SCENE SETTER (through the games of Thurs., March 14)

- San Diego State, winner of a Mountain West men's basketball championship record 11 titles, advance to the semifinals for the 12th consecutive season and will face No. 14/17 Nevada for the second time in seven days.
- The Aztecs-Wolf Pack game will be broadcast nationally by CBS Sports Network and the contest can be heard on 101.5 KGB, XTRA Sports 1360 and FOX Sports IE 1350.
- The Aztecs and Wolf Pack split the season series this season, with each team defending its home court (SDSU, 65-57, in San Diego on Feb. 20 and Nevada, 81-53, last Saturday in Reno).
- San Diego State has won 11 of the last 14 meetings with the Wolf Pack and are 3-0 in neutral site meetings. The Aztecs is 2-0 against Nevada in the Mountain West tourney - winning twice in the semifinals (2016 and 2018).
- The Aztecs are 10-4 all-time in the semifinal round of the Mountain West tourney.
- San Diego State has won the event a record five times (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011 and 2018).
- Amazingly, San Diego State has played for the tournament title in four of the last five years and in eight of the last 10 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2018).
- This is the fifth time SDSU has earned the four seed in the event. The Aztecs own an 8-3 record when in the four position, including the 2010 season when they won their third MW tournament championship.
- San Diego State has won the event as the one seed, two seed, four seed and five seed (twice).
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, no team has won more games in a building the NCAA does not consider its home venue than the Aztecs 27 victories in Thomas & Mack Center. Villanova is second with 26 wins at Madison Square Garden (see chart, bottom page one).
- San Diego State is 3-1 in its last four games against the Wolf Pack and has handed Nevada three of its last six losses. Since Feb. 12, 2017, SDSU is 4-2 against Nevada while the rest of the country is a combined 9-65.
- San Diego State has defeated 33 AP nationally-ranked teams at the time of the game in school history.

- The Aztecs have won at least 19 games in 14 straight seasons (counts this season). Entering the year that was tied for the 7th-longest active streak in the nation.
- San Diego State has won the Mountain West Conference postseason tournament a record five times (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011 and 2018).

Trends:

- SDSU is 18-3 this season and 37-6 under Brian Dutcher when holding the opposition to 45.0 percent or less FG shooting.
- SDSU 37-4 last 41x when owing a higher FG pct.
- The Aztecs are 30-3 in the Dutcher era when holding opponents to 45 percent FG shooting and 35 percent 3FG shooting.

- The Aztecs are 11-11 in their last 22 games against top 25 competition. SDSU is 10-6 in its last 16 games against AP Top 25 teams not ranked in the top 10.
- Since the start of the 2017-18 campaign, San Diego State's 4-4 record against AP Top 25 teams at the time of the game is tied for the 12th-best record in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2017-18 season, San Diego State's 4-4 record as an unranked team vs. nationally-ranked opponents at game time is tied for the second best record nationally (min. 8 games) (*top 5 list is located below on page one*).

SEASON QUICK HITS (through the games of Thurs., March 14)

- San Diego State has won 20 games for the second consecutive season (both Brian Dutcher seasons as head coach) and 13 of the last 14 seasons. SDSU has 23 20-win seasons in school history.
- San Diego State ended the Mountain West season with an 11-7 record and was the only team to defeat both Nevada and Utah State.
- The Aztecs finished in a tie for fourth-place despite playing the league's fourth most difficult conference schedule and toughest among the top six seeds. The Aztecs did not play at Wyoming and did not have a home game against Colorado State.
- SDSU's defense continues to improve at a dramatic rate. The Aztecs, who earlier this season allowed four opponents in a six-game stretch to shoot above 50 percent, rank among the top of the conference in several defensive categories. In Mountain West games only, SDSU ranks 2nd in scoring defense (66.7), field goal percentage defense (.413), and KenPom defensive efficiency (97.4).
- In conference games, **Jalen McDaniels** averaged 16.4 points, 8.2 rebounds and shot 47.7 percent from the field. In the Mountain West era, only Randy Holcomb (2001-02) produced those numbers in conference play.
- San Diego State's sophomore class of **McDaniels**, **Matt Mitchell** and **Jordan Schakel** is averaging 32.9 points per game. If the season ended today it would

come close to being the highest scoring sophomore class in school history, currently held by the 1999-00 sophomore class that included six players (34.4). Keep in mind that Schakel has missed six games due to the injury.

- The Aztecs are 37-4 the last 41 times they have had a higher field goal percentage than their opponent.
- San Diego State is 18-3 this season and 37-6 under Brian Dutcher when holding the opposition to 45.0 percent field goal shooting or less.
- SDSU is 30-3 in the Dutcher era when holding the opposition to 45 percent field goal shooting and 35 percent three-point field goal shooting.
- San Diego State is 15-2 this season when owning an advantage in rebounds (and 32-8 in the Brian Dutcher era).
- San Diego State is 29-13 in its last 42 games - regardless of location - dating back to last season.
- San Diego State is 26-10 in its last 36 contests against teams that were not ranked in the AP Top 25 at game time.
- The Aztecs are 17-2 in 2018-19 when owning a higher field goal percentage than its opponent.
- The Aztecs are 12-3 this season when attempting more free throws.
- SDSU is 12-3 in 2018-19 when committing fewer turnovers.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher has a career record of 15-4 in games played after Feb. 12.
- In January, SDSU used a starting lineup comprised of one senior, three sophomores and one true freshman (for consecutive games). This marked the first time the Aztecs have started four underclassmen since February 12, 2005 vs. UNLV. Against the Runnin' Rebels that day, SDSU started two freshmen (Tyler Smith and Matt Thomas), two sophomores (Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter) and a junior college transfer (Mohamed Camara). That team finished 11-18 and marks the last time the Aztecs finished a campaign below .500. SDSU would make the postseason each of the next 11 seasons.

SAYING GOODBYE

Three San Diego State seniors that have helped carry on the rich Aztec Basketball tradition are wrapping up their collegiate basketball career. In the last four season, SDSU has posted an 89-47 record, advanced to the NCAA Tournament, made an NIT semifinalist appearance at Madison Square Garden and claimed a Mountain West regular season and tournament championship. All three players are on track to graduate in May.

Below are a few quick notes on all three seniors.

Jeremy Hemsley appears on almost every school career chart. A four-year member of the program, Hemsley has played in 132 career games and made 93 starts. He ranks 9th on the career scoring chart with 1,375 points and 15th in career assists with 281. He ranks in the top 20 in field goals made (11th), three-point field goals (6th), free throws made (19th), games played (8th), game started (14th), minutes played (9th) and points-rebounds-assists (11th). Most importantly, he has already been a part of 86 San Diego State victories, tied for the eighth most in school history.

Devin Watson has been one of the most impactful two-year players in school history. Transferring after his sophomore season from USF, Watson has started all 65 games since he became eligible (9th longest recorded consecutive streak in school history). He is 20th in school history in assists (258) and is 6th in assists per game (4.0). This season he earned player of the week honors after SDSU knocked off 6th-ranked Nevada, the highest-ranked team the Aztecs have ever defeated.

Michael Sohikish began his SDSU basketball career as a graphic design intern for the program. He became a team manager and practice player and started suiting up for games last season. An engineering major, Sohikish has seen action in 23 career games and has posted 18 points. He posted a career-high five-point game in the victory over San José State on Senior Night.

SERIES HISTORY VS. NEVADA

- This is the 23rd meeting between the schools with San Diego State winning 16 of the previous 22 (16-6).
- San Diego State has won three of its last four games with Nevada and have handed the Wolf Pack three of their last six losses and six of its last 25 defeats. Since Feb. 12, 2017, SDSU is 4-2 against Nevada while the rest of the country is a combined 9-65.
- Only eight of the meetings have been decided by single digits, including three of the last five that have taken place in Reno (2015: SDSU, 65-63; 2016: SDSU, 57-54; 2017: NEV, 72-69).
- After Nevada joined the league in time for the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs won the first seven games by an average of 12.9 points. The Wolf Pack defeated SDSU for the first time as a member of the Mountain West on Jan. 4, 2017.
- In the history of the series, San Diego State won five of the first six meetings, dropped two of the next three get-togethers, won seven straight and then split the season series in 2016-17. SDSU won three of the five encounters between the teams beginning last season.
- The Aztecs are 2-0 against the Wolf Pack in the Mountain West Tournament. They faced off in the semifinals last year and SDSU beat Nevada 90-73. The Wolf Pack were the No. 1 seed and ranked No. 22 in the country.
- In games played in San Diego, the Aztecs are 8-1 vs. Nevada.
- SDSU is 5-4 all-time in Reno and winners of three of the last five.
- Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley has a 6-3 career record and has scored 114 points in nine games (12.7 ppg) against the Wolf Pack.
- In five games against Nevada, Devin Watson is 12-of-29 from three-point range (41.4 percent) and averages 13.2 points, 3.6 rebounds and 3.6 assists.
- Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels averages 10.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in his five games against the Wolf Pack.

RENO, Nev. — Caleb Martin scored 25 points and twin brother Cody added 14 to lead No. 17 Nevada to an 81-53 rout of San Diego State on Saturday night that clinched a share of the Mountain West title with Utah State.

The Martin twins combined to shoot 12 of 19 and Nevada (28-3, 15-3 Mountain West) finished at 53.1 percent as a team. Jordan Caroline has 16 points and Trey Porter had 13.

Jeremy Hemsley had a team-high 16 points for the Aztecs, while Matt Mitchell recorded nine rebounds in the game, tying his career high.

San Diego State had as many personal fouls as rebounds (25) -- with one offensive rebound.

Nevada grabbed 42 boards and beat the Aztecs 26-12 in the paint. Nevada made 20 free throws to San Diego State's seven.

The Wolf Pack jumped out to a 16-5 lead in the first five minutes in front of 11,243, but San Diego State answered with a 10-0 run in the final two minutes of the first half and entered the break trailing 42-37.

Nevada dominated the second half, outscoring San Diego State 39-16 and never trailing, en route to a perfect regular-season home record (15-0).

Jeremy Hemsley led San Diego State (19-12, 11-7) with 16 points. Matt Mitchell and Devin Watson each scored 14 for the Aztecs, who shot 34.6 percent as a team.

The Aztecs finished the season tied with UNLV for fourth place in the Mountain West. The Wolf Pack got revenge for its 65-57 loss at San Diego State on Feb. 20, and broke its three-game losing streak against the Aztecs.

SAN DIEGO STATE SNAPSHOT

- San Diego State has typically started some combination of six players this season - a true freshman (Nathan Mensah), three sophomores (Jalen McDaniels, Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel) and two seniors (Devin Watson and Jeremy Hemsley).
- The Aztecs have a wealth of experience in the backcourt with a pair of seniors, **Devin Watson** and **Jeremy Hemsley**.
- **Watson**, who is in his third year with the program after playing two seasons at the Univ. of San Francisco, is second on the team this season in scoring (15.8), and leads the team in minutes played (33.8), assists (4.2) and has connected on 80-of-214 attempts from beyond the arc (37.4 percent). He is one of only eight players in the nation to average at least 15.8 points, 4.2 assists, 2.5 three-point field goals per game this season.
- **Hemsley** has played extensively for San Diego State the last four seasons, logging 132 games and 93 starts. He is averaging 30.2 minutes (second on the team), 9.3 points, and is considered the team's best defender.
- A majority of the time, the other three starters come from the Aztecs' sensational sophomore class of **Jalen McDaniels**, **Matt Mitchell** and **Jordan Schakel**. The group has been sensational to date and is a major reason why Aztec fans are excited about the future.
- **Mitchell** has six career games with 20 or more points. He also has recorded 11 games with at least three assists this season. For the year, he is averaging 10.3 points, good for third on the team, with 4.2 rebounds and 1.9 assists per contest. He has attempted 98 free throws and at one point made 15 straight.
- **Schakel** has already surpassed his offensive production from his entire freshman season. The sophomore is averaging 7.7 points, 3.8 rebounds and has connected on 44-of-102 three-point field goals this season (43.1 percent). He has 201 points this season after scoring 106 points in 33 games last season. If the season ended today, his 43.1 percent shooting from three-point range would be the best by any Aztec player since 2012 (Chase Tapley, 43.3 percent).
- After spending the summer working out for NBA teams, **McDaniels** has returned to campus with an improved jumper and a more consistent and well-rounded game. The sophomore has scored in double-digits in 30 of his last 33 games. He leads the team in scoring (16.3) and rebounding (8.3) and has played particularly well of late, averaging 17.5 points, 9.0 rebounds and shooting 48.7 percent from the field over his last 21 games.
- SDSU has five freshmen on the roster, with two contributing significantly. True freshman forward **Nathan Mensah** is averaging 12.0 points and 11.7 rebounds per 40 minutes of action and has started the last 18 games. He has a pair of double-doubles this season. Only 13 players in the country have more rebounds than his 177 in fewer minutes (602). He has played at least 20 minutes in 11 of the last 14 games.
- Redshirt freshman guard **Adam Seiko** has seen action in 30 games and is averaging 12.6 minutes per appearance. He has just 17 turnovers in 377 minutes of action this season and has shown the ability to hit the three-pointer, going 14-for-33 from bonus distance (42.4 percent).

SEASON SCENE SETTER

- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in redshirt sophomore forward **Jalen McDaniels** (2018 all-MW third team by media, honorable mention by coaches) sophomore forward **Matt Mitchell** and senior guard **Devin Watson**. The trio played in all 33 games a year ago with Watson starting every game, Mitchell receiving the opening nod 32 times (starting the final 31 outings) and McDaniels starting 21 of the final 22 contests (did not play on Senior Night).
- The aforementioned threesome ranked No. 2, 3 and 4 in scoring in 2017-18 with Watson leading the way at 12.2 points and falling seven points shy of tying outgoing senior Malik Pope for the team lead in the category. Mitchell and McDaniels, meanwhile, each finished with 10.5 scoring averages.
- SDSU returns from last year its leader in rebounding average (McDaniels - 7.5), assists (Watson - 124), steals (Mitchell - 36), field-goal percentage (McDaniels - .586), free-throw percentage (McDaniels - .788), three-point field-goal percentage (Watson - .389), three-pointers (Mitchell and Watson - 49) and minutes (Watson - 1,031).
- Senior guard **Jeremy Hemsley** and junior forward **Nolan Narain** are back for their respective seasons after receiving the starting nod at different times throughout the 2017-18 campaign. Hemsley (7.3 ppg, 1.22 a/to) played in 32 of 33 games last year, starting seven times, and enters '18-19 with 63 starting assignments in 101 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Narain, meanwhile, started once in 23 games and averaged career highs in every category (4.7 ppg, 2.0 rpg, .688 FG).
- Sophomore guard **Jordan Schakel** returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. Hailing from Torrance, Schakel ranked fourth on the team last year in three-point makes (27) and percentage (.346; min. 40 3FGA), while playing in all 33 games (13.8 mpg). Schakel averaged 3.2 points and 2.1 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing just nine turnovers in 455 minutes. In fact, he only had one multi-turnover game all season and finished the year with 26 straight one-turnover-or-less outings.

THE PROGRAM (through the games of Wed., March 13)

- Head coach **Brian Dutcher** is in his second season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a 22-11 record in 2017-18. He was the only first-year head coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament in 2018. In 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat.
- San Diego State had advanced to the NCAA tournament seven times in the last nine seasons, making Sweet 16 appearances in both 2011 and 2014. Only 26 schools nationally have played in at least seven of the last nine NCAA tournaments.
- The Aztecs' NCAA appearance in 2018 was their first since 2015, and their 12th postseason berth in the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT).
- SDSU claimed its Mountain West-leading 11th conference title last year and broke a tie with New Mexico by claiming its fifth MW tournament crown. The Aztecs, who played in their fourth Mountain West championship game in the last five seasons, won the tourney for the first time since 2011.
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2010-11 season, posting a cumulative record of 230-83. SDSU's .735 winning percentage is the 14th-best nationally over the last nine years.
- SDSU enters the this season having won at least 20 games and advanced to the postseason in 12 of the last 13 years (8 NCAA, 4 NIT). In the last 13 seasons, the Aztecs have averaged 25.2 victories.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) five times in the last eight years.
- San Diego State has won at least 19 games in 14 consecutive seasons (including this season).

Kris Clyburn had 19 points for the Runnin' Rebels (17-14). Amauri Hardy added 11 points and seven assists. Joel Ntambwe had 10 points and eight rebounds.

SDSU held UNLV to 32 percent shooting from the field and 18 percent on three-point field goals (4-22).

San Diego State has defeated UNLV for the 15 times in the last 16 meetings.

San Diego State has won 23 straight games when holding their opponent to less than 60 points.

For SDSU, it was their 20th win of the season. It marks the second straight 20-win season (both of Brian Dutcher's two seasons as head coach) and the 13th time in the last 14 seasons.



BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach • 41-23 record as head coach at San Diego State and overall

2nd Season • 20th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, is entering his second season as head coach after a first year in which he led the Aztecs to their Mountain West-high 11th conference title and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. Dutcher, who took over the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his time at San Diego State, Dutcher helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 13 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2011-12 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, SDSU was again an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

Last season, SDSU won six consecutive games to end the regular season and all three in the MW tournament to capture the program's 11th league crown to return to the NCAA tournament. Despite the NCAA first-round exit, SDSU finished the campaign with a 22-11 record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches last season.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.





SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Devin Watson connected on a career-high six three-point field goals and had a team-high 20 points as San Diego State opened its 2018-19 campaign with a 76-60 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff at Viejas Arena.

It was the sixth straight season-opening win for SDSU and the Aztecs have now won 14 consecutive home openers (regardless of the game being a season opener).

San Diego State led 39-36 with 17:38 to play when the Aztecs went on a 15-2 run to open up a comfortable 16-point lead. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had seven points during the spurt and was one of three Aztecs (Jordan Schakel and Watson) to connect on a trey during the decisive run.

The lead grew to 23 points (following a 30-10 run) before the Aztecs settled for the 16-point final margin.

San Diego State's trademark stellar defense on full display, limited Arkansas-Pine Bluff to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and forced the Golden Lions into 18 turnovers.

Watson recorded his fifth game with the Aztecs with at least 20 points, a figure he has reached 24 times in his career. His six treys are the fourth most by an Aztec player in Viejas Arena history.

Hemsley added 14 points, three assists and three steals. Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels narrowly missed a double-double with 15 points and team highs with nine rebounds and five assists. Sophomore forward Matt Mitchell rounded out four Aztec players in double figures with 10 points and five rebounds.

McDaniels became just the fourth Aztec player in the last 22 seasons to record at least 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and three steals in a game, joining Jamaal Franklin, Kawhi Leonard and Chase Tapley.

SAN DIEGO - Six San Diego State players scored in double figures, including all five starters, as the Aztecs never trailed and cruised to a 103-64 victory over Texas Southern.

San Diego State, which improved to 2-0 for the first time in four seasons, received a game-high 21 points from Matt Mitchell. The sophomore also added five rebounds and three assists.

Classmate Jordan Schakel had a career-high 16 points on 3-of-3 three-point field goal shooting and 7-of-7 from the charity stripe, and had seven rebounds.

Sophomore Jalen McDaniels added 14 points and a game-high nine rebounds, while Devin Watson poured in 14 points and had eight assists for SDSU. Senior Jeremy Hemsley scored 10 points and freshman Nathan Mensah came off the bench to score 11 points and pull down five rebounds.

San Diego State scored the first eight points of the game and led by as many as 41 points in claiming the team's eighth straight home win.

The Aztecs produced its highest point total in nearly five years (118 vs. Saint Katherine College, Dec. 27, 2013) connected on 52.3 percent from the field and was 27-of-36 from the free throw line.

Meanwhile, SDSU limited the Tigers to 33.3 percent field goal shooting and forced 14 turnovers on the evening.

San Diego State won for the 68th straight time when shooting at least 50 percent from the field and has won 71 consecutive contests when shooting 50 percent and committing 13 or fewer turnovers.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - Duke made five of its first seven attempts from beyond the arc to build a 13-point advantage in the opening 10 minutes of the game and the top-ranked Blue Devils defeated San Diego State, 90-64, in the opening day of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

San Diego State held Duke without an opening possession and quickly got a transition follow basket from sophomore Matt Mitchell to put the Aztecs on top, 2-0. It was the only lead of the day for SDSU.

The Blue Devils feature one of the nation's most dangerous lineups and on this day that fearsome unit made nine first-half three-point field goals to build a 49-32 halftime advantage.

Senior Jeremy Hemsley and sophomore Jalen McDaniels made consecutive lay ups early in the second half to cut the deficit to 13, but the Aztecs were not able to draw any closer.

Despite the loss, there were plenty of positive takeaways for SDSU. The Aztecs made 27 trips to the line and drew 25 fouls on the Blue Devils. McDaniels and Mitchell tied for team-high honors by drawing five fouls apiece.

San Diego State was led by senior guard Devin Watson's 15 points. Hemsley added 12 points and McDaniels and Mitchell each chipped in with 11 points apiece.

Duke was led R.J. Barrett who had 20 points and five assists. The Aztecs held Zion Williams, a projected NBA lottery pick, to 13 points on 5-of-11 attempts from the line.

The game marked just the fourth all-time matchup for the Aztecs against the nation's top ranked team. On two occasions, the opponent has been the Blue Devils.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - San Diego State made one of the most dramatic comebacks in school history, overcoming a 19-point deficit, to defeat Xavier, 79-74, on the second day of the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

The Aztecs trailed 32-13 with 9:21 to play in the first half against a Musketeers' program that is the defending Big East Conference champions, was a No. 1-seed in the NCAA tournament and finished the campaign 29-6.

SDSU scored the next seven points as part of a 27-5 run to cut the deficit to three points at half.

After allowing the opening basket of the second half, the Aztecs went on a 17-2 run to open up a nine-point advantage. In all, SDSU outscored Xavier, 45-17, over approximately a 20-minute period in the middle of the game.

San Diego State was led by sophomore sensation Jalen McDaniels. McDaniels scored a career-high 26 points on the strength of 9-of-14 shooting, including a career-high three three-point field goals. He added eight rebounds and three blocked shots.

Senior guard Devin Watson tallied 21 points, including four three-point field goals, and added a game-high seven assists. Sophomore guard Jordan Schakel made three three's en route to a 13-point, five-rebound performance.

San Diego State shot 53.8 percent from the field and ran its winning streak to 68 games when shooting at least 50 percent from the floor. Equally impressive was the fact the Aztecs outrebounded their bigger Big East opponent, 33-29.

The comeback was the third largest in SDSU recorded history and the largest in Brian Dutcher's tenure as SDSU's head coach.

Xavier raced out to the big lead by making eight of its first 10 and 13 of its first 19 field goal attempts. As if that was not bad enough, the Musketeers converted on five of its first seven attempts from beyond the arc.

LAHAINA, Hawaii - For the third straight day San Diego State ran into a team that opened the game on fire and on this day the Aztecs did not have an answer.

Iowa State made three of its first four three-point field goal attempts of the game, had nine treys at intermission and 14 for the contest in an 87-57 victory over San Diego State in the fifth-place game on the Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

Unlike the previous two games, when San Diego State overcame hot shooting starts to compete for 40 minutes against top-ranked Duke or produce a historic comeback against Xavier the day before, SDSU did not have the legs to mount a comeback on this day.

Iowa State raced out to an 18-6 lead by the first media timeout and the Aztecs clawed back to a 20-16 deficit with 12:45 to play in the first half. The Cyclones then used a 12-2 run to open the lead up and SDSU got no closer than nine points the rest of the way.


Sophomore forward Matt Mitchell scored a team-high 14 points and added six rebounds. Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels, who was limited to 27 minutes due to foul trouble, had 10 points and seven boards. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley added 10 points on the day.

Iowa State was paced by Marial Shayok, who tallied 21 points on 8-of-12 shooting. Michael Jacobson added 19 points and eight rebounds, while Terrence Lewis came off the bench to score 16 points in 21 minutes of action.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State dominated both ends of the court from the opening tip and recorded its widest margin of victory against a Division I opponent in 32 years as the Aztecs defeated Jackson State, 87-44.

The Aztecs, coming off a 30-point loss six days earlier, scored the first 11 points of the game, raced to a 24-5 advantage and built a 49-21 halftime lead.

Five San Diego State players scored in double figures, led by sophomores Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel. Mitchell had 15 points to go along with six rebounds and three assists and Schakel had 15 points and four steals.

Classmate Jalen McDaniels had 14 points and junior forward Nolan Narain came off the bench to add 11 points and four rebounds.

Offensively, San Diego State was efficient, connecting on 50.9 percent of its field goal attempts, including 57.6 percent of its two-point field goal attempts. The Aztecs had 20 assists on 29 field goal attempts.

San Diego State has now won 70 consecutive games when shooting 50 percent or better from the floor.

Defensively, the Aztecs limited Jackson State to 25.9 percent from the field, the lowest mark for an SDSU opponent in the Brian Dutcher era. This was just the 33rd time this season that a Division I opponent was held to less than 30 percent field goal shooting and was forced into more than 20 turnovers (23).

With the victory, San Diego State has followed each of its last four defeats with a victory in the next game.

NORMAL, Ill. - San Diego State received strong play from its starting senior backcourt and used a relentless team effort on the glass and on the defensive end to pick up a road win at Illinois State, 75-65.

The game was part of the eighth annual Mountain West - Missouri Valley Challenge and the SDSU victory helped the Mountain West salvage a tie in the 10-games played between the teams this season.

The Aztecs snapped the Redbirds 10-game homecourt winning streak thanks in part to Devin Watson's season-high 23 points and game-high seven assists and classmate Jeremy Hemsley timely shooting en route to 17 points and five rebounds.

Possibly overlooked was another outstanding performance by sophomore Jalen McDaniels who reached double figures for a personal-best eighth straight game. McDaniels recorded his 10th career double-double with 12 points and a personal-high 15 rebounds.

The Aztecs had their best rebounding game of the season, with a 47-36 rebound advantage in the contest. It marked the second straight game in which the Aztecs enjoyed a double-digit advantage on the glass after being outrebounded in three of the first five contests of the season. The -11 rebound margin marked the worst of the season for the Redbirds.

SDSU limited Illinois State to 31.0 percent field goal shooting, its lowest percentage in nearly 21 months, since No. 21 Wichita State limited the Redbirds to 29.3 percent on March 5, 2017.

San Diego State led for 37:20 of the contest, including the entire second half. The Aztecs were never really in danger in the second half, but when Illinois State cut the deficit to 55-49 with 11:37 to play, the Aztecs responding with an 8-0 run. Hemsley converted on a basket and followed it with a try on the next possession and Watson made a three-pointer of his own to push the lead back to 14 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego connected on seven three-point field goals after intermission and shot 56.0 percent after the break to overcome a halftime deficit and defeat San Diego State, 73-61.

The Toreros snapped the Aztecs 11-game win streak in the series in games played indoors and won enemy ground for the first time since 2000.

The Aztecs played stellar defense in the first half, limiting USD to 35.7 percent field goal shooting and 0-for-11 from beyond the arc. Despite the strong performance on that side of the floor, the Aztecs, which led by as many as nine points, only entered halftime with a seven-point lead.

San Diego used a 16-5 run to open the second half to build a four-point advantage. The Aztecs took their final lead of the evening on a pair of free throws by sophomore Jordan Schakel with 10:57 to play.

USD responded with a 10-0 run to take an eight-point advantage with 7:23 to play.

The Aztecs made a final push, cutting the deficit to four points on a Devin Watson basket with 3:04 to play, but USD drew a foul late in the shot clock, converted two free throws and SDSU could draw no closer.

San Diego State was led by Watson, who tallied a game-high 22 points and added three assists. Sophomore Matt Mitchell added 13 points, four rebounds and three assists for SDSU. McDaniels reached double-figures for a career-high ninth straight game with 12 points.

USD, who had six different players make a three-point basket in the game, was led by Isaiah Pineiro with 21 points and five rebounds.

BERKELEY, Calif. - California converted four of its final five three-point field goal attempts over the final 4:21 of the contest to overcome a late eight-point deficit and defeat San Diego State, 89-83.

The Aztecs led 78-71 with 3:53 to play in the contest, but the Bears outscored the SDSU 18-5 over the final stretch to hand SDSU just its second loss to California in the last six meetings.

The loss was the second in a row for San Diego State, which had responded from its previous four losses with a victory in the following game.

San Diego State produced a tremendous offensive game. The Aztecs posted 83 points, connected on 54.7 percent of its field goals and a remarkable 57.1 percent of its three-point field goals (12-of-21).

This marked just the second time since Dec. 27, 2013 that San Diego State scored at least 83 points, made at least 12 three-point field goals, and shot at least 55.6 percent from the field (other was vs. Colorado State, 1-24-18).

Unfortunately, California enjoyed a big offensive night as well, connecting on 52.7 percent from the floor and making 13 three-point field goals.

The Aztecs were led by sophomore Jalen McDaniels, who had a team-high 20 points and added six rebounds and five assists. Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley was sensational, connecting on 5-of-6 three-point field goals en route to 19 points and six rebounds.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used a 23-0 run in the first half to cruise to a 99-46 victory at Viejas Arena over Division II member Cal State Dominguez Hills.

The 53-point victory was the fifth largest margin of victory in school history and the largest since an 83-point win over St. Katherine College on Dec. 27, 2013.

Four Aztecs scored in double figures led by sophomore forward Matt Mitchell's 20 points. Mitchell connected on 3-of-6 from beyond the arc en route to his fourth career 20-point scoring effort and second of the 2018-19 campaign.

Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels added 13 points, six rebounds and four assists for San Diego State.

The Aztecs, who were meeting Dominguez Hills for the first time, broke a two-game losing streak.

The game was tied at nine with 13:40 to play in the first half when the Aztecs went on their monster spurt. SDSU got points from eight different players during the 23-0 run - Jordan Schakel 5, Nolan Narain 4, Nathan Mensah 3, Adam Seiko 3, Devin Watson 3, Jeremy Hemsley 2, Matt Mitchell 2 and Jalen McDaniels. Dominguez Hills was held without a point for 7:45 during the SDSU run.

San Diego State dominated every statistical category, including rebounding (53-27), field goal percentage (49.3-30.9), three-point field goal percentage (51.9-12.5), assists (28-10) and turnovers forced (18-10).

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State used an 18-3 run early in the first half, built a 20-point first half lead and were never threatened in a 90-81 victory over Brigham Young.

The Aztecs tied a school record by claiming its third consecutive victory in the series and defeated the Cougars in San Diego for the first time since Feb. 23, 2008.

San Diego State posted 90 points on the strength of 52.8 percent shooting from the field, 12 three-point field goals and 22 free throws. The Aztecs had 20 assists on their 28 made field goals.

It marked the second straight game SDSU has scored at least 90 points for the first time since Nov. 30 and Dec. 2, 2000.

Four San Diego State players reached double figures, led by senior guard Devin Watson.

Watson scored 23 points and added eight assists, four rebounds and three steals. The senior got to the free throw line 16 times (making 12) and recorded his fifth 20-point game of the season.

Sophomore Matt Mitchell scored 22 points, on the strength of 9-of-12 shooting from the field. Mitchell was instrumental in getting the Aztecs off to a good start, scoring six of SDSU's first seven points. It marked the 10th time in his career he has scored at least 15 points, with San Diego State posting a 9-1 record in those games.

Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had 14 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals, while sophomore Jordan Schakel had 12 points, career-high eight rebounds and two assists.

San Diego State led 10-9 with 16:56 left in the first half before going on an 18-3 run to open up a 16-point advantage. After that, the Aztecs led by at least eight points the final 35:18 of the contest.

The Bears (9-4) made six 3-pointers overall in a 26-0 run that gave them a 50-22 lead just before halftime.

As the Bears were draining 3s, San Diego State (7-5) went more than eight minutes without scoring. After Aguek Arop made a 3-pointer to pull the Aztecs to 24-20 with 8:32 left before halftime, they didn't score again until Arop had a slam dunk with 29 seconds left to make it 50-22.

SDSU simply had no answer for Brown during the decisive run. After Tamenang Choh made a layup for a 26-20 Brown lead, the Aztecs missed three jumpers on their next possession. Brown's Travis Fuller, who played at La Costa Canyon High in northern San Diego County, rebounded to set up a 3-pointer by Cambridge.

Brown made 3s on its next four possessions, with Cambridge and Okolie alternating shots from behind the arc. Okolie's second 3 made it 41-20. The run continued with nine more points by Brown, with Cambridge hitting another 3 and Okolie making a turn-around jumper and a layup.

Cambridge went down hard after committing his third foul with 14 minutes left and got up favoring his right knee. He came out of the game but later returned.

Jalen McDaniels scored 19 and Arop 11 for SDSU, which was coming off a 90-81 win against Brigham Young.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State overcame a 19-point second half deficit to defeat CSUN, 65-60, at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs overcame their second 19-point deficit to win for the second time this season. Against the Matadors, the Aztecs trailed 46-27 with 15:12 to play but closed the game on a 38-14 run to win their fourth straight game in the series.

Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels led the way for the Aztecs, recording his second double-double of the season with team-highs 20 points and 13 rebounds. Senior guard Devin Watson added 14 points (12 in the second half) and six assists, while senior guard Jeremy Hemsley tallied 13 points (10 in the second half).

For the second consecutive game, San Diego State struggled to score in the first half. The Aztecs connected on just 9-of-32 shots in the first half (28.1 percent) and 2-of-15 from three-point range (13.3 percent) prior to intermission. That helped enable CSUN to close the half on a 12-4 run in the final 4:29 of the first half and open a 32-21 halftime advantage.

Entering the game, SDSU had overcome a double-digit half-time deficit to win on three occasions in the last 23 seasons.

The deficit grew to 19 points in the opening minutes of the second half and the Aztecs trailed by 15 with 11:17 to play. SDSU got the deficit to eight points with a 7-0 run, on the strength of a bucket by McDaniels and consecutive field goals by Hemsley (5 points).

CSUN pushed the lead to 10 points but SDSU erased that with a 10-0 run. This time Watson (two treys) and Matt Mitchell (4 points) keyed the run.

CSUN led for the final time, 60-58, with 2:12 to play but SDSU took the lead for good by scoring on consecutive possessions, first on a Hemsley three (1:57) than a driving layup by Watson (1:02) put SDSU up for good.

The 19-point second-half deficit marked the second largest ever overcome by San Diego State in recorded history (since 1996-97).

BOISE, Idaho - Derrick Alston had a career-high 30 points on 9-of-14 shooting and Boise State led by throughout the second half in an 88-64 win over San Diego State on Saturday night.

Alston's 30 points was the first 30-point game of the season for any Boise State player. His 30 points also was the 55th 30-plus point game in program history. He recorded career highs in made field goals (9), field goals attempted (14), made free throws (10) and free throws attempted (12) in 29 minutes of play.

Alex Hobbs added 18 points for the Broncos (7-8, 2-0 Mountain West Conference), who have won three of their last four games.

Boise State led by 23 late in the first half and went into the break with a 46-25 lead. San Diego State opened the second half with a 12-2 run to cut the deficit to eleven but that was as close as the Aztecs (8-6, 0-1) would get.

The loss snapped a San Diego State six-game Mountain West regular-season win streak and a nine-game win streak against teams from the Mountain West Conference.

Devin Watson had 24 points on 7-of-14 shooting from the field. It was his sixth 20-plus scoring game of the season, 10th while at San Diego State and 29th of his career. Watson led the Aztecs in scoring for the sixth time this season in 15th time in his career.

Jalen McDaniels added 14 points for San Diego State, which made just 3-of-21 from 3-point range. With the 14 points in Boise, McDaniels tallies 53 points in his last three games, averaging 18.3 points per game. He also tallied a team-high five rebounds for SDSU against the Broncos.

SAN DIEGO - Jalen McDaniels had 22 points and 12 rebounds, and Matt Mitchell scored 20 as SDSU ran past Wyoming 84-54 Tuesday night. Jordan Schakel scored 14 points and Devin Watson had 12 points and eight assists for the Aztecs (9-6, 1-1), who lost 88-64 Boise State on Saturday night.

After making only 3 of 21 3-point shots at BSU, the Aztecs made their first five from behind the arc — two each by Mitchell and Schakel — in taking a 23-9 lead against the Cowboys. They made 9 of 15 en route to a 48-25 halftime lead and 12 of 24 overall.

Jalen McDaniels notched his third double-double of the season and 12th of his career and led SDSU in scoring for the fifth time this season and 14th time of his career.

The Aztecs beat Wyoming for the 11th straight time at Viejas Arena. Four of SDSU's last 10 MWC wins have been by 30 points.

It was Wyoming's worst loss since Jan. 29, 2011, when fourth-ranked SDSU won 96-57.

Justin James scored 18, Hunter Thompson 11 and Trevon "TJ" Taylor 10 for Wyoming (4-12, 0-3), which lost for a third straight game and six of its last seven.

The Cowboys were without five players, including two of their top five scorers, Hunter Maldonado and Jake Hendricks. They added walk-on guard KC Henry, a redshirt sophomore, to the roster.

Nolan Narain was a scratch because he was still sore after a collision in the Boise State loss and senior guard Jeremy Hemsley had the flu and was sent home.

USAFA, Colo. — Lavelle Scottie and Ryan Swan recorded double-doubles for Air Force and the Falcons withstood a frantic second-half rally to defeat San Diego State, 62-48.

The Air Force victory, which snapped a three-game San Diego State win streak in the series, came in large part due to the performances of Swan (15 points and 15 rebounds) and Scottie (16 points and 11 rebounds).

SDSU was unable to win despite holding the Falcons to 39.0 percent field goal shooting and 32.1 percent from three-point range.

Neither team shot the ball well early, with San Diego State connecting on just 5-of-22 attempts (22.7 percent) from the floor in the first half and Air Force making 9-of-30 shots (30.0 percent). However, the Falcons were able to build a 28-14 halftime advantage on the strength of eight offensive rebounds in the first half (leading to 13 second-chance points) and forcing seven Aztec turnovers.

The Falcons pushed the lead to 16 points by scoring the first basket of the second half before the Aztecs started to chip away. Trailing 45-30 with 10 minutes to play, the Aztecs used a 14-3 run over the next four minutes to cut the deficit to four points. Jalen McDaniels capped the run with to cut the Air Force advantage to 48-44.

However, on its next three offensive possessions, the Aztecs missed a pair of free throws and had consecutive turnovers (one of which led to an uncontested layup) to allow Air Force to open the game back up.

McDaniels continued his strong play, posting his second consecutive double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds. Senior guard Devin Watson added nine points, four rebounds and four assists. Freshman forward Nathan Mensah, making his second career start added four points and five rebounds.

SAN DIEGO — Sophomore forward Jalen McDaniels scored 24 points and added 11 rebounds and senior guard Devin Watson made three three-pointers in the opening four minutes of the second half as San Diego State cruised to a 97-77 victory over New Mexico at Viejas Arena.

McDaniels recorded his personal best third consecutive double-double and reached the 20-point plateau for the fifth time this season as the Aztecs won their eighth straight conference home game.

The Aztecs tied their Mountain West Conference high for points in a regulation game (97) and set a program best for assists in an MWC game with 30.

San Diego State never trailed but led by only two points in the closing moments of the first half when freshman forward Aguek Arop stole the ball and made a 65-foot heave at the first half buzzer to give the Aztecs a five-point advantage.

SDSU led by eight points with 14:47 to play before utilizing an 11-3 run to provide further cushion. McDaniels had nine points during the decisive run and had 14 of his 21 points after intermission.

San Diego State shot 55.1 percent for the game and has now won 57 straight home games when shooting at least 50 percent from the field.

In all five players reached double figures for the Aztecs. Watson ended the game with 21 points on 5-of-7 shooting from three-point range. In just his third career start Nathan Mesah was 7-for-7 from the field and ended the game with 16 points and seven rebounds.

New Mexico was led by Anthony Mathis with 21 points and Vance Jackson with 16 points.

FRESNO, Calif. — Braxton Huggins had a career-high 20 points with eight rebounds and five assists, Nate Grimes added 13 points and 16 rebounds and Fresno State rallied from a 20-point, first-half deficit to beat San Diego State 66-62 on Tuesday night.

Fresno State took its first lead, since 2-0, midway through the second half when Grimes' putback made it 52-51. Sam Bittner was fouled on a 3-pointer with 1:06 remaining and hit 2 of 3 free throws for a 63-58 lead, and Huggins made two more on their next possession.

Bittner, who had five points at halftime, sparked the second-half comeback with three early 3-pointers and finished with 18 points for Fresno State (14-4, 5-1 Mountain West). Deshon Taylor, averaging 16.6 points per game, fouled out on a charging call with 2:04 remaining.

Fresno State has won six of the last eight games in the series. Jalen McDaniels had 19 points and 10 rebounds for San Diego State (10-8, 2-3). Jeremy Hemsley added 14 and Devin Watson 13.

Hemsley scored 10 points in the first half to help SDSU build a 39-26 lead as Fresno State was held to 8-of-27 shooting (29.6 percent). McDaniels' putback with 12.7 seconds remaining in the game was SDSU's only field goal in the final four minutes.

McDaniels continued his solid play by recording his fourth consecutive double-double. Prior to this stretch, the sophomore had never posted more than two straight double-doubles. During his last seven games, McDaniels is averaging 19.4 points, 9.7 rebounds and is shooting 56.0 percent from the field.

Hemsley moved into 13th place on the school's all-time scoring list. The senior passed Kyle Spain and Xavier Thames and now has 1,242 career points.

SAN DIEGO — Jalen McDaniels had a career-high 30 points and 13 rebounds for his fifth straight double-double as San Diego State defeated UNLV 94-77 on Saturday night at Viejas Arena.

SDSU (11-8, 3-3 Mountain West) led by 11 points at halftime, and unlike in its last game against Fresno State, it didn't squander an early double-digit advantage. The Aztecs extended their bulge to 19 points about five minutes into the second half and cruised in for the win.

UNLV (11-8, 5-2) was led by Joel Ntambwe's 19 points in losing its sixth straight game at SDSU and for the 13th time in the teams' last 14 meetings. The Rebels squandered a chance to pull into a tie atop the conference standings with Nevada being idle and Fresno State losing at Colorado State.

McDaniels, who entered the game averaging nearly 20 points over his last seven games, was bothersome to the Rebels. Kawhi Leonard, during the 2010-11 season, was the last Aztecs player with five consecutive double-doubles.

UNLV entered the game among the conference leaders in numerous offensive categories but missed seven of its first eight shots as the Aztecs raced to a nine-point lead in the opening four minutes.

Amauri Hardy hit a 3-pointer, UNLV's sixth of the game, to cut the deficit to 29-27 but the Rebels missed a chance to tie the game on their following possession. McDaniels sandwiched a pair of 3-point plays around a layup by Watson to push the lead back into double figures about 2 1/2 minutes later.

McDaniels scored a career-high with 30 points (previous: 26 vs. Xavier, 11-20-18) and became just the sixth player in the last 23 years to record at least 30 points, 13 rebounds, five steals and four assists in the same game. The last was LSU's Ben Simmons on Dec. 2, 2015, who went onto to be the No. 1 NBA Draft pick in 2016.

SAN DIEGO — With a revenge win against Air Force well in hand, all that was left Wednesday night was for San Diego State's Jalen McDaniels to secure his sixth straight double-double.

McDaniels got it all right, on a jumper with 2:38 to go. He finished with 11 points and 11 rebounds in SDSU's 66-51 victory, the first time in more than a month the Aztecs have won consecutive games.

His six straight double-doubles are the most at SDSU since Michael Cage had a school-record eight straight in 1983-84. McDaniels came in tied with Kawhi Leonard (2010-11) with five, the most at the school in the Mountain West era, which started in 1999-2000.

Devin Watson scored 15 points, Jeremy Hemsley 14 and Matt Mitchell 11 for the Aztecs (12-8, 4-3), who averaged a 62-48 loss at Air Force on Jan. 12. McDaniels came in leading the Aztecs with 16.8 points and 8.4 rebounds.

SDSU was coming off a 94-77 home win against UNLV on Saturday night. This is the first time SDSU won consecutive games since beating Cal State Dominguez Hills on Dec. 12 and BYU on Dec. 22, both at home. SDSU hit 7 of 12 3-pointers in taking a 36-19 halftime lead.

Unlike the game at Air Force earlier this month, the Aztecs never trailed. With the Falcons struggling against a zone defense, the Aztecs quickly built an 18-7 lead thanks in part to 3-pointers by Mitchell, Adam Seiko, McDaniels and Hemsley. Air Force got within single digits only once more.

SDSU outrebounded Air Force 38-27 and had 18 assists. In the loss at Air Force, the Aztecs had only one assist in the first half.

SAN JOSE, Calif. — Devin Watson and Jalen McDaniels combined to score 49 points and San Diego State picked up its third straight victory, knocking off San Jose State 67-56 on Saturday night.

San Diego State swept the season series with the Spartans last year and now have won 10 of the last 11 meetings between the programs.

Watson hit 5 of 11 from long range and finished with 27 points to lead the Aztecs (13-8, 5-3 Mountain West). McDaniels had 22 points and grabbed nine rebounds.

Craig LeCesne had 14 points and Steadman pulled down 11 rebounds for San Jose State (3-18, 0-9).

Watson scored a season-high and game-high 27 points and it was his eighth game this season with 20 or more points and the 31st time in his career. He led the Aztecs in scoring for the eighth time this season and the 17th time in his career and led the Aztecs in assists for the 16th time this season and the 28th time in his career. Watson scored in double figures for the fifth straight game, 18th time this season and 83rd time in his career. He now has 1,608 career points.

The Aztecs were in eighth place in the Mountain West Conference entering play on Jan. 26 (one week ago today). The Aztecs are now alone in fourth place in the league.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — Anthony Mathis scored 17 points, including three 3-pointers in a 22-6 run to start the second half, as New Mexico overcame an early-double deficit Tuesday night to beat San Diego State 83-70.

Keith McGehee scored a career-high 19 points for the Lobos (10-12, 4-6 Mountain West) and Mathis scored all of his points in the second half as New Mexico won just its third conference home game.

Jalen McDaniels had 25 points for the Aztecs (13-9, 5-4) and Devin Watson added 13, 12 of which he scored after halftime. McDaniels tied a career high by reaching double figures in an 11th straight game, and score 20+ points in consecutive games for the first time in his 55-game career.

The Lobos trailed 33-22 late in the first half before closing with a 14-3 surge to cut it to 37-36. Then Mathis got hot, not only hitting all three of his 3-pointers, but also making three foul shots after being fouled behind the arc.

San Diego State never got within single digits thereafter and had its three-game win streak snapped, as well as their two-game win streak against the Lobos.

This marked the first time this season the Aztecs have lost a game in which they had a rebound advantage. SDSU is now 9-1 when owning an edge on the glass.

After committing a season-low eight turnovers in the win at San Jose State last Saturday, the Aztecs had 16 miscues tonight that led to 25 New Mexico points.

Prior to the game against New Mexico, SDSU had held seven straight opponents to less than 50 percent shooting from the field.

San Diego State dropped into a fourth-place tie with UNLV and Boise State, and will host second-place Utah State on Saturday.

SAN DIEGO — Devin Watson scored 23 points and Jalen McDaniels had 16, as San Diego State defeated Utah State 68-63 Saturday night at Viejas Arena to open the second half of Mountain West play.

The Aztecs (14-9, 6-4) overcame a 35-point effort from Utah State's Sam Merrill to improve to 11-0 against the Aggies since they joined the conference in 2013-14.

Merrill finished two shy of his career-high before fouling out for the Aggies (18-6, 8-3), who came into the game in sole possession of second place.

Nathan Mensah had 10 points and 10 rebounds, and Matt Mitchell also scored 10 for SDSU.

The Aztecs squandered a 13-point lead they built in the first half and nearly let a 52-42 second-half advantage slip away; however, Watson made a bank shot, while McDaniels hit a 3-pointer and converted an old-fashioned 3-point play with 4:51 left for a 61-52 lead.

Merrill hit a 3-pointer with 2:10 left to narrow the gap to 63-58 but then had a shot blocked by Mensah.

Merrill fouled out with 49 seconds to go when he was called for charging.

Watson had eight points during a 20-0 run midway through the first half that carried SDSU from a 10-point deficit to a 31-18 lead. He had a 3-pointer and a 3-point play, and also fed Mensah for an alley-oop slam dunk. McDaniels finished the run with a 3-pointer for a 13-point lead with 5:35 to go before halftime.

Utah State snapped a five-minute scoring drought with Merrill scoring all the points in a 9-0 run to close to 31-27. He had a layup, two free throws, a jumper and a 3-pointer.

SDSU scored only two more points the rest of the half and led 33-29. The Aggies then scored the first five points of the second half to take a 34-33 lead.

FORT COLLINS, Colo. — Devin Watson had 21 points as San Diego State beat Colorado State 71-60 on Tuesday night. The victory was the fifth in the last six outings for the Aztecs.

Watson shot 5 for 7 on 3-pointers for SDSU, who defeated the Rams for a third consecutive time.

Jalen McDaniels had 18 points and 12 rebounds for San Diego State (15-9, 7-4 Mountain West Conference). Jeremy Hemsley added 12 points.

Nico Carvacho had 20 points and 12 rebounds for the Rams (9-16, 4-8). J.D. Paige added 16 points. Adam Thistlewood had 11 points.

The Aztecs win their third straight game against Colorado State and are 21-6 in its last 27 games against the Rams. San Diego State is 10-4 in its last 14 visits to Moby Arena. The Aztecs 10 wins are the most by a visiting team in the venue since Feb. 4, 2006. Since that date, SDSU is 10-4 in Moby Arena, while the rest of the teams are a combined 62-137.

With the victory, the Aztecs pull within one game of second place in the Mountain West (currently shared by Utah State and Fresno State).

The Aztecs improve to 7-4 in Mountain West Conference play and is now three games above .500 in league play for the first time since finishing the 2015-16 league campaign with a 16-2 record.

Jalen McDaniels reached double figures for a 13th straight game (career-high). His 18 points and 12 rebounds give him seven double-doubles in his last 10 games and 18 for his career.

Devin Watson scored a game-high 21 points, including 11 straight for the Aztecs in the second half. It was the 10th 20-point scoring effort of the season and the 33rd of his career.

San Diego State plays Boise State at home on Saturday. Colorado State takes on San Jose State on the road next Wednesday.

SAN DIEGO — Devin Watson paced San Diego State with 19 points, Jalen McDaniels added 18 and teammates Matt Mitchell and Nathan Mensah also scored in double figures as the Aztecs beat Boise State, 71-65, on Saturday.

SDSU (16-9, 8-4 Mountain West) won for the sixth time in its last seven outings and ran its home conference winning streak to 12 games in splitting the season series with the Broncos (11-15, 6-7).

Boise State bolted to a 5-0 lead as it was clear the Aztecs were in for an uneven first half. They would take a one-point lead some five minutes in but then they went nearly five more minutes before converting another field goal.

SDSU, after a sluggish first half, went ahead 45-35 with 14 minutes remaining when Watson hit his second three-pointer in three minutes, with his two free throws separating his long-range shots. The Aztecs outscored the Broncos 14-2 over a four-minute span to enjoy their biggest cushion of the game.

Boise State was led by Justinian Jessop's 19 points. The Broncos mounted a few charges at the Aztecs, but SDSU countered them by handling the ball better and improving its aim.

Boise State pulled to within four points with 45 seconds to play on RJ Williams' put-back and then a free throw by Pat Dembley, who replaced an injured Williams. Jessop's three-pointer later sliced it to 68-65 before Watson's free throw helped seal the win.

San Diego State overcame a halftime deficit to win in a conference game for the first time this season. Overall, it was the third time SDSU has rallied from a deficit at intermission.

SDSU matched its season-long win streak to three games and has won six of its last seven games. The Aztecs have also won 12 consecutive Mountain West home games.

Senior guard Jeremy Hemsley moved into ninth place on the SDSU career scoring list with his seven points on Saturday (1,311).

SAN DIEGO — Jeremy Hemsley and Devin Watson scored 15 points apiece for San Diego State, which shut down Jordan Caroline and stunned cold-shooting No. 6 Nevada 65-57 Wednesday night at Viejas Arena, beating the Wolf Pack for the third straight time.

Jalen McDaniels added 10 points for SDSU (17-9, 9-4 Mountain West), which won for the seventh time in eight games and snapped a 10-game winning streak by the Wolf Pack (24-2, 11-2), prompting fans to rush the court. It was the highest ranked team that SDSU had ever beaten.

Caleb Martin had 20 points for Nevada, which was held to its lowest point total this season. Their previous low was in its only other loss, 85-58 at New Mexico on Jan. 5. Since then Nevada had averaged 22 points per game.

The Wolf Pack made only 19 of 56 shots (33.9 percent). Caroline came in averaging 18.8 points but scored only six, on 3-of-12 shooting. SDSU won despite shooting just 39.7 percent, making 25 of 63 attempts from the field.

The Aztecs, who are coming on strong for the second straight season, have handed Nevada three of its last five losses. They beat the Wolf Pack in San Diego in the regular-season finale a year ago and again in the semifinal of the Mountain West Conference tournament. That didn't keep the Wolf Pack from advancing to the Sweet 16, where they lost 69-68 to Loyola-Chicago, which went on to reach the Final Four.

San Diego State led 30-21 at halftime thanks to 10 points from Jeremy Hemsley. The Aztecs' biggest lead was 28-18 with 2:41 to go after a put-back by Aquek Arop.

Caroline and McDaniels (17.2-point average) were held scoreless in the first half.

The Wolf Pack hadn't trailed in the last three games and in five of six but allowed Jeremy Hemsley's jumper less than two minutes in to fall behind 2-0.

The Aztecs and Wolf Pack will meet again in the regular-season finale March 9 in Reno.

Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 13 road victories at UNLV. That is the most road wins by any team in the nation at any other opponent. In addition, since the start of the 2008-09 season, San Diego State has 26 victories at Thomas & Mack Center, which are tied for the most wins by any Division I team at a venue other than its home arena in that time frame (Kansas has 26 wins at the Sprint Center and Villanova is third with 25 wins at Madison Square Garden).

The Aztecs have swept the regular-season meetings with the Rebels in five of the last six seasons (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2019; in 2014, 2015 and 2017 the Aztecs won a Mountain West Conference tourney meeting).

San Diego State plays Utah State on the road on Tuesday. UNLV takes on Nevada on the road on Wednesday.

Sam Merrill had 19 points for Utah State (23-6, 13-3 Mountain West Conference), which earned its fifth consecutive victory. Diago Brito added 12 points. Justin Bean had 10 points and eight rebounds for the hosts.

Jordan Schakel had 15 points for the Aztecs (18-10, 10-5), whose five-game winning streak came to end. Schakel's 15 points marks his second-highest scoring game of his career, and was his eighth double-digit performance this season.

Matt Mitchell added 12 points, posting consecutive double-digit games for the first time since late January. Nathan Mensah had a team-high eight rebounds.

Jalen McDaniels, whose 17 points per game entering the matchup led the Aztecs, had only seven points (3 of 10). Devin Watson, the Aztecs' second leading scorer coming into the matchup at 16 points per game, was held to only five points (2 of 14).

San Diego State tied its season-low field goal percentage (35.2) in the loss (also vs. Brown, 12/29/18).

San Diego State's season-long five-game win streak was snapped in the loss, but the Aztecs have won eight of their last 10 games.

The Aggies snapped an 11-game win streak by the Aztecs, claiming their first victory in the series since Nov. 24, 1998.

The Aggies evened the season series against the Aztecs with the win. San Diego State defeated Utah State 68-63 on Feb. 9. Utah State matches up against Nevada at home on Saturday. San Diego State faces San Jose State at home on Saturday.

Zach Chappell had 14 points, Michael Steadman 12 points and 11 rebounds, and Seneca Knight 12 points for San Jose State (4-24, 1-15), which has lost 18 of its last 19.

The Aztecs didn't have any trouble with the MWC's last-place team. McDaniels scored nine points in helping them take a 19-9 lead, including a 3-pointer, a jumper in the paint, a slam dunk to finish a fast break and a nice left-handed layup.

Later in the first half, McDaniels and Nathan Mensah each blocked a shot during a Spartans possession and the Aztecs responded with a fast break that resulted with Devin Watson feeding Hemsley for a dunk.

San Diego State has won nine straight home games. Its last loss on Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena was on Dec. 29, when it was stunned 82-61 by Brown.

The Aztecs improved to 8-0 in home MWC games. If they beat Fresno State here on Wednesday night, they'll finish with a perfect home league record for just the second time in the conference's 20-season history.

SAN DIEGO – New Williams stole the ball and scored the go-ahead basket on a slam dunk with 30 seconds left and Fresno State overcame an eight-point deficit in the final 2:50 to stun San Diego State 76-74 Wednesday night and clinch the No. 3 seed in the Mountain West Conference Tournament.

Deshon Taylor scored 25 points for Fresno State (21-8, 12-5 MWC), including a 3-pointer that keyed the comeback and then three free throws in the final 21 seconds.

Taylor's 3-pointer pulled Fresno State to 72-69 with 1:02 left and then SDSU couldn't handle the Bulldogs' full-court press, committing three costly turnovers.

Braxton Huggins stole the ball and went in for a layup to pull within one point. Devin Watson was caught in traffic and threw the ball away to Williams for his go-ahead slam dunk. A third turnover resulted in Taylor going to the free throw line and making both for a 75-72 lead.

SDSU's Jalen McDaniels was fouled while taking a 3-pointer and had a chance to tie it. He made the first two free throws but missed the third and the Bulldogs rebounded. Taylor made the first of two free throws and Watson missed a desperation 3 at the buzzer.

Watson and McDaniels each scored 16 points while Jeremy Hemsley had 15 and Nathan Mensah 12 for SDSU (19-11, 11-6).

San Diego State, which overcame a 15-point first-half deficit, seemed to have the game in hand when Matt Mitchell hit a 3-pointer for a 71-63 lead with 2:50 to go.

After trailing by 15 with seven minutes to go in the first half and 39-32 at halftime, SDSU went on a 13-5 run to open the second half and take its first lead of the game, 45-44, on McDaniels' slam dunk off a rebound. Hutson drew a technical foul during an ensuing timeout and Watson made both free throws for a 47-44 lead.

Jeremy Hemsley led San Diego State (19-12, 11-7) with 16 points. Matt Mitchell and Devin Watson each scored 14 for the Aztecs, who shot 34.6 percent as a team.

The Aztecs finished the season tied with UNLV for fourth place in the Mountain West. The Wolf Pack got revenge for its 65-57 loss at San Diego State on Feb. 20, and broke its three-game losing streak against the Aztecs.
