### **NEWS AND NOTES** (As of Nov. 17)

- ► San Diego State and San Diego, two schools separated by 9.8 miles meet for the SERIES INFORMATION 51st time on Wednesday night at Jenny Craig Pavilion (JCP).
- ► Entering Sunday, San Diego State is one of just 78 Division I teams with a perfect record (there are 351 Division I men's basketball programs).
- ► The Aztecs have opened the 2019-20 campaign with a 3-0 record, marking the best start for the program since the 2014-15 NCAA tournament and Mountain West Conference regular season championship team opened with a 5-0 record.
- ▶ A win would give San Diego State just its second 4-0 start in the last nine seasons (other: the aforementioned 2014-15 season).
- ► San Diego State is 11-2 in its last 13 encounters with San Diego, although the two losses have come recently (2015 outdoors at PETCO Park and 2018 at Viejas Arena). The teams have split the last four games.
- ▶ The Aztecs have won the last five times the series has been played at Jenny Craig Pavilion and has a six-game win streak in the venue overall (defeated Kansas State in the second round of the 2009 postseason NIT). Although San Diego State has faired well against the Toreros at the JCP, the games have been remarkably close with the following winning margins during the streak: 3, 5, 7 (ot), 12, 11 and 9. SDSU's average margin of victory during the six-game series road win streak is 7.8 points.
- ► San Diego State's six-game win streak at Jenny Craig Pavilion is the longest active win streak by any team in the venue and is two short of the all-time mark set by a guest (Gonzaga won eight straight games in the building, several of which were neutral site WCC tournament games, from March 3, 2001 - March 9, 2003).
- ► Since the start of the 2007-08 season, San Diego State is 5-0 against USD at the JCP while the rest of the nation is 78-105 (42.6 percent) and non-conference opponents are 24-59 (28.9 percent).
- ► Since the start of the 2008-09 season, San Diego State is 125-81 in road or neutral site games. That winning percentage of 60.7 ranks 14th nationally.
- ► Although early in the season, San Diego State has shown tremendous improvement offensively this season. Through three games, SDSU ranks 17th in three-point field goal percentage (43.7) and 36th in three-pointers per game (10.3). In each of its first three games, SDSU has posted an offensive efficiency rating of 104.8 or greater. The Aztecs have not done that in four consecutive games since January, 2018.
- ► SDSU has enjoyed a huge advantage on the glass thus far, with a +14.0 margin. That margin ranks 14th nationally. The Aztecs are 3-0 this season and 35-8 in the Brian Dutcher era when owning an advantage on the glass.
- ▶ Junior guard Malachi Flynn has wasted little time in making his presence felt on The Mesa. The Washington State transfer who was selected by the media as the preseason conference newcomer of the year, leads San Diego State in scoring (15.3 ppg), assists (6.3) and steals (5). He is shooting 45.9 percent from the field and has connected on 7-of-14 three-point attempts (50.0 percent).
- ▶ Junior guard Jordan Schakel has started the season scorching the nets from beyond the arc. Schakel, who shot 41.5 percent from beyond the arc last season, has made 10-of-14 three-point attempts (71.4 percent) through three games. He is fifth nationally in the category and is averaging 13.0 points per contest.

- ► Senior guard KJ Feagin has posted consecutive double-digit scoring games and is averaging 10.0 points, 3.7 assists and 2.3 rebounds in his three games as an Aztec. The Santa Clara transfer is 6-of-12 from beyond the arc (50.0 percent).
- ► Sophomore forward **Natahan Mensah** is coming off a remarkable game with 14 points, a game-high nine rebounds and a career-high six dunks in the victory over Grand Canyon. He is averaging 8.7 points and 10.3 rebounds through the first three games.
- ▶ San Diego State has outrebounded each of its first three opponents by a total of 142-to-100, an average of 14 rebounds per game.
- ▶ Nationally on the glass, San Diego State currently ranks 6th in offensive rebounds per game (16.3), 7th in total rebounds per game (47.3) and 12th in rebound margin (+14.0).
- ▶ USD marks the first game in a stretch of three games in six days for San Diego State. The Aztecs return home to face LIU on Friday night and Tennessee State on next Monday. Adding two games in the Las Vegas Invitational over Thanksgiving, extending it out to five games in 10 days.
- ► San Diego State is looking for its first 4-0 start to a campaign since the 2014-15 NCAA Tournament season. Since the inaugural year of the Mountain West (1999-00), San Diego State has started the season 4-0 four times. The 2010-11 team, which reached the Sweet-16 in the NCAA Tournament, reached No. 4/4 in the national rankings and had the best start going, 20-0, before a 68-55 loss at BYU on Jan. 19. 2011.
- ▶ The Aztecs have opened the 2019-20 campaign with three consecutive victories, and with one of the first two wins coming on the road, for the first time since the 2010-11 season. That season, SDSU opened the year with wins at Long Beach State and at No. 11/12 Gonzaga en route to a 20-0 start, a 34-3 final record and the school's first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.

### THE SERIES AGAINST SAN DIEGO

San Diego State leads in the series with San Diego, 31-19. San Diego defeated the Aztecs 73-61 on Dec. 5, 2018, in the last meeting between the teams.

- ► The Aztecs are 10-8 against the Toreros on USD's home court, including a 6-2 mark in Jenny Craig Pavilion (JCP), which opened prior to the 2000-01 season.
- ▶ In the last five meetings in JCP, all San Diego State wins, the Aztecs' average margin of victory is 6.8 points.
- ▶ In the 2017 game, guard Matt Mitchell, then a freshman, was one of three Aztecs to score in double figures. He finished with four rebounds and 13 points on 4-of-4 FG shooting, including 1-of-1 from beyond the arc, and 4-of 5 from the line.
- ► San Diego State is 134-155 against the current members of the West Coast Conference, which includes a 76-71 win at BYU on Nov. 9.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State is 18-5 against the current makeup of the WCC and two of its five losses have come at the hands of the Toreros.

### **LAST TIME OUT**

SAN DIEGO STATE 86, GRAND CANYON 61 Nov. 13, 2019 | Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena

SAN DIEGO - First a win at BYU and then finally, a win against pesky Grand Canyon. It's been a big five-day stretch for San Diego State, which dominated inside and outside against Grand Canyon to win 86-61 Tuesday night. Malachi Flynn and Nathan Mensah each scored 14 points. KJ Feagin added 13 points for SDSU (3-0), which was coming off a big 76-71 win at former conference rival BYU on Saturday.

Grand Canyon (0-3) had won its previous two games against the Aztecs in San Diego, plus the most recent game in the series, a 76-72 victory in Phoenix on Dec. 7, 2016.

Leading 15-14, SDSU got hot from inside and outside and raced to a 30-18 lead. Matt Mitchell hit a 3-pointer and a fall-away jumper during the big run. The Aztecs twice hit consecutive 3-pointers in the first half. Feagin and Mitchell did it early on and then Adam Seiko and Keshad Johnson did it to give SDSU a 36-22 lead with six minutes before halftime. GCU went scoreless for the final five minutes of the first half as SDSU jumped to a 40-24 lead and never looked back.

- ▶ The Aztecs are off to their first 3-0 start since 2014-15. It has advanced to the NCAAs each of the last three times it started 3-0.
- ▶ With the win over Grand Canyon (86-61 on 11/13), SDSU now has five Division I programs it has played at least three times without coming away with a victory. The list includes Tennessee & Villanova (0-3), Duke & Stanford (0-4) and Washington State (0-6).
- ▶ Prior to the Aztecs 86-61 victory over Grand Canyon (11/13), GCU had won the previous two game on SDSU's home court and had defeated San Diego State by an average of 12.5 points per game (86-68 on 2/23/80 & 52-45 on 12/18/15).
- ► The Aztecs led 40-24 at the half against Grand Canyon. In the Brian Dutcher era, SDSU is 41-8 when leading after 20 minutes, 3-0 this season and have won nine straight when leading at intermission.
- ▶ Against Grand Canyon, **Nathan Mensah** had a career-high six dunks, last year he totaled 15 dunks in 34 games.
- ► The Aztecs sank their first seven field goal attempts against GCU with six assists on each of the first six buckets.

### **BRIGHAM YOUNG RESET**

- ► San Diego State's 76-71 victory at Brigham Young (11/9) marks the team's fourth consecutive win in the series, which is the longest Aztec win streak in the 74 all-time meetings. The other three game win streaks of the series were 1940-77 and 2005-06.
- ► Entering its game at BYU (11/9), San Diego State was just 3-29 against the Cougars in Provo, with victories coming on Jan. 31, 1985, Dec. 31, 1996 and Jan. 8, 2005. San Diego State had to wait 5,418 days between wins at Brigham Young.
- ► The Aztecs game at BYU featured one of the nation's best home teams against an elite road program. Since the start of the 1999-00 season, Brigham Young was 276-38 at home (87.9 percent). That ranked sixth nationally in home win percentage during that span. Meanwhile, San Diego State was 102-65 in road/neutral contests since the start of the 2010-11 season. That is 15th nation ally during that period.
- ► San Diego State overcame a nine-point second half deficit to win at BYU, 76-71. The Aztecs overcame double-digits to win three different games last season (vs. Xavier, CSUN and Utah State).
- ► San Diego State is 2-3 the last five times it has trailed in a game with five minutes to play.
- ► At Brigham Young, SDSU was led by junior guard Jordan Schakel who scored a career-high 19 points and grabbed 5 rebounds. Schakel scored 17 of his 19 points after intermission, connecting on 6-of-6 field goal attempts and 5-of-5 from beyond the arc after the break.
- Guards junior Malachi Flynn and senior KJ Feagin scored 17 and 12 points, respectively, both season-highs. Flynn has scored in double figures in 40 of his 64 career college games and both of his games as an Aztec. Feagin scored in double figures for the first time as an Aztec and for the 58th time in 85 college contests.
- Sophomore forward Nathan Mensah grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds. It's his second consecutive game with 11 boards and marks the eighth time in his career he had reached double-digit rebounds.

### **THE PROGRAM**

- ► San Diego State prepped for the regular season by winning its 27th consecutive exhibition game with an 86-51 victory over preseason No. 5 ranked UC San Diego on Wednesday, Oct. 30, at Viejas Arena. Senior forward Yanni Wetzell scored on a three-point play to open the game and then saw the Tritons tie it at 3-3 and 6-6. SDSU then went on a 6-0 run and never looked back. The team led by 25 points at the half before cruising to the 35-point victory. Sophomore forward **Aguek Arop** and senior forward **Nolan Narain** were the only two scholarship players that did not play in the game.
- ► Head coach Brian Dutcher begins his third season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a 21-13 record last year and is 43-24 in his first two seasons. In 2018, he was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament and in 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat. In addition, Dutcher is the first Aztecs' men's basketball coach to win 20+ games in each of his first two seasons.
- ► The Aztecs were picked to finish in second place in the preseason poll of the Mountain West media. SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last six years. It is also the 11th time in the 21 seasons the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 11 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 15 years.
- ► Malachi Flynn, a junior transfer from Washington State who sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer Rules, was selected the league's Preseason Newcomer of the Year. In his final season at Washington State, Flynn averaged 15.8 points, 4.3 assists, and 3.4 rebounds per game.
- ► The 2019-20 Aztecs return six of their top nine scorers off a team that posted a 21-13 record and advanced to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament in 2019. San Diego State is one of just nine schools nationally to win at least 19 games each of the last 14 seasons and is one of 29 schools to play in seven of the last 10 NCAA tournaments.
- ► In addition to the Mountain West media, which predicted the Aztecs would finish in second place, two other publications agreed that San Diego State would finish the regular season in second place CBS Sports Network and Street & Smith Yearbooks.
- ► The Aztecs have four players on the roster that stand 6-10 and all are international students. Senior Nolan Narain is from Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. Graduate transfer Yanni Wetzell comes to The Mesa from Auckland, New Zealand and sophomores Joel Mensah and Nathan Mensah, who are not related, are from Korle Gonno and Labadi, Accra, Ghana, respectively.

► The Aztecs next game will be at 7 p.m., on Nov. 22 against LIU on Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

### **ABOUT THE AZTECS**

- ► Head coach Brian Dutcher welcomes back two returning starters in junior forward Matt Mitchell and sophomore forward Nathan Mensah. The pair played in all 34 games a year ago with Mitchell starting 33 games, and Mensah receiving the opening nod in each of the final 20 contests. The only other returners who have started a game for SDSU are junior guard Jordan Schakel, who got 16 starting assignments last year, and senior forward Nolan Narain, who made one start in 2017-18.
- Schakel returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. The Torrance, Calif., native ranked second on the team last year in three-point makes (44) and led the team in three-point percentage (.415; min. 40 3-PT FGA), while playing in 28 games (23.3 mpg). Schakel averaged 7.4 points and 3.8 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing 15 turnovers in 651 minutes. In two seasons, he has committed just 24 turnovers in 1,106 total minutes (less than one turnover (.086) per 40 minutes played).
- ► SDSU will replace its leader in scoring average (Devin Watson 16.0), rebounding average (Jalen McDaniels 8.3), assists (Watson 142), steals (Jeremy Hemsley 38), and minutes (Watson 1,155) from a season ago.
- ➤ SDSU has three Division I transfers on the 2019-20 roster. **KJ Feagin** (Santa Clara) and **Yanni Wetzell** (Vanderbilt) are grad transfers who will play immediately and **Malachi Flynn** (Washington State), who sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer rules, will have two seasons of eliaibility, beginning in 2019-20, to compete for the Aztecs.
- ► San Diego State has lost three starters (Jeremy Hemsley, Jalen McDaniels and Devin Watson) from its 2018-19 squad that reached the championship game of the 2019 MW Tournament. The impact of the loss of trio can not be underestimated. They provided SDSU with 56.9 percent of its scoring last season (1,389-of-2,437 points), 56.2 percent of its assists (274-of-487), 53.5 percent of its steals (105-of-196) and 39.6 percent of its rebounds (487-of-1,228).
- ▶ When the 2019-20 season tiped off, the Aztecs had seven players on its roster who had never played a game in a San Diego State uniform. Guards Malachi Flynn (Washington State) and Caleb Giordano, a junior and sophomore, respectively, utilized redshirt seasons in 2018-19. KJ Feagin (Santa Clara) and Yanni Wetzell (Vanderbilt) are grad transfers with one year of eligibility each. Trey Pulliam is a junior transfer from Navarro College in Corsicana, Texas and Keshad Johnson and Mike Pope are freshman from Oakland and San Diego, Calif., respectively.
- ▶ Junior Matt Mitchell and sophomore Nathan Mensah, both forwards, are back for their respective seasons after receiving starting nods throughout the 2018-19 campaign. Mitchell (10.3 ppg, 4.1 rpg) played in all 34 games, starting 33 times, and enters 2019-20 with 65 starting assignments in 67 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Mensah, meanwhile, started the final 20 games of the season and led the team in blocks (39) and field goal percentage (.541), while scoring 5.6 points and ranking second with 5.5 rebounds-per-game.
- ► SDSU also welcomes back sophomores **Adam Seiko** (guard), **Aguek Arop** (forward), and **Joel Mensah** (forward) as well as senior **Nolan Narain** (forward). In 2019-20 Seiko averaged 2.2 points and 1.0 rebounds in his initial season on The Mesa. Arop (3.1 ppg, 2.7 rpg), Mensah (1.1 ppg, 1.0 rpg) and Narain (2.9 ppg, 2.2 rpg) will play larger rolls and make larger contributions in 2019-20.
- ▶ The Aztecs bring in just one freshman, **Kesahd Johnson**. The graduate of San Leandro (Calif.) High School was designated a three-star recruit by all of the major recruiting services and was listed by ESPN as one of the top-25 prep players in the state at the time of his signing. In signing with SDSU, he turned down scholarship offers from schools in the Big East, American and Mountain West Conferences. This is the smallest freshman class since Dutcher has been on The Mesa, which dates to the start of the 1999-00 campaign.

### **LUTE OLSON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST**

- ► Malachi Flynn, a redshirt junior guard, was named to the Lute Olson National Player of the Year watch list last week.
- ► Flynn is the first Aztec to be named to the Award's watch list in the now 11 years it has been in existence.
- ▶ Before transferring to SDSU, the native of Tacoma, Wash., averaged 12.8 points, 3.2 rebounds, 3.6 assists, while shooting 40.6 percent from the field in two seasons at Washington State.

### **NEXT SIGNPOST IS 1,000 POINTS**

- ► San Diego State has two players who are on the precipice of the 1,000 career-points Matt Mitchell and Malachi Flynn.
- ► Mitchell, a junior forward began 2019-20 with 695 points, and after totaling 27 in the first three games, is now less than 300 from the milestone (278).
- ▶ If Mitchell continues to score at his career pace (10.4 points per game), he will pass 1,000-career points in the team's opening game of the 2020 Mountain West Championship Tournament.
- ▶ When Mitchell reaches 1,000-career points, he will be the 34th Aztec in program history to reach quadruple digits. Mitchell will be the third player in as many years to reach 1,000 points scored in an Aztecs uniform (Jeremy Hemsley passed 1,000 points in 2018 and finished his career on the Mesa in 2019 with 1,392 points & Malik Pope reached 1,000 points, finishing with 1,111, in his senior season of 2018).
- ► Flynn, a redshirt junior guard, arrived at San Diego State after competing at Washington State for two seasons and compiling 791-career points. He began the season 209 points from 1,000 for his career and after scoring 46 in his first three games, is 163 from the signpost.
- ▶ If Flynn continues to score at his career-pace (12.8 points per game), he will pass 1,000 points against Boise State (1/11/20).
- ► KJ Feagin, a grad transfer from Santa Clara, had 1,182-career points prior to arriving at San Diego State. With his 30 combined points in the team's first three games, he passed 1,200 and now stands at 1,212 for his career.

### **TALL STRANGERS**

- ▶ The four tallest players on the 2019-20 San Diego State roster all stand 6'-10" and all are foreign born.
- ► Yanni Wetzell, a graduate transfer and forward, is a native of Auckland, New Zealand.
- ▶ Nathan Mensah, a sophomore forward, hails from Labadi, Accra, Ghana.
- ▶ Joel Mensah, no relations to Nathan and a sophomore forward, is from Korle Gonno, Accra, Ghana.
- ▶ Nolan Narain, a senior forward, came to the States from north of the border in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.

- ▶ In 99 years of basketball at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 66-33 (.667) in season opening games.
- ▶ In 50 seasons of Division I basketball at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 31-19 (.620) in Division I season-opening games.
- ► San Diego State has won its last 15 home openers, regardless of if the game was the season opener.
- ► The Aztecs have won seven consecutive season openers, regardless of location.
- ► San Diego State opened the 2019-20 campaign in style disposing of a Texas Southern, a program that won 24 games a year ago and piled up road wins at Baylor, Oregon and Texas A&M, 86-51.
- ▶ The Aztecs never trailed, used a 20-0 run in the first half to build a 40-10 advantage in cruising to the season opening win.
- ► SDSU played near flawless basketball in the first half. The Aztecs built a 48-13 lead at intermission. The Aztecs made twice as many first half three-point field goals (10), then Texas Southern had total field goals (5) and limited the Tigers to just 5-of-26 field goal shooting (19.2 percent) prior to the break.
- ▶ For a program that prides itself on defense, the first half effort still resonated in the record books. The 13 points allowed are tied for the fourth lowest first-half output for an Aztec opponent in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era (since 1999-00) and the 35-point advantage at intermission matched the highest against a Division I opponent int hat same time period.
- ▶ The Aztecs were led by junior guards Jordan Schakel and Malachi Flynn with 15 points apiece. Schakel connected on his four shots of the game and had eight points before four minutes expired. He connected on 4-of-5 three-point attempts in the game. Flynn, celebrating his SDSU debut after transferring from Washington State, stuffed the stat sheet by adding five rebounds and a game-high five assists to go along with his 15 points.
- ► SDSU dominated in every category, including a 62-41 advantage on the glass. Sophomore forward Natahan Mensah had a game-high 11 rebounds and true freshman forward Keshad Johnson came off the bench to add 10 rebounds and seven points in 15 minutes of
- ► San Diego State entered its 99th season of basketball, its 50th season at the Division I level and the third under the direction of Brian Dutcher on Tuesday, Nov. 5, with a 77-42 victory against Texas Southern University.
- ► San Diego State and Texas Southern met for the fourth time in school history. The Aztecs defeated the Tigers 79-64 on Dec. 6, 1991, 74-62 on Dec. 3, 2012, 103-64 on Nov. 14, 2018 and 77-42 last Tuesday. Those games were contested in Austin, Texas, in the Texas Longhorn Classic, and three in Viejas Arena, respectively.
- ► San Diego State won its 14th straight season-opener against unranked teams, a run dating back to the start of the 2005-06 season. SD-SU's last lost to an unranked opponent on opening night came on Nov. 19, 2004, when it came out on the wrong end of a double-overtime 80-72 loss against UC Santa Barbara.
- ► San Diego State has won seven straight season openers and 14 of the last 15 to begin a campaign. The lone blemish came at the start of the 2012-13 season when SDSU fell to No. 9/9 Syracuse on the USS Midway. Taking into account that the Syracuse game was played outdoors, on the flight deck of the USS Midway, the Aztecs have come out victorious in its last 14 season openers played indoors.
- ► The Aztecs are currently in a 10-game winning streak in season openers that have taken place at home.

### **NEW RULES FOR 2019-20**

With a new season comes some new rules from the NCAA.

- ► THREE-POINT LINE has been moved back from 20 feet, 9 inches to the international distance of 22 feet, 1¾ inches.
- ▶ SHOT CLOCK RESET has been reduced from 30 seconds to 20 seconds after a field goal attempt hits the rim and the offensive team rebounds the ball in the front court.
- ▶ LIVE-BALL TIMEOUTS coaches will be allowed to call live-ball timeouts in the last two minutes of the second half and any overtime periods. Previously coaches have not been able to call any live-ball timeouts during the game.
- ► TECHNICAL FOULS players will be assessed a technical foul should they use derogatory language about an opponent's race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender expression, gender identity, sexual orientation or disability.

### **HOME COURT ADVANTAGE**

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons and has a NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 143-20 home record, winning 87.7 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2019-20 season underway, here are a few statistics to keep an eye on.

- ▶ In its last 168 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 148-20 mark, including a 71-9 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- ► Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 100-16 at home, including a 46-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (44-6 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- ► The Aztecs are 38-7 in their last 48 non-conference home games.

## PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE POLL

- ► San Diego State has been picked second in the annual Mountain West preseason media poll.
- ▶ The preseason favorite, according to the media that regularly cover the conference, is Utah State, which shared the 2018-19 regular-season title and won the conference tournament. The Aggies earned 187 points and all 17 first-place votes to finish in front of SDSU, the team Utah State edged in last season's Mountain West championship game, and its 150 points.
- ▶ New Mexico has been predicted to finish in third place in this year's preseason poll. UNM picked up 141 points to finish ahead of fourth-place Nevada (135 points) and fifth-place Boise State (128).
- ► Fresno State (6th; 103 points), UNLV (7th; 89) and Air Force (8th; 76) were the next three teams to fall in line behind the Broncos with Colorado State (9th; 59), Wyoming (10th; 36) and San José State (11th; 17) rounding out the poll.
- ► SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last six years. It is also the 11th time in the 21 seasons the Mountain West has been in existence that San Dieao State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 11 times. additionally, have occurred in the last 15 years. This is the first time in the last six years that the Aztecs haven't received at least one first-place vote.



## **BRIAN DUTCHER**

Head Coach Third Season ● 21st Season Overall at SDSU ● Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, begins his third season as head coach. Dutcher completed his first year at the helm in 2017-18, following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Last season, Dutcher guided San Diego State to a 21-13 record which included multiple victories over nationally ranked Nevada. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first two seasons and for the second year in a row directed his squad to the championship game of the Mountain West Championship tournament.

In his first season, Dutcher led the Aztecs to the 2018 Mountain West tournament title and the NCAA tournament, the program's first appearance in three seasons. He was the only first-year head coach in the NCAA tournament and SDSU ultimately finished the year with a 22-11 record.

Over the course of his 20-year career at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 14 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next year, SDSU was an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tourney, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, SDSU won three games and qualified for the NIT semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

In his final season as associate head coach/head coach in waiting (2016-17), San Diego State posted a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan

Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

## Last Meeting: San Diego 73, San Diego State 61 Dec. 5, 2018 • Viejas Arena at Aztec Bowl • Att.: 11,082

SAN DIEGO - San Diego connected on seven three-point field goals after intermission and shot 56.0 percent after the break to overcome a halftime deficit and defeat San Diego State, 73-61.

The Toreros snapped the Aztecs 11-game win streak in the series in games played indoors and won enemy ground for the first time since

The Aztecs played stellar defense in the first half, limiting USD to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and 0-for-11 from beyond the arc. Despite the strong performance on that side of the floor, the Aztecs, only entered halftime with a seven-point lead.

San Diego used a 16-5 run to open the second half to build a fourpoint advantage. The Aztecs took their final lead of the evening on a pair of free throws by sophomore Jordan Schakel with 10:57 to play.

USD responded with a 10-0 run to take an eight-point advantage with 7:23 to play.

The Aztecs made a final push, cutting the deficit to four points on a Devin Watson basket with 3:04 to play, but could draw no closer.

San Diego State was led by Watson, who tallied a game-high 22 points and added three assists. Sophomore Matt Mitchell added 13 points, four rebounds and three assists for SDSU. McDaniels reached double-figures for a career-high ninth straight game with 12 points.

USD, who had six different players make a three-point basket in the game, was led by Isaiah Pineiro with 21 points and five rebounds.
