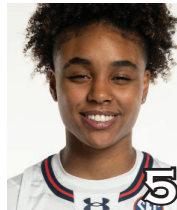

Auburn Women's Basketball Quick Hitters

- Auburn is 42-10 all-time in season openers and 29-4 when playing its first game of the season at home
- Auburn has won 43 of its last 44 home openers
- Auburn is in its 53rd season of women's basketball and has 978 program wins
- This is the 17th meeting between Auburn and Jacksonville State in women's basketball
- Auburn is 12-0 against the Gamecocks, including a 3-0 mark at Neville Arena
- The Tigers are 37-9 against current members of Conference USA
- Auburn's last meeting with Jacksonville State came in 2019, a 62-53 win for the Tigers at home
- This is the third time Auburn has faced Jacksonville State in a season-opener (1996, 1999)
- Nov. 6 is the earliest season-opener for Auburn; the Tigers also played on this date in 2018 and 2019
- Auburn won two exhibitions last week, defeating West Georgia 77-49 and Columbus State XX-XX
- Senior transfer Taylen Collins led Auburn with 15 points in the West Georgia win
- Auburn returns two starters and six letterwinners from the 2022-23 season; the Tigers welcome eight newcomers and one redshirt for this season
- Graduate student Honesty Scott-Grayson is Auburn's leading returner in scoring (12.7 ppg), rebounding (3.6/game), steals (2.3/game) and blocks (0.5/game)
- Sophomore Sydney Shaw is Auburn's leading returner in assists (2.3/game) but will primarily play at the 2-guard position this season
- Taylen Collins averaged 9 points and 9 rebounds as a junior last year at Oklahoma State
- Johnnie Harris is in her third season as head coach at Auburn
- In SEC preseason polls, Auburn was picked to finish 12th by both the media and the league's coaches
- Auburn finished 16-15 overall last year, 5-11 in SEC play, and advanced to the second round of the WNIT
- Auburn is in its 53rd year of varsity women's basketball and has 978 program wins

- » A 20-point night for Honesty Scott-Grayson and a double-double for Kaitlyn Duhon led Auburn to a 94-65 women's basketball exhibition victory over Columbus State Thursday night at Neville Arena.
- » Scott-Grayson led the Tigers with 20 points in just under 20 minutes of action. She also tied for the team lead with five assists to go along with four rebounds and a steal. Duhon was a force on both ends of the floor. She recorded a double-double with 10 points – all in the fourth quarter – and 10 rebounds to go along with six steals and three assists.
- » Three other Tigers hit for double-digits on the night. Mar'Shaun Bostic scored 13 points along with seven rebounds and five assists, Sydney Shaw had 12 points, and Celia Sumbane added 11 points with three steals. Oyindamola Akinbolawa contributed eight points in just eight minutes of action, along with three rebounds and a pair of steals.

- » Auburn senior Daisa Alexander scored her 1,000th career point as the Tigers closed out non-conference play with a 62-53 win over Jacksonville State at Auburn Arena.
- » The Tigers forced a season-high 27 turnovers, turning those into 27 points, and controlled the paint throughout. Auburn never trailed and led by

as many as 18 in the fourth quarter before a late 3-point barrage from the Gamecocks cut the final margin to single digits.

- » Junior Unique Thompson kept her nation-leading double-double streak alive with a 20-point, 10-rebound effort, grabbing her final rebound with less than two minutes to play for her 11th straight double-double. Brooke Moore added 11 points and Kiyae' White pulled down eight rebounds to aid the Tiger effort.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE

- » Jacksonville State finished 16-14 overall last season, 9-9 in Atlantic Sun Conference play. The Gamecocks are in their first season in Conference USA, making the transition to the FBS level prior to the 2023-24 school year.
- » The Gamecocks were picked to finish eighth in CUSA in a vote of the league's coaches.
- » Last year, JSU averaged 62.5 points per game while holding opponents to 57.9. The Gamecocks were 34th nationally in scoring defense and had the 12th-fewest turnovers per game with 12.3.
- » Keiara Griffin is JSU's leading returner in every offensive and defensive category. Six players return from last year's squad along with seven newcomers.

SCOUTING AUBURN

- » Auburn returns two starters and six total letterwinners from 2022-23, when the Tigers finished 16-15 overall, 5-11 in SEC play. Auburn made its first postseason appearance and secured its first winning record since 2019 last season, when they advanced to the second round of the WNIT.
- » Graduate student Honesty Scott-Grayson is Auburn's leading returning scorer, averaging 12.7 points, 3.6 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 2.3 steals last season as a redshirt senior. She started 27 games last season and was Auburn's top 3-point shooter, hitting 45-of-122 attempts (36.9%). She also finished third in the SEC in steals per game with 2.3.
- » Scott-Grayson enters her final year at Auburn with 1,065 career points, good for 34th all-time in program history.
- » Sophomore Sydney Shaw started 25 games last season, averaging 7.6 points, and 2.6 rebounds. Possibly the Tigers' best pure shooter, she moves from playing significant minutes at point guard last year to exclusively at the 2-guard spot this season. She was second on the team in 3-point shooting last year, hitting 40-of-118 (33.9%) from deep.
- » Junior Mar'Shaun Bostic was a breakout star in the Tigers' final game of the season, scoring a career-high 23 points in the WNIT second round matchup at Clemson. She played in all 31 games last year, averaging 5.6 points and 1.9 rebounds. Bostic, one of the fastest players in the SEC, looks to play significant minutes at point guard and can be one of the SEC's top defenders.
- » Sophomore Kaitlyn Duhon played in 30 games last season, earning six starts. She averaged 3.8 points and 2.3 rebounds and will likely see significant minutes this season at the 3 or the 4.
- » Eight new players will take the court for Auburn this season - three true freshmen, two junior college transfers and three Division I transfers.
- » Among the Tigers' newcomers, senior Taylen Collins (Oklahoma State) averaged 9.5 points and 9.1 rebounds last year to finish fourth in the Big

TIGERS IN THE PROS

DeWanna Bonner, a 2009 Auburn graduate, completed her 14th season in the WNBA in 2023, her fourth with the Connecticut Sun. A five-time WNBA All-Star, Bonner helped lead the Sun to the WNBA semifinals, where they fell to the Las Vegas Aces.

Former Tiger Charlene Thomas-Swinson, who played at Auburn from 1984-87, was an assistant coach for the Las Vegas Aces, who won the 2022

and 2023 WNBA title.

Unique Thompson, a 2021 graduate, is currently playing for Nadezhda Orenburg in Russia. Thompson was the No. 19 pick in the 2021 WNBA Draft by the Indiana Fever, and she signed a training camp contract with the Dallas Wings in 2022, but has not played in a WNBA regular-season game.

NO. 24 HEADED TO THE RAFTERS

Auburn women's basketball will retire DeWanna Bonner's No. 24 prior to the Auburn-Alabama game on Sunday, Jan. 21.

Bonner is Auburn's all-time leading scorer with 2,162 points and third in career rebounds with 1,047. She was the 2009 SEC Player of the Year and a two-time All-American.

Bonner's No. 24 will be the fifth jersey retired by Auburn women's basketball, joining Carolyn Jones (No. 21), Ruthie Bolton (No. 25), Becky Jackson (No. 34) and Vickie Orr (No. 50).

IT DIDN'T COUNT, BUT...

The Tigers earned two exhibition wins in the preseason, defeating West Georgia 77-49 and Columbus State 94-65.

In the win over West Georgia on Oct. 30, senior Taylen Collins led four in double figures with 15 points. Celia Sumbane added 14, Honesty Scott-Grayson had 13 and Sydney Shaw added 10. JaMya Mingo-Young was the leading rebounder with 8, and Kaitlyn Duhon had 6 points and 6 steals. Against Columbus State on Nov. 2, Honesty Scott-Grayson led the way with 20 points, and Kaitlyn Duhon had a double-double with 10 points, 10 rebounds and 6 steals.

WORLD TRAVELING TIGERS

Auburn players, coaches and staff took an 11-day trip to Europe in August, visiting four countries with overnight stays in Paris; Montreux, Switzerland; and Nice, France. The Tigers played a game in each location, winning all three.

THIS, THAT AND THE OTHER

Two Tigers are wearing the SEC Graduate patch this season. Honesty Scott-Grayson graduated from Auburn in December 2022, and JaMya Mingo-Young earned her degree at Alabama in 2023 before transferring to the Plains.

Redshirt freshman Audia Young is part of the SEC Women's Basketball Leadership Council.

Young's No. 21 is technically retired, but the previous owner of that number - her mother, Carolyn Jones-Young - granted her permission to wear it at Auburn.

Third Season at Auburn • 25th Season in college coaching

Johnnie Harris enters her third year as head coach for Auburn women's basketball in 2023-24. A long-time Southeastern Conference assistant and 2018 WBCA National Assistant Coach of the Year, Harris was named Auburn women's basketball head coach on April 3, 2021.

In year two at Auburn, Harris led the Tigers to their first winning record and postseason appearance in four years, finishing with a 16-15 overall record and five SEC wins. Auburn won a postseason game for the first time since 2016, defeating Tulane in the WNIT first round. In addition, the Tigers tied a school record for steals in a game with 24 against Samford, defeated Texas A&M for the first time, and won a road game in the SEC for the first time since the 2019-20 season.

Her first season on the Plains saw Auburn double its win total from the previous season and pick up three victories over nationally ranked opponents. Her first top-25 win came Nov. 21 with a 59-51 win at Georgia Tech, Auburn's first road win over a ranked foe since 2014. The biggest win of the season, and one of Auburn's biggest in decades, came Jan. 27 when the Tigers shocked No. 4 Tennessee 71-61 at home for their first SEC win of the season and their first win over a top-5 opponent since 1997. The Tigers added one more top-25 win, a 65-60 victory over No. 21 Georgia on Feb. 20. Sophomore Aicha Coulibaly was named to the All-SEC Second Team, and the Tigers landed a consensus top-25 recruiting class for 2022-23.

Prior to her arrival at Auburn, Harris spent 16 years combined at Arkansas, Texas A&M and Mississippi State, and spent the 2020-21 season as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Texas. She helped Texas to an Elite Eight appearance during the 2020-21 season, and she worked alongside Longhorn head coach Vic Schaefer the previous 10 years assisting Mississippi State to a pair of NCAA Championship game appearances. She was a central part of Mississippi State's success those eight seasons and is considered one of the nation's top recruiters.

Harris helped lead Mississippi State to a 221-62 [.781] record and five NCAA Tournament berths, including NCAA Championship Game appearances in 2017 and 2018. During that time, the Bulldogs also won the program's first Southeastern Conference regular-season championship and SEC Tournament Championship.

Harris' pupils in the past were some of the best in Mississippi State school history, led by Teaira McCowan, who Harris mentored during McCowan's record-setting junior and senior campaigns from 2017-19. The 2019 SEC Player of the Year and a consensus First-Team All-American, McCowan finished her career as Mississippi State's leader in rebounds and field-goal percentage, while ranking second in blocks and fourth in points and field-goals made.

The individual development McCowan showed during Mississippi State's run to a second consecutive national title game caught the attention of the coaching community, as Harris was tabbed the WBCA National Assistant Coach of the Year for the 2017-18 season.

In 2018-19, Harris helped transfer forward Anriel Howard combine with McCowan to create one of the best front courts in the country. In her lone season with the Bulldogs, Howard earned first-team All-SEC recognition by the AP and league coaches after averaging 16.4 points and 8.4 rebounds per game. Both McCowan [No. 3, Indiana Fever] and Howard [No. 24, Seattle Storm] were selected in the 2019 WNBA Draft.

Another Harris product, Chinwe Okorie, was an integral part of the Bulldogs' runs to the Final Four and 2016 Sweet 16 and finished her MSU career sixth in program annals in field-goal percentage, shooting 52.1 percent over 109 games. She raised her scoring average and field goal percentage each season of her three-year career, capped by her 7.5 ppg average on 56.4 percent shooting as a senior.

Harris helped guide Texas A&M to four Sweet 16 appearances in her five seasons, including the program's first national championship in 2010-11. During her tenure with the Aggies, Harris helped sign and mentor junior college All-Americans Danielle Adams and Tanisha Smith.

Prior to her stop in College Station, Harris spent three seasons at Arkansas, landing some of the Lady Razorbacks' top recruiting classes in program history. She signed Laura Ervin, a junior college All-American who went on to garner Second Team All-SEC accolades, as well as Freshman All-SEC selection Donica Cosby.

Harris has had the opportunity to learn from some of the game's top coaches, including Hall of Famer Kay Yow at N.C. State. She joined the program in the 2003-04 season and assisted the squad to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in two years. Her first recruiting class in Raleigh was rated as one of the best in the nation. She also garnered a commitment from Gillian Goring, the nation's No. 1 post player who went on to play for the Washington Mystics.

The Arkansas-Fort Smith position kept the Pine Bluff native in her home state after she started her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Little Rock. Her hard work at UALR earned her a promotion to a full-time assistant position in 2000.

Harris is the mother of two children, Marcus and Kiera, and the legal guardian of Lily. She also has two grandchildren, Samarah and Kaiden.

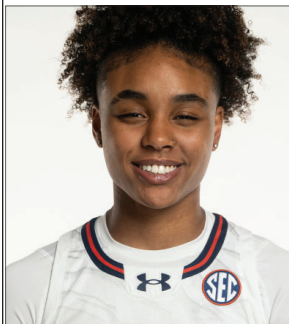

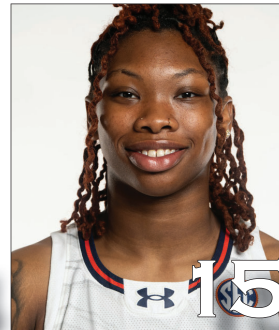

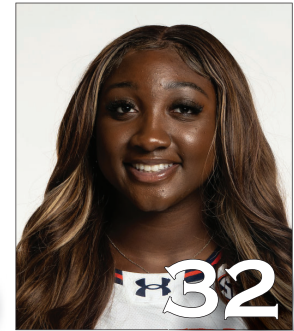
