#### **GAMEDAY EXPERIENCE:** AUBURN ARENA

>>> Auburn Arena is in its sixth season as home of Auburn Volleyball. The Tigers are 47-34 since moving to the Arena in 2013. The facility seats approximately 2,000 fans for volleyball and 9,121 for basketball.



#### FIRST SERVE

- >> The Auburn volleyball team kicks off the 2019 season at home, hosting Tennessee State, New Mexico State and Butler in the annual War Eagle Invitational. The two-day tournament is slated for Aug. 30-31 and will be held in Auburn Arena.
- >> The Tigers open with a 12:00 p.m. CT match against Tennessee State before matching up with New Mexico State at 7:00 p.m. CT on Friday. Saturday starts with an 11 a.m. CT contest between TSU and NMSU before the Tigers face off with Butler at 1 p.m. CT.
- Auburn has an all-time record of 648-645-4 (.500) in its 47th full season of volleyball.
- >> Head Coach Rick Hold stands at 120-117 in his ninth season on the Plains and is the second-winningest coach in Auburn volleyball history.
- >> Auburn's 2019 schedule boasts seven 2018 NCAA Tournament participants.
- >> The Tiger roster features two seniors, six juniors, five sophomores and two freshmen.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

- >> Auburn concluded the 2018 season with a 12-16 overall reacord and went 5-13 in SEC play. The Tigers finished tied for 10th in the league.
- Xey returners for Auburn is senior Shaina White, juniors Chesney McClellan and Payton White and sophomores Tatum Shipes and Bella Rosenthall.
- All-SEC Freshman Tatum Shipes collected 128 of her 147 kills during SEC play with all eight of her double-digit kill performances coming in conference play.
- >> S. White and McClellan combined for 102 blocks last season to stabilize the middle for the Tigers.
- >> Rosenthall, who led the team with 339 digs, returns at libero to anchor the back row for Auburn.
- P. White played in 102 sets for Auburn in the back row, totaling 156 digs for the Tigers with a 1.53 digs/set average.

#### UP NEXT

>> Auburn hits the road for the first time for the Miami Invitational, Sept. 6-8, in Miami. The Tigers face Florida Gulf State Friday at 4 p.m. CT and follow with matches Saturday and Sunday vs. South Florida and George Washington, respectively.

- The Tennessee State Tigers are coming off a 9-19 season in 2018, including a 7-9 mark in Ohio Valley Conference play. The squad is under the direction of third-year head coach Donika Sutton.
- >> The Tigers were picked to finish eighth overall in the OVC this season.
- Senior utility Julia Pierson was named to the preseason All-OVC after leading the Tigers with 364 kills, 13 doubledoubles, 25 service aces and 427 team points as a junior.

#### **SCOUTING BUTLER**

- >> Butler travels to Auburn for the first time after a 9-21 campaign that saw the Bulldogs go 6-12 in BIG EAST play in 2018.
- >> Sharon Clark enters her 20th season with the Bulldogs in 2019 as the all-time wins leader in Butler volleyball history.
- >> The Bulldogs are picked to finish fifth in the BIG EAST this season.
- Senior outside hitter Anna Logan returns for Butler after missing the 2018 season with an injury. The two-time First Team All-BIG EAST selection was named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST team.

#### A WIN OVER BUTLER WOULD...

>> In his ninth season at Auburn, head coach Rick Nold has a 120-117 overall record on the Plains. He became the third coach in program history to record 100 or more wins with the Tigers after Auburn swept Clemson, Sept. 9, 2017.

#### **FANTASTIC FRESHMEN**

- >> The 2019 Auburn volleyball signing class brings in two of the top prep players with a combined five state championships between them.
- >> Defensive specalist Molly Pember guided Walton High School to four-straight Georgia state titles. She was also named 2018 4AAAAAAA Second Team All-Area.
- Outside hitter Lily Thomason comes to Auburn after guiding Valor Christian to the 2018 Colorado State Championship in her senior season. She was named second team All-State following her junior campaign and a Prep Volleyball Top-10 hitter in the state of Colorado.

#### TRANSFER TRIFECTA

- Junior Jaedan Brown is in her first season on the Plains after transferring from South Florida this summer. She finished second in The American with 146 blocks for the Bulls.
- >> Lauren Dorrell is a 6-0 middle blocker that saw time on the court with Colorado in 23 matches last year. The Brentwood, Tenn. native finished with 92 kills.
- Setter Marissa Hines comes to Auburn after spending her first year at Wyoming. Hines competed in 19 matches for the Cowgirls and totaled 298 assists on the season.

#### SETTER OUTLOOK

- >> Junior Morgan Kull and sophomore Marissa Hines will be looked upon to pace the Auburn offense in 2019.
- >> Kull, who has served primarly as a backup in her first two years, looks to take on a bigger role for the Tiger offense this season.
- >> Hines joins the Tigers after helping guide Wyoming to an NIT Volleyball Championship apperance last season.

#### PLAYER TO WATCH: BELLA ROSENTHALL

>> Sophomore Bella Rosenthalll, who led the team with 339 digs last season, returns at libero to anchor the back row for the Tigers.



#### **OUTSIDE HITTER OUTLOOK**

- >> The 2019 outside hitters look to fill the void left behind from Brenna McIlroy, the seventh Tiger in program history to reach 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs.
- >> Leading the way on the outside is Tatum Shipes. A 6-4 sophomore from Buford, Ga., Shipes was named to the SEC All-Freshman team after her rookie campaign.
- >> Shipes is Auburn's leading returner in a number of offensive catagories including points, pts/s, kills and k/s.
- >> Senior Enija Bidzane and sophmore Val Green return to provide depth at the position.
- Auburn adds two players at the position from The Centennial State in 2019. Lauren Dorrell looks to make an impact joining the Tigers after spending her first three years at Colorado, while Lily Thomason comes to the Plains after a successful prep career.

#### MIDDLE BLOCKER OUTLOOK

- Auburn brings back a wealth of experience in the middle with the return of senior Shaina White and junior Chesney McClellan.
- S. White begins her final campaign after an outstanding first two season on the Plains. She finished among the SEC's best in hitting percentage (.357) over the past two seasons and returns the second most kills from last years team (102).
- >> McClellan, along with White, combined for 102 blocks to fortify the middle for the Tigers.
- » McClellan reached a career-high seven blocks on two occasions vs. EIU and at Kennesaw State last season.
- >> Junior Jaeden Brown transferred to Auburn from South Florida. The Hollywood, Fla. product will provide experience and a solid blocking front for the Auburn defense.
- >> Junior Shea McNamara brings strong blocking abilities to provide more defensive options Auburn.

#### **BACK ROW OUTLOOK**

>> The 2019 edition of the Auburn back row is led by sophomore Bella Rosenthall. Rosenthall started 26 matches at libero, while appearing in all 28 matches her freshman year.

Rick Nold is in his ninth season in 2019 as Auburn's head volleyball coach. He was named the 10th coach in program history on April 10, 2011. In his eight seasons on the Plains, Nold has put together a 120-117 overall record (.506). He enters the season with a career winning percentage of .576 in 18 years as a collegiate head coach, having a 292-215 mark.

The youthful 2018 squad finished 12-16 overall, picking up big program wins during the non-conference slate at Kansas and vs. Florida State. A pair of freshmen in Mica Allison and Tatum Shipes were recognized by the Southeastern Conference and were placed on the All-Freshman squad. In addition, Anna Stevenson earned a spot on the AVCA All-South Region team.

The 2017 season saw the Tigers go 15-12 overall, picking up big non-conference wins. Auburn opened with a sweep at Georgia Tech and topped then-No. 16 North Carolina and NC State in Puerto Rico. Boasting one of the toughest schedules in the Southeastern Conference, the squad finished 8-10 overall against the league and came in a tie for seventh.

Auburn had one of its best finishes in the SEC in 2016, going 9-9 and finishing tied for fifth overall. The league finish was the best for the program since 2010 as the squad went 15-16 overall. Jesse Earl and Alexa Filley were named All-SEC and honored by the AVCA All-South region. Earl and Filley both reached 1,000 career digs as juniors and Earl's path to that total marked the fasted by any Tiger in program history. Gwyn Jones picked up SEC All-Freshman honors, marking the second-straight season a Tiger has been recognized.

The 2015 season was an exciting one for the young Tiger team as the squad went 18-12 overall and came in sixth in the conference with an 10-8 mark. The team upped its defensive presence from the previous season and finished second overall among SEC opponents with a 15.62 digs/set average. Freshman Brenna McIlroy earned SEC All-Freshman accolades, marking the first time since 2010 that a Tiger newbie wos honored by the league. Stephanie Campbell was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year — the fourth honor in program history. Auburn's 3-2 win over then-No. 11 Florida was the team's first win over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2013 and snapped a 41-match losing streak to the Gators. Auburn finished 11-3 at home in Auburn Arena.

The Tigers finished 19-11 during the 2013 season, tying for sixth in the SEC with a 10-8 conference record. The 10 victories in SEC play were the most by the Tigers since 2010 and just the second time in the last 15 years that Auburn posted 10 wins in league action. Nold also guided the Tigers to their first-ever win over a top-10 opponent, knocking off No. 10 Nebraska, 3-1.

His second season (2012) saw a six-match improvement from his first as he took the Tigers from an 11-19 mark (5-15 SEC) in 2011 to a 17-13 record (8-12 SEC) in 2012. He led the Tigers to nine straight wins to open the season, the second-longest winning streak in program history. Nold also picked up his 200th career head coaching victory on Nov. 4 with a 3-1 win over Georgia.

Nold came to Auburn after directing Jacksonville State to unprecedented heights during his nine-year tenure, winning three regular season conference titles, three conference tournament titles and making three NCAA postseason appearances.
