

• The Aztecs wrap up their regular season Thursday evening when they host Nevada at 5:30 p.m. They will honor their three seniors prior to the game: Arantxa Gómez Ferrer, Loli Gomez and Monica Merkovsky.

• The game will be streamed on the Mountain West Network with Chris Ello (12th season) on the call.

• The winner of Thursday's game will be the No. 7 seed at the Mountain West Tournament, which begins Sunday in Las Vegas, while the loser will be the No. 8 seed. The No. 7 seed plays the No. 10 seed Sunday at 4:30 p.m. and the No. 8 and 9 seeds face off at 2:00 p.m. San Jose State and Air Force are currently tied for ninth.

• The Aztecs snapped their five game losing streak at Fresno State Monday evening with a 59-58 win.

• The Bulldogs' Candice White hit a difficult three-pointer with 5.8 seconds left to bring Fresno State within one point. The Bulldogs then fouled Mallory Adams who missed both free throws to set up one more chance for Fresno State. After advancing the ball, they inbounded to Maddi Utti, who faked a hand-off to White and then drove baseline, stopped and elevated for an eight foot jumper that rimmed out as the buzzer went off.

• In the Aztecs' first meeting with the Wolf Pack, the Aztecs lost 74-69. A 17-2 Nevada run in the second quarter sunk SDSU.

• Junior Baylee Vanderdoes collected a season-high 11 rebounds Monday at Fresno State.

• Téa Adams led the Aztecs with 15 points Monday. She has scored 10 or more points in each of SDSU's last six games, averaging 12.0 points over that span.

- Mallory Adams has scored 10 or more points in 11 of her last 13 games, averaging 14.1 points over that span.
- Sophia Ramos is the only true freshman in the nation to average 13.0 points, 4.5 assists and 4.5 rebounds per game.
- Sophomore Najé Murray is tied for third in the SDSU record books for most three-pointers made and attempted in a single season. She is nine threes away from breaking the school record of 77 held by Jamey Cox and Courtney Clements.

• SDSU leads the conference in made free throws. Freshman Mallory Adams is second in the MW in free throws made.

Last Time Out (59-58 at Fresno State 3-4-19)

The Aztec women's basketball team (11-17, 6-11) held off a late rally by Fresno State (18-10, 11-6) to escape with a 59-58 win Monday evening.

The Bulldogs' Candice White hit a difficult three-pointer with 5.8 seconds left to bring Fresno State within one point. The Bulldogs then fouled Mallory Adams who missed both free throws to set up one more chance for Fresno State. After advancing the ball, they inbounded to Maddi Utti, who faked a hand-off to White and then drove baseline, stopped and elevated for an eight foot jumper that rimmed out as the buzzer went off.

Téa Adams had a game-high 15 points including two clutch free throws with 15 seconds left to put SDSU up four. Mallory Adams had 13 points and eight rebounds. Baylee Vanderdoes had a season-high 11 rebounds.

Fresno State started the game up 5-0 but the Aztecs then went on a 12-2 run and held the lead for the remainder of the game. SDSU shot 50 percent in the opening quarter and forced the Bulldogs to miss nine of their last 11 shots of the quarter.

The Aztecs scored the first six points of the second quarter and opened up a doubledigit lead (22-12). The Bulldogs quickly responded with a 6-0, prompting Coach Terry to call a timeout. From that point, both teams struggled offensively in the closing minutes of the first half and SDSU took a 27-20 lead at the halftime break. The Aztecs held the Bulldogs to 28 percent shooting in the first half.

The Bulldogs shot 50 percent in the third quarter, but the Aztecs were able to maintain their seven point lead entering the fourth quarter.

The Aztecs led by as much as 11 points with 5:39 remaining only to see their lead slowly dwindle. Fresno State scored 11 of the next 14 points to close the gap to three points with 2:06 left. A Sophia Ramos lay-up pushed the lead back to five with 1:13 left, but the Bulldogs hit a put back three on a kick out following an offensive rebound to bring the score to 57-55 with 36 seconds remaining.

The Bulldogs were instructed not to foul but did anyway with 15 seconds remaining, putting Téa Adams on the line, who sunk both to put SDSU up four. On the other end, Candice White hit an off-balance step-through three with 5.8 seconds remaining. The Bulldogs then fouled Mallory Adams, who missed both to set up Fresno State's final play.

The Aztecs outrebounded the Bulldogs 44-35 and held Fresno State to 24 percent from three (6-25).

Noting the Fresno State Game (W, 59-58, 3-4-19)

- SDSU won the rebounding battle 44-35 This is the second straight game the Aztecs have had at a +9 edge in rebounds.
- The Aztecs are 6-1 when holding their opponent under 60 points and 10-2 when holding the opposition under 40 percent from the field.
- This was the Aztecs first win on the year when having less than three players score in double-digits.
- SDSU had 11 bench points, the third consecutive game with 10 or more bench points, which is their longest streak during conference play.
- Baylee Vanderdoes had a season-high 11 rebounds.

 Loli Gomez had five rebounds in just eight minutes, the most boards she has had in an Aztec uniform.

Téa Adams entered last weekend 0-for-5 on the year on three-pointers and then went 3-for-

3 against San Jose State and Fresno State. Her two made threes at Fresno tied a career-high. Adams led the Aztecs with 15 points. She has scored in double-digits in each of the Aztecs' last six games.

 She has 10 or more rebounds in 14 games this season and in ten of the Aztecs' 17 MW games.

 Adams is the only true freshman in the nation to average at least 13 points and 9.5 rebounds per game in conference play.

- She leads the Mountain West in rebounding for freshmen and is tied for second overall.
- She is in the top six in the nation in free throws made and attempted per game among true freshmen.
- Adams has led the Aztecs in rebounding in 20 of their 28 games.

- Sophia Ramos leads the Aztecs in scoring with 13.6 points per game, this is the second best among freshmen in the MW.
- Ramos is the only true freshman in the nation averaging at least 13.0 points, 4.5 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game.
- She leads all freshmen in the Mountain West in assists, field goal percentage and minutes.
- She is fifth in the conference with an .813 free throw percentage.
- Ramos has scored in double-digits in 23 of their 28 games.
- Ramos has led the Aztecs in assists in 21 of their 28 games.
- Sophia Ramos scored a career-high 28 points at CSUN (12-9-18) with seven threepointers including six in the fourth quarter.

county recognition as both a sophomore and as a junior. She was heavily recruited and received offers from Gonzaga, Colorado, Washington State and Colorado State among others.

Preseason Notes

• The Aztecs were picked to finish ninth in the Mountain West preseason poll.

• The Aztecs lost four starters and six players total from a year ago. The Aztecs return just 34.6 percent of their scoring from last season.

• Najé Murray (Stockton, Calif.), who was named to the Mountain West all-freshman team last year, is the Aztecs' leading returning scorer (9.3 ppg). She led all MW freshmen in three-pointers made per game and was fourth overall in scoring among freshmen.

• The support from the community was record-breaking a season ago. The Aztecs had 22,069 fans over their 16 home games for an average of 1,379. That broke the total and average attendance records set in 2007-08, when the Aztecs drew 14,730 fans for an average of 1,133 per game.

• The Aztecs have had a winning record at home in 10 of the past 12 seasons.

• The Aztecs shot 71.4 percent from the free throw line last year, their best mark since the 1988-89 season and the fourth best rate in program history.

• The Aztecs made 200 three-pointers last season, the second most in program history (204, 2016-17). They made 33.7 percent of their three-point attempts, their best percentage since the 2009-10 season and the fourth best rate in program history

• For the second straight season San Diego State's incoming freshmen class is nationally ranked. The Aztecs' 2018 recruiting class is ranked 59th nationally (according to Prospects Nation), fourth in the Mountain West. G/F Mallory Adams (Frisco, Texas), G Jayden Perez (Las Cruces, N.M.) and G Sophia Ramos (San Antonio, Texas) comprise the freshmen class.

• Transfers Zayn Dornstauder (Ball State) and Taylor Kalmer (Oregon State) will also join the Aztecs this year, although Kalmer will sit out the 2018-19 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Dornstauder, a 6'3" center from Canada, redshirted at Ball State last year after playing two years at San Francisco as a reserve. Kalmer, a 5'8" guard, spent her past three years at Pac-12 powerhouse Oregon State where she averaged a career-high 6.0 points per game last season.


