### Postgame Football Notes – San Diego State at Nevada

**October 27, 2018**

**Mackay Stadium | Reno, Nev.**

#### Streaks Broken

- 6-game winning streak
- 7-game conference winning streak
- 8-game road winning streak against West Division opponents. SDSU's last road loss to a Mountain West, West Division team prior to tonight was a 30-14 setback at Nevada on Nov. 1, 2014.
- 5-game Mountain West road winning streak (regardless of division)
- 3-game winning streak against Nevada
- 28-game winning streak when recording at least 400 total yards of offense
- 26-game winning streak when holding an opponent to under 300 yards of total offense
- 14-game winning streak when leading at the half
- 13-game winning streak when recording at least 20 first downs

#### Team Notes

- SDSU has still won 18 of its last 23 games (18-5), 24 of its last 31 games (24-7), 37 of its last 45 games (37-8) and 38 since the 2015 season (38-11).
- The Aztecs dropped to 25-5 in their last 30 regular-season Mountain West games and 27-5 in their last 32 against Mountain West opponents (includes MW championship games).
- SDSU dropped to 16-2 in its last 18 games against Mountain West, West Division teams.
- SDSU outrushed its opponent for the seventh time in eight games this season.
- San Diego State had its most points in the first half (24) since leading San Jose State, 35-0, on Nov. 4, 2017.
- The Aztecs had 320 total yards in the first half, eclipsing its game total over each of the three previous games (293 vs. San Jose State, 297 vs. Air Force, 267 at Boise State).
- SDSU allowed 10 points in the third quarter, the first time it has allowed more than eight points in a quarter since the third quarter at No. 13/13 Stanford on Aug. 30. SDSU had gone 27 quarters without allowing more than eight points.
- San Diego State finished with a season-high 456 yards of total offense.

#### Series Notes

- SDSU dropped to 7-4 all-time against Nevada, including a 5-2 mark in Mountain West games.
- The Aztecs dropped to 2-3 on the road at Nevada.

## Trends

- SDSU started with the ball for the 79<sup>th</sup> time in the last 92 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 151 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 273).
- SDSU ran a pass play on its opening drive for the first time this season (eight games).
- San Diego State scored on its opening drive for the second time this season, going 75 yards with four first downs on 12 plays. The Aztecs came into the game averaging 19.4 yards and 0.7 first downs in game-opening drives.
- SDSU held its opponent scoreless on its opening drive for the 38<sup>th</sup> time since 2015 (49 games).
- San Diego State fell to 4-2 this year and 51-15 in the Rocky Long era when scoring first.
- The Aztecs scored 14 points in the first quarter for the first time since scoring 14 vs. Nevada on Nov. 18, 2017.
- SDSU dropped to 2-2 this year and 44-10 in the Rocky Long era when leading after the first quarter.
- San Diego State had their 14-game winning streak snapped when leading at the half, and are now 5-1 this year and 50-10 in the Rocky Long era when leading at the half.
- The Aztecs dropped to 5-1 on the season and 22-10 in the Rocky Long era in games decided by seven or less points.
- SDSU fell to 34-5 since the start of the 2015 season when holding an opponent below 400 yards of total offense. Nevada had 297 yards tonight.

## Player Notes

### \* **Ryan Agnew, Jr., QB (20-for-41, 283 yds., 3 TD)**

- Threw for 283 yards and three touchdowns.
- Set career highs in completions (20), pass attempts (41), passing yards (283) and touchdowns (3).
- The three touchdowns were the most by an Aztec since Christian Chapman threw three vs. Hawai'i on Nov. 5, 2016.
- Threw to a season-high nine different receivers.
- Dropped to 5-1 as the starting quarterback.

### \* **Chase Jasmin, So., RB (16 att., 85 yds. | 3 rec., 14 yds, 1 TD)**

- Rushed for 85 yards on 16 carries (5.3 avg.), while adding three catches for 14 yards and a touchdown.
- Recorded his first career receiving touchdown, fifth overall touchdown this season and seventh overall touchdown of his career.
- Has a touchdown in four straight games for the first time of his career.
- His three catches were a career high.

### \* **Kahale Warring, Jr., TE (6 rec., 95 yds., 2 TD)**

- Caught six passes for 95 yards and two touchdowns.
- Set career highs in receptions (6), receiving yards (95) and touchdown catches (2).
- The touchdown was his first and second of the season and the sixth and seventh of his career.

### \* **Kyahva Tezino, Jr., LB (6 tackles, 2 PBU)**

- Had six tackles and two pass breakups.
- Led the team in tackles for the 10<sup>th</sup> time of his career, all of which have come over his last 13 outings.
- Has 128 tackles and 12 tackles for loss over his last 13 games (first career 13 starts).
- His two PBUs were a career high.

## Other Notes

- CB Ron Smith started for the 27<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 49<sup>th</sup> straight game, the longest streak on the team.

- SDSU's captains tonight were AZ Parker Baldwin (fourth time this year), K John Baron (seventh time this year), DT Noble Hall (fourth time this year) and WR Fred Trevillion (third time this year).
- Tonight's temperature was 68 degrees.
- Tonight's attendance was 14,545.
