### Postgame Football Notes – San Diego State at No. 13/13 Stanford

August 31, 2018

#### San Diego State Streaks Snapped

- Three-game winning streak against Power 5 schools.
- Six-game winning streak in road games.
- Five-game winning streak as an “underdog.”
- Three-game winning streak against Pac-12 opponents.
- Eight-game winning streak in the month of September.
- Four-game winning streak in season openers. SDSU is now 50-41-5 all-time in season openers, including a 26-24-1 mark in the Division I era (since 1969).

#### Series Notes

- SDSU drops to 2-4 all-time against Stanford, including an 0-3 mark at Stanford.
- San Diego State has won the last two encounters.

#### Trends

- The Aztecs had scored in 21 consecutive quarters, the second-longest active streak in FBS (Louisville, 25), before being held scoreless in the second quarter.
- SDSU did not start with the ball for just the 13<sup>th</sup> time in the last 85 games.
- San Diego State lost the coin toss for just the 25<sup>th</sup> time over the last 54 games.
- The Aztecs have now gone 145 games without suffering a shutout (Nov. 18, 2006 at TCU), which is the second-longest streak among current Mountain West schools (Boise State at 265).
- SDSU held its opponent scoreless on its opening drive for the 31<sup>st</sup> time over the last 39 games and for the 32<sup>nd</sup> time since 2015 (42 games).
- San Diego State dropped to 47-14 in the Rocky Long era when scoring first.
- The Aztecs dropped to 42-9 in the Rocky Long era when leading after the first quarter.

## **Player Notes**

### **\* Jwan Washington, So., RB (24 att., 158 yds., 1 TD | 2 rec., 6 yds. | 1 KR, 27 yds.)**

- Set career highs in rushing yards (158), attempts (24) and all-purpose yards (194).
- Recorded his first 100-yard rushing game of the season and third of his career.
- He became the 16<sup>th</sup> Aztec to rush for 100-plus yards in a season opener (17<sup>th</sup> occasion overall).
- Washington's 158 yards rank as the sixth most in a season opener in the Division I era (since 1969).
- Recorded his first rushing touchdown of the season and 14<sup>th</sup> of his career.
- Recorded his first overall touchdown of the season and 18<sup>th</sup> of his career.
- Now has 18 touchdowns (14 rushing, three kick return, one receiving) over the last 21 games.

### **\* Christian Chapman, Sr., QB (10-for-15, 113 yds., 0 TD, 0 INT)**

- Dropped to 23-7 as a starting quarterback.
- Stretched is FBS-leading streak with one or less interceptions to 30, 13 more than No. 2 on the list (Alabama's Jalen Hurts, 17).

### **\* Kyahva Tezino, Jr., LB (10 tackles, 0.5 TFL)**

- Recorded his third straight double-digit tackle game and now has 41 stops over his last three games.
- Led the team in tackles for the fifth time of his career and fifth time in his last six games.

## **Other Notes**

- QB Christian Chapman started for the 30<sup>th</sup> consecutive game, the longest streak on the team (offense/defense).
- AZ Parker Baldwin played in his 42<sup>nd</sup> straight game, the longest streak on the team.
- The following players earned their first career start tonight: WR Ethan Dedeux, DE Anthony Luke, CB Kyree Woods, WAR Trenton Thompson
- The following players played in their first career game tonight: Keshawn Banks, Luq Barcoo, Ethan Dedeaux, Caden McDonald, Connor Mitchell, Kobe Smith, Gabe Strong, Alex Wilson
- DT Noble Hall recorded his first career interception.
- Tonight's attendance was 40,913.
- SDSU's captains tonight were QB Christian Chapman, DT Noble Hall, LB Ronley Lakalaka and K John Baron II.
