## NEWS AND NOTES (through games of Dec. 26)

- San Diego State looks to complete a perfect regular-season non-conference slate for just the second time in the last 89 seasons when the Aztecs play host to Cal Poly on Saturday afternoon at Viejas Arena.
- In the 99-season history of San Diego State Basketball, only three times have the Aztecs posted a perfect non-conference regular season - 1926-27 (4-0), 1930-31 (3-0) and 2010-11 (15-0).
- The No. 15/14 (AP/coaches) Aztecs jumped five positions in the AP Top 25 Poll for a second consecutive week.
- San Diego State, which is nationally-ranked for the 69th week in school history (all since the beginning of the 2010-11 campaign), is at its highest position in the poll since being ranked No. 13 on Dec. 1, 2014.
- San Diego State is currently one of three unbeaten teams nationally. In addition to the Aztecs, that list includes, Auburn (11-0, vs. Lipscomb, Sun.) and Liberty (14-0, at LSU, Sun.).
- San Diego State's current 12-game win streak is the fourth-longest in school history. Overall, the Aztecs have enjoyed six win-streaks of at least 11 games, with five of those coming with Brian Dutcher on the sidelines (four as an assistant coach).
- This is the Aztecs longest win streak since a school-record tying 20-game win streak during the 2013-14 campaign (that team posted a 31-5 record and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16).
- San Diego State's metrics continue to pace at an elite level. The Aztecs are currently 1st in NET (the last time San Diego State was not at the top of this chart was Dec. 21), 1st in strength of record, 6th in RPI, 6th in Sagarin, 12th in BPI, and 18th in KenPom.
- Through Dec. 26, San Diego State's 3-0 record in NCAA NET Quadrant 1 games was the second best in the nation, trailing only Duke (4-0). No other team with at least three Quadrant 1 games was undefeated in the category.
- With the fast start, San Diego State finds itself ranked among the nation's elite in several statistical categories, including 2nd in scoring margin (+20.8), 2nd in three-point field goal percentage differential (+13.7), 5th in scoring defense (56.3), 6th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.50), 10th in three-point field goal defense (26.3), 10th in field goal percentage defense (36.3), 11th in field goal percentage differential (+10.1) and 14th in three-point field goal percentage (39.9).
- San Diego State improved to 12-0 last Saturday with a 28-point neutral court victory over Utah (9-3, which defeated then No. 6 Kentucky three days earlier) at STAPLES Center in Los Angeles. The Aztecs never trailed and led the final 35:19 of the contest by at least eight points. The Aztecs held the Utes to just 31.3 percent shooting from the field and had advantages in rebounds (37-29) and turnovers forced (17-9) in defeating Utah for the seventh time in the last eight outings.
- Junior guard **Malachi Flynn** scored 16 points and added eight assists with no turnovers, while senior forward **Yanni Wetzell** and sophomore forward **Nathan Mensah** both chipped in 14 points.
- San Diego State has four players averaging in double figures (10.5 points or more) and six players averaging 7.2 points or more. Six Aztec players have scored 13 or more points in a game this season.
- Junior guard **Malachi Flynn** has been one of the best players in the nation through the opening two months of the season. A

- SDSU is 14th nationally in winning percentage since the beginning of the 2010-11 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 11.

transfer from Washington State, Flynn leads the Aztecs in scoring (15.6), assists (5.3) and steals (1.5). He is one of just 23 players in the nation to average 15 and five and when you add his assist-to-turnover ratio (3.76, 6th nationally), he is the only player in the nation to average 15 points, five rebounds and have an A/TO ratio of 3.20 or better.

- ▶ Despite coming off the bench, junior forward **Matt Mitchell** is second in the team in scoring (11.1) and is third on the team in rebounding (4.6), while shooting 40.5 percent from three-point range. He is averaging career bests in all three of those categories.
- ▶ Senior **Yanni Wetzell** has reached double figures in seven of his last nine games after doing so nine times all of last season at Vanderbilt. The transfer is averaging 11.1 points and 5.9 rebounds (second on the team), while shooting 59.8 percent from the field. In his last nine games he is averaging 12.8 points, 5.6 rebounds and has made 47-of-72 field goal attempts (65.3 percent).
- ▶ Junior **Jordan Schakel** has eight or more points in six straight games (double figure in four of those contests). Not only is reaching double figures good for Schakel, it has proven good for the Aztecs. When Schakel scores 10 or more points in his career, SDSU is 15-2 with eight straight victories. The Aztecs are 11-0 at Viejas when the sharp shooter reaches double figures. The sharpshooter has made 28-of-58 attempts from bonus distance (48.3 percent) this season to rank 17th nationally among players with at least 25 makes.

### INTO THE TOP-25s

- ▶ Off to a 12-0 start, the second best in program history, San Diego State entered the top-25 in both the AP and Coaches polls on Dec. 9 at No. 25 and No. 24, respectively. It was the first time since Feb. 23, 2015, the team had been ranked by the AP.
- ▶ The Aztecs have been ranked as high No. 4 (Jan. 24, 2011) by the AP and since the 2010-11 season have appeared in the top-25 for a total of 69 weeks (66 of those 69 weeks were from 2010-11 to 2014-15).
- ▶ San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP top-25 is 22 (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- ▶ Prior to this season, the last time the Aztecs were ranked in the Coaches Poll was March 9, 2015.
- ▶ On December 16, San Diego State moved up to No. 20 in both polls.
- ▶ On December 23, the Aztecs jumped to No. 15 in the AP Top-25 & No. 14 in the Coaches Poll.

### NET NATIONAL RANKING

- ▶ The NCAA announced its first NET (NCAA Evaluation Tool) rankings on Monday (12/16) and San Diego State slotted comfortably at No. 3, behind only Ohio State (No. 1) and Kansas (No. 2).
- ▶ Since its initial rankings, the Aztecs have been No. 1 five times, No. 2 twice and No. 3 twice.
- ▶ The NET replaced RPI this year as the primary sorting tool for evaluating teams during the Division I men's basketball season. NET relies on game results, strength of schedule, game location, scoring margin, net offensive and defensive efficiency, and the quality of wins and losses to create its rankings.

## ...AND THEN THERE WERE FOUR...THREE

- ▶ When the season started on Nov. 5, all 353 schools that compete at the Division I level were undefeated.
- ▶ On Thursday, Dec. 26, there were three Division I schools that remained unbeaten (San Diego State, Auburn, & Liberty).
- ▶ According to KenPom, which rates SDSU No. 18, the Aztecs have the best chance to remain unbeaten for the remainder of the year.
- ▶ Staying with the KenPom rankings, SDSU will be favored in every game for the rest of the regular season, except at Utah State on Jan. 4. In that contest, KenPom predicts the Aggies will win 66-65.
- ▶ SDSU's 12-0 start is the second-best start to a season, since the program ripped off 20 straight to start the 2010-11 season.

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons and has a NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 143-20 home record, winning 87.7 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2019-20 season underway, here are a few statistics to keep an eye on.

- ▶ In its last 172 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 152-20 mark, including a 74-9 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
  - ▶ Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 104-16 at home, including a 49-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (47-6 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 41-7 in their last 48 non-conference home games.

## NEXT SIGNPOST IS 1,000 POINTS

- ▶ San Diego State has two players who are on the precipice of the 1,000 career-points **Matt Mitchell** and **Malachi Flynn**.
- ▶ Mitchell, a junior forward began 2019-20 with 695 points, and after totaling 133 in the first 12 games, is now 172 from the milestone.
- ▶ If Mitchell continues to score at his career pace (10.5 points per game), he will pass 1,000-career points in the team's regular-season finale at Nevada (Feb. 29).
- ▶ When Mitchell reaches 1,000-career points, he will be the 34th Aztec in program history to reach quadruple digits. He will be the third player in as many years to reach 1,000-points in an Aztecs uniform (Jeremy Hemsley passed 1,000 points in 2018 and finished his career on The Mesa in 2019 with 1,392 points & Malik Pope reached 1,000 points, finishing with 1,111, in his senior season of 2018).
- ▶ Flynn, a redshirt junior guard, arrived at SDSU after competing at Washington State for two seasons and compiling 791-career points. He began the season 209 points from 1,000 for his career and after scoring 187 in his first 12 games, is 22 from the signpost.
- ▶ If Flynn continues to score at his career-pace (13.2 points per game), he will pass 1,000 points against Fresno State (Jan. 1).
- ▶ **KJ Feagin**, a grad transfer from Santa Clara, had 1,182-career points prior to arriving at San Diego State. Combined with his 88 points in the team's first 12 games, he passed 1,200. He now stands at 1,270 for his career.

## MULTI-TEAM EVENT SUCCESS

- ▶ Since the start of the 2010-11 season San Diego State has competed in 12 Multi-Team Events (MTE).
- ▶ San Diego State has played 32 games in those events and has compiled a 27-5 record.
- ▶ San Diego State has been crowned champion in seven of the 11 MTEs it's competed in since 2010-11, including the 2019 Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational late last month.

## FLYNN NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Malachi Flynn, a junior transfer from Washington State, was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 1. In three games, Flynn hit 19-of-40 from the floor (.475) averaging 20.0 points to go along with 3.7 assists, 2.7 rebounds, 2.3 steals and had a 1.6:1 assist to turnover ratio. In two games in the Las Vegas Invitational, he totaled 49 points on 15-of-27 shooting, including six threes, and had seven rebounds, seven assists and five steals. The Tacoma, Wash., native, led SDSU in scoring all three games and was the overall leading scorer in two of three contests the team played last week.

- ▶ **Trailing by nine points starting the second half against Iowa in the LVI Championship game, Flynn went 8-of-13 from the field, 3-of-7 from distance and 9-of-9 from the line, scoring 28 points in the half, en route to being named the tournament's MVP.**

## BRINGING HOME HARDWARE FROM CONTINENTAL TIRES LAS VEGAS INVITATIONAL

- ▶ With wins over Creighton (83-52) and Iowa (83-73), the Aztecs won the Las Vegas Invitational, its first exempt tournament title since the 2017 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic.
- ▶ **Malachi Flynn**, who was held scoreless in the first half against Iowa but totaled 28 of his team's 51 second-half points en route to the win. In two San Diego State wins, Flynn totaled 49 points on 15-of-27 shooting, including six threes, was 13-for-13 from the line and had seven rebounds, seven assists, and five steals. For his efforts he was named the tournament MVP
- ▶ **Yanni Wetzell** averaged 14.5 points (11-of-15 FG, 1-of-2 3FG, 6-of-8 FT), 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and had a steal and a block and was named to the All-Tournament Team.
- ▶ **Jordan Schakel** was also named to the All-Tournament Team after averaging 13.5 points (10-16 FG & 7-of-10 3FG), 4.5 rebounds, with an assist and two steals.

## WETZELL NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

**Yanni Wetzell**, a graduate transfer originally from Auckland, New Zealand, was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 24. In two games, Wetzell hit 15-of-18 from the floor (.833) averaging 16.5 points to go along with 8.5 rebounds and 1 assist and one steal win a pair of wins. Against USD, he reached career-highs with 20 points and 12 rebounds to become the first Aztec this year to finish a game with a double double.

- ▶ Wetzell is one of three players this year who has had a game where his shot at least .800 from the floor, grabbed at least 12 boards and was perfect from beyond the three-point line.

## MORE AZTEC TIDBITS

- ▶ San Diego State finished November with a 51-13 record in its last 64 November games.
- ▶ San Diego State starts December 4-0 and is now 54-14 in its last 68 games played in the month.
- ▶ San Diego State's 12-game win streak is the longest of the Brian Dutcher era and equals the fourth longest in school history.
- ▶ In San Diego State history there have been seven win-streaks of at least 11 games. Brian Dutcher has been on the sidelines for six of them.
- ▶ San Diego State is 89-14 in its last 103 home games.
- ▶ San Diego State has won 17 straight games and are 49-8 in the Dutcher era when leading at intermission.

## LAST TIME OUT

### SAN DIEGO STATE 80, UTAH 52

DEC. 21, 2019 | STAPLES Center

**LOS ANGELES** — Malachi Flynn and San Diego State head into Christmas off one of their most impressive wins of the season.

Flynn scored 16 points to lead the 20th-ranked Aztecs to a 80-52 victory over Utah on Satin the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic at Staples Center.

Yanni Wetzell and Nathan Mensah added 14 points apiece for the Aztecs (12-0), who remain one of the nation's four unbeaten teams. They are also off to the second-best start in program history.

San Diego State dominated inside with a 42-20 advantage in points in the paint. They led 29-19 at halftime with 18 of their points coming inside.

The Utes — who upset No. 6 Kentucky on Wednesday — came in shooting 50.2% from the field but were 15 of 48 on Saturday. That is their second worst-shooting game in Larry Krystkowiak's nine seasons as coach.

Timmy Allen led Utah (9-3) with 21 points. The Utes didn't make a field goal in the final 3:33.

It is the second time this season the Aztecs have held a team under 32% from the field. Their shooting was much better as they went 31 of 63.

The Aztecs scored the first seven points and roared to a 15-2 lead. The Utes did not get on the scoreboard until the 16:16 mark and trailed by double digits when Wetzell hit a 3-pointer to make it 12-2 with 15:19 remaining.

San Diego State's largest lead in the first half was 14. It was up 29-19 at halftime and extended it to 34 during the final minute.

## TIP INS

San Diego State joins Auburn, Duquesne and Liberty as the remaining unbeaten teams. ... Allen also had six rebounds, marking the eighth game he has led the Utes in both scoring and rebounding. ... Wetzell led the Aztecs with six boards. ... San Diego State has won seven of its last eight against Utah.

## BIG PICTURE

This is the Aztecs' third neutral-court victory over a major conference opponent this season. They beat Creighton and Iowa in the Las Vegas Invitational.

- ▶ San Diego State's 28-point margin of victory is the second highest of its 20 wins against Utah trailing only a 32-point win (85-53) over the Utes on Feb., 8, 2011 in Viejas Arena.
- ▶ The Aztecs held their ninth opponent this season to 40 percent or less from the floor and has won 16 straight in that situation.
- ▶ San Diego State has won seven of its last eight meetings against Utah and improved to 3-5 in neutral site games against the Utes.
- ▶ San Diego State is 3-0 this season, 10-5 in neutral site games in the Dutcher era and is 43-22 in its last 65 neutral site games.
- ▶ San Diego State has won 32 straight when holding its opponent to under 60 points.
- ▶ In San Diego State history there have been four win-streaks of at least 12 games. Brian Dutcher has been on the sidelines for three of them.

## FOREIGN FRONT LINE

- ▶ The four tallest players on the 2019-20 San Diego State roster all stand 6'-10" and all are foreign born.
- ▶ **Yanni Wetzell**, a graduate transfer and forward, is a native of Auckland, New Zealand.
- ▶ **Nathan Mensah**, a sophomore forward, hails from Labadi, Accra, Ghana.
- ▶ **Joel Mensah**, no relations to Nathan and a sophomore forward, is from Korle Gonno, Accra, Ghana.
- ▶ **Nolan Narain**, a senior forward, came to the States from north of the border in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.

## THE PROGRAM

- ▶ San Diego State prepped for the regular season by winning its 27th consecutive exhibition game with an 86-51 victory over Division II preseason No. 5 ranked UC San Diego on Wednesday, Oct. 30, at Viejas Arena. Senior forward Yanni Wetzell scored on a three-point play to open the game and then saw the Tritons tie it at 3-3 and 6-6. SDSU then went on a 6-0 run and never looked back. The team led by 25 points at the half before cruising to the 35-point victory. Sophomore forward **Aguek Arop** and senior forward **Nolan Narain** were the only two scholarship players that did not play in the game.
- ▶ Head coach Brian Dutcher begins his third season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a 21-13 record last year and is 43-24 in his first two seasons. In 2018, he was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament and in 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat. addition, Dutcher is the first Aztecs' men's basketball coach to win 20+ games in each of his first two seasons.

- ▶ The Aztecs were picked to finish in second place in the preseason poll of the Mountain West media. SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last six years. It is also the 11th time in the 21 seasons the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. Additionally, All 11 times have occurred in the last 15 years.
- ▶ **Malachi Flynn**, a junior transfer from Washington State who sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer Rules, was selected the league's Preseason Newcomer of the Year. In his final season at Washington State, Flynn averaged 15.8 points, 4.3 assists, and 3.4 rebounds per game.
- ▶ The 2019-20 Aztecs return six of their top nine scorers off a team that posted a 21-13 record and advanced to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament in 2019. San Diego State is one of just nine schools nationally to win at least 19 games each of the last 14 seasons and is one of 29 schools to play in seven of the last 10 NCAA tournaments.
- ▶ In addition to the Mountain West media, which predicted the Aztecs would finish in second place, two other publications agreed that San Diego State would finish the regular season in second place - CBS Sports Network and Street & Smith Yearbooks.

## ABOUT THE AZTECS

- ▶ Head coach Brian Dutcher welcomes back two returning starters in junior forward **Matt Mitchell** and sophomore forward **Nathan Mensah**. The pair played in all 34 games a year ago with Mitchell starting 33 games, and Mensah receiving the opening nod in each of the final 20 contests. The only other returners who have started a game for SDSU are junior guard **Jordan Schakel**, who got 16 starting assignments last year, and senior forward **Nolan Narain**, who made one start in 2017-18.
- ▶ Schakel returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. The Torrance, Calif., native ranked second on the team last year in three-point makes (44) and led the team in three-point percentage (.415; min. 40 3-PT FGA), while playing in 28 games (23.3 mpg). Schakel averaged 7.4 points and 3.8 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing 15 turnovers in 651 minutes. In two seasons, he has committed just 24 turnovers in 1,106 total minutes (less than one turnover (.086) per 40 minutes played).
- ▶ SDSU will replace its leader in scoring average (Devin Watson - 16.0), rebounding average (Jalen McDaniels - 8.3), assists (Watson - 14.2), steals (Jeremy Hemsley - 38), and minutes (Watson - 1,155) from a season ago.
- ▶ SDSU has three Division I transfers on the 2019-20 roster. **KJ Feagin** (Santa Clara) and **Yanni Wetzell** (Vanderbilt) are grad transfers who will play immediately and **Malachi Flynn** (Washington State), who sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer rules, will have two seasons of eligibility, beginning in 2019-20, to compete for the Aztecs.
- ▶ San Diego State has lost three starters (Jeremy Hemsley, Jalen McDaniels and Devin Watson) from its 2018-19 squad that reached the championship game of the 2019 MW Tournament. The impact of the loss of trio cannot be underestimated. They provided SDSU with 56.9 percent of its scoring last season (1,389-of-2,437 points), 56.2 percent of its assists (274-of-487), 53.5 percent of its steals (105-of-196) and 39.6 percent of its rebounds (487-of-1,228).
- ▶ When the 2019-20 season tipped off, the Aztecs had six players on its roster who had never played a game in a San Diego State uniform. Guards **Malachi Flynn** (Washington State) and **Caleb Giordano**, a junior and sophomore, respectively, utilized redshirt seasons in 2018-19. **KJ Feagin** (Santa Clara) and **Yanni Wetzell** (Vanderbilt) are grad transfers with one year of eligibility each. **Trey Pulliam** is a junior transfer from Navarro College in Corsicana, Texas and **Keshad Johnson** is a freshman from Oakland, Calif.
- ▶ Junior **Matt Mitchell** and sophomore **Nathan Mensah**, both forwards, are back for their respective seasons after receiving starting nods throughout the 2018-19 campaign. Mitchell (10.3 ppg, 4.1 rpg) played in all 34 games, starting 33 times, and enters 2019-20 with 65 starting assignments in 67 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Mensah, meanwhile, started the final 20 games of the season and led the team in blocks (39) and field goal percentage (.541), while scoring 5.6 points and ranking second with 5.5 rebounds-per-game.
- ▶ SDSU also welcomes back sophomores **Adam Seiko** (guard), **Aguek Arop** (forward), and **Joel Mensah** (forward) as well as senior **Nolan Narain** (forward). In 2019-20 Seiko averaged 2.2 points and 1.0 rebounds in his initial season on The Mesa. Arop (3.1 ppg, 2.7 rpg), Mensah (1.1 ppg, 1.0 rpg) and Narain (2.9 ppg, 2.2 rpg) will play larger rolls and make larger contributions in 2019-20.
- ▶ The Aztecs bring in just one freshman, **Keshad Johnson**. The graduate of San Leandro (Calif.) High School was designated a three-star recruit by all of the major recruiting services and was listed by ESPN as one of the top-25 prep players in the state at the time of his signing. In signing with SDSU, he turned down scholarship offers from schools in the Big East, American and Mountain West Conferences. This is the smallest freshman class since Dutcher has been on The Mesa, which dates to the start of the 1999-00 campaign.

## LUTE OLSON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- ▶ **Malachi Flynn**, a redshirt junior guard, was named to the Lute Olson National Player of the Year watch list earlier this season.
- ▶ Flynn is the first Aztec to be named to the Award's watch list in the now 11 years it has been in existence.
- ▶ Before transferring to SDSU, the native of Tacoma, Wash., averaged 12.8 points, 3.2 rebounds, 3.6 assists, while shooting 40.6 percent from the field in two seasons at Washington State.

## PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE POLL

- ▶ San Diego State has been picked second in the annual Mountain West preseason media poll.
- ▶ The preseason favorite, according to the media that regularly cover the conference, is Utah State, which shared the 2018-19 regular-season title and won the conference tournament. The Aggies earned 187 points and all 17 first-place votes to finish in front of SDSU, the team Utah State edged in last season's Mountain West championship game, and its 150 points.
- ▶ New Mexico has been predicted to finish in third place in this year's preseason poll. UNM picked up 141 points to finish ahead of fourth-place Nevada (135 points) and fifth-place Boise State (128).
- ▶ Fresno State (6th; 103 points), UNLV (7th; 89) and Air Force (8th; 76) were the next three teams to fall in line behind the Broncos with Colorado State (9th; 59), Wyoming (10th; 36) and San José State (11th; 17) rounding out the poll.
- ▶ SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last six years. It is also the 11th time in the 21 seasons the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 11 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 15 years. This is the first time in the last six years that the Aztecs haven't received at least one first-place vote.

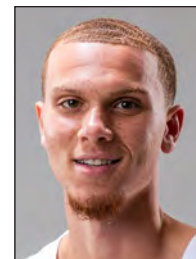

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Third Season • 21st Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, begins his third season as head coach. Dutcher completed his first year at the helm in 2017-18, following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Last season, Dutcher guided San Diego State to a 21-13 record which included multiple victories over nationally ranked Nevada. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first two seasons and for the second year in a row directed his squad to the championship game of the Mountain West Championship tournament.

In his first season, Dutcher led the Aztecs to the 2018 Mountain West tournament title and the NCAA tournament, the program's first appearance in three seasons. He was the only first-year head coach in the NCAA tournament and SDSU ultimately finished the year with a 22-11 record.

Over the course of his 20-year career at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the post-season 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 14 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next year, SDSU was an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tourney, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, SDSU won three games and qualified for the NIT semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

In his final season as associate head coach/head coach in waiting (2016-17), San Diego State posted a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan

Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.
