» With its 9-0 start, Auburn won 21 of its last 22 games dating back to last season. The Tigers ended last season by winning their last four regular season games before winning four games to win its second SEC Tournament title in program history and then won four games in the NCAA Tournament to advance to their first Final Four. Auburn won seven games before Thanksgiving for the first time in program history.

» The Tigers are 21-1 since Feb. 27 last season. That record is the best in the country, ahead of Liberty (17-1) and Virginia (19-2).

» Auburn is one of the final four remaining unbeaten teams in college basketball. The last time the Tigers were the last team standing was during the 1998-99 season in which Auburn won its first 17 games before falling to No. 7 Kentucky on Jan. 20.

» The 2019-20 Tigers have a chance to be the best defensive team under Coach Pearl at Auburn. The Tigers are allowing only 67.1 points per game. The previous best defensive team under Pearl on The Plains was the 2018-19 team that allowed 68.8 points per game.

» Auburn is averaging 83 points per game on offense and just 67.1 points per contest on defense. The Tigers have averaged 75 or more points and given up under 70 points just three times in program history: 1958-59, 1964-65, 1998-99.

» Auburn is the ninth-best team in the country in shots inside the arc. The Tigers shoot at a 56.7 clip from 2, over seven percent higher than the national average of 49.0.

» The Tigers are one of eight teams in the country to amass five wins away from home this season, joining BYU, Duke, Delaware, Gonzaga, Liberty, San Diego State and Yale.

- Set single-season wins records at four different schools (29 at Southern Indiana in 1995; 26 at Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2005; 31 at Tennessee in 2008; 30 at Auburn in 2019)
- Bruce Pearl's teams have led their conference in scoring 17 of the 24 years that he has been a head coach. His squads were the SEC's scoring champion in four of his six seasons at Tennessee, averaging 77.4 ppg while allowing 70.5 ppg
- One of 12 coaches to lead three different DI programs to the Sweet 16, joining Rick Barnes, Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Lon Kruger, Frank McGuire, Ralph Miller, Rick Pitino, Bill Self, Tubby Smith, Eddie Sutton and Bruce Weber. Including his stint at DI Southern Indiana, Pearl is one of only three coaches to take four programs (with three at the DI level) to the Sweet 16, joining Lon Kruger and Eddie Sutton
- With the win over Kentucky that sent Auburn to its first Final Four in program history, Pearl notched his 100th win as head coach of the Tigers. He is the first coach in Auburn history to have 100 wins in his first five seasons
- Bruce Pearl is the 11th coach in SEC history to win four conference crowns (overall or division) in a 10-year span. He is on the same list as Adolph Rupp (UK), Babe McCarthy (MSU), Billy Donovan (UF), Dale Brown (LSU), Joe Hall (UK), John Calipari (UK), Nolan Richardson (ARK), Rick Pitino (UK), Rick Stansbury (MSU) and Tubby Smith (UK)
- Auburn sold out of season tickets for the fifth straight time in 2018-19, all under Pearl, to continue the school record streak. Prior to Pearl, the only other time the Tigers sold out of season tickets came was 1999-2000
- Auburn welcomed 138,650 fans inside Auburn Arena for the 2018-19 season. The total is the highest ever recorded in Auburn Arena history
- In 24 full years as a head coach, Bruce Pearl's teams have finished either first or second in conference play 16 times
- At the Division I level, Pearl's teams have topped the 100-point mark 19 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as a coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg
- In the past three seasons, Auburn has the best non-conference record in the SEC during the regular season at 34-5 (.872), while scheduling regular NCAA Tournament teams in Arizona, Dayton, Duke, Middle Tennessee, Murray State, Oklahoma, Texas Tech, UConn and Xavier

- His teams have been just as successful off the court as Auburn has had 23 graduates in five years – the most in the SEC. In 2018, Auburn received an Academic Progress Rate Public Recognition Award marking the first time the Tigers have been honored since the award began tracking data in 2004. The NCAA annually honors teams earning multiyear Academic Progress Rates in the top 10 percent of all squads in each sport
- Auburn recently secured its third perfect APR score of 1,000 in mid-May, something that has never been accomplished in program history
- In the past four years, Auburn men's basketball has averaged an APR of 995 (out of 1,000). In the previous four seasons before Pearl and his staff arrived, Auburn's APR average score was 940
- Bruce Pearl has raised over \$1 million in only five golf tournaments at Auburn. Pearl and his wife, Brandy, have remarkably raised \$770,000 in the last three years benefitting Children's Harbor in Birmingham through the Bruce Pearl Fore the Children Golf Classic. The mission of Children's Harbor is to help children with serious illness and their families. Over \$200,000 was raised in the Bruce, Barkley & Basketball Golf Classic Oct. 23-24, 2016, benefitting the Auburn Basketball program
- Pearl started AURLIVE at Auburn in 2015-16 to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. AURLIVE raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients. He initiated the AURLIVE program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease
- The Bruce Pearl Family Foundation in conjunction with L5 Foundation, an organization dedicated to addressing the essential and basic needs of cancer patients, donated \$20,000 to five charities in a ceremony in Knoxville in August 2015
- The Pearl family announced on Feb. 27, 2007, a \$100,000 donation to endow a scholarship in the name of former Tennessee player Dane Bradshaw. The Dane Bradshaw Athletic Scholarship Endowment is awarded to the male or female student-athlete at UT who best epitomizes the characteristics of the 2006-07 senior captain

AUBURN VS. NC STATE SERIES

» The Tigers and Wolfpack have played against each other nine times in series with NC State holding a 6-3 advantage. Auburn has won the two previous meetings on The Plains.

» NC State won the first game of the home-and-home series last year in Raleigh, 78-71. Auburn was turned it over a season-high 25 times in the loss.

» Head coach Bruce Pearl is 0-2 against the Wolfpack all-time, having played against them in 2003 with Milwaukee and 2018 with Auburn.

BEST STARTS TO A SEASON

» Coming off a run to the Final Four, the Tigers have won 21 of their last 22 games and are 9-0 to begin the 2019-20. Below is a list of the best starts to a season in program history.

» The Tigers have gotten off to 9-0 starts five times, including this season, and just twice since 1960.

» Auburn is looking to achieve a 10-0 start to a season for just the fourth time ever, joining the 1927-28, 1951-52, 1958-59 and 1998-99 seasons.

» Auburn's best start to a season came in 1958-59 when the Tigers won their first 19 games of the season.

» Auburn is one of only four remaining teams that are undefeated, joining Duquesne, Liberty and San Diego State.

» Auburn was the last remaining unbeaten during the 1998-99 season. The Tigers started 17-0 before falling to No. 7 Kentucky on Jan. 20.

TOP OF THE PACK

» Auburn has fared well the past three-plus seasons in the non-conference slate. The Tigers lead the SEC in both wins and winning percentage in non-league regular-season games over the last three-plus seasons. Auburn is the only SEC team that has won at least 11 regular-season non-conference games in each of the last three seasons. The streak is the longest in school history. The Tigers' 34 non-conference regular-season wins over the last three seasons tie a school record for the most non-conference wins over a 3-year span, which was previously set from 1998-2000.

» The Tigers have earned wins vs. notable opponents in Arizona, Dayton (twice), Davidson, Middle Tennessee, Murray State (twice), Oklahoma, TCU, Texas Tech, UConn (twice), Washington and Xavier (twice).

GETTING NETTY

» Auburn appeared at No. 7 in the NCAA's first release of the NET this season. It is tied for the highest rating achieved by the Tigers, matching the NET on Dec. 8, 2018.

» Auburn has appeared in the top 25 of the NET every day since Jan. 29 of last season. The Tigers, along with Tennessee, are the only two teams in the SEC to be inside the top 25 in every NET ranking since Jan. 29, including this season.

PLAYER TO WATCH: ISAAC OKORO

Auburn freshman Isaac Okoro is second on the team in scoring at 13.7 points per game while shooting at an efficient .570 clip from the floor. The Powder Springs, Ga. native has scored in double figures in all but one game this season. Okoro became just the second Tiger freshman since 1990 to accomplish the feat.

On if the game will prepare team for SEC play...
 "Right now, there's not a team in the SEC firing on the offensive cylinders that this team is firing on. This will be as good of an offensive team as we'll play. So it'll help expose us and get us ready for SEC play."

 "Saint Louis disrupted us. We were not as sharp offensively as far as our execution is concerned. We had too many empty possessions. » The Tigers ended the season last year at No. 13 following their run to the Final Four.

SOLID OFFENSE, BETTER DEFENSE

» Auburn has been solid on offense, scoring 83 points per game this season. But, what has made a huge difference has been the attention to detail on the defensive end as the Tigers have allowed only 67.1 points per game. That mark is the lowest under head coach Bruce Pearl.

» Listed below are seasons that the Tigers have scored over 75 points per game, while also holding opponents to fewer than 70 points per game.

HIGH-QUALITY OPPONENTS

» Auburn has played seven opponents picked to finish in the top three of its league. The Tigers were the only team in the SEC to play seven top-3 projected finishers in their first eight games of the season.

» Auburn played Georgia Southern (third), Davidson (second), South Alabama (first), CSUN (third), Colgate (first) New Mexico (third) and Furman (third).

» The Tigers tout the 12th-best strength of schedule according to the NET.

MAKE ROOM IN THE TROPHY CASE

» Since the 2017-18 season, Auburn has won four trophies: 2018 SEC regular season title, 2019 SEC Tournament crown, 2019 NCAA Midwest Regional championship and the 2019 Legends Classic title.

» The Tigers lead the SEC in trophies in the last two-plus seasons. As a whole, the league has amassed 11 trophies through league championships, conference tournament championships, NCAA regional championships and in-season tournament championships. Auburn has four and Kentucky has three, while Florida, LSU, Tennessee and Texas A&M have all won one.

TIGERS PERFECT VS. NON-CON AT HOME

» Auburn has posted a 25-0 home record against non-conference opponents over the last three-plus seasons, including an 8-0 mark last season, 7-0 in 2017-18 and 6-0 in 2016-17.

» During Bruce Pearl's five years as Auburn's head coach, the Tigers have posted a 36-3 (.923) mark against non-conference opponents at Auburn Arena.

EVERYBODY EATS

» In seven of Auburn's nine games to begin the season, at least four players have scored in double figures. In total, seven different players have reached the 10-point plateau so far this season.

» During the 2018-19 season, the Tigers had four players score in double figures 19 times.

OKORO IN GREAT COMPANY

» It's no secret how big of an impact Isaac Okoro has made since stepping foot on campus. The Powder Springs, Ga. native scored in figures in the first six games of his career, becoming just the second freshman since 1990 to accomplish the feat.

» Okoro is the first freshman to accomplish the feat since former Tiger Mustapha Heron did it in 2016. The previous holder was All-American Wesley Person, who did it in his first 14 games. Heron holds the overall mark at 25 straight games to begin his career.

» All-American and NBA All-Star Mike Mitchell scored in double figures 24 times as a freshman in 25 games in 1974-75. All-SEC Eddie Johnson scored in double figures in 24 of 26 games as a freshmen in 1973-74.

CLASS OF THE SEC: MOST GRADUATES SINCE 2014

When it comes to graduating players, nobody in the SEC has done it better than head coach Bruce Pearl and Auburn. Since 2014, the Tigers have had 23 student-athletes walk across the graduation stage and earn their degrees, which is the highest number in the SEC. Current senior Anfernee McLemore already has his degree in hand as he pursues a master's during the 2019-20 season.

» Okoro, who hit the game-winning shot at South Alabama with 2.9 seconds left, became the only Auburn player in the last 15 years with a stat line of 15 points, six rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks in a game.

» Okoro was named SEC Freshman of the Week after Nov. 18 as well as Dec. 9.

» Okoro is the fourth freshman in program history to earn the weekly recognition twice in a season, joining Jared Harper (2016-17), Aaron Swinson (1991-92) and Wesley Person (1990-91).

WE'VE GOT J'VON

» While replacing Jared Harper's name in the popular song "We've Got Jared" to "We've Got J'Von" is easy, the replacement of Jared on the court was going to be a challenge heading into the 2019-20 season.

» McCormick has put up an assist-to-turnover ratio very similar to Harper, who set a new Auburn single-season assist record with 231 dimes last season, through nine games. Last season, Harper recorded a 61:20 assist:turnover ratio in the first nine games compared to McCormick's 57:19 ratio this season, which includes a new program single-game record 16 assists and only one turnover vs. CSUN.



» The record of 15 was previously held by Eddie Johnson vs. LSU on Jan. 3, 1976. Former floor general Jared Harper was next in line with 14 assists vs. Vanderbilt on Feb. 3, 2018.

» McCormick's 16 assists are tied for the ninth-most in SEC single-game history and are the most by any player in the league since Phil Pressley (Missouri) had 19 dimes in 2013.

» In his last game, McCormick scored 20 points and added seven rebounds with six assists in Auburn's victory over Saint Louis. He was named the Mike Slive Invitational MVP.

LEAVE NO DOUGHT(Y)

» After being a secondary scoring option last season, Samir Doughty has asserted himself as the top option in 2019-20. He's averaging a team-best 17.3 points per game on 49 percent shooting from the floor, including 38 percent from behind the arc. Last season, Doughty had an average of 7.3 points per game.

» In Auburn's win at South Alabama, Doughty scored 10 points and tied a career-high with 10 rebounds. It was his second career double-double and first as a member of the Auburn Tigers. The Philadelphia, Pa. native had 10 points and 10 assists against Saint Joe's while suiting up for VCU on Feb. 14, 2017. Doughty's 10 rebounds matched his output vs. Dayton on Dec. 8, 2018.

» Doughty followed up that performance with a career-high 33 points on 10-of-15 from the floor, including 6-of-8 from deep, in the Tigers' 116-70 triumph over CSUN. He also chimed in with eight boards and three assists.

» In Auburn's win vs. Colgate, Doughty had a team-best 20 points on 7-of-13 shooting. In that game, Doughty produced a crossover, step-back 3-pointer that sent his defender flying and earned him the No. 1 spot on the Sportscenter Top 10 for Nov. 18.

» The senior was named to the Legends Classic All-Tournament Team after scoring 19 points against New Mexico and 22 vs. Richmond, both team-highs.

GAMEDAY EXPERIENCE: AUBURN ARENA

Built at a cost of \$86 million, Auburn Arena seats 9,121 fans for basketball games. Auburn Arena replaced the old Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum as the home of Tiger basketball for the 2010-11 season. The furthest seat in Auburn Arena is just 43 feet away from the court. Two-thirds of the seats are less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside offering a home environment that is unrivaled.



» Doughty has four 20-point games in the first nine games this season after the senior entered the season with just two 20-point efforts in 75 career games.

THE BIG MAN IS HUNGRY

» Austin Wiley is as healthy as he's ever been and it's showing. He was named the SEC Player of the Week on Dec. 2 - the first in his career - after averaging 16 points and 10.5 rebounds per game en route to being named the MVP at the Legends Classic. He is just the fourth center in program history to earn the weekly award, joining Mamadou N'diaye (1999), Aaron Swinson (1994) and Jeff Moore (1987).

» The senior posted a double-double with 14 points and 13 rebounds in the semifinal victory against New Mexico - the fifth of his career - and then followed up that performance with 18 points and eight rebounds in the championship game vs. Richmond.

» Wiley has been a man on a mission the last six games, averaging 12.7 points and 10 boards per contest. In that span the senior has amassed three double-doubles, scoring in double figures in five games and pulling down at least eight rebounds in each game.

RETURN TO SENDER

» After setting a program record with 190 blocks last season, the Tigers have had four of its program's top-11 single-season block totals during Bruce Pearl's five seasons on the Plains, including three of the top four in the last three seasons.

» A big key to that has been the brick wall of Anfernee McLemore, who is inside the top five in program history in career blocks. McLemore has blocked 12 shots over the last six games.

AUBURN ARENA SELLOUTS

» Auburn posted six sellouts last year to bring its total to 28 in Auburn Arena history. Of the 28 sellouts, 23 have come in the five seasons under head coach Bruce Pearl. Twelve of the last 17 SEC games at Auburn Arena have been sold out. The average attendance of 8,156 last year marked the third time in the last 17 years the Tigers have had an average attendance of over 8,000.

THE GREATEST SEASON EVER

» The Tigers reached the Final Four for the first time in program history. Auburn is the first program from the state of Alabama to reach the Final Four.

» Auburn became the only team to defeat Kansas, Kentucky and North Carolina - the three winningest programs in NCAA history - in consecutive games in NCAA Tournament history.

» The Tigers won four games in four days to capture their second SEC Tournament title (1985) all-time.

» Auburn set a program record with 30 wins in the 2018-19 season.

» Auburn broke the SEC record with 454 3-pointers as a team. The record was held previously by the 1995 Arkansas team with 361. The Tigers finished only 10 3-pointers away from matching the NCAA record of 464 currently held by the 2018 Villanova squad.

» The Tigers made their 10th NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and first in back-to-back seasons since 1999-2000. Auburn is 16-10 all-time in NCAA Tournament play.

» The Tigers won four straight games over AP Top-10 teams for the first time in program history following wins against No. 5 and No. 8 Tennessee, No. 3 North Carolina and No. 7 Kentucky. Auburn won five straight over top-25 opponents for the first time ever during its historic March run, which including triumphs over No. 5 and No. 8 Tennessee, No. 17 Kansas, No. 3 North Carolina and No. 7 Kentucky.

PEARL WINS HIS 100TH GAME AT AUBURN

» Auburn's win over Kentucky in the Elite Eight was Bruce Pearl's 100th win in his 171st game as Auburn's head coach. Pearl is the first head coach in Auburn history to win 100 games in his first five seasons. This includes a 5-3 mark in the NCAA Tournament as Pearl matches Cliff Ellis (5-3) for the second-most NCAA Tournament wins by a head coach in Auburn history. Pearl and Ellis only trail Sonny Smith, who led the Tigers to a 7-5 record in five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1984-88.

LET IT FLY

» As Coach Pearl has said, "As long as the 3 is worth more than the 2, we'll continue to take them." Below are all the games Auburn has hit at least 15 3-pointers as a team.

OKORO ON DRAFT BOARDS

» In the latest 2020 NBA Mock Draft on ESPN.com, freshman Isaac Okoro was projected to be picked 15th.

» "He is one of the most gifted athletes in this class. He has a shredded, 225-pound frame that makes it impossible to dislodge him on straight line drives. He also has outstanding feet getting over the top of screens or mirroring opponents in one-on-one situations. His 6-foot-10 wingspan should allow him to see time guarding power forwards in smaller lineups, but he's at his best right now smothering point guards. Seven games into the season, there's little doubt that Okoro has established himself as one of the best defenders in college basketball." - Jonathan Givony

EARLY BRACKETOLOGY

» Auburn is currently projected as a No. 3 seed in the East Regional by both ESPN.com's Joe Lunardi and NCAA.com's Andy Katz. In addition, CBSsports.com's Jerry Palm had the Tigers as a No. 6 seed in the South Regional at the beginning of the season.

MEET THE FUTURE

» Auburn put together a top-10 recruiting class during the early signing period, inking three players for the 2020 class. The class currently sits at No. 9 according to ESPN, No. 12 according to 247Sports and No. 14 according to Rivals.

» Since the early signing period began, the Tigers have secured three top-10 classes at the conclusion of November. In total, Auburn, Kentucky and LSU are the only three programs in the SEC to sign top-25 classes five times in the past six years

» Sharife (shuh-reef) Cooper highlights the class as a consensus 5-star, top-20 prospect. He is the highest rated signee in program history, topping fellow 5-stars Mustapha Heron, Isaac Okoro and Austin Wiley. Cooper was the 2018-19 USA Today National Player of the Year after averaging 28.6 points, 8.7 assists, 6.0 rebounds and 4.1 steals while leading McEachern (Ga.) High School to a 32-0 record and a state title.

» Cooper was high school teammates with current Tigers Babatunde Akingbola and Isaac Okoro.

» Joining Cooper in the class are 4-stars Chris Moore and Justin Powell. Moore led West Memphis (Ark.) High School to the semifinals of the state tournament and averaged 17.2 points, 13.0 rebounds, 4.9 assists and 1.5 blocks per game while shooting 63 percent. Powell, who is the No. 1 player out of Kentucky, sat out last season after transferring from Montverde Academy in Florida to North Oldham High School in Goshen, Ky. He played for the Indy Heat in the EYBL circuit and averaged 13.2 points while shooting 50 percent from the field, including 55 percent from 3.

TAKING AWAY OPTION A

Auburn has put an increased emphasis on taking out the opposition's top scorer heading into the matchup. The Tigers have held seven opponents' leading scorers below their average, including three by more than 10 points. LOCKDOWN D

» Auburn showed its strength on defense in its 76-66 triumph over Davidson in the 2019 Veterans Classic in Annapolis, Md.

» Coming into the game, Davidson guards Kellan Grady and Jon Axel Gudmundsson averaged 17.3 and 16.9 points per game in the 2018-19 season. The two guards who are on the watch list for national player of the year were held to just 13 combined points on 4-of-17 from the floor, led by the backcourt defense of Samir Doughty, J'Von McCormick and Isaac Okoro. It is the first time in their careers that both Grady and Gudmundsson were both held in single digits in the same game.

» Auburn held New Mexico's top two play-makers JaQuan Lyle and Carlton Bragg to just six combined points on 3-of-18 from the floor. Lyle came in averaging 19.8 points, while Bragg was averaging 11.8 per contest.

WHAT'S RETURNING?

» Auburn returns just two starters from last season's Final Four and SEC Tournament championship winning team in Samir Dougherty and Anfernee McLemore.

» The Tigers return just 32 percent of their 3,188 points from a season ago. Auburn lost five of its top eight scorers, including its top three from last year's team.

WILEY PICKED PRESEASON ALL-SEC

» Austin Wiley was chosen Preseason Second Team All-SEC by the league's coaches. He was one of 20 players chosen to the annual list.

» In 29 games last season, Wiley averaged 6.9 points and 4.0 rebounds per game to go along with 37 blocks. The senior shot a team-best 57 percent from the floor and scored in double figures eight times.

ROSTER NUGGETS

» Auburn boasts a unique roster heading into the 2019-20 season. The Tigers have seven seniors, zero juniors, five sophomores and eight freshmen.

» Auburn's eight newcomers is tied with Florida for second-most in the SEC behind Georgia's 10. It is the second-most newcomers Bruce Pearl has had at Auburn, trailing only 10 in 2016-17.

» Auburn has 10 players who are 6-foot-6 or taller, which is the most Coach Pearl has had at Auburn and tied for the most he's ever had (10 in 2010-11 at Tennessee).

» Auburn is one of just two programs to have two sets of father-son combinations on its roster: Head coach Bruce Pearl and assistant coach Steven Pearl, as well as assistant coach Wes Flanigan and freshman Allen Flanigan. Utah's combinations include head coach Larry Krystkowiak and freshman Luc Krystkowiak, as well as director of operations Chris Jones and freshman Rylan Jones.

100 SEC WINS ... AND COUNTING

» With a win at Vanderbilt on Feb. 16, Auburn head coach Bruce Pearl picked up his 100th SEC win. Pearl became the 23rd coach in conference history to amass 100 victories and just the fifth to accomplish the feat while coaching two schools.

» The other coaches to have 100 SEC wins while leading two programs include C.M. Newton (195, Alabama and Vanderbilt), Tubby Smith (139, Georgia and Kentucky), Don DeVoe (110, Tennessee and Florida) and John Mauer (103, Tennessee and Florida).

» Coach Pearl is one of just two active coaches to tally 100 conference wins in the league, joining Kentucky head coach John Calipari.

AS GOOD AS IT HAS EVER BEEN

» Auburn finished the 2018-19 season 30-10 after making the first Final Four appearance in program history, breaking the 1998-99 Tigers' program record of 29 victories. Auburn has compiled a 56-18 (.757) record over the last two seasons, including a 24-12 (.667) mark in the

SEC. The Tigers went 26-8 and claimed the third regular-season SEC championship (1960, 1999 and 2018) in program history with a 13-5 conference record last season before advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

» This is the third time in program history that the Tigers have won 20-plus games in at least two straight seasons. It is the first time Auburn has strung together back-to-back seasons with 25-plus wins and the Tigers' set a new program record with its 30th win of the season in the Elite Eight against Kentucky. Auburn, Kentucky and Tennessee are the only three SEC teams that have won at least 26 games in each of the last two seasons. Auburn won 18 games two years ago and currently has won 74 games in the last three seasons, which is a program record for wins in a three-year stretch. The Tigers won 71 games from the 1998-99 season to the 2000-01 season.

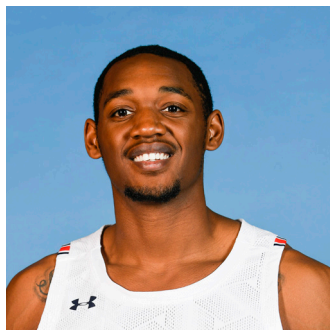
