

AZTEC STORYLINES

BACK IN ACTION: Fresh off their fifth Mountain West Championship in the last six years, the San Diego State baseball team begins its 83rd season of play on Friday, welcoming the University of San Francisco for a three-game set.

Friday, the Aztecs will honor the 2018 Mountain West Championship team with a pregame ring ceremony. In addition, the first 250 fans will receive a free SDSU beach towel.

Friday night's game will be aired on the Mountain West Network. Links to live stats for each game are available on GoAztecs. com.

HISTORY WITH USF: The Aztecs enter this weekend with a 5-3 advantage in the all-time series with San Francisco. Most recently, the

Aztecs defeated the Dons in 2017, 4-2. Seven of the eight all-time meetings have been played in San Diego.

PRESEASON FAVORITES: Mountain West head coaches named SDSU the preseason favorite in the conference, collecting four first-place votes and 32 overall points. SDSU also placed Casey Schmitt, Logan Boyer, and Julian Escobedo on the all-MW preseason team, leaving SDSU in a tie with Nevada for most selections on the preseason all-conference team. SDSU is preseason favorites for the first time since 2014, when SDSU was co-preseason favorites with New Mexico.

In addition, both D1Baseball.com and Baseball America have also projected SDSU to win the Mountain West.

CLASS OF THE MOUNTAIN WEST: In addition to winning their fifth conference crown in the last six years, SDSU led the conference in nearly every team pitching category last season including earned run average (4.03), opposing batting average (.253), strikeouts (467), wins (39), saves (19), hits allowed per nine innings (8.67), fewest runs allowed (291), fewest earned runs allowed (240), fewest extra-base hits allowed (125), fewest triples allowed (9), and fewest home runs allowed (26).

OPENING WEEKEND HISTORY: The Aztecs are 13-5 in the first weekend of the season since the start of the 2013 season, including a three-game sweep of UC Santa Barbara last season.

SUCCESS AT TONY GWYNN STADIUM: The

Aztecs set a Tony Gwynn Stadium record (since 1997) with 25 home wins last season, besting the previous mark of 24 set in 1997, 2002, and 2014. Since the start of the 2012 season, the Aztecs are 131-86 (.604) when playing at home.

AGAINST THE WCC: Against the West Coast Conference, the Aztecs are 12-7 (.632) since Mark Martinez took over as head coach before the 2015 season.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN CASEY

SCHMITT: After a record-setting freshman season, sophomore RHP/IF Casev Schmitt was recognized as a preseason all-American by both the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Assocation (Second Team) and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper (Third Team). After setting SDSU's single-season ERA record (minimum 30 IP) at 0.28, Schmitt was the first Aztec to become a Baseball America First Team Freshman All-American since Stephen Strasburg did so in 2007.

Schmitt enters 2019 having thrown 25.1 scoreless innings and was the only player in the nation last season to have an ERA under 1.00 (minimum 15 IP) and drive in 30 or more runs at the plate. In the Mountain West Championships, Schmitt became the first freshman in the legaue to win Most Valuable Player since SDSU's Ty France did so in 2013.

THE NEW GUYS: SDSU has 14 newcomers for the 2019 season, split between 10 true freshmen, two graduate transfers, and two junior college transfers. Three freshmen in Brian Leonhardt (No. 9 LHP), Jaden Fein (No. 9 OF) and Noah Kaagan (No. 11 OF) rank inside the top 11 at their respective positions among class of 2018 California high school players. Leonhardt, although ranked as a pitcher, is expected to be SDSU's opening day first baseman.

SDSU also added a pair of graduate transfers from USC in Angelo Armenta and Brad Weaman. Armenta is expected to be the Aztecs starting shortstop, while Wegman will begin the year as SDSU's Sunday starter. Armenta recorded a career .239 average in 86 games for the Trojans, while Wegman logged a 5-6 record and 3.93 ERA over four years in Los Angeles. Wegman last season did not allow a run over 10 innings pitched before his season was cut limited due to injury.

Mike Jarvis, a transfer from Saddleback College, is expected to join the starting lineup after recording a career .297/.405/.399 slash line over two years in junior college. Jarvis also provides the Aztec lineup with some speed, having stolen 20 bases on 30 chances in his junior college career. Jacob Cruce also comes from the junior college ranks and led San Joaquin Delta College to a CCCAA state championship and 43-9 record after leading the

team with 11 home runs.

REPLACING WHAT'S GONE: The Aztecs lost four position player starters -- all drafted by MLB teams -- and two pitchers who ranked near the top of the Mountain West. Chase Calabuig, SDSU's all-time games played leader and leading hitter last season, was drafted in the 27th round by Oakland, while Jordan Verdon, the team's leader in home runs, extra-base hits, and RBIs a year ago, was picked by Detroit in the 23rd round. Starting shortstop David Hensley and starting catcher Dean Nevarez were picked up by Houston (26th round) and Seattle (19th round), respectively. 2018 Mountain West Co-Pitcher of the Year Garrett Hill was drafted by Detroit in the 26th round.

SDSU also lost the Mountain West's all-time pitching appearances leader, Jacob Erickson, who ended his career with 120 appearances. Erickson recorded a 2.37 ERA against Mountain West opponents -good for the second-best mark among all qualified pitchers in the conference. Erickson, an all-MW second team honoree, also led the conference in strikeout-to-walk ratio.

2019 SCHEDULE: The 2019 schedule features four teams that are currently nationally ranked, including No. 3/8 Texas Tech who visits Tony Gwynn Stadium on March 5-6. The Aztecs visit defending national champion No. 8/10 Oregon State on April 2-3. SDSU has a weekend series at No. 25/NR Cal State Fullerton from April 12-13 and have a homeand-home with No. NR/25 UC Irvine, with the Anteaters visiting America's Finest City on Feb. 19 before SDSU makes the trip north on April 16.

The Aztecs play each of their first eight games and 16 of their first 20 games at home. After April, where the Aztecs have just four home games for the entire month, SDSU closes its regular season schedule with seven of its last 10 games at home. SDSU's weekend series at Cal State Fullerton is its only non-conference weekend on the road.

SDSU's 2019 schedule features 32 home games and 24 road games.

IN THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION: The Aztecs are one of 18 teams in the country to have reached a regional five times in the last six seasons

and one of nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons. SDSU is one of just three west coast programs to have played in five regionals since 2013, joined by only Oregon State and Cal State Fullerton.

Teams that have reached five regionals in the last six years: Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Clemson, Dallas Baptist, Florida, Florida State, Indiana, Louisville, LSU, Mississippi State, NC State, Oklahoma State, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Rice, San Diego State, Texas A&M, Vanderbilt

ONLY ONES: The Aztecs are the only team in the country to have won five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons.

GOOD IN ALL ASPECTS: The Aztecs were one of five teams in the country last season to have a batting average above .300, an ERA below 4.05, and a fielding percentage above .973 last season, joined by only Oregon State, New Mexico State, Ole Miss, and Minnesota.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Since 2014, the Aztecs lead all Division I California programs in win total.

SHUTTING THINGS DOWN: Heading into 2019, the Aztecs have won 85 consecutive games when leading after eight innings. The streak currently stands as one of the top five longest in the nation.

HOMEGROWN: 11 players on the SDSU roster are from San Diego county. Last season, San Diego natives accounted for 411 of SDSU's 632 hits (65 percent) while San Diego native pitchers pitchers combined for a 1.67 earned run average over 64.1 innings pitched.

2018 (JUNIOR): Finished tied for the team and conference lead with 15 starts and recorded a total of 17 appearances on the year... Recorded a .215 opponent batting average, the second best average among qualified pitchers in the Mountain West... Posted a 4.68 ERA and 4-4 record... 4.68 ERA marked as the 10th best in the conference... 70 strikeouts marked as the seventh most in the MW and 20 batters struck out looking marked as the sixth highest...Finished 10th in the MW with 73 innings pitched... Allowed only two home runs on the year, tied for the lowest number among qualified pitchers in the MW... Took a pair of no-hitters into the seventh inning or later, first against Long Beach State on April 3 where Pyatt did not allow a hit until a two-out double in the eighth inning... Also had a no-hit bit at New Mexico on May 4 until allowing a one-out double in the seventh... Struck out a career-high nine against UNLV on April 27 while also pitching six shutout innings with only three hits allowed in a 1-0 win... Struck out at least five in seven of his 15 starts... Had a streak of 18.2 consecutive scoreless innings from April 13 - May 4, lowering his season ERA from 4.50 to 3.44... Currently 17th in SDSU history with 31 career games started.

Mark Martinez heads into his fifth season as head coach and 14th at SDSU in 2019 after being named the late Tony Gwynn's successor on August 20, 2014.

During his fourth season as head coach in 2018, Martinez became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to win three conference championships. In 2017, Martinez logged his 100th win as head coach and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach the century mark.

Martinez led SDSU to a 39-21 performance in 2018, leaving the Aztecs as one of 13 teams in the nation to have won 39 or more games four times in the past five years. Since the start of the 2014 season — Martinez's final year as SDSU's head assistant coach under Gwynn — the Aztecs have recorded 185 wins, the most among all Division I California programs.

San Diego State will enter the 2019 season as the only team in Division I baseball with five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons. SDSU is one of 18 programs in the nation to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years and one of just two programs in California, joined by only Cal State Fullerton. Statistically, the Aztecs are one of just nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons and will enter 2019 having led the MW in earned run average in back-to-back seasons.

Martinez, who has been a part of 1,030 collegiate baseball wins since starting his coaching career in 1984, enters his fifth season as a head coach with a record of 143-103 (.581). Under his watch, SDSU has reached its highest academic progress rate, highest team grade point average, and highest total of scholar-athletes in its 82-year history. Last April, Martinez received the Center for Community Solutions Champions Award, recognizing his efforts in starting healthy relationships and consent education training with SDSU baseball student-athletes and coaches.

Fifteen Aztecs have been selected by the MLB First-Year Player draft and 10 Aztecs have been named Mountain West scholar athletes (3.5 GPA or better) since 2015. Martinez has also directed 21 student-athletes to all-MW honors over the last four seasons, including back-to-back MW Pitchers of the Year (Brett Seeburger — 2017, Garrett Hill — 2018) and 2017 MW Player of the Year Danny Sheehan.

Martinez entered the start of his head coaching career with 31 years

of coaching experience as an assistant coach, split between nine years on Gwynn's Aztec staff (2006—2014), 17 years at New Mexico (1989—2005), and five seasons at his alma mater Mesa State (1984—1988). With Gwynn, Martinez helped SDSU end an 18-year drought from the NCAA postseason with an appearance in 2009.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had seven of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry, Lance Zawadski, and Greg Allen).

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals.

The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons. Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well. During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season,

only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State. In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American. Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer. During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage. New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88. Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990. In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa, and a son, Cade

Jacob Maekawa's run on a wild pitch thrown by Arizona reliever Tylor Megill handed the San Diego State baseball team a 3-2, 10-inning win in SDSU's opening game of the Tony Gwynn Legacy at Tony Gwynn Stadium. Both the Aztecs and Wildcats posted a two-spot in the first inning, as the Aztecs fought out of a 2-0 deficit with a Chase Calabuig 2-RBI double scoring Julian Escobedo and David Hensley.

Led by a Chad Bible pinch-hit two-RBI double and a Julian Escobedo go-ahead RBI single, SDSU used a four-run eighth inning to defeat Grand Canyon, 5-4, in the final game of the Tony Gwynn Legacy. Garrett Hill dominated GCU's hitters for the first three innings of the game, striking out eight while not allowing a hit.

- San Diego State improved its all-time record against current Big Ten programs to 19-8 (.703).

The Aztecs used a then-season-high 11 runs in a game 2 win over the Spartans, led by a career-high four hits by senior David Hensley who finished his day 4-for-5 with three RBIs. On the mound, Garrett Hill continued his successful start to his 2018 campaign, tossing six shutout innings with five hits allowed, seven strikeouts, and no walks for his second win of the season.

- The 10-run margin of victory is SDSU's largest against SJSU since defeating the Spartans 14-3 on April 27, 2014.

The Aztecs swung the bat well in the early stages of the game, scoring a pair of first-inning runs in thanks to a Jordan Verdon double scoring David Hensley and Julian Escobedo. An inning later, the Aztecs built that lead to 3-0 with leadoff hitter Matt Rudick bringing home Escobedo on a single through the left side of the inning. The Wildcats added to its lead with four runs in the fourth, a pair of runs in the fifth, and a trio of runs in the eighth to give the Wildcats a season-high 13 runs and 15 hits. The Arizona bullpen kept the Aztec bats quiet with four Wildcat relievers combining for 7.1 innings with just one run allowed.

- The loss for SDSU snapped a four-game winning streak against Pac-12 opponents, the team's longest winning streak against the Pac-12 since 2007.
- Matt Rudick continued a successful start to his collegiate career, having reached base in 11 consecutive games after a 3-for-4 performance. Since taking over the leadoff spot on Feb. 26, the freshman is batting .542 (13-for-24) with five RBI in seven games.

Jacob Erickson got the ball for his first start of the 2018 season and shined, recording seven strikeouts while allowing just five hits and one run. The Aztecs got on the board first with Grant Mayeaux's first home run of the season. Chase Calabuig drove in his team-leading 11th RBI of the year to tie the game at 2-2 in the bottom of the sixth, hitting an opposite-field RBI double to left center to score David Hensley. It was Calabuig again who provided the much-needed offense, as aggressive base running in the bottom of the eighth while at third base eventually led to an opportunity to score on a wild pitch thrown by Air Force's Shawn Kelly.

- Combining his 147 wins as an assistant at Mesa State (now Colorado Mesa), his 467 wins as an assistant at New Mexico, his 273 wins as an assistant at San Diego State, and now, his 113 wins as head coach at SDSU, head coach Mark Martinez has now been in the dugout for 1,000 collegiate baseball victories since starting his coaching career in 1984.
- Jacob Erickson made his 100th collegiate pitching apperance.

Air Force jumped out to a 7-0 lead before Chad Bible's second home run of the year cut SDSU's deficit to 7-2. Chase Calabuig later drove in a run on a RBI single. Bible led SDSU with a 3-for-5 showing at the plate.

SDSU took an 8-3 decision over San Diego at Fowler Park, using a seven-run sixth inning to overcome an early 2-0 deficit and salvage a split of the season series against the Toreros. Facing a 2-0 hole heading into the sixth inning, the Aztecs broke out for its largest single-inning outburst of the season, scoring seven runs with the help of two hits, three walks, and three Torero errors.

- San Diego State's seven runs scored in the sixth inning is the most its scored this season and the most scored since scoring 10 in the first inning against Fresno State in the Mountain West tournament on May 25, 2017.
- San Diego State is 7-1 all-time at USD's Fowler Park and have outscored the Toreros 47-20 in those games.
- SDSU is 10-5 in its last 15 meetings against crosstown foe USD.
- Chad Bible logged his fifth multi-hit performance in his last seven games and is hitting .462 (12-for-26) over that span.

The Aztecs opened the game with a 6-0 lead, including a three-run first inning. Matt Rudick, who led the Aztecs at the top of the order with a 3-for-4 performance, started the game off with a leadoff single. The bats continued to produce after Chad Bible reached on a two-out error, with Jordan Verdon capitalizing on a 2-RBI double and Dean Nevarez following with an RBI single.

- Jordan Verdon led SDSU with four RBIs
- Jacob Flores recorded his first career save
- Jorge Fernadez earned the win with 2.1 innings pitched, allowing only one hit and one unearned run.

SDSU fell victim to a walk-off wild pitch in the bottom of the ninth inning, despite taking a 4-1 lead into the bottom of the eighth.

At the plate, the Aztecs outhit Cal Poly, 14-10. SDSU had five players with multi-hit performances, including Escobedo, who notched a career-high four hits in a 4-for-4 day. Nevarez recorded a 3-for-4 showing at the plate, while Verdon, Calabuig, and David Hensley each had a pair of hits.

Highlighted by Garrett Hill's 6.2 shutout innings, SDSU earned a series win over Cal Poly in the series finale. Hill, who lowered his season ERA to 0.95 and earned his fourth win of the season in his Sunday outing, finished the day with 6.2 innings pitched, five strikeouts — all swinging — with five hits and three walks allowed.

SDSU scored all its runs in a three-run top of the third that started with back-to-back singles by Jacob Maekawa and Matt Rudick. Chase Calabuig later drove in Maekawa on a single up the middle, and to cap SDSU's scoring, Jordan Verdon continued his hot streak with a two-RBI single to right-centerfield to score Rudick and David Hensley.

- In San Diego State's 3-1 week, Verdon paced the offense to the tune of an 8-for-17 (.471) showing at the plate, logging six doubles with nine RBI for a .824 slugging percentage. He later went on to win both Collegaite Baseball National Player of the Week and Mountain West Player of the Week.

Dean Nevarez's walk-off single with two outs and the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth inning sealed SDSU's 5-4 win over CSU Bakersfield. The game started with three freshmen shining for the Aztecs on the mound, as Jacob Flores, Casey O'Sullivan, and Daniel Ritcheson combined to give the Aztecs six shutout innings. Four of the game's first six innings for SDSU pitching were 1-2-3 frames and the trio combined for two hits allowed, one walk, one hit by pitch, while striking out five.

- San Diego State is 12-2 in its last 14 one-run games.
- Over his last six games played, Julian Escobedo is 10-for-18 (.556) with a home run and three RBIs.

The Aztecs responded to a 2-0 hole with Chase Calabuig hitting an RBI double in the top of the third to score Julian Escobedo before Dean Nevarez hit a game-tying solo home run in the top of the fourth to knot the score at 2-2.

The Aztecs went to the long ball to tie the game once again in the top of the sixth, as Chad Bible hit his team-leading third home run of the season to tie the game at 3-3.

The Rebels took a 4-3 lead in the bottom of the eighth with a Grant Robbins RBI double. UNLV closer Bryan Menendez retired SDSU's hitters in order in the top of the ninth to seal UNLV's 20th win of the season.

- The Aztecs fall to 7-2 in its last nine games in Las Vegas.
- In just his fourth career start against UNLV, Dean Nevarez hit his fourth career home run against the Rebels. Over his career, Nevarez is 9-for-20 (.450) with four home runs, eight runs scored, 15 RBI, and a 1.300 slugging percentage when playing UNLV.

All nine Aztecs in the starting lineup reached base and eight of nine recorded at least one hit. Bible (4-for-6, 4 RBIs) and Schmitt (4-for-5, 4 RBIs) combined for eight of SDSU's season-high 18 hits and eight of SDSU's season-high 15 RBIs. - Garrett Hill saw a 21.1 inning scoreless streak come to an end in the bottom of the second inning. It was the first run Hill has allowed in conference play this season. On the year, Hill is 5-0 with a 1.32 ERA in addition to a 3-0 record and 0.98 ERA in Mountain West play.
- With the win, the Aztecs earn its first victory over a nationally ranked opponent since defeating No. 25 San Diego 10-1 on March 14, 2017.

- San Diego State's 39 runs over its last two games is the most over a two-game span since scoring 43 against Air Force from May 5-6, 2006. It is the first time since 2003, when SDSU defeated Air Force 19-2 and 18-4 on March 23, 2003, and March 22, 2003, respectively, that the Aztecs have scored 17 or more runs in back-to-back games
- The Aztecs improve to 9-2 in its last 11 games in Las Vegas.
- Chad Bible became the first SDSU player since Danny Sheehan and Seby Zavala (both homered in three consecutive games from May 22-23, 2015) to hit a home run in three consecutive games.
- SDSU's 22 runs against UNLV is tied for most runs the Aztecs have ever scored against the Rebels in 149 all-time meetings. The Aztecs also scored 22 in a 22-1 win over UNLV on March 29, 1997.

Adrian Mardueno improved to 3-0 on the year after pitching 1.1 innings of shutout, hitless relief, which included stranding a pair of inherited runners in the fifth inning.

- Jordan Verdon extended his team-high on-base streak to 21 games and his team-best hitting streak to 10 games.

Jacob Erickson continued an impressive start to his senior campaign, turning in a quality start for the Aztecs with 6.2 innings pitched and scattering five hits and two runs. Erickson, who is now just one appearance shy of tying SDSU's all-time pitching appearance record, logged a career-high eight strikeouts in a 99-pitch outing against the Lobos Thursday night. The Aztecs showed signs of a potential comeback in the bottom of the ninth, as a leadoff Escobedo hit by pitch ended a run of nine consecutive SDSU batters retired. Escobedo advanced to second on a softly hit groundout by Schmitt and advanced to third after Maekawa grounded out to third base. With the tying-run just 90 feet away, New Mexico closer Chris Tripp forced Matt Rudick to fly out to right field and end the ballgame.

 The Aztecs are 8-3 in its last 11 games. All three losses over that span have come by a one-run margin.

An eight-run second inning for the Lobos dug a hole for the Aztecs early on, as the pitching staff surrendered three hit by pitches, five walks, two hits, and a balk. A two-out error allowed the Lobos to score six unearned runs in the inning.

The Aztec lineup immediately began to chip away at the deficit, however, with Jacob Maekawa drawing a bases-loaded walk and Matt Rudick driving in Julian Escobedo on a groundout to second base to help the Aztecs plate a pair in the bottom of the second. SDSU posted another two-spot in the third inning, thanks to a well-hit RBI double in the left centerfield gap by Escobedo to score Dean Nevarez and Jordan Verdon.

- It is the first series loss for the Aztecs this season. SDSU has won five of six weekend series in 2018, 11 of its last 14 Mountain West series, and 15 of its last 18 series overall.
- SDSU had its 24-game winning streak when scoring five or more runs come to an end.
- It is the first time in the 2018 season the Aztecs have suffered back-to-back losses. The Aztecs were a perfect 14-0 in its last 14 games following a loss entering this contest.

Garrett Hill turned in a season-high 8.1 innings with only one run allowed on three hits and four walks, while striking out seven. Hill's only run allowed was due to a two-run home run allowed by Jorge Fernandez in the ninth inning. Prior to that, Hill did not allow a New Mexico runner to reach second base. Joe Fitzhugh's first collegiate RBI coming on a line-drive single to centerfield scored Julian Escobedo for a 1-0 SDSU lead in the bottom of the second. The Aztecs extended that lead further in the fifth, with Jacob Maekawa's leadoff double setting the table for a Chase Calabuig RBI double and a Jordan Verdon sacrifice fly to extend SDSU's lead to 3-0.

- Jacob Maekawa logged a career-high three hits, going 3-for-3 with a run scored.
- Julian Escobedo extended his hitting streak to 11 games with a 2-for-4 performance in Saturday's series finale. Over that span, Escobedo is hitting .524 (22-for-42) with a home run, two doubles, and 11 RBIs. Escobedo has recorded five multi-hit performances in his last six games played.

Justin Goossen-Brown logged another successful start for the Aztecs, going 5.1 innings on the mound for SDSU, allowing just one earned run and four hits allowed.

Washington broke a scoreless tie in the top of the fourth, however, the Aztecs were quick to the task of responding, as a Chase Calabuig leadoff double kick-started a two-run, four-hit inning for the Aztecs that featured RBIs from Dean Nevarez and Casey Schmitt. Harrison Pyatt took a no-hitter bid into the eighth inning before surrendering his first and only hit of the game in SDSU baseball's 5-1 victory over Long Beach State at Lake Elsinore Diamond. SDSU got the bats going early with a three-run first inning. Jordan Verdon hit his 16th double of the season to give the Aztecs a pair of runners in scoring position and in the next at-bat, Dean Nevarez converted on the run-scoring opportunity with a single plating both Verdon and David Hensley. The Aztecs capped the scoring on an RBI single by Casey Schmitt that brought home Nevarez.

- Jordan Verdon hit his 16th and 17th doubles of the season in a 3-for-3 day at the plate to claim sole possession of the national lead in doubles. Teammate Chase Calabuig currently sits in a tie for fourth in the country with 14 doubles.
- SDSU's two hits allowed is a season-best for the Aztecs. It's the fewest hits allowed for the Aztecs since allowing one to Fresno State on March 25, 2017.
- Playing at Lake Elsinore Diamond for the fourth consecutive season, SDSU evens its record in Lake Elsinore to 3-3 and has won each of its last two games.

SDSU defeated Air Force in the series finale 15-11 with the help of 19 total hits, four home runs, and seven total extra-base hits. SDSU started its offensively-focused day with a four-run first inning that featured a three-run inside-the-park home run by David Hensley.

After Air Force made the game tighter with a run in the bottom of the first and a run in the bottom of the fourth, SDSU broke things open with a six-run fifth inning to take a 10-2 lead. A pair of freshman hit back-to-back homers in the frame -- both the first of their respective collegiate careers -- as Casey Schmitt hit a two-run shot just before classmate Joe Fitzhugh hit a solo homer to cap SDSU's fifth-inning outburst.

Jordan Verdon concluded SDSU's 15-run showing with a solo home run, good for his fourth long ball of the season.

On the mound, Justin Goossen-Brown posted 4.1 innings in his first weekend start of the year, allowing four earned runs on 11 hits. Adrian Mardueno improved to 4-0 on the year, posting 3.2 innings in relief of Goossen-Brown.

SDSU was shutout for the first time in the 2018 season. SDSU accumulated just five hits in the contest and were hindered in scoring opportunities by going 0-for-4 with runners in scoring position and 1-for-8 with runners on base.

Garrett Hill suffered his first loss of the season in tough-luck fashion, allowing just two runs over 6.2 innings of work while striking out five and walking one.

All the offense the Falcons mustered came in the second and third, with a Nic Ready solo home run in the second inning and a Colby Brown RBI single in the third.

 Jacob Erickson became SDSU's all-time career appearances leader after relieving Hill, recording the 107th outing of his career on Saturday. Erickson set the new all-time Aztec record in impressive fashion, retiring all four batters he faced.

SDSU found itself in a large hole early in the game, as UC Irvine jumped out to a 7-0 lead after a seven-run second inning. The Anteaters recorded seven base hits in the frame, including three doubles and a Ryan Fitzpatrick three-run home run that capped the second-inning outburst. UC Irvine's lead grew to 10-0 after a run in the fourth and two runs in the sixth.

The Aztecs avoided the shutout with a two-run bottom of the ninth that featured RBI singles by David Hensley and Grant Mayeaux.

- Over his last 16.1 innings pitched, Justin Goossen-Brown has surrendered just two earned runs, good for a 0.55 earned run average over his last three appearances. Goossen-Brown's 3.13 earned run average is now the best on the team.

The game-changing moment came off the bat of Jordan Verdon, who hit a two-out, game-tying grand slam in the top of the sixth to tie the game at 7-7. The Aztecs first three runs of the game came in thanks to a pair of Chad Bible RBI singles and a two-out RBI triple by Julian Escobedo in the top of the fifth.

After Verdon's game-tying blast, the game remained tied until Dean Nevarez gave SDSU an 8-7 advantage with an RBI single to score Chase Calabuig. SDSU added several insurance runs after Verdon scored on a wild pitch and Jacob Maekawa hit a 2-RBI single to bring the score to 11-7 after eight innings.

- Jordan Verdon hit his second grand slam of the season, marking the first time since 2015 that SDSU has hit multiple arand slams in a season. Verdon is the first Aztec in the Mountain West-era (since 2000) to have multiple grand slams in the same season (also hit a grand slam against UNLV on March 25).
- Jordan Verdon recorded his 37th extra-base hit of the season with his grand slam on Friday night, giving him the most extra-base hits in a single season since Chris Gwynn tallied 59 extra-base hits during the 1984 season.
- Calabuig recorded his 250th career hit, becoming the fourth player in Aztec history to reach that mark.

After New Mexico responded with a two-run third inning, SDSU extended its lead to 4-2 in the ensuing frame, as Casey Schmitt hit a sacrifice fly to right to score Escobedo.

The two-run third inning was SDSU starter Jorge Fernandez's one of few blemishes on the afternoon, as the senior right-hander was one out shy of his third consecutive quality start, pitching 5.2 innings with three runs and seven hits allowed.

Nine different Aztecs recorded at least one hit, led by four-hit performances by Hensley (4-for-6) and Calabuia (4-for-6) and three-hit showings by Matt Rudick (3-for-5) and Jordan Verdon (3-for-5). As a unit, the 1-4 hitters of Rudick, Hensley, Calabuig and Verdon combined to go 14-for-22 (.637) with three doubles. 10 runs scored, and 11 RBIs. Hensley set a new career-high with

RBIs by David Hensley and Chase Calabuig in the bottom of the seventh paved the way to a comeback victory over San Jose State in the first ronud of the Mountain West Championships. Jacob Erickson posted 2.2 innings of perfect relief to earn his fourth win of the season, while in a battle of the two MW Co-Pitchers of the Year, Garrett Hill contributed a quality start with 6.1 innings pitched, allowing just one earned run and five hits. Hill started his outing retiring 12 of the first 13 batters he faced.

- SDSU is 21-6 in the Mountain West tournament since 2013.
- The Aztecs win their third straight MW tournament opening game.
- SDSU improves to 23-10 at Tony Gwynn Stadium this season.

The San Diego State bullpen, highlighted by Casey Schmitt's first collegiate win, faced the minimum over 7.1 innings and allowed just one hit.

- Game tied the MW tournament record for the longest game (12 innings).
- This marked the longest game of the season (by innings) for SDSU this season.

After a four-run fourth for UNLV gave the Aztecs a two-run deficit, Casey Schmitt hit a game-tying two run double and took a two-run lead after a pair of runs scored on an error by third baseman Dillon Johnson. SDSU went on to add insurance runs with a fiverun sixth, two-run seventh, and a run in the eighth. Nevarez and Hensley led the team with three hits each.

SDSU was stifled by NWST starting pitcher Jerry Maddox, who allowed just three hits over six shutout innings. David Hodo followed Maddox in relief and held the Aztecs hitless for the final three innings.

The Aztecs' best offensive chance came in the bottom of the sixth, as David Hensley kicked the inning off with a double. After Chase Calabuig drew a walk and Chad Bible was hit by a pitch, Maddox was able to maintain the Demons' 5-0 lead, forcing Julian Escobedo to ground into a 4-6-3 double play

Hensley led the Aztecs offensively, going 2-for-4.






