

## News and Notes

HEADING TO THE ALOHA STATE: San Diego State travels to Honolulu, Hawaii for the Outriggers Volleyball Challenge hosted by the University of Hawai'i starting this Thursday. The Aztecs start the tournament off with a rematch against Portland, which it faced at the Aztec Invitational on August 25. The Pilots went on to win the match in four sets. It's SDSU's first trip to the Aloha State since participating in the 2015 Outrigger Resorts Volleyball Challenge.

BACK TO CAMPUS: Head coach Deitre Collins-Parker, a three-time all-American, two-time National Player of the Year and two-time national champion as a student-athlete at Hawai'i, returns to her alma mater this weekend. Collins-Parker has coached against her alma mater three times during her time at SDSU and is in search of her first coaching win against the Rainbow Wahine.

#### A RECAP OF THE CACTUS CLASSIC: SDSU fell to

Pacific in a tough five-set decision (25-19, 18-25, 16-25, 25-22, 9-15) to open the cactus Classic Classic hosted by the University of Arizona last weekend. Ashlynn Dunbar led the charge in the match, recording 16 kills and 15 digs -- both team highs -- for her team-leading third double double of the season, matching her total from her entire sophomore campaign.

After SDSU dropped a three-set contest against Arizona, SDSU fell in a closely-contested three-set match against Lipscomb (22-25, 24-26, 25-27), with two games requiring extra points. SDSU had limited action from starting setter Delaney Taylor against Lipscomb, forcing outside hitter Ashlynn Dunbar to make her first collegiate appearance at the setter position. Dunbar re-

corded 25 assists and logged a .278 setting percentage in the match.

Despite having lost in straight sets in each of the final two matches of the Cactus Classic, SDSU held a lead for at least a portion of all six of those games.

With a team-best 2.82 kills per set, junior outside hitter Hannah Turnlund was named to the 2018 Cactus Classic All-Tournament team.

DUNBAR'S START: Ashlynn Dunbar has served as a leader for SDSU both offensively and defensively through the team's first six matches, leading SDSU in kills per set (3.16) and second on the team in both digs per set (2.60) and assists per set (1.44). Dunbar currently stands second in the Mountain West in service aces (15) and sixth in points per set (3.96). Right behind Dunbar in the conference leaders in points per set is teammate Deja Harris (3.94), and the duo make up the only pair to come from the same team in the Mountain West's top 10 points leaders.

#### **HISTORY WITH THE OUTRIGGERS CHALLENGE**

FIELD: SDSU faces a tough slate this weekend, with its three opponents, Portland, Idaho, and Hawai'i, owning a combined 14-2 record during the early goings of the 2018 season. SDSU faces Portland for the second time this season and it will be the third all-time meeting between the Aztecs and Pilots. In SDSU's four-set (25-27, 22-25, 25-21, 22-25) loss to Portland, Ashlynn Dunbar recorded a career-high 22 kills -- the most by an Aztec since the 2016 season.

SDSU is 3-1 against Idaho all-time and 2-0 against the

Vandals since Deitre Collins-Parker took over as SDSU head coach.

SDSU meets with Hawai'i for the first time since Sept. 10, 2015, where the Rainbow Wahine took the match in three sets. Then a freshman, Deja Harris led SDSU with seven kills in the match. It will be the 44th all-time meeting between SDSU and Hawai'i.

A LOOK AT 2018: San Diego State is in ts 43rd season of women's volleyball in 2018 and enters the fall having posted back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 2012-13. Head coach Deitre Collins-Parker begins her 11th season on the Mesa and has compiled a 147-132 record over her Aztec career.

PRESEASON POLL: For the second consecutive year, SDSU was selected to finish third in the Mountain West in the league's annual preseason poll. Colorado State and Wyoming were selected to finish first and second in the conference, respectively, while Boise State finished in a tie for third place with the Aztecs.

ALL-MW (AGAIN): SDSU's lone senior, Deja Harris, was named to the preseason all-MW team for the second consecutive season, being one of just three student-athletes in the MW (Colorado State's Kirstie Hillyer and Katie Oleksak) to be on both the 2017 and 2018 preseason all-MW team. Last season, Harris became the

third three-time all-MW selection in SDSU history and has an opportunity to become the first-ever four-time honoree in 2018. The Las Vegas native was the only student-athlete in the Mountain West to finish in the top seven in points per set (3.84), blocks per set (1.28) and hitting percentage (.344) in 2017.

A NEW LOOK: SDSU's roster of 20 is split evenly between 10 returners (eight letter winners, two redshirts) and 10 newcomers (five transfers, five true freshmen).

SDSU's 10 newcomers is the most its had on a roster since having 11 in 2010. SDSU's roster of 20 is tied for the largest roster since Collins-Parker arrived at SDSU, and SDSU's five transfers is the most for an Aztec recruiting class since Collins-Parker's first season on the Mesa.

2018 SCHEDULE: SDSU will play four non-conference tournaments featuring 12 matches before starting Mountain West play against Fresno State on Sept. 21.

SDSU's non-conference finale on Oct. 2 features a home match against crosstown foe San Diego, which appeared at No. 14 in the AVCA preseason rankings. SDSU will also face No. 25 Colorado State at home on Sept. 27 and RV Oregon State on Sept. 14. On the road, SDSU takes on RV Hawai'i on Sept. 9 and No. 25 Colorado State on Oct. 25.

# Deitre **COLLINS-PARKER** Head Coach - 11th season

Deitre Collins-Parker, a two-time national collegiate player of the year and AVCA Hall of Fame member, was named the head volleyball coach at San Diego State on Jan. 30, 2009. She became just the fourth head coach since the Aztecs began collegiate play in 1976. She replaced Mark Warner, who retired at the end of the 2008 campaign after 13 years at the helm of the women's program.

Collins-Parker directed SDSU to its second consecutive winning season and a fourth-place Mountain West finish in 2017. A quad of Aztecs were named All-MW (Deja Harris, Devyn Pritchard, Baylee Little, Alexis Cage) -- tied for the program's largest number of honorees since the team joined the league in 2000.

During the summer of 2014 she led a Mountain West all-star team on a tour of Europe that concluded with a bronze medal third-place finish at the 2014 European Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia.

In 2012 she led her Aztec squad to a 23-8 mark and a 13-3 ledger in the Mountain West as the Aztecs claimed their first-ever Mountain West title. It was SDSU's best conference record and league finish since the 1996 season and top overall record since 1995. In addition, she produced a pair of All-America honorees (Andrea Hannasch and Johnna Fouch) along with a total of three all-conference selections (Raegan Shelton) and the conference Newcomer of the Year (Michelle Waber).

Collins-Parker arrived at San Diego State after five seasons as the head coach at Cornell, where she led the Big Red to three Ivy League titles and two NCAA tournament appearances. Under her tutelage, the Big Red had seven players named first-team All-Ivy, including two-time Ivy League Player of the Year and honorable mention All-American, Elizabeth Bishop (2007).

Prior to taking over at Cornell in 2004, Collins-Parker spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at UNLV, earning Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1998 after taking a dormant volleyball program and leading the Lady Rebels to a 23-8 record and a WAC tournament semifi nal appearance. Before her stint at UNLV, Collins-Parker served as an assistant coach at South Alabama, Northern Arizona and Houston for one year each. She also has plenty of international coaching experience as well. She served as head coach of the 1998 U.S. junior national team, directing her squad to a gold medal in the national qualifier. She served in the same capacity during the summer of 2000 (silver medal) and 2001 (bronze medal).

A former member of the U.S. national team and a three-time AVCA All-American at the University of Hawai'i, Collins-Parker was the starting middle blocker for the 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul, South Korea, and was an alternate for the 1992 team in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and the 1987 Pan-Am Games.

As a collegian, Collins-Parker was a two-time Broderick Award honoree as the national player of the year (1983, 1984) after leading the Rainbow Wahine to consecutive national titles and a 110-5 record in her final three seasons. Collins capped off her career by becoming the first volleyball player to be awarded the Broderick Cup recipient, given to the nation's best collegiate athlete in all sports. She was twice named to the NCAA all-tournament team and still holds the record for solo blocks in one NCAA tournament (15 in 1982). She was one of six players named to the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball 25th Anniversary Team in October 2005. Collins-Parker went on to compete at the national level and

played in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games and was also an alternate for the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and 1987 Pan-Am Games. She played professionally in the Italian League (1988-89) and the French League (1989-91), capturing the French League Championship twice and the European Cup of Champions in 1990.

Collins-Parker received the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award during the 2009 NCAA Convention in Washington, D.C. The award honors former student-athletes who successfully completed collegiate careers in various sports and have excelled in their chosen professions on their 25th anniversary of completing their athletic eligibility. Collins-Parker was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in the fall of 2008. She currently serves as a member of the AVCA Board of Directors and the chairperson on the AVCA Minority Coaches Committee. She currently has membership with the AVCA, Coaches Accreditation Program, Kaepa Gold Medal Clinics, Black Coaches Association, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes. A 1995 graduate of Hawai'i with a bachelor of arts in broadcast communications, Collins-Parker is a member of the USA Volleyball Coaching Accreditation Program and is a CAP level III accredited coach.
