SCENE SETTER (through the games of Thurs., Nov. 15)

- Off to its first 2-0 start in four seasons, San Diego State ventures off the mainland for its fourth (1989, 2003, 2014 and 2018) appearance in the Maui Jim Maui
- San Diego State and Duke will meet for the third time, with the Blue Devils owning victories on Dec. 29, 2001 in Durham (92-79) and March 22, 2015 in the NCAA tournament third round in Philadelphia (68-49).
- Now in his second year as San Diego State's head coach, Brian Dutcher owns a 3-2 record against teams ranked in the AP Top 25 at the time of the game.
- Since the start of the 2017-18 campaign (when Dutcher took over as head coach), SDSU is tied for the 11th-highest winning percentage nationally against AP Top 25 opponents (there are 84 teams that meet the minimum of five aames).
- SDSU has performed well in eight-team in-season tournaments since 2008-09. The Aztecs have advanced to the championship game of eight-team events in each of their last eight appearances posting a 15-3 record during that span.
- Should Duke remain No. 1 in the AP Poll released Monday morning, it will mark the fourth time in school history the Aztecs have faced the nation's top ranked
- San Diego State is now 11-1 in its last 12 games dating back to last season. It is the best 12-game stretch since the 2015-16 squad posted 11 consecutive wins from Dec. 30, 2015 through Feb. 6, 2016 (streak snapped Feb. 10, 2016). That squad finished the campaign 28-10.
- Since Feb. 14, 2018, San Diego State's 11-1 record is tied for the third-highest winning percentage in the country, trailing only Michigan (16-1) and Gonzaga (12-1).

LAST TIME OUT (through the games of Thurs., Nov. 15)

- SDSU recorded its 42nd 100-point game in program history, first since scoring 100 vs. Savannah State on Nov. 28, 2016, most since scoring 118 against St. Katherine College on Dec. 27, 2013 and tied for its 23rd most in a game in school history.
- The Aztecs won their 68th straight game when shooting at least 50 percent from the field (137-13 since 2000-01).
- SDSU won its 71st straight game when shooting at least 50 percent from the field and committing 13 or less turnovers (73-1 since
- The Aztecs opened their season with consecutive victories for the first time since the 2014-15 campaign.

- San Diego State improved to 3-0 all-time against Texas Southern.
- Two of the three wins in the series have come a Viejas Arena (tonight and on Dec 3, 2012) with the other win coming at the Longhorn Classic in Austin, Texas on Dec. 6, 1991.
- SDSU improved to 2-0 this season and 8-0 all-time against current members of the SWAC.
- San Diego State won for the 134th time in its last 151 home games (134-17) and for the 65th time in its last 72 home games (65-7) against non-conference competition.
- San Diego State led wire-to-wire, scoring the first eight points of the game, leading by 10 at 15-5 just 5:55 into the game (14:05 left in first half), by 20 at 37-17 just 13:56 into the game (6:04 left in first half), by 30 at 75-45 with 10:17 left in the game, by 40 at 98-58 with 3:19 left in the game and by 39 for the game.
- The 39-point scoring margin was SDSU's largest since beating San Diego Christian by 39 in the 2017-18 opener on Nov. 10, 2017 and matches its largest margin since beating St. Katherine by 83 points (118-35) on Dec. 27, 2013.
- SDSU scored 49 points in the first half and now has at least 48 points in the first half in two of its last five games, four of its last 12 games and six times since the beginning of the 2017-18 campaign (35 games).
- SDSU shot 56.7 percent from the field in the first half (17-for-30) and held Texas Southern to just 26.3 percent shooting (10-for-38)
- The Aztecs won their 13th straight game when leading at the half and improved to 85-12 in their last 97 games when leading at the half, and a remarkable 89-5 in their last 94 home games when leading at the half.
- SDSU held Texas Southern to its fewest points in a game this season (TSU was playing in its fourth game).
- SDSU improved to 49-13 in its last 62 games when outrebounding its opponent.
- The Aztecs are now 62-9 in their last 71 games when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent.
- SDSU won its 27th straight game when scoring 100 points.
- Matt Mitchell 21 points, 5 rebounds, 3 assists 1 steal... Scored at least 20 points for the third time of his career (first time this season)... His 21 points tied for the second most of his career... Scored in double-figures just 11:36 into the game... Reached double-figures for the second straight game and for the 22nd time of his career... Led the team in scoring for the first time this season and seventh time of his career.
- Jordan Schakel 16 points, 7 rebounds, 1 blocked shot, 1 steal... Scored in double figures for the first time of the season and for the second time of his career (SDSU has won both games)... Became just the second Aztec to record at least three 3-pointers, 7 rebounds and a perfect outing from the free-throw line (7-for-7) since the 1996-97 season (also Jamaal Franklin on March 16, 2012 vs. North Carolina State in the NCAA Tournament)... Made a career-high seven free-throw attempts.

- Jalen McDaniels 14 points, 9 rebounds, 1 assist, 3 steals... Scored in double-figures for the second time this season and 20th time of his career... Reached double-figures in scoring for the third straight game... Had nine points (4 of 5 shooting) and seven rebounds in just 10 minutes in the first half before picking up this third foul... Led the team in rebounding for the second time this year and 20th time of his career (SDSU is 18-2 in those games).
- Devin Watson 14 points, 8 assists, 2 rebounds... Reached double-figures in scoring for the second straight game, 25th time while at San Diego State and 67th time of his career... Was one assist shy of tying a career high... Led the team in assists for the first time this season and for the 13th time as an Aztec... Has multiple assists in 38 of his last 44 games.
- Nathan Mensah 11 points, 5 rebounds, 2 blocked shots, 2 assists, 1 steal... Reached double-figures in scoring for the first time of his career... After scoring two points (0-for-2 FG, 2-for-4 FT) in 13 minutes in the opener against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, recorded nine points (3-for-3 FG, 3-for-4 FT) in nine minutes in the first half alone tonight.
- **Jeremy Hemsley** − 10 points, 2 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 steal... Reached double-figures in scoring for the second straight game and 59th time of his career (SDSU is 41-18 in those games).

SAN DIEGO STATE SNAPSHOT

- In its first two games, San Diego State has started two seniors and three sophomores.
- The Aztecs have a wealth of experience in the backcourt with a pair of seniors. **Devin Watson**, who is in his third year with the program after playing two seasons at the Univ. of San Francisco, leads the team this season in minutes played (35.0), scoring (17.0), assists (5.5) and has connected on 7-of-14 attempts from beyond the arc (50.0 percent). **Jeremy Hemsley**, has played extensively for San Diego State the last four seasons logging 103 games and 65 starts. He is averaging 28.5 minutes (second on the team) and 12.0 points, and is 9-of-16 from the field (56.3 percent).
- The other three starters come from the Aztecs' sensational sophomore class of Jalen McDaniels, Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel. Through two games the group accounted for 83 points (41.5 ppg) and 154 minutes (77.0 mpg). The three players also have chipped in 40 rebounds. 15 assists and 10 steals to date.
- San Diego State currently has five players in double figures all of whom start. In addition to the two seniors, sophomore forward Mitchell (15.5), sophomore forward McDaniels (14.5) and sophomore guard Schakel (11.5).
- To date, the Aztecs defense has been very impressive. SDSU's two opponents shot a combined 34.4 percent from the field, 24.1 percent from three-point distance and are averaging 16.0 turnovers and just 62.0 points.

SEASON SCENE SETTER

- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in redshirt sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels (2018 all-MW third team by media, honorable mention by coaches) sophomore forward Matt Mitchell and senior guard Devin Watson. The trio played in all 33 games a year ago with Watson starting every game, Mitchell receiving the opening nod 32 times (starting the final 31 outings) and McDaniels starting 21 of the final 22 contests (did not start on Senior Night).
- The aforementioned threesome ranked No. 2, 3 and 4 in scoring in 2017-18 with Watson leading the way at 12.2 points and falling seven points shy of tying outgoing senior Malik Pope for the team lead in the category. Mitchell and McDaniels, meanwhile, each finished with 10.5 scoring averages.
- SDSU returns from last year its leader in rebounding average (McDaniels 7.5), assists (Watson 124), steals (Mitchell 36), field-goal percentage (McDaniels .788), three-point field-goal percentage (Watson .389), three-pointers (Mitchell and Watson 49) and minutes (Watson 1,031).
- Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley and junior forward Nolan Narain are back for their respective seasons after receiving the starting nod at different times throughout the 2017-18 campaign. Hemsley (7.3 ppg, 1.22 a/to) played in 32 of 33 games last year, starting seven times, and enters '18-19 with 63 starting assignments in 101 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Narain, meanwhile, started once in 23 games and averaged career highs in every category (4.7 ppg, 2.0 rpg, .688 FG).
- Sophomore guard Jordan Schakel returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. Hailing from Torrance, Schakel ranked fourth on the team last year in three-point makes (27) and percentage (.346; min. 40 3FGA), while playing in all 33 games (13.8 mpg). Schakel averaged 3.2 points and 2.1 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing just nine turnovers in 455 minutes. In fact, he only had one multi-turnover game all season and finished the year with 26 straight one-turnover-or-less outings.

THE PROGRAM (through the games of Thurs., Nov. 15)

- Head coach Brian Dutcher is in his second season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a 22-11 record in his first season. He was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament in 2018. In 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat.
- San Diego State had advanced to the NCAA tournament seven times in the last nine seasons, making Sweet 16 appearances in both 2011 and 2014. Only 26 schools nationally have played din seven of th the last nine NCAA tourneys.
- The Aztecs' NCAA appearance in 2018 was their first since 2015, and their 12th postseason berth in the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT)
- SDSU claimed its Mountain West-leading 11th conference title last year and broke a tie with New Mexico by claiming its fifth MW tournament crown. The Aztecs, who played in their fourth Mountain West championship game in the last five seasons, won the tourney for the first time since 2011.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 212-71. SDSU's .749 winning percentage is the 12th-best nationally over the last eight years. See left column for complete list
- SDSU enters the new year having won at least 20 games and advanced to the postseason in 12 of the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT).
 In the last 13 seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 25.2 victories.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) five times in the last eight years.
- San Diego State has won at least 19 games in 13 consecutive seasons.

THE DUKE SERIES

- Monday marks the third meeting between the teams with the Blue Devils claiming victories in the first two meetings.
- The inaugural encounter occurred back on Dec. 29, 2001, in Durham, N.C. The Blue Devils won, 92-79, in what was SDSU's first game broadcast by network television. The Aztecs' 2,017th game was aired on ABC with Brad Nessler and Dick Vitale on the call. Randy

Holcomb paced SDSU with 22 points , 15 rebounds and three assists. Duke finished that season with a trip to the Final Four and a 13-O record at home. Their narrowest margins of victory at home that season were by 13 points to No. 7 Virginia and San Diego State.

- The non-conference game took place during the 2001-02 season, which was Steve Fisher's and Brian Dutcher's third at San Diego State. When the clock his triple zeroes, the Fisher/Dutcher SDSU era record was 26-41 (.388). Since that day, the Aztecs have gone 384-179 (.682) and advanced to 14 postseason tournament, including nine NCAA tournaments.
- The second meeting occurred in the third round of the NCAA tournament (round of 32) on March 22, 2015, with Duke claiming a 68-49 win in Charlotte, N.C.. The game is refered to ass the "food poisoning" game as the team was fighting the flu and food poising from the night before. Winston Shepard led the Aztecs with 13 points and four rebounds. Duke claimed the national championship that season. Although the outcome was never really in question, SDSU did cut the deficit to 44-37 on a three-pointer from Malik Pope with 12:42 left then got the ball back with a chance to inch closer. Trey Kell missed a jumper, Duke hit a trey to extend the lead.
- Although this is the first time Dutcher has faced Duke as a head coach, he owns a 4-8 record vs. Duke as an assistant coach, with nine of the meetings coming while he was at Michigan. Dutcher won his first meeting, beating sixth-ranked Duke in overtime in Ann Arbor before dropping six straight. Dutcher, however, ended with three straight victories over the Devils while in Ann Arbor, two at home and another at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

SDSU VS. THE ACC

- The Aztecs are 4-9 all-time vs. the current alignment of the ACC.
- San Diego State is 2-1 in nits last three games against members of the ACC. The Aztecs defeated Pittsburgh, 74-57 in the winner's bracket semifinal game of the 2014 EA Sports Maui Invitational (Nov. 25). As previously notes, Duke ended San Diego State's season in the third round of the 2015 NCAA tourney, 68-49. The following season, San Diego State advanced to the Madison Square Garden and the NIT national semifinals with a 72-56 win over Georgia Tech at Viejas Arena.
- This marks the first time Brian Dutcher has faced a member of the ACC as a head coach.

LOOKING FORWARD TO EXEMPT EVENTS

- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, San Diego State has had tremendous record in eight-team exempt tournament events, posting a 15-3 record in these situations.
- San Diego State has reached the championship game in six straight such events winning the 2008 Great Alaska Shootout, the 2013 Wooden Legacy and the 2016 Diamond Head Classic. SDSU fell short in the 2012 Diamond Head Classic, the 2014 Maui Invitational and 2017 Wooden Legacy, losing in the title game all three times.

JALEN IS BACK FOR MORE

- After a phenomenal freshman debut, Jalen McDaniels is back for his sophomore campaign with the Aztecs. McDaniels, who spent the offseason auditioning for NBA teams, withdrew from the draft just prior to the deadline.
- McDaniels, who focused on being a becoming a better long-range shooter while working with NBA teams this past summer, is looking to better on a remarkable debut campaign.
- Jalen posted a special game in the 2018-19 season-opening victory against Arkansas-Pine Bluff. The sophomore became the first SDSU player in nearly seven years and just the fourth Aztec player, regardless of class, in the last 22 seasons to produce a game with at least 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and three steals. He joined:

- McDaniels followed that up with 14 points, a game-high nine rebounds and three steals in just 23 minutes of action.
- Currently, Jalen ranks 41st nationally in points, rebounds and assists per 40 minutes (min. 25 mpg) at 42.4 Duke's Zion Williamson leads the nation at 61.1.

Below is a look at a few of his accomplishments last season:

- For starters, McDaniels averaged 10.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and shot 58.6 percent from the field and 78.8 percent from the line last season. He led the team in rebounding as a freshman last season.
- McDaniels was one of just four freshman in the nation to average 10.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and connect on at least 58 percent from the field. Other than McDaniels, Iowa State's Cameron Lard is the only other 2017-18 freshman who returned for his sophomore campaign.
- He is the only San Diego State player, regardless of class, to post those numbers over an entire season in at least 22 seasons.

■ For comparison sake, SDSU great Kawhi Leonard averaged 12.7 points and 9.9 rebounds as a freshman in 2009-10. However, McDaniels had an edge in field-goal percentage as Leonard connected on 45.5 percent from the field and 72.6 percent from the line.

HEMSLEY CLIMBING CHARTS IN 4TH SEASON

- Jeremy Hemsley enters his senior season in rare company. A native of Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., Hemsley will spend this season climbing the Aztecs career statistical charts in many categories.
- As he embarks on his senior campaign, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on:
- First off, Hemsley is a member of the 1,000-point, 200 rebound, 200 assist club. In school history, there have been 33 players to score 1,000 points at San Diego State and 24 to record 200 rebounds, but in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era only nine players have reached the 1,000-200-200 club. The players to accomplish that since 1999-2000 are (listed chronologically): Tony Bland, Brandon Heath, Lorrenzo Wade, D.J. Gay, Chase Tapley, Xavier Thames, Winston Shepard, Trey Kell and Hemsley.
- Hemsley has 1,111 points. That ranks tied for 22nd on the school's all-time list (with Malik Pope).
- Hemsley has 206 assists. That ranks 24th on the school's all-time list. He is seven away from being in the 21st position.
- Hemsley has 122 three-point field goals. That ranks in a tie for 11th in school history.
- Hemsley has played 2,686 minutes. That ranks 19th on the school's all-time list.
- Hemsley has 223 made free throws. That is good for 19th in school's Division I era.

TOUGH AT HOME

- San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last nine seasons and has a NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that the Aztecs have been a very tough out as Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 131-17 home record, winning 88.5 percent of its home games during that span.

Here are a few tidbits on the recent home success.

- In its last 151 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 134-17 mark, including a 65-7 record against non-conference competition at Viejas.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 86-13 at home, including a 40-6 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (38-4 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 32-5 in their last 37 non-conference home games.
- Currently, San Diego State has a modest eight-game win streak at Viejas.

PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE POLL

- San Diego State has been picked second in the annual Mountain West preseason media poll.
- The preseason favorite, according to the media that regularly cover the conference, is Nevada, which won the 2017-18 regular-season title. The Wolf Pack earned 207 points and 18 first-place votes to finish in front of SDSU, the reigning Mountain West tournament champions who garnered 188 points and one first-place tally.
- The Aztecs won the MW tournament crown a season ago when they beat New Mexico in the final. The Lobos' run to the championship game set them up for a third-place finish in this year's preseason poll. UNM picked up 153 points to finish ahead of fourth-place Boise State (139 points) and fifth-place Fresno State (138).
- UNLV (6th; 122 points), Wyoming (7th; 88) and Colorado State (8th; 80) were the next three teams to fall in line behind the Bulldogs with Utah State (9th; 78), Air Force (10th; 42) and San José State (11th; 19) rounding out the poll.
- SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll and received at least one first-place vote in each of the last five years. It is also the 10th time in 20 seasons the Aztecs have been picked first or second in the poll. All 10 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 14 years.
- Despite being considered the second-best team in the league, San Diego State did not have a player voted to the preseason all-conference team or as one of the of-the-year award winners (player, freshman, newcomer).
- The Aztecs are set to return three of their top four scorers from last season (Devin Watson, Matt Mitchell, Jalen McDaniels) and four of their top six (Watson, Mitchell, McDaniels, Jeremy Hemsley) off a 2017-18 team that went 22-11, won their Mountain West-high 11th conference title and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the seventh time in the last nine years.

LAST TIME OUT

SAN DIEGO STATE 103, TEXAS SOUTHERN 64 (game 2)

- Six San Diego State players scored in double figures, including all five starters, as the Aztecs never trailed and cruised to a 103-64 victory over Texas Southern.
- San Diego State, which improved to 2-0 for the first time in four seasons, received a game-high 21 points from Matt Mitchell. The sophomore also added five rebounds and three assists.
- Classmate Jordan Schakel had a career-high 16 points on 3-of-3 three-point field goal shooting and 7-of-7 from the charity stripe, and had seven rehounds
- Sophomore Jalen McDaniels added 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds, while Devin Watson poured in 14 points and had eight assists for SDSU. Senior Jeremy Hemsley scored 10 points and freshman Nathan Mensah came off the bench to score 11 points and pull down five rebounds.
- San Diego State scored the first eight points of the game and home win.
- The Aztecs produced its highest point total in nearly five years (118 vs. Saint Katherine College, Dec. 27, 2013) connected on 52.3 percent from the field and was 27-of-36 from the free throw line.
- Meanwhile, SDSU limited the Tigers to 33.3 percent field goal shooting and forced 14 turnovers on the evening.
- San Diego State won for the 68th straight time when shooting at least 50 percent from the field and has won 71 consecutive contests when shooting 50 percent and committing 13 or fewer turnovers.

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

2nd Season • 20th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is entering his second season as head coach after a first year in which he led the Aztecs to their Mountain West-high 11th conference title and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. Dutcher, who took over the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his time at San Diego State, Dutcher helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 13 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSÜ's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2011-12 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, SDSU was again an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an atlarge invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

Last season, SDSU won six consecutive games to end the regular season and all three in the MW tournament to capture the program's 11th league crown to return to the NCAA tournament. Despite the NCAA first-round exit, SDSU finished the campaign with a 22-11 record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches last season. Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.





San Diego State 76 Arkansas-Pine Bluff 60

SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Devin Watson connected on a careerhigh six three-point field goals and had a team-high 20 points as San Diego State opened its 2018-19 campaign with a 76-60 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff at Viejas Arena.

It was the sixth straight season-opening win for SDSU and the Aztecs have now won 14 consecutive home openers (regardless of the game being a season opener).

San Diego State led 39-36 with 17:38 to play when the Aztecs went on a 15-2 run to open up a comfortable 16-point lead. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had seven points during the spurt and was one of three Aztecs (Jordan Schakel and Watson) to connect on a trey during the decisive run.

The lead grew to 23 points (following a 30-10 run) before the Aztecs settled for the 16-point final margin.

San Diego State's trademark stellar defense on full display, limited Arkansas-Pine Bluff to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and forced the Golden Lions into 18 turnovers.

Watson recorded his fifth game with the Aztecs with at least 20 points, a figure he has reached 24 times in his career. His six treys are the fourth most by an Aztec player in Viejas Arena history.

Hemsley added 14 points, three assists and three steals. Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels narrowly missed a double-double with 15 points and team highs with nine rebounds and five assists. Sophomore forward Matt Mitchell rounded out four Aztec players in double figures with 10 points and five rebounds.

McDaniels became just the fourth Aztec player in the last 22 seasons to record at least 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and three steals in a game, joining Jamaal Franklin, Kawhi Leonard and Chase Tapley.

SAN DIEGO - Six San Diego State players scored in double figures, including all five starters, as the Aztecs never trailed and cruised to a 103-64 victory over Texas Southern.

San Diego State, which improved to 2-0 for the first time in four seasons, received a game-high 21 points from Matt Mitchell. The sophomore also added five rebounds and three assists.

Classmate Jordan Schakel had a career-high 16 points on 3-of-3 three-point field goal shooting and 7-of-7 from the charity stripe, and had seven rebounds.

Sophomore Jalen McDaniels added 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds, while Devin Watson poured in 14 points and had eight assists for SDSU. Senior Jeremy Hemsley scored 10 points and freshman Nathan Mensah came off the bench to score 11 points and pull down five rebounds.

San Diego State scored the first eight points of the game and led by as many as 41 points in claiming the team's eighth straight home win

The Aztecs produced its highest point total in nearly five years (118 vs. Saint Katherine College, Dec. 27, 2013) connected on 52.3 percent from the field and was 27-of-36 from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, SDSU limited the Tigers to 33.3 percent field goal shooting and forced 14 turnovers on the evening.

San Diego State won for the 68th straight time when shooting at least 50 percent from the field and has won 71 consecutive contests when shooting 50 percent and committing 13 or fewer turnovers
