• The Aztecs, who have four of their last five games, play at Nevada Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. PT

• The game will be streamed on the Mountain West Network. Additionally, there will be an audio-only broadcast with Chris Ello (12th season) on the call.

• SDSU played Nevada three times last year and went 1-2, including an overtime loss in the first round of the Mountain West Tournament.

• The Aztecs lost at first place Boise State 91-67 Saturday afternoon. Mallory Adams led SDSU with 17 points.

• Zayn Dornstauder scored 14 points (6-for-10) to set a new career-high. She is averaging 7.8 points and 5.0 rebounds per game during conference play while shooting 49.3 percent from the floor.

• Mallory Adams has scored 10 or more points seven of her last eight games, averaging 14.1 points over that span.

Adams is averaging 8.8 rebounds per game, the most for an Aztec since Mary Apiafi the in 1999-2000 season (9.1).

• Sophia Ramos leads all freshmen in the Mountain West in points, assists, field goal percentage and minutes.

• Ramos is the only true freshman in the nation to average 13 points, 4.5 assists and 4.5 rebounds per game.

 Sophomore Najé Murray has moved into the top ten in school history for career three-pointers and three-point attempts. Entering the weekend, she is 110-330 (.333), which would rank her at No. 7 for three-point makes and attempts. At her current rate of 2.5 made threes per game, Murray has a chance to break the SDSU all-time record for made three-pointers in a season.
 SDSU leads the conference with 13.8 made free throws per game. Mallory Adams is third in the MW in free throws made and first in attempts.

• The Aztecs are in seventh place in the Mountain West. They began last week tied for tenth place. The top five teams receive a first round bye in the Mountain West Tournament.

• SDSU's recent four game win streak was their longest since February 2016 when they won five in a row.

Last Time Out (67-91 at Boise State, 2-16-19)

The Aztecs women's basketball team (10-13, 5-7) had their four-game winning streak with a 91-67 loss at first place Boise State (21-3, 12-1) Saturday afternoon. The high-powered Bronco offense scored 50 points on 68 percent shooting in the first half and built an insurmountable lead.

The Aztecs were once again led by Mallory Adams, who scored 17 points for the second straight game. Téa Adams had 15 and Zayn Dornstauder set a new careerhigh with 14 points.

A 7-0 Bronco run early in the first quarter put Boise State up 16-8 and they never looked back. BSU started the game making seven of their first ten shots with Braydey Hodgins scoring nine quick points. The Aztecs played well offensively for the majority of the first half but struggled to keep up with the Broncos' firepower.

Zayn Dornstauder scored the first points of the second quarter to get SDSU within six points but that was the closest they would get despite making four of their first five shots. Every time the Aztecs scored, the Broncos had an answer on the other end. Boise State shot 69 percent from the floor in the first half and 46 percent from three.

The Aztecs shot 48 percent in the first frame, but their two leading scorers, Sophia Ramos and Najé Murray, were both held scoreless. SDSU led by Zayn Dornstauder's 12 points. Boise State's Tess Amundsen, who entered the game averaging 3.7 points, had 15 in the first half as the Broncos took a 50-35 lead in to the halftime break.

The Broncos cooled off in the third quarter, but the Aztecs did as well, and the Broncos were able to extend their lead to 19 points entering the fourth quarter.

The Aztecs were outrebounded 38-28 and BSU won the turnover battle 17-8.

Boise State had four players in double-figures and were led by Braydey Hodgins' 22 points. Marta Hermida hit four three-pointers and had 16 points, Tess Amundson had 15 points, all of which came in the first half and A'Shanti Coleman chipped in 10.

Noting the Boise State Game

The Aztecs gave up 28 points in the first quarter, 50 points in the first half and 88 points in the game. All were season-highs for a SDSU opponent.
SDSU had assists on 17 of thier 24 field goals.
This was just the second time an opponent has shot 50% or better from the floor against SDSY (Wyoming, 1-9-19).
The Broncos scored 18 fast break points on Saturday, the second most the Aztecs have allowed this season.
Zayn Dornstauder set a new career-high with 14 points.
Sophia Ramos and Najé Murray, the Aztecs' top leading scorers. combined to score 12 points, their lowest combined score in a game this season.
Senior Loli Gomez went 1-for-2 from three and is now shooting 47.1 percent (8-17) from long range on the season.
Mallory Adams led the team in scoring with 17 points. She has now scored 10 or more points in seven of SDSU's last eight games.

- They are also last in three-point percentage (.278) and threes made per game (4.3).
- Jade Redmon (14.7) and Terae Briggs (14.5) are their top two leading scorers.
- Briggs averages 8.0 rebounds per game and is shoots 51.9 percent from the floor.
- Head Coach Amanda Levens (2nd season) led Nevada to the Mountain West Tournament championship game last season as the No. 7 seed.

All-Time Series vs. the Wolf Pack

- The all-time series is tied at 10-10.
- Since Nevada joined the Mountain West, the series is tied at 7-7.
- The Aztecs are 2-6 against the Wolf Pack in Reno.
- Nevada has won two in a row and three of the last four.
- SDSU and Nevada faced off in the first round of last year's Mountain West Tournament with the Wolf Pack winning 95-84 in overtime.
- The first meeting was January 2, 1984, a 90-44 Aztec win at home, which is still the biggest SDSU win in the series.

Climbing the Charts

• Sophomore Najé Murray has moved into the top ten in school history for career three-pointers and three-point attempts. Entering the weekend, she is 110-330 (.333), which would rank her at No. 7 for three-point makes and attempts.

• At her current rate of 2.5 made threes per game, Murray has a chance to break the SDSU all-time record for made three-pointers in a season. Jamey Cox (2003) and Courtney Clements share the record with 77 made.

• Murray leads the conference in made three-pointers and is second it attempts and made threes per game.

• Mallory Adams has scored 10 or more points seven of her last eight games, averaging 14.1 points over that span.

• Adams is averaging 8.8 rebounds per game, the most for an Aztec since Mary Apiafi the in 1999-2000 season (9.1). She is bringing in 9.8 boards per game in conference play, the second most in the league.

- She has 10 or more rebounds in 12 games this season and in 8 of the Aztecs' 12 MW games.
- Mallory Adams is one of five true freshmen nationally to average 11.0 points and 8.5 rebounds per game.
- She leads the Mountain West in rebounding for freshmen.
- She is top ten in the nation in free throws made and attempted per game among true freshmen.
- Adams has led the Aztecs in rebounding in 17 of their 22 games.

• Adams leads the conference in free throw attempts and is third in made free throws. and is top ten in the nation in free throws made and attempted per game among true freshmen.

• Mallory Adams was recently named a Star of the Month for January by the San Diego Sports Association. In seven January games, Adams had three double-doubles and 10-plus rebounds five times.

• Earlier this month, Adams became the first Aztec to have three consecutive double-doubles since Paris Johnson had four straight in the 2008-09 season.

• Adams averaged a double-double at the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic and was named to the All-Tournament Team.

Sophia Ramos

- Sophia Ramos leads the Aztecs in scoring with 13.9 points per game, this is best among freshmen in the MW.
- Ramos is the only true freshman in the nation averaging at least 13 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game.
- She leads all freshmen in the Mountain West in points, assists, field goal percentage and minutes.
- She is fourth in the conference with an .817 free throw percentage and sixth in three-point percentage (.371)
- Ramos has scored in double-digits in 19 of their 23 games.
- Ramos has led the Aztecs in assists in 17 of their 23 games.
- Sophia Ramos scored a career-high 28 points at CSUN (12-9-18) with seven three-pointers including six in the fourth quarter.
- Her 28 points and 10 made field goals in that game were the most by an Aztec this season.
- Her seven three-pointers tie her for the second most in school history and her she became the first Aztec to hit six three-pointers in a quarter
- Despite being 5'9", she is second on the team in rebounds (4.6 per game). She had a career-high 10 vs. Arizona (12-2-18).

Earning it at the Line

• The Aztecs lead the conference in made free throws and are third in attempts. They are 70.5 percent from the line, fourth best in the league.

• In conference play, Najé Murray is shooting 92.3 percent from the line (24-26), second best in the league. Sophia Ramos is fourth (86.2 percent).

• Mallory Adams leads the conference in free throw attempts and is third in made free throws. and is top ten in the nation in free throws made and attempted per game among true freshmen.

- Najé Murray is second in the conference with 2.2 steals per game.
- Murray has led the team or tied for the team lead in steals in 17 of their 22 games.

Block Party

- The Aztecs are fourth in the conference in blocked shots per game (3.7).
- They already have 86 blocks, which would be their most in a season since 2013-14.

• Zayn Dornstauder is third in the conference with 1.3 blocks per game.

Youth Movement

• The Aztecs started two freshmen, two sophomores and one junior in the season opener against Hawai'i. That group had a combined 33 career starts entering the game.

• The freshmen duo of Sophia Ramos and Mallory Adams earned the starting nod in the season opener, marking the first time two freshmen started the season opener for the Aztecs since 2003 (Michelle Elliott and Courtney Fritz).

Aztecs Ink Isabela

• Head Coach Stacie Terry and her staff announced the signing of Isabela Hernandez to a letter of intent in November.

• Hernandez has helped her team make the Washington 1A state tournament for the second consecutive year.

• Earlier this year, she hit seven three-pointers in a game and scored 25 points.

• Hernandez, a four-star recruit according to Prospects Nation, helped Lynden Christian High School (Bellingham, Wash.) to a perfect 29-0 record and state championship last season.

• A 6'2" wing, Hernandez averaged 13 points per game last season along with 5.3 rebounds. She knocked down 50 percent of her shots from the field and was 88 percent from the free-throw line.

 Hernandez was an all-state selection last year and earned all-league and all-county recognition as both a sophomore and as a junior. She was heavily recruited and received offers from Gonzaga, Colorado, Washington State and Colorado State among others.

Preseason Notes

• The Aztecs were picked to finish ninth in the Mountain West preseason poll.

• The Aztecs lost four starters and six players total from a year ago. The Aztecs return just 34.6 percent of their scoring from last season.

Najé Murray (Stockton, Calif.), who was named to the Mountain West all-freshman team last year, is the Aztecs' leading returning scorer (9.3 ppg). She led all MW freshmen in three-pointers made per game and was fourth overall in scoring among freshmen.

• The support from the community was record-breaking a season ago. The Aztecs had 22,069 fans over their 16 home games for an average of 1,379. That broke the total and average attendance records set in 2007-08, when the Aztecs drew 14,730 fans for an average of 1,133 per game.

• The Aztecs have had a winning record at home in 10 of the past 12 seasons.

• The Aztecs shot 71.4 percent from the free throw line last year, their best mark since the 1988-89 season and the fourth best rate in program history.

• The Aztecs made 200 three-pointers last season, the second most in program history (204, 2016-17). They made 33.7 percent of their three-point attempts, their best percentage since the 2009-10 season and the fourth best rate in program history

• For the second straight season San Diego State's incoming freshman class is nationally ranked. The Aztecs' 2018 recruiting class is ranked 59th nationally


