AZTEC STORYLINES

ORANGE COUNTY: San Diego State concludes a five-game stretch of non-conference games at UC Irvine on Tuesday night. Links to follow along with live stats are available on GoAztecs.com.

NATIONALLY RANKED FOES: Tuesday marks as SDSU's sixth game against a nationally ranked opponent. Over those previous five games, SDSU is 2-3. At the plate, Matt Rudick is 11-for-22 (.500) against nationally ranked opponents this season.

SERIES HISTORY WITH UCI: SDSU is 58-36-1 all-time against UC Irvine and 27-16-1 when playing against the Anteaters on the road.

LAST TIME OUT VS. UC IRVINE: The Aztecs defeated UC Irvine 9-3 in their fourth game of the season on February 19. Brian Leonhardt led the Aztecs with a 3-for-4 performance including four RBIs against the Anteaters, while Casey O'Sullivan earned the win on the mound for SDSU, pitching two innings of one-hit relief with four strikeouts. Justin Goossen-Brown made the start, pitching three hitless innings and faced the minium over his nine batters faced.

SERIES WIN AT FULLERTON: The Aztecs won their first road series at Cal State Fullerton since 1965 this weekend, winning each of the first two games 6-1 and 13-7 before falling in the finale, 7-2. SDSU has won six of its last eight games against the Titans, marking the best eight-game stretch against CSF in program history.

SDSU's first two wins gave the Aztecs three consecutive wins when playing at Goodwin Field, marking the first time over 35 all-time

meetings in Fullerton that the Aztecs had won three in a row.

Chad Bible, Brian Leonhardt, and Julian Escobedo led the Aztecs with five hits each for the series. Leonhardt drove in a team-high five runs over the weekend, while Escobedo hit his third and fourth home runs of the season in Fullerton.

Justin Goossen-Brown recorded his fourth consecutive quality start on Friday night, earning the win after six shutout innings with only three hits allowed. Over Goossen-Brown's last 21 innings pitched the senior has allowed just two earned runs.

SUCCESS AGAINST THE BIG WEST: The Aztecs are 27-9 (.750) against Big West taams since the start of the 2017 season. SDSU's loss on Sunday against Cal State Fullerton snapped a seven-game winning streak against Big West programs.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Since 2014, the Aztecs lead all Division I California programs in win total. Also, over that span, SDSU is 102-50 (.671) when playing teams based in California.

OVER THE LAST 10: The Aztecs are 7-3 over their last 10 games, marking the second-best 10-game stretch of the 2019 season. Sunday's loss against Cal State Fullerton also snapped a season-best five game winning streak.

Over the last 10, the Aztec bullpen has been one of the biggest bright spots, owning a 2.81 ERA and .223 opponent batting average while striking out 54 batters in 48 innings pitched.

ON THE ROAD THIS SEASON: The Aztecs are 8-6 away from Tony Gwynn Stadium this season. Chad Bible leads the Aztecs with a .368 batting average on the road while owning team-highs with three home runs and 13 RBIs.

AZTEC STORYLINES

STRIKEOUTS GALORE: SDSU has recorded 20 games with 10 or more strikeouts, tied for the most since recording 23 double-digit strikeout games in 2009. In 2009, Stephen Strasburg recorded 10 or more strikeouts in 13 of his 15 starts during his Golden Spikes Award-winning season.

The Aztecs also recorded 20 double-digit strikeout performances during the 2015 season.

SCHEDULE UPDATES: This weekend's series against Air Force has been altered due to postponed games in Colorado Springs in early March.

The Aztecs and Falcons will resume the second game of the early March series in Colorado Springs on Thursday night. The Aztecs lead that game 2-0 in the top of the second and the third game of the series has been canceled.

SDSU and Air Force will play a doubleheader starting at 2:00 p.m. on Friday. The second game of the doubleheader will start at 6:00 p.m. or 30 minutes after first pitch if the first game ends later than 5:30 p.m.

In addition, on May 6, the Aztecs will play Brigham Young at Lake Elsinore Stadium, home of the Lake Elsinore Storm, single-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres. First pitch is scheduled for 6:00 p.m.

IMPACT FRESHMAN: Freshman Brian Leonhardt drove in a team-high six runs last week while recording a trio of multi-hit performances. Leonhardt currently rides a seven-game hitting streak, leads the team with 14 multi-hit games this season, and is fourth in the conference with 14 doubles.

With 19 games still remaining on the regular-season schedule, Leonhardt has recorded four games with four or more RBIs, which is tied for the most 4+ RBI performances since Nick Romero had five 4+ RBI showings in 2008. Jordan Verdon (2018), Tyler Adkison (2017), Seby Zavala (2015), and Brandon Meredith (2010) also had four 4+ RBI games.

ADRIAN MARDUENO IS REALLY GOOD:

Including Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week, Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week, and Mountain West Pitcher of the Week awards received on April 8-9, Marudeno has been the Mountain West's most dominant arm during the 2019 season, leading the conference in ERA (1.40) and opponent batting average (.138). Mardueno leads the conference in ERA by half a run (Air Force's Jake Gilbert is second at 1.90) and opposing batting average by .051 percentage points (UNLV's Ryan Hare is second at .189).

Mardueno posted a pair of scoreless performances against Cal State Fullerton, extending is streak of not allowing an earned run to 17 innings. Over that span, Mardueno has allowed just six hits and has struck out 19 batters.

Mardueno, who led the Aztecs in inherited runners stranded percentage as both a freshman and sophomore, leads the Aztecs once again as a junior, having stranded 72 percent of his inherited base runners. Over his streak of 17 innings without allowing an earned run, Mardueno has stranded nine of a possible 10 inherited runners.

Mardueno's ERA also stands as 19th best in the country, while his 3.96 hits allowed per nine innings is second-best in the nation, trailing only Omaha's Spencer Koelewyn (3.76 hits per nine).

ROAD TRIPPING: After playing each of their first eight, 16 of their first 18, and 21 of their first 27 at home, San Diego State is in the middle of a stretch where they will play nine of 10 on the road and only have six home games the entire month of April.

SEEING DOUBLE: SDSU leads the nation with 43 double plays turned this season. Since the start of the 2017 season, SDSU's 169 double plays turned are the most among any team in the nation.

FIVE, IT'S A MAGIC NUMBER: SDSU is 53-9 in their last 62 games when scoring five or more runs.

REBOUNDING QUICKLY: SDSU is 40-12 in their last 50 games following a loss.

UNDER PRESSURE: SDSU is 27-14 in their last 41 one-run games.

A BREAK FROM MW PLAY: The Aztecs end a

stretch of five consecutive non-conference games on Tuesday and are 14-9 (.609) in non-conference play. Five of SDSU's non-conference games have been against nationally ranked opponents. Brian Leonhardt leads the team with a .351 average in non-conference play, including team-bests in doubles (10) and RBIs (24).

EYEING 2,500: With a 35-win season in 2019, the Aztecs would become the 27th team in the nation to reach the 2,500-win threshold and become just the fourth California program to do so, joining USC, Fresno State, and Stanford.

PRESEASON FAVORITES: Mountain West head coaches named SDSU the preseason favorite in the conference, collecting four first-place votes and 32 overall points. SDSU also placed Casey Schmitt, Logan Boyer, and Julian Escobedo on the all-MW preseason team, leaving SDSU in a tie with Nevada for most selections on the preseason all-conference team. SDSU is preseason favorites for the first time since 2014, when SDSU was co-preseason favorites with New Mexico.

In addition, both D1Baseball.com and Baseball America have also projected SDSU to win the Mountain West.

SUCCESS AT TONY GWYNN STADIUM: The

Aztecs set a Tony Gwynn Stadium record (since 1997) with 25 home wins last season, besting the previous mark of 24 set in 1997, 2002, and 2014. Since the start of the 2012 season, the Aztecs are 142-93 (.603) when playing at home.

IN THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION: The

Aztecs are one of 18 teams in the country to have reached a regional five times in the last six seasons, one of 13 teams in the country to have won 39 or more games five times in the last six years, and one of nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons. SDSU is one of just three west coast programs to have played in five regionals since 2013, joined by only Oregon State and Cal State Fullerton.

Teams that have reached five regionals in the last six years: Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Clemson, Dallas Baptist, Florida, Florida State, Indiana, Louisville, LSU, Mississippi State, NC State, Oklahoma State, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Rice, San Diego State, Texas A&M, Vanderbilt

ONLY ONES: The Aztecs are the only team in the country to have won five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons.

Mark Martinez heads into his fifth season as head coach and 14th at SDSU in 2019 after being named the late Tony Gwynn's successor on August 20, 2014.

During his fourth season as head coach in 2018, Martinez became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to win three conference championships. In 2017, Martinez logged his 100th win as head coach and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach the century mark.

Martinez led SDSU to a 39-21 performance in 2018, leaving the Aztecs as one of 13 teams in the nation to have won 39 or more games four times in the past five years. Since the start of the 2014 season — Martinez's final year as SDSU's head assistant coach under Gwynn — the Aztecs have recorded 185 wins, the most among all Division I California programs.

San Diego State will enter the 2019 season as the only team in Division I baseball with five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons. SDSU is one of 18 programs in the nation to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years and one of just two programs in California, joined by only Cal State Fullerton. Statistically, the Aztecs are one of just nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons and will enter 2019 having led the MW in earned run average in back-to-back seasons.

Martinez, who has been a part of 1,030 collegiate baseball wins since starting his coaching career in 1984, enters his fifth season as a head coach with a record of 143-103 (.581). Under his watch, SDSU has reached its highest academic progress rate, highest team grade point average, and highest total of scholar-athletes in its 82-year history. Last April, Martinez received the Center for Community Solutions Champions Award, recognizing his efforts in starting healthy relationships and consent education training with SDSU baseball student-athletes and coaches.

Fifteen Aztecs have been selected by the MLB First-Year Player draft and 10 Aztecs have been named Mountain West scholar athletes (3.5 GPA or better) since 2015. Martinez has also directed 21 student-athletes to all-MW honors over the last four seasons, including back-to-back MW Pitchers of the Year (Brett Seeburger – 2017, Garrett Hill – 2018) and 2017 MW Player of the Year Danny Sheehan.

Martinez entered the start of his head coaching career with 31 years

of coaching experience as an assistant coach, split between nine years on Gwynn's Aztec staff (2006–2014), 17 years at New Mexico (1989–2005), and five seasons at his alma mater Mesa State (1984–1988). With Gwynn, Martinez helped SDSU end an 18-year drought from the NCAA postseason with an appearance in 2009.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had seven of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry, Lance Zawadski, and Greg Allen).

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals.

The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons. Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well. During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season, only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State. In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American. Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer. During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage. New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico. he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88. Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990. In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa, and a son, Cade




