Postgame Football Notes — San Diego State vs. Air Force

SDCCU Stadium | San Diego, Calif.

Streaks Extended

- San Diego State won its fifth consecutive game overall, tied for the 10th-longest active streak nationally.
- The Aztecs won their sixth straight Mountain West game, tied for the sixth-longest active win streak in conference games.
- SDSU won its sixth straight home game, tied for the 14th-longest active streak.
- San Diego State won its fifth straight game when playing a team exactly six days after another game (9-1 in last 10 games).
- The Aztecs claimed their eighth straight victory over Air Force, which is longest active win streak in the nation against the Falcons and longest win streak against AFA since Notre Dame won eight straight from 1986-95.
- SDSU won its 11th straight Friday home game (last home Friday loss was Nov. 20, 1970 against Long Beach State). San Diego State improved to 14-3 in the Division I era in games played on Friday.

Rocky Long Notes

- Rocky Long now has 12 career victories against Air Force, which is the most wins against the Falcons by any active coach in FBS, six more than any other active coach.
- This marked Rocky Long's 99th game as the head coach at San Diego State. He is 69-30 (.697) since taking over the program in 2011 and amazingly 44-13 (.772) in conference play (46-13 (.780) if you count the conference championship games).
- Rocky Long recorded his 20th second-half comeback victory since he took over in 2011, the most in school history (No. 2 is Claude Gilbert at 13).

Team Notes

- SDSU has won 17 of its last 21 games (17-4), 23 of its last 29 games (23-6), 36 of its last 43 games (36-7) and 37 since the 2015 season (37-10).
- The Aztecs improved to 24-4 in their last 28 regular-season Mountain West games and 26-4 in their last 30 against Mountain West opponents (includes MW championship games).
- Kaelin Himphill blocked a punt in the second quarter, SDSU's first since Kameron Kelly blocked one against UNLV on Sept. 27, 2014.
- Trenton Thompson recovered a blocked punt for a touchdown in the second quarter, SDSU's first since Freddy Keiaho did so against New Mexico on Oct. 22, 2005.
- San Diego State now has 20 special teams touchdowns (14 kick return, five punt return and one punt block) in the Rocky Long era (since 2011).
- SDSU was outrushed for the first time this season (AFA 214, SDSU 84).
- The Aztecs won a game with less than 100 rushing yards for the first time since beating Boise State, 34-31, in overtime on Nov. 23, 2013.

- San Diego State allowed its first run this year of more than 16 yards. The Aztecs entered the weekend as one of three teams who had yet to allow a 20-yard run.
- The Aztecs had a season-high 75 tackles, surpassing their previous best of 68, which occurred the last two outings vs. Eastern Michigan and at Boise State.
- SDSU's 43 unassisted tackles tied a season high (vs. Arizona State).
- San Diego State held Air Force to a season-low 17 points. The Falcons' previous season low was 25 points vs. Nevada on Sept. 29.

Trends

- SDSU started with the ball for the 77th time in the last 90 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 149 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 270).
- SDSU held its opponent scoreless on its opening drive for the 36th time over the last 44 games and for the 37th time since 2015 (47 games).
- San Diego State improved to 4-1 on the season and 51-14 in the Rocky Long era when scoring first.
- The Aztecs improved to 2-1 on the season and 44-9 in the Rocky era when leading after the first quarter.
- The Aztecs won their 13h straight game when leading at the half, and improved to 4-0 this year and 49-9 in the Rocky Long era when leading at the half.
- SDSU improved to 3-0 on the season and 59-11 in the Rocky Long era when leading after three quarters.
- San Diego State improved to 4-0 on the season and 21-9 in the Rocky Long era in games decided by seven or less points. .
- The Aztecs won their 34th consecutive game when holding their opponent to 24 or less points (57-4 in the Rocky Long era) and 28th straight game when holding their opponent to 17 or less points (43-1 in the Rocky Long era).
- SDSU is now 33-4 since the start of the 2015 season when holding an opponent below 400 yards. Air Force had 276 yards of offense.
- San Diego State improved to 29-4 the last 33 times it has committed one turnover or less.
- The Aztecs have one turnover or less in 14 of their last 18 games.

Series Notes

- San Diego State improved to 17-19 all-time against Air Force.
- The Aztecs won their school-record eighth straight game in the series, which is the longest active win streak against the Academy.
- \bullet SDSU improved to 10-7 all-time against the Falcons in San Diego.
- The Aztecs improved to 11-7 against AFA since both teams joined the Mountain West in 1999, including an 11-4 record over the last 15 meetings.
- SDSU held Air Force to its lowest point total in the series since allowing 14 points in a 2014 match-up in San Diego.
- The Aztecs have outscored the Falcons by a total of just 11 points over their last three wins in the series.

Player Notes

- * Chase Jasmin, So., RB (18 att., 70 yds., 1 TD)
 - Rushed for 70 yards and a touchdown on 18 attempts.
 - Led the team in rushing for the third straight game.
 - Recorded his third rushing touchdown of the season and fifth of his career.
 - Has a touchdown in two straight games for the first time of his career.

* Ryan Agnew, Jr., QB (9-for-25, 213 yds., 1 TD, 1 INT | 4 att., 4 yds.)

- Threw for a career-high 213 yards and passed for a touchdown.
- Improved to 4-0 as the starting quarterback.

- Recorded his third second-half comeback to win on the season.
- Had a career-long 32-yard run.
- Now has four touchdowns on the season.

* Parker Houston, Jr., TE (2 rec., 37 yds., 1 TD)

- Caught his second touchdown of the season and third of his career.
- His two touchdowns this season is a single-season career high.
- Tied his single-game career high with two receptions.
- Established a career high with 37 yards receiving.

* Fred Trevillion, Sr., WR (3 rec., 94 yds.)

- Had a season-high 94 yards receiving, surpassing his previous best of 57 yards at Boise State.
- His three receptions tied a single-game career high.
- Has increased his receiving yards total the last three games (40, 57, 94).
- Now has 12 catches on the season, tying his 2017 total.

* Tim Wilson Jr., So., WR (3 rec., 50 yds.)

- Had a career-high 50 receiving yards on a career-high-tying three receptions.
- Caught his first pass since the game vs. Arizona State.
- Started for the first time since the 2017 opener against UC Davis on Sept. 2.

* Kyahva Tezino, Jr., LB (15 tackles, 1 TFL, 1 PBU, 1 QBH)

- Had a game- and season-high 15 tackles, including 10 solo stops. His previous season best was 11 at Stanford.
- The 15 tackles were the second most of his career (17 vs. Army West Point on Dec. 23, 2017).
- Recorded his second double-digit tackle game of the season and fourth of his career (all over his last eight games played).
- Led the team in tackles for the eighth time of his career, all of which have come over his last 11 outings.
- Had his first pass breakup, his first since Nov. 18, 2017, vs. Nevada.

* Parker Baldwin, Sr., S (9 tackles, 1 TFL, 1 INT, 1 PBU)

- Recorded his first interception of his career in the fourth quarter.
- He has five interceptions in his career and at least one in every season in which he has seen action.
- Tied a season high with his one pass breakup.

Other Notes

- CB Ron Smith started for the 25th consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 47th straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- SDSU's captains tonight were K John Baron II (fifth time this year), DT Noble Hall (third time this year), LB Ronley Lakalaka (third time this year) and FB Chad Woolsey (second time this year).
- WR Kobe Smith had a career-long 32-yard catch.
- Tonight's temperature was 67 degrees.
- The game was delayed a total of 1 hour, 7 minutes because of lightning in the area, starting at 8:22 p.m. PT.
- Tonight's attendance was 25,326.
- Tonight's Honor Warrior was Travis Hitt (1973-76), who was inducted into the Aztec Hall of Fame earlier in the day.
