News and Notes

CAPPING OFF 2018: San Diego State wraps up its 2018 season this weekend, hosting Nevada on Thursday at 6:00 p.m. before hosting Senior Night against San Jose State on Saturday at 6:00 p.m. SDSU will honor its lone senior, Deja Harris, in a pregame ceremony on Saturday. Harris, a threetime All-Mountain West honoree with a chance to be the program's first-ever four-time all-MW selection, concludes her career as one of the most decorated players in program history.

SDSU held a 2-1 lead at SJSU earlier this season, but ultimately fell in five sets, 25-17, 22-25, 25-19, 14-25, 12-15. Four different Aztecs posted double-digit kill totals against the Spartans, including Deja Harris (16), Ashlynn Dunbar (14), Hannah Turnlund (12), and Erin Gillcrist (10). SDSU is 5-1 in its last six home matches against SJSU.

Following the SJSU loss, SDSU responded with a four-set win over Nevada, where Erin Gillcrist (15 kills, .429 hit%) and Deja Harris (15 kills, .393 hit%) paced the offense. Ashlynn Dunbar recorded a double double against the Wolf Pack, logging 10 kills and 13 digs. SDSU enters this week having won seven in a row against Nevada.

DEJA HARRIS: Deja Harris concludes a stellar collegiate career this weekend, being a centerpiece for the SDSU volleyball program since her arrival. Harris, who is a three-time all-Mountain West selection, currently stands second in program history in career block assists (473 - seven away from tying Jennifer Miller's (1989-92) record of 480), seventh in block points (307.5), and eighth in career hitting percentage (.320). Her 136

block assists this season are ninth most in a single season at SDSU and Harris' 1266 career kills currently lead all active players in the Mountain West. Harris' total of 269 block assists over the last two years is the second most over a two-year span in program history (Jennifer Miller - 285 in 1989-90).

Among all active Division I players, Harris is fourth with 546 career total blocks, 16th in blocks per set with 1.17, 25th in sets played with 465, and 44th with 1,266 kills.

This season. Harris is seventh in the nation with 157 total blocks. Harris is also sixth in the Mountain West in hitting percentage (.316) and sixth in points per set (3.92), being the only player in the Mountain West to rank inside the top six in both categories.

COMEBACK KIDS AT NEW MEXICO: SDSU

pulled off its biggest comeback road win in nearly five years on Saturday, rallying from a 2-0 deficit to defeat New Mexico in Albuquerque in five sets. It marks as the first time SDSU has rallied from a 2-0 hole on the road since Nov. 27, 2013 when the Aztecs did so against Colorado State in Fort Collins. The win for SDSU, which was led by Deja Harris (17 kills, eight blocks) and Ashlynn Dunbar (19 kills), improved SDSU's record to 6-1 in their last seven matches against the Lobos.

The win was SDSU's second of the season when losing the first set.

LOOKING TO EXTEND THE STREAK: With a pair of wins this weekend, SDSU would solidify its

ninth consecutive season with a conference record of .500 or better. Entering this season, SDSU is one of two Mountain West teams to have league records of .500 or better in each of the last eight seasons. The Aztecs are joined by only Colorado State.

TURNING THINGS AROUND: Since starting the 2018 season 1-14, SDSU has gone 8-6 in their last 14 matches. Below is a statistical comparison between the team's first 15 matches of the season and the team's last 14 matches.

TETER LEADING THE BACK ROW: Loren Teter has emerged as one of SDSU's defensive leaders late in the season, owning a team-best 3.40 digs per set over the team's last seven matches. Over SDSU's last seven matches, Teter has either led the team or tied for the team lead in digs in six times.

IN IT TIL THE END: SDSU played in its 10th five-set match of the season on Saturday at New Mexico, tying the program record for most five-set matches in a single season (also had 10 five-set matches in 2012 and 2016). SDSU is 5-5 in five-set

matches this year, tied for the third most five-set wins in a single season in program history.

NOVEMBER SUCCESS: The Aztecs are 33-20 (.622) in November matches since the 2011 season.

Dunbar's 47 aces also mark as the most by Aztec in a single season since Robyn Gregg recorded 61 in 2002. Gregg, who recorded 76 service aces in 2001 (eighth most for a single season in program history), is the only Aztec in the MW era (since 1999) to have more service aces than Dunbar in a season.

Deitre COLLINS-PARKER Head Coach - 11th season

Deitre Collins-Parker, a two-time national collegiate player of the year and AVCA Hall of Fame member, was named the head volleyball coach at San Diego State on Jan. 30, 2009. She became just the fourth head coach since the Aztecs began collegiate play in 1976. She replaced Mark Warner, who retired at the end of the 2008 campaign after 13 years at the helm of the women's program.

Collins-Parker directed SDSU to its second consecutive winning season and a fourth-place Mountain West finish in 2017. A quad of Aztecs were named All-MW (Deja Harris, Devyn Pritchard, Baylee Little, Alexis Cage) -- tied for the program's largest number of honorees since the team joined the league in 2000.

During the summer of 2014 she led a Mountain West all-star team on a tour of Europe that concluded with a bronze medal third-place finish at the 2014 European Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia.

In 2012 she led her Aztec squad to a 23-8 mark and a 13-3 ledger in the Mountain West as the Aztecs claimed their first-ever Mountain West title. It was SDSU's best conference record and league finish since the 1996 season and top overall record since 1995. In addition, she produced a pair of All-America honorees (Andrea Hannasch and Johnna Fouch) along with a total of three all-conference selections (Raegan Shelton) and the conference Newcomer of the Year (Michelle Waber).

Collins-Parker arrived at San Diego State after five seasons as the head coach at Cornell, where she led the Big Red to three Ivy League titles and two NCAA tournament appearances. Under her tutelage, the Big Red had seven players named first-team All-Ivy, including two-time Ivy League Player of the Year and honorable mention All-American, Elizabeth Bishop (2007).

Prior to taking over at Cornell in 2004, Collins-Parker spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at UNLV, earning Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1998 after taking a dormant volleyball program and leading the Lady Rebels to a 23-8 record and a WAC tournament semifi nal appearance. Before her stint at UNLV, Collins-Parker served as an assistant coach at South Alabama, Northern Arizona and Houston for one year each. She also has plenty of international coaching experience as well. She served as head coach of the 1998 U.S. junior national team, directing her squad to a gold medal in the national qualifier. She served in the same capacity during the summer of 2000 (silver medal) and 2001 (bronze medal).

A former member of the U.S. national team and a three-time AVCA All-American at the University of Hawai'i, Collins-Parker was the starting middle blocker for the 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul, South Korea, and was an alternate for the 1992 team in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and the 1987 Pan-Am Games.

As a collegian, Collins-Parker was a two-time Broderick Award honoree as the national player of the year (1983, 1984) after leading the Rainbow Wahine to consecutive national titles and a 110-5 record in her final three seasons. Collins capped off her career by becoming the first volleyball player to be awarded the Broderick Cup recipient, given to the nation's best collegiate athlete in all sports. She was twice named to the NCAA all-tournament team and still holds the record for solo blocks in one NCAA tournament (15 in 1982). She was one of six players named to the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball 25th Anniversary Team in October 2005. Collins-Parker went on to compete at the national level and

played in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games and was also an alternate for the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and 1987 Pan-Am Games. She played professionally in the Italian League (1988-89) and the French League (1989-91), capturing the French League Championship twice and the European Cup of Champions in 1990.

Collins-Parker received the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award during the 2009 NCAA Convention in Washington, D.C. The award honors former student-athletes who successfully completed collegiate careers in various sports and have excelled in their chosen professions on their 25th anniversary of completing their athletic eligibility. Collins-Parker was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in the fall of 2008. She currently serves as a member of the AVCA Board of Directors and the chairperson on the AVCA Minority Coaches Committee. She currently has membership with the AVCA, Coaches Accreditation Program, Kaepa Gold Medal Clinics, Black Coaches Association, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes. A 1995 graduate of Hawai'i with a bachelor of arts in broadcast communications, Collins-Parker is a member of the USA Volleyball Coaching Accreditation Program and is a CAP level III accredited coach.
