News and Notes

NEARING THE END: SDSU plays four of its final six matches of the 2018 season at home, including a pair of home contests this week against Utah State and Boise State. SDSU previously beat both of this week's opponents in road matches in early

LAST TIME AGAINST THE AGGIES &

BRONCOS: The Aztecs earned their first two road conference wins of the season against Utah State and Boise State, defeating the Broncos on Oct. 4 in five sets before winning another match that went the distance, besting the Aggies on Oct. 6.

SDSU took an 8-7 all-time advantage over BSU in the October win while also supplying the Aztecs' first win in Boise since sweeping the Broncos on Oct. 26, 2013. Deja Harris paced the Aztecs with 14 kills, a .458 hitting percentage, and eight blocks.

SDSU's win over Utah State on Oct. 6 gave the Aztecs their fourth consecutive victory. Harris led the Aztecs again, recording 19 kills and eight blocks against the Aggies.

GOOD MONTH OF OCTOBER: After recording a 1-10 record in September, the Aztecs recorded a record of 5-4 in the month of October. Below are some of the major statistical differences between September and October.

GETTING IT DONE AT THE NET: SDSU is third in the Mountain West in total blocks (225) and second in the league in total kills (1,263), leaving SDSU as the only team in the conference to be in both the top three in both categories.

LEADERS IN THE NATION & MOUNTAIN

WEST: Both Deia Harris and Ashlynn Dunbar rank inside the Mountain West's top 10 in multiple statistical categories.

Dunbar's 43 aces also mark as the most by Aztec in a single season since Robyn Gregg recorded 61 in 2002. Gregg, who recorded 76 service aces in 2001 (eighth most for a single season in program history), is the only Aztec in the MW era (since 1999) to have more service aces than Dunbar in a season.

NOVEMBER SUCCESS: The Aztecs are 31-18 in November matches since the 2011 season.

DEFENSE WINS GAMES: In all seven of SDSU's wins this year, the Aztecs have recorded more digs than their opponents. In addition, six of seven wins have come when the Aztecs have had as many or more blocks than their opponents. SDSU's only win this season when having less blocks than their

opponents came on Oct. 20 at Nevada, with the Wolf Pack owning a 7-6 advantage in blocks. On the offensive side, all seven of SDSU's wins have come when recording a hitting percentage of .200 or better.

HARRIS CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOK: Deja Harris has led SDSU in blocks in 19 of a possible 25 matches (including all seven wins) this

possible 25 matches (including all seven wins) this season and has led the Aztecs both offensively and defensively during her final collegiate season.

Among active players in Division I, Harris is sixth with 521 career total blocks, 17th in career blocks per set (1.16), 27th in sets played (450) and 42nd in total kills (1,233).

BALANCED DEFENSIVE EFFORT: San Diego State has had four different players (Ashlynn Dunbar, Sam McGrath, Loren Teter, Lauren Lee) record a 20+ dig game this season and five post a

single-match team-high in digs (also Hannah Turnlund). SDSU has recorded 1,282 digs this season in comparison to 1,230 digs by its opponents, and have four players averaging 2.0 digs per set or more, including Sam McGrath (2.44), Ashlynn Dunbar (2.42), Loren Teter (2.31) and Lauren Lee (2.13).

PRESEASON POLL: For the second consecutive year, SDSU was selected to finish third in the Mountain West in the league's annual preseason poll. Colorado State and Wyoming were selected to finish first and second in the conference, respectively, while Boise State finished in a tie for third place with the Aztecs.

A NEW LOOK: SDSU's roster of 20 is split evenly between 10 returners (eight letter winners, two redshirts) and 10 newcomers (five transfers, five true freshmen).

SDSU's 10 newcomers is the most its had on a roster since having 11 in 2010. SDSU's roster of 20 is tied for the largest roster since Collins-Parker arrived at SDSU, and SDSU's five transfers is the most for an Aztec recruiting class since Collins-Parker's first season on the Mesa.

Deitre COLLINS-PARKER Head Coach - 11th season

Deitre Collins-Parker, a two-time national collegiate player of the year and AVCA Hall of Fame member, was named the head volleyball coach at San Diego State on Jan. 30, 2009. She became just the fourth head coach since the Aztecs began collegiate play in 1976. She replaced Mark Warner, who retired at the end of the 2008 campaign after 13 years at the helm of the women's program.

Collins-Parker directed SDSU to its second consecutive winning season and a fourth-place Mountain West finish in 2017. A quad of Aztecs were named All-MW (Deja Harris, Devyn Pritchard, Baylee Little, Alexis Cage) -- tied for the program's largest number of honorees since the team joined the league in 2000.

During the summer of 2014 she led a Mountain West all-star team on a tour of Europe that concluded with a bronze medal third-place finish at the 2014 European Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia.

In 2012 she led her Aztec squad to a 23-8 mark and a 13-3 ledger in the Mountain West as the Aztecs claimed their first-ever Mountain West title. It was SDSU's best conference record and league finish since the 1996 season and top overall record since 1995. In addition, she produced a pair of All-America honorees (Andrea Hannasch and Johnna Fouch) along with a total of three all-conference selections (Raegan Shelton) and the conference Newcomer of the Year (Michelle Waber).

Collins-Parker arrived at San Diego State after five seasons as the head coach at Cornell, where she led the Big Red to three Ivy League titles and two NCAA tournament appearances. Under her tutelage, the Big Red had seven players named first-team All-Ivy, including two-time Ivy League Player of the Year and honorable mention All-American, Elizabeth Bishop (2007).

Prior to taking over at Cornell in 2004, Collins-Parker spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at UNLV, earning Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1998 after taking a dormant volleyball program and leading the Lady Rebels to a 23-8 record and a WAC tournament semifi nal appearance. Before her stint at UNLV, Collins-Parker served as an assistant coach at South Alabama, Northern Arizona and Houston for one year each. She also has plenty of international coaching experience as well. She served as head coach of the 1998 U.S. junior national team, directing her squad to a gold medal in the national qualifier. She served in the same capacity during the summer of 2000 (silver medal) and 2001 (bronze medal).

A former member of the U.S. national team and a three-time AVCA All-American at the University of Hawai'i, Collins-Parker was the starting middle blocker for the 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul, South Korea, and was an alternate for the 1992 team in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and the 1987 Pan-Am Games.

As a collegian, Collins-Parker was a two-time Broderick Award honoree as the national player of the year (1983, 1984) after leading the Rainbow Wahine to consecutive national titles and a 110-5 record in her final three seasons. Collins capped off her career by becoming the first volleyball player to be awarded the Broderick Cup recipient, given to the nation's best collegiate athlete in all sports. She was twice named to the NCAA all-tournament team and still holds the record for solo blocks in one NCAA tournament (15 in 1982). She was one of six players named to the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball 25th Anniversary Team in October 2005. Collins-Parker went on to compete at the national level and

played in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games and was also an alternate for the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and 1987 Pan-Am Games. She played professionally in the Italian League (1988-89) and the French League (1989-91), capturing the French League Championship twice and the European Cup of Champions in 1990.

Collins-Parker received the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award during the 2009 NCAA Convention in Washington, D.C. The award honors former student-athletes who successfully completed collegiate careers in various sports and have excelled in their chosen professions on their 25th anniversary of completing their athletic eligibility. Collins-Parker was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in the fall of 2008. She currently serves as a member of the AVCA Board of Directors and the chairperson on the AVCA Minority Coaches Committee. She currently has membership with the AVCA, Coaches Accreditation Program, Kaepa Gold Medal Clinics, Black Coaches Association, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes. A 1995 graduate of Hawai'i with a bachelor of arts in broadcast communications, Collins-Parker is a member of the USA Volleyball Coachina Accreditation Program and is a CAP level III accredited coach.
