SDSU Women's Golf Set for MW Championship

After three straight runner-up placements, the San Diego State women's golf team will be aiming for its second conference title in the last five years when it travels to the Palm Springs area next week for the Mountain West Championship, April 15-17, in Rancho Mirage, Calif. The 54-hole event will be conducted at Mission Hills Country Club on the renowned Dinah Shore Tournament Course, home of one of the LPGA Tour's majors, the ANA Inspiration, formerly known as the Kraft Nabisco Championship.

The nine-team field will play 18 holes on the par-72, 6,270-yard layout each of the three days, following a practice round on Sunday. The Aztecs received the No. 2 seed are scheduled to tee off with No. 5 New Mexico and No. 8 Boise State in the second group on Monday, starting at 7:45 a.m. PT, while the pairings for the final two rounds with be based on team standings. A live scoring link will be available courtesy of Golfstat on GoAztecs.com.

The MW Championship returns to Mission Hills for the seventh straight season after a two-year run in 2011 and 2012 at the Wigwam Resort in Litchfield Park, Ariz., just outside of Phoenix. During the 2009 and 2010 campaigns, the event was held at the Black Horse Golf Club in Seaside, Calif., near Monterey. In the league's 18-year history, the championships have also been contested in three other states: Oregon, Utah and New Mexico.

Aztec Lineup

Eighth-year San Diego State head coach Leslie Spalding will accompany five golfers to the Coachella Valley next week, featuring sophomores Gioia Carpinelli (Boppelsen, Switzerland) and Sara Kjellker (Hollviken, Sweden), junior Fernanda Escauriza (Asunción, Paraguay), as well as seniors Daniela Anastasi (La Jolla, Calif.) and

Kitty Tam (Hong Kong, China).
Escauriza will looking to duplicate her success from the 2017 MW Championship when she became the Aztecs' first-ever medalist in a conference tournament after shooting a 6-under 210 to win by two strokes during the her freshman campaign. She also tied for eighth at last season's event with a 4-over 220, finishing seven shots behind SDSU's Mila Chaves, who took home the individual crown before

completing her eligibility. In addition, Carpinelli (20th, +12) and Kjellker (T-35th, +20) find themselves in the thick of the fight for the second year in row, while Anastasi and Tam are each making their first conference tournament appearances. Carpinelli finds herself at No. 59 in the latest Golfstat individual rankings, while Kjellker checks in at No. 129.

SDSU At The MW ChampionshipDespite boasting medalist Mila Chaves and two other top-10 players in Georgia Lacey (T-6th) and Fernanda Escauriza (T-8th), the Aztecs (+16) took second place at the Mountain West Championship for the third year in a row last season, finishing eight strokes behind UNLV (+8).

In 2017, SDSU also sported the individual winner in Escauriza and set a school record for lowest collective score in a conference tournament with a 7-over 871. However, the Scarlet and Black was relegated to the runner-up spot once again after the champion UNLV (+4) emerged triumphant by three strokes.

The Aztecs also came up just short in their quest for a league title the previous year after a second-place effort at the 2016 MW Championship. Despite firing a combined 2-under 286 during the final round, a school standard for 18 holes in a conference tournament, San Diego State finished at 22-over 886, nine strokes in back of first-place UNLV (+13).

In 2015, the Aztecs captured the first MW championship in program history after topping New Mexico by five shots. Despite falling on the first hole of a sudden-death playoff, Mila Chaves shattered the SDSU record for best individual score in a 54-hole league tournament after firing a 6-under 210, which was ultimately matched by fellow compatriot Escauriza in 2017. With her first-place tie in regulation, Chaves equaled the finish of Christine Wong, who also lost on the fourth hole of a playoff in 2012.

In addition to its conference crown that season, San Diego has finished fifth at the MW tourney on seven occasions, second five times, third and seventh twice, while placing fourth and sixth once each.

In 2014, the Aztecs landed in a three-way tie for third after oc-cupying the fifth position in 2013. SDSU also posted back-to-back fifth-place performances in 2010 and 2011 to go along with another third-place effort in 2012. In addition, the Scarlet and Black wound up seventh in both 2008 and 2009, following a sixth-place result in 2007. The program was also fifth in 2003, 2005 and 2006, fourth in 2004 to go with consecutive runner-up placements in 2001 and 2002. The Aztecs were disqualified in the inaugural tournament in 2000, after two players turned in incorrect scorecards in the third and final round.

The Competition

Five of SDSU's opponents at the MW Championship are among the top 100 teams in the latest Golfstat rankings released April 9. San José State is the highest rated squad in the field, landing in the 27th spot this week, while defending champion UNLV checks in at No. 76, followed by Colorado State (90), New Mexico (92) and Fresno State (95). In addition, SDSU will lock horns with Nevada (105), Boise State (121) and Wyoming (167), while the two remaining MW members, Air Force and Utah State, do not sponsor women's golf programs.

The Aztecs own an 11-2 record in head-to-head results against fiveconference foes during the 2018-19 campaign, including a 4-0 ledger against New Mexico. SDSU has also maintained spotless marks against UNLV (3-0), Fresno State (2-0) and Colorado State (1-0), but came out on the wrong side of standings in two of three tournaments competing against San José State. Conversely, the Scarlet and Black has not faced, Nevada, Wyoming or Boise State.

Individually, seven of the top-15 finishers return from last year's conference championship, including Colorado State's Katrina Prendergrast (E) and Ellen Secor (+1), who landed in the third and fourth spots, respectively, while SDSU's Fernanda Escauriza (+4) and UNLV's Polly Mack (+4) tied for eighth. Fellow Rebel teammates Shannon Oh (+5) and Elizabeth Prior (+5) are also back in the mix after each tied for 10th, while Wyoming's Erin Sargent (+7) tied for 15th

San José State senior Abegail Arevalo, who enters the week as the top-ranked golfer in the MW is expected to contend as well, along with teammates Natasha Andrea Oon, Franziska Friedrich and Alexandra Cooper, the Aztecs' Gioia Carpinelli and Sara Kjellker, Fresno State's Brigitte Thibault and Jessica Hall, Nevada's Victoria Gailey, Chaithra Katamneni and Jenny Krause, and Boise State's Tara Finigan, all of whom are among the league's top 20 players in Golfstat's head-tohead rankings.

Backspin: 2018 MW ChampionshipSan Diego State's Mila Chaves claimed the individual title at the 2018
Mountain West Championship after shooting an even-par 72 during the final round at Mission Hills Country Club.

With her total, Chaves completed the event with a 54-hole total of 3-under 213 to give the Aztecs their second straight medalist at the conference tournament after fellow compatriot Fernanda Escauriza accomplished the feat last year.

"I don't know what it is about this place, but Mila and Fernanda absolutely love this course," said San Diego State head coach Leslie Spalding. "I am so proud of Mila's performance. Watching her play with us is just so much fun. She loves these greens and can see the putts very well, which really contributed to her win today.

As a team, SDSU landed in the runner-up position behind UNLV for the third consecutive year after logging a collective 2-over 290 during the final round on the par-72, 6,270-yard Dinah Shore Tournament Course. Despite posting their lowest team score of the week, the Aztecs were unable to significantly narrow the gap against the Rebels (+8), who won by eight shots.
With its result, SDSU finished with a combined 16-over 880, while

Colorado State (+31) was a distant third, followed by New Mexico (+38) and Nevada (+39).

Chaves, who lost a one-hole playoff at the MW Championship as a freshman in 2015, avenged her earlier disappointment with a steady performance on Wednesday, edging UNLV's Mackenzie Raim (-2) by

one shot for her first collegiate victory.

The two players were all even after Chaves made bogey on the par-5, 494-yard No. 11. However, the Aztec senior jumped in front to stay on the very next green, draining a birdie on the par-4, 375-yard No. 12, which ranked as the third-toughest hole of the week, while her

Chaves increased her lead to two strokes in the de facto match after notching a par-4 at No. 15, while Raim suffered a bogey. The 2018 South American Women's Amateur champion finished with three additional pars over her final three holes, holding off her UNLV challenger, who carded a birdie on the par-3, 145-yard 17th, but could draw no closer.

With average individual scores increasing for the third day in row up to 76.84, Chaves became the lone golfer in the field of 45 players to complete all three rounds at or below par. She totaled three birdies on the day at No. 2 and No. 4, offsetting a potentially damaging double bogey-6 on the third green.

Two other SDSU competitors made significant gains on the leaderboard to finish in the top 10, as Georgia Lacey vaulted eight spots into a tie for sixth at 3-over 219, while sophomore Fernanda Escauriza ended in a tie for eighth at 4-over 220.

Lacey recorded a final-round 71, sinking four birdies to counter a double bogev-6 at No. 10 and another bogev on the aforementioned 12th en route to her highest placement at the MW Championship. On the other hand, Escauriza carded the low round of the tournament with a career-best 68 over the final 18 holes, posting four birdies, including an impressive drain on the par-4, 402-yard No. 3, which ranked as the toughest hole of the week.

Conversely, Gioia Carpinelli was unable to avoid a drop of five places, but still finished alone in 20th at 12-over 228 after shooting a 79. The day started ominously for the Aztec freshman, who opened with a double bogey followed by two additional blemishes at No. 4 and No. 8. Carpinelli tried to regroup with a birdie on the ninth green followed by four consecutive pars. However, two bogeys and another double on her final five holes derailed her momentum.

Elsewhere, Sara Kjellker completed her first MW Championship in a tie for 35th at 20-over 236 following an uncharacteristic 80. The SDSU freshman experienced a dearth of birdies and was unable to overcome the sting of six bogeys and a double.

Mountain West History 101

 New Mexico dominated the first four years of the Mountain West Women's Golf Championship, claiming the team title by at least 11 shots in each of the first three seasons before coming back to defeat UNLV in 2003 by one stroke. The Rebels got their revenge against UNM over the next three years, edging the Lobos by two shots in both 2004 and 2005 to capture the conference crown before winning by five strokes in 2006. After TCU registered a oneshot victory over Brigham Young in 2007, New Mexico topped the Cougars by 19 strokes on its home course in the 2008 installment to usher in another three-year reign, which included two straight decisions over runner-up TCU in 2009 and 2010. However, the Horned Frogs managed to capture two consecutive championships of their own in 2011 and 2012 before bolting for the Big 12. The MW tournament witnessed a return to form in the following two seasons as UNLV and New Mexico won titles in 2013 and 2014, respectively, before the Aztecs busted that oligarchy in 2015.

In 2015, San Diego State became the first team other than New Mexico, UNLV and former conference member TCU to capture the MW Championship. However, the Rebels have taken home the last three crowns and will be vying to match UNM's record streak of four straight titles from 2000-03.

• Prior to 2015, New Mexico and UNLV owned at least a share of all 12 MW championship records. However, the Aztecs' Mila Chaves etched her name into the history books that season, opening with a 66 to set a conference tournament standard for lowest first-round score. In 2017, SDSU's Fernanda Escauriza became the first freshman medalist out of four competitors to complete all three rounds of the MW Championship below par (71-69-70).

· Seven different schools have had a player collect medalist honors, including New Mexico (2001, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2015), UNLV (2004, 2005, 2006, 2011, 2016), San Diego State (2017, 2018), Wyoming (2000, 2009), Colorado State (2002), TCU (2012) and Fresno State (2014).

 The first Mountain West Championship took place in 2000 at the Sunbrook Golf Club in St. George, Utah. The tournament then moved to Sunriver Resort in central Oregon over the next five seasons; however, the first round of the 2003 event was conducted at the Awbrey Glen Golf Course in Bend, Ore., due to inclement weather. The tournament has also been played at the Entrada at Snow Canyon Resort in St. George (2006-07), the UNM Championship Course in Albuquerque, N.M. (2008), the Black Horse Golf Course in Seaside, Calif. (2009-10) and the Wigwam Resort in Litchfield Park, Ariz. (2011-12).

2018-19 Highlights

· Despite the loss of former all-MW honorees Mila Chaves and Georgia Lacey while facing a schedule replete with high-level competition, San Diego State enjoyed another successful season in 2018-19, posting top-10 team finishes in seven of eight stroke-play events, including a pair of third-place performances at the Branch Law Firm Dick McGuire Invitational and in the maedal round of the Aztecs' own Lamkin Invitational

- The Aztecs opened the season last September at the aforementioned Branch/McGuire Invitational in Albuquerque, N.M., where Gioia Carpinelli finished in a tie for the runner-up spot after carding a career-best 6-under 210, highlighted by a final-round 68.
- Carpinelli was also SDSU's top golfer at the Golfweek Conference Challenge in Wolcott, Colo., where she wound up a solo 12th at even-par 216.
- The Aztecs faced some robust competition in their next two events, finishing 13th at Northwestern University's Windy City Collegiate Classic just outside of Chicago, Ill., before rising to the eighth position at the Stanford Intercollegiate. Kjellker held her own in the former event, tying for 15th with a 3-over 219, before landing in the 20th position at Stanford, along with Carpinelli (+2).
- · SDSU wrapped up its fall slate with seven individuals competing at the UC Irvine Invitational, where Kjellker posted her highest placement of the year thus far with fifth-place tie at 3-under 213.
- During the winter break, Escauriza won the South American Women's Amateur Championship in Santiago, Chile, where she carded a collective 12-under 276 to win by eight strokes over fellow Paraguayan Sofia Garcia (-4). Escauriza was the only golfer in the 51-player field to complete all four rounds below par (69-71-68-68).
- SDSU opened its second semester schedule at the Bruin Wave Invitational in San Luis Obispo, where only eight individuals finished in red figures for the tournament. The Aztecs were paced by Escauriza and Carpinelli, who ended up in a four-way tie for third at 8-over 224, as the Scarlet and Black took sixth in the team standings
- Carpinelli broke through for her first collegiate victory two weeks later at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational in Tucson, where she was the lone golfer in the 92-player field to finish below par for the tournament, posting a combined 1-under 215 to propel the Aztecs to a fifth-place team finish.
- Shortly thereafter, the Aztecs returned the Golden State to conduct their seventh annual home event, the Lamkin Invitational, which featured a match-play sequence for the fifth year in a row, following an opening round of stroke play. Carpinelli emerged triumphant for the second straight tournament, winning the medal phase with a 2-under 70 to help SDSU clinch the No. 3 seed in match play. The Aztecs shut out UC Irvine in their opening match, 5-0, before falling to Cal in the second round 3.5-1.5. However, the Scarlet and Black rebounded with a 4-1 triumph over Sacramento State to claim third place. Individually, Kjellker (3-0) and Escauriza (2-0-1) finished with unblemished records, while Carpinelli and April Ranches both went 2-1.
- · San Diego State finished 10th at the Silverado Showdown in Napa, Calif., during its last event, as Escauriza (18th, +6) and Kjellker (T-19th, +7) cracked the individual top 20.

Just A Chip Shot Away
The winner of next week's Mountain West Championship earns an automatic bid to the NCAA regional tournament. If SDSU claims the MW title, it will head to the NCAA regionals, May 6-8, in either Cle Elum, Wash., Norman, Okla., East Lansing, Mich., or Opelika, Ala. The trip to the NCAAs would be the team's ninth in the last 10 years after three individuals, Christine Wong, Emma Henrikson and Paige Spiranac, were invited to compete in the Central Regional in 2013.

Each of the four regional tournaments will include 18 schools, along with six individuals not on those qualifying teams. The participants will be selected by the NCAA women's golf committee and announced later this month on the Golf Channel

The top six squads and the three highest finishing individuals not on those teams from each region will advance to the NCAA Championships, May 17-22, in Fayetteville, Ark.

Head Coach Leslie Spalding

Leslie Spalding, who was hired in August 2011, is in her eighth season as head coach of the Aztecs.

Since her arrival on Montezuma Mesa, Spalding has guided SDSU to nine team tournament titles, including the 2015 Mountain West Championship, which marked the team's first-ever conference crown. For her efforts, the Billings, Mont., native was named MW Women's Golf Coach of the Year.

During her tenure, Spalding's players have garnered 18 all-conference accolades, including Emma Henrikson, who became the team's first-ever All-American after receiving honorable mention in 2016.

In addition, Spalding's charges have excelled in the classroom, earning 24 all-academic honors and 13 scholar-athlete certificates from the MW to go with nine WGCA Scholar All-America recipients.

Spalding played on the LPGA Tour from 1996 to 2005, competing in 215 events with seven top-10 finishes while earning more than \$600,000 in prize money. After completing her playing career, she served as the head women's golf coach at Montana State from 2007-11.

As a collegian, Spalding attended the University of Alabama on a golf scholarship from 1987 to 1991 and received her bachelor's degree in telecommunication/film with a minor in marketing in 1992.
