- The Aztecs take on New Mexico at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday for Field Trip Day.
- The game will be streamed on the Mountain West Network with Chris Ello (12th season) on the call.
- New Mexico is 18-2 and 8-1 in Mountain West play, tied for first in the league with Boise State.
- The Aztecs lost to the Lobos in Albuquerque 87-81 on January 23. SDSU nearly rallied back from a 19-point deficit, but the Lobos ended the game on an 8-0 run.
- SDSU is coming off a 69-68 win over San José State Saturday, which snapped a four game losing streak.
- The Aztecs had a season-high 20 assists in their win over the Spartans Saturday.
- Mallory Adams finished with 14 points and 13 rebounds, which tied a career-high. It was her third straight double-double and seventh of the year. Adams now has 10 games with 10 or more rebounds and is averaging a double-double in MW play.
- Adams is the first Aztec to have three consecutive double-doubles since Paris Johnson had four straight in the 2008-09 season.
- Adams is averaging 8.7 rebounds per game, the most for an Aztec freshman since Ashlee Dunlap in the 2002-03 season. She is bringing in 10.2 boards per game in conference play, the second most in the league.
- Sophomore Najé Murray set a new career-high with nine assists against San José State last Saturday. Her previous best was eight which came against the Spartans as well. Murray also tied a career-high with nine rebounds.
- Murray is one of six players in the nation to average 14 points, 2.4 steals and 2.4 three-pointers per game.
- Sophia Ramos leads all Mountain West freshmen in points, assists, free throw percentage, assist-to-turnover ratio and minutes played. In conference play, she is shooting 88.0 percent from the free throw line, the most accurate among all qualified players.
- Ramos is the only true freshman in the nation to average 14 points, 4.5 assists and 4.5 rebounds per game.
- Zayn Dornstauder is averaging 8.4 points per game in conference play while shooting 55.3 percent from the floor.

Last Time Out (66-75 at Air Force, 1-30-19)

The Aztec women's basketball team (7-12, 2-6) withstood a rally from San José State (2-18, 1-8) to win 69-68 Saturday afternoon inside Viejas Arena.

SDSU led by 17 points in the first quarter, but saw the Spartans take their first lead of the game with 16 seconds left after Analyss Benally banked in a three-pointer. On the other end, Téa Adams knifed through the lane and scooped up the game-winner off the glass with two seconds left to secure the nail-biting victory for the Aztecs.

"It was exciting," Adams said after the game. "We were all pumped up. The game wasn't supposed to come down to the wire, but we did what we had to do in the end. Coach said in the huddle that we had to execute, I had to make that bucket, and that's what I tried to do."

"We've been in so many tight games that I think the team is used to it and they don't panic," head coach Stacie Terry added. "This group never gives up and I'm so proud of them."

Najé Murray had a team-high 16 points with a career-high nine assists and seven rebounds. Mallory Adams recorded her third straight double-double with 14 points and 13 rebounds. Sophia Ramos finished with 13 points, five rebounds and five assists and Téa Adams had 13 points including the game-winner. This is Adams' second game-winner of the year. She had another one against Hawai'i in the season opener.

"Offensively, we came out on all cylinders," Coach Terry said "I was proud of the way we started in the first quarter, kind of the reverse of what we normally do. Then we started to slow down, but the good thing about that is our defense got the stops that we needed."

The Aztecs, who typically struggle in the first quarter, hit the ground running Saturday. They scored the game's first seven points and opened up a 16-2 and 22-5 lead. They were using excellent ball movement to create good looks and had assists on seven of their first eight buckets with six players scoring in the opening quarter. SDSU had just one turnover in the first quarter and ten in the game and held a 26-15 lead after one, the most first quarter points they have had this season.

SDSU shot just 23 percent in the second quarter and scored just nine points as the Spartans started to cut into the Aztec lead. SDSU took a 35-30 lead into the halftime break, but the Spartans rallied to tie it up at 41-41 midway through the third quarter.

The Aztecs immediately responded and pushed their lead back to eight. They would have that same margin of lead with 2:57 left in the game, but a 7-0 Spartan run saw their lead evaporate. Téa Adams hit a jumper from the top of the key to push the lead back to three with 52 seconds left but SJSU scored a lay-up on the other end to cut the score to 66-65.

On the next possession, Sophia Ramos found Mallory Adams in the lane from the baseline. Adams was fouled and hit one free throw to put SDSU up two. SJSU's Benally then banked a three in with 16 seconds left, which was the Spartans' first lead of the day.

After a SDSU timeout advanced the ball, the Aztecs had the ball down one with 14 seconds left. Sophia Ramos sucked the defense in and found Adams who split two defenders, sidestepped another and scooped it off the glass for the game-winner.

"We've worked on that set so Tea was comfortable in that situation," Coach Terry said. "If she didn't have that, we had a backscreen for Najé coming to the top of the floor, so we had a couple options."

Noting the San José State Game

- The Aztecs only had ten turnovers, their fewest since their season opener against Hawai'i.
- SDSU had a season-high 20 assists, giving them a 2-1 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- The Aztecs scored 26 points in the first quarter, their highest output in the opening quarter this year.
- SDSU tied a season-high with 47 rebounds.
- This was the Aztecs first win of the year when having less made free throws than their opponent and just their second win when having a worse field goal percentage (2-9).
- SDSU is now 6-1 when holding their opponent to less than 40 percent shooting from the field.
- The Aztecs had zero blocks in the game, the first time that has happened this season.
- SDSU had just four bench points, tied for their lowest bench output of the year (Air Force 1-12-19).
- Mallory Adams finished with 14 points and 13 rebounds, which tied a career-high. It was her third straight double-double and seventh of the year. Adams now has 10 games with 10 or more rebounds and is averaging a double-double in MW play.
- Adams is the first Aztec to have three consecutive double-doubles since Paris Johnson had four straight in the 2008-09 season.
- Najé Murray had a career-high nine assists. This topped her previous best of eight which also happened against San José State (2-24-18). Murray also tied a career-high with seven rebounds.

Scouting the Lobos

- New Mexico is 18-2 overall and 8-1 in the Mountain West.
- Their lone MW loss was to UNLV, a 66-57 defeat on the road on January 9th
- Their only other loss was against Auburn, a 79-76 defeat at home on November 11.
- They are 6-1 on the road so far this season.
- New Mexico has won six games in a row.
- The Lobos lead the conference and are top ten in the nation in blocks (6.6) and rebounds per game (44.5).
- They are holding opponents to 36.4 percent shooting from the field, second in the conference.
- Jaisa Nunn (15.7) and Aisia Robertson (14.4) lead the Lobos in scoring. Nunn shoots a MW-best 56.4 percent from the field.
- Robertson leads the MW and is fifth in the nation with 7.2 assists per game.
- Nike McClure is 11th in the country with 2.7 blocks per game.
- Jaisa Nunn averages 8.5 rebounds per game, second most in the conference.
- Head Coach Mike Bradbury (3rd year) is 58-28 in 2.5 years at UNM. Prior to coming to New Mexico, he was the head coach at Morehead State (2007-10) and Wright State (2010-16).

All-Time Series vs. Lobos

- The Lobos lead the all-time series 34-28
- New Mexico beat the Aztecs 87-81 two weeks ago in Albuquerque.
- They played only once last year, and the Aztecs earned a 97-89 win at home. In the game, McKynzie Fort scored 32 points and Najé Murray had a career-high 29 with seven three-pointers. Geena Gomez dished out 11 assists.
- SDSU is 13-12 all-time at home vs. New Mexico
- From 2001-2008, the Lobos beat SDSU 19 straight times.
- They first met January 18, 1992, a 91-44 SDSU win. The Aztecs won the first 10 meetings.

- Mallory Adams finished with 14 points and 13 rebounds, which tied a career-high last Saturday. It was her third straight double-double and seventh of the year. Adams now has 10 games with 10 or more rebounds and is averaging a double-double in MW play.
- Adams is the first Aztec to have three consecutive double-doubles since Paris Johnson had four straight in the 2008-09 season.
- Adams is averaging 8.7 rebounds per game, the most for an Aztec freshman since Ashlee Dunlap in the 2002-03 season. She is bringing in 10.2 boards per game in conference play, the second most in the league.
- Mallory Adams is one of five true freshmen nationally to average 11.5 points and 8.5 rebounds per game.
- She leads the Mountain West in rebounding for freshmen.
- She is top ten in the nation in free throws made and attempted per game among true freshmen.
- Adams had 10 or more rebounds in three straight games earlier this year. The last Aztec to do that was SDSU legend and current pro Chelsea Hopkins, who did it in the 2011-12 season.

Sophia Ramos

- Sophia Ramos leads the Aztecs in scoring with 14.4 points per game, this is seventh in the conference and best among freshmen.
- Ramos is the only true freshman in the nation averaging at least 14 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game.
- She leads all freshmen in the Mountain West in points, assists, assist-to-turnover ratio, free throw percentage and minutes.
- She is second in the conference with an .821 free throw percentage
- Sophia Ramos scored a career-high 28 points at CSUN (12-9-18) with seven three-pointers including six in the fourth quarter.
- Her 28 points and 10 made field goals in that game were the most by an Aztec this season.
- Her seven three-pointers tie her for the second most in school history and her she became the first Aztec to hit six three-pointers in a quarter
- Despite being 5'9", she is second on the team in rebounds (4.8 per game). She had a career-high 10 vs. Arizona (12-2-18).

Earning it at the Line

- The Aztecs lead are second in the conference in made free throws and third in attempts. They are 70.2 percent from the line, fifth best in the conference.
- Mallory Adams is second in the conference in made free throws and first in attempts. and is top ten in the nation in free throws made and attempted per game among true freshmen.

Master Thief

- Najé Murray is second in the conference with 2.4 steals per game.
- Murray has led the team or tied for the team lead in steals in 15 of their 19 games.

Block Party

- The Aztecs are fourth in the conference in blocked shots per game.
- They have already eclipsed their total for blocks from last year (79-64).
- Zayn Dornstauder is third in the conference with 1.4 blocks per game.

Youth Movement

- The Aztecs started two freshmen, two sophomores and one junior in the season opener against Hawai'i. That group had a combined 33 career starts entering the game.
- The freshmen duo of Sophia Ramos and Mallory Adams earned the starting nod in the season opener, marking the first time two freshmen started the season opener for the Aztecs since 2003 (Michelle Elliott and Courtney Fritz).

Aztecs Ink Isabela

- Head Coach Stacie Terry and her staff announced the signing of Isabela Hernandez to a letter of intent in November.
- Last month, she hit seven three-pointers in a game and scored 25 points.
- Hernandez, a four-star recruit according to Prospects Nation, helped Lynden Christian High School (Bellingham, Wash.) to a perfect 29-0 record and state championship last season.
- A 6'2" wing, Hernandez averaged 13 points per game last season along with 5.3 rebounds. She knocked down 50 percent of her shots from the field and was 88 percent from the free-throw line.
- Hernandez was an all-state selection last year and earned all-league and all-county recognition as both a sophomore and as a junior. She was heavily recruited and

Preseason Notes

- The Aztecs were picked to finish ninth in the Mountain West preseason poll.
- The Aztecs lost four starters and six players total from a year ago. The Aztecs return just 34.6 percent of their scoring from last season.
- Najé Murray (Stockton, Calif.), who was named to the Mountain West all-freshman team last year, is the Aztecs' leading returning scorer (9.3 ppg). She led all MW freshmen in three-pointers made per game and was fourth overall in scoring among freshmen.
- The support from the community was record-breaking a season ago. The Aztecs had 22,069 fans over their 16 home games for an average of 1,379. That broke the total and average attendance records set in 2007-08, when the Aztecs drew 14,730 fans for an average of 1,133 per game.
- The Aztecs have had a winning record at home in 10 of the past 12 seasons.
- The Aztecs shot 71.4 percent from the free throw line last year, their best mark since the 1988-89 season and the fourth best rate in program history.
- The Aztecs made 200 three-pointers last season, the second most in program history (204, 2016-17). They made 33.7 percent of their three-point attempts, their best percentage since the 2009-10 season and the fourth best rate in program history
- For the second straight season San Diego State's incoming freshman class is nationally ranked. The Aztecs' 2018 recruiting class is ranked 59th nationally (according to Prospects Nation), fourth in the Mountain West. G/F Mallory Adams (Frisco, Texas), G Jayden Perez (Las Cruces, N.M.) and G Sophia Ramos (San Antonio, Texas) comprise the freshmen class.
- Transfers Zayn Dornstauder (Ball State) and Taylor Kalmer (Oregon State) will also join the Aztecs this year, although Kalmer will sit out the 2018-19 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Dornstauder, a 6'3" center from Canada, redshirted at Ball State last year after playing two years at San Francisco as a reserve. Kalmer, a 5'8" guard, spent her past three years at Pac-12 powerhouse Oregon State where she averaged a career-high 6.0 points per game last season.
