FIRST SERVE

- » The Auburn volleyball gets away from the Plains for the first time in 2019, traveling to Miami for the Hurricane Invitational hosted by Miami. The three-day tournament is slated for Sept. 6-Sept. 8 at the Knight Complex.
- » The Tigers open with a 4 p.m. CT match on Friday against Florida Gulf Coast before matching up with South Florida at 10 a.m. CT on Saturday. The Tigers face off with George Washington at 10 a.m. CT on Sunday to conclude the weekend.
- » Auburn has an all-time record of 649-647-4 (.499) in its 47th full season of volleyball.
- » Head Coach Rick Nold stands at 121-119 in his ninth season on the Plains and is the second-winningest coach in Auburn volleyball history.
- » Auburn's 2018 schedule boasts seven 2017 NCAA Tournament participants.
- » The Tiger roster features two seniors, six juniors, five sophomores and two freshmen.

LAST TIME OUT

- » Auburn opened 2019 with the annual War Eagle Invitational in Auburn Arena, Aug. 30-31. The Tigers dropped the season opener, 3-2 (21-25, 25-17, 22-25, 25-13, 11-15) to Tennessee State Friday night and followed with a three-set loss (22-25, 20-25, 22-25) to New Mexico State. Auburn bounced back on Saturday defeating Butler, 3-2 (29-31, 25-22, 33-31, 14-25, 15-12).
- » Juniors Chesney McClellan and Payton White were placed on the all-tournament team.
- » P. White notched a career-high 37 digs against Butler, breaking the Auburn single match record in the category.
- » Sophomores Marissa Hines and Tatum Shipes both finished with a double-double in the match against Butler.
- » McClellan finished with a career-high 14 kills in the season opener against Tennessee State.
- » The Tigers finished with 13 aces against TSU, the most in a match since September 2016.

UP NEXT

- » Auburn stays on the road for the entire month of September traveling next to Fort Worth, Texas. The Tigers face Miami Saturday at 2 p.m. CT and follow on Sunday vs. Texas Christian.

PLAYER TO WATCH: PAYTON WHITE

- » Sophomore Payton White broke the Auburn single match record in digs, notching a career-high 37 against Butler.



SCOUTING FLORIDA GULF COAST

- » The Florida Gulf Coast Eagles are coming off a 27-7 season in 2018, including the program's first NCAA Tournament victory. The Eagles stand at 3-0 in 2019 after picking up three wins at home to start the year.
- » Matt Botsford, the reigning ASUN Coach of the Year, enters his sixth season as the FGCU volleyball head coach. In his six seasons at the helm of the Eagles, Botsford has registered 20 wins in four straight seasons and led FGCU in its first trip to the NCAA tournament.
- » The Eagles were picked to win the ASUN against this season, receiving eight of the nine first place votes.
- » Reigning ASUN player of the year Courtney VanLiew, who became FGCU's first-ever AVCA Honorable Mention All-American last year, was selected as the preseason player of the year. The junior outside hitter led all ASUN players with 482 kills, while adding 312 digs last year.

A WIN OVER FLORIDA GULF COAST WOULD...

- » Be Auburn's first road win of the season.
- » Be Auburn's second-straight win against FGSU.

AUBURN-FLORIDA GULF COAST SERIES

- » Auburn leads the all-time series, 1-0. The two teams first meet in 2014.
- » This will be the second meeting between the two teams at a neutral site.

SCOUTING SOUTH FLORIDA

- » The South Florida Bulls are 2-0 in 2019 after winning both matches of the Ball State Invitational in Muncie, Ind., last weekend.
- » Courtney Draper, who earned her 100th career win at USF last season, is in her sixth season at the helm for the Bulls.
- » After the program's first postseason appearance since 2002, the Bulls were voted to finish sixth in the American this season.
- » Senior outside hitter Jac'cara Walker was named to the preseason American Athletic All-Conference team. She finished fourth in The American with 394 kills and led USF with 15 double-doubles last season.

A WIN OVER SOUTH FLORIDA WOULD...

- » Give the Tigers back-to-back wins over the Bulls for the first time in the series dating back to 1979.

- » George Washington is 2-1 on the early season, competing in the DC Challenge last weekend to kick start 2019.
- » Sarah Bernson enters her third season with the Colonials.
- » The Colonials are picked to finish fifth in the A-10 this season.
- » Senior setter Jaimeson Lee returns for GW after dishing out 877 assists and tying for the team with 16 double-doubles.

A WIN OVER GEORGE WASHINGTON WOULD...

- » Be Auburn's fourth in five matches against the Colonials.

AUBURN-GEORGE WASHINGTON SERIES

- » Auburn leads the all-time series, 4-1. The two teams last meet in 2014.
- » The Colonials swept the Tigers, 3-0.

NOLD IN AUBURN HISTORY

- » In his ninth season at Auburn, head coach Rick Nold has a 121-119 overall record on the Plains. He became the third coach in program history to record 100 or more wins with the Tigers after Auburn swept Clemson, Sept. 9, 2017.

FANTASTIC FRESHMEN

- » The 2019 Auburn volleyball signing class brings in two of the top prep players with a combined five state championships between them.
- » Defensive specialist Molly Pember guided Walton High School to four-straight Georgia state titles. She was also named 2018 4AAAAAAA Second Team All-Area.
- » Outside hitter Lily Thomason comes to Auburn after guiding Valor Christian to the 2018 Colorado State Championship in her senior season. She was named second team All-State following her junior campaign and a Prep Volleyball Top-10 hitter in the state of Colorado.

TRANSFER TRIFECTA

- » Junior Jaedan Brown is in her first season on the Plains after transferring from South Florida this summer. She finished second in The American with 146 blocks for the Bulls.
- » Lauren Dorrell is a 6-0 middle blocker that saw time on the court with Colorado in 23 matches last year. The Brentwood, Tenn. native finished with 92 kills.
- » Setter Marissa Hines comes to Auburn after spending her first year at Wyoming. Hines competed in 19 matches for the Cowgirls and totaled 298 assists on the season.

SETTER OUTLOOK

- » Junior Morgan Kull and sophomore Marissa Hines will be looked upon to pace the Auburn offense in 2019.
- » Kull, who has served primarily as a backup in her first two years, looks to take on a bigger role for the Tiger offense this season.
- » Hines joins the Tigers after helping guide Wyoming to an NIT Volleyball Championship appearance last season.

OUTSIDE HITTER OUTLOOK

- » The 2019 outside hitters look to fill the void left behind from Brenna McLroy, the seventh Tiger in program history to reach 1,000 career kills and 1,000 career digs.
- » Leading the way on the outside is Tatum Shipes. A 6-4 sophomore from Buford, Georgia, Shipes was named to the All-SEC freshmen team after her rookie campaign.
- » Shipes is Auburn's leading returner in a number of offensive categories including, points, pts/s, kills and k/s.
- » Senior Enija Bidzane and sophomore Val Green return to provide depth at the position.
- » Auburn adds two players at the position from The Centennial State in 2019. Lauren Dorrell, looks to make an impact

PLAYER TO WATCH: ENIJA BIDZANE

- » Senior Enija Bidzane led the Auburn offensive attack with 39 kills on opening weekend. The outside hitter has a 3.00 kills/set average on the year so far.



joining the Tigers after a season at Colorado, while Lily Thomason comes to the Plains after a successful prep career.

MIDDLE BLOCKER OUTLOOK

» Auburn's brings back a wealth of experience in the middle with the return of senior Shaina White and junior Chesney McClellan.

» Senior Shaina White begins her final campaign after an outstanding first two season on the Plains. She finished among the SEC's best in hitting percentage (.357) over the past two seasons and returns the second most kills from last years team (102).

» Junior Chesney McClellan, along with White, combined for 102 blocks to fortify the middle for the Tigers.

» McClellan reached a career-high seven blocks on two occasions – vs. EIU, and at Kennesaw State last season.

» Junior Jaeden Brown transferred to Auburn from South Florida. The Hollywood, Fla. product will provide experience and a solid blocking front for the Auburn defense.

» Junior Shea McNamara brings strong blocking abilities to provide more defensive options Auburn.

BACK ROW OUTLOOK

» The 2019 edition of the Auburn back row is led by sophomore Bella Rosenthal. Rosenthal started 26 matches at libero, while appearing in all 28 matches her freshman year.

» Junior Payton White played in 102 sets in the back row totaling 156 digs for the Tigers with a 1.53 digs/set average.

» Freshmen Molly Pember joins them in Auburn's first line of defense.

TIGERS PICKED 12TH IN PRESEASON POLL

» Auburn was chosen to finish 12th in the Southeastern Conference in this season's preseason coaches' poll.

» Auburn earned 20 points from the league's 13 coaches.

» Kentucky edged Florida as the favorite to win the conference championship, securing 11 first-place votes and 143 points. Florida had two votes and 132 points. Tennessee was selected third, while Missouri and South Caroline completed the top five.

» Texas A&M, LSU, Georgia, Arkansas, Ole Miss, Alabama and Mississippi State round out the poll.

THIS, THAT, AND THE OTHER

» Junior Payton White comes from a volleyball family as well. Her oldest sister played at College of Charleston, while her other sister is a senior on Penn State's volleyball team.

» Sophomore Tatum Shipes has a wealth of athletic talent in her family's history. Her mother, Laurel, played basketball at Kentucky, while her father, Rocky, played basketball at The Master's University. Her brother, T.J., was a member of the Georgia State basketball team. Grandfather, Don Hudgens, played basketball at Wheaton College and her great grandparents, Ira and Opal, played basketball at Southern Illinois.

» Freshman Molly Pember has an older sister, Tate, who played for Auburn for three seasons.

» Senior Shaina White will wear the SEC graduate patch on her jersey this season after graduating with a degree in accounting through the Raymond J. Harbert College of Business in the spring of 2019. She is now pursuing her Master of Accountancy with the college.

» Junior Morgan Kull represented Auburn at the Final Four as she was chosen to perform "The Star-Spangled-Banner" along side one representative of each institution participating in Minneapolis.

Rick Nold is in his ninth season in 2019 as Auburn's head volleyball coach. He was named the 10th coach in program history on April 10, 2011. In his eight seasons on the Plains, Nold has put together a 121-119 overall record (.506). He enters the season with a career winning percentage of .576 in 18 years as a collegiate head coach, having a 292-215 mark.

The youthful 2018 squad finished 12-16 overall, picking up big program wins during the non-conference slate at Kansas and vs. Florida State. A pair of freshmen in Mica Allison and Tatum Shipes were recognized by the Southeastern Conference and were placed on the All-Freshman squad. In addition, Anna Stevenson earned a spot on the AVCA All-South Region team.

The 2017 season saw the Tigers go 15-12 overall, picking up big non-conference wins. Auburn opened with a sweep at Georgia Tech and topped then-No. 16 North Carolina and NC State in Puerto Rico. Boasting one of the toughest schedules in the Southeastern Conference, the squad finished 8-10 overall against the league and came in a tie for seventh.

Auburn had one of its best finishes in the SEC in 2016, going 9-9 and finishing tied for fifth overall. The league finish was the best for the program since 2010 as the squad went 15-16 overall. Jesse Earl and Alexa Filley were named All-SEC and honored by the AVCA All-South region. Earl and Filley both reached 1,000 career digs as juniors and Earl's path to that total marked the fastest by any Tiger in program history. Gwyn Jones picked up SEC All-Freshman honors, marking the second-straight season a Tiger has been recognized.

The 2015 season was an exciting one for the young Tiger team as the squad went 18-12 overall and came in sixth in the conference with an 10-8 mark. The team upped its defensive presence from the previous season and finished second overall among SEC opponents with a 15.62 digs/set average. Freshman Brenna McIlroy earned SEC All-Freshman accolades, marking the first time since 2010 that a Tiger newbie was honored by the league. Stephanie Campbell was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year – the fourth honor in program history. Auburn's 3-2 win over then-No. 11 Florida was the team's first win over a nationally-ranked opponent since 2013 and snapped a 41-match losing streak to the Gators. Auburn finished 11-3 at home in Auburn Arena.

The Tigers finished 19-11 during the 2013 season, tying for sixth in the SEC with a 10-8 conference record. The 10 victories in SEC play were the most by the Tigers since 2010 and just the second time in the last 15 years that Auburn posted 10 wins in league action. Nold also guided the Tigers to their first-ever win over a top-10 opponent, knocking off No. 10 Nebraska, 3-1.

His second season (2012) saw a six-match improvement from his first as he took the Tigers from an 11-19 mark (5-15 SEC) in 2011 to a 17-13 record (8-12 SEC) in 2012. He led the Tigers to nine straight wins to open the season, the second-longest winning streak in program history. Nold also picked up his 200th career head coaching victory on Nov. 4 with a 3-1 win over Georgia.

Nold came to Auburn after directing Jacksonville State to unprecedented heights during his nine-year tenure, winning three regular season conference titles, three conference tournament titles and making three NCAA postseason appearances.
