#### **SAYING HELLO TO OUR SECOND**

**HOME:** Since Fowler Park and Cunningham Field opened in 2013, the Aztecs are 7-1 when playing at San Diego and have outscored the Toreros 47-20.

SDSU has won each of the last four meetings at USD and overall, SDSU has won 14 of the last 17 against USD when playing as the road team.

**THE ALL-TIME SERIES:** The Aztecs lead the all-time series against the Toreros, 75-57-3.

SERIES WIN AGAINST AIR FORCE: The Aztecs posted a 3.25 team ERA over the weekend, leading the way to a 3-1 record against Air Force in a four-game set.

Offensively, Jaden Fein led the team with a .417 batting average (5-for-12) while recording a team-best .917 slugging percentage with a double, triple, and his team-leading fourth home run of the season over the weekend.

The Aztecs hit .297 with runners in scoring position for the series while holding the Falcons to just a .185 clip.

With the trio of wins, SDSU improves to 10-3 in their last 13 home games against Air Force

and 25-10 in their last 35 games overall against the Falcons.

On Saturday, SDSU moved into sole possession of second place in the Mountain West and trails first-place Fresno State by just one game.

BULLPEN TURNING IT AROUND: Over the last 16 games, San Diego State relievers have combined for a 2.70 ERA, .216 opponent batting average, and have struck out 88 batters in 76.2 innings. Over the first 25 games of the season, the SDSU bullpen owned a 5.17 ERA and .265 opponent batting average.

PITCHING TRIO: Adrian Mardueno, Aaron Eden, and Justin Goossen-Brown are first, fourth, and sixth in the conference, respectively, in ERA this season. The trio has combined for 160.2 innings this season, making up 44.1 percent of the innings thrown by the entire pitching staff.

The trio has been exceptional over the month of April, with Mardueno leading the team with a 1.06 ERA while Goossen-Brown and Eden are behind Mardueno with ERA's of 1.99 and 3.02, respectively. SDSU owns a 9-5 record so far in April, but are 8-2 this month when one of those three pitchers makes an appearance.

Eden, who is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season on Tuesday, is currently 12th among freshmen in the country in ERA with a 2.72 mark.

**CALIFORNIA LOVE:** Since 2014, the Aztecs lead all Division I California programs in win total. Also, over that span, SDSU is 102-51 (.671) when playing teams based in California.

STRIKEOUTS GALORE: SDSU has recorded 22 games with 10 or more strikeouts, the most since recording 23 double-digit strikeout games in 2009. In 2009, Stephen Strasburg recorded 10 or more strikeouts in 13 of his 15 starts during his Golden

Spikes Award-winning season.

The Aztecs are 15-7 in their 22 games when striking out 10 or more batters.

**ALL-AROUND PITCHING:** The Aztecs are one of 24 teams in the country to have an ERA of 4.07 or better, while striking out at least 9.4 batters per game and allowing 8.3 hits or less per game. Of those 24 teams, just 10 come from non-power 5 conferences.

STRANGE BUT TRUE: The Aztecs are going through an uncharacteristic season in terms of fielding, owning a .961 fielding percentage in 2019 -- the program's lowest since a .959 mark in 2012. However, the Aztecs have found ways to win games despite defensive miscues, as the Aztecs are 7-1 this season when recording three or more errors.

#### **ADRIAN MARDUENO IS REALLY GOOD:**

Including Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week, Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week, and Mountain West Pitcher of the Week awards received on April 8-9, Marudeno has been the Mountain West's most dominant arm during the 2019 season, leading the conference in ERA (1.71) and opponent batting average (.153).

Mardueno, who led the Aztecs in inherited runners stranded percentage as both a freshman and sophomore, leads the Aztecs once again as a junior, having stranded 75 percent of his inherited base runners this season. Since April 2, Mardueno has stranded 12 of his last 13 inherited runners.

Mardueno's ERA also stands as 27th best in the country, while his 4.50 hits allowed per nine innings is seventh best in the country. Mardueno is one of just four qualified pitchers (Will Wheeler - USC Upstate, Spencer Koelewyn - Omaha, Garret Price - Liberty) in the country to have an ERA below 2.00 and allow 4.50 or fewers hits per nine innings.

**SEEING DOUBLE:** SDSU leads the nation with 47 double plays turned this season. Since the start of the 2017 season, SDSU's 173 double plays turned are the most among any team in the

nation.

**FIVE, IT'S A MAGIC NUMBER:** SDSU is 55-10 in their last 65 games when scoring five or more runs.

**REBOUNDING QUICKLY:** SDSU is 42-13 in their last 55 games following a loss.

**UNDER PRESSURE:** SDSU is 29-15 in their last 44 one-run games.

SCHEDULE UPDATES: On May 6, the Aztecs will play Brigham Young at Lake Elsinore Stadium, home of the Lake Elsinore Storm, single-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres. First pitch is scheduled for 6:00 p.m.

**EYEING 2,500:** With a 35-win season in 2019, the Aztecs would become the 27th team in the nation to reach the 2,500-win threshold and become just the fourth California program to do so, joining USC, Fresno State, and Stanford.

PRESEASON FAVORITES: Mountain West head coaches named SDSU the preseason favorite in the conference, collecting four first-place votes and 32 overall points. SDSU also placed Casey Schmitt, Logan Boyer, and Julian Escobedo on the all-MW preseason team, leaving SDSU in a tie with Nevada for most selections on the preseason all-conference team. SDSU is preseason favorites for the first time since 2014, when SDSU was co-preseason favorites with New Mexico.

In addition, both D1Baseball.com and Baseball America have also projected SDSU to win the Mountain West.

SDSU is one of just three west coast programs to have played in five regionals since 2013, joined by only Oregon State and Cal State Fullerton.

Mark Martinez heads into his fifth season as head coach and 14th at SDSU in 2019 after being named the late Tony Gwynn's successor on August 20, 2014.

During his fourth season as head coach in 2018, Martinez became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to win three conference championships. In 2017, Martinez logged his 100th win as head coach and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach the century mark.

Martinez led SDSU to a 39-21 performance in 2018, leaving the Aztecs as one of 13 teams in the nation to have won 39 or more games four times in the past five years. Since the start of the 2014 season — Martinez's final year as SDSU's head assistant coach under Gwynn — the Aztecs have recorded 185 wins, the most among all Division I California programs.

San Diego State will enter the 2019 season as the only team in Division I baseball with five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons. SDSU is one of 18 programs in the nation to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years and one of just two programs in California, joined by only Cal State Fullerton. Statistically, the Aztecs are one of just nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons and will enter 2019 having led the MW in earned run average in back-to-back seasons.

Martinez, who has been a part of 1,030 collegiate baseball wins since starting his coaching career in 1984, enters his fifth season as a head coach with a record of 143-103 (.581). Under his watch, SDSU has reached its highest academic progress rate, highest team grade point average, and highest total of scholar-athletes in its 82-year history. Last April, Martinez received the Center for Community Solutions Champions Award, recognizing his efforts in starting healthy relationships and consent education training with SDSU baseball student-athletes and coaches.

Fifteen Aztecs have been selected by the MLB First-Year Player draft and 10 Aztecs have been named Mountain West scholar athletes (3.5 GPA or better) since 2015. Martinez has also directed 21 student-athletes to all-MW honors over the last four seasons, including back-to-back MW Pitchers of the Year (Brett Seeburger — 2017, Garrett Hill — 2018) and 2017 MW Player of the Year Danny Sheehan.

Martinez entered the start of his head coaching career with 31 years

of coaching experience as an assistant coach, split between nine years on Gwynn's Aztec staff (2006—2014), 17 years at New Mexico (1989—2005), and five seasons at his alma mater Mesa State (1984—1988). With Gwynn, Martinez helped SDSU end an 18-year drought from the NCAA postseason with an appearance in 2009.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had seven of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry, Lance Zawadski, and Greg Allen).

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals.

The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons. Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well. During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season,

only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State. In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American. Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer. During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage. New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88. Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990. In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa, and a son, Cade

Both Aaron Eden and Casey Schmitt shined on the mound for the Aztecs, with Eden starting on the mound and earning his second win of the season after six innings with five hits and one earned run allowed. Schmitt, making his first relief appearance since March 10, kept the Lions quiet, earning his third save of the year with three innings pitched, three strikeouts, and one hit. The Aztecs were quick to score the game's first runs, as Matt Rudick posted a lead-off double in the bottom of the first and later scored on a one-out Angelo Armenta single to centerfield. Brian Leonhardt hit the first of his two doubles later in the frame, allowing Schmitt to score on a well-hit line drive to right field.

- With Aaron Eden and Casey Schmitt allowing just two walks combined, it marks as the third consecutive game where the Aztecs have surrendered two or fewer walks. It is the first time the Aztecs have had two or fewer walks allowed in three straight games since May 19-25, 2018.
- SDSU is 5-2 in their last seven games against LMU and have won four consecutive home games against the Lions.

The Aztecs scored nine runs before the end of the third inning to jump out to a 9-0 lead with three runs in the first and a six-spot in the third. Julian Escobedo opened up the scoring with a solo home run in the first, giving the junior outfielder his fourth home run of the season and his second of the series. Brian Leonhardt and Chad Bible both logged RBI singles before the completion of the three-run first inning.

Casey Schmitt and Angelo Armenta led off the third inning with a hit by pitch and single, respectively, before Leonhardt drove both in on his team-leading 14th double of the season. Jaden Fein drove in Leonhardt on an RBI single just before Mike Jarvis brought in a pair on a 2-RBI single to left field. Matt Rudick capped the six-run third inning with a single through the right side, scoring Jarvis.

- With the win, SDSU clinches its first road series win at Cal State Fullerton since 1965. The Aztecs had either lost or split seven consecutive series in Fullerton heading into this weekend's series.
- Over SDSU's current season-best five-game winning streak, the Aztecs are hitting .323 as a team while limiting their opponents to a .215 average. On the mound, SDSU pitchers collectively own a 2.60 ERA over the winning streak, while the Aztec lineup has tagged opposing pitchers for a 7.16 ERA.

After Cal State Fullerton took a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first, the Aztecs responded with Jaden Fein's two-run single in the top of the second scoring both Brian Leonhardt and Chad Bible for a

Unfortunately for SDSU, that was all the offense the Aztecs were able to muster, as Cal State Fullerton regained the lead with a three-run bottom of the third before taking advantage of an Aztec error in a three-run bottom of the eighth.

Despite the loss, the Aztec bullpen performed well, as Aaron Eden, Adrian Mardueno and Casey Schmitt combined for 5.1 innings without surrendering an earned run. Aztec starter Casev O'Sullivan fell to 3-3 on the year, allowing four earned runs on five hits and three walks

Eden shined in the middle stages of the game, posting 2.2 shutout innings with only three hits allowed and no walks.

The Aztecs were unable to overcome multiple one-run deficits despite standout performances out of the bullpen by Jacob Flores and Casey Schmitt. In Colorado Springs on March 2, SDSU set the tone early in the first with a double to right field by lead-off batter Matt Rudick. Angelo Armenta then hit an RBI single to center field for Rudick to score, putting the Aztecs in the lead 1-0. The Aztecs added another run in the second, with Deron Johnson doubling to bring home Casey Schmitt to

make it a 2-0 lead before snow halted the game from being continued.

1,129 miles away and 47 days later, Aaron Eden came into the game with one out and two runners on in the bottom of the second. Eden stranded both of those inherited runners forcing Tommy Gillman to fly out to right field and a 1-3 groundout against Cole Blatford

Aztecs got their Thursday-night scoring started n the top of the fifth, with Chad Bible and Devyn Lopez scoring on a double by Armenta to make it a 4-0 Aztec advantage. Air Force responded with their first run on an RBI single to shortstop by Nic Ready in the

- Casey Schmitt reached base in his 13th consecutive game, tying his previous longest streak of the season. On the mound, Schmitt recorded the 13th save of his career (T-7th in SDSU history) and recorded his fourth consecutive appearance without allowing an earned run.
- Adrian Mardueno had a streak of 18 consecutive innings without allowing an earned run snapped in the ninth inning.

Goossen-Brown finished the day with 8.2 innings pitched -- the longest outing by an Aztec this season -- with six hits, four earned runs, two walks, and eight strikeouts. Christian Winston came in of relief of Goossen-Brown, who finished his outing with 116 pitches, and struck out the only batter

While Goossen-Brown held the Falcons at bay, the Aztecs put together a two-run sixth inning with a Casey Schmitt RBI double, scoring Matt Rudick, and an infield single by Angelo Armenta to score Schmitt.

A go-ahead RBI double by Mike Jarvis and a 2-RBI triple by Matt Rudick highlighted a game-clinching three-run eighth inning in a 6-3 win for SDSU in the nightcap. Air Force, which tied the game at 3-3 in the top of the eighth with a Rob Dau RBI single, was held to just three hits - the lowest hit total posted by the Aztec pitching staff this season.

The duo of starter Michael Paredes and reliever Adrian Mardueno collectively allowed just three hits while striking out 13 over 8.2 innings pitched. Paredes threw 6.1 innings in his first career weekend start, allowing only one hit while surrendering two earned runs with four walks and eight strikeouts

Paredes allowed a Tommy Gillman solo home run in the top of the first, but settled in and did not allow a hit for his remaining six innings. After recording a frame-opening strikeout in the seventh, Paredes ran into some control issues, walking the next two batters he faced before SDSU made the move to the bullpen.

A bases-loaded walk allowed Air Force to cut the lead to 3-2 in the seventh, but Adrian Mardueno, who inherited a bases-loaded situation and a 2-0 count, fought back and stranded all three inherited runners to preserve the one-run Aztec lead.

Mardueno earned the win on the mound for SDSU, throwing 2.1 innings with two hits, one run, no walks, and five strikeouts. With his seventh-inning effort, Mardueno has stranded 12 of the last 13 runners he has inherited

Fein's home run proved to be an important insurance run, as the Falcons clipped the lead to 5-4 with a solo home run in the ninth.

- Matt Rudick extended his in-conference on-base streak to 29 games, which carries over 12 games from the 2018 season.
- Jacob Flores extended his streak of consecutive innings without allowing an earned run to 10.2 after four shutout innings on Saturday.
- SDSU is 8-2 this season and has won three in a row when playing on Saturdays this season.




