### Aztecs Notes

- San Diego State, which earned a share of the 2019 Mountain West regular-season title, is the No. 2 seed in this week's Mountain West Championship and will play No. 6 Fresno State in a semifinal matchup on Thursday, Nov. 7 at 11 a.m. MT, after the Bulldogs advanced 3-1 on penalty kicks against No. 3 Colorado State.
- It's share of the MW regular-season title marks the sixth time since the 1999 inception of the Mountain West that the Aztecs have either won outright or shared the regular-season crown.
- San Diego State is playing its second MW Championship game outside of America's Finest City for the second time in as many appearances, the team competed in the 2017 Championship in Las Vegas, Nev., and the second time since 2013, when the tournament was held in Albuquerque, N.M. In 2013, the Aztecs earned a bye into the semifinal round and defeated Utah State before downing Boise State to win the title and in 2017, they defeated Boise State in the semifinals and New Mexico in the Championship match.
- The Aztecs come into the Mountain West Championship with an impressive 13-game unbeaten streak in tourney settings. In its last 13 MW tournament outings, SDSU has compiled an 10-0-3 record. San Diego State has not suffered a defeat in this tournament since a 1-0 setback to Wyoming in the semifinal round of the 2011 tourney.
- Under head coach Mike Friesen, who is the all-time leader in wins at SDSU, the Aztecs are 13-4-3 at the Mountain West Championship with titles coming in 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2017.
- In 20 previous Mountain West Championships, the Aztecs are 19-11-4, with five titles to their credit. SDSU has made the final 10 times (1999, 2004, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017).
- The Aztecs were the most potent offense during conference play, scoring 24 goals ahead of both New Mexico and Air Force, which scored 20 times each. SDSU's 24 goals were spread among nine players, led by freshman Rachelle Elve who found the back of the net six times.
- By a vote of the conference's 12 head coaches, five San Diego State players garnered end of season awards led by first team All-Mountain West performer junior midfielder Chloe Frisch. She is joined by second team honorees senior defender Sarah Broacha, junior midfielder Laura Fuentes and freshman striker Rachelle Elve. Both Elve and senior keeper Brooke Lisowski were named to the All-Newcomer Team. The five honorees are the most since SDSU had nine members of the 2015 team selected to receive all-league recognition.

- SDSU went 3-2-0 this season vs. the Championship field and yielded nine goals. The Aztecs went 3-0-0, defeating Colorado State (2-0), San Jose State (3-0) and Fresno State (2-1, OT), but lost 1-2 at Boise State and 0-6 and at New Mexico in the regular season finale. The Aztecs were outscored 9-8 in those games, but six of the tallies came in last week's loss at New Mexico.

## Opponent Notebook

## (6) Fresno State

The Bulldogs enter the game against San Diego State after advancing 3-1 on penalty kicks over (3) Colorado State in the quarterfinal round. On the road this season Fresno State is 3-4-1 and 1-0-1 in neutral site games. The Bulldogs have 11 players have found the back of the net led by Ele Avery's five goals she also leads her team with 11 points. The Bulldogs have used three keepers this season with Milena Zink earning the majority of the minutes. She has a 1.02 GAA, a .773 save percentage and an 4-3-2 record... Fresno State is coached by Brian Zwischka.

- The Aztecs have played the Bulldogs 17 times dating back to the 1995 season and lead the all-time series 12-3-2. In games played in San Diego, SDSU is 8-0-1, which includes a 2-1 overtime victory on Oct. 25. In road games the Aztecs are 3-3-1 and in the lone neutral site matchup, in Provo, Utah in 1998, San Diego State defeated Fresno State 2-0. In the series, SDSU has outscored the Bulldogs 41-19.
- With a 2-0 record and an assist on a game-winning goal, **Brooke Lisowski** (Sr., GK, Los Gatos, Calif.) was named the MW Defensive Player of the Week for the week ending October 27. In two games, the Los Gatos, Calif., native, allowed just one goal in a total of 182 minutes, posting a 0.50 goals against average and had a .857 save percentage. This is her second Mountain West weekly honor, the fourth for an Aztec women's soccer player in the last four weeks and Lisowski is now one of two players to earn multiple Defensive Player of the Week honors in the Mountain West this year.
- Aztec senior **Rachel Speros** (Sr., D, Danville, Calif.) enjoyed her final appearance on The Mesa with a goal in the 30th minute of the team's 3-0 victory over San Jose State last Sunday. It was the first tally in exactly two years for the central defender. Speros' last goal came on Oct. 27, 2017 in a 4-3 decision at New Mexico.

- **Chloe Frisch** (Jr., MF, Solana Beach, Calif.) has emerged as one of the Aztecs most formattable offensive threats. Frisch ranks second on the side with five goal, more than double her previous season high of two, and leads the team with eight assists, again double her previous best of four. Frisch now stands one assist from joining the program's single-season top-10 list for assists. Frisch also leads the team in shots (57), shots on goal (21) and points (18).
- **Rachelle Elve** (Fr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) has scored six goals to lead the San Diego State in that category, but she is far from the first freshman to pace the side in goals for a given year. The last freshman to top the squad in tallies was Mia Root who banged home 10 goals in her initial campaign of 2017. Leah Pruitt (10 goals in 2015), Jen Mello (8 goals in 2005) and Kim Castellanos (10 goals in 2000) are the other freshman who have led the team in goals since the 2000 season.
- **Rachelle Elve** (Fr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) scored three goals and assisted on two others in a two-game road trip two weeks ago and was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week for the week ending Oct. 20. Down 3-1 at Air Force, Elve opened her weekend account with a 36th minute strike which sparked a four-goal unanswered streak. Early in the second half she assisted on a Laura Fuentes goal which drew SDSU even with the Falcons at 3-3. Then in the 79th minute, she put the game away with the eventual game-winner. On Sunday at Colorado College, SDSU again found itself down 1-0 early in the game. At the 14:00 mark, Elve found the equalizer and then assisted on a Chole Firsch goal just two minutes later which put the Aztecs up for good in the 3-2 victory.
- With her POW honor, **Rachelle Elve** (Fr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) joins **Laura Fuentes** (So., MF, Newark, Calif.) and two-time selection **Brooke Lisowski** (Sr., GK, Los Gatos, Calif.) as Aztecs who have been recognized by the conference this season for an individual weekly award and it is the first time since the 2016 season that SDSU has had as many three players earn the honor. In addition, the three have been recognized in four successive weeks. It is the fourth time in program history that SDSU has had at least three player recognized in successive weeks. The record is six straight weeks, from Sept. 24-to-Oct. 29, in the 2012 season.
- After a tough preseason schedule in which the team went 1-5-1 and scored just three goals versus 13 for the opposition, Mountain West play came at the right time. In its 10 conference games the Aztecs are 8-2-0 and have outscored opponents 24-13. San Diego State which struggled to find the back of the net early on, now sits atop the scoring list by six goals to the second place team Air Force. In the non-conference SDSU was outscored by 1.43 goals per game, but in MW play they are outscoring opponents by 1.10 goals a contest...That's a difference of over 2.5 goals per game!
- Getting the call from the Hall of Fame... **Brooke Lisowski** (Sr., GK, Los Gatos, Calif.), who as a member of the Archbishop Mitty High School girl's soccer team from 2011-14, won three West Catholic Athletic League titles and three Central Coast Section championships is being inducted into her high schools Hall of Fame. As a senior she had a GAA of 0.322 in 745 minutes allowing just three goals in 17 games.
- SDSU has put together a five-game winning streak which is its longest run of wins since the program put together six straight victories near the end of the 2017 season. Heading into its match at New Mexico, the Aztecs are riding three straight road wins which is impressive, but consider this... In 1998 the Aztecs strung together 10 straight victories away from home. That team won its first two road contests, dropped a 3-1 decision at Cal Poly and then ripped off 10 in a row and were unbeaten until being eliminated at Portland in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- **Laura Fuentes** (So., MF, Newark, Calif.) scored both goals for San Diego State three weekends ago as the team split a pair of road games at Boise State and Utah State and was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week, for the week ending October 13. Fuentes' goal at Boise State, on a penalty kick, came in the 75th minute and cut the Broncos' lead in half in a 2-1 defeat. Then at Utah State, she got the game-winning header in the 68th minute of a 1-0 victory. They were the first two goals of the season for the MW's 2019 Newcomer of the Year.
- For her efforts in the Aztecs' two-game sweep the week ending October 6, **Brooke Lisowski** (Sr., GK, Los Gatos, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week. Lisowski was in goal for all 180 minutes, faced 20 shots and stopped three of the four that reached her line. Her goals against average was 0.50 and her save percentage was .750. It was her first weekly conference award and the first for an Aztec women's soccer player this season.
- The team's 5-4 victory at Air Force (10/18) was the highest goal output since a 5-0 win over Air Force on the Sports Deck last season and the third time it has put up at least three goals this season and the third time in the last four games.
- The Aztecs have gotten balanced scoring from the players who have found the back of the net this season and opponents can't focus on one player who can put it in the goal. SDSU has nine players who have scored. Elve leads the team with six strikes, Frisch has five, two enter the weekend with four (Moorehead & Fuentes), three have recorded two tallies (Weiser, Leitch & Utush) and Tucker and Speros have one each.
- Welcome back **Darcy Weiser** (Sr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.). Weiser missed the first seven games and didn't make her season debut until the 38th minute at Wyoming (9/27). She scored her first goal of the year in the 82nd minute in Laramie which started a four-goal run for SDSU over the next 98 minutes and sparked a three-game winning streak. The tally started the Aztecs come back from a 3-0 deficit to the Cowgirls to make the final decision 3-2. In the team's next game, against Colorado State

(9/29), SDSU was the victor, 2-0. Against UNLV (10/4), Weiser picked up her second goal, the game winner, in a 1-0 win and she assisted on the goal that put the game away in the team's 4-1 win over Nevada (10/6).

- Strikers strike...and along with Weiser's two tallies, **Taylor Moorehead** (So., F, Valencia, Calif.) got into the goal scoring action in Laramie and against Nevada. Moorehead's goal at Wyoming got the Aztecs to within one, 3-2, with under 10 minutes to play. It was her first goal of the year and the fourth of her career and she added her second goal of the campaign in the 4-1 victory against Nevada and her third in the Air Force win. In the Colorado State win, **Rachelle Elve** (Fr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) became the third striker to score this year and she followed that goal with the game winner in the squad's decision against Nevada, two including the game winner at Air Force and another in the victory at Colorado College.
- **Kiera Utush** (Fr., MF, Rocklin, Calif.) has also scored twice this season, each time on a penalty kick. She is the first Aztecs to have multiple successful PKs in a season, since current volunteer assistant coach Victoria Barba put four penalty kicks in the back of the net in the 2016 season. Since the 2003 season, an Aztecs has scored multiple PKs in a season eight times. In addition, Utush is just the second freshman in the last 10 years to score the team's season-opening goal (vs. No. 22 Texas Tech). The other freshman to tally a goal in her first collegiate game in that time frame is **Taylor Moorehead** (So., F, Valencia, Calif.) who had the game-winner in a 1-0 victory over New Mexico State in the 2018 season.
- With 10 shots on goal, **Malia Kaleiohi** (Jr., MF/F, San Diego, Calif.) ranks second on the team and has already more than doubled her single-season high of four, which she set last year. She produced two shots on goal in each of the team's first three games as well as against San Diego (9/13), which are single-game highs for her career. In addition, Kaleiohi has produced 17 total shots, good for second on the team and a single-season high for the junior. With assists against Colorado State and Nevada, the first two of her career, she is tied for second on the squad.
- **Brooke Lisowski** (Sr., GK, Los Gatos, Calif.), a transfer from California, has played every minute in goal for SDSU and has a 7-7-1 record. In 1,370 minutes, she has surrendered 25 goals (1.64 GAA) and has made 53 saves (.683 save percentage). In the team's victory at Utah State, Lisowski recorded her fourth clean sheet of the year and of her career and third in Mountain West play. In the team's victory at Colorado College, Lisowski made a career-high nine saves.
- This season the Aztecs played three Power-5 schools. Over the last 10 years, SDSU has played a minimum of three Power-5 squads per season. In 2011, San Diego State took the pitch a single-season high six times against current Power-5 schools and posted a 4-2 record. Among those four wins, SDSU notched victories over Arizona (1-0), Minnesota (2-1), & Texas (1-0).
- Head Coach **Mike Friesen** is in his 13th campaign leading the Mountain West's most dominant women's soccer program. Friesen has guided his squads to 10 Mountain West championships (five tournament and five regular season), and five NCAA Tournament appearances. In 13 seasons of conference play, Friesen has a 80-22-15 record. His 80 victories are nearly double that of the next closest conference coach...Boise State's Jim Thomas have won 44 games each in Mountain West play.
- Friesen's 150 victories (150-93-34) since the start of the 2007 season, the year he took control of the program, are the most by any coach in the Mountain West.
- San Diego State is picked to finish fourth in the MW coaches' preseason poll. This marks the first time in 10 seasons the Aztecs have been picked to finish lower than second place. The last time SDSU was lower than second place in the preseason poll was at the beginning of the 2009 season, a year in which the team went 15-4-5, was undefeated in the Mountain West (5-0-2) and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Entering the year having won four of the last seven regular season titles, SDSU slotted into the No. 4 spot in the Mountain West preseason coaches' poll, which snaps a six-year run of being the favorite in the eyes of the conference's head coaches.
- The Aztecs have won 10 of the last 14 MW trophies (regular season and tournament), all of which have come under the direction of head coach **Mike Friesen**. In total, the 13th-year head coach has guided San Diego State to 10 conference crowns.
- San Diego State brings back its top seven point-earners from last year, including 2018 Mountain West Newcomer of the Year **Laura Fuentes** (So., MF, Newark, Calif.). The midfielder tallied three goals and an assist as a true freshman. Fuentes finished with seven points on the year, one behind another freshman, team leader **Chloe Frisch** (Jr., MF/F, Solana Beach, Calif.) who totaled eight (two goals & four assists).
- Joining Frisch and Fuentes as the top returning point-getters are **Taylor Moorehead** (So., F, Valencia, Calif.), **Phoebe Leitch** (Jr., D/MF, Forest Row, England) and **Darcy Weiser** (Sr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) who each tallied three goals and six points in 2018. **Sarah Broacha** (Jr., D, Pleasanton, Calif.) totaled a goal and two assists for four points.

**SAN DIEGO** — Kiera Utush, a freshman from Rocklin, Calif., scored on a penalty kick five minutes into the second half to put the San Diego State women's soccer team on the scoreboard, but it wasn't enough to defeat the No. 22 Texas Tech Red Raiders on Thursday night. SDSU (0-1-0) came out on the short end of a 6-1 decision in both team's season opener.

Utush's goal, the first of her collegiate career, came in the 51st minute. She was taken down by a Red Raiders' defender in the box. With the ball on the spot, she calmly slotted her shot past the keeper's right hand to open her college account.

The tally was the spark the Aztecs needed. They went on to enjoy the vast majority of the run of play in the second 45 minutes. As a team, SDSU outshot the Red Raiders 5-to-4 in the second half and forced Texas Tech to play the way San Diego State wanted and not the other way around, which is what happened in the first half.

Texas Tech (1-0-0) jumped on the Aztecs in the first half with five goals and dominant play. They played directly at SDSU and challenging every possession and putting San Diego State back on its heels.

The scoring was opened at the 2:44 mark on a Jayne Lydiatt goal and eight minutes later, in the 11th minute, Lydiatt struck again to make the score 2-0. Then in the 37th minute, the Red Raiders got a pair of goals from Kirsten Davis. Her first tally came at the 36:04 mark and just 28 seconds later she scored again to push the Texas Tech advantage to 4-0. Before the whistle blew to end the half, the Red Raiders picked up a fifth goal. It came at the 41:19 mark, off the boot of Demi Koulikakis, and sent the teams to the intermission with SDSU down 5-0.

Utush scored early in the second half to cut the lead to 5-1, but in the 71st minute Texas Tech got the lead back to five goals on a Marisa Weichel strike to make it 6-1, the final score.

In the first half, Texas Tech outshot the Aztecs 10-to-4 and put six shots on goal, coming away with five scores.

For the match, Chloe Frisch led the Aztecs with three shots. Malia Kaleiohi produced two shots as did Utush. Both of Kaleiohi's attempts were on frame, with Utush putting one in the net. Ariana Robles and Laura Fuentes each took one shot, with Robles' being on goal. Keeper Brooke Lisowski (0-1-0) took the loss. She saved three of the nine shots which reached her line.

For Texas Tech, Davis led the team with four shots. She and Lydiatt each had a pair of tallies. Marissa Zucchetto (1-0-0) made three saves while surrendering one goal.

"This was really a tale of two halves and were taking away from this one what we did in the second half. I thought in the second half we played as well as we have in the last three years. At half time I was less than thrilled at where we were, but to show the grit, both physically and emotionally, to come back in the second half against a very good team really speaks volumes about the type of players we have. **SAN DIEGO** — Chloe Frisch broke a 0-0 tie with just under two minutes to play, propelling the San Diego State women's soccer team to a 1-0 decision over the LIU Sharks on Sunday afternoon on the SDSU Sports Deck.

With just over two minutes left in a scoreless tie, freshman Kiera Utush played a pass down the right sideline, which Frisch collected. Frisch, a native of Solana Beach, Calif., then drove down the sideline, cut back to the center of the field and hammered a shot from just outside the right corner of the 18. The shot crossed the goal line inside the upper corner of the far post putting San Diego State (1-1-0) up 1-0 with just under 1:40 to play in regulation. It was Frisch's first tally of the 2019 season and Utush's first assist.

From that point on, the Aztecs ran out the clock and secured the team's first win of the season. "When I got the ball, I had tunnel vision," said Frisch. "I didn't see anyone else on the field and was totally focused on scoring and not letting the game get to overtime."

In the game, San Diego State did to LIU (0-2-0), what they had experienced on Thursday night in a season opening loss to No. 22 Texas Tech. SDSU controlled the run of play and outshot the Sharks 14-to-2, including 7-to-1 in shots on goal.

In the first half, the Aztecs attempted seven shots, with the most dangerous chance coming from senior Ariana Robles. In the 14th minute, she took a centering pass at the far post from junior Malia Kaleiohi, and just missed tucking it into the net behind the LIU keeper. Of the seven attempts in the first 45 minute two were on frame, but the teams went to the half tied, 0-0.

In second half, it was more of the same. The Aztecs controlled the play for the most part with LIU creating its only dangerous scoring chance at the 52:35 mark. Veronica Seeger took a centering pass at the far post and headed it toward the other side of the goal, but senior keeper Brooke Lisowski made a diving stop to preserve the 0-0 tie. The Sharks only other shot came in the 81st minute and it was blocked by the defense.

Lisowski (1-1-0) stopped the only shot to reach her line and recorded her first clean sheet and her first win as an Aztec.

SDSU produced 14 shots on the day led by three each from Frisch, Utush and Robles. Kaleiohi took two shots and Phoebe Leitch, Rachel Speros and Lauren Dicus had one shot each. The 14 attempts are the most for the team this season and the most since the Aztecs took 22 in a 5-0 victory over Air Force (10/21/18) last season.

LIU's keeper, Lydia Fraga Cordoba (0-2-0), made six saves and gave up the only goal in the game.

"I wasn't thrilled with how we played today in terms of a dominant performance, but we earned the win and at this level, to defeat any team is an accomplishment and it's important. So, we didn't play at our best, but it was the first Sunday game of the season, it was very warm, and those are excuses we could have used, but to have a gritty performance where we didn't allow chances and to find a late game winner in huge for us. Defensively we limited them to just two shots, which is fantastic and the overall performance back there was a step in the right direction." — SDSU head coach Mike Friesen

**SAN DIEGO** — The San Diego State women's soccer team was called for a foul in the box, which led to a successful 80th minute San Francisco penalty kick and a 1-0 loss on Thursday night on the Sports Deck.

USF's Sydney Cooper was fed the ball at the midfield line and drove down the left side. Sarah Broacha, who started the play behind the ball, sprinted to the side of Cooper and made a sliding tackle in the box. It looked like a perfect play, but the referee, who was trailing the action, called a penalty on Broach and put Cooper on the spot with a chance to break a 0-0 tie.

Cooper fired the penalty kick low to her left. SDSU keeper Brooke Lisowski made a diving save attempt, but the ball slipped under her glove and into the back of the net for what turned out to be the game-winning goal.

The teams played a closely contested game both on the field and on the box score. USF (2-1-0) outshot the Aztecs 12-to-11, including 5-to-3 in shots on goal, but the Aztecs had the more dangerous chances, all of which came in the second half.

San Diego State (1-2-0) had the games first good opportunity to get on the board. Ariana Robles collected the ball on the right side of the offensive zone and slid a beautiful through pass to Malia Kaleiohi about 14 yard. Kaleiohi turned and fired a shot which USF keeper Olivia Camera stopped at her line.

The other two good chances came in the 84th minute. Taylor Moorehead, coming of the bench had a couple of chances from the right side of the box. The first sailed wide right and the second looked to be heading into the goal, but Camera punched it over the crossbar.

Other than the goal, USF also had two dangerous chances. Four minutes before the penalty kick, Miciah Madison blasted a shot off the crossbar from a tough angle on the left side of the box and in the first half, a shot from the top of the 18 was sailing toward the goal, but Lisowski pushed it up and over the crossbar.

Lisowski (1-2-0) had four saves but took the loss. Kaleiohi led the team with a season-high four shots, and two on goal. Moorehead had two shots, with one on frame. Phoebe Leitch, Chloe Frisch, Laura Fuentes, Kiera Utush and Jessica Sanders attempted one shot each.

USF's Madison led her side with four shots and Camera (2-1-0) made three saves in earning the victory.

"We've looked at the video and it appears that Sarah (Broacha) hit the ball with her right foot. It popped back out and she hit it with her left foot, so I felt like she did everything in her power to make the right play. It's just disappointing that that (the penalty kick) was the result.

"The hard part for us right now is that we are missing a few players being in form. Taylor (Moorehead) has been battling health issues for the last six months and hasn't been able to compete at the level we feel she is capable of. I thought she performed at that level tonight. I thought Florence (Larocche) was really good. She was dangerous... attacking and we need her to get to the level we believe she can be. **SAN DIEGO** — The San Diego State women's soccer team played very disciplined defense against the California Golden Bears but allowed a pair of second half goals en route to a 0-2 decision on Sunday on the Sports Deck.

Despite California controlling the run of play for most of the match, the Aztecs didn't make things easy. They played their best defensive game so far this season, jumping into the passing lanes and never allowing the Golden Bears any easy opportunities.

In the first half, Cal (3-0-0) outshot the Aztecs 13-to-2, but it was SDSU which generated the most dangerous chance.

In the 29th minute, freshman Macy Horn stole the ball in the team's defensive zone. She played a throughball into the offensive end which Malia Kaleiohi, who slipped behind the defensive, ran onto about 30 yards out. The Bears keeper rushed to cut down Kaleiohi angle and at the top of the 18 just got a piece of the ball and deflected it outside the far post. It would end up being San Diego State's best opportunity to score and the teams went to the half tied, 0-0.

Through injuries, which occurred during the match, several San Diego State (1-3-0) reserves saw significant minutes and one, Abbie Rieder, made her collegiate debut.

"The way that our schedule sets up, it is hard to get new players into the game in difficult moments," said head coach Mike Friesen. "So, in situations where injuries occur it forces us to play some of those kids and I thought everyone that came in gave great efforts and followed the game plan. In terms of minutes and first experiences, Macy (Horn), McKenna (Wallace) and Abbie (Rieder) did a good job. Lauren (Dicus) played in a couple of different positions as did Malia (Kaleiohi), and they really performed well."

In the second half, the Golden Bears took advantage of two chances. In the 56th minute, Cal had a corner kick. Mia Corbin took the corner put into the box were Emily Smith redirected it onto the boot of Paige Matayer. Matayer shot in low to keeper Brooke Lisowski's right to put the Golden Bears a 1-0 advantage.

In the 82nd minute, Emma Westin and Corbin completed a give and go at the top of the 18. Westin shot to the right side of the goal to make it 2-0, which would be the final score.

In addition to Kaleiohi, Jessica Sanders had the other SDSU shot. Lisowski (1-3-0) surrendered two goals and made a season-high four saves.

California's offense, which finished with a 24-to-2 advantage in shots, was paced by five attempts from Westin. Angelina Anderson (3-0-0) earned the clean sheet victory in goal.

**THE QUOTE**

"I feel that today's defensive performance, from a tactical standpoint, was one of the better I've seen from any team I've coached. In the past we've tried to do that and were just not committed enough to do the things needed to be done. I thought we controlled the spaces that they were playing in and limited their opportunities to just a few. It is unfortunate to not get a result, but (Cal) is a very good team. They created some chances and finished them. Congrats to them, but I thought we played very well."

"One of the things that has happened over the past few weeks, is that they are starting to understand what we are asking of them and fully committing to it. If you only commit part way you end up creating huge gaps. Today especially, was a game where we were asking them to do something, we haven't done in our other games and to be able to still press, but in a different space. It just says so much about this team that they did what we asked and played really well." — SDSU head coach Mike Friesen

**CORAL GABLES, Fla.** — The San Diego State women's soccer team and Miami Hurricanes played 110 minutes on Saturday night, but a victor could not be determined as the game ended in the 1-1 tie.

The Aztecs, who controlled the majority of the play in the first half, took the lead in the 44th minute. Coming off back-to-back corners, Ariana Robles was fouled in the box which led to a penalty kick. Kiera Utush took the PK and shot low to the left of and under the diving Miami keeper. The ball found the back of the net for a 1-0 SDSU lead at the 43:22 mark.

It was Utush's team-leading second goal, both of which have come on penalty kicks, and ended a scoreless streak of 225 minutes. It also sent SDSU to intermission with its first halftime lead of the season.

Despite controlling the run of play for most of the first half, SDSU (1-3-1) was outshot 7-to-5. However, five of the Hurricanes' shots were in an eight-minute run late in the first half. Just when it looked like Miami was building toward something, they had two shots hit the crossbar in the run, the Aztecs who stole the momentum with the late tally.

Miami (2-1-1) came out in the first 15 minutes of the second half looking to take the game to San Diego State. They had a point-blank shot which sailed past the far post and another clang off the crossbar. A minute after the Hurricanes failed attempts, SDSU had a chance to double its lead.

Malia Kaleiohi got behind the defense, but a throughball was just a bit beyond her ability to control it and her shot sailed just outside the far post.

Inside the last 20 minutes of regulation, Ariana Robles dispossessed a Miami forward of the ball and sent it into the offensive zone. Lauren Dicus swerved behind the defense, picked up the ball and was one-on-one with the Miami keeper. Dicus drove to the top of the six and fired a shot which was just outside the right post.

The Hurricanes found the equalizer on a shot from Bayleigh Chaviers with 6:11 to go. It came from just outside the left side of the 18, went over the outstretched hand of Lisowski and inside the far post.

McKenna Wallace had the final dangerous chance in regulation. She picked up a loose ball in the box and took a point-blank shot in the 86th minute. It was to the right of the keeper, who made the correct choice with her dive. Tyler Speaks, the Hurricanes keeper, stopped it to send the game to overtime.

Neither team attempted a shot in the first overtime and Miami took three in the second extra period, but the game ended in a 1-1 draw.

For the game, the Aztecs were out shot 19-to-11, including 8-to-3 in shots on goal. Utush was credited with a team-high four shots. Phoebe Leitch took two and Robles, Broacha, Chloe Frisch, Malie Kaleiohi, and Wallace attempted one shot each. Brooke Lisowski (1-3-1) faced 19 shots, made a career-high seven saves.

Miami's offense was paced by Kristina Fisher, who produced four shots. Speaks came in at the start of the second half and is the keeper of record.

**SAN DIEGO** — The San Diego State women's soccer team outshot the San Diego Toreros 12-to-7, including 6-to-2 in shots on goal, but it was USD which took advantage of a late opportunity and scored at the 77:11 mark en route to a 1-0 win on the SDSU Sports Deck on Friday night.

From the opening whistle, the Aztecs took the play to San Diego. SDSU (1-4-1) took a season-high equaling seven shots in the first half and put three on frame, but couldn't find the back of the net. The best chance to score for either team in the first 45 minutes came at the 44:08 mark.

On a USD corner, keeper Brooke Lisowski grabbed the pass into the box and fed it out to Ariana Robles who moved it into midfield and onto the foot of Kiera Utush. Utush then played a through ball toward Taylor Moorehead as she neared the top of the 18. Toreros' keeper Amber Michel charged out to cut down the angle and attempted to grab the ball. She bobbled it, misplayed it to her left, and right onto the foot of Veronica Avalos. Avalos fired a shot toward the open goal, but a USD defender came from behind the play and blocked the shot, sending the game to the half, 0-0.

In the second half, the Aztecs continued to enjoy the better run of play, outshooting USD 4-0 in the first 33 minutes. Among those four shots for SDSU would be its second dangerous chance. Laura Fuentes stole the ball in the Toreros end and quickly fed Chloe Frisch, who drove to the middle of the field and from 30 yards out blasted a shot. It went over the USD keeper's outstretched hand and slammed off the cross bar.

The game remained scoreless until the 78th minute. USD's Milan Moses took a pass at the top of the 18, swung around and fired a shot just inside the right post to make it 1-0. USD would make the tally standup over the final 12 minutes and earned the 1-0 result.

Frisch led the Aztecs' offense with four of the team's 12 shots. Malia Kaleiohi and Robles took two shots each, both on frame. Fuentes, Avalos, Utush and Jessica Sanders produced one shot apiece. Keeper Brooke Lisowski (1-4-1) made one save among the two shots which reached her line.

For San Diego (4-2-0), Moses took five of the team's seven shots and Michel (4-2-0) made six saves.

**LARAMIE, Wyo.** — The San Diego State Aztecs scored a pair of second half goal within a minute of each other, but it wasn't enough for a comeback victory as SDSU lost in its Mountain West Conference opener 3-2 to the Wyoming Cowgirls.

The Aztecs out shot Wyoming 18-to-6, with the 18 attempts a season-high. It was the third time this year SDSU has out shot its opponent, but in those games the team has just a lone victory, 1-0 against LIU on August 25.

Down 3-0 in the final 10 minutes of regulation, the Aztecs strong offensive play was finally rewarded.

At the 81:35 mark, Rachelle Elve hammered a shot from the left side of the 18 which deflected off a defender. It came to the foot of Darcy Weiser, who despite not playing in the team's first seven games, knew exactly what to do with it. She slotted it inside the right post for her first goal of the year and broke a 308:13 scoreless streak. The last goal prior to Weiser's came from Kiera Utush, who scored at the 43:22 mark against Miami (Fla) on Sept. 7.

Less than a minute later Chloe Frisch took a ball in the midfield, drove to just inside the 18 and slid a pass around two defenders. Taylor Moorehead ran onto the ball and placed it past the Wyoming keeper to get the Aztecs to within 3-2 at the 82:27 mark.

Moorehead joined Weiser in scoring her first goal of the campaign and both Frisch and Elve picked up their initial assists of the season on the respective goals.

Despite producing more shots, 7-to-3, in the first half and controlling the run of play for the majority those 45 minutes, SDSU (1-6-1, 0-1-0 MW) found themselves in a 0-0 tie at the half.

Coming out of the intermission, Wyoming (4-2-3, 1-0-0 MW) got more aggressive and turned that into a pair of goals. At the 49:20 mark, the Cowgirls got a header off a corner to score the games initial goal. Three minutes later they doubled the lead when they picked up a loose ball about 30 yards out. They drove to the left side, averted SDSU keeper Brooke Lisowski who was charging off her line, and took a shot which deflected off the cross bar and in.

What proved to be the Wyoming game winner came in the 80th minute. Mikayla Stark grabbed a loose ball and drove down the left side. She out muscled an Aztec defender about 25 yards out and took the shot just before Rachel Speros, who was sprinting from the other side of the field, could reach her. The shot went into the upper corner to make it 3-0.

**SAN DIEGO** — The San Diego State women's soccer team hadn't come out on the winning end of a decision in six matches, but in its Mountain West home opener, that all changed with a 2-0 victory over the Colorado State Rams.

The last time the Aztecs tasted victory before Sunday was on August 25 in a 1-0 defeat of LIU, also the last time they shut out an opponent.

Senior keeper Brooke Lisowski weathered the first 16 minutes in which the Rams attempted eight of their 10 shots on the day and all the shots they would put up in the first 45 minutes. Three of those eight reached Lisowski's line and she stopped each one on her way to her second clean sheet of the season.

After the opening third of the first period, the Aztecs began to take over. They controlled the play and at the 41:08 mark struck for the first goal of the game.

Dominique Tucker had a throw in on the left side of the field. She passed it to Malia Kaleiohi who took a touch to place it onto the foot of a charging Chloe Frisch. Frisch, from 12 yards out on the left side, powered home a shot inside the far post for a 1-0 Aztec lead.

It was the first time San Diego scored first in a game in 357:46, dating back to its 1-0 advantage at Miami (Fla) on September 7. For Tucker, a sophomore defender, it was her first assist and point as a collegian. Junior midfielder Kaleiohi picked up her first assist of the campaign and for Frisch it was her second goal on the year. It marked just the third time this year that SDSU scored first and the second time it took a lead into the intermission.

The fans waited just over seven second-half minutes for San Diego State to double its lead. Laura Fuentes, the reigning Newcomer of the Year in the Mountain West, picked up a ball in the team's defensive end and played it on the Frisch at the midfield line. Frisch, a junior mid, drove down the left side and placed a perfect pass into the box which freshman forward Rachelle Elve ran onto. As with the first goal of the game, Elve beat the keeper low inside the far post to open her collegiate account. The Aztecs had a 2-0 lead in the 53rd minute.

From that point on, SDSU (2-6-1, 1-1-0 MW) stymied the Rams, which managed just one shot in the final 37 minutes and were held shut less in the final 31 minutes.

Frisch led the SDSU attack with three shots, a goal and an assist. Darcy Weiser, Taylor Moorehead and Jordan Girman produced a pair of shots each while Ariana Robles, Elve, and Veronica Avalos took a shot a piece. Lisowski stopped each of the three shots which reached her line to earn her second win of the season.

Colorado State (6-3-1, 1-1-0 MW) got a game-high five shots from Kristen Noonan, who had two of her team's three shots on goal. Gabi McDonald (6-3-1, 1-1-0 MW) made four saves, but gave up two goals in the loss.

**THE QUOTE**

"For us to get the first goal today was huge because it allowed us to open them up even more. They had to take chances and come forward which allowed us to get the second goal. We wanted to play the first 15 minutes today like we played the last 15 at Wyoming and then build on that, keep going and have that urgency to go get goals. Getting a result after how hard we have worked is massive. We were disappointed on Friday (a 3-2 loss at Wyoming) to dominate the game and not come away with a victory. We created a lot of quality chances and were really good, but we made a couple of mistakes which really cost us." — SDSU head coach Mike Friesen

**SAN DIEGO** — Senior Darcy Weiser picked up a loose ball in the box and fired it home in the 76th minute to send the San Diego State Aztecs to a 1-0 Mountain West Conference victory over the UNLV Rebels on Friday night at the SDSU Sports Deck.

It was the second goal this season for Weiser, who missed the first seven games of the year with an injury.

The play started with Jessica Sanders taking a pass in Aztecs territory from Ariana Robles. She drove up the right side and once inside the offensive half of the field played a throughball to Chloe Frisch in the right side of the box. The Rebels keeper came flying off her line to cut down the angle and met Frisch 12 yards out. She stopped Frisch but couldn't collect the ball.

Phoebe Lietch pounced on it, but a sliding tackle by a UNLV defender knocked it away and right onto the foot of the waiting Weiser. The Huntington Beach native fired a shot to the far post for the seventh goal of her Aztecs career and a 1-0 advantage.

From there the Aztecs (3-6-1, 2-1-0 MW) made the lead stand up and took their second consecutive victory, the first time this year the team has won back-to-back games.

UNLV (3-8-0, 0-3-0 MW) outshot the Aztecs 13-to-6 but were able to put just two shots on frame compared to San Diego State's four.

The glaring stat was the Rebels had 12 corner kicks to SDSU's one. It appeared in a six minutes stretch in the middle of the first period that UNLV had something building. They attempted six corner kicks which led the three shots in the box during that stretch, but the Aztec defense was up to the challenge. They, along with keeper Brooke Lisowski, stopped everything that the Rebels threw at them.

It looked like San Diego State would strike in the first half when, in the 36th minute, Veronica Avalos nearly scored from point blank range. Off a free kick, Kiera Utush played it to Laura Fuentes who drove to the end line on the left side of the box and then centered it to the top left corner of the six. Avalos hammered a one-time to her right with the outside of her right boot. The ball flew past the keeper, and but for a defender who was lucky for UNLV in the right place at the right time, the ball would have gone in. Instead, it slammed off her leg, which saved the day and sent the teams to the intermission in a 0-0 tie.

The sides played the second half evenly until Weiser put the Aztecs ahead for good at the 75:42 mark. The goal, her second of the season, ties her with Chloe Frisch and Kiera Utush for the team lead.

For the game Weiser and Frisch took a team-high two shots, with Avalos and Laura Fuentes producing a shot a piece. Lisowski (3-6-1) saw the Rebels take a lot of shots, but the two that reached her line were turned away and she recorded her second clean sheet in as many games and her third of the season.

UNLV's Jadyne Noguez produced a game-high five shots and keeper Emberly Sevilla (3-7-0) made three saves in taking the loss.

**THE QUOTE**

"I thought our energy was good in the warm-up, but we didn't show up to compete at the level we need to compete against a team that was desperate to get a win. I thought that UNLV did a really good job of winning a lot of 50-50 balls and putting us under pressure where we couldn't do what we normally do. That's a credit to them and at the same time, we were doing some things that led to UNLV getting some opportunities, specifically the corners." — SDSU head coach Mike Friesen

**SAN DIEGO** — The San Diego State women's soccer team had everything come together on Sunday at the SDSU Sports Deck in a 4-1 Mountain West Conference victory over the Nevada Wolf Pack.

The win, the team's third in a row, in combination with a Boise State loss vaults the Aztecs into the a three-way tie for the lead in the conference standings.

The Aztecs (4-6-1, 3-1-0 MW) owned the run of play throughout the match, outshooting Nevada 20-to-7, including 9-to-3 in the first half, which was predominantly played in the Nevada half of the field.

Things were building throughout the first 15 minutes and the effort was paid off when Chloe Frisch scored her team-high third goal of the season in the 25th minute to stake SDSU to a 1-0 lead.

Malia Kaleiohi had possession at the top of the box and passed to Phoebe Leitch at the spot. Leitch played the ball on towards the left side to Frisch who hammered a shot inside the far post to make it 1-0.

The teams went to intermission with SDSU's one goal lead and they wasted no time in adding to it.

At the 46:30 mark, Frisch, driving down the left side, passed the ball into the box and Rachelle Elve ran onto it and beat the Nevada keeper low inside the far post. It was a mirror image of her goal against Colorado State two days ago and it would not be the last time SDSU executed it in Sunday's game.

Nevada's Lesley Gonzalez cut the lead in half at the 46:57 mark. She picked up a loose ball in the box and beat Aztec keeper Brooke Lisowski low to the right side of the goal to make it 2-1 SDSU.

San Diego State put the game away in the 62nd minute on Taylor Moorehead's second goal of the year. Darcy Weiser had the ball inside the box and passed it to Moorehead who was 25 yards put. The sophomore from Valencia, Calif., then fired a rocket which caromed off the left post and in to make the score 3-1.

A little over five and a half minutes later SDSU made it 4-1. On virtually the same play in which she scored what would end up being the game winner, Elve took the ball on the left side of the box from a pass off the foot of Leitch and fired a shot. The Nevada keeper scrambled off her line and just got a piece of the ball redirecting it away from the goal. Leitch, who kept driving toward the goal on the right side and a Nevada defender got tangled up on the goal line. But Leitch was not going to be denied and forced the ball in for her first tally of the season.

The four goals are the most by the team since a 5-0 victory over Air Force on October 21, 2018. The Aztecs have scored multiple goals in three of the last four games and over that period, the team is 3-1.

Ten Aztecs produced shots, a single-game season best, with Frisch leading the attack with four. Moorehead, Kaleiohi and Darcy Weiser took three shots each, while Elve attempted two. Laura Fuentes, Jordan Girman, Leitch, Lauren Dicus and Veronica Avalos fired a shot a piece. Lisowski made one save and surrendered one goal, the first against her in over 237 minutes. With the win she improves her record to 4-6-1 and has earned three straight decisions.

**BOISE, Idaho** — The San Diego State women's soccer team spotted Boise State a pair of first half goals and then mounted a second half comeback, but it fell short in a 2-1 decision.

Trailing 2-0 in the 75th minute, Chloe Frisch drove to the end line on the right side of the box and was dragged down from behind which resulted in a penalty kick. **LOGAN, Utah** — Sophomore Laura Fuentes scored the lone goal of the game, a 68th minute header, in the San Diego State women's soccer's 1-0 victory over Utah State in a Mountain West match-up on Sunday afternoon.

The win improves the Aztecs to 5-7-1, 4-2-0 in conference play. San Diego State completes the week in a second-place tie on the league table with New Mexico, which SDSU faces in the final game of the regular season, and Colorado State, which it defeated 2-0 on Sept. 29. Utah State drops to 6-7-1 and 1-4-1 in Mountain West games.

Tied 0-0 in the 68th minute, the Aztecs had a corner kick. It was taken by Taylor Moorehead and cleared, but the clearance went just outside the top of the 18 where Sarah Broacha chipped it back inside the six. Laura Fuentes was in the right place at the right time and headed it on into the goal. It was her second goal of the season for the conference's 2018 Newcomer of the Year and her second in as many games. Broacha's assist was her first this season.

After the tally, San Diego State had to weather a blistering attack from the Aggies in order to secure the win. Brooke Lisowski, who recorded her fourth clean sheet of the season, made a critical save in the 88th minute to preserve the win. Off a Utah State corner there was a scrum in front of the six for a loose ball. Lisowski forced her way through the pack and smothered the Aggies final chance to find the equalizer.

The Aztecs dominated the run of play throughout the first half. SDSU was credited with five shots to Utah State's one. Taylor Moorehead and Chloe Frisch's strikes from outside the 18 were San Diego State's best opportunities in the first 45 minutes. SDSU took four corners to none for the Aggies but couldn't convert any of its set piece chances.

Utah State upped its level in the second half. They took 11 shots to SDSU's six and had seven corner kicks to San Diego State's two. USU had the better second-half stat sheet, but the Aztecs produced the critical goal and secured the victory.

For the game, Utah State outshot the SDSU 12-to-11. Chloe Frisch lead the Aztec attack with a team and game-high four shots. Moorehead produced two while Malia Kaleiohi, Fuentes, Darcy Weiser, Ariana Robles and Veronica Avalos took a shot apiece. Lisowski (5-7-1) had five saves on the day, including four in the second half.

Utah State's Mealii Enos topped her squad with three shots and keeper Diera Walton made three saves and surrendered the game's only goal.

**THE QUOTE**

"We came out determined in the first half. We wanted to be aggressive and did a decent job of it, but we weren't able to get a goal. I told the team that this would be a gritty game and we would have to grind it out if we wanted to come a way with a win. I was pleased with our effort all day. We went into survival mode there for about a ten-minute stretch near the end, but in the last couple of minutes we were able to regroup and finish the game off. These wins are incredibly important. We want to keep pace with the team in front of us and secure one of those first-round byes in the conference tournament." — SDSU head coach Mike Friesen

**USAF, Colo.** — The San Diego State women's soccer team trailed by two goals 29 minutes into its game at Air Force, but led by freshman striker Rachelle Elve, who scored twice and assisted on another goal, the team stormed back to earn a 5-4 decision at Cadet Soccer Stadium on Friday night.

The teams played an even first 20 minutes, but then tallied four goals in the next nine.

Air Force's Emma Nelson opened the scoring at the 20:38 mark staking the Falcons a 1-0 advantage.

Slightly less than two and a half minutes later San Diego State (6-7-1, 5-2-0 MW) tied it up. Darcy Weiser drove down the right side and into the box. An Air Force defender tried to run her off the ball and did so but she stopped short of the end line. When the ball didn't go out of bounds, Weiser was able to get a boot on it and centered it to the top of the six. Taylor Moorehead was crashing the box and pounded a shot that the Falcons keeper didn't even see as it screamed past her to make it 1-1. It was Moorehead's third goal of the season.

Air Force (8-5-1, 3-4-0 MW) responded with a pair of goals scored within 90 seconds of each other. Lexi Romero struck at the 27:26 mark and Kayla Milford scored at the 29:00 mark to make it 3-1 Falcons.

However, the Aztecs dug deep and found a goal in the 36th minute to cut the lead to 3-2. Elve tallied her first strike of the game, and third of the season, at the 35:41 mark. Chloe Frisch picked up her fourth assist of the year on the play and the teams went to the intermission with the Aztecs down 3-2.

It took seven minutes into the second half for SDSU to find the equalizer. At the 52:30 mark, Laura Fuentes scored her third goal in as many games to make it 3-3. Elve was credited with an assist,

The Aztecs took their first lead of the game on an unassisted goal from Frisch in the 68th minute. It was her fourth of the season and gave SDSU a lead it would never relinquish.

The final goal for San Diego State, and what would end up being the game winner, was produced by Elve. At the 78:53 mark she combined with Frisch again to make the score 5-3.

The Falcons scored in the 86th minute to cut the lead to 5-4, but from there SDSU slammed the door to earn the victory.

For the match, the Aztecs outshot Air Force 18-to-17, including 12-to-7 in shots on goal. San Diego State's 12 shot on goal are a season high and its 18 total shots are two shy of its season best.

The five goals are the most the team has scored since it defeated Air Force 5-0 last season at home.

Frisch led the offense with five shots, three on frame, a goal and two assists. Elve had two shots, both were on goal and found the back of the net, and she added an assist. Moorehead and Fuentes produced three shots each, both put two of those on goal and each scored once. Lauren Dicus and Veronica Avalos took a shot apiece. Despite allowing four in, Brooke Lisowski made three saves and earned her sixth victory of the season.

"We're very excited to get this win on the road. Air Force put us under a ton of pressure, especially early, and they scored a great first goal. After they went up 3-1, I thought it was a huge mental performance by our team to come back and get it to 3-2 by the half. In the second half we continued to close the gap. **COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo.** — As they did on Friday night at Air Force, the San Diego State women's soccer team surrendered the first goal on Sunday against Colorado College and then came back for a 3-2 victory and a two-game sweep of its games in Colorado Springs this weekend.

San Diego State (7-7-1, 6-2-0 MW) completed its longest stretch of games away from home this season, four contests, with a 3-1 record and are now in sole possession of second place in the conference table with three games remaining in the regular season.

**SAN DIEGO** — Freshman Rachelle Elve continued her Mountain West goal scoring streak with a 92nd minute game-winning goal to send the San Diego State Aztec women's soccer team to a 2-1 win over the Fresno State Bulldogs on Friday night at the SDSU Sports Deck.

Elve, the reigning Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week, scored her sixth goal of the season to earn SDSU (8-7-1, 7-2-0 MW) its fourth win in a row. In the last three games Elve has four goals, including two game-winners, on just five shots.

In the 92nd minute, with the game tied 1-1, the Aztecs had a goal kick. Brooke Lisowski hammered a ball two-thirds of the way down the field. It disappeared into a group of players and then reappeared on the foot of Elve outside the 18. She took a left-footed shot which sailed over the Fresno State keeper and in.

In the first 20 minute of the game, it looked like there was no way this one was going to extra time. SDSU came out and dominated the run of play early on and came up with the opening goal in the 11th minute.

After a save by Bulldogs starting keeper Valentina Vivas, she made a sloppy clearance to her left which came right to Aztec Jessica Sanders, inside the 18. Sanders played the ball to Taylor Moorehead who was crashing into the six and Moorehead sent it home for the 1-0 advantage. Things were looking good for SDSU, but for the remainder of the half Fresno State (9-5-2, 5-3-1 MW) took over the run of play. They outshot San Diego State 5-to-2 in the final 25 minutes of the period, but still trailed 1-0 at the intermission.

In the second half, the flow continued to favor Fresno State, which found the equalizer in the 51st minute. Off a corner to the far post, Robyn McCarthy headed the ball back to the near post where Emma Chivers bodied the ball in off her chest to tie the game at 1-1.

The score remained the same for the rest of the second half and though Fresno State controlled the majority of the possession, they weren't able to generate any real chances to score.

The Aztecs had several of opportunities in the second half, but were offside on three occasions, where a player got open behind the defense. In the 89th minute, SDSU nearly put the game away. Elve picked up a ball near the left side of the midfield and played a perfect pass to a driving Chloe Frisch. Frisch used her speed and the ball angle to get behind the Bulldogs defender and in one-on-one on the keeper.

Milena Zink who came on in goal at the start of the second half, stormed off her line and got just enough of the Frisch shot to save the game for her team...but only for a couple of minutes.

Elve would strike on the team's first shot in overtime and put SDSU in a tie with Boise State at the top of the MW table.

Moorehead paced the San Diego State offense with five shots and a goal. Frisch attempted four shots and Elve took two which included the game-winner. Phoebe Leitch, Jordan Girman and Sarah Broacha produced a shot each. Brooke Lisowski made one save in earning her eighth win on the season.

**SAN DIEGO** — Needing a victory to remain tied for first place in the Mountain West and with a first-round bye in the upcoming conference tournament on the line, the San Diego State women's soccer team dominated the San Jose State Spartans in a 3-0 victory on Sunday at the SDSU Sports Deck.

With the win, SDSU (9-7-1, 8-2-0 MW) has secured one of the top-two seeds and a first-round bye in the MW Championship which begins on Nov. 5, in Boise, Idaho. The Aztecs also keep pace with Boise State, which it is tied with at the top of the Mountain West table. A win by the San Diego State at New Mexico next Friday, combined with a Broncos loss at Utah State, and the Aztecs will win the Mountain West regular-season championship.

SDSU came out in the first half of the opening period and didn't attempt a shot until the 20:35 mark. San Jose State took seven shots and had three corners in the first 15 minutes but were held to just one shot for the rest of the match.

When the Aztecs finally did get that initial shot off, it opened the offense up. It took only three minutes from the first shot attempt, in the 21st minute, to get a goal and it was Phoebe Leitch who recorded the tally. Jordan Girman played a ball to Chloe Frisch who was outside the 18, on the left side of the field. Frisch served a ball to the back post. It bounced a couple of times and right to Leitch who slammed it home for her second goal of the season. Girman picked up her first assist of the year and for Frisch it was her seventh assist, and the first of two on the day.

Just over seven minutes later, at the 30:33 mark, senior Rachel Speros scored for the first time in two seasons. Again, Frisch picked up a ball just inside the Aztecs offensive zone and laid it off for a charging Speros who took two touches and hammered a shot through the Spartan keeper's hands to make it 2-0 Aztecs.

Despite being outshot 7-to-1 in the first 15 minutes, the teams went to intermission tied in shot 7-to-7. The Spartans put five shots on frame in the first half, but senior keeper Brooke Lisowski turned them all away and earned her fifth clean sheet of the season.

In the second half, the run of play continued to favor San Diego State. The Spartans (6-8-4, 4-4-2 MW) got off just one shot to SDSU's five and the Aztecs took five corners. The score remained 2-0 until the 73rd minute when Dominique Tucker removed all doubt about who would win the game.

Kiera Utush had the ball at the top of the 18 and passed to Laura Fuentes on her left. Fuentes drove to the end line and centered it to the far post. The ball was just out of the reach of Darcy Weiser, but Tucker was crashing the goal and neatly tucked it inside the post for the first goal of her college career.

From there the Aztecs ran out the clock to secure the team's fifth win in a row and the first-round bye in the upcoming conference tournament.

For the match, Leitch led the team with three shots, all were on frame, with one being the game winner. Frisch and Rachele Elve both attempted two shots while Taylor Moorehead, Fuentes, Speros, Tucker and Veronica Avalos produced one shot each. Lisowski made five saves in improving her record to 9-7-1 this season.

**ALBUQUERQUE, N.M.** — The San Diego State women's soccer team needed a win or a draw at New Mexico to win the 2019 Mountain West regular-season crown outright, but the Lobos had other ideas and defeated the Aztecs 6-0 on Friday night.

New Mexico outshot SDSU 19-to-8 and put 11 shots on goal compared to five for the Aztecs.

It looked like the San Diego State (9-8-1, 8-3-0 MW) would get the opening goal when off a corner, Kiera Utush headed the ball which banged off the post early in the 17th minute. But that would be one of the few dangerous chances the Aztecs would have for the remainder of the game.

But on the ensuing possession for New Mexico, Jady Edwards got loose behind the defense and went in one-one-one against SDSU keeper Brooke Lisowski. Edwards took the ball on the left side of the box and beat Lisowski low inside the far post.

With two minutes left in the half, the Lobos doubled the lead. In a play that looked like it was offsides, but not called, Edwards again got behind the SDSU defense and hammered a shot that Lisowski got a glove on but it caromed into the net for the 2-0 lead which was the score as the teams went to intermission.

Coming out of the locker room it took barely two minutes for Edwards to get a hat trick which made it 3-0 at the 47:03 mark.

New Mexico (10-7-1, 6-4-1 MW) added goals in the 52nd, 66th and 76 minutes to make the final score 6-0.

Chloe Frisch and McKenna Wallace led the team with two shots apiece. Sarah Broacha, Taylor Moorehead, Darcy Weiser and Rachel Speros were credited with one shot each. Both Wallace shots were on frame.

Despite the loss, San Diego State earns a share of the Mountain West regular season championship, its sixth since the conference was founded in 1999.

**THE QUOTE**

"This was a tough game to play in terms of before the game started, we already knew we had at least a share of the regular season title (due to a Boise State loss). I think we let our guard down and weren't completely ready to go with the game started. Early on we had the header which went off the post, but we didn't get the put back and they come down and score on us. Then it happened again on the second goal where we are packed into the box on one end and they bust out and get behind us to score. Then they came out and scored early in the second half and that was the nail in the coffin. I got as many of our starters off the field when it was apparent what the outcome would be to try to rest up for next week's tournament. This was not the way we wanted to win a regular season title, but we will try to make it two trophies when we get to Boise." — SDSU head coach Mike Friesen
