General Notes

- San Diego State has its three-game win streak snapped. The Aztecs most recent previous loss came prior to tonight came on Tue., Jan. 22 (two weeks ago today).
- The Aztecs have their two-game win streak against the Lobos snapped.
- San Diego State is 3-1 in Mountain West Conference "quick turnaround" games (games played two days between the two game).
- The loss snapped a six-game win streak in games played during the month of February.
- SDSU lost for just the second time on a Tuesday this season (6-2).

Game Notes

- This marked the first time this season the Aztecs have lost a game in which they had a rebound advantage. SDSU is now 9-1 when owning an advantage on the glass (tonight: SDSU 34, New Mexico 32).
- After committing a season-low eight turnovers in the win over San Jose State Saturday, the Aztecs had 16 miscues tonight that led to 25 New Mexico points.
- Prior to the game against New Mexico, SDSU had held seven straight opponents to less than 50 percent shooting from the field.
- This marked the fourth time this season that the Aztecs have lost a game they were leading at intermission.

Player Notes

Jalen McDaniels (game-high 25 points, team-high 9 rebounds, 11-19 FGs)

Tied a career-high by reaching double figures in an 11th straight game... Has 20+ points in consecutive games for the first time in his 55-game career... His 11 made field goals made are a career-high (previous: 10 twice)... Now has 10+ points in 22 of his last 23 games... Surpassed the 20-point plateau for the eighth time in his career (all this season)... The Aztecs fall to 6-2 when he scores 20+ points... He led SDSU in scoring for the 10th time this season (19th time in his career) and in rebounding for the 18th time this season (36th time in his career)... This is the 10th straight game he has led the Aztecs in rebounding... Numbers over his past 11 games: 20.4 points, 10.0 rebounds, while shooting 54.2 percent from the field... His 19 field goal attempts matched his career high.

Devin Watson (13 points, 3 assists, 2 steals)

Scored 12 of his 13 points after intermission... Reached double figures for the sixth straight game, the 19th time this season and 84th time in his career... Led the team in assists for the 17th time this season.
