Postgame Football Notes — San Diego State at Fresno State

November 17, 2018
Bulldog Stadium | Fresno, Calif.

Team Notes

- SDSU has still won seven of its last 10 games (7-3), 19 of its last 26 (19-7), 25 of its last 34 (25-9), 38 of its last 48 (38-10) and 39 since the 2015 season (39-13).
- The Aztecs dropped to 26-7 in their last 33 regular-season Mountain West games and 28-7 in their last 35 against Mountain West opponents (includes MW Championship games).
- San Diego State dropped to 8-3 in its last 11 MW games.

Series Notes

- San Diego State dropped to 29-25-4 all-time against Fresno State.
- SDSU is now 14-12-2 all-time against the Bulldogs in Fresno.

Trends

- SDSU started with the ball for the 82nd time in the last 95 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 154 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 276).
- SDSU allowed its opponent to score on its opening drive for just the 13th time since 2015 (52 games).
- San Diego State dropped to 8-2 the last 10 times it was tied at the end of the first quarter.
- San Diego State scored a touchdown in the second quarter, making it 14 out of the last 16 second quarters that SDSU has scored a touchdown.
- The Aztecs fell to 5-3 this season and 50-12 in the Rocky Long era when leading at the half. SDSU has won 14 of its last 17 games when leading at the half.

Player Notes

- * Fred Trevillion, Sr., WR (4 rec., 189 yds., 2 TD)
 - Had career highs of four reception, 189 yards and two touchdowns.
 - The 189 receiving yards were the most in the Jeff Horton offensive coordinator era (since 2015), the most by an Aztec receiver since DeMarco Sampson had 257 at Colorado State on Oct. 24, 2009 and the 30th most in a game in school history.
 - It was the 334th 100-yard game in program history.
 - Went over 100 yards receiving for the first time this season second time of his career (also Oct. 14, 2017 vs. Boise State).
 - Became SDSU's second straight player with a 100-yard receiving game (also Tim Wilson Jr. last week (Nov. 10) vs. UNLV).

- The 75-yard touchdown catch was SDSU's longest play (pass or rush) all season.
- The two touchdowns were his first two of the season, and third and fourth of his career.

* Kyahva Tezino, Jr., LB (15 tackles, 1.0 SCK, 1.0 TFL)

- Had a game-high 15 tackles, a sack and a tackle for loss.
- Led the team in tackles for the sixth consecutive game, ninth time this season (in 11 games) and the 13th time of his career (all of which have come over his last 16 outings).
- Has 169 tackles and 17.5 tackles for loss over his last 16 games (first career 16 starts).
- Recorded his sixth double-digit tackle game this season and eighth of his career.

* Parker Baldwin, Sr., AZ (14 tackles)

- Had a career-high 14 tackles.
- Reached double-digits in tackles for second time this season and sixth time of his career.

* Chibu Onyeukwu, Sr., DE (2 tackles, 2.0 SCK, 2.0 TFL)

- Had two tackles, both which were sacks.
- His two sacks and two tackles for loss both tied a career high.

* Christian Chapman, Sr., QB (4-for-13, 126 yds., 1 TD, 0 INT)

- Threw for 126 yards and a touchdown.
- The 75-yard touchdown pass to Fred Trevillion was SDSU's longest play of the season.
- Threw his third touchdown of the season and 38th of his career.
- Dropped to 24-9 all-time as a starting quarterback.

* Ryan Agnew, Jr., QB (4-for-8, 92 yds., 1 TD, 0 INT)

- Threw for 92 yards and a touchdown.
- Threw a 70-yard touchdown pass to Fred Trevillion, the longest throw of his career.
- The touchdown was his ninth of the season (and career).

Other Notes

- CB Ron Smith started for the 30th consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- \bullet AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 52^{nd} straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- RT Kyle Spalding and CB Darren Hall earned their first career starts tonight.
- The Aztecs had their fifth different starting lineup on the offensive line in 10 games this year.
- Desmond Bessent logged his first career snaps on special teams.
- DT Noble Hall blocked his second PAT in three games.
- P Brandon Heicklen had his first touchback of the season. He entered the game with the most punts (51) in FBS play without a touchback. He had gone 17-plus games and 81 punts without a touchback.
- SDSU's captains tonight were K John Baron (10th time this year), QB Christian Chapman (third time this year), DT Noble Hall (fifth time this year), and LB Kyahva Tezino (third time this year).
- Tonight's temperature was 55 degrees.
- Tonight's attendance was 36,123.
