Friday's matchup is set to be the first meeting is series history between Auburn and CSUN. It is Auburn's first game of the Roman Legends Classic presented by Old Trapper. With its 3-0 start, Auburn has won 15 of its last 16 games dating back to last season.

The Tigers ended last season by winning their last four regular season games before winning four games to win its second SEC Tournament title in program history and then won four games in the NCAA Tournament to advance to their first Final Four.

Auburn is 3-0 to start the season for the second consecutive season and the sixth time since 2000. The Tigers have reached 4-0 in each of the previous six seasons that they started 3-0. Since 2000, Auburn's best start to a season was 7-0 in 2003-04.

The Tigers are looking to achieve a 4-0 start for the second straight season. The last time Auburn began back-to-back campaigns are 4-0 was 1987-88 and 1988-89, coached by current radio analyst Sonny Smith.

Auburn is set to face its fourth-consecutive opponent who was picked to finished third or better in the conference's preseason poll. The Tigers are the only program in the SEC to face four straight top-three teams out of the game. Georgia Southern was picked third in the Sun Belt, Davidson second in the Atlantic 10, South Alabama first in the Sun Belt and CSUN third in the Big West preseason polls.

Isaac Okoro, who hit the game-winning shot at South Alabama with 2.9 seconds left, » became the only Auburn player in the last 15 years with 15 points, six rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks in a game.

• Has advanced to postseason play in 20 of 24 years as a head coach

• Set single-season wins records at four different schools (29 at Southern Indiana in 1995; 26 at Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2005; 31 at Tennessee in 2008; 30 at Auburn in 2019)

• Bruce Pearl's teams have led their conference in scoring 17 of the 24 years that he has been a head coach. His squads were the SEC's scoring champion in four of his six seasons at Tennessee, averaging 77.4 ppg while allowing 70.5 ppg

• One of 12 coaches to lead three different DI programs to the Sweet 16, joining Rick Barnes, Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Lon Kruger, Frank McGuire, Ralph Miller, Rick Pitino, Bill Self, Tubby Smith, Eddie Sutton and Bruce Weber. Including his stint at DII Southern Indiana, Pearl is one of only three coaches to take four programs (with three at the DI level) to the Sweet 16, joining Lon Kruger and Eddie Sutton

• With the win over Kentucky that sent Auburn to its first Final Four in program history, Pearl notched his 100th win as head coach of the Tigers. He is the first coach in Auburn history to have 100 wins in his first five seasons

• Bruce Pearl is the 11th coach in SEC history to win four conference crowns (overall or division) in a 10-year span. He is on the same list as Adolph Rupp (UK), Babe McCarthy (MSU), Billy Donovan (UF), Dale Brown (LSU), Joe Hall (UK), John Calipari (UK), Nolan Richardson (ARK), Rick Pitino (UK), Rick Stansbury (MSU) and Tubby Smith (UK)

• Auburn sold out of season tickets for the fifth straight time in 2018-19, all under Pearl, to continue the school record streak. Prior to Pearl, the only other time the Tigers sold out of season tickets came was 1999-2000

• Auburn welcomed 138,650 fans inside Auburn Arena for the 2018-19 season. The total is the highest ever recorded in Auburn Arena history

• In 24 full years as a head coach, Bruce Pearl's teams have finished either first or second in conference play 16 times

• At the Division I level, Pearl's teams have topped the 100-point mark 18 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as a coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg

• In the past three seasons, Auburn has the best non-conference record in the SEC during the regular season at 34–5 (.872), while scheduling regular NCAA Tournament teams in Arizona, Dayton, Duke, Middle Tennessee, Murray State, Oklahoma, Texas Tech, UConn and Xavier

• His teams have been just as successful off the court as Auburn has had 23 graduates in five years – the most in the SEC. In 2018, Auburn received an Academic Progress Rate Public Recognition Award marking the first time the Tigers have been honored since the award began tracking data in 2004. The NCAA annually honors teams earning multiyear Academic Progress Rates in the top 10 percent of all squads in each sport

• Auburn recently secured its third perfect APR score of 1,000 in mid-May, something that has never been accomplished in program history

• In the past four years, Auburn men's basketball has averaged an APR of 995 (out of 1,000). In the previous four seasons before Pearl and his staff arrived, Auburn's APR average score was 940

• Bruce Pearl has raised over \$1 million in only five golf tournaments at Auburn. Pearl and his wife, Brandy, have remarkably raised \$770,000 in the last three years benefitting Children's Harbor in Birmingham through the Bruce Pearl Fore the Children Golf Classic. The mission of Children's Harbor is to help children with serious illness and their families. Over \$200,000 was raised in the Bruce, Barkley & Basketball Golf Classic Oct. 23-24, 2016, benefitting the Auburn Basketball program

• Pearl started AUTLIVE at Auburn in 2015-16 to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. AUTLIVE raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients. He initiated the OUTLIVE program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease

• The Bruce Pearl Family Foundation in conjunction with L5 Foundation, an organization dedicated to addressing the essential and basic needs of cancer patients, donated \$20,000 to five charities in a ceremony in Knoxville in August 2015

• The Pearl family announced on Feb. 27, 2007, a \$100,000 donation to endow a scholarship in the name of former Tennessee player Dane Bradshaw. The Dane Bradshaw Athletic Scholarship Endowment is awarded to the male or female student-athlete at UT who best epitomizes the characteristics of the 2006-07 senior captain

#### AUBURN VS. CSUN SERIES

» Friday's game is set to be the first in series history between Auburn and CSUN.

» The Tigers are 4-2 against teams from the currently-constructed Big West Conference having defeated Hawai'i twice and Cal State Fullerton and Long Beach State once.

» Auburn head coach Bruce Pearl and CSUN head coach Mark Gottfried have squared off six times, each having won three times. Coach Pearl was 1-0 while at Milwaukee and 2-3 at Tennessee against Gottfried's Alabama teams. The last three meetings between the two heach coaches have been decided by a total of 13 points.

#### **EVERYBODY EATS**

» In all three of Auburn's games to begin the season, four players have scored in double figures. In total, seven different players have reached the 10-point plateau so far this season.

#### DOUGHTY DOUBLE-DOUBLE

» In Auburn's win at South Alabama, Samir Doughty scored 10 points and tied a career-high with 10 rebounds. It was Doughty's second career double-double and first as a member of the Auburn Tigers. The Philadelphia, Pa. native had 10 points and 10 assists against Saint Joe's while suiting up for VCU on Feb. 14, 2017. Doughty's 10 rebounds matched his output vs. Dayton on Dec. 8, 2018.

#### LOCKDOWN D

» Auburn showed its strength on defense in its last game, a 76-66 triumph over Davidson in the 2019 Veterans Classic in Annapolis, Md.

» Coming into the game, Davidson guards Kellan Grady and Jon Axel Gudmunsson averaged 17.3 and 16.9 points per game in the 2018-19 season. The two guards who are on the watch list for national player of the year were held to just 13 combined points on 4-of-17 from of the floor, led by the backcourt defense of Samir Doughty, J'Von McCormick and Isaac Okoro. It is the first time in their careers that both Grady and Gudmundsson were both held in single digits in the same game.

#### PLAYER TO WATCH: SAMIR DOUGHTY

Auburn guard Samir Doughty has stepped up in his new role being one of the top go-to options for the Tigers this season. The senior is averaging 13.7 points per game, good for second on the team, and also is tied for the team lead with 6.7 rebounds per contest. Doughty is coming off his second career double-double in which he had 10 points and 10 rebounds at South Alabama.



#### HOT START

» With its 3-0 start, Auburn has won 15 of its last 16 games dating back to last season. The Tigers ended last season by winning their last four regular season games before winning four games to win its second SEC Tournament title in program history and then won four games in the NCAA Tournament to advance to their first Final Four.

» Auburn is 3-0 to start the season for the second consecutive season and the sixth time since 2000. The Tigers have reached 4-0 in each of the previous six seasons that they started 3-0. Since 2000, Auburn's best start to a season was 7-0 in 2003-04.

» The Tigers are looking to achieve a 4-0 start for the second straight season. The last time Auburn began back-to-back campaigns are 4-0 was 1987-88 and 1988-89, coached by current radio analyst Sonny Smith.

#### WHAT'S RETURNING?

» Auburn returns just two starters from last season's Final Four and SEC Tournament championship winning team in Samir Doughty and Anfernee McLemore.

» The Tigers return just 32 percent of their 3,188 points from a season ago. Auburn lost five of its top eight scorers, including its top three from last year's team.

#### WILEY PICKED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

» Austin Wiley was chosen Preseason Second Team All-SEC by the league's coaches. He was one of 20 players chosen to the annual list.

» In 29 games last season, Wiley averaged 6.9 points and 4.0 rebounds per game to go along with 37 blocks. The senior shot a team-best 57 percent from the floor and scored in double figures eight times.

#### Head Coach Bruce Pearl

On the start to the season...

"Every season is a journey. Every team is different and you can see where we are, and you can see how far we need to go. It's nice to be able to win along the way, but obviously we've got to get a lot better if we're going to be able to beat the people that are on our schedule later on in the season."

On what Babatunde Akingbola is working on... "Having more confidence offensively. He's got great defensive confidence, but he doesn't have a lot of confidence offensively. That will come to him through experience. He is a better offensive player than he gives himself credit for."

On transfers sitting out a year (Jamal Johnson)... "It helps a lot. I think guys transferring and sitting out a year is a great tool for them to develop personally and get ahead academically. Jamal had a lot of catching up to do physically. He was behind strength-wise and in regards to his physical development. He had some injuries when he was younger with his hips and his knees and things like that, so last year was a great chance for him to just get physically better."

#### THE GREATEST SEASON EVER

» The Tigers reached the Final Four for the first time in program history. Auburn is the first program from the state of Alabama to reach the Final Four.

» Auburn became the only team to defeat Kansas, Kentucky and North Carolina - the three winningest programs in NCAA history - in consecutive games in NCAA Tournament history.

» The Tigers won four games in four days to capture their second SEC Tournament title (1985) all-time.

» Auburn set a program record with 30 wins in the 2018-19 season.

» Auburn broke the SEC record with 454 3-pointers as a team. The record was held previously by the 1995 Arkansas team with 361. The Tigers finished only 10 3-pointers away from matching the NCAA record of 464 currently held by the 2018 Villanova squad.

» The Tigers made their 10th NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and first in back-to-back seasons since 1999-2000. Auburn is 16-10 all-time in NCAA Tournament play.

» The Tigers won four straight games over AP Top-10 teams for the first time in program history following wins against No. 5 and No. 8 Tennessee, No. 3 North Carolina and No. 7 Kentucky. Auburn won five straight over top-25 opponents for the first time ever during its historic March run, which including triumphs over No. 5 and No. 8 Tennessee, No. 17 Kansas, No. 3 North Carolina and No. 7 Kentucky.

#### AS GOOD AS IT HAS EVER BEEN

» Auburn finished the 2018-19 season 30-10 after making the first Final Four appearance in program history, breaking the 1998-99 Tigers' program record of 29 victories. Auburn has compiled a 56-18 (.757) record over the last two seasons, including a 24-12 (.667) mark in the SEC. The Tigers went 26-8 and claimed the third regular-season SEC championship (1960, 1999 and 2018) in program history with a 13-5 conference record last season before advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

This is the third time in program history that » the Tigers have won 20-plus games in at least two straight seasons. It is the first time Auburn has strung together back-to-back seasons with 25-plus wins and the Tigers' set a new program record with its 30th win of the season in the Elite Eight against Kentucky. They strung together three-straight 20-win seasons from 1983-84 to 1985-86, winning 20 games in 1983-84 and 22 games in 1984-85 and 1985-86. After winning a program record 29 games in 1998-99, Auburn won 24 games in 1999-2000. The Tigers' 56 wins the last two seasons are a new school record, surpassing the old mark of 53 wins in 1998-99 and 1999-2000, Auburn, Kentucky and Tennessee are the only three SEC teams that have won at least 26 games in each of the last two seasons. Auburn won 18 games two years ago and currently has won 74 games in the last three seasons, which is a program record for wins in a three-year stretch. The Tigers won 71 games from the 1998-99 season to the 2000-01 season.

#### TIGERS PERFECT VS. NON-CON AT HOME

» Auburn has posted a 22-0 home record against non-conference opponents over the last three-plus seasons, including an 8-0 mark last season, 7-0 in 2017-18 and 6-0 in 2016-17.

» During Bruce Pearl's five years as Auburn's head coach, the Tigers have posted a 33-3 (.917) mark against non-conference opponents at Auburn Arena.

#### TOP OF THE PACK

» Auburn has fared well the past three seasons in the non-conference slate. The Tigers lead the SEC in both wins and winning percentage in non-league regular-season games over the last two-plus seasons. Auburn is the only SEC team that has won at least 11 regular-season non-conference games in each of the last three seasons. The streak is the longest in school history. The Tigers' 34 non-conference regular-season wins over that span tie a school record for the most nonconference wins over a 3-year span, which was previously set from 1998-2000.

#### CLASS OF THE SEC: MOST GRADUATES SINCE 2014

When it comes to graduating players, nobody in the SEC has done it better than head coach Bruce Pearl and Auburn. Since 2014, the Tigers have had 23 student-athletes walk across the graduation stage and earn their degrees, which is the highest number in the SEC. Current senior Anfernee McLemore already has his degree in hand as he pursues a master's during the 2019-20 season.

» The Tigers have earned wins vs. notable opponents in Arizona, Dayton (twice), Middle Tennessee, Murray State (twice), Oklahoma, TCU, Texas Tech, UConn (twice), Washington and Xavier (twice).

#### AUBURN ARENA SELLOUTS

» Auburn posted six sellouts last year to bring its total to 28 in Auburn Arena history. Of the 28 sellouts, 23 have come in the five seasons under head coach Bruce Pearl. Twelve of the last 17 SEC games at Auburn Arena have been sold out. The average attendance of 8,156 last year marked the third time in the last 17 years the Tigers have had an average attendance of over 8,000.

#### **100 SEC WINS ... AND COUNTING**

» With a win at Vanderbilt on Feb. 16, Auburn head coach Bruce Pearl picked up his 100th SEC win. Pearl became the 23rd coach in conference history to amass 100 victories and just the fifth to accomplish the feat while coaching two schools.

» The other coaches to have 100 SEC wins while leading two programs include C.M. Newton (195, Alabama and Vanderbilt), Tubby Smith (139, Georgia and Kentucky), Don DeVoe (110, Tennessee and Florida) and John Mauer (103, Tennessee and Florida).

» Coach Pearl is one of just two active coaches to tally 100 conference wins in the league, joining Kentucky head coach John Calipari.

#### GAMEDAY EXPERIENCE: AUBURN ARENA

Built at a cost of \$86 million, Auburn Arena seats 9,121 fans for basketball games. Auburn Arena replaced the old Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum as the home of Tiger basketball for the 2010-11 season. The furthest seat in Auburn Arena is just 43 feet away from the court. Two-thirds of the seats are less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside offering a home environment that is unrivaled.



#### PEARL WINS HIS 100TH GAME AT AUBURN

» Auburn's win over Kentucky in the Elite Eight was Bruce Pearl's 100th win in his 171st game as Auburn's head coach. Pearl is the first head coach in Auburn history to win 100 games in his first five seasons. This includes a 5-3 mark in the NCAA Tournament as Pearl matches Cliff Ellis (5-3) for the second-most NCAA Tournament wins by a head coach in Auburn history. Pearl and Ellis only trail Sonny Smith, who led the Tigers to a 7-5 record in five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1984-88.

#### LET IT FLY

Auburn led the country with 454 made 3-pointers last season, which was 60 more 3-pointers than any other team. The total is second-most in DI history, only trailing Villanova's 464 triples in 2017-18. For the season, the Tigers scored 42.7 percent of their points from long range. Auburn led the SEC and was third nationally with 11.4 made 3s per game, which set a new SEC record, breaking the old mark of 10.04 triples by Kentucky in 1990, and was second in the league with a 37.7 3-point field-goal percentage, which is tied for fourth in program history. Auburn broke the program record for 3-pointers in a season at Alabama on March 5, topping the old mark of 324 triples from last season. The Tigers' set a new single-season SEC record for 3-pointers against South Carolina in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament. Auburn is the only school that has multiple seasons ranked in the top eight in SEC history in terms of 3-point field goals made. The Tigers led the league with 11.5 3-pointers (207-of-525) and was second with a 39.4 percent 3-point field-goal percentage in SEC play. Auburn made 53 3s in four games during its run to the SEC Tournament title and led the NCAA Tournament field with 58 3-pointers during the tournament.

» The Tigers made double-digit 3-pointers in 26 of 40 games last season, including 16 of 23 games against SEC opponents. Prior to topping 300 3-pointers in each of the last two years, Auburn had not previously done so in program history. The Tigers have made double-digit 3s in 71 of 172 games (41.3 percent) under head coach Bruce Pearl. Prior to Pearl's arrival, the Tigers had

#### **RETURN TO SENDER**

» Auburn finished 22nd nationally averaging 4.8 blocked shots per game in 2018-19. The Tigers blocked 190 shots last season, setting a new program record for blocked shots in a season against Kentucky in the Elite Eight, breaking the old mark of 180 blocks in 2017-18. The Tigers have had four of its program's top-11 single-season block totals during Bruce Pearl's five seasons on the Plains, including three of the top four in the last three seasons.

#### STEALING THE SHOW

» Auburn averaged 9.2 steals per game last year, which led all power conference teams and was fourth nationally. The Tigers recorded at least 10 steals in a game 18 times last season (17-1 record), including eight of the last 17. This includes 20 steals in their last non-conference game against North Florida on Dec. 29, which is one off the school record of 21 steals against Louisiana-Monroe on Dec. 6, 2008. Auburn registered 14 steals in its last two games in the SEC Tournament and finished the season with a new program record 369 steals after averaging 7.8 steals in five NCAA Tournament games.




