» Auburn rose to No. 4 in the latest AP poll. It is the highest the Tigers have been ranked since also being fourth for four consecutive weeks from Dec. 27, 1999-Jan. 17, 2000. This is the fifth season the program has been ranked in the top five in its history (1958-59, 1986-87, 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2019-20).

» With its 15-0 start, Auburn has won 27 of its last 28 games dating back to last season. The 27-1 (.964) record since Feb. 27 last season is the best in the country, ahead of Liberty (23-2, .920), Gonzaga (24-3, .889), Wichita State (24-3, .889) and Duke (23-3, .885).

» Auburn is one of the final two unbeaten teams left in college basketball (San Diego State). The last time the Tigers were the last team standing was during the 1998-99 season in which Auburn won its first 17 games before falling to No. 7 Kentucky on Jan. 20.

» Auburn is in search of winning at Alabama for just the 11th time in program history. The Tigers last won back-to-back games in Tuscaloosa in 1970-71.

» Following a win vs. Vanderbilt the 2020 senior class picked up win No. 88, which broke the program record for wins by a class previously held by the 2001 seniors (87).

» The 2019-20 Tigers have a chance to be the best defensive team under Coach Pearl at Auburn. The Tigers are allowing only 66.3 points per game. The previous best defensive team under Pearl on The Plains was the 2018-19 team that allowed 68.8 points per game.

» Auburn is averaging 82.1 points per game on offense and allow just 66.3 points per contest on defense. The Tigers have averaged 75 or more points and given up under 70 points just three times in program history: 1958-59, 1964-65, 1998-99.

- Has advanced to postseason play in 20 of 24 years as a head coach

- Set single-season wins records at four different schools (29 at Southern Indiana in 1995; 26 at Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2005; 31 at Tennessee in 2008; 30 at Auburn in 2019)

- Pearl has achieved a top-5 national ranking at Southern Indiana, Tennessee and Auburn. He has been in the top five in 10 seasons (1994-2001 at Southern Indiana, 2007-08 at Tennessee, 2019-20 at Auburn)

- Bruce Pearl's teams have led their conference in scoring 17 of the 24 years that he has been a head coach. His squads were the SEC's scoring champion in four of his six seasons at Tennessee, averaging 77.4 ppg while allowing 70.5 ppg

- One of 12 coaches to lead three different DI programs to the Sweet 16, joining Rick Barnes, Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Lon Kruger, Frank McGuire, Ralph Miller, Rick Pitino, Bill Self, Tubby Smith, Eddie Sutton and Bruce Weber. Including his stint at DII Southern Indiana, Pearl is one of only three coaches to take four programs (with three at the DI level) to the Sweet 16, joining Lon Kruger and Eddie Sutton

- With the win over Kentucky that sent Auburn to its first Final Four in program history, Pearl notched his 100th win as head coach of the Tigers. He is the first coach in Auburn history to have 100 wins in his first five seasons

- Bruce Pearl is the 11th coach in SEC history to win four conference crowns (overall or division) in a 10-year span. He is on the same list as Adolph Rupp (UK), Babe McCarthy (MSU), Billy Donovan (UF), Dale Brown (LSU), Joe Hall (UK), John Calipari (UK), Nolan Richardson (ARK), Rick Pitino (UK), Rick Stansbury (MSU) and Tubby Smith (UK)

- Auburn sold out of season tickets for the fifth straight time in 2018-19, all under Pearl, to continue the school record streak. Prior to Pearl, the only other time the Tigers sold out of season tickets came was 1999-2000

- Auburn welcomed 138,650 fans inside Auburn Arena for the 2018-19 season. The total is the highest ever recorded in Auburn Arena history

- In 24 full years as a head coach, Bruce Pearl's teams have finished either first or second in conference play 16 times

- At the Division I level, Pearl's teams have topped the 100-point mark 20 times, including a high of 124 in 2009 as well as 121 in the 2007 NCAA Tournament. In his second year as a coach at Southern Indiana the team averaged 101.7 ppg

- In the past three seasons, Auburn has the best non-conference record in the SEC during the regular season at 34-5 (.872), while scheduling regular NCAA Tournament teams in Arizona, Dayton, Duke, Middle Tennessee, Murray State, Oklahoma, Texas Tech, UConn and Xavier

- His teams have been just as successful off the court as Auburn has had 23 graduates in five years – the most in the SEC. In 2018, Auburn received an Academic Progress Rate Public Recognition Award marking the first time the Tigers have been honored since the award began tracking data in 2004. The NCAA annually honors teams earning multiyear Academic Progress Rates in the top 10 percent of all squads in each sport

- Auburn recently secured its third perfect APR score of 1,000 in mid-May, something that has never been accomplished in program history

- In the past four years, Auburn men's basketball has averaged an APR of 995 (out of 1,000). In the previous four seasons before Pearl and his staff arrived, Auburn's APR average score was 940

- Pearl started AURLIVE at Auburn in 2015-16 to benefit cancer patients in the fight to beat cancer. AURLIVE raises the awareness of cancer prevention and detection while t-shirt sales and donations raise money to benefit cancer patients. He initiated the AURLIVE program in 2009 at Tennessee in recognition of former Vol Chris Lofton, who beat testicular cancer through early diagnosis and treatment and went on to play the entire 2007-08 season while recovering from his battle with the disease

- On Dec. 19, 2019, Children's Harbor in Birmingham, Ala. dedicated their on-site basketball court in honor of the charitable work done by Coach Pearl and the Pearl family over the last six years.

- Bruce Pearl has raised over \$1 million in only five golf tournaments at Auburn. Pearl and his wife, Brandy, have remarkably raised \$770,000 in the last three years benefitting Children's Harbor in Birmingham through the Bruce Pearl For the Children Golf Classic. The mission of Children's Harbor is to help children with serious illness and their families

- The Bruce Pearl Family Foundation in conjunction with L5 Foundation, an organization dedicated to addressing the essential and basic needs of cancer patients, donated \$20,000 to five charities in a ceremony in Knoxville in August 2015

- The Pearl family announced on Feb. 27, 2007, a \$100,000 donation to endow a scholarship in the name of former Tennessee player Dane Bradshaw. The Dane Bradshaw Athletic Scholarship Endowment is awarded to the male or female student-athlete at UT who best epitomizes the characteristics of the 2006-07 senior captain

**AUBURN VS. ALABAMA SERIES**

» Auburn and Alabama square off for the 161st Wednesday night. The Crimson Tide hold a 96-64 advantage in the all-time series, but the Tigers have won five of the last seven duels.

» Auburn is 10-49 in Tuscaloosa against Alabama in series history. However, the Tigers have won two of the last three battles, including last season's come-from-behind 66-60 victory. The last time Auburn won consecutive games at Alabama was when the Tigers reeled off three straight wins from 1969-71.

» Head coach Bruce Pearl is 11-8 in his career against Alabama, including 6-5 while at Auburn.

**ON THE RISE**

» Auburn earned its first top-5 ranking since Jan. 17, 2000 when it appeared at No. 5 in the AP poll on Jan. 6. The Tigers most recently moved up to No. 4 in the Jan. 13 poll.

» It is just the fifth season the program has been ranked in the top five in its history (1958-59, 1986-87, 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2019-20).

» The last time the Tigers were ranked as high as No. 4 was when they were in that spot four consecutive weeks from Dec. 27, 1999-Jan. 17, 2000. The highest ranking achieved by Auburn is No. 2 on Nov. 22, 1999.

» Coach Pearl is no stranger to being ranked inside the top five. His teams have achieved the benchmark in 10 of his 25 seasons as a head coach. Pearl and Southern Indiana were ranked in the top five every season from 1994-2001 reaching as high as No. 1 in 1995 and between 1997-99. Pearl's 2007 Tennessee team also reached No. 1.

**A CLASS ABOVE THE REST**

» The 2019-20 senior class made history with a win vs. Vanderbilt. The class amassed its 88th win, setting a program record for most victories in a 4-year period at Auburn all-time.

» In the two previous seasons that Auburn has started 15-0, the Tigers have combined for a final record of 48-7, including 26-4 in SEC play. Auburn also won the SEC regular season title in those seasons. The 1998-99 team had the previous single-season wins record (29) before the 2018-19 team that advanced to the Final Four won 30 games.

» Including this season, head coach Bruce Pearl has recorded two 15-0 starts in his career, but the 2019-20 season is the first of his tenure as a Division I head coach. He accomplished the feat in 2000-01 (16-0) while at Southern Indiana.

» Auburn is one of only two remaining teams that are undefeated, joining San Diego State. Auburn was the last remaining unbeaten during the 1998-99 season. The Tigers started 17-0 before falling to No. 7 Kentucky on Jan. 20.

**RACKING UP THE WINS**

» Auburn is currently on what is tied for the third-longest winning streak in program history. The Tigers have produced win streaks of at least 10 games 10 times, including 2019-20. Below are the largest win streaks in program history.

**PLAYER TO WATCH: J'VON MCCORMICK**

In his first road SEC start, J'Von McCormick rose the occasion. The senior floor general poured in a career-high 28 points, including 20 in the second half, in a win at Mississippi State. McCormick leads the Tigers in scoring during SEC play at 15.7 points per game, while also contributing 3.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds per tilt.

» Auburn, which won 14 straight during the 2017-18 season, 12 straight leading into last season's Final Four and currently has won 13 straight games, has won at least 12 straight games in three straight seasons for the first time in program history. There have only been two other times in school history where Auburn has won at least 10 straight games in consecutive seasons.

» The Tigers won the last 11 games of the 1957-58 season and the first 19 games of the 1958-59 season and they won the first 17 games in 1998-99 and won 14 straight during the 1999-2000 season. The 30-game winning streak from 1958-1959 is still the longest in program history.

» Auburn is one of just three programs in the country to boast three separate 12-game winning streaks over the last three seasons, along with Michigan State and Virginia.

**BEST IN THE COUNTRY SINCE FEB. 27, 2019**

» Auburn touts the best record in the nation since Feb. 27, 2019. Since losing at Kentucky, the Tigers are 27-1, which includes runs to the SEC Tournament championship and the Final Four. In that timeframe, Auburn has defeated #3 North Carolina, #5 Tennessee, #7 Kentucky, #8 Tennessee and #17 Kansas. Below are the records of teams from Feb. 27, 2019 until now.

**GETTING NETTY**

» Auburn appeared at No. 7 in the NCAA's first release of the NET this season. It previously tied for the highest rating achieved by the Tigers, matching the NET on Dec. 8, 2018. Auburn has since achieved its highest NET ranking at No. 5 on Dec. 30. The Tigers currently stand at No. 6.

» Auburn has appeared in the top 25 of the NET every day since Jan. 29 of last season. The Tigers are the only team in the SEC to be inside the top 25 in every NET ranking since Jan. 29, including this season.

» The Tigers ended the season last year at No. 13 following their run to the Final Four.

**TOP OF THE PACK**

» Auburn has fared well the past three-plus seasons in the non-conference slate. The Tigers lead the SEC in both wins and winning percentage in non-league regular-season games over the last three-plus seasons. Auburn is the only SEC team that has won at least 10 regular-season non-conference games in each of the last four seasons. **MAKE ROOM IN THE TROPHY CASE**

» Since the 2017-18 season, Auburn has won four trophies: 2018 SEC regular season title, 2019 SEC Tournament crown, 2019 NCAA Midwest Regional championship and the 2019 Legends Classic title.

» The Tigers lead the SEC in trophies in the last two-plus seasons. As a whole, the league has amassed 11 trophies through league championships, conference tournament championships, NCAA regional championships and in-season tournament championships. Auburn has four and Kentucky has three, while Florida, LSU, Tennessee and Texas A&M have all won one.

**THE CHARITY STRIPE**

» Despite only shooting 65.7 percent from the free-throw line this season, Auburn has made 253 free throws, just six fewer than its opponents have attempted (259).

» The Tigers have made more free throws than their opponents have attempted in seven games this season and made more free throws than their opponents in 14 of 15 games.

**EVERYBODY EATS**

» In nine of Auburn's 15 games, at least four players have scored in double figures. In total, seven different players have reached the 10-point plateau so far this season.

» During the 2018-19 season, the Tigers had four players score in double figures 19 times.

» Auburn is the only team in the SEC to have all five of its starters average double figures in league games this season: J'Von McCormick (15.7), Isaac Okoro (14.7), Samir Doughty (12.7), Austin Wiley (10.3) and Danjel Purifoy (10.0).

**ICE OKORO**

» After hitting the game-winning shot at South Alabama with 2.9 seconds left, Isaac Okoro earned the nickname "Ice."

» Okoro ranks second on the team in scoring (13.2) and field goal percentage (.565) and third in blocks (15) and steals (13).

» In that same game at South Alabama, he became the only Auburn player in the last 15 years with a stat line of 15 points, six rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks in a game.

» The Powder Springs, Ga. native scored in figures in the first six games of his career, becoming just the second freshman since 1990 to accomplish the feat and the first since Mustapha Heron in 2016. The previous record holder was All-American Wesley Person, who did it in his first 14 games. Heron holds the overall mark at 25 straight games to begin his career.

» All-American and NBA All-Star Mike Mitchell scored in double figures 24 times as a freshman in 25 games in 1974-75. All-SEC Eddie Johnson scored in double figures in 24 of 26 games as a freshmen in 1973-74.

» Okoro was named SEC Freshman of the Week after Nov. 18 as well as Dec. 9. He is the fourth freshman in program history to earn the weekly recognition twice in a season, joining Jared Harper (2016-17), Aaron Swinson (1991-92) and Wesley Person (1990-91).

» He is one of just four players in the country to have their high school jersey retired, joining Joe Quintana (LMU), Reggie Perry (Mississippi State) and Landers Nolley II (Virginia Tech).

**WE'VE GOT J'VON**

» While replacing Jared Harper's name in the popular song "We've Got Jared" to "We've Got J'Von" is easy, the replacement of Jared on the court was going to be a challenge heading into the 2019-20 season.

» McCormick has stepped in and already made a huge impact. The senior is leads the SEC with a 2.47 assist-to-turnover ratio and is third in the league with 5.1 assists per game, highlighted by a single-game program record of 16 vs. CSUN.

» The previous record of 15 was held by Eddie Johnson vs. LSU on Jan. 3, 1976. Former floor general Jared Harper was next in line with 14 assists vs. Vanderbilt on Feb. 3, 2018.

» McCormick's 16 assists are tied for the ninth-most in SEC single-game history and are the most by any player in the league since Phil Pressley (Missouri) had 19 dimes in 2013.

**GAMEDAY EXPERIENCE: AUBURN ARENA**

Built at a cost of \$86 million, Auburn Arena seats 9,121 fans for basketball games. Auburn Arena replaced the old Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum as the home of Tiger basketball for the 2010-11 season. The furthest seat in Auburn Arena is just 43 feet away from the court. Two-thirds of the seats are less than 27 feet in elevation from courtside offering a home environment that is unrivaled.





» The New Orleans, La. native was recently named the SEC Player of the Week on Jan. 6 after scoring 28 points in a win at Mississippi State. It was the most points by an Auburn player in a road SEC win since since KT Harrell dropped 28 at LSU Feb. 5, 2015.

» McCormick is averaging a team-high 15.7 points along with 3.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game in SEC play.

**LEAVE NO DOUGHT(Y)**

» After being a secondary scoring option last season, Samir Doughty has asserted himself as the top option in 2019-20. He's averaging a team-best 15.7 points per game on 44 percent shooting from the floor. Last season, Doughty had an average of 7.3 points per game.

» In Auburn's win at South Alabama, Doughty scored 10 points and tied a career-high with 10 rebounds. It was his second career double-double and first as a member of the Auburn Tigers. The Philadelphia, Pa. native had 10 points and 10 assists against Saint Joe's while suiting up for VCU on Feb. 14, 2017. Doughty's 10 rebounds matched his output vs. Dayton on Dec. 8, 2018.

» Doughty followed up that performance with a career-high 33 points on 10-of-15 from the floor, including 6-of-8 from deep, in the Tigers' 116-70 triumph over CSUN. He also chimed in with eight boards and three assists.

» In Auburn's win vs. Colgate, Doughty had a team-best 20 points on 7-of-13 shooting. In that game, Doughty produced a crossover, step-back 3-pointer that sent his defender flying and earned him the No. 1 spot on the Sportscenter Top 10 for Nov. 18.

» The senior was named to the Legends Classic All-Tournament Team after scoring 19 points against New Mexico and 22 vs. Richmond, both team-highs.

» Doughty has five 20-point games in the first 12 games this season after the senior entered the season with just two 20-point efforts in 75 career games.

**THE BIG MAN IS HUNGRY**

» Austin Wiley is as healthy as he's ever been and it's showing. The senior has scored in double figures in 11 of 15 games and has double-digit rebounds seven times so far this season. Wiley has six double-doubles this season, including three in the last five games, after entering the season with just two in his career.

» Where Wiley has shown the most progress is at the charity stripe. Coming into the season as a 52.5 percent free throw shooter, the senior is 61-of-88 from the charity stripe (69.3 percent). Wiley has made 27 of his last 34 free throws (79.4 percent).

» He was named the SEC Player of the Week on Dec. 2 - the first in his career - after averaging 16 points and 10.5 rebounds per game en route to being named the MVP at the Legends Classic. He became the fourth center in program history to earn the weekly award, joining Mamadou N'diaye (1999), Aaron Swinson (1994) and Jeff Moore (1987).

**AUBURN ARENA SELLOUTS**

» Auburn posted its first sellout of the season vs. NC State and then did it again the last four home games to bring its total to 33 in Auburn Arena history. It is the first time in the building's history that it has been sold out for five straight games.

» Of the 33 sellouts, 28 have come in the six seasons under head coach Bruce Pearl. Fourteen of the last 19 SEC games at Auburn Arena have been sold out.

**RETURN TO SENDER**

» After setting a program record with 190 blocks last season, the Tigers have had four of the program's top-11 single-season block totals during Bruce Pearl's five seasons on the Plains.

» A big key to that has been the brick wall of Anfernee McLemore, who is inside the top five in program history in career blocks.

**THE GREATEST SEASON EVER**

» The Tigers reached the Final Four for the first time in program history. Auburn is the first program from the state of Alabama to reach the Final Four.

» Auburn became the only team to defeat Kansas, Kentucky and North Carolina - the three winningest programs in NCAA history - in consecutive games in NCAA Tournament history.

» The Tigers won four games in four days to capture their second SEC Tournament title (1985) all-time.

» Auburn set a program record with 30 wins in the 2018-19 season.

» Auburn broke the SEC record with 454 3-pointers as a team. The record was held previously by the 1995 Arkansas team with 361. The Tigers finished only 10 3-pointers away from matching the NCAA record of 464 currently held by the 2018 Villanova squad.

» The Tigers won four straight games over AP Top-10 teams for the first time in program history following wins against No. 5 and No. 8 Tennessee, No. 3 North Carolina and No. 7 Kentucky. Auburn won five straight over top-25 opponents for the first time ever during its historic March run, which including triumphs over No. 5 and No. 8 Tennessee, No. 17 Kansas, No. 3 North Carolina and No. 7 Kentucky.

» The Tigers made their 10th NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and first in back-to-back seasons since 1999-2000. Auburn is 16-10 all-time in NCAA Tournament play.

**PEARL WINS HIS 100TH GAME AT AUBURN**

» Auburn's win over Kentucky in the Elite Eight was Bruce Pearl's 100th win in his 171st game as Auburn's head coach. Pearl is the first head coach in Auburn history to win 100 games in his first five seasons. This includes a 5-3 mark in the NCAA Tournament as Pearl matches Cliff Ellis (5-3) for the second-most NCAA Tournament wins by a head coach in Auburn history. Pearl and Ellis only trail Sonny Smith, who led the Tigers to a 7-5 record in five straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 1984-88.

» With a win at Vanderbilt on Feb. 16, Coach Pearl picked up his 100th SEC win. Pearl became the 23rd coach in conference history to amass 100 victories and just the fifth to accomplish the feat while coaching two schools.

» The other coaches to have 100 SEC wins while leading two programs include C.M. Newton (195, Alabama and Vanderbilt), Tubby Smith (139, Georgia and Kentucky), Don DeVoe (110, Tennessee and Florida) and John Mauer (103, Tennessee and Florida).

» Coach Pearl is one of just two active coaches to tally 100 conference wins in the league, joining Kentucky head coach John Calipari.

**LET IT FLY**

» As Coach Pearl has said, "As long as the 3 is worth more than the 2, we'll continue to take them." Below are all the games Auburn has hit at least 15 3-pointers as a team.

**OKORO ON DRAFT BOARDS**

» In the latest 2020 NBA Mock Draft on ESPN.com, freshman Isaac Okoro was projected to be picked 10th.

» "He is one of the most gifted athletes in this class. He has a shredded, 225-pound frame that makes it impossible to dislodge him on straight line drives. He also has outstanding feet getting over the top of screens or mirroring opponents in one-on-one situations. His 6-foot-10 wingspan should allow him to see time guarding power forwards in smaller lineups, but he's at his best right now smothering point guards. Seven games into the season, there's little doubt that Okoro has established himself as one of the best defenders in college basketball." - Jonathan Givony

» The Athletic's Sam Vecenie tabs Okoro to go 14th overall.

» "To call him defense first is real. Okoro might be the best defensive wing in the country right now, and he's only 18 years old. He's an absolute monster athletically, and he flies around and makes plays while also consistently staying close enough guarding position to handle his man. Okoro is an exceptional finisher due to that leaping ability, and his feel for the game is strong. He makes plays for his teammates, and can pass it a bit." - Sam Vecenie

**EARLY BRACKETOLOGY**

» Auburn is currently projected as a No. 1 seed in the South Regional by Sporting News' Mike DeCourcy. The Tigers are a No. 2 seed in the Midwest Regional and No. 5 seed overall by ESPN.com's Joe Lunardi.

**HIGH-QUALITY OPPONENTS**

» Auburn has played seven opponents picked to finish in the top three of its league. The Tigers were the only team in the SEC to play seven top-3 projected finishers in their first eight games of the season.

» Auburn played Georgia Southern (third), Davidson (second), South Alabama (first), CSUN (third), Colgate (first) New Mexico (third) and Furman (third).

» The Tigers tout the 13th-best strength of schedule according to the NET.

**THE SCHEDULE**

» Auburn has put together another top-25 schedule to get the Tigers ready for the second half of the season. Auburn has won more games than any team in the SEC ranked in the KenPom top 100, including away from home.

**TIGERS PERFECT VS. NON-CON AT HOME**

» Auburn has posted a 28-0 home record against non-conference opponents over the last three-plus seasons, including an 8-0 mark last season, 7-0 in 2017-18 and 6-0 in 2016-17.

» During Bruce Pearl's five years as Auburn's head coach, the Tigers have posted a 39-3 (.929) mark against non-conference opponents at Auburn Arena.

**WILEY PICKED PRESEASON ALL-SEC**

» Austin Wiley was chosen Preseason Second Team All-SEC by the league's coaches. He was one of 20 players chosen to the annual list.

» In 29 games last season, Wiley averaged 6.9 points and 4.0 rebounds per game to go along with 37 blocks. The senior shot a team-best 57 percent from the floor and scored in double figures eight times.

**WHAT'S RETURNING?**

» Auburn returns just two starters from last season's Final Four and SEC Tournament championship winning team in Samir Dougherty and Anfernee McLemore.

» The Tigers return just 32 percent of their 3,188 points from a season ago. Auburn lost five of its top eight scorers, including its top three from last year's team.

**ROSTER NUGGETS**

» Auburn boasts a unique roster heading into the 2019-20 season. The Tigers have seven seniors, zero juniors, five sophomores and eight freshmen.

» Auburn's eight newcomers is tied with Florida for second-most in the SEC behind Georgia's 10. It is the second-most newcomers Bruce Pearl has had at Auburn, trailing only 10 in 2016-17.

» Auburn has 10 players who are 6-foot-6 or taller, which is the most Coach Pearl has had at Auburn and tied for the most he's ever had (10 in 2010-11 at Tennessee).

» Auburn is one of just two programs to have two sets of father-son combinations on its roster: Head coach Bruce Pearl and assistant coach Steven Pearl, as well as assistant coach Wes Flanigan and freshman Allen Flanigan. Utah's combinations include head coach Larry Krystkowiak and freshman Luc Krystkowiak, as well as director of operations Chris Jones and freshman Rylan Jones.

**AS GOOD AS IT HAS EVER BEEN**

» Auburn finished the 2018-19 season 30-10 after making the first Final Four appearance in program history, breaking the 1998-99 Tigers' program record of 29 victories. Auburn has compiled a 56-18 (.757) record over the last two seasons, including a 24-12 (.667) mark in the SEC. The Tigers went 26-8 and claimed the third regular-season SEC championship (1960, 1999 and 2018) in program history with a 13-5 conference record last season before advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

» This is the third time in program history that the Tigers have won 20-plus games in at least two straight seasons. It is the first time Auburn has strung together back-to-back seasons with 25-plus wins and the Tigers' set a new program record with its 30th win of the season in the Elite Eight against Kentucky. Auburn, Kentucky and Tennessee are the only three SEC teams that have won at least 26 games in each of the last two seasons. Auburn won 18 games two years ago and currently has won 74 games in the last three seasons, which is a program record for wins in a three-year stretch. The Tigers won 71 games from the 1998-99 season to the 2000-01 season.

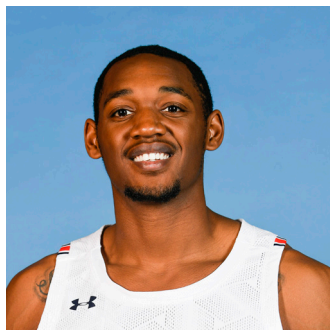
