THREE HITS

The Tigers boast the No. 7 recruiting class in the nation. The class includes three Top 35 players in Mica Allison (No. 7), Taylor Rowland (No. 30) and Tatum Shipes (No. 34).

Auburn senior Brenna McIlroy is on the verge of a handful of major career milestones. The Garland, Texas, product needs just 24 kills for 1,000 over four seasons. In addition, she is 174 digs away from 1,000 in a career. She will become just the seventh Tiger to achieve both numbers.

Despite the exit of Alexa Filley and Jesse Earl, the Tigers return five of seven starters from the 2017 season.

» Auburn Arena is in its sixth season as home of Auburn Volleyball. The Tigers are 43-27 since moving to the Arena in 2013. The facility seats approximately 2,000 fans for volleyball and 9,121 for basketball.

FIRST SERVE

- The Auburn volleyball team kicks off the 2018 season at home, hosting High Point and Michigan in the annual War Eagle Invitational. The two-day tournament is slated for Aug. 24-25 and will be held in Auburn Arena.
- The Tigers open with a 6:30 p.m. CT match against High Point Friday. Saturday starts with an 11 a.m. CT contest between HPU and Michigan before the Tigers and the Wolverines go headto-head at 7 p.m. CT.
- Auburn has an all-time record of 636-629-4 (.501) in its 46th full season of volleyball.
- Head Coach Rick Nold stands at 108-101 in his eightth season on the Plains and is the second-winningest coach in Auburn volleyball history.
- Auburn's 2018 schedule boasts 10 2017 NCAA Tournament participants.
- The Tiger roster features two seniors, four juniors, five sophomores and six freshmen.

LAST TIME OUT

- Auburn concluded the 2017 season with a 15-12 overall reacord and went 8-10 in SEC play. The Tigers finished tied for seventh in the league.
- Key returners for Auburn is senior Brenna McIlroy, juniors Shaina White and Gwyn Jones and sophomore Anna Stevenson.
- McIlroy has led the Tigers in kills every season since arriving on the Plains three years ago and is just 24 kills away from 1,000 in her career.
- White returns as an 2017 AVCA All-South Region honorable mention honoree. She was among the SEC's best in hitting percentage all last year.
- Jones and Stevenson bring height and experience at the middle/right side.
- The back row boasts a wealth of experience in junior Karis Beasley and sophomore Payton White. They each played all sets for the Tigers in 2017.
- Auburn's 2018 incoming class ranked No. 7 nationally.

UP NEXT

Auburn hits the road for the first time for the Butler Invitational, Aug. 31-Sept. 1, in Indianapolis. The Tigers face host Butler Friday at 6 p.m. CT and follow with matches Saturday vs. Illinoi State and Eastern Illinois.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN

- >> The Michigan Wolverines make their first trip to the Plains after a solid 2017 season. Under the direction of 20-year head coach Mark Rosen, the Wolverines finished last season at 21-12 overall and earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.
- >> Michigan is currently receiving votes in the AVCA Top 25 Preseason Poll.
- >> The Wolverines were chosen to finish sixth in the Big Ten Preseason Coaches' poll.
- Senior Carly Skjodt was named to the preseason All-Big Ten team and was one of seven unanimous selections. The outside hitter was an AVCA All-America third team honoree last season.

- >> The Tigers have traveled to Ann Arbor on three occasions in the series history and as 0-3 vs. Michigan.

NOLD IN AUBURN HISTORY

- >> In his eighth season at Auburn, head coach Rick Nold has a 108-101 overall record on the Plains. He became the third coach in program history to record 100 or more wins with the Tigers after Auburn swept Clemson, Sept. 9, 2017.
- >> With his 106th win vs. Alabama (Nov. 1, 2017), he moved up to No. 2 all-time in Auburn volleyball history.

TOP-NOTCH NEWCOMERS

- >>> The 2018 Auburn volleyball signing class is ranked the seventh-best incoming group in the nation.
- >> The 2018 class garnered the highest ranking in program history, featuring three Top 35 Senior Aces and two Gatorade Players of the Year.
- >> Auburn's incoming freshmen are also ranked the secondhighest among Southeastern Conference opponents.
- >> Setter Mica Allison ranked No. 7 on the individual list and spent the summer on the 2018 USA Volleyball Junior National

Team. She was also the Illinois Gatorade Player of the Year.

Outside hitter Taylor Rowland comes to Auburn as the two-time North Carolina Player of the Year, while outside hitter Tatum Shipes was the 2017 8-AAAAA Region Player of the Year in Georgia. Rowland and Shipes were ranked No. 30 and No. 34, respectively.

NEBRASKA TRANSFER

- Sophomore Chesney McClellan is in her first season on the Plains after transferring from defending national champion Nebraska this summer.
- >> McClellan is a 6-4 middle blocker that saw time on the court with the Huskers in four matches last year.

SETTER OUTLOOK

- >> Freshman Mica Allison will be looked to pace the Auburn offense in 2018. The White Heath, Ill., product stands at 6-1, brings a plethora of talent and experience to the Plains.
- >> Allison was an early enrollee in the spring.
- She earned a starting role for the 2018 USA Volleyball Women's Junior National Team, guiding the Americans to the NORCECA title and a berth in the 2019 FIVB U20 World Championship.
- » Returning from last season is now sophomore Morgan Kull, who served as backup to four-year starter Alexa Filley.

OUTSIDE HITTER OUTLOOK

- >> The 2018 outside hitters bring a wealth of diversity for the Auburn Tigers this season.
- >> Leading way on the outside is senior Brenna McIlroy. A 5-11 junior from Garland, Texas, McIlroy has been the team's top attacker on the outside since her freshman season.
- >> McIlroy enters her final campaign on the Plains needing just 24 kills and 174 digs to reach 1,000 in each category. She can become just the seventh Tiger to achieve both milestones in a career
- >> Freshman Taylor Rowland was an early enrollee for Auburn this spring. Standing at 6-3, the Charlotte, N.C., native had an outstanding prep career and was the No. 30 ranked recruit in the nation.
- >> Rowland was a two-time Gatorade North Carolina Player of the Year.
- >> Freshman Tatum Shipes comes to Auburn as the No. 34 recruit nationally, standing at 6-4. She was the 2017 8-AAAAA Region Player of the Year in Georgia.

MIDDLE BLOCKER OUTLOOK

- Auburn's roster has a total of five student-athletes with experience at middle blocker.
- Junior Shaina White returns to the squad after an outstanding first season on the Plains in 2017. She finished among the SEC's best in hitting percentage (.367) and came in second on the team in overall kills (276). Her performances throughout the year helped her earn AVCA All-South Region honorable mention honors.
- Sophomore Anna Stevenson had a solid first year in 2017, leading the team in blocks with 61.
- Junior Gwyn Jones is capable of playing both middle and right side for the Tigers. The 6-3 hitter has been a mainstay in the Auburn lineup since her freshman season.
- Sophomore Chesney McClellan transferred to Auburn from Nebraska. Her 6-4 presence will provide experience and a solid blocking front for the Auburn defense.
- Sophomore Shea McNamara and senior Isabella Thompson both bring strong blocking abilities to provide more defensive options Auburn.

BACK ROW OUTLOOK

- The 2018 edition of the Auburn back row will have to fill the shoes of AVCA All-America honorable mention honoree Jesse
- Junior Karis Beasley and sophomore Payton White played in every set last season and were among the team's best in dig
- Freshmen Bella Rosenthall and Katie Persons join them in Auburn's first line of defense.
- Rosenthall and Persons were both AVCA Phenom List honorees during their prep careers.

TIGERS PICKED SIXTH IN PRESEASON POLL

- Auburn was chosen to finish sixth in the Southeastern Conference in this season's preseason coaches' poll.
- Auburn earned 78 points from the league's 13 coaches.
- Kentucky edged Florida as the favorite to win the

conference championship, securing eight first-place votes and 140 points. Florida had five votes and 137 points. Missouri was selected third, while Georgia and LSU finished in a tie for fourth. Arkansas, Texas A&M, South Carolina, Tennessee, Ole Miss,

Alabama and Mississippi State round out the poll.

Rick Nold enters his eighth season as Auburn's head volleyball coach in 2018 after being named the 10th head coach in program history on April 10, 2011. In his seven seasons on the Plains, Nold has put together an 108-101 overall record (.518). He enters the season with a career winning percentage of .585 in 17 years as a collegiate head coach, having a 280-199 mark.

The 2017 season saw the Tigers go 15-12 overall, picking up big non-conference wins. Auburn opened with a sweep at Georgia Tech and topped then-No. 16 North Carolina and NC State in Puerto Rico. Boasting one of the toughest schedules in the Southeastern Conference, the squad finished 8-10 overall against the league and came in a tie for seventh.

Auburn had one of its best finishes in the SEC in 2016, aging 9-9 and finishing tied for fifth overall. The league finish was the best for the program since 2010 as the squad went 15-16 overall. Jesse Earl and Alexa Filley were named All-SEC and honored by the AVCA All-South region. Earl and Filley both reached 1,000 career digs as juniors and Earl's path to that total marked the fasted by any Tiger in program history. Gwyn Jones picked up SEC All-Freshman honors, marking the second-straight season a Tiger has been recognized.

The 2015 season was an exciting one for the young Tiger team as the squad went 18-12 overall and came in sixth in the conference with an 10-8 mark. The team upped its defensive presence from the previous season and finished second overall among SEC opponents with a 15.62 digs/set average. Freshman Brenna McIlroy earned SEC All-Freshman accolades, marking the first time since 2010 that a Tiger newbie was honored by the league. Stephanie Campbell was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year — the fourth honor in program history. Auburn's 3-2 win over then-No. 11 Florida was the team's first win over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2013 and snapped a 41-match losing streak to the Gators. Auburn finished 11-3 at home in Auburn Arena.

The Tigers finished 19-11 during the 2013 season, tying for sixth in the SEC with a 10-8 conference record. The 10 victories in SEC play were the most by the Tigers since 2010 and just the second time in the last 15 years that Auburn posted 10 wins in league action. Nold also guided the Tigers to their first-ever win over a top-10 opponent, knocking off No. 10 Nebraska, 3-1.

His second season (2012) saw a six-match improvement from his first as he took the Tigers from an 11-19 mark (5-15 SEC) in 2011 to a 17-13 record (8-12 SEC) in 2012. He led the Tigers to nine straight wins to open the season. the second-longest winning streak in program history. Nold also picked up his 200th career head coaching victory on Nov. 4 with a 3-1 win over Georgia.

Nold came to Auburn after directing Jacksonville State to unprecedented heights during his nine-year tenure, winning three regular season conference titles, three conference tournament titles and making three NCAA postseason appearances.


