News and Notes

HOME SWEET HOME: San Diego State returns home for the first time in nearly three weeks this weekend, hosting Oregon State, UTEP, and Louisiana during the SDSU/USD Challenge. The Aztecs are 1-2 at home this season, however, SDSU is 26-13 in its last 39 matches at Peterson Gym.

DUNBAR LEADING THE WAY: Ashlynn Dunbar has been a staple of the SDSU offense this season. having led the Aztecs in kills in six of SDSU's nine matches this year. Currently, Dunbar stands fifth in the Mountain West in points per set (4.17) and third in service aces (17).

HARRIS KEEPING IT GOING: Deig Harris. SDSU's lone senior on the 2018 squad, continues to be a centerpiece for the Aztecs on the offensive and defensive sides of the ball. Currently, Harris stands ninth among all active players in Division I with 434 career blocks. In 2018, Harris is ninth in the MW in hitting percentage (.344) and third in blocks per set (1.41).

TOUGH ROAD SO FAR: As of last Sunday, San Diego State's eight opponents so far in 2018 currently own a 42-27 (.609) record. Six of those eight opponents currently have records of .500 or better.

A RECAP OF THE OUTRIGGERS VOLLEYBALL CHALLENGE: San Diego State faced a tough field at the Outriggers Volleyball Challenge hosted by the University of Hawai'i last weekend, dropping a trio of matches to teams that entered the weekend with

a combined 14-2 record. Deja Harris was named to the all-tournament team -- good for her fourth regular-season all-tournament team selection. Ashlynn Dunbar averaged 4.27 kills per set in the Aloha State to lead the team, while Harris' .409 hitting percentage a 1.36 blocks per set average were also team bests. Delaney Taylor and Camryn Machado split time at setter and averaged 5.55 and 4.82 assists per set, respectively, while Sam McGrath led the defensive effort with 4.09 digs per set.

HISTORY AGAINST THIS WEEKEND'S OPPO-

NENTS: San Diego State looks to even its all-time record against Oregon State, with the Beavers holding a 4-3 advantage in the all-time series. It will be the first SDSU-OSU meeting since 2015, when Oregon State defeated the Aztecs in four sets (20-25, 25-20, 24-26, 19-25). Deja Harris, then a freshman, posted a team-high 12 kills in the setback.

SDSU looks to continue its dominance over UTEP, owning a 12-1 record against UTEP all-time. It is the first SDSU-UTEP meeting since 2008, when the Aztecs won in five sets (24-26, 20-25, 25-19, 25-23, 15-10).

This weekend's meeting between SDSU and Louisiana is the first-ever meeting between the two programs.

the fall having posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2012-13. Head coach Deitre Collins-Parker is in her 11th season on the Mesa and has compiled a 147-135 record over her Aztec career.

PRESEASON POLL: For the second consecutive year, SDSU was selected to finish third in the Mountain West in the league's annual preseason poll. Colorado State and Wyoming were selected to finish first and second in the conference, respectively, while Boise State finished in a tie for third place with the Aztecs.

ALL-MW (AGAIN): SDSU's lone senior, Deja Harris, was named to the preseason all-MW team for the second consecutive season, being one of just three student-athletes in the MW (Colorado State's Kirstie Hillyer and Katie Oleksak) to be on both the 2017 and 2018 preseason all-MW team. Last season, Harris became the third three-time all-MW selection in SDSU history and has an opportunity to become the first-ever four-time honoree in 2018. The Las Vegas native was the only student-athlete in the Mountain West to finish in the top seven in points per set (3.84), blocks per set (1.28) and hitting percentage (.344) in 2017.

A NEW LOOK: SDSU's roster of 20 is split evenly between 10 returners (eight letter winners, two redshirts) and 10 newcomers (five transfers, five true freshmen).

SDSU's 10 newcomers is the most its had on a roster since having 11 in 2010. SDSU's roster of 20 is tied for the largest roster since Collins-Parker arrived at SDSU, and SDSU's five transfers is the most for an Aztec recruiting class since Collins-Parker's first season on the Mesa.

2018 SCHEDULE: SDSU will play four non-conference tournaments featuring 12 matches before starting Mountain West play against Fresno State on Sept. 21.

SDSU's non-conference finale on Oct. 2 features a home match against crosstown foe San Diego, which appeared at No. 14 in the AVCA preseason rankings. SDSU will also face No. 25 Colorado State at home on Sept. 27 and RV Oregon State on Sept. 14. On the road, SDSU takes on RV Hawai'i on Sept. 9 and No. 25 Colorado State on Oct. 25.

Deitre COLLINS-PARKER Head Coach - 11th season

Deitre Collins-Parker, a two-time national collegiate player of the year and AVCA Hall of Fame member, was named the head volleyball coach at San Diego State on Jan. 30, 2009. She became just the fourth head coach since the Aztecs began collegiate play in 1976. She replaced Mark Warner, who retired at the end of the 2008 campaign after 13 years at the helm of the women's program.

Collins-Parker directed SDSU to its second consecutive winning season and a fourth-place Mountain West finish in 2017. A quad of Aztecs were named All-MW (Deja Harris, Devyn Pritchard, Baylee Little, Alexis Cage) -- tied for the program's largest number of honorees since the team joined the league in 2000.

During the summer of 2014 she led a Mountain West all-star team on a tour of Europe that concluded with a bronze medal third-place finish at the 2014 European Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia.

In 2012 she led her Aztec squad to a 23-8 mark and a 13-3 ledger in the Mountain West as the Aztecs claimed their first-ever Mountain West title. It was SDSU's best conference record and league finish since the 1996 season and top overall record since 1995. In addition, she produced a pair of All-America honorees (Andrea Hannasch and Johnna Fouch) along with a total of three all-conference selections (Raegan Shelton) and the conference Newcomer of the Year (Michelle Waber).

Collins-Parker arrived at San Diego State after five seasons as the head coach at Cornell, where she led the Big Red to three Ivy League titles and two NCAA tournament appearances. Under her tutelage, the Big Red had seven players named first-team All-Ivy, including two-time Ivy League Player of the Year and honorable mention All-American, Elizabeth Bishop (2007).

Prior to taking over at Cornell in 2004, Collins-Parker spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at UNLV, earning Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1998 after taking a dormant volleyball program and leading the Lady Rebels to a 23-8 record and a WAC tournament semifi nal appearance. Before her stint at UNLV, Collins-Parker served as an assistant coach at South Alabama, Northern Arizona and Houston for one year each. She also has plenty of international coaching experience as well. She served as head coach of the 1998 U.S. junior national team, directing her squad to a gold medal in the national qualifier. She served in the same capacity during the summer of 2000 (silver medal) and 2001 (bronze medal).

A former member of the U.S. national team and a three-time AVCA All-American at the University of Hawai'i, Collins-Parker was the starting middle blocker for the 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul, South Korea, and was an alternate for the 1992 team in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and the 1987 Pan-Am Games.

As a collegian, Collins-Parker was a two-time Broderick Award honoree as the national player of the year (1983, 1984) after leading the Rainbow Wahine to consecutive national titles and a 110-5 record in her final three seasons. Collins capped off her career by becoming the first volleyball player to be awarded the Broderick Cup recipient, given to the nation's best collegiate athlete in all sports. She was twice named to the NCAA all-tournament team and still holds the record for solo blocks in one NCAA tournament (15 in 1982). She was one of six players named to the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball 25th Anniversary Team in October 2005. Collins-Parker went on to compete at the national level and

played in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games and was also an alternate for the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and 1987 Pan-Am Games. She played professionally in the Italian League (1988-89) and the French League (1989-91), capturing the French League Championship twice and the European Cup of Champions in 1990.

Collins-Parker received the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award during the 2009 NCAA Convention in Washington, D.C. The award honors former student-athletes who successfully completed collegiate careers in various sports and have excelled in their chosen professions on their 25th anniversary of completing their athletic eligibility. Collins-Parker was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in the fall of 2008. She currently serves as a member of the AVCA Board of Directors and the chairperson on the AVCA Minority Coaches Committee. She currently has membership with the AVCA, Coaches Accreditation Program, Kaepa Gold Medal Clinics, Black Coaches Association, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes. A 1995 graduate of Hawai'i with a bachelor of arts in broadcast communications, Collins-Parker is a member of the USA Volleyball Coachina Accreditation Program and is a CAP level III accredited coach.
