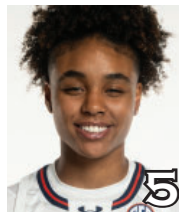

Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- This is the third meeting between Auburn and UCF in women's basketball
- Auburn is 2-0 all-time against UCF with both previous meetings in Auburn
- Last year, Auburn took down previously unbeaten UCF at home 86-46
- Freshman Savannah Scott leads Auburn and the SEC in field goal percentage at .724
- Scott was named SEC Freshman of the Week after her first career double-double at Rutgers (21 points, 11 rebounds)
- Scott scored 16 points in Auburn's comeback win over Louisiana-Lafayette
- Honesty Scott-Grayson leads the Tigers with 16.3 points/game
- Scott-Grayson led Auburn with 14 points in the season opening win vs. Jacksonville State, then scored season-highs in back-to-back games with 18 points against both Rutgers and California
- Mar'Shaun Bostic matched career highs in assists (4) and steals (4) in the opener vs. JSU, then had a career-high 9 rebounds vs. UL-Lafayette
- Taylen Collins had a huge second half in the win over ULL with all nine of her points and 8 of her 14 rebounds coming after halftime
- JaMya Mingo-Young made her Auburn debut with a team-leading 5 assists vs. Cal
- Auburn rallied from 12 points behind to defeat Louisiana-Lafayette on Nov. 9; it was the largest deficit overcome by Auburn since coming back from 14 points down to Ole Miss to win 77-76 in overtime on Jan. 22, 2023
- Three days later, the Tigers were down 13 at Rutgers in the first quarter and went on a 41-5 run over the next 15 minutes to take as much as a 23-point lead; Auburn would win 76-56
- Eight players made their Auburn debuts in the win over Jacksonville State - Collins, Scott, Milton, Sumbane, Eddins, Gaines, Young and Thurnan
- Auburn is 43-10 all-time in season openers and 30-4 when playing its first game of the season at home
- Auburn has won 44 of its last 45 home openers
- Auburn is in its 53rd season of women's basketball and has 981 program wins
- Auburn won two exhibitions in late October/early November, beating West Georgia 77-49 and Columbus State 94-65
- Collins led Auburn with 15 points in the West Georgia exhibition
- Sophomore Kaitlyn Duhon had a double-double with 10 points, 10 rebounds and 6 steals in the Columbus State exhibition
- Auburn returns two starters and six letterwinners from the 2022-23 season; the Tigers welcome eight newcomers and one redshirt for this season
- Johnnie Harris is in her third season as head coach at Auburn
- In SEC preseason polls, Auburn was picked to finish 12th by both the media and the league's coaches

- » Trailing by a dozen after three quarters, Mar'Shaun Bostic's steal and layup cut the Bears' lead to 10 to start the fourth quarter but Auburn would get no closer.
- » Auburn outscored Cal 29-2 in bench points but a trio of Bears starters produced at a high enough level to negate the Tigers' depth advantage. Auburn 86, UCF 46**

- » Honesty Scott-Grayson scored 22 points, and the Auburn women's basketball team steamrolled past previously unbeaten UCF 86-46 Saturday afternoon at Neville Arena.
- » The Tigers dominated all phases of the game, using a smothering defense to hold the Knights to their lowest scoring total of the season while securing its largest margin of victory in 2022-23.
- » Scott-Grayson led the Tigers in scoring for the fourth straight game, scoring 20-plus for the third time in those four contests. Mar'Shaun Bostic scored a career-high 10 points on 4-of-4 shooting; she also had two rebounds, one assist and one steal. Sydney Shaw and Jakayla Johnson came up

just short of double-figures with nine and eight points, respectively. Sania Wells made her first start of the season and recorded a team-leading three blocks along with three assists and two steals.

- » Auburn shot 47.8 percent from the floor (33-69) and hit 6-of-13 3-point attempts (46.2%). Meanwhile, the Knights were held to a season-low 22.4 percent night and did not hit a 3-pointer; it's the second straight opponent Auburn has held scoreless from long range. Auburn also controlled the boards, pulling down a season-high 51 rebounds to UCF's 33, and the Tigers' relentless ball pressure forced UCF into 18 turnovers while holding the Knights without a single assist on the day.

AUBURN-UCF SERIES

- » This is the third meeting between Auburn and UCF in women's basketball. The Tigers have won the previous two meetings, both in Auburn. This will be the first meeting between the teams in Orlando.

SCOUTING THE KNIGHTS

- » UCF is 2-0 after wins over Bethune-Cookman and Division II Anderson the first two weeks of the season.
- » In those two games, UCF is averaging 98.5 points while allowing 68.0 per game.
- » Last season, UCF finished 14-15 overall and 4-11 in American Athletic Conference play. This is UCF's first season as a member of the Big 12.
- » Indiana transfer Kaitlin Peterson leads UCF with 24.5 points/game. Achol Akot averages 10.5 points and 10.0 rebounds.

SCOUTING AUBURN

- » Auburn is 3-1 after wins over Jacksonville State and Louisiana-Lafayette at home, a road win at Rutgers, and a home loss to Cal to open the season.
- » Graduate student Honesty Scott-Grayson led the Tigers with 14 point in the opener vs. JSU, then hit two clutch 3-pointers late in the win over UL-Lafayette and finished with 15 points. Her season-high came in her "homecoming" game at Rutgers Nov. 12 when she scored 18 points. She leads the team with 16.3 points/game and also averages 6.5 rebounds and 2.7 assists.
- » Freshman Savannah Scott has been a force under the basket through the early part of the season, averaging 13.0 points and a team-high 7.3 rebounds. She led the Tigers with 16 points in the win over ULL, then posted her first career double-double with 21 points and 11 rebounds in the win at Rutgers. At 6-4, she adds much-needed size in the post, as do fellow freshmen Timya Thurman (6-5) and Yakiya Milton (6-4) along with sophomore Oyindamola Akinbolawa (6-5).
- » Sophomore Sydney Shaw scored 10 points in the comeback win over UL-Lafayette last Thursday, then matched that with 10 at Rutgers Sunday. She is fourth on the team with 8.3 points/game. Shaw started 25 games last season, averaging 7.6 points, and 2.6 rebounds. Possibly the Tigers' best pure shooter, she moves from playing significant minutes at point guard last year to mostly at the 2-guard spot this season, although she has run the point at times in the first four games.
- » Senior Taylen Collins had a huge second half to spark the comeback win over UL-Lafayette on Nov. 9 with all nine of her points and 8 of 14

rebounds coming after halftime. She averages 6.8 points and 6.8 rebounds through three games. Collins, a transfer from Oklahoma State, was fourth in the Big 12 in rebounding last year with 9.5 points and 9.1 rebounds per game.

» Junior Mar'Shaun Bostic had a huge game in the opener with 12 points, 4 assists, 4 steals and 3 rebounds. She was a breakout star in the Tigers' final game of the season last year, scoring a career-high 23 points in the WNIT second round matchup at Clemson. She played in all 31 games last year, averaging 5.6 points and 1.9 rebounds. Bostic, one of the fastest players in the SEC, looks to play significant minutes at point guard and can be one of the SEC's top defenders.

» Sophomore Kaitlyn Duhon started the season off with a bang, scoring 13 points along with 3 rebounds and 2 steals in the opener vs. JSU. In the two exhibition games, she had 6 steals in each and recorded a 10-point, 10-rebound double-double vs. Columbus State.

» Celia Sumbane and McKenna Eddings, both JUCO All-Americans last season, have played significant minutes in the first three games. They both had their best games at Rutgers as Eddings had 4 points, 3 rebounds, 3 assists, a steal and a block in 24 minutes of action, and Sumbane was a beast at both ends of the floor with 5 points, 2 rebounds, 3 steals, 2 assists and 2 blocks. Eddings made her first Division I start vs. California.

» JaMya Mingo-Young (Alabama/Mississippi State) averaged 5.4 points and 4.4 rebounds in 14 games at Alabama before missing the second half of the season with injury; in 2021-22, she started all 34 games and averaged 11.6 points, 6.7 rebounds, 2.5 assists and finished second in the SEC with 80 steals. She made her Auburn debut with a team-leading 5 assists vs. Cal after missing the first three games with injury.

» DeWanna Bonner, a 2009 Auburn graduate, completed her 14th season in the WNBA in 2023, her fourth with the Connecticut Sun. A five-time WNBA All-Star, Bonner helped lead the Sun to the WNBA semifinals, where they fell to the Las Vegas Aces.

» Former Tiger Charlene Thomas-Swinson, who played at Auburn from 1984-87, was an assistant coach for the Las Vegas Aces, who won the 2022 and 2023 WNBA title.

» Unique Thompson, a 2021 graduate, is currently playing for Nadezhda Orenburg in Russia. Thompson was the No. 19 pick in the 2021 WNBA Draft by the Indiana Fever, and she signed a training camp contract with the Dallas Wings in 2022, but has not played in a WNBA regular-season game.

» Auburn women's basketball will retire DeWanna Bonner's No. 24 prior to the Auburn-Alabama game on Sunday, Jan. 21.

» Bonner is Auburn's all-time leading scorer with 2,162 points and third in career rebounds with 1,047. She was the 2009 SEC Player of the Year and a two-time All-American.

» Bonner's No. 24 will be the fifth jersey retired by Auburn women's basketball, joining Carolyn Jones (No. 21), Ruthie Bolton (No. 25), Becky Jackson (No. 34) and Vickie Orr (No. 50).

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

» Two top in-state prospects signed National Letters of Intent with Auburn during the early signing period in November.

» The Tigers will welcome Jordan Hunter (5-8, G, Trussville, Ala./Hewitt-Trussville HS) and Syriah Daniels (6-0, G, Auburn, Ala./Auburn HS) to the Plains for the 2024-25 season. Daniels is the daughter of Marquis Daniels, former Auburn men's basketball player and current director of player development, and the late Shana Askew Daniels, a

former Auburn women's basketball standout.

» Auburn players, coaches and staff took an 11-day trip to Europe in August, visiting four countries with overnight stays in Paris; Montreux, Switzerland; and Nice, France. The Tigers played a game in each location, winning all three.

Third Season at Auburn • 25th Season in college coaching

Pine Bluff, Ark. • Arkansas Baptist, 1996

Johnnie Harris enters her third year as head coach for Auburn women's basketball in 2023-24. A long-time Southeastern Conference assistant and 2018 WBCA National Assistant Coach of the Year, Harris was named Auburn women's basketball head coach on April 3, 2021.

In year two at Auburn, Harris led the Tigers to their first winning record and postseason appearance in four years, finishing with a 16-15 overall record and five SEC wins. Auburn won a postseason game for the first time since 2016, defeating Tulane in the WNIT first round. In addition, the Tigers tied a school record for steals in a game with 24 against Samford, defeated Texas A&M for the first time, and won a road game in the SEC for the first time since the 2019-20 season.

Her first season on the Plains saw Auburn double its win total from the previous season and pick up three victories over nationally ranked opponents. Her first top-25 win came Nov. 21 with a 59-51 win at Georgia Tech, Auburn's first road win over a ranked foe since 2014. The biggest win of the season, and one of Auburn's biggest in decades, came Jan. 27 when the Tigers shocked No. 4 Tennessee 71-61 at home for their first SEC win of the season and their first win over a top-5 opponent since 1997. The Tigers added one more top-25 win, a 65-60 victory over No. 21 Georgia on Feb. 20. Sophomore Aicha Coulibaly was named to the All-SEC Second Team, and the Tigers landed a consensus top-25 recruiting class for 2022-23.

Prior to her arrival at Auburn, Harris spent 16 years combined at Arkansas, Texas A&M and Mississippi State, and spent the 2020-21 season as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Texas. She helped Texas to an Elite Eight appearance during the 2020-21 season, and she worked alongside Longhorn head coach Vic Schaefer the previous 10 years assisting Mississippi State to a pair of NCAA Championship game appearances. She was a central part of Mississippi State's success those eight seasons and is considered one of the nation's top recruiters.

Harris helped lead Mississippi State to a 221-62 [.781] record and five NCAA Tournament berths, including NCAA Championship Game appearances in 2017 and 2018. During that time, the Bulldogs also won the program's first Southeastern Conference regular-season championship and SEC Tournament Championship.

Harris' pupils in the past were some of the best in Mississippi State school history, led by Teaira McCowan, who Harris mentored during McCowan's record-setting junior and senior campaigns from 2017-19. The 2019 SEC Player of the Year and a consensus First-Team All-American, McCowan finished her career as Mississippi State's leader in rebounds and field-goal percentage, while ranking second in blocks and fourth in points and field-goals made.

The individual development McCowan showed during Mississippi State's run to a second consecutive national title game caught the attention of the coaching community, as Harris was tabbed the WBCA National Assistant Coach of the Year for the 2017-18 season.

In 2018-19, Harris helped transfer forward Anriel Howard combine with McCowan to create one of the best front courts in the country. In her lone season with the Bulldogs, Howard earned first-team All-SEC recognition by the AP and league coaches after averaging 16.4 points and 8.4 rebounds per game. Both McCowan [No. 3, Indiana Fever] and Howard [No. 24, Seattle Storm] were selected in the 2019 WNBA Draft.

Another Harris product, Chinwe Okorie, was an integral part of the Bulldogs' runs to the Final Four and 2016 Sweet 16 and finished her MSU career sixth in program annals in field-goal percentage, shooting 52.1 percent over 109 games. She raised her scoring average and field goal percentage each season of her three-year career, capped by her 7.5 ppg average on 56.4 percent shooting as a senior.

Harris helped guide Texas A&M to four Sweet 16 appearances in her five seasons, including the program's first national championship in 2010-11. During her tenure with the Aggies, Harris helped sign and mentor junior college All-Americans Danielle Adams and Tanisha Smith.

Prior to her stop in College Station, Harris spent three seasons at Arkansas, landing some of the Lady Razorbacks' top recruiting classes in program history. She signed Laura Ervin, a junior college All-American who went on to garner Second Team All-SEC accolades, as well as Freshman All-SEC selection Donica Cosby.

Harris has had the opportunity to learn from some of the game's top coaches, including Hall of Famer Kay Yow at N.C. State. She joined the program in the 2003-04 season and assisted the squad to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in two years. Her first recruiting class in Raleigh was rated as one of the best in the nation. She also garnered a commitment from Gillian Goring, the nation's No. 1 post player who went on to play for the Washington Mystics.

The Arkansas-Fort Smith position kept the Pine Bluff native in her home state after she started her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Little Rock. Her hard work at UALR earned her a promotion to a full-time assistant position in 2000.

Harris is the mother of two children, Marcus and Kiera, and the legal guardian of Lily. She also has two grandchildren, Samarah and Kaiden.

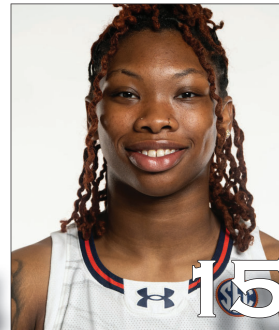
