SETTING THE SCENE

The Lehigh men's basketball team returns from a two-week break of games for final exams when the Mountain Hawks travel to reigning Final Four team and No. 9/12 nationally-ranked Auburn on Saturday. Opening tipoff is set for 6 p.m. ET (5 p.m. locally) on the SEC Network. The Tigers are one of four undefeated teams remaining in the nation (and only undefeated team from a power conference), standing 10-0 after a Thursday night victory over NC State. Most recently, Lehigh dropped a hard-fought 78-65 final at home vs. Yale on Saturday, Dec. 7.

The Mountain Hawks hung tough against a strong Yale opponent, pulling within three (66-63) with 3:18 remaining. However, the Bulldogs answered with an 11-0 run to pull away. The run coincided with junior center **James Karnik** fouling out after 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting and five rebounds. Lehigh trailed by as many as 16 late in the first half, but fought back to within nine at the half then as close as one in the second when an **Evan Taylor** basket pulled the Mountain Hawks within 62-61. Lehigh even had a chance to take a lead on the ensuing possession, but a Taylor 3-pointer was off the mark. That's as close as the Mountain Hawks would come.

Sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** enjoyed a strong game, posting 16 points and six rebounds and shooting 7-of-12 from the field. Senior **Jordan Cohen** also impressed with 12 points, five rebounds and five assists, moving to within 14 points of 1,000 in his career. Taylor added eight points as well.

The Mountain Hawks got back into the game in the second half due in large part to forcing 13 Yale turnovers (19 for the game). The loss to the Bulldogs was Lehigh's fifth straight (over the last four years), but all have been competitive contests that came down to the final minutes.

Lehigh is winding down nonleague play with Saturday's game at Auburn. The Tigers are one of four undefeated teams in the nation, along with San Diego State, Liberty and Duquesne. They're the only power conference team still unbeaten. Auburn is ranked No. 9 in the national coaches poll and No. 12 in the AP poll. The Tigers are also No. 7 in the first NCAA Net Rankings released this week.

The last time Lehigh faced an SEC team was an 87-73 win at Mississippi State on Nov. 25, 2016. It was Cohen's freshman year and he tallied six rebounds and an assist in 14 minutes off the bench. Lehigh is 1-3 all-time vs. current members of the Southeast Conference, falling to Texas A&M and dropping a pair of contests against Vanderbilt.

The last time the Mountain Hawks played a nationally-ranked team was Nov. 24, 2018 at No. 12 Kansas State. Lehigh led for much of the first half, including 31-26 with less than five minutes remaining in the first. The Wildcats created separation, but the Mountain Hawks pulled as close as nine with 7:56 remaining. Meanwhile, Lehigh's last top 10 opponent was Nov. 22, 2017 at No. 10 Southern Cal; the Mountain Hawks were down just 10 at the half (44-34), but the Trojans pulled away in the second. Lehigh's last win over a ranked (and top 10) opponent came in the 2012 NCAA Tournament over Duke, seeded second and ranked No. 8 in both the AP and Coaches polls.

LAST TIME OUT

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (12/7/19) - The Lehigh men's basketball team battled back from a 16-point first-half deficit to pull as close as one, but Yale staged an 11-0 run late in the second half to turn a three-point margin into a 78-65 victory on Saturday evening in Stabler Arena. Sophomore Jeameril Wilson led the Mountain Hawks' offense with a season-high 16 points while junior James Karnik continued his strong play with 15 points on just eight field goal attempts.

SCOUTING AUBURN

Auburn finished last season 30-10 and advanced to its first Final Four after earning a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament and beating New Mexico State, Kansas, North Carolina and Kentucky. The Tigers actually lost their top two scorers from last season in Bryce Brown and Jared Harper, but have kept the success rolling into 2019-20. Harper was a junior last season, but declared early for the NBA Draft. Brown (a senior) and Harper were both undrafted, but have signed onto NBA organizations (and are on G League rosters). Overall, Auburn has won 22 of its last 23 games dating back to last season, with the only loss being a slim 63-62 defeat in the Final Four against Virginia. Several players have stepped up this season, with Samir Doughty leading the offense (18.0 points per game). Isaac Okoro comes in at 13.2 while Austin Wiley is averaging 10.6 with a team-high 8.8 rebounds per contest. Auburn is nearing the top 10 nationally in both rebounds (42.5) and blocks (6.1) per game.

SUCCESS VS. THE BEST

Lehigh head coach **Brett Reed** will face Auburn head coach Bruce Pearl, who's annually considered one of the nation's top coaches. Reed has enjoyed success in his career against some all-time great coaches. He is 1-2 against coaches in the top 10 all-time for Division I victories. Reed defeated all-time leader Mike Krzyzewski and Duke in the 2012 NCAA Tournament and fell to Jim Boeheim (Syracuse), who's No. 2, on Nov. 13, 2015 and Bob Huggins (West Virginia) last Dec. 30. Both of those defeats were by just 10 points.

IF LEHIGH BEATS AUBURN

- Lehigh would snap a five-game losing streak.
- The Mountain Hawks would win their second straight against the SEC and improve to 2-3 all-time vs. current members of the Southeast Conference.
- Lehigh would pick up its second road victory of the season, snapping a five-game losing streak away from home.
- The Mountain Hawks would pick up their first win over a nationally-ranked team (and top 10 team) since beating Duke in the 2012 NCAA Tournament. The Blue Devils were ranked eighth in both national polls entering the tournament.
- The Mountain Hawks would improve to 32-19 overall over their last 51 games dating back to the end of the 2017-18 season.

SUSTAINED SUCCESS

- Lehigh has enjoyed impressive success, especially over the last 10 years (2010-19), earning a Patriot League Quarterfinal home game in nine of those seasons.
- Over the last 10 years, the Mountain Hawks are second in the league in number of tournament championships (two), second in average finish (2.80) and second in quarterfinal home games (nine).
- Lehigh is also second in number of Patriot League (regular season) victories (102) and number of double-figure win seasons (seven).
- Over the last seven years (even without current NBA standout C.J. McCollum), the Mountain Hawks still stand second in total (regular season) Patriot League victories in that span with 75.
- Lehigh is one of just two teams to post 10+ Patriot League regular season victories in each of the last five years.

STRONG EFFORT VS. GAELS (NOV. 23)

- Lehigh trailed Saint Mary's by just three at the half and even though the Gaels opened a 13-point advantage midway through the second, the Mountain Hawks fought back to give themselves a chance down the stretch. Lehigh eventually fell 77-66.
- Lehigh trailed by eight early (12-4), but the Mountain Hawks scored 14 of the next 18 points. A **Jeameril Wilson** post move gave Lehigh its first lead midway through the first half. After Saint Mary's surged ahead, the Mountain Hawks scored the final four points of the first half - capped off by an impressive give-and-go between senior **Jordan Cohen** and junior **James Karnik** following a timeout - to pull within 35-32 after 20 minutes of play. Late in the second, Lehigh pulled within single digits on multiple occasions, including within seven in the final minutes, but couldn't get over the hump.

- The effort came against a Saint Mary's program coming off a West Coast Conference Championship Game victory over Gonzaga. The Gaels are one of the nation's winningest program over the last decade.
- Leading Lehigh's offense was Cohen, who scored 26 points and dished five assists. He became the first Mountain Hawk with 25+ points since Cohen did so last Jan. 30 at Lafayette (scoring 33 in that game). That marked Cohen's second of two consecutive 30+ point games.
- Cohen became the first Mountain Hawks with at least 25 points and five assists since Kyle Leufroy also had 26 and five against Bucknell last Jan. 19. Cohen became the first Mountain Hawks with at least 25 and five in a road game since Kahron Ross had 30 points and five assists at American on Feb. 2, 2018.
- Cohen also had a steal vs. Saint Mary's to reach exactly 100 in his career.
- Karnik added 12 points and 10 rebounds for his second double-double in the last three games (third of the season and ninth of his career).
- Sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** added 10 points on 4-of-7 shooting, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range. Wilson tallied double-figure points in five of the seven games of 2019-20 after five games with 10+ points his entire freshman season.
- The game saw a number of student-athletes playing in front of friends and family. Being out west, several family members of Cohen and freshman **Jakob Alamudun** (both Southern California natives) were in attendance. Karnik's family (Surrey, British Columbia) was also in attendance.

FIGHTING OFF MISERICORDIA (NOV. 18)

- The Mountain Hawks erased early deficits and outscored the Cougars 55-36 in the second half for the runaway victory.
- Freshman **Reed Fenton** impressed, posting 14 points, four rebounds, four assists and a steal. He made things happen on both ends of the floor and ended the day with a game-best plus/minus of plus 31.
- Meanwhile, junior **James Karnik** posted his second double-double of the season with 18 points and 12 rebounds.
- Sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** scored a season-high 15 points, shooting 6-of-9 from the field.
- Defensively, Lehigh tallied 11 steals (led by three each from Karnik and senior **Jordan Cohen**). It was the Mountain Hawks' first time with double-digit steals since last January 24 at Navy.

IMPRESSIVE ROAD W AT ALBANY (NOV. 9)

- The Mountain Hawks picked up the first-ever road win for either side in the all-time series between Lehigh and Albany.
- Lehigh used a 21-10 run to end the first half to take a 10-point halftime advantage, on the way to its first win of the season.
- The Mountain Hawks extended their lead to 17 midway through the first half. The Great Danes staged a comeback and pulled as close as three in the final seconds, but junior **James Karnik** knocked down a big free throw with eight seconds remaining for a four-point lead, which proved to be the final as the Mountain Hawks' spoiled the season (and home) opener for the perennial America East contenders.
- Karnik filled the stat sheet with 16 points, five rebounds (to reach exactly 500 in his career), a steal and three blocks. It marked Karnik's second straight game with three blocks after never tallying more than two in a game over his first two seasons.
- Senior **Jordan Cohen** led the offense with 17 points while sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** also reached double figures for the first time this year, scoring 10. Junior **Marques Wilson** filled up the stat sheet with eight points, seven rebounds and four assists while freshman **Reed Fenton** scored eight points as well, along with a rebound and two steals.
- Fenton's point total was his high through two games. Same was true for classmates **Jake Betlow** (five points) and **Jakob Alamudun** (six). Alamudun scored four first-half points, marking the first points of his collegiate career. Senior **Ed Porter** also scored for the first time this season.
- It marked Lehigh's first win against an America East team since Dec. 28, 2014, a 58-55 victory at UMBC. Lehigh has only played five current members of the America East (Albany, New Hampshire, Stony Brook, Vermont and UMBC).
- It was also the third straight year Lehigh has won its first road game of the season (winning at Marist in 2017-18 and at Monmouth in 2019-20).

COHEN, KARNIK, LIEB NAMED CAPTAINS

Head coach **Brett Reed** announced the Mountain Hawks' 2019-20 captains, which include seniors **Jordan Cohen** and **Jack Lieb**, and junior **James Karnik**.

Cohen is Lehigh's leading returning scorer after averaging 13.6 points during his junior campaign. Among his many highlights was back-to-back games with 30+ points - at Boston University and home vs. Lafayette. A strong all-around student-athlete, Cohen was named third team All-Patriot League for his on-court success while also garnering Academic All-League for a second straight season. Additionally, Cohen was named a Google Cloud Academic All-District honoree, the program's first honoree since 2009. Karnik is the Mountain Hawks' other returning starter from last season, averaging 9.3 points and 6.1 rebounds per contest. He was especially impressive in Patriot League play, averaging 11.4 points and 6.6 boards. The team's Coaches Award winner, Karnik tied for eighth in the league in rebounding and was fourth in field goal percentage (59.2, 113-of-191). Lieb has not seen action in his Lehigh career due to injury, but has continued to make his presence felt as a veteran, so much so that his teammates helped make him a captain this season.

COACH REED PUTTING UP THE W'S

Head coach **Brett Reed** reached 100-career Patriot League (regular season) wins last season, becoming just the fourth coach in league history to reach that plateau. Below is the list. Reed tied Jeff Jones of American coach for fastest to reach 100 PL wins in terms of number of seasons (11th season for both Reed and Jones). However, for both Flannery and Jones, it took fewer games to reach 100.

Here is where Reed stands among Patriot League laurels for total wins and Patriot League victories. Reed's 200th win came during a 78-72 home-opening win over Marist on Nov. 13, 2018. He tied Jones for third place with a home win over Saint Francis (Pa.) (Dec. 22) and overtook Jones with an 86-83 victory over Lafayette (Jan. 2) in Stabler Arena. With the thrilling overtime win at Lafayette on Jan. 30, Reed moved past Jones all alone into third place for Patriot League victories.

MCCOLLUM STARRING FOR TRAIL BLAZERS

- Former Lehigh standout **C.J. McCollum** is starring in his seventh NBA season with the Portland Trail Blazers.
- McCollum is currently averaging 21.7 points per game this season (**before games Dec. 17**). That number is currently 21st in the NBA. McCollum averaged 20+ points per game each of the previous four years as one of the NBA's most elite scorers.

2019-20 Season Highlights

- McCollum scored 20+ points in 10 straight games (Nov. 16 through Dec. 4).
- McCollum scored 35 points on Oct. 27 at Dallas, knocking down 13-of-26 from the field and 8-of-8 from the free throw line.
- McCollum scored 32 points on Nov. 16 at San Antonio. He shot 13-of-25 from the field, including 6-of-11 from 3-point range while adding seven assists and six rebounds.
- On Nov. 21 at Milwaukee, McCollum scored 37 points on 15-of-29 shooting, including 5-of-10 from 3. He also added 10 assists for a double-double, and six rebounds.
- McCollum scored 33 points on Dec. 4 against Sacramento, shooting 14-of-22 from the field, including 5-of-10 from 3-point range.
- McCollum scored 30 points in a Dec. 16 road win at Phoenix while adding seven rebounds and six assists.

marked Lehigh's eighth candidate in the past eleven years.

- Tejada tied a school-record with 10 made three-pointers at Holy Cross, tying Joe Knight and teammate Pat Andree.
- The Mountain Hawks featured one first team All-League honoree (Tejada) and two third-team honorees (**Jordan Cohen** and **Kyle Leufroy**). Lehigh has had three All-League honorees three times in the last four years. Prior to that, it happened just one other time in program history.
- Leufroy became the first player in program history to finish his career 8-0 vs. Lafayette. Leufroy went on to finish 8-0 against American as well. Ironically, the year before Leufroy arrived at Lehigh, Lafayette vs. American was the Patriot League Championship Game matchup.
- Lehigh finished 5-3 in February to extend its February mark to 27-5 (84.4 win percentage) since February of 2016. That mark since that point is fourth in the nation, only behind Gonzaga, Vermont and Kansas ahead of Wichita State.
- The Mountain Hawks reached 20 wins for the second time in the last three years and fifth time in the last 10. Prior to that, the program had just two 20-win seasons in program history.
- The program's top three totals for Patriot League wins have come in the last three seasons. 1) 13 in 2015-16, t-2) 12 in 2016-17 and 2018-19.
- The top two comeback wins in Coach Reed's tenure as Lehigh head coach came in 2018-19: 19 at Army West Point and 18 at Holy Cross.
- Over the last four years, Lehigh has been first (2018-19), ninth (2017-18), 23rd (39.2) and 15th (2015-16) nationally in three-point percentage.
- Lehigh's 80.0 points per game was most in Coach Reed's career. It also marked just the second time since the turn of the century that a Patriot League team averaged 80+ per game.

NONLEAGUE SUCCESS

Lehigh's 7-4 nonleague record in 2018-19 was its best since 2012-13 when it finished 10-3, one year before going 7-6 in 2013-14. The Mountain Hawks' only losses last season came to three power-conference opponents (Miami, Kansas State and West Virginia) along with Ivy League power Yale. Among Lehigh's victories was a win over another strong Ivy League squad Princeton, while also beating pre-season NEC favorite Saint Francis (Pa.).

2018-19 Season Highlights

- Among many highlights, McCollum scored 40 points against Milwaukee on Nov. 6, the most points ever scored by the Trail Blazers against the Bucks.
- McCollum scored 35 points in just 28 minutes on Dec. 30 vs. Philadelphia, shooting 13-of-18 from the field.
- McCollum recorded his first-career triple-double on Saturday, Jan. 26 vs. Atlanta, posting 28 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists in a 120-111 win.

Additional Notes

- During the 2017-18 season, *McCollum was the talk of the NBA on Jan. 31, 2018 when he scored a career-high 50 points vs. Chicago. McCollum set a Portland franchise record for points in a quarter with 28 in the first.* It also marked the most points any NBA player scored in a quarter this season. McCollum went on to tally 50 points on 18-of-25 shooting, including 6-of-9 from three-point range. It came in just 29 minutes as McCollum didn't play the fourth quarter with the Trail Blazers leading comfortably. He became just the second NBA player in the shot clock era (along with Golden State's Klay Thompson) to score 50+ points in less than 30 minutes.
- On June 27, 2013, McCollum became the first player in school history to be selected in the NBA Draft. He declared for the 2012 draft, but officially withdrew from the NBA Draft on Monday, Apr. 9, 2012 to return to Lehigh for his senior season. McCollum went on to write a piece published on *Sporting News'* website titled "Why I'm returning to Lehigh for my senior year," citing earning his degree as one of the primary reasons.

STRONG IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Mountain Hawks take a lot of pride in their academic performance.
- Last spring, seven Mountain Hawks were named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll - Shane Acoveno (3.55, Computer Science), Pat Andree (3.50, Psychology), Jordan Cohen (4.0, Finance), Joe Foley (4.0, Business), Jack Lieb (3.25, Finance), Ed Porter (3.47, Sociology) and David Roelke (3.70, Political Science).
- Both Andree and Cohen were named to the five-member Academic All-Patriot League team each of the last two seasons. Prior to last year, Lehigh had never featured more than one student-athlete on the team.
- Cohen was also named 2019 Google Cloud Academic All-District, Lehigh's first Academic All-District honoree since Marquis Hall in 2009.

DOUBLE THE PRODUCTION

- Lehigh has five double-doubles this season, led by four from **James Karnik**. Here's a rundown:

- The Mountain Hawks posted nine double-doubles last season, three from **Nic Lynch** (at Miami on Nov. 9, vs. Princeton on Nov. 16 and at Loyola on Mar. 2), two from **Pat Andree** (vs. Marist on Nov. 13 and vs. Lafayette on Jan. 2), two from **James Karnik** (vs. Loyola on Jan. 6) and two from **Kyle Leufroy** (at Holy Cross on Jan. 9 and at Army on Feb. 2).

OFFENSIVE JUGGERNAUT

Lehigh is consistently near the top of the Patriot League in scoring, leading the way in 2009-10 (75.1 PPG), 2010-11 (73.6), 2011-12 (75.7) and 2012-13 (73.1). In 2016-17, the Mountain Hawks finished second (76.0 points per game) before finishing second again last season (77.9). Every other year in between, Lehigh has finished in the top half of the league in scoring.

Last year, the Mountain Hawks averaged 80.0 points per game, first in the Patriot League. Lehigh is averaging 67.8 points per contest so far this year.

Year after year, Lehigh has excelled at the charity stripe. In 2016-17, the Mountain Hawks knocked down 77.2 percent from the line (448-of-580), good for 12th in the nation. In 2017-18, the Mountain Hawks shot 77.7 percent (373-of-480), first in the Patriot League and 12th in the nation. Last year, Lehigh shot 77.4 percent (480-of-620), 11th in the nation. *So far this year, the Mountain Hawks are shooting 73.7 percent (87-of-118), good for 75th in the nation.*

HOME SWEET STABLER

The Mountain Hawks have won 17 of their last 23, 60 of their last 90, 82 of their last 116 and 95 of their last 134 in the friendly confines of Stabler Arena. They had an 11-game home win streak snapped vs. Bryant on Dec. 29, 2012 and an eight-game winning streak snapped on Jan. 5, 2014 against Boston University. Lehigh also had an eight-game home winning streak snapped during the 2016 Patriot League Championship Game.

Head Coach

13th Year as Lehigh Head Coach

The 2019-20 season is Dr. Brett Reed's 13th as the Murray H. Goodman '48 Head Men's Basketball Coach at Lehigh University. In 12 years on the sideline, Reed has become the winningest coach in Lehigh history and has won more than 70 percent of his games at Stabler Arena.

During the 2012-13 season, Reed won his 100th career game and became the fastest coach to 100 wins in the history of the Patriot League. The same season, he also became the all-time winningest coach in school history. Early in the 2018-19 season, he reached 200 career victories. Reed is the Patriot League's second longest-tenured coach.

Reed owns a 58.1 career Division I winning percentage, good for sixth in Patriot League history and second among active coaches. Reed's 218 overall wins, and 114 Patriot League victories, are both third in league history.

Reed has consistently won at Lehigh, eclipsing 20 wins three times in a four-year span from 2009-13, which also included three national post-season appearances. The Mountain Hawks twice won the Patriot League and advanced to the NCAA Tournament while advancing to the College Basketball Invitational in 2013. Lehigh reached back-to-back Patriot League Championship Games in 2016 and 2017, marking the third and fourth times in eight seasons the Mountain Hawks played in the title game. In 2018-19, Reed led Lehigh to 20 victories for the fifth time in 10 years, finishing in the top four of the league standings in nine of the last 10 seasons. Reed's teams have played their best basketball when it matters, posting a 22-2 record in February between 2016 and 2018 (9-0 in 2016, 6-2 in 2017 and 7-0 in 2018). Counting last season, the Mountain Hawks are 27-5 in February dating back to 2016, and 59-33 in the month during Reed's head coaching career.

Lehigh has developed plenty of impressive talent in Reed's tenure, led by two-time All-American and Patriot League Player of the Year C.J. McCollum '13 who was selected 10th overall by the Portland Trail Blazers in the 2013 NBA Draft and has developed into an NBA star. McCollum has finished at or near the top 20 in the NBA in scoring each of the last three seasons (23.0 points per game in 2016-17, 21.4 in 2017-18 and 21.0 in 2018-19). Tim Kempton '17 was a two-time Patriot League Player of the Year, who was invited to play for the Milwaukee Bucks in the NBA Summer League following graduation, leading to a professional contract overseas. Reed has recruited at an extremely effective rate, having secured five of the last 12 Patriot League Rookies of the Year along with many alumni playing professionally overseas.

Reed will be most remembered for the 2011-12 season, when the Mountain Hawks posted a school-record 27 wins, along with the program's third Patriot League Championship (and second in the three years). The highlight was a historic 75-70 NCAA Tournament win over Duke, becoming only the sixth No. 15 seed to ever beat a No. 2 seed and second in the same day (Norfolk State defeated Missouri just hours earlier). McCollum led the way with 30 points as Lehigh never trailed by more than five and was leading for much of the game. Mountain Hawks' largest lead came in the final minute (eight) as the squad always had an answer for the Blue Devils' runs.

That game helped put the Lehigh men's basketball program squarely on the map as over the ensuing days, the Mountain Hawks were featured in an endless number of national media outlets including SportsCenter, ESPN Radio, Fox Sports Radio, Sports Illustrated, USA Today and much more. The Mountain Hawks entered the following season ranked among the mid-major's best teams by numerous outlets. The 2011-12 season also featured a school record for nonleague wins (12), the Mountain Hawks shattered the program's previous wins record of 22 (also set by a Reed-led team). Along the way, Lehigh played tough against power conference foes, including NCAA Tournament No. 1 seed Michigan State when the Mountain Hawks held a 38-35 lead at the half.

The Mountain Hawks earned two more wins against power conference foes during the 2014-15 season as Lehigh took a big step forward in its quest to return to championship contention. The Mountain Hawks' season was highlighted by two wins over power conference opponents DePaul and Arizona State, and a tight loss to eventual No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament Villanova. After a slow start to Patriot League play, the Mountain Hawks rebounded by winning seven-of-eight games midway through the league schedule. Late in the season, Lehigh dominated eventual regular season

champion Bucknell to clinch a home game in the Patriot League Quarterfinals.

Several individuals took their play to new levels in 2014-15, highlighted by Kempton who was named the league's Player of the Year as just a sophomore. Along with Kempton, freshman Kahron Ross became the Mountain Hawks' fifth Patriot League Rookie of the Year in the previous nine seasons, along with Marquis Hall (2007), Rob Keefer (2008), McCollum (2010) and Kempton (2014). Ross set a single-game record with 14 assists in Lehigh's thrilling win at Arizona State.

Lehigh rebounded from a slow start in 2015-16 winning 11 straight games beginning in early February, tying the program's 90-year school record. The Mountain Hawks surged to the No. 2 seed in the league tournament and went on to host the quarterfinals, semifinals and championship game. It marked the sixth time in seven seasons that Lehigh has played at least one Patriot League Tournament game at home. The Mountain Hawks wrapped up an undefeated February, their first undefeated month since November of 1993. When all was said and done, Lehigh finished the season with a school-record 13 Patriot League victories.

Kempton and Ross were each named first team All-Patriot League, marking the first time in school history Lehigh has featured multiple first team honorees. Ross broke the school's single-season record for assists (194), previously held by Mackey McKnight. Kempton was also named Patriot League Player of the Year for the second straight season, becoming just the third player in league history to earn the honor twice before his senior season. The others were McCollum and Colgate's Adonal Foyle. As a team, Lehigh finished the season 15th nationally in three-point percentage (39.2).

The Mountain Hawks finished the 2016-17 season with a 20-12 record, tied for second in the league standings before defeating Colgate and Boston University in the Patriot League Tournament to reach their second straight title game. Among Lehigh's wins was an 87-73 win at Mississippi State, the program's first-ever victory over the SEC. The Mountain Hawks also defeated eventual Ivy League Champion Princeton as one of four wins over NCAA Tournament teams. Kempton led the league in points (20.4) and rebounds (10.4) and was named a Final Five Finalist for Kareem-Abdul Jabbar National Center of the Year. He also became Lehigh's first-ever participant in the 2017 Reese's® Division I College All-Star Game, going on to score a game-high 21 points.

In 2017-18, Lehigh graduated over 4,000 points and 1,600 rebounds from the previous year, but still found itself near the top of the league standings. The Mountain Hawks won eight straight games to end the regular season tied for third place in the league. Among the victories was a thrilling overtime win over Bucknell in early February, handing the eventual Patriot League Champion its last defeat until the NCAA Tournament. Lehigh finished the season 4-1 in overtime. Ross finished his career as the Lehigh and Patriot League all-time career leader for assists. He was named second team All-Patriot League, becoming the program's first-ever four-time All-League honoree. Ross also became the first student-athlete in program history to finish his career 4-0 at archrival Lafayette. In one stretch, Lehigh exceeded 50 percent from three-point range in six straight games. The Mountain Hawks had double-digit makes in eight straight and 10-of-11, finishing the year 40.6 percent as a team, good for ninth nationally.

The hot shooting continued in 2018-19 as Lehigh knocked down 42.3 percent of its three-pointers, leading the nation and almost a full percent more than any other team in the country. It also marked a Patriot League record. The Mountain Hawks finished the year 20-11 and 12-6 in league play, their fifth straight season with 10+ Patriot League victories. Lehigh's 7-4 non-league record was its best since 2011-12. Lance Tejada received All-League recognition for a second straight season, garnering first-team laurels for the first time. The Mountain Hawks did not lose two straight games all season, showing strong resiliency and an ability to bounce back. In the Patriot League Quarterfinals vs. Army, Lehigh came back from a double-figure second-half deficit to advance, marking the Mountain Hawks' third double-figure second-half comeback against the Black Knights of the season. In the Patriot League opener at Holy Cross, Lehigh erased an 18-point deficit to beat the Crusaders in overtime, the largest comeback in Reed's head coaching tenure. Tejada tied the program record for three-pointers with 10 in the victory, tying the mark set by Joe Knight and teammate Pat Andree. Less than a month later, Lehigh went on to erase a 19-point deficit at Army West Point.

Another impressive season under Reed came in 2012-13 when the Mountain Hawks finished 21-10 and played in a national postseason tournament for a second straight season and third time in four years. Lehigh began the season 9-2, including an eight-game winning streak capped off by a 90-75 win at North Texas. McCollum went down with a season-ending injury at VCU on Jan. 5, but the Mountain Hawks wouldn't go away quietly. Lehigh

posted a 10-4 record in league play to tie for second in the league standings. Reed picked up his 100th career win in style as the Mountain Hawks defeated Fairleigh Dickinson, 102-62. He went on to post his school record-breaking victory in a 72-43 win at Navy. Following the season, McCollum, the Patriot League's all-time leading scorer, became the first player in school history and second in league history selected in the NBA Draft.

Reed's first Patriot League Title as head coach came in 2009-10 when he led the Mountain Hawks to their second Patriot League Tournament Championship, first outright regular season league title, the most wins in school history (at the time) and the most-ever wins at Stabler Arena. The Mountain Hawks also led the Patriot League in scoring offense, scoring margin, three-point percentage, assist-to-turnover ratio and defensive rebounds. Their 220 made three-pointers established a new school record, later broken just four seasons later when Lehigh knocked down 235 in 2013-14. The 2009-10 team also set a mark for the most dominant run in the Patriot League Tournament's history, winning every game by 15 points or more. They also excelled in the classroom. Lehigh's starting five of Dave Buchberger, Zahir Carrington, Hall, McCollum and Gabe Knutson achieved an average grade point average of 3.2.

During Reed's second season at the helm in 2008-09 season, the Mountain Hawks continued to build upon the solid foundation established at the beginning of his Lehigh career. The accomplishments included the most overall road wins since 1991 and the school's first-ever victory over a Big East foe. Hall went onto become Lehigh's first-ever Patriot League Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, while Carrington was the school's first All-District selection since 1988.

In his first season as a collegiate head coach, Reed led the Mountain Hawks to the third most wins for a first-year headman in the 108-season history of Lehigh Basketball. Reed mentored the Mountain Hawks' second consecutive Patriot League Rookie of the Year in Keefer as Lehigh became the first school in the league to accomplish that feat. In addition, Reed oversaw a defensive unit that held league foe Bucknell to just 39 points on February 27, 2008 - the second fewest points ever allowed by the Brown and White since the inception of Patriot League play in 1990.

Reed has recruited and developed some excellent basketball talent over the course of his career at Lehigh. In addition to McCollum and several Rookie of the Year performers, there have been a host of others who have enjoyed individual accomplishments and recognition. Lehigh has also featured high-level performers in the classroom and community as well. Hall was named the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year in consecutive seasons while Knutson was a three-time Academic All-Patriot League performer. Andree and Jordan Cohen were named Academic All-League in 2017-18. Hall, McCollum and Kempton have been named finalists for the Senior CLASS Award while Knutson, Corey Schaefer, Austin Price and Tejada have been named candidates for the prestigious award.

Reed was named Lehigh's head coach on August 10, 2007. He had been an assistant at Lehigh for the previous five years, serving as associate head coach for the 2006-07 campaign.

Prior to his time at Lehigh, Reed served as the top assistant coach at High Point University in North Carolina for two seasons. Reed was an integral part of the coaching staff that led the Panthers to the Big South Championship Game in 2002. Included in that two-year period, Reed recruited a Big South Rookie of the Year and a Player of the Year.

Reed spent the 1999-2000 season as the Director of Basketball Operations at the University of North Carolina - Greensboro. He began his collegiate coaching career at Oakland (Mich.) Community College where he was an assistant for his father's program.

A native of Waterford, Michigan, Reed attended Eckerd College in St. Petersburg, Florida where he contributed at point guard and helped lead his team to a conference championship and NCAA Tournament appearance. Reed graduated with honors, earning his Bachelor's degree in 1995 before earning his Master's at Wayne State in 1998. In 2003, Reed received his Ph.D. from Wayne State University in Instructional Technology with a Cognate in Sports Administration. He is one of only two Division I men's basketball



head coaches in the entire nation to have earned their doctorate degrees. Reed was also honored during his academic career with a number of awards including the prestigious Thomas C. Rumbell Fellowship.

Reed and his wife Kindra reside in Bethlehem with their sons Brendan and Calvin, and daughter Makenna.

**ASSISTANT COACH
HARRY MORRA**

Harry Morra enters his fifth season as Lehigh assistant coach in 2019-20 following a stint with the program as video coordinator during the program's historic 2011-12 season. After that season at Lehigh, Morra spent the next three years as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at nearby DeSales University.

In Morra's four seasons at Lehigh, the Mountain Hawks have gone 73-51, playing in two Patriot League Championship games, winning 20 games twice and accumulating double-figure league victories all four seasons. Lehigh has also earned a home game in the Patriot League Quarterfinals every season, extending its streak to nine time in the last 10 seasons.

In his first season at Lehigh, Morra helped lead the Mountain Hawks to the 2016 Patriot League Championship Game. Lehigh won its final nine regular season games and saw its winning streak reach 11 (to tie a school record) after wins over Navy and American in the Patriot League Quarterfinals and Semifinals, respectively. The Mountain Hawks hosted the league championship game for the first time since 2010, reaching the title game for the third time in seven seasons.

Lehigh followed in 2016-17 by reaching its second straight title game. The Mountain Hawks finished 20-12, finishing the regular season tied for second in the league standings before defeating Colgate and Boston University in the Patriot League Tournament to reach their second straight title game. In Morra's time at DeSales, the Bulldogs went 102-39. He helped lead DeSales to two Regular Season Championships, two Freedom Tournament Championships, along with three NCAA Tournament wins. Morra helped develop three 1,000 point scorers, two All-Americans, two Freedom MVPs and a National Rookie

Team member.

As assistant coach, Morra designed and executed recruiting strategies for New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New York, Delaware and Maryland. He planned and executed an annual Prospect Camp for 50 participants and Team Camp with 30 teams from all over the Mid-Atlantic region. He also prepared and presented scouting reports for 2014 Freedom Conference Coach of the Year Scott Covall.

During graduate school at Lehigh, Morra took a year off from DeSales and was Lehigh's video coordinator during a memorable 2011-12 season, which featured a Patriot League Championship and historic NCAA Tournament win over Duke. Morra was responsible for film exchange, advanced scouting and game/practice video breakdown.

Morra has worked camps at Duke, Villanova and Lehigh. After college, he was both a player and then assistant coach for Belfast Star of the Sea, which competes in the 12-team Irish Superleague. He also has experience as Operations Manager for PeacePlayers International in Northern Ireland and South Africa, an ESPY Award winning basketball non-profit organization based out of Washington, D.C.

As a player, Morra was a four-year member and two-year captain at DeSales, shooting 48 percent from three-point range in 2004 as a senior captain of the 24-5 MAC Champions.

Morra and his wife Kelly Lyons reside in Bethlehem with their four-year old son Marcus.



**ASSISTANT COACH
NOEL HIGHTOWER**

Noel Hightower begins his fourth season on the Lehigh coaching staff in 2018-19, and third as assistant coach, after serving as the director of basketball operations in 2016-17.

In Hightower's three seasons at Lehigh, the Mountain Hawks have gone 56-36, playing in a Patriot League Championship game, winning 20 games twice and accumulating double-figure league victories all three seasons.

In his first season at Lehigh, Hightower managed day-to-day operations of the program as Lehigh advanced to its second straight Patriot League Championship Game.

Hightower helped coach a young team in 2017-18, which graduated over 4,000 points and 1,600 rebounds from the previous year, but still found itself near the top of the league standings. The Mountain Hawks won eight straight games to end the regular season tied for third place in the league, earning a home game in the Patriot League Quarterfinals. Among Lehigh's victories was a thrilling overtime win over Bucknell in early February, handing the eventual Patriot League Champion its last defeat until the NCAA Tournament.

Kahron Ross led the charge, finishing his career as the Lehigh and Patriot League all-time career leader for assists (660). He was named second team All-Patriot League, becoming the program's first-ever four-time All-League honoree. Ross also became the first student-athlete in program history to finish his career 4-0 at archrival Lafayette. In addition to Ross, transfer Lance Tejada was named second team All-Patriot League in his first season donning the Brown and White. Tejada finished 10th nationally in three-point percentage (45.3) while teammate Pat Andree finished 23rd (42.9). In one stretch, Lehigh exceeded 50 percent from three-point range in six straight games. The Mountain Hawks had double-digit makes in eight in a row and 10-of-11, finishing the year 40.6 percent as a team, good for ninth nationally. Lehigh posted a 7-0 record in February to improve to 22-2 over the last three Februaries.

In the Patriot League opener at Holy Cross, Lehigh erased an 18-point deficit to beat the Crusaders in overtime, the largest comeback in head coach Brett Reed's head coaching tenure. Tejada tied the program record for three-pointers with 10 in the victory, tying the mark set by Joe Knight and teammate Pat Andree. Less than a month later, Lehigh went on to erase a 19-point deficit at Army West Point.

Hightower is a 2016 graduate of Chestnut Hill, where he was a two-sport student-athlete. He won the Athletic Director's Award, given annually to the male and female student-athlete who best demonstrates dedication to the mission of the College and excels in his or her sport of choice.

As a senior, Hightower averaged 6.1 points and a team-high 8.3 rebounds per game while serving as the heart and soul of the Griffins' defense. For his career, he ranks second in school history in rebounds (577), second in offensive rebounds (225), fifth in defensive rebounds (352), seventh in rebounds per game (5.4), second in blocks (114) and fifth in steals (128). Hightower shot 53.4 percent from the field as a senior (63-of-118). He was also a standout track and field athlete, highlighted by winning a CACC Individual Championship in 2015 in the 110-meter hurdles.

Hightower has shown tremendous leadership, serving as a three-year captain. He was also a member of Chestnut Hill College's Diversity Committee, vice president of the Student Athlete Advisory Committee, Presidential Leadership Award winner and the 2015 conference representative at the NCAA Leadership Forum.

Hightower has basketball experience outside of playing, which includes serving as a camp counselor at Lehigh's summer camps from 2013 through 2015. He was Director of a 3 vs. 3 Basketball Tournament, where he managed the tournament's operations, and assisted in game management at Chestnut Hill athletic events.



**ASSISTANT COACH
QUINN MCDOWELL**

Quinn McDowell enters his first season as Lehigh assistant coach in 2019-20. He comes to Lehigh after stints with Virginia Wesleyan and Taylor University.

A strong student-athlete himself, McDowell was a four-year starter and two-time All-Conference selection at William & Mary, graduating in 2012. He became the first player in CAA history to be named the Dean Ehlers Leadership Award winner twice (the award goes to the student-athlete who "embodies the highest standards of leadership, integrity and sportsmanship in conjunction with his academic athletic achievement."). McDowell was a three-time CAA All-Academic Team honoree and was named one of 10 finalists for the prestigious Senior CLASS Award, the first finalist in CAA men's basketball history to be named a finalist. He was Team MVP as a senior, becoming one of only four players in W&M history with 1,600 career points and 500 career rebounds. McDowell set the William & Mary school record for games played and minutes played in a career.

McDowell went on to play post-graduation in top basketball leagues, including the G-League, the VTB League in Russia, LEB Gold in Spain and SBL in Australia.

McDowell began his coaching career as assistant at Division III Virginia Wesleyan University. Along with day-to-day scouting, recruitment and player development, McDowell helped monitor the academic progress of the student-athletes, which led to an all-time high grade point average and 100 percent graduation rate. McDowell also amplified the program's social media presence, increased camp enrollment and came up with strategic initiatives for the head coach to help raise funds for the program.

McDowell comes to Lehigh after one season at NAIA Taylor University in Indiana. While there, the former William & Mary standout handled scouting, game planning and played a critical role in player development and recruiting. McDowell also served as the strength and conditioning coach, working closely with the athletic trainers and head coach to design and implement strength and conditioning programs.

GREG TARCA**

Greg Tarca enters his second season on staff in 2019-20 and first as Director of Basketball Operations after serving as Video Coordinator in 2018-19. Tarca came to Lehigh after graduating from Quinnipiac in May of 2018 as a four-year member of the men's basketball program.

The Mountain Hawks' Sixth Man Award winner in his first season with the program, Tarca played an integral role in video breakdown. Lehigh finished the 2018-19 season with a 20-11 record, 12-6 in league play, their fifth straight season with 10+ Patriot League victories. The Mountain Hawks also finished top four in the final standings, earning a quarterfinal home game for the ninth time in the last 10 years.

Also in 2018-19, Lehigh knocked down 42.3 percent of its three-pointers, leading the nation and almost a full percent better than any other team in the country. It also marked a Patriot League record.

Tarca played in 18 career games for Quinnipiac, earning a full scholarship in December of his senior year after spending four years as a walk-on. Tarca started his Senior Day game vs. Saint Peter's and scored a layup in the game's final minute. His impact went far beyond the court, which included serving as legislative chair of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Tarca led a group of student-athletes in weekly meetings, spoke on behalf of the organization and more.

Despite being fresh out of college, Tarca does have experience as a supervisor/coach at the Grundy Hoops Academy, facilitating basketball clinics for students ages eight to 16 and teaching fundamental basketball skills. Tarca has also interned at The Hoop Group, assisting in the recruitment of future campers nation-wide, building relationships with high school, college and AAU coaches, and assisting with logistics, planning and day-to-day operations of camps.

Billy Dunn begins his third season on the Lehigh men's basketball staff, serving as Student-Athlete Support and Enrichment Coordinator. Dunn has previously served as Director of Operations and Enrichment.

In his first season at Lehigh, Dunn served as a resource for the Mountain Hawks' players and coaches, speaking into concepts of character and leadership while running a pregame chapel for those interested. Lehigh posted an eight-game winning streak to end the regular season, tying for third place in the league standings and earning a home game in the Patriot League Quarterfinals for the eighth time in the last nine years. Dunn received the team's Sixth Man of the Year Award at its annual end-of-year banquet.

Dunn expanded his role in 2018-19, serving as Director of Operations and Enrichment. He continued to serve as a resource for the members of the program, running things such as a pregame chapel, while also coordinating the daily operations of the program such as travel.

Dunn has worked locally in the Lehigh Valley in the game of basketball. MONMOUTH 66, LEHIGH 62

BETHLEHEM, Pa. - The Lehigh men's basketball team trimmed an early 16-point hole down to one late in the second half, but Monmouth immediately answered with an 8-0 run, on the way to downing the Mountain Hawks 66-62 in the season opener for both sides Tuesday evening in Stabler Arena. Junior **James Karnik** was stellar, posting his 13 points and 11 rebounds for his seventh-career double-double. Freshman **Evan Taylor** scored a team-high 15 points in his collegiate debut.

Karnik came alive in the second half, posting nine points and seven boards over the final 20 minutes. Karnik also had three blocks and took two charges, all in the second half as well.

Meanwhile, Taylor's 15 points came on 5-of-11 shooting, 2-of-2 from 3-point range and 3-of-3 from the free throw line. Taylor was one of five Mountain Hawk first-years to see action and one of three to score points in their first collegiate games.

Senior **Jordan Cohen** added 13 points, seven assists and four rebounds while junior **Marques Wilson** had 10 points and five boards to round out Mountain Hawks with double-figure points.

A back-and-forth first few minutes saw neither team lead by more than four. But after Karnik put the Mountain Hawks up 10-9 with 15:09 on the clock, Monmouth staged a big 17-0 run - capped off by a Deion Hammond 3-pointer - to give the Hawks a 26-10 advantage with 10:38 left in the first half.

Lehigh slowly chipped away from there, pulling within 12 after Marques Wilson treys with 9:04 then 7:55 remaining in the first.

Trailing by 16 once again with less than three minutes to go, the Mountain Hawks ended the half on a 7-0 run. Sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** accounted for the final five points behind a highlight-reel driving layup, then 3-pointer just 42 seconds later, to pull within 41-32 after 20 minutes of play.

The momentum continued into the second as a Taylor 3-pointer got Lehigh within 44-39. Less than two minutes later, Taylor finished a 3-point play to get the Mountain Hawks within three at 45-42.

Monmouth extended its lead back to two possessions for much of the ensuing minutes, until four consecutive Lehigh points got the Mountain Hawks within 54-52 with 7:51 on the clock.

The Mountain Hawks followed by scoring just two points over the next 3:30, but played tough defense to stay close. A Karnik offensive rebound and layup got Lehigh back within 57-56, but again Monmouth answered with an 8-0 run to go up 65-56 with 2:55 on the clock.

Taylor scored five of Lehigh's next six points to pull back within three, but a Cohen jumper with 12 seconds remaining was off line, and Monmouth wrapped up the 66-62 victory.

LEHIGH 74, ALBANY 70

ALBANY, N.Y. - The Lehigh men's basketball team ended the first half on a 21-10 run to take a 10-point halftime lead, then extended the advantage to 17 in the second half, on the way to a 74-70 win at Albany on Saturday evening. The Mountain Hawks bounced back from Tuesday's season-opening defeat to Monmouth in a big way, defeating the perennial America East contenders on their opening night. Senior **Jordan Cohen** led the offense with 17 points on 6-of-8 shooting while junior **James Karnik** enjoyed another strong effort, tallying 15 points, five boards and three blocks.

Saturday marked the first time in the all-time series that the road team came out victorious. The home teams were 6-0 over the previous six meetings between Lehigh and Albany.

A balanced effort saw all nine Mountain Hawks who saw action score. Along with Cohen and Karnik, sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** added 10 points on 5-of-9 shooting. Junior **Marques Wilson** and freshman **Reed Fenton** added eight points apiece. The point total for Fenton was a high for his young career. The same was true for classmate **Jake Betlow** (five points) and **Jakob Alamudun** (six). Alamudun's points were the first of his collegiate career.

The teams traded leads for much of the early going. Mid first half, senior Ed Porter got on the scoresheet for the first time this season, as his short jumper gave the Mountain Hawks the lead for the first time in nearly eight minutes, 16-15, with 10:12 left in the half.

With Albany leading 17-16, the Mountain Hawks immediately staged a 9-0 run. The rally began with a Betlow transition 3-pointer and continued with Alamudun's first-career points, a jumper with 7:59 on the clock. Karnik and Alamudun later added 2-pointers for the 25-17 advantage with 6:24 left in the first.

Later in the half, Cohen gave Lehigh its first double-figure lead, as his fast break basket made it 33-23. That proved to be the halftime margin, as Marques Wilson knocked down a jumper with 33 seconds on the clock for the 37-27 lead after 20 minutes of play.

Lehigh struggled towards the beginning and end of the second half, but a dominant middle portion helped the Mountain Hawks to the victory. Early on, the Great Danes quickly trimmed Lehigh's lead down to five at 39-34. But from there, Lehigh staged a 12-1 run, with six of the points from Karnik, to take a 51-35 advantage.

The Mountain Hawks maintained their double-figure lead for most of the half, taking as much as a 17-point lead. Still leading by 16 with 7:57 remaining, Albany made a late rally, getting within four with 37 seconds remaining and three with 12 seconds on the clock, but Karnik knocked down a big free throw with eight seconds remaining to help ice the victory. Not long before, Marques Wilson and Jeameril Wilson each knocked down big shots in the final minutes to help give the Mountain Hawks the margin they would need.

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – The Lehigh men’s basketball team jumped out to a 16-0 lead and would never look back, downing Cairn 80-43 on Tuesday evening in Stabler Arena. A total team effort saw all 11 Mountain Hawks who played score points. Freshman **Jakob Alamudun** led the way with career highs in points (19) and rebounds (10) for his first-career double-double. Freshman **Evan Taylor** also scored 12 points while sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** added 10. With the win, Lehigh improves to 2-1 on the young campaign, ahead of a Saturday afternoon matchup at Virginia Tech.

In a game that saw all of Lehigh’s starters play less than 23 minutes, the bench made big contributions. Alamudun shot 6-of-9 from the field, including 3-of-5 from 3-point range. Senior **Ed Porter** added six points and a career-high nine rebounds while freshman **Andrei Arion** scored his first-career points, tallying three. He also added a career-high 10 rebounds.

The Mountain Hawks corralled 64 rebounds on the evening, tied for the second most by any team in the nation this season. It was also just seven from tying the Patriot League record of 71.

Lehigh held Cairn scoreless for the game’s first 7:17, scoring 16 points in that span. Junior **James Karnik** scored six of his eight points in the early run, including a pair of dunks.

The Highlanders pulled back within 16-10 and 18-12, but Lehigh answered with a monster 23-0 run to take a 41-12 advantage, on the way to the 41-15 halftime lead.

The Mountain Hawks continued to cruise in the second half, as a Taylor 3-pointer gave Lehigh its first 30-point lead, 52-20, with 14:20 remaining in the stanza. Late in the period, the advantage swelled to 37 on multiple occasions then 39 following a Porter layup in the final minute, on the way to the 80-43 final.

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – The Lehigh men’s basketball team led by as much as six in the first half Saturday and trailed by just five after 20 minutes of play, but Virginia Tech outscored the Mountain Hawks 42-21 in the second half for the 79-53 victory. Lehigh shot 48.0 percent from the field in the first half (and 41.7 percent from 3-point range), but tides turned in the second as Lehigh couldn’t pull off the upset against a Hokies’ program coming off a Sweet 16 appearance. In the end, 19 Mountain Hawk turnovers also proved costly.

Senior **Jordan Cohen** and sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** each scored 11 points to lead the offense. Among Wilson’s scoring was a thunderous, highlight-reel dunk less than two minutes into the second half.

In the end, eight Mountain Hawks attempted between five and eight field goal attempts. Freshman **Reed Fenton** and junior **Marques Wilson** each scored six points, combining to hit 3-of-7 3-pointers.

Lehigh got off to a fast start taking several early leads, due in large part to early 3-pointers from freshman **Evan Taylor** and Fenton. Trailing 9-8, the Mountain Hawks staged a 7-0 run, capped off by an **Ed Porter** basket, to take a 15-9 lead with 12:58 on the first-half clock.

With Lehigh leading 18-13, the Hokies scored 10 straight points to go up 23-18, but the Mountain Hawks fought back and pulled even at 23 and later 25. Virginia Tech answered with a 7-0 surge, but two Cohen free throws with 1:39 on the clock rounded out the first-half scoring and helped keep the Mountain Hawks within striking distance (37-32) at the half.

Wilson’s highlight dunk helped spark the Mountain Hawks early in the second half, but Virginia Tech came out of the locker room strong, eventually opening a double-digit lead. Lehigh was still within 12 with 12:15 remaining, but the Hokies used a 10-0 run to open a 22-point advantage. The Mountain Hawks could never get back in it, falling by the 79-53 final.

MORAGA, Calif. - The Lehigh men's basketball team played preseason top 25 team Saint Mary's tightly until the final whistle, but the Gaels held on in the end for the 77-66 victory on Saturday at McKeon Pavilion. Saint Mary's created a bit of separation in the second half, going up by 13. However, the Mountain Hawks wouldn't go away, pulling back within seven on multiple occasions in the final minute, but the Gaels hit enough free throws to keep Lehigh at arm's length. Senior **Jordan Cohen** was stellar to lead the Mountain Hawks' offense, scoring a season-high 26 points while dishing five assists.

Along with Cohen's 26 points, junior **James Karnik** had 12 points and 10 rebounds for his third double-double in seven games this season, and ninth of his career. Sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** added 10 points on 4-of-7 shooting, including 2-of-5 from 3-point range.

Lehigh scored the most points by any team against the Gaels this season (which includes an overtime game in which Wisconsin scored 63). The Mountain Hawks also held Saint Mary's to 68 points before the Gaels connected on nine free throws in the final minute with Lehigh fouling to extend the game.

The Mountain Hawks had a chance from the very beginning. Saint Mary's actually opened an early 12-4 lead, but Lehigh responded with a 14-4 run to take its first lead of the contest. Cohen scored nine of the points in the run, which ended with a Wilson basket to give the Mountain Hawks an 18-16 advantage with 10:06 on the first-half clock.

A Jordan Ford 3-pointer gave the Gaels the lead back with 8:14 left in the first. Saint Mary's wouldn't trail the rest of the game, but Lehigh made the perennial West Coast Conference power earn it.

A Wilson trey with 5:23 on the clock pulled the Mountain Hawks back within one at 27-26. The Gaels extended their lead back to seven, but four straight Lehigh points to end the half, capped off by a pretty give-and-go ending in a Cohen layup following a timeout, pulled Lehigh within 35-32 at the half.

Cohen scored on Lehigh's first second-half possession to pull within one, but Saint Mary's slowly extended its advantage from there. The margin reached double figures with 11:49 on the clock and 13 with 8:42 remaining, but the Mountain Hawks continued to battle.

A **Marques Wilson** layup with 4:40 remaining got Lehigh back within single digits at 62-54.

The Mountain Hawks pulled within seven twice in the final minute, but couldn't pull any closer as Saint Mary's hit nine free throws in the final 57 seconds for the 77-66 final.

NEW YORK - In a back-and-forth game that went down to the wire, Columbia used a late 7-0 run to take a 65-58 lead, which proved too much for the Lehigh men's basketball team to overcome as the Mountain Hawks dropped their third straight game (all on the road), 68-64 on Saturday. Lehigh struggled to contain Columbia's leading scorer Mike Smith, who finished with 30 points on 12-of-21 shooting. Senior **Jordan Cohen** led the Mountain Hawks with 20 points, his second straight game with 20+ points. He came ever-so-close to pulling Lehigh even in the final minute, but an offensive foul was called against Cohen to wipe out a basket.

The Lions led for the remainder of the half, extending their advantage to five, but Cohen went on a personal 5-0 run in the final minute as his 3-pointer with seven seconds remaining evened the score at 32 following 20 minutes of play.

The game of runs continued in the second half. Columbia enjoyed a strong start, retaking a five-point lead in the opening minutes. Trailing 49-44, Lehigh went on a 10-2 run to take a 54-51 lead with 9:22 remaining after four consecutive Cohen points.

A Marques Wilson basket gave the Mountain Hawks a 56-55 advantage with 7:24 remaining, but Columbia used a 10-2 run (which included a 7-0 run to break a 58-58 tie) to take its largest lead, 65-58, with 3:17 remaining.

Lehigh clawed back, scoring four straight points, and had a chance in the final minute down just three. Cohen drove hard to the hoop, but was called for an offensive foul with 35 seconds remaining to wipe out the basket.

Columbia followed by hitting enough free throws down the stretch for the victory.

LORETTO, Pa. – Senior **Jordan Cohen**, junior **James Karnik** and freshman **Reed Fenton** combined for 53 points, but it wasn't enough in the end as the Lehigh men's basketball team fell to a second-half Saint Francis (Pa.) rally, 77-69 on Wednesday evening. Cohen scored 16 of his 22 points in the first half to help the Mountain Hawks open a 42-36 halftime advantage, but Lehigh shot just 36.4 percent in the second half (and only 13.3 percent from 3-point range) while turning the ball over eight times. Wednesday wrapped up Lehigh's four-game road swing as the Mountain Hawks return home Saturday to host Yale at 7 p.m.

Cohen's 22 points marked his third straight game eclipsing 20 points, a career-high streak. He was 4-of-5 from 3-point range in the first half to help spark the offense. Meanwhile, Karnik tallied his fourth double-double of the season (in nine games), scoring 18 points on 9-of-10 shooting, and grabbing 13 rebounds to tie a career high.

Playing an hour from his hometown of Latrobe, Pa., Fenton scored 13 points on 5-of-10 shooting. Freshman **Evan Taylor** added nine points.

The Mountain Hawks scored the game's first four points behind baskets from Cohen and Karnik. Fenton finished a baseline dunk to give the Mountain Hawks a 9-4 advantage, with the lead reaching eight (13-5) after a pair of Taylor free throws with 13:24 left in the first half.

The Red Flash pulled within five, but two 3-pointers in just over a minute – from Fenton and Cohen – gave Lehigh a 26-17 lead with 7:45 on the clock.

Cohen later added two more treys in the span of 22 seconds to help the Mountain Hawks retake a nine-point, 34-25 advantage, with 4:31 left in the first.

Saint Francis pulled within four with less than 10 seconds remaining, but on the other end, Cohen drew a foul and hit 2-of-3 free throws to give Lehigh a 42-36 halftime lead.

Lehigh extended its lead to eight very early in the second half, but the Red Flash responded with an 8-0 run to pull even at 46 apiece.

Saint Francis took its first lead of the game (54-53) following a 3-pointer with 12:15 left in the second half. The Mountain Hawks kept fighting back to within one, eventually tying the score at 64 following a Cohen layup with 4:15 remaining. Then less than a minute later, Karnik finished a thunderous dunk to give the Mountain Hawks a 66-64 edge.

But on the other end, Saint Francis' Isaiah Blackman knocked down a trey to give the Red Flash the lead for good. Lehigh remained within two possessions for most of the ensuing minutes, when the Mountain Hawks were forced to foul.

BETHLEHEM, Pa. – The Lehigh men's basketball team battled back from a 16-point first-half deficit to pull as close as one, but Yale staged an 11-0 run late in the second half to turn a three-point margin into a 78-65 victory on Saturday evening in Stabler Arena. Sophomore **Jeameril Wilson** led the Mountain Hawks' offense with a season-high 16 points while junior **James Karnik** continued his strong play with 15 points on just eight field goal attempts.

Wilson shot 7-of-12 from the floor while adding a team-high six rebounds. Karnik was 6-of-8. Senior **Jordan Cohen** added 12 points, five rebounds and five assists, shooting 4-of-6 from the field. He is now just 14 points from 1,000 in his career. Freshman **Evan Taylor** chipped in with eight points.

Turnovers once again hurt the Mountain Hawks, finishing with 18 on the evening.

Lehigh actually jumped out to early leads of 6-0 and 10-2, with four of the Mountain Hawk starters on the scoreboard less than three minutes into the game.

Yale quickly answered, going on an 8-0 run to pull even. The score was tied at 10, 12 and 14 before Lehigh went into a 4:23 scoreless drought. However, the Mountain Hawks allowed just six Bulldogs' points during that stretch, behind a pair of 3-pointers.

The Bulldogs had another run later in the half, using a 13-0 rally to turn a three-point game into a 37-21 advantage with 3:03 on the clock. Lehigh did fight back, scoring 11 of the final 15 points of the stanza – including a 4-0 run in the final 30 seconds – to pull within single digits (41-32) after 20 minutes of play.

The Mountain Hawks continued to claw back in the second, using an 11-3 run to pull within 52-47 following a **Reed Fenton** 3-pointer with 13:03 on the clock.

A few minutes later, Lehigh got within a single possession on multiple occasions, beginning after a **Marques Wilson** trey made the score 56-54 with 10:41 remaining.

A Taylor field goal with 5:23 on the clock pulled Lehigh within one at 62-61. The Mountain Hawks even got the ball back with a chance to take a lead, but a Taylor 3-pointer was off the mark. Lehigh hung within striking distance over the ensuing minutes until the Bulldogs' late rally.
