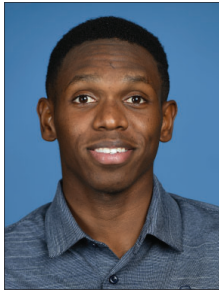

Quick Facts:

Nathon Allen is making his second Olympic appearance after winning silver at the 2016 Olympics as part of Jamaica's 4x400m relay team ... He will be a member of the 4x400m relay in Tokyo ... Allen won silver at the 2019 World Championships in the 4x400m relay and mixed relay ... Fifth in the 400m (44.88) at the 2017 World Championships ... 2017 Jamaican National Champion at 400m (44.58) ... His personal best time of 44.13 came at the 2018 NCAA Outdoor Championships in Eugene, Ore. ... Four-time NCAA All-American ... NCAA Outdoor runner up in 2017 and bronze medalist in 2018.

Swimming 100m Freestyle

Quick Facts:

Zach Apple will swim the 100 freestyle for the United States ... Finished second in the 100 free final at the 2021 U.S. Olympic Trials to earn his spot on the Olympic team ... Won two gold medals as part of the 4x100 freestyle relay team and 4x100 mixed freestyle relay team at the 2019 World Championships ... Earned 13 All-America honors in three seasons at Auburn and was SEC champion in 2018 after winning the 50 freestyle ... Set the Auburn all-time record in the 200 freestyle in 2018 ... Second-fastest in program history in the 100 free and fifth-fastest in the 50 free ... Transferred to Indiana University for senior year.

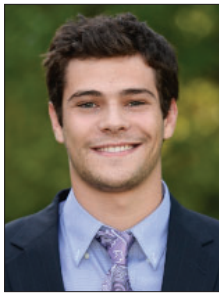


Softball

Quick Facts:

Emily Carosone will compete in softball in her first Olympic appearance for Italy ... first Olympian in Auburn softball program history ... helped Italy to the gold medal at 2021 European Championships ... a three-time All-American during her Auburn career ... captured the 2015 and 2016 Southeastern Conference Softball Tournament and was named the tournament's most valuable player twice ... led Auburn to back-to-back Women's College World Series appearances (2015, 2016) ... Auburn's all-time leader in career batting average, hits, runs, on-base percentage and hit by pitches ... ranks in the top three in program history in career RBI, doubles, home runs, slugging percentage and games started ... holds Auburn's single-season records for runs, slugging percentage and hit by pitches ... a four-year veteran in the professional softball ranks ... entering her second season as Auburn softball's assistant coach.

Marcelo Chierighini • Brazil



Swimming 4x100m Freestyle Relay

Quick Facts:

Marcelo Chierighini will compete in the 4x100 free relay for Brazil ... Marks third straight Olympics competing on Brazil's 4x100 free relay team ... Of Auburn's eight swimmers in Tokyo, he is only three-time Olympian ... One of six men in Auburn history to swim at three Olympic Games ... Best finish in the 4x100 free relay came in Rio 2016 when Brazil placed fifth in the final ... Also made the 100 free final in Rio where he took eighth place ... Earned 22 All-America honors at Auburn ... Won a pair of NCAA relay titles at Auburn (400 FR - 2014, 200 FR - 2013).

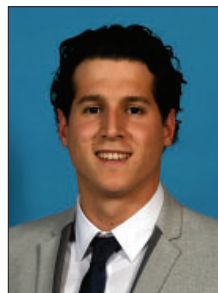
Rachel Dincoff • USA



Track & Field Discus Throw

Quick Facts:

Rachel Dincoff is making her first Olympics appearance and is Auburn's first United States track and field Olympian since Coby Miller (2000, '04) ... Auburn's first female ever to represent the United States at the Olympics in track and field ... A four-time outdoor All-American at Auburn from 2014-16, Dincoff finished third at the Olympic Trials with a toss of 60.21/197-6 to earn one of three spots in the discipline for the United States ... In May, Dincoff posted a lifetime best mark of 64.41m ... The most decorated women's discus thrower in Auburn history, she holds the Auburn record in the discus throw and owns six of the top 10 marks in Auburn history ... Dincoff was a three-time NCAA Outdoors performer, qualifying twice in the shot put and two times in the discus throw.



Santiago Grassi • Argentina



Swimming 50m Freestyle, 100m Butterfly

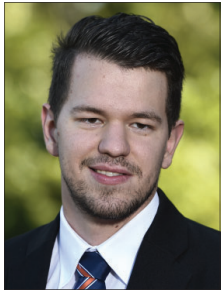
Quick Facts:

Santiago Grassi will swim the 50 freestyle and 100 butterfly for Argentina in what will be his second Olympics ... Placed 24th in the 100 butterfly at the 2016 Olympics in Rio ... Earned his Olympic Qualifying Time in August 2019 at the Pan-American Games in Peru where his 100 fly time in prelims (51.90) put him under the Olympic A Cut ... Seven-time All-American at Auburn ... In Auburn history, he is fifth-fastest in the 100 fly (45.32) and eighth-fastest in the 200 fly (1:42.85) ... Set both marks at the 2020 SEC Championships where he earned a silver medal in the 100 fly.

Quick Facts:
Peter Holoda will swim on Hungary's 4x100 medley relay team in what will be his second Olympics ... Part of Hungary's 4x100 freestyle relay team at the 2016 Olympics in Rio ... Won bronze medal at the 2017 World Championships swimming on the 4x100 free relay team ... Earned 15 All-America honors at Auburn and anchored the SEC champion 400 free relay as a sophomore in 2014 ... Sixth-fastest all-time at Auburn in the 100 free ... Nominated for SEC's 2019 McWhorter Award.

Swimming 200m Breaststroke

Quick Facts:
Annie Lazor will compete in the 200 breaststroke for the United States ... Made the team by winning the 200 breast final at the 2021 U.S. Olympic Trials ... Her time of 2:21.07 is third fastest in the world so far this year ... Earned three gold medals at the 2019 Pan-American Games, finishing first in the 100 and 200 breast and winning the 4x100 medley relay ... Four-time All-American at Auburn ... Third-fastest performer in Auburn history in the 200 breast and fourth-fastest all-time in the 100 breast ... Gave up swimming following the 2016 U.S. Trials ... She will be making her first appearance at the Olympic Games.

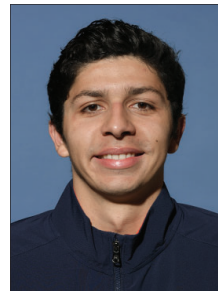

Sunisa Lee will compete as part of Team USA in artistic gymnastics ... She'll compete for a team medal as well as spots in the all-around individual final, individual uneven bars final and individual beam final ... This is her first Olympics ... 2021 U.S. uneven bars champion and balance beam silver medalist ... 2021 U.S. all-around silver medalist ... 2019 World team champion, floor exercise silver medalist and uneven bars bronze medalist ... 2019 U.S. uneven bars champion, all-around silver medalist and floor exercise bronze medalist.



Luis Martinez • Guatemala



Swimming 100m Butterfly

Quick Facts:
Luis Martinez will swim the 100 butterfly for Guatemala ... Making his second Olympic appearance after finishing 19th in the 100 butterfly at the 2016 Rio Games ... Earned his Olympic Qualifying Time at the 2019 Pan-American Games where he set the Pan-Am Games record in the 100 fly with a time of 51.44 ... In November 2020, he broke the U.S. Open 100 butterfly record finishing in 51.50 ... Three-time NCAA All-American at Auburn ... Tied for eighth fastest in Auburn history in the 100 fly.

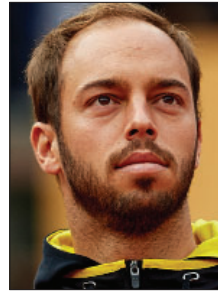
Swimming 50m, 100m Freestyle

Quick Facts:

Julie Meynen is making her second Olympic appearance and will swim the 50 and 100 freestyle for Luxembourg ... Placed 26th in the 50 free and 25th in the 100 free at the 2016 Olympics in Rio ... Became Auburn's first and only Olympian from Luxembourg in 2016 ... Holds the Luxembourgish records in the 50 free (24.78), 100 free (54.44) and 50 fly (27.66) ... Earned 14 All-American honors during her Auburn career and was part of four SEC champion relay teams ... Second-fastest performer in Auburn history in both the 50 and 100 freestyle events.

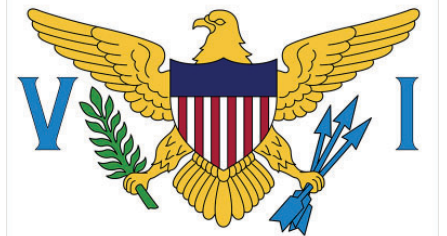
Tennis Men's Doubles

Quick Facts:

Tim Puetz is Auburn's first Olympian in men's tennis ... four-year letterman at Auburn (2008-11) from Unsingen, Germany ... advanced to the NCAA doubles semifinals in 2009 paired with Alexey Tsyrenov and then was an NCAA singles semifinalist in 2010 ... All-American in 2009 and 2010 ... first-team all-SEC ... ITA Southern Region champion in both singles and doubles ... along with Tsyrenov won the consolation doubles title at the ITA All-American Championships ... posted 93 career wins in singles and 89 in doubles at Auburn ... currently ranked No. 39 worldwide in doubles and has won four career ATP event titles, including victories this season at Lyon and Estoril paired with Hugo Nys ... in Tokyo, will pair with Kevin Krawietz, a Munich resident who was the partner of Auburn alum Andreas Mies in winning the 2019 and 2020 French Open doubles championships.



Adriel Sanes • US Virgin Islands



Swimming 100m, 200m Breaststroke

Quick Facts:

Adriel Sanes will swim the 100 and 200 breaststroke for the U.S. Virgin Islands ... Earned his Olympic berth in the 200 breaststroke where he notched an Olympic B Cut time (2:12.59) at the UANA Olympics Qualifier meet in Clermont, Fla., on May 1 ... Received exemption to compete in the 100 breaststroke ... First U.S. Virgin Islands swimmer to compete in two events at the Olympics since George Gleason did it at the 2004 Games ... Graduate transfer from the University of Denver who will join Auburn's roster for the 2021-22 season ... At Denver, was named the Summit League Men's Swimmer of the Championship in 2020.

Kai Selvon • Trinidad & Tobago



Track & Field 4x100m Relay

Quick Facts:

Kai Selvon is making her third appearance at the Olympics for Trinidad and Tobago ... Competing in the women's 4x100m Relay ... Just the third Auburn woman to compete in three Olympics, joining Lacena-Golding Clarke (1996, '00, '04) and Juliet Campbell (1992, '96, '00) ... She previously competed in 2012 (London) and 2016 (Rio de Janeiro) ... Finished 19th in the 200m with a time of 23.04 at the 2012 (London) Olympics ... Selvon competed in the 4x100m relay in the 2012 Olympics and helped lead Trinidad and Tobago to a second place finish in qualifying with a time of 42.31 ... She is tied for the all-time lead in Auburn women's track history with nine All-American honors ... Was the 2012 SEC Indoor Champion in the 60m ... Graduated from Auburn in 2014 with a degree in industrial design.

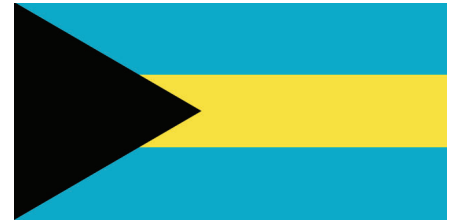

Donald Thomas • Bahamas



Track & Field High Jump

Quick Facts:

Donald Thomas will represent the Bahamas in his fourth Olympics in the high jump after competing in the 2008 (Beijing), 2012 (London) and 2016 (Rio de Janeiro) Olympics ... Just the second Auburn track and field athlete ever to compete in four Olympic Games (Leevan Sands) ... Won the World Championship in the high jump in 2007 with a height of 2.35m ... Finished first in the Commonwealth Games in 2010 with a jump of 2.32m ... Also won the Pan American Games with a height of 2.32m in 2011 ... Posted a personal best 2.37m on July 18, 2016 ... Two-time All-American at Auburn in the high jump ... 2007 Indoor National Champion in the high jump with a height of 2.33m ... Holds the school record in the indoor (2.33m) and outdoor (2.36m) high jump.

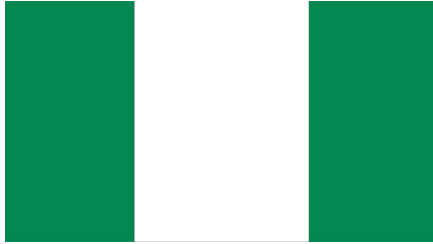

Ruthie Bolton • Nigeria



Women's Basketball Assistant Coach

Quick Facts:

Ruthie Bolton is serving as assistant coach for the Nigerian Women's Basketball National Team for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics ... Bolton is a two-time Olympian, helping lead Team USA to the gold medal in 1996 and 2000 ... She is also a two-time World Champion, helping lead Team USA to gold in 1994 and 1998 ... Bolton had an eight-year WNBA career with the Sacramento Monarchs and was a two-time All-Star in 1999 and 2001 ... At Auburn, she helped lead the Tigers to three straight Women's Final Four appearances in 1988, 1989 and 1990 ... She is Auburn's all-time leader in games played with 132 and is in the program's top five in career assists and steals.



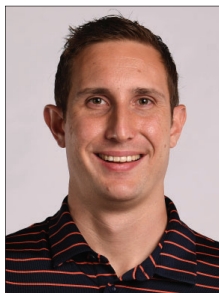
David Marsh • Israel



Swimming Technical Advisor

Quick Facts:

David Marsh will serve as the Technical Advisor for the Israeli swimming team at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics ... Marsh has previous Olympic experience, serving as the men's assistant coach for the 1996, 2000 and 2012 U.S. Olympic teams and then as the women's head coach for the 2016 U.S. Olympic Team ... Becomes fifth Auburn alum to appear in five Olympic Games ... A 1981 graduate of Auburn with a degree in business administration, Marsh was a five-time All-American backstroker for the Tigers ... He would return in 1990 as the head coach of his alma mater and guide the program to 12 NCAA titles and 17 SEC titles.



Gideon Louw • Guatemala



Swimming Assistant Coach

Quick Facts:

Gideon Louw will serve as an assistant coach for the Guatemalan Swimming Team, working primarily with Auburn alum Luis Martinez ... Louw helped trained Martinez, Santiago Grassi and Julie Meynen for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics ... An Olympian himself, Louw competed for South Africa in the 2008 and 2012 Summer Games, finishing fifth in the 400 freestyle relay in 2012 ... As a swimmer at Auburn, he was a six-time All-American and played a major role in helping the men win the NCAA championship in 2008 and 2009 ... Swam on three NCAA champion relay teams ... Returned to the Plains in 2018 as an assistant coach.



Rowdy Gaines • United States



NBC Sports Commentary

Quick Facts:

For the eighth Olympics in a row, former Auburn swimmer Rowdy Gaines will set up behind the microphone to call the action for NBC Sports ... Swimming's top commentator, Gaines regularly calls the Olympics, U.S. Olympic Trials, NCAA Championships and SEC Championships ... A member of the International Swimming Hall of Fame, he is also a member of the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame, Florida Sports Hall of Fame and the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame ... The 1981 Auburn graduate is also recognized on the Auburn Tiger Trail in downtown Auburn ... Selected as a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team, but did not compete due to the American boycott of the Games ... Came back to win three gold medals (100m free, 400m free relay, 400m medley relay) at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles ... Named the 1980 World Swimmer of the Year ... Finished his Auburn career a 22-time All-American, five-time NCAA champion and six-time SEC champion ... In 1991, Rowdy contracted Guillain-Barre Syndrome, an inflammatory disorder of the peripheral nerves ... Partially paralyzed for more than a month, Rowdy fought back and overcame the disorder ... He eventually regained world-class times and, at the age of 35, became the oldest swimmer to qualify for the trials for the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta.

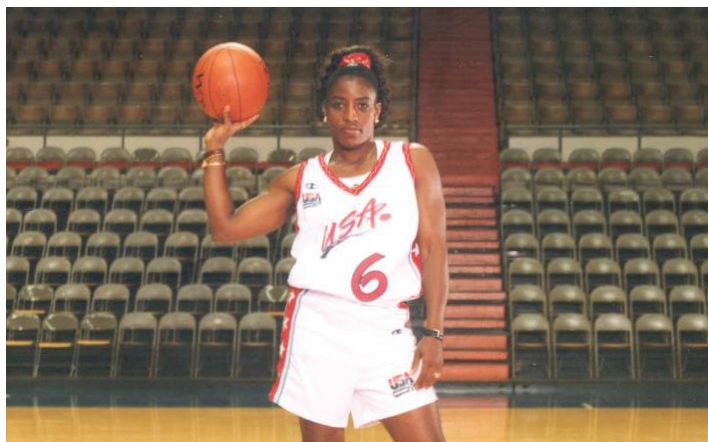

 - The "Dream Team" finished with a perfect 8-0 record in the Olympics as Barkley led Team USA with 18.0 points per game at the 1992 Olympics in Barcelona, Spain. He also set a then-Olympic record with 30 points in a single game (against Brazil).

Charles Barkley **United States** **1996** **Gold** **Men's Basketball**
 - Returned for his second Olympics, leading Team USA to a gold medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga. The United States posted an 8-0 record as Barkley led the team with 12.4 points per game and 6.6 rebounds per game.

Percy Beard **United States** **1932** **Silver** **100m Hurdles**
 - Percy Beard led through the sixth hurdle of the 110m hurdles at the 1932 Olympics in Los Angeles, Calif., but was overtaken by fellow American George Sailing. Beard finished in 14.7 seconds to take the silver medal in the race and become Auburn's first Olympic medalist.



Ruthie Bolton **United States** **1996** **Gold** **Women's Basketball**
 - Ruthie Bolton averaged 12.8 points per game, 4.3 rebounds per game, 2.0 assists per game and 2.87 steals per game as a starter in eight games for the gold-medal winning U.S. Women's Olympic Team during the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga.

Ruthie Bolton **U.S.** **2000** **Gold** **Women's Basketball**
 - Ruthie Bolton played in all eight games as a reserve, helping the U.S. to a second consecutive gold medal at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. Averaged 5.0 points per game and 2.0 rebounds per game.

Fred Bousquet **France** **2008** **Silver** **400m Freestyle Relay**
 - Fred Bousquet, swimming the third leg on the relay, swam a 46.63 split, the fastest on the team, to give France the lead with one leg to go. The United States would pull ahead in the final leg of the race to edge out France by .08. The United States took gold in 3:08.24 while France took silver with a 3:08.32, setting a new European record along the way.

George Bovell **Trinidad** **2004** **Bronze** **200m IM**
 - George Bovell dropped more than a second and a half off his semifinal time to move into the top three and earn a bronze medal in the 200m IM at the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece. Bovell swam a 2:00.65 in the preliminary, ranking third overall, and improved to a 2:00.31 in the semifinal to earn the fifth seed heading into the final. He then swam a time of 1:58.80 to finish behind USA's Michael Phelps and Ryan Lochte to take the bronze.

Marc Burns **Trinidad** **2008** **Silver** **400m Relay**
 - Marc Burns ran the second leg in the 400m relay for Trinidad and Tobago, who captured the silver medal with a time of 38.06. After setting the fastest time in preliminaries with 38.26, Burns and the team finished in second behind Jamaica in the finals by .96 of a second.

Marc Burns **Trinidad** **2012** **Bronze** **400m Relay**
 - Burns medaled in the 400m Relay for the second time in his career with a Bronze medal finish at the London Olympics. Trinidad and Tobago finished with a time of 3:00.38 in the qualifiers and a 2:59.40 in the finals to take the Bronze medal.

 - Cesar Cielo earned his third career medal – and his second in the 50m free – in 2012. After winning gold in 2008 in the same event, the then world record-holder clocked a time of 21.59 to finish third behind surprise gold medalist Florent Manaudou (FRA) with a 21.34 and Cullen Jones (USA), who swam a 21.54.

Kirsty Coventry **Zimbabwe** **2004** **Gold** **200m Backstroke**
 - Kirsty Coventry twice broke the African record, improving in each round, as she won the gold medal in the 200m backstroke at the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece. Coventry clocked a 2:12.49 in the preliminary, ranking third overall, and earned the second seed in the final after touching in with a 2:10.04 in the semifinal. She then posted a time of 2:09.19 in the final to earn the gold medal.

Kirsty Coventry **Zimbabwe** **2004** **Silver** **100m Backstroke**
 - Kirsty Coventry twice broke the African record, improving in each round, as she finished second in the 100m backstroke at the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece. Coventry finished fourth overall in the preliminary with a time of 1:01.60, improving to a 1:01.21 in the semifinal to sneak into the final as the seventh seed. She dropped her time to 1:00.50 in the final to beat out France's Laure Manaudou (1:00.88) for the silver medal - finishing behind USA's Natalie Coughlin (1:00.37).

Kirsty Coventry **Zimbabwe** **2004** **Bronze** **200m IM**
 - Kirsty Coventry twice broke the African record en route to a bronze-medal showing in the 200m IM at the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece. Coventry broke the African record in the preliminary as she posted the top overall time of 2:13.33. She dropped to a time of 2:13.68 in the semifinal as she earned the fourth seed for the final. Coventry then cut her time to 2:12.72 in the final, setting a new African record, and finishing behind USA's Amanda Beard (2:11.70) and the Ukraine's Yana Klochkova (2:11.14).

 - Kirsty Coventry defended her title in the 200m backstroke at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, after setting a world record in the final with a time of 2:05.24. Fellow Jamaican Veronica Campbell-Brown took gold with a 21.74 while the United States' Allison Felix took silver in 21.93. Stewart was 10th after her first-round time of 23.03, but moved to a tie for fourth with a 22.74 in the second round. She finished second in the semifinal with a time of 22.29 before earning the bronze medal.

Tyler McGill **United States** **2012** **Gold** **400m Medley Relay**
 - Tyler McGill swam the butterfly leg for the United States' gold medal-winning 400m medley relay team in London during the prelims session. He clocked a 51.53 split to give the USA team a lead they would not relinquish in their heat. The medal was the 13th straight for the United States in the 4x100 medley relay as the A Relay won by almost two full seconds over silver medal-winning Japan.

Eric Shanteau **United States** **2012** **Gold** **400m Medley Relay**
 - Eric Shanteau swam the breaststroke leg for the United States' gold medal-winning 400m medley relay team in London during the prelims session. His leg moved the USA from third to second at the halfway point before turning it over to fellow Auburn alum Tyler McGill on the butterfly leg. The medal was the 13th straight for the United States in the 4x100 medley relay as the A Relay won by almost two full seconds over silver medal-winning Japan.

Matt Targett **Australia** **2008** **Silver** **400m Medley Relay**
 - Matt Targett swam the freestyle leg during the preliminaries of the 400m Medley Relay at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, helping Australia to a silver medal. During qualifying, the Australian team set an Oceania Record with a time of 3:32.76. Targett swam a 47.41 split, teaming up with Ashley Delaney (backstroke), Christian Sprenger (breaststroke), and Adam Pine (butterfly).

Matt Targett **Australia** **2008** **Bronze** **400m Freestyle Relay**
 - Matt Targett swam the anchor leg of the 400m freestyle relay at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, helping Australia to a bronze medal in the event. Targett was the anchor in the preliminary, swimming a team-best 47.22 split to help the squad to a time of 3:12.41 and the third seed in the final. Swimming with Eamon Sullivan, Andrew Lauterstein and Ashley Callus, Targett again swam the anchor leg in the final, posting a 47.25 split. He helped the team to a bronze medal with a time of 3:09.91, setting new Oceania and Commonwealth Records.

Matt Targett **Australia** **2012** **Bronze** **400m Medley Relay**
 - Matt Targett swam the butterfly leg on the Australian bronze medal-winning 4x100 medley relay team in London. Sitting in fifth place after the breaststroke leg, his butterfly split of 51.60 brought the Aussies up to fourth place, and a stellar closing kick from James Magnussen in the freestyle pulled Australia ahead of Hungary into third place.

Scott Tucker **United States** **1996** **Gold** **400m Freestyle Relay**
 - Scott Tucker swam the second leg during the preliminary of the 400m freestyle relay at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Ga., helping the United States qualify for the final and an eventual gold medal. Tucker swam behind David Fox and ahead of Brad Schumacher and Josh Davis on the relay. The team posted a 3:18.40 - the fastest time in the preliminary.

Scott Tucker **United States** **2000** **Silver** **400m Freestyle Relay**
 - Scott Tucker swam the leadoff leg during the preliminary of the 400m freestyle relay at the 2000 Olympics in Athens, Greece, helping the United States qualify for the final and an eventual silver medal. Tucker swam ahead of Anthony Ervin, Jason Lezak and Josh Davis on the relay. The team posted a 3:15.43 - the fastest time in the preliminary.

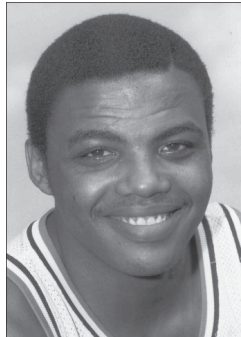
