### AZTEC STORYLINES

**SPRING BREAK:** SDSU opens its April schedule and a five-game spring break road trip with a two-game roadtrip at Oregon State.

Both games will be streamed on Pac-12 Plus and will be streamed live on the Pac-12 Plus Facebook page.

**TIME TO HIT THE ROAD, A LOT:** With 21 of SDSU's 34 home games already played, the Aztecs will play at Tony Gwynn Stadium for only six games during April. SDSU played at home 13 times during March -- the same total as SDSU's home games for the remainder of the season.

Originally scheduled for a three-game series, SDSU will make up both games that were postponed at Air Force in early March on the weekend of April 18-20. Times/dates are still to be announced.

**HEADING BACK TO CORVALLIS:** After competing in the Corvallis Regional hosted by Oregon State in 2018, SDSU makes its third trip to Corvallis since since 2016. SDSU is 1-3 all-

time in Corvallis.

**SERIES HISTORY AGAINST THE BEAVERS:** The Aztecs are 7-12-1 all-time against Oregon State, including a two-game split at OSU in 2016. SDSU took the opener, 6-5, which snapped a four-game skid against the Beavers in the all-time series. 18 of the 20 previous meetings have been played in San Diego.

**OUR GOOD FRIENDS FROM THE PAC-12:** SDSU is 6-1 in its last seven games against members of the Pac-12, including wins over Arizona and Utah this season.

## AZTEC STORYLINES

**TWO OF THE BEST ON THE WEST COAST:** San Diego State and Oregon State, the defending national champions and currently No. 6 in the nation in D1Baseball.com's latest ranking, are two of three west coast programs to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years, joined only by Cal State Fullerton.

The Aztecs and Beavers in 2018 were also two of five teams in the country to hit .300 or better, have an ERA of 4.05 or lower, and a fielding percentage of .973 or better. Only New Mexico State, Ole Miss, and Minnesota were in that category last season.

Entering the NCAA postseason last year, SDSU was hitting .305 as a team with a 3.90 team ERA. At that point, the only team in the country to have better marks in both statistics was Oregon State.

**TAKING ON THE CHAMPS:** SDSU is playing the defending national champion for the first time since May 30, 2009, when the Aztecs played Fresno State, which won the 2008 national championship. The Aztecs won that game, 4-1, to stay alive in NCAA Regional play at the Irvine Regional.

**PLAYING AGAINST TEAMS WITH CWS EXPERIENCE:** Since 2015, San Diego State is 5-7 against teams that played in the College World Series the year prior. Before that stretch, the Aztecs were in a 14-game losing streak against those opponents.

**RUDICK ON FIRE:** Matt Rudick currently rides a career-long 19-game hitting streak, which is the longest by an Aztec since Steven Pallares recorded a 21-game hitting streak in 2015.

Over Rudick's 19-game hitting streak, the sophomore is hitting a team-best .381 (32-for-84), with team highs in extra-base hits (seven), RBIs (17) and doubles (five).

**PITCHERS WHO RAKE:** San Diego State pitchers Michael Paredes, Casey Schmitt, Julian Escobedo and Brian Leonhardt have all had at bats while pitching this season. Combined, those four two-way players are hitting .385 (5-for-13) with three RBIs and three extra-base hits (2 2B, HR) when hitting as the Aztecs pitcher.

**WHERE WE RANK IN THE MW:** The Aztecs are the only team in the Mountain West to be hitting .280 or better while having an ERA under 4.50. Both SDSU's .284 batting average and 4.20 ERA rank third in the conference.

Matt Rudick is sixth in the Mountain West with a .345 batting average and fourth in the league with 40 hits, while Angelo Armenta is also sixth in the league with a .448 on-base percentage. The Aztecs have five players with an on-base percentage of .395 or better (Armenta - .448, Rudick - .412, Casey Schmitt - .410, Chad Bible - .402, and Mike Jarvis - .395), making the Aztecs the only team in the league with that distinction.

Aaron Eden is fourth in the league with a 2.54 earned run average and 11th with a .262 opponent batting average while Justin Goossen-Brown and Casey O'Sullivan are sixth and seventh, respectively, with 34 and 32 strikeouts.

**SEEING DOUBLE:** SDSU's 32 double plays turned are the second most in the country, trailing only George Washington's 35. Since the start of the 2017 season, SDSU's 158 double plays turned are the most among any team in the nation.

**MAKING THE MOST OF IT:** Due to injuries on the pitching staff, SDSU has had to use nine different starters during the 2019 season. Those nine starters feature five pitchers who had never started a college game before this season, including true freshmen Aaron Eden, Michael Paredes, and Brian Leonhardt and Casey Schmitt and Adrian Mardueno, who had been used strictly as relievers prior to the start of this season. All three of SDSU's opening weekend starters have not pitched in each of the last three weekend series and have not made an appearance since opening-day starter Logan Boyer threw 0.2 of an inning at CSUN on March 12.

Despite the variety of starting pitchers used, SDSU starters collectively own a 3.47 ERA, a .246 opponent batting average, and have struck out 119 batters in 124.2 innings.

**STRIKEOUTS GALORE:** SDSU has exceeded its 2018 total of 13 double-digit strikeout games, needing just 23 games this season to record 14 10+ strikeout games. The Aztecs are currently 29th in the country averaging 9.8 strikeouts per nine innings.

Despite not even being halfway through the season, SDSU's 16 10+ strikeout games are the most since the 2015 team recorded 20 double-digit strikeout performances.

**CALIFORNIA LOVE:** Since 2014, the Aztecs lead all Division I California programs in win total. Also, over that span, SDSU is 99-49 (.669) when playing in-state counterparts.

**EYEING 2,500:** With a 35-win season in 2019, the Aztecs would become the 27th team in the nation to reach the 2,500-win threshold and become just the fourth California program to do so, joining USC, Fresno State, and Stanford.

**PRESEASON FAVORITES:** Mountain West head coaches named SDSU the preseason favorite in the conference, collecting four first-place votes and 32 overall points. SDSU also placed Casey Schmitt, Logan Boyer, and Julian Escobedo on the all-MW preseason team, leaving SDSU in a tie with Nevada for most selections on the preseason all-conference team. SDSU is preseason favorites for the first time since 2014, when SDSU was co-preseason favorites with New Mexico.

In addition, both D1Baseball.com and Baseball America have also projected SDSU to win the Mountain West.

**CLASS OF THE MOUNTAIN WEST:** In addition to winning their fifth conference crown in the last six years, SDSU led the conference in nearly every team

pitching category last season including earned run average (4.03), opposing batting average (.253), strikeouts (467), wins (39), saves (19), hits allowed per nine innings (8.67), fewest runs allowed (291), fewest earned runs allowed (240), fewest extra-base hits allowed (125), fewest triples allowed (9), and fewest home runs allowed (26).

**SUCCESS AT TONY GWYNN STADIUM:** The Aztecs set a Tony Gwynn Stadium record (since 1997) with 25 home wins last season, besting the previous mark of 24 set in 1997, 2002, and 2014. Since the start of the 2012 season, the Aztecs are 141-93 (.603) when playing at home.

#### PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN CASEY SCHMITT:

After a record-setting freshman season, sophomore RHP/IF Casey Schmitt was recognized as a preseason all-American by both the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (Second Team) and Collegiate Baseball Newspaper (Third Team). After setting SDSU's single-season ERA record (minimum 30 IP) at 0.28, Schmitt was the first Aztec to become a Baseball America First Team Freshman All-American since Stephen Strasburg did so in 2007.

Schmitt entered 2019 having thrown 25.1 scoreless innings and was the only player in the nation last season to have an ERA under 1.00 (minimum 15 IP) and drive in 30 or more runs at the plate. In the Mountain West Championships, Schmitt became the first freshman in the league to win Most Valuable Player since SDSU's Ty France did so in 2013.

**REPLACING WHAT'S GONE:** The Aztecs lost four position player starters -- all drafted by MLB teams -- and two pitchers who ranked near the top of the Mountain West. Chase Calabuig, SDSU's all-time games played leader and leading hitter last season, was drafted in the 27th round by Oakland, while Jordan Verdon, the team's leader in home runs, extra-base hits, and RBIs a year ago, was picked by Detroit in the 23rd round. Starting shortstop David Hensley and starting catcher Dean Nevarez were picked up by Houston (26th round) and Seattle (19th round), respectively. 2018 Mountain West Co-Pitcher of the Year Garrett Hill was drafted by Detroit in the 26th round.

SDSU also lost the Mountain West's all-time pitching appearances leader, Jacob Erickson, who ended his career with 120 appearances. Erickson recorded a 2.37 ERA against Mountain West opponents -- good for the second-best mark among all qualified pitchers in the conference. Erickson, an all-MW second team honoree, also led the conference in strikeout-to-walk ratio.

**IN THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION:** The Aztecs are one of 18 teams in the country to have reached a regional five times in the last six seasons, one of 13 teams in the country to have won 39 or more games

five times in the last six years, and one of nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons. SDSU is one of just three west coast programs to have played in five regionals since 2013, joined by only Oregon State and Cal State Fullerton.

**ONLY ONES:** The Aztecs are the only team in the country to have won five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons.

**GOOD IN ALL ASPECTS:** The Aztecs were one of five teams in the country last season to have a batting average above .300, an ERA below 4.05, and a fielding percentage above .973 last season, joined by only Oregon State, New Mexico State, Ole Miss, and Minnesota.

**HOMEGROWN:** 11 players on the SDSU roster are from San Diego county. Last season, San Diego natives accounted for 411 of SDSU's 632 hits (65 percent) while San Diego native pitchers combined for a 1.67 earned run average over 64.1 innings pitched.

Mark Martinez heads into his fifth season as head coach and 14th at SDSU in 2019 after being named the late Tony Gwynn's successor on August 20, 2014.

During his fourth season as head coach in 2018, Martinez became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to win three conference championships. In 2017, Martinez logged his 100th win as head coach and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach the century mark.

Martinez led SDSU to a 39-21 performance in 2018, leaving the Aztecs as one of 13 teams in the nation to have won 39 or more games four times in the past five years. Since the start of the 2014 season — Martinez's final year as SDSU's head assistant coach under Gwynn — the Aztecs have recorded 185 wins, the most among all Division I California programs.

San Diego State will enter the 2019 season as the only team in Division I baseball with five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons. SDSU is one of 18 programs in the nation to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years and one of just two programs in California, joined by only Cal State Fullerton. Statistically, the Aztecs are one of just nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons and will enter 2019 having led the MW in earned run average in back-to-back seasons.

Martinez, who has been a part of 1,030 collegiate baseball wins since starting his coaching career in 1984, enters his fifth season as a head coach with a record of 143-103 (.581). Under his watch, SDSU has reached its highest academic progress rate, highest team grade point average, and highest total of scholar-athletes in its 82-year history. Last April, Martinez received the Center for Community Solutions Champions Award, recognizing his efforts in starting healthy relationships and consent education training with SDSU baseball student-athletes and coaches.

Fifteen Aztecs have been selected by the MLB First-Year Player draft and 10 Aztecs have been named Mountain West scholar athletes (3.5 GPA or better) since 2015. Martinez has also directed 21 student-athletes to all-MW honors over the last four seasons, including back-to-back MW Pitchers of the Year (Brett Seeburger — 2017, Garrett Hill — 2018) and 2017 MW Player of the Year Danny Sheehan.

Martinez entered the start of his head coaching career with 31 years

of coaching experience as an assistant coach, split between nine years on Gwynn's Aztec staff (2006–2014), 17 years at New Mexico (1989–2005), and five seasons at his alma mater Mesa State (1984–1988). With Gwynn, Martinez helped SDSU end an 18-year drought from the NCAA postseason with an appearance in 2009.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had seven of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry, Lance Zawadzki, and Greg Allen).

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans. In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals.

The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons. Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well. During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season,

only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State. In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American. Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer. During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage. New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88. Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990. In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa, and a son, Cade

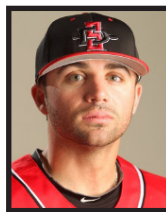
