## Auburn Women's Basketball Ouick Hitters

- This is the 59 th meeting between Auburn and Mississippi State in women's basketball
- Auburn leads the series $35-23$ but MSU has won the last seven meetings
- Auburn owns a 20-7 edge over MSU in games played in Auburn
- Mississippi State won $78-73$ in the teams' earlier meeting Jan. 30 in Starkville
- Auburn is No. 105 in the latest NCAA RPI (as of $2 / 18$ ) and has the third-highest RPI of any team with a losing record
- Auburn's strength of schedule ranks 11th nationally
- The Tigers picked up their third SEC win and third straight home win with a $65-60$ win over LSU on Feb. 16
- Auburn has shot $50 \%$ on 3-pointers in two straight games (7-14 at South Carolina; 8-16 vs. LSU)
- Daisa Alexander had a career-high 10 assists vs. LSU, the first double-digit assist SEC game for an Auburn player since Janiah McKay had 13 vs. Ole Miss in 2017
- Auburn picked up its second SEC win of the season on Feb. 2, defeating Vanderbilt 70-62 at home to avenge a

22-point loss in Nashville earlier in the season

- Sophomore Robyn Benton scored a career-high 17 points and had a career-high 6 rebounds in the win over Ole Miss
- Benton had a career-high 6 steals at Mississippi State then matched that against Vandy; both mark the top steals total by an Auburn player this year
- Auburn's 55 rebounds vs. Ole Miss (1/23) were its most in a game since pulling down 57 in at Marquette in an overtime loss in 2015; it was the most in a regulation game since grabbing 61 vs. Stephen F. Austin (12/17/07)
- The Tigers' 55 rebounds were also their most in an SEC game since at least 2000
- Unique Thompson has 19 double-doubles in 23 games this year, which leads NCAA Division I ; she has 39 career dou-
ble-doubles, which ranks 2nd in Auburn history and first among active SEC players
- Thompson's next double-double will tie the Auburn career record (40, DeWanna Bonner)
- Thompson scored her 1,000 th career point at Kentucky ( $1 / 27$ ), becoming the 35 th player in Auburn history to reach
that milestone
- Thompson's 826 career rebounds rank 2nd among active SEC players and 8th in Auburn history
- Thompson's 31-point, 15-rebound effort at TCU (12/7) was Auburn's first 30-15 game since Dec. 19, 2008, when DeWanna Bonner had 30 points and 16 rebounds vs. George Washington
- Senior Daisa Alexander scored her 1,000 th career point in Auburn's win over Jacksonville State (12/28); she was the 34th Tiger to reach that milestone
- Alexander missed the Florida and Alabama games with an ankle injury suffered vs. Arkansas; she returned with 17 points at Georgia, a career-high 10 rebounds vs. Ole Miss, and a season-high 7 assists vs. Kentucky
- Alexander's 207 career steals rank second among active SEC players; her 1,110 points are 7 th among active players
- The Tigers have employed eight different starting lineups this year; eight of 11 active players have drawn starts
- Freshman Lauren Hansen hit 73 -pointers vs. Drake, one shy of the Auburn single-game record and the most by an Auburn player since Brandy Montgomery made 73-pointers at Florida on Jan. 1, 2017

" Auburn is 9-14 overall, 3-9 in SEC play, and coming off a 65-60 win over LSU Sunday at home. " Mississippi State is 22-4 overall, 10-2 in SEC play. The Bulldogs fell at Kentucky 73-62 Sunday.

## LAST TIME OUT

" Unique Thompson scored a game-high 23 points and Daisa Alexander had a career-high 10 assists as the Auburn women's basketball team never trailed in earning its third straight home win, a 65-60 victory over LSU Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.
" Auburn led by as many as 15 points late in the fourth quarter before a flurry of turnovers allowed LSU to cut the lead to as few as four. But Auburn was able to get a pair of late stops and make free throws late to overcome the furious LSU rally.
" Thompson's 23 points led all scorers; she also finished with six rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block. Hansen scored 16 points, hitting 4-of-6 3-point attempts on the day. And Benton added 11 points along with a game-high four steals.
" Alexander's 10 assists were the most for an Auburn player in an SEC game since Janiah McKay had 13 against Ole Miss during the 2017 season. Alexander also had seven points and six rebounds.

## LAST MEETING: Jan. 30, 2020 (at Starkville) \#9 Mississippi State 78, Auburn 73

" One of the best all-around efforts of the season from the Auburn women's basketball team came up just short as the Tigers dropped a 78-73 decision at No. 9 Mississippi State.
» The Tigers had their best shooting night and scoring output in SEC play so far and led by as many as nine points early in the second half, but a string of Auburn turnovers late in the third quarter allowed the Bulldogs to pull ahead and stay there. " For the third time this season, Auburn had two players top the 20-point mark. Unique Thompson led the way with a 21-point, 11-rebound effort, picking up her 18th double-double of the season and 38th of her career, moving her into a tie for second on the all-time Auburn list.
" Daisa Alexander added 20 points, her fifth effort of 20 or more points this year, and matched her career-high with four 3-pointers on the night. Robyn Benton added 14 points to give Auburn three
players in double-figures, and freshman Sania Wells, a Mississippi native, added a career-high eight points in a return to her home state.

## SCOUTING MSU

" Mississippi State is 22-4 overall, 10-2 in SEC play, and ranked No. 9 in both the AP and Coaches' polls.
" The Bulldogs have the third-best scoring offense in the SEC, averaging 79.3 points per game, while giving up just 58.5. They are the league's second-best shooting team at $46.8 \%$.
") Rickea Jackson, who scored 22 points in the first meeting with Auburn, is MSU's leader with 14.3 points/game. Jessika Carter ( 13.5 ppg ) and Jordan Danberry ( 12.3 ppg ) give the Bulldogs three players in double-figures. Carter is the team's leading rebounder with 8.9/game.

## SCOUTING AUBURN

" The Tigers are among the most inexperienced teams in the country with just two upperclassmen on their 13-player roster. With four freshmen and seven sophomores, Auburn is one of just eight teams nationwide with three or fewer upperclassmen on its roster.
" Auburn averages 66.3 points per game but gives up 71.0; the Tigers lead the SEC with 10.7 steals per game, including 11.2/game in conference play.
" Junior forward Unique Thompson has 19 double-doubles through 23 games, averaging 16.7 points and 11.7 rebounds; she is the leading rebounder and fourth-leading scorer in the Southeastern Conference. She has 39 career double-doubles, which ranks 2nd in Auburn history, first among active SEC players, and is one shy of tying the Auburn career record of 40 (DeWanna Bonner). Thompson scored her 1,000th career point at Kentucky (1/27).
" Senior guard Daisa Alexander is the Tigers' second-leading scorer, averaging 12.9 points/ game. She scored her 1,000th career point against Jacksonville State on Dec. 28, becoming the 34th Tiger to reach that milestone. Alexander also ranks fifth in the SEC in steals (2.1/game). Alexander missed two games with an ankle injury, but returned to the lineup with 17 points at Georgia (1/19) and a career-high 10 rebounds vs. Ole Miss (1/23).
" Sophomore Robyn Benton made her season debut vs. Bethune-Cookman on Dec. 15, scoring 10 points along with two blocks. She missed the season's first nine games with injury. Benton made her first career start at Georgia (1/19), scoring 12 points to go along with 5 rebounds and 3 steals. She added a career-high 17 points and 6 rebounds in the Tigers' win over Ole Miss $(1 / 23)$, and she had 6 steals in each of two games vs. MSU and Vandy. Benton is averaging 2.9 steals, which would lead the SEC if she met playing minimums. In SEC play, she leads the league with 3.3 steals/game.
") Freshman Lauren Hansen earned her first career start at UAB on Nov. 21 in her second collegiate game. Hansen followed that up with an 18-point, 4 -steal performance in a win over St. Joseph's, then a 24-point, 4-assist day against Drake where she made seven 3-pointers. She had her best game in SEC play with 18 points against Vanderbilt (2/2).
" Sophomore Erin Howard scored a career-high 15 points at Alabama (2/9); she has started 11

" Thompson is the national leader with 19 double-doubles this year and had the longest streak of the season nationally with 12 in her first 12 games.
" From the final game of last season through the Arkansas game on Jan. 6, Thompson had double-doubles in 13 consecutive games, which is the second-longest streak in Auburn history (Lauretta Freeman, 18, 1992-93).

" Through games of Feb. 17, Unique Thompson is 2nd in the NCAA in offensive rebounds per game (5.0) and is 7th overall in rebounding (11.7). She leads the SEC in both categories. Thompson is also 18th nationally and 4th in the SEC in field goal percentage (57.8\%).
" Thompson's 31-point, 16-rebound game at TCU (12/7) was her first 30-point effort and the first for Auburn since Katie Frerking scored 32 at Texas A\&M in 2017. It was the first 30/15 game by an Auburn player since DeWanna Bonner vs. George Washington in 2008.

AUBURN-- Junior Unique Thompson and senior Daisa Alexander combined for 47 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team held off a late rally to earn an 84-82 win over Wofford Wednesday night to open the 2019-20 season.

The Tigers (1-0) led by as many as 17 points midway through the third quarter but saw the Terriers ( $0-1$ ) storm back to take the lead just nine minutes later. But strong rebounding and free-throw shooting down the stretch allowed Auburn to withstand a second-half 3-point barrage from Wofford.

Thompson picked up where she left off with her 21st career double-double, scoring 25 points and pulling down 11 rebounds. Alexander finished with 22 points and was $9-$ of-12 at the free-throw line, including a $7-0 f-8$ mark in the fourth quarter.

Sophomore Brooke Moore scored 15 points in her first career start, and freshman Annie Hughes finished with 10 points, a team-high four assists and two steals. Sophomore Kiyae' White pulled down a career-high nine rebounds as she started for the first time.

Three freshmen made their Auburn debuts. Hughes started and played just under 30 minutes, and Maliya Perry and Morgan Robinson-Nwagwu saw 11 minutes each off the bench.

Auburn shot 46.9 percent for the game (30-of-64) and was 20-of-28 at the free-throw line. The Tigers out-rebounded the Terriers $43-32$, including 17 offensive rebounds that led to 22 second-chance points. Auburn also controlled the paint, outscoring Wofford inside 38-18. The Terriers, shot 48.1 percent from 3-point range, hitting 13-of-27 attempts from long range, including 9-of16 in the second half.

After the teams finished the first 10 minutes tied 11-11, Auburn outscored Wofford in the second quarter 24-13 to take a 35-24 lead at the break. An 11-4 run over the first 5:13 of the third quarter pushed the Tigers' advantage to as many as 17 at 51-34. Auburn saw its lead shrink a bit by the end of the quarter but still took a 58-48 lead to the final 10 minutes.


AUBURN-- Auburn had four players in double figures, but a fourth-quarter surge from Old Dominion led the Monarchs to an 89-77 win over the Tigers in women's basketball action at Auburn Arena Thursday night.

The Tigers (1-1) trailed by just two points at the end of the third quarter, but Old Dominion (2-0) could scarcely miss in the final 10 minutes, shooting 90 percent ( 9 -of10) in the fourth period and 5-of-5 on 3-pointers to break open what had been a tight game.

Senior Daisa Alexander finished with 17 points and four steals to lead the Tigers. Junior Unique Thompson picked up her second double-double in as many games with a 13-point, 10-rebound performance that saw her go 5-of-6 from the floor.

Sophomore Brooke Moore recorded her second straight 15-point game and remained perfect at the free-throw line for her career, going 7-for-7. And freshman Annie Hughes scored 12 points and had two steals.

As a team, the Tigers shot 43.3 percent from the field (26-60) and hit 8-of-19 3-point attempts (42.1\%). Auburn also out-rebounded the Monarchs 34-28. But Old Dominion shot a blistering 59.3 percent from the field and 50 percent (14-of-28) from 3-point range.

The Monarchs, who were just 1-of-13 from 3-point range in their first game, hit 8-of-17 from long range in the first half alone to lead most of the opening half and take a 41-39 lead at the break. Auburn led briefly in the second quarter when Hughes put back a missed free throw to give the Tigers a 33-32 advantage with 6:01 to play.

ODU jumped back ahead by as many as 10 points midway through the third quarter, but the Tigers closed the period on an 8-0 run, punctuated by a pair of 3-pointers from Erin Howard, to head to the fourth quarter down by just two at 60-58. After an Alexander free throw got Auburn within one 16 seconds into the fourth, the Monarchs missed just one shot the entire period and went on a 25 10 run over the next six-plus minutes to build a 16-point lead and secure the road win.

## Game 3: Nov. 21, 2019 UAB 80, Auburn 75 Bartow Arena Birmingham, Ala.



BIRMINGHAM-- Auburn's Unique Thompson scored 24 points and matched a career-high in rebounds, but the Tigers came up short in a back-and-forth battle at UAB Thursday night, 80-75.

In a game that featured 12 ties and 25 lead changes and neither team ever led by more than five points, the Tigers (1-2) shot 50 percent from the field and had 10 more rebounds than UAB (3-2). But the Blazers scored 23 points off 20 Auburn turnovers, hit 103 -pointers and did not miss a free throw in the second half.

Thompson finished with a game-high points and tied her career-high with 19 rebounds, 10 of those coming on the offensive end and leading to 17 second-chance points for the Tigers. Alexander added 20 points on 9-of-14 shooting and also had a team-best four steals. Those were the only two Tigers in double-figures; Erin Howard added 9 points and 7 rebounds off the bench.

A back-and-forth first half that saw seven ties and 15 lead changes ended with the Blazers holding a one-point lead at 41-40. Alexander and three others missed some minutes in the opening half with foul trouble, and UAB took advantage, although neither team led by more than four at any point. The Tigers shot 55 percent from the floor in the half and outrebounded UAB 20-11, but the Blazers scored 16 points off 10 Auburn turnovers.

Auburn pulled ahead by as many as five points midway through the third quarter, taking a 54-49 lead on an 8-0 run that featured a steal-and-score from Alexander and back-to-back layups from Thompson. But the Blazers tied it up on a pair of free throws just before the end of the period to tie the game 58-58 after three.

The teams traded the lead for the next seven minutes and the game was tied 69-69 with just under four to play. A backbreaking sequence for Auburn saw a would-be Brooke Moore jumper wiped away after a shot clock review, and a desperation heave to beat the shot clock on the other end found the basket for UAB's Miyah Barnes to give the Blazers a 72-69 lead. UAB would never trail again, going 6 -for- 6 at the free-throw line in the final minute to secure the win.


AUBURN-- Career nights from redshirt sophomore Kiyae' White and freshman Lauren Hansen and a pair of late defensive stops led the Auburn women's basketball team to a 66-62 win over St. Joseph's at Auburn Arena Sunday night.

The Tigers (2-2) snapped a two-game skid with their best defensive effort of the season, turning 14 turnovers by St. Joseph's (2-3) into 17 turnovers and limiting the Hawks to just four 3-pointers on 15 attempts.

Hansen, making her second career start, led Auburn with a career-high 18 points on 6-of-10 shooting, including a 4-for-6 night from 3-point range. Hansen also led the Auburn defensive effort with a game-high four steals. White also shattered her previous career-high with a 12-point effort, going 3-for-4 from the floor and 6-of-8 at the free-throw line.

Junior Unique Thompson made it 4-for-4 this season on double-doubles with a 17-point, 12 -rebound night. Dating back to the final game of last season, Thompson has five consecutive double-doubles, a feat not accomplished by an Auburn player since Le'Coe Willingham in 2004. Thompson also led the Tigers with five assists.

Senior Daisa Alexander had eight points, three assists and two steals, and freshman Annie Hughes added five points and four rebounds off the bench.

As a team, the Tigers shot a season-low 36.2 percent from the field but got to the free-throw line 30 times for the second time this season, making 19. Auburn also out-rebounded St. Joe's 40-34 and had just 10 turnovers, a season-low.

A tough offensive third period for both teams ended with St. Joseph's holding a 46-45 lead. But the Tigers used several defensive stops and got timely shots from Hansen, Hughes and Morgan Robinson-Nwagwu to build a six-point lead at 64-58 with 1:16 to play. A pair of trips to the free-throw line for St. Joe's allowed the Hawks to cut the advantage to two points inside of 30 seconds, but the Tigers forced a turnover on the Hawks' next possession before a pair of Thompson free throws sealed the win.

## Game 5: Nov. 29, 2019 <br> Middle Tennessee 73, Auburn 50 Hertz Arena Estero, Fla.



ESTERO, Fla.-- Junior Unique Thompson picked up her fifth double-double in as many games, but the Auburn women's basketball team could never get going in a 7350 loss to Middle Tennessee Friday morning to open the Gulf Coast Showcase.

A sloppy start to the game put the Tigers (2-3) in a big early hole, and Auburn was never able to climb out. Middle Tennessee (5-1) took advantage of 15 first-half Auburn turnovers to build a 21-point halftime lead, and Auburn was unable to make enough headway in the second half to get within striking distance.

Thompson finished with 15 points and 10 rebounds to give her six straight double-doubles going back to last season. Sophomore Brooke Moore was the only other Tiger in double-figures with 11 points.

Auburn shot a season-low 34.0 percent from the field (18-53) and was 4-of-20 from 3-point range. The Tigers also turned the ball over 23 times, leading to 19 MTSU points. Auburn did get 11 second-chance points off eight offensive rebounds, but the Tigers were out-rebounded for the first time this season, 36-29. The Blue Raiders also hit 10 3-pointers.

Middle Tennessee forced nine Auburn turnovers in the first quarter, and the Tigers hit just 3-of-10 shots as the Blue Raiders jumped out to a 24-7 lead. Things got slightly better in the second quarter, but ball control still proved to be an issue as MTSU took advantage of 15 firsthalf turnovers to lead 40-19 at the half. Auburn would get no closer than 16 points the rest of the way.

Taylor Sutton led MTSU with 27 points, followed by Aislynn Hayes with 20.

Game 6: Nov. 30, 2019
Auburn 76, Dayton 74 (OT) Hertz Arena
Estero, Fla.


ESTERO, Fla.-- Auburn's Erin Howard tipped in a game-tying basket at the buzzer to force overtime, and the Tigers out-dueled Dayton in the extra period to earn a 76-74 win Saturday morning in the Gulf Coast Showcase.

With the score tied 74-74 and Auburn able to hold for the last shot in overtime, Unique Thompson was fouled and made one of two free throws to give the Tigers a 75-74 lead. Auburn was then whistled for a foul with 0.8 seconds to play, but Dayton's Erin Whalen - who had scored all 11 points for the Flyers in OT - missed both free throws. Kiyae' White got the rebound, and another Auburn free throw in the final two-tenths gave the Tigers the win.

The Tigers forced the extra period when, trailing 63-61 with 7.6 seconds to play, a baseline miss from Lauren Hansen came off the rim to Howard on the weak side, who tipped it in as the buzzer sounded.

Auburn (3-3) trailed by 13 points at halftime after two starters missed a large chunk of the second quarter with foul trouble; while they were on the bench, the Flyers went on a 22-4 run. But Auburn answered by outscoring Dayton 25-12 in the third quarter to tie it up, and the final 15 minutes went back-and-forth to set up the wild finish.

Daisa Alexander led the Tigers with 22 points, along with three assists and three steals. Unique Thompson added 20 points and 11 rebounds for her sixth dou-ble-double in as many games and was a key at the free throw line late, hitting 10-of-15 attempts in the game. Brooke Moore poured in a season-high 18 points, with five of those coming in the overtime period, along with a team-leading four steals.

Lauren Hansen finished with eight points and six rebounds, and Howard contributed five points and six boards off the bench, including the game-tying put-back to force overtime.

For the first time this season, Auburn forced an opponent into 20 turnovers, turning those into 19 points. Dayton shot 44.4 percent for the game to Auburn's 40.6 percent, but the Tigers took advantage of free-throw opportunities, hitting 18-of-26 (69.2\%) for the game.


ESTERO, Fla.-- Auburn got huge offensive efforts from Daisa Alexander and Lauren Hansen, but the Tigers came up just short in a wild game with Drake Sunday afternoon, falling 83-82 in the fifth-place game of the Gulf Coast Showcase.

The Tigers ( $3-4$ ) trailed by as many as 11 , led by as many as 11, and saw 13 ties and 12 lead changes in an incredibly entertaining game. But a pair of free throws for Drake (6-2) with 7.8 seconds left, coupled with two misses at the other end, left Auburn behind as the clock expired.

Alexander and Hansen each scored 24 points, a career-high for Hansen and one shy of it for Alexander. Hansen made seven 3-pointers on the day, one shy of tying the Auburn single-game record. Both players also finished with four assists, and Alexander added three steals. Unique Thompson kept her double-double streak alive with a 12-point, 11-rebound effort that also included four steals.

Auburn shot 45.2 percent for the game (28-62) and hit 13-of-293-pointers (44.8\%), coming up one short of the single-game team record. The Tigers were also stellar at the free-throw line, hitting 13-of-16 (81.3\%). Auburn forced 19 Drake turnovers, turning those into 24 point.

Drake led 44-42 at the half. A slow start to the third quarter for both teams saw Auburn tie it up at 48-48, then go on a 10-0 run to build a 58-48 advantage on an Alexander 3-pointer with 3:36 left. But a flurry by the Bulldogs in the final 90 seconds cut the lead to four at $66-62$ headed to the fourth.

The lead swung wildly in both directions throughout the fourth quarter with both teams leading by as many as 6 . Auburn trailed 81-75 with 2:18 to play, but another 3-pointer plus two free throws from Alexander cut it to one at 81-80 with under a minute. Auburn got a stop, then Alexander drew a foul with 15 seconds left and made both free throws to put the Tigers back ahead 82-81. At the other end, Auburn forced a miss but was unable to get the rebound, and a foul with 7.8 seconds left led to two Bulldog free throws. The Tigers had two chances before the buzzer but could not get a shot to fall.

# Game 8: Dec. 4, 2019 <br> Auburn 82, South Alabama 62 Mitchell Center <br> Mobile, Ala. 



MOBILE-- Five players scored in double figures, and an offensive flurry early in the fourth quarter broke the game open as Auburn earned an $82-62$ road win at South Alabama Wednesday night.

The Tigers (4-4) used a 16-0 run that spanned the end of the third and start of the fourth quarters to break open what had been a close game throughout. Auburn's long-range shooting was effective for the second straight game as the Tigers hit 123 -pointers, giving them 25 over their last two contests.

Sophomore Brooke Moore led the Tigers' offensive attack with a season-high 20 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including 4-of-6 beyond the 3-point arc. Erin Howard and Daisa Alexander had 14 points apiece; Howard made a career-high four 3-pointers and also had a career-best four steals.

Unique Thompson grabbed three rebounds in the fourth quarter to extend her double-double streak to nine straight, dating back to last season. She finished with 15 points and 10 rebounds and was 7-of-7 from the floor. Lauren Hansen was Auburn's fifth player in double-figures with 10 points and a team-leading four assists. Kiyae' White added eight rebounds.

As a team, Auburn shot a season-high 53.3 percent from the field (32-60) and was 50 percent (12-24) from 3 -point range. The Tigers out-rebounded the Jaguars 3630 and scored 21 points off 15 USA turnovers.

South Alabama (3-5) led 47-45 with 4:46 to play in the third quarter. But the Tigers' defense held the Jaguars to just one basket over the next eight-plus minutes, outscoring them 23-2 in that stretch to build a 19-point lead with 7:47 to play. From there, the Tigers cruised, pushing the advantage to as many as 26 before a couple of late defensive lapses let USA cut the final margin to 20.

Auburn never trailed in the first half, taking a 37-32 lead at the break. Moore hit four 3-pointers in the first half with three of those coming in the second quarter as the Tigers extended their lead to as many as eight points. But the Jaguars stayed in the game thanks to 10 second-chance points off eight offensive rebounds in the opening half.

Game 9: Dec. 7, 2019
TCU 80, Auburn 65
Schollmaier Arena Fort Worth, Texas


FORT WORTH, Texas-- Unique Thompson scored a career-high 31 points, but early foul trouble and turnovers cost Auburn in an 80-65 loss at TCU Saturday in the Big 12/SEC Challenge.

Auburn (4-5) turned the ball over 19 times, leading to 26 points for TCU (7-0), and multiple Tigers missed significant minutes with foul trouble; two players fouled out. The Horned Frogs took advantage, getting into the bonus every quarter and hitting 23-of-33 free throws for the game.

Thompson's 31 points were the most by an Auburn player since Katie Frerking had 32 at Texas A\&M in 2017. Thompson also added 15 rebounds to pick up her ninth double-double of the season and 10th straight dating back to last year, continuing the longest active streak in the nation.

But Thompson was Auburn's only player in double figures. Lauren Hansen and Brooke Moore added eight points and Daisa Alexander had six; all three fought foul trouble throughout the game. Alexander and Morgan Robinson-Nwagwu tied for the team lead with four assists, and Kiyae' White and Erin Howard had three steals apiece.

Neither team shot the ball particularly well; Auburn hit 24-of-67 from the floor ( $35.8 \%$ ) and TCU was one shot better at 25-of-67 (37.3). But the Frogs made seven 3-pointers to Auburn's three, and made up the rest of the difference at the free-throw line. TCU also out-rebounded Auburn 49-42.

Auburn went on a 13-2 run early in the second quarter to tie the game after trailing by nine at the end of the first. But foul trouble took a toll as TCU was in the bonus for the final five minutes of the quarter and took advantage, hitting 7-of-9 free throws in the period. Meanwhile, three starters missed significant minutes with two or more fouls, and the Horned Frogs took a 44-31 lead at the break.

The Tigers cut the lead to single-digits early in the third, but TCU went on a 13-5 run to take a 58-40 lead, and Auburn got no closer than 15 points the rest of the way.


AUBURN-- Five Tigers scored in double-figures as the Auburn women's basketball team pulled away in the second half for a $74-56$ win over Bethune-Cookman Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

Auburn (5-5) shot over 65 percent in the second half and overcame a tenacious press by Bethune-Cookman (6-2) to turn a five-point halftime lead into as much as a 19-point advantage to head into the holiday break with a victory.

Junior Unique Thompson led the way with a 16-point, 13 -rebound effort that also included a team-leading four steals. She was just one rebound shy of a double-double by halftime; as such, she picked up her NCAA-leading 10th double-double in 10 games and extended her streak to 11 straight games, which leads all active players nationwide.

Erin Howard added 12 points and seven rebounds off the bench, and Daisa Alexander scored 11, bringing her within four points of 1,000 for her career. Lauren Hansen scored 10 points and shared the team lead with three assists. And Robyn Benton, who missed the season's first nine games with injury, scored 10 points and added two blocks in her return to action. Annie Hughes moved back into the starting lineup for Sunday's game and pulled down a season-high seven rebounds along with five points.

For the game, Auburn shot 50.8 percent from the floor (30-59) and held the Wildcats to a 33.9 percent night (19-56), the lowest by an Auburn opponent this year. The Tigers out-rebounded BCU 43-26, their biggest margin of the year, and scored 36 points in the paint to BCU's 20 .

Auburn found an offensive rhythm late in the second quarter to turn a five-point deficit into a five-point lead at 36-31 headed to the locker room. The Tigers then started the third quarter on a $16-4$ run, extending the advantage to 52-35 with 4:15 to play. A turnover- and foulplagued cold spell to begin the fourth quarter allowed the Wildcats to cut the Auburn lead to as few as 10 points, but a Hughes 3-pointer with just under six minutes left sparked a 9-0 run to put the game out of reach.

## Game 11: Dec. 28, 2019 <br> Auburn 62, Jacksonville State 53 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.



AUBURN-- Auburn senior Daisa Alexander scored her 1,000th career point as the Tigers closed out non-conference play with a 62-53 win over Jacksonville State Saturday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (6-5) forced a season-high 27 turnovers, turning those into 27 points, and controlled the paint throughout. Auburn never trailed and led by as many as 18 in the fourth quarter before a late 3-point barrage from the Gamecocks (4-7) cut the final margin to single digits.
Alexander's fadeaway jumper with 39 seconds to play in the third quarter gave her 1,000 career points, making her the 34th Auburn player to reach the milestone. She finished with 10 points, six rebounds and three steals on the day.

Junior Unique Thompson kept her nation-leading double-double streak alive with a 20 -point, 10 -rebound effort, grabbing her final rebound with less than two minutes to play. She is now 11-for-11 this season and has 12 straight double-doubles, dating back to the final game of last season. Brooke Moore added 11 points and Kiyae' White pulled down eight rebounds to aid the Tiger effort.

Auburn shot 40 percent for the game (22-55) and held JSU to 34 percent ( $16-47$ ) from the floor, but 13 of JSU's 16 made field goals came from 3-point range, including all seven of their made shots in the fourth quarter. The Tigers outrebounded the Gamecocks 36-30 and outscored JSU in the paint 22-2.
Auburn jumped out to an early double-digit lead, forcing seven first-quarter turnovers to lead 14-4 late in the period and 16-7 at the end of one. The Camecocks hit back-to-back 3 s to open the second quarter, but Auburn held JSU without a field goal for the next seven minutes, taking a 27-18 lead to the break.

The Gamecocks got as close as six points at 30-24 earIy in the third, but Auburn finished the quarter on a 15-5 run to take a $45-29$ lead at the end of three. Two straight Thompson buckets midway through the final period gave Auburn its largest lead at $56-38$ with $4: 03$ to play, but Jacksonville State hit four 3-pointers in the final 3:11 to cut the final margin to single digits.

## Game 12: Jan. 2, 2020 Vanderbilt 77, Auburn 55 Memorial Gym Nashville, Tenn.



NASHVILLE-- Auburn got off to a slow start and never recovered in a $77-55$ loss to Vanderbilt Thursday night at Memorial Gym to open SEC play.

The Tigers ( $6-6,0-1$ SEC) had their worst shooting night of the season and saw Vanderbilt (11-3, 1-0) shoot a blistering 60 percent as the Commodores opened a big early lead and never looked back.

Unique Thompson kept her nation-leading dou-ble-double streak alive with a 14 -point, 10 rebound performance. She also tallied three steals and a pair of assists. Brooke Moore led the Tigers with 17 points, and Erin Howard added 13.

Vanderbilt shot 59.6 percent from the field (31-52) and outscored Auburn in the paint 46-24. The Tigers finished at 28.3 percent (17-60). Auburn had a strong night at the free-throw line, hitting 18-of-23 (78.3\%).

Auburn took a 1-0 lead before the ball was even tossed on an administrative technical due to a malfunctioning shot clock at Memorial Gym, and Moore made a layup to open the in-game scoring and give the Tigers a 3-0 lead. But it was downhill from there. The Commodores went on an 8-0 run over the next two minutes and never trailed again. A 68-percent first half gave Vanderbilt a 47-18 lead at the break. The Tigers outscored Vandy 37-30 in the second half.
Mariella Fasoula led Vanderbilt with 21 points and Demi Washington added 17.

AUBURN-- Daisa Alexander and Brooke Moore both scored 19 points, but Auburn fell to No. 20 Arkansas 8670 Sunday in the home SEC opener at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (6-7, 0-2 SEC) saw the Razorbacks (13-2, 2-0) jump out to a big early lead and never look back as Auburn was unable to slow down the SEC's top-scoring team.

Alexander and Moore shared the team lead with 19 points each and were Auburn's only two players in double-figures. Junior Unique Thompson saw her 13-game double-double streak come to an end as she pulled down a game-high 13 rebounds but was held to six points. Thompson also led the Tigers with six assists. Erin Howard had seven rebounds, and Robyn Benton added six points and a team-leading four steals.

Auburn shot 53 percent in the second half and finished at 41 percent for the game (27-66), but Arkansas was lights-out early and finished at 51.6 percent from the field (32-62). The Razorbacks also hit 123 -pointers on 27 attempts and scored 24 points off 19 Auburn turnovers.

The Tigers jumped out to a quick lead, hitting 3-of-4 3-pointers to start the game with a 9-2 advantage. But Auburn would make just two of its next 14 3-point shots and score just three points the rest of the quarter. Meanwhile, the Razorbacks hit 5-of-6 from long range in the first quarter alone to take a 26-12 lead after one. Arkansas cooled a bit in the second quarter, but Auburn was unable to take advantage as the Razorbacks led $44-27$ at the half.

Arkansas continued its hot shooting to the tune of 63.2 percent in the third quarter, scoring 28 points in the period to take a $72-47$ lead after three. Auburn was able to force some turnovers in the fourth quarter and ended the game on an 11-0 run.

Amber Ramirez led Arkansas with 25 points, hitting seven 3-pointers. Chelsea Dungee added 19 points.


AUBURN-- Unique Thompson picked up her 13th double-double of the season, but Auburn was unable to overcome a hot-shooting Florida team Thursday night in an 83-63 loss at Auburn Arena.

Florida (11-5, 2-1 SEC) shot 61.5 percent from the field, including 58.8 percent from 3-point range, and also controlled the paint as Auburn ( $6-8,0-3$ ) fell behind early and was unable to recover.

Thompson was held scoreless in the first half but bounced back after halftime to finish with 10 points and 10 rebounds to extend her NCAA-leading double-double total. Brooke Moore was Auburn's leading scorer with 14 points. Kiyae' White added eight points and seven rebounds, and Erin Howard had four steals.

Auburn shot 39.3 percent from the field and attempted a season-high 29 3-pointers, making seven (24.1\%). Florida grabbed one more rebound than Auburn (30-29). The Tigers forced Florida into 17 turnovers but was only able to convert those into ninie points. Florida, meanwhile, scored 26 points off 16 Auburn turnovers.

The teams traded baskets early, but the Gators ended the first quarter on a 14-5 run to take a 21-12 lead after 10 minutes. Auburn got within five midway through the second and had the chance to cut it to a two-possession game with a last shot, but a turnover led to a Florida layup at the buzzer and a 42-31 UF lead. Florida shot $61.5 \%$ from the floor ( $16-26$ ) and $67 \%$ from 3-point range (6-9) in the first half.

An 13-0 run by the Gators to open the third quarter put the game out of reach as Florida turned its halftime advantage into a 55-31 lead just over three minutes into the second half.

Auburn was without the services of senior guard Daisa Alexander, who injured her ankle in Sunday's game vs. Arkansas. She was honored with a pregame ceremony that recognized her for scoring her 1,000th career point on Dec. 28 vs. Jacksonville State.


AUBURN-- Unique Thompson recorded her 14th dou-ble-double of the season, but Alabama took advantage of a long cold stretch for Auburn as the Tigers fell 75-48 Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers led by six at the end of one quarter and were tied 26-26 with just over two minutes to play in the second. But Auburn went scoreless over the next nine-plus minutes as Alabama used a $25-0$ run to put the game out of reach.

Thompson led Auburn with 16 points and 14 rebounds to give her 14 double-doubles in 15 games this year, which continues to lead the nation. But she was Auburn's only player in double-figures. Robyn Benton added nine points and three steals off the bench, and Lauren Hansen had four assists.

The Tigers took 15 more shots than Alabama but made nine fewer. Alabama shot 51.9 percent (28-54) from the field, including 11-of-29 from 3-point range ( $37.9 \%$ ) while Auburn was 19-of-69 from the field (27.5\%) and 6-26 (23.1\%) on 3-pointers. Alabama had one more rebound than Auburn, 39-38, and while Auburn forced 17 Alabama turnovers, the Tigers turned those into only 10 points.

Jasmine Walker led the Tide with 23 points and 10 rebounds, and Jordan Lewis added 16 points.

ATHENS, Ga.-- Auburn played its best first half of basketball in SEC play but was unable to sustain its strong play for 40 minutes as Ceorgia pulled away late for a 61-50 win Sunday afternoon at Stegeman Coliseum.

After leading at the half for the first time in SEC play, the Tigers went ice cold in the second half, shooting just 20 percent in the final 20 minutes as Georgia went on a 19-3 run spanning the third and fourth quarters to put the game away.

Unique Thompson recorded her 15th double-double in 16 games with a 13 -point, 11 -rebound performance that saw most of her scoring come at the free-throw line; she made 9-of-13 attempts. Daisa Alexander made her return from an ankle injury that sidelined her the last two games, leading Auburn with 17 points. And Robyn Benton added a season-high 12 after making her first career start.

For the game, Auburn shot 28.3 percent, tying for their second-lowest percentage of the season. But it was the second half that was the difference - Auburn made just 5 of 25 shots from the field ( $20 \%$ ) while Georgia hit 10-of18 in the third quarter and $15-$ of- 31 ( $48.3 \%$ ) for the half.

The Tigers forced 18 Ceorgia turnovers but converted those into just nine points, all in the first half. Georgia scored 19 points off 17 Auburn turnovers and outscored the Tigers on fast breaks 19-4.

Auburn led 29-25 at the half; it was the Tigers' first halftime lead in SEC play. It was as much as a 10 -point lead for the Tigers at two different points in the first half. Auburn sprinted to a 14-4 lead in the first five minutes but saw Georgia close to 17-9 at the end of the first. The lead was back to 10 at 21-11 on a pair of Thompson free throws with 7:30 left in the second, but the Bulldogs went on an 11-4 run to get within as few as two.

Georgia took its first lead with 6:35 to play at 34-33. After the Bulldogs extended it to four at $38-34$, Benton hit a 3 -pointer with $4: 33$ left in the quarter to pull within one at 38-37. From there, Auburn missed its next 13 shots while Georgia made 8-of-10 to build a lead it would not relinquish.

## Game 17: Jan. 23, 2020

Auburn 59, Ole Miss 43 Auburn Arena Auburn, Ala.


AUBURN-- Auburn put together one of its best defensive efforts of the season and pulled away in the fourth quarter as the Tigers defeated Ole Miss 59-43 Thursday night at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (7-10, 1-5 SEC) earned their first SEC win of the year and snapped a five-game losing streak as a fourpoint lead at the end of the third quarter ballooned to as much as 19 in the fourth as Auburn outscored Ole Miss (7-12, 0-6) 21-9 in the final period.

Sophomore Robyn Benton led the Tigers with a career-high 17 points along with a career-best six rebounds, hitting three 3-pointers and going 4-for-4 at the free-throw line. She also shared the team lead with three assists and had a pair of steals in her second career start.

Unique Thompson made a pair of late free throws to secure her NCAA-leading 16th double-double in 17 games, racking up 10 points and 13 rebounds. Brooke Moore scored 10 points, all in the second half, to give the Tigers three players in double figures. And Daisa Alexander had a career-high 10 rebounds along with seven points, three assists and two steals.

Auburn had another rough night from the floor, shooting 30.3 percent, but knocked down seven 3-pointers and was 12-of-15 at the free-throw line. The Tigers held Ole Miss to 27.4 percent from the floor, the lowest by an Auburn opponent this season, and were able to keep the Rebels away from the foul line as they attempted just four free throws.

The Tigers grabbed a season-high 55 rebounds, their most since pulling down 57 in an overtime game at Marquette in 2015. Auburn also scored a season-high 12 points on fast breaks.

## Game 18: Jan. 27, 2020 <br> No. 12 Kentucky 68, Auburn 61 Memorial Coliseum Lexington, Ky.



LEXINGTON, Ky.-- Auburn fought back from a 20-point deficit to tie the game in the fourth quarter but was unable to pull out the victory as No. 12 Kentucky held on for a 68-61 win Monday night at Memorial Coliseum.

The Tigers trailed by 16 at the half and as many as 20 midway through the second quarter, but went on an 11-0 run to open the second half and never allowed Kentucky to pull away. Auburn was within two points with under a minute to go but was unable to score again as the Wildcats knocked down five free throws in the final seconds to seal the win.

Unique Thompson had one of her best performances at Auburn, picking up her nation-leading 17th dou-ble-double in 18 games with a game-high 27 points and 15 rebounds, hitting 11-of-14 attempts from the field.
Thompson was Auburn's only player in double-figures; Robyn Benton and Erin Howard added nine points each and Daisa Alexander had eight. Alexander also contributed a season-high seven assists.

The Tigers had turnover troubles throughout, finishing with 26 that led to 25 Kentucky points. Auburn forced Kentucky into 20 turnovers, turning those into 16 points. Auburn out-shot Kentucky, hitting 45.5 percent (25-55) from the floor to UK's 42.9 percent (24-56), but the Wildcats knocked down 113 -pointers. Auburn out-rebounded UK 36-29 and scored 38 points in the paint to UK's 20.

Kentucky led 44-28 at the half after the Tigers turned the ball over 15 times in the opening 20 minutes, leading to 16 Wildcat points. The Wildcats also hit seven 3-pointers in the first half.

But Auburn opened the third quarter on an 11-0 run and closed to a four-point game at 51-47 after three quarters. The Tigers scored the first four points of the fourth quarter, tying the game on a Thompson free throw with 8:40 to play. Kentucky moved back ahead by five, but Auburn pulled to within a point on two different occasions in the fourth and had the ball with a chance to take the lead. However, the Tigers could never get over the hump, and Kentucky made 5-of-6 free throws in the final 30 seconds to seal the win.

STARKVILLE, Miss.-- One of the best all-around efforts of the season from the Auburn women's basketball team came up just short Thursday night as the Tigers dropped a 78-73 decision at No. 9 Mississippi State.

The Tigers had their best shooting night and scoring output in SEC play so far and led by as many as nine points early in the second half, but a string of Auburn turnovers late in the third quarter allowed the Bulldogs to pull ahead and stay there.

For just the second time this season, Auburn had two players top the 20-point mark. Unique Thompson led the way with a 21-point, 11-rebound effort, picking up her 18th double-double of the season and 38th of her career, moving her into a tie for second on the all-time Auburn list.

Daisa Alexander added 20 points, her fifth effort of 20 or more points this year, and matched her career-high with four 3-pointers on the night. Robyn Benton added 14 points to give Auburn three players in double-figures, and freshman Sania Wells, a Mississippi native, added a career-high eight points in a return to her home state.

The Tigers shot 49.1 percent from the field, their best in SEC play so far this year, hitting 27-of-55 attempts from the floor. Auburn was also 6-of-12 on 3-point attempts and out-rebounded a much taller Mississippi State team 34-27. But the Bulldogs shot 32-for-58 (55.2\%) from the floor and forced Auburn into 24 turnovers, which turned into 24 MSU points. Auburn had one of its better nights scoring points off turnovers this year, though, scoring 21 off 18 MSU giveaways.


AUBURN-- Four players scored in double-figures, and the Auburn women's basketball team held off a late Vanderbilt rally and had their best free-throw shooting day of the season in a 70-62 win Sunday at Auburn Arena.

The Tigers (8-12, 2-7 SEC) avenged a 22-point loss a month ago in Nashville by forcing the Commodores (12-10, 2-7) into 22 turnovers and taking advantage of opportunities at the line, hitting 18-of-20 free throws on the day.

Senior Daisa Alexander and freshman Lauren Hansen tied for the Auburn lead with 18 points apiece. Alexander added four assists and three steals, and Hansen had two assists, two steals and a rebound. The two combined to go 12-of-12 at the charity stripe, with five of those coming in the closing second to seal the win.

Unique Thompson moved within one double-double of DeWanna Bonner's Auburn record with the 39th of her career and 19th of the season, scoring 15 points along with 12 rebounds. She also had three assists, a steal and a block. Robyn Benton gave the Tigers four players in double figures with a 13-point effort that included six rebounds and matched a career-high with six steals for the second straight game.

Auburn's 90-percent free-throw day was its best since shooting 92.3 percent (12-of-13) in a win over Nicholls State last season. Despite Vanderbilt out-shooting the Tigers 49.1 percent to 38.7 percent, Auburn held the Commodores at bay from long range, allowing Vandy to hit just one 3-pointer on the night; 40 of Vandy's 62 points came in the paint. The 'Dores had two more rebounds than Auburn, but the Tigers had 16 second-chance points off 14 offensive rebounds and scored 19 fast-break points

The Tigers led by as many as 13 in the third quarter at 53-40 with 2:38 to play. But Vandy would not go away, getting as close as three points in the final minute of the game. But with 45 seconds to play and Auburn coming out of a timeout with two seconds to shoot, the Tigers got the ball in Hansen's hands who drew a foul shooting a 3-pointer. She made all three free throws to make it 6660, and two more free throws apiece from Alexander and Benton put the game out of reach.

## Game 21: Feb. 9, 2020 Alabama 68, Auburn 64 Coleman Coliseum Tuscaloosa, Ala.



TUSCALOOSA - Auburn's Erin Howard scored a career-high 15 points and three Tigers finished in double figures, but a back-and-forth game went Alabama's way Sunday afternoon as Auburn fell 68-64 at Coleman Coliseum.

In a game that featured 12 ties and 13 lead changes, Auburn led 61-60 with 1:24 to play. But Alabama, which had missed 11 straight 3-pointers, hit one from the corner to take a 63-61 lead with under a minute to play. Auburn came up empty on its next possession, and Alabama sank 5-of-6 free throws down the stretch to earn the win.

Howard's 15 points led the Tigers on a tough shooting day; she was 3-of-5 from 3-point range. Howard also contributed four rebounds, two steals and an assist. Robyn Benton added 14 points, including an 8-for-8 day at the free-throw line, and a career-high seven rebounds. And Daisa Alexander finished with 10 points, six assists and four rebounds.

Unique Thompson missed a double-double for just the second time this season by one point, finishing with nine points and 12 rebounds along with two steals. Lauren Hansen also added nine points.

The Tigers shot 36.1 percent (22-of-61) while Alabama was slightly better at 40.7 percent. Both teams made 22 shots, but Alabama made one more 3-pointer and three more free throws. Auburn committed just seven turnovers, a season-low, but also forced Alabama into only 11, also a season-low. Alabama out-rebounded Auburn 41-34.

Auburn led 13-12 at the end of one quarter, and the game was tied 28-28 at the half as Alabama hit a layup at the buzzer to pull back even. The Tigers took advantage of opportunities at the free throw line in the third quarter to pull ahead by as many as six points at 45-39 with just over three minutes to play; Benton was a perfect 7-for-7 at the line in the period. Alabama cut the lead to three at 50-47 headed to the fourth.


COLUMBIA, S.C.-- Robyn Benton scored 15 points and Unique Thompson added 12, but the Auburn women's basketball team fell on the road to No. 1 South Carolina 79-53 Thursday night at Colonial Life Arena.

South Carolina hit their first five 3 -pointers of the game and shot better than 50 percent from behind the arc for the game and had five players in double figures as Auburn battled to the end but came up short against the nation's top-ranked team.

Benton's 15 points led all scorers on the night, giving her five of her last six games in double figures. Thompson finished with 12 points and eight rebounds on a night when both were tough to come by. Erin Howard added nine points on three 3 -pointers.

South Carolina shot 49.2 percent for the game while Auburn was 22 -for- 65 ( $33.8 \%$ ) from the floor. Auburn only got to the free-throw line four times, making two, while the Gamecocks were 11-of-16. Both teams made at least half their 3-pointers; Auburn was 7 -for-14 while Carolina was 10 -of-19. The Gamecocks had 39 rebounds to Auburn's 34 and took advantage of their quickness in transition, scoring 20 fast-break points.

The Gamecocks hit their first five 3-pointers and eight of their first 10, pushing to a $42-23$ lead at the half. Auburn answered the early barrage to cut the deficit to as few as three points at 22-19 early in the second quarter, but the Tigers were unable to get any defensive stops as the Gamecocks hit their next seven shots to pull away.

Carolina stayed hot to start the second half, shooting nearly 69 percent in the third quarter and extending its lead to as many as 30 early in the fourth. Auburn outscored the Gamecocks 13-11 in the final period.

Five players scored in double-figures for South Carolina, led by 13 points each from Zia Cooke and Aliyah Boston.


AUBURN-- Unique Thompson scored a game-high 23 points and Daisa Alexander had a career-high 10 assists as the Auburn women's basketball team never trailed in earning its third straight home win, a 65-60 victory over LSU Sunday afternoon at Auburn Arena.

Auburn led by as many as 15 points late in the fourth quarter before a flurry of turnovers allowed LSU to cut the lead to as few as four. But Auburn was able to get a pair of late stops and make free throws late to overcome the furious LSU rally.

Thompson's 23 points led all scorers; she also finished with six rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block. Hansen scored 16 points, hitting 4-of-6 3-point attempts on the day. And Benton added 11 points along with a game-high four steals.

Alexander's 10 assists were the most for an Auburn player in an SEC game since Janiah McKay had 13 against Ole Miss during the 2017 season. Alexander also had seven points and six rebounds.
Auburn shot 48.9 percent for the game, its sec-ond-best effort in SEC play, while holding LSU to 35.6 percent. Auburn also shot 50 percent from 3-point range for the second straight game, hitting 8-of-16 from long range. LSU out-rebounded Auburn 36-31.
Auburn led from wire-to-wire for the second time this season, jumping out to an early 8-2 lead in the first three minutes. LSU would get no closer than four points the rest of the game as Auburn led 17-13 at the end of one, then took a $33-22$ lead to halftime.

Thompson took over in the final 10 minutes, going 5 -for-5 from the floor and drawing four fouls to score 13 points. Her layup with 2:35 to play gave Auburn its biggest lead at 61-46. But LSU responded with a 12-1 run over the next 83 seconds to cut the lead to four at 62-58. On the next possession, Erin Howard blocked a shot, Alexander pulled down the rebound and was fouled, making both shots to put Auburn back up by six. On LSU's next possession, Benton stole an inbound pass to eliminate another opportunity, and LSU only got one more good look on the offensive end down the stretch.
