-Ohio selection.
- He scored five points and had two assists in 18 minutes of action in his first college action vs. North Florida.
- Cohill had two points and one assist in 18 minutes vs. UDM.
- Even though he earned a reputation as a high-volume scorer in high school, early in his college career he is making his presence felt as a defender and efficient backup point guard.
- His +/- numbers for his first three games were +16, +10 and +23.

FRANKIE GOES TO DAYTON

- Frankie Policelli made his Dayton debut against Mississippi State with two minutes and an assist against Mississippi State.
- It was hoped that he would be able to use 2018-19 as a developmental redshirt season, but injuries and illness dictated he move into the rotation.
- Played 16 minutes with two points and four assists vs. UDM.
- Policelli played his senior season at Long Island Lutheran High and was named Second Team All-New York.
- He averaged 12.2 points and 6.0 rebounds, while shooting 40 percent from three-point range and 86 percent from the line.
- Policelli helped Long Island Lutheran to a 22-3 overall record and a state-wide No. 1 ranking in Class AA.
- As a junior at New Hartford High School, Policelli averaged 28.1 points and 13.0 rebounds until a mid-season knee injury cut his campaign short.

YOU DON'T KNOW JACK

- Senior walk-on Jack Westerfield worked his way in to the Flyer's rotation as a junior, playing in 10 games and averaging 4.6 minutes a game.
- He drained two three-pointers, was two-for-two from the line and had two steals in 2017-18.
- Along with Ryan Mikesell, Westerfield is a member of UD's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.
- Was the 2017-18 winner of the John L. Macbeth Scholar-Athlete Award, which goes to the upperclassman with the highest GPA.

WALK ON BY

- A trio of walk-ons round out the active Flyer roster.
- Sophomore Camron Greer played in four games last season, and hit a three-pointer. He had two assists in the Capital exhibition.
- The two newest Flyers -- Jabali Leonard and Christian Wilson were added to the roster the afternoon of the Capital exhibition game and both scored in that evening's game.

SUPER SENIOR

- Josh Cunningham is UD's only scholarship senior this year.
- Dayton is one of 16 teams that have one or fewer scholarship seniors on its roster in 2018-19.
- The others are Cal State Northridge, Chattanooga, Drexel, Duke, Duquesne, East Carolina, Idaho, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana Tech, North Florida, Oklahoma State, Richmond, UNC Asheville and Virginia.
- Cal State Northridge, Duquesne, North Florida and Virginia have zero scholarship seniors.

DAYTON'S NBA LINEAGE CONTINUES

- Kostas Antetokounmpo was the final pick of the 2018 NBA draft, and signed a two-way contract with the Dallas Mavericks.
- Former Flyer Charles Cooke played in the NBA in 2017-18 on a two-way contract with the New Orleans Pelicans.
- He is one of the 20 former Flyers who have played in the NBA.
- In the last five years, Cooke, Brian Roberts, Chris Johnson and Chris Wright have all represented Dayton in the NBA.

FLYERS BROADCAST GAMES IN CHINESE FOR 4TH STRAIGHT YEAR

- This is the fourth straight year the Flyers are audio broadcasting men's basketball home games in Mandarin Chinese.
- Mandarin is the most widely spoken dialect in China.
- University of Dayton students will be the announcers for the free broadcasts on a rotating basis.
- The announcers are all full-time University of Dayton students, whose majors range from Electro-Optics Engineering to Financial Mathematics.
- Enrollment of Chinese students has increased dramatically from a bare handful to an estimated 450 in the last decade. Chinese students make up the most of any international student population at the University of Dayton.

MUST SEE TV

- For the fourth consecutive year, at least 30 Dayton regular season men's basketball games will be televised during the 2018-19 season.
- UD appears in 18 nationally-televised games via the ESPN family of networks, CBS Sports Network, NBCSN and Stadium Network.
- FOX Sports Ohio and Spectrum Sports Ohio will air 11 home contests of Flyer Basketball.
- The Dayton television market was the eighth-best in the country when it comes to ESPN college basketball, according to research analyzed by ESPN.
- This was the 16th year ESPN compiled the data and Dayton has always been in the top 14 markets. The Dayton area has been in the top 10 eight consecutive years and nine of the last 11.

GRANT HELPS USA BASKETBALL WIN GOLD

- Flyer coach Anthony Grant spent part of his summer serving as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's gold medal-winning entry in the 2018 FIBA Americas U18 Championship for Men which was held June 11-17 in St. Catherines, Ontario.
- Kansas' Hall of Fame coach Bill Self was the team's head coach. Joining Grant on the staff was Danny Manning of Wake Forest.
- This was Grant's second stint with USA Basketball. He was an assistant for the 2008 USA Men's U18 National Team, which played in the FIBA Americas Championship in Argentina.
- Grant is the fourth Flyer coach to serve with USA Basketball. Don Donoher had two stints, most notably as an assistant on the gold medal-winning team at the 1984 Olympics. Oliver Purnell served five times, including at the 2004 Olympics and winning the gold as head coach at the 1999 World University Games. Archie Miller was an assistant when the U.S. won the gold at the 2014 FIBA U19 World Championships.

JUST CAN'T HAVE ENOUGH EXPERIENCE

- UD is one of 14 schools with at least two former head coaches serving as assistants on its staff.
- The others are Boise State, Cal. Evansville, Fairfield, Georgia State, Indiana, Iowa, Maryland, Michigan State, Oklahoma State, Pitt, South Carolina and Washington.
- Associate head coach Anthony Solomon previously coached at St. Bonaventure, while assistant coach Donnie Jones was a head coach at Marshall and Central Florida.

NEW FACES FITTING IN

- During the off-season, the Flyers added assistant coach Donnie Jones (previously a head coach at Marshall and Central Florida), strength and conditioning coach Ed Streit (previously at UConn and the Chicago Bulls) and graduate assistant Sean Damaska (previously a development intern with the Dallas Mavericks).

TRANSFERENCE

- Speaking of new faces, the Flyers have three Division I transfers sitting out the 2018-19 campaign, per NCAA regs.
- Rodney Chatman, a 6-2 point guard from UT Chattanooga.
- Jordy Tshimanga, a 6-11 center from Nebraska.
- Ibi Watson, a 6-5 wing from Michigan.
- UD's leading scorer for the last seven seasons was a transfer.

LOOKING FOR OUR 10 MILLIONTH FAN

- The 10 millionth fan to attend a Flyer basketball game will pass through the turnstiles sometime mid-season, probably during the Georgia Southern or Richmond games.
- Since UD Arena opened in 1969, Dayton has been in the NCAA's Top 35 in attendance every season.

AMAZING IN THE A-10

- Since the 2012-13 season, Dayton has the most conference regular season wins with 75, just ahead of VCU with 73 and St. Bonaventure with 71
- Dayton won the Atlantic 10 regular season title in the 2015-16 and 2016-17 campaigns.

SUCCESS IN THE LATEST GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

- Dayton men's basketball is one of 72 Division I programs with a perfect 100 score in the latest Graduation Success Rate numbers.
- UD is one of four teams in Ohio and one of five in the Atlantic 10.

DID YOU KNOW?

- UD won more games than any other school in both the 1950s and 60s. UD won 435 games between 1950 and 1969 and ranks among the top teams in Division I history in a 20-year period.
- The Flyers' .763 (228-71) winning percentage in the 1950s ranks fifth in the decade. Their .729 (207-77) winning percentage ranks eighth in the 1960s.

DAYTON SIGNS MOULAYE SISSOKO

- During the early signing period, Moulaye Sissoko (pronounced MOO-lie Sis-SO-koe) signed an LOI with UD.
- Sissoko is a 6-foot-10, 223-pound forward from Bamako, Mali who is at Lincoln Academy in Suwannee, Ga.
- After 7 games, he had averaged 15.4 points and 10.6 rebounds this year.

THE FLYER FAITHFUL

- Dayton was 23rd nationally in average attendance in 2017-18 in the annual men's basketball attendance report.
- UD averaged 12,996 fans a game, just 22 less than the previous season's school-record 13,018.
- Dayton was ranked 22nd that season.
- In 2017-18, Dayton had the second-best single-season attendance record averaging 12,997 fans per game.
- Dayton finished in the Top 30 in men's basketball attendance for the 20th straight season.
- The 2017-18 season was the 21st consecutive year with an average attendance of 12,000 or more fans.
- Dayton's game versus North Florida was the 300th consecutive UD regular season home game with an attendance of at least 11,000 fans.
- In the last 18 years, 99% of UD's home games have drawn at least 10,000 (542 of 545).
- UD Arena has 122 sellouts in its 49-year history, including the last two of the three exhibition games.
- Dayton had five regular season sellouts last season: Ball State, Penn, Rhode Island, Fordham and George Washington.
- The record for regular season sellouts is eight in the Arena's first season (1969-70).
- UD is 39,348 fans away from 10 mill.

THE MADNESS STARTS IN DAYTON

- "March Madness" will begin again in Dayton as UD Arena serves as the host site for the 2019 NCAA First Four.
- UD Arena is the all-time leader with 121 NCAA Tournament games hosted.
- That is 38 more than the original home of the NCAA Tournament, Kansas City's Municipal Auditorium.
- Since the NCAA Tournament expanded to 64 teams in 1985, Dayton has hosted the event 22 times.
- The University of Dayton is riding a 18-year streak, including four years (2001, 2006, 2009, 2013) in which it hosted the tournament's opening round game(s) and the next two rounds.
- The First Four is booked at UD Arena through 2022.

The University of Dayton announced Anthony Grant as the 20th head coach in Flyer Basketball history on March 30, 2017.

“I am honored and humbled to be the head coach at the University of Dayton,” Grant said. “It’s a great responsibility to take over at an institution that is so well-respected. Anyone you talk to in college basketball would say our program is a successful one, but the potential is here for so much more.”

Grant was most recently on the coaching staff of the NBA’s Oklahoma City Thunder, working with athletes such as Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook. He spent the last two seasons on Billy Donovan’s staff after nine seasons as head coach at Alabama and VCU and 13 seasons as a Division I assistant coach.

In nine seasons as a head coach, Grant took his teams to three NCAA tournament appearances and six postseason tournament berths. He won his 200th career game at Dayton on Jan. 3, 2018.

Grant is also a 1987 graduate of the University of Dayton, where he was a four-year basketball letterwinner and three-year starter. He played in 105 games at Dayton, averaging 11.6 points and 6.7 rebounds per game over his career. He was the Flyers’ co-captain and the White-Allen Most Valuable Player as a senior. His teams played in two NCAA tournaments and one NIT.

“I join Neil and the entire Flyer Nation in offering a warm welcome to Coach Grant, his wife Christina and their family,” UD President Eric F. Spina said. “In our time together, Anthony clearly demonstrated his ability, his desire to be here and is a clear fit with the University’s values and priorities, which include integrity, the development of character, and winning.”

In six years at Alabama, Grant amassed a record of 117-85 (.579) while guiding the Crimson Tide to the 2012 NCAA Tournament, their first tournament berth since 2006. He also took Alabama to the NIT three times.

Prior to Alabama, the Miami, Fla. native spent three seasons as the head coach of VCU where he led the Rams to a 76-25 (.752) record and three consecutive Colonial Athletic Association Championships. VCU went to the NCAA tournament twice under Grant and was 45-9 (.833) in CAA games.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Grant spent 13 years as a respected Division I assistant coach. The last 10 years were at the University of Florida (1996-2006) where he served under Donovan. Grant helped lead the Gators to their first national title in 2006, and Florida won the national title again in 2007 with players he recruited and developed. Current staffers Donnie Jones and Darren Hertz were also at Florida at the time.

The 20th coach in Dayton’s history, Grant is just the seventh Flyer coach in the last 70 years. In the modern era of UD basketball, Grant is just the second Dayton grad to coach the Flyers. The first was his coach, College BB Hall of Famer Don Donoher (1964-89).

He and his wife Christina have four children.

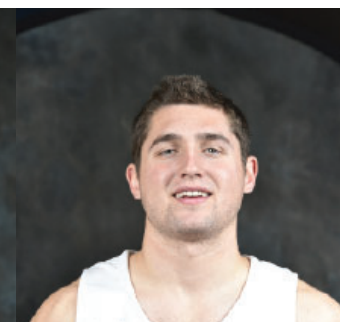

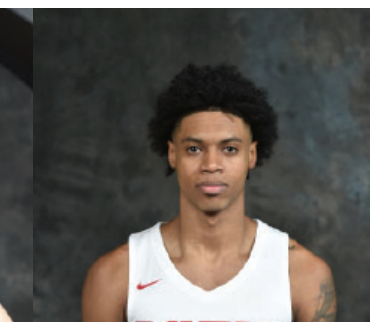

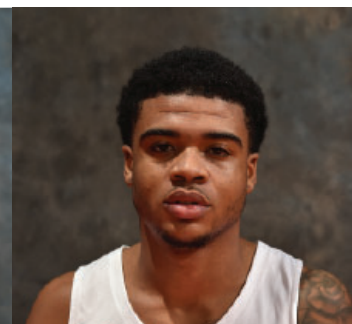
