AZTEC STORYLINES

BACK HOME: San Diego State returns to Tony Gwynn Stadium after a five-game spring break road trip at Oregon State and Nevada last week to host Loyola Marymount at 6:00 p.m.

The game will air live on XTRA 1360, with Judson Richards on Jon Schaeffer on the call.

LAST TIME OUT AGAINST LMU: The Aztecs fell to Loyola Marymount in Los Angeles, 5-1, on March 19. The loss for SDSU snapped their season-best four-game winning streak. Jaden Fein hit his first career home run in the loss.

The Aztecs lead the all-time series, 67-42 and have won four of the last six meetings. SDSU has won three consecutive home games against the Lions, with the last home loss coming on March 8, 2008 (7-2).

RECAPING THE NEVADA SERIES: San Diego State rebounded from a series-opening 8-7 walk-off loss on Friday to win the series with a 6-2 win on Saturday and a 11-3 win on Sunday. The Aztecs have won two of their last three series

in Reno after having lost each of their first four series in the all-time series.

Julian Escobedo led the offense in the series, hitting a team-best .462 (6-for-13) while Brian Leonhardt drove in a team-high six runs and hit .455 (5-for-11).

The SDSU bullpen allowed four earned runs in 12.2 innings pitched for a 2.84 ERA for the series.

SDSU hit .333 with runners in scoring position for the series while the Aztec pitching staff held the Wolf Pack to just a .207 average in the same situation.

A BREAK FROM MW PLAY: The Aztecs begin a stretch of five consecutive non-conference games on Tuesday and are 11-8 in non-conference play. Five of SDSU's non-conference games have been against nationally ranked opponents.

Matt Rudick and Casey Schmitt lead the team with non-conference batting averages of .346 an

.344, respectively. Brian Leonhardt is averaging nearly an RBI per non-conference game with a team-best 18 runs batted in. Rudick has recorded a hit in each of his last 11 non-conference games.

ADRIAN MARDUENO - COLLEGIATE BASEBALL NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK & MOUNTAIN WEST PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Adrian Mardueno was named Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week and Mountain West Pitcher of the Week on Monday. Mardueno threw 11 shutout innings last week, split between appearances against defending national champion and No. 6/7-ranked Oregon State and Nevada.

The Upland, Calif. product allowed just three hits over his 11 innings last week, holding opposing hitters to a .091 batting average. Of the 36 batters Mardueno faced, only one reached third base.

Both of Mardueno's relief outings last week started in bases-loaded, no-out situations. The junior was able to strand five of a possible six inherited runners for the week and he earned the win in both SDSU's 4-3 win over Oregon State on Tuesday and SDSU's 11-3 win against Nevada on Sunday.

Mardueno turned in one of SDSU's most dominant outings of the season against the Beavers, throwing seven shutout innings while allowing just two hits against the defending national champions. Mardueno logged a streak of 4.2 consecutive innings without allowing a hit against the Beavers until allowing a two-out double in the ninth inning. The seven innings pitched marked a new career-high for the junior, who leads all active Aztecs with 70 career appearances.

Mardueno followed his performance against the Beavers with a dominating four-inning relief appearance against the Wolf Pack, allowing just one hit while striking out six. Mardueno finished his outing facing the minimum over his final nine batters faced on Sunday.

Mardueno, currently on a streak of 14.1 innings without allowing an earned run, leads the Mountain West in both earned run average (1.50), hits allowed per nine innings (4.00), and opponent batting average (.139). Mardueno is also 25th in the nation with his 1.50 ERA.

Mardueno is the first Aztec to win Mountain West Pitcher of the Year this season and he's the first Aztec since Jordan Verdon to win Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week. Verdon won the honor twice during the 2018 season.

21-GAME STREAK FOR RUDICK: Matt Rudick had a 21-game hitting streak snapped last Friday, marking the third longest hitting streak by an Aztec in the

Mountain West era. Rudick's on-base streak is still intact and sitting at 26 games, the longest since Julian Escobedo had a 27-game streak snapped earlier this season.

Over Rudick's 21-game hitting streak, the sophomore hitting a team-best .376 (35-for-93), with team-highs in extra-base hits (seven), RBIs (17) and doubles (five).

ROAD TRIPPING: After playing each of their first eight, 16 of their first 18, and 21 of their first 27 at home, San Diego State is in the middle of a stretch where they will play nine of 10 on the road and only have six home games the entire month of March.

Due to SDSU's postponed games at Air Force in the beginning of March, the Aztecs and Falcons will play a five-game series on the weekend of April 18-20. Dates and times are still to be determined.

WHERE WE RANK IN THE MW: The Aztecs are the only team in the Mountain West to be hitting .275 or better while having an ERA under 5.00.

The Aztecs rank second in the Mountain West with a 4.22 ERA and third with a .278 batting average.

SEEING DOUBLE: SDSU leads the nation with 38 double plays turned this season. Since the start of the 2017 season, SDSU's 164 double plays turned are the most among any team in the nation.

FIVE, IT'S A MAGIC NUMBER: SDSU is 51-9 in their last 60 games when scoring five or more runs.

REBOUNDING QUICKLY: SDSU is 40-12 in their last 50 games following a loss.

UNDER PRESSURE: SDSU is 27-14 in their last 41 one-run games.

MAKING THE MOST OF IT: Due to injuries on the pitching staff, SDSU has had to use 11 different starters during the 2019 season. SDSU's 11 different starters are tied for the most used in a season since 12 were used in the 2012 season. The Aztecs also had 10 different starting pitchers used in the 2017 and 2013 seasons.

All three of SDSU's opening weekend starters have not pitched in each of the last three weekend series

and have not made an appearance since opening-day starter Logan Boyer threw 0.2 of an inning at CSUN on March 12.

Despite the wide variety of starters, the starting pitchers have combined for a 3.88 ERA this season.

STRIKEOUTS GALORE: SDSU has exceeded its 2018 total of 13 double-digit strikeout games, needing just 23 games this season to record 14 10+ strikeout games. The Aztecs are currently 29th in the country averaging 9.7 strikeouts per nine innings.

Despite having 24 games left on the regular season schedule, SDSU's 19 double-digit strikeout games is the most since the 2015 team recorded 20 10+ strikeout performances.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Since 2014, the Aztecs lead all Division I California programs in win total. Also, over that span, SDSU is 99-49 (.669) when playing in-state counterparts.

EYEING 2,500: With a 35-win season in 2019, the Aztecs would become the 27th team in the nation to reach the 2,500-win threshold and become just the fourth California program to do so, joining USC, Fresno State, and Stanford.

PRESEASON FAVORITES: Mountain West head coaches named SDSU the preseason favorite in the conference, collecting four first-place votes and 32 overall points. SDSU also placed Casey Schmitt, Logan Boyer, and Julian Escobedo on the all-MW preseason team, leaving SDSU in a tie with Nevada for most selections on the preseason all-conference team. SDSU is preseason favorites for the first time since 2014, when SDSU was co-preseason favorites with New Mexico.

In addition, both D1Baseball.com and Baseball America have also projected SDSU to win the Mountain West.

SUCCESS AT TONY GWYNN STADIUM: The Aztecs set a Tony Gwynn Stadium record (since 1997) with 25 home wins last season, besting the previous mark of 24 set in 1997, 2002, and 2014. Since the start of the 2012 season, the Aztecs are 141-93 (.603) when playing at home.

IN THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION: The Aztecs are one of 18 teams in the country to have reached a regional five times in the last six seasons, one of 13 teams in the country to have won 39 or more games five times in the last six years, and one of nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons. SDSU is one of just three west coast programs to have played in five regionals since 2013, joined by only Oregon State and Cal State Fullerton.

Mark Martinez heads into his fifth season as head coach and 14th at SDSU in 2019 after being named the late Tony Gwynn's successor on August 20, 2014.

During his fourth season as head coach in 2018, Martinez became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to win three conference championships. In 2017, Martinez logged his 100th win as head coach and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach the century mark.

Martinez led SDSU to a 39-21 performance in 2018, leaving the Aztecs as one of 13 teams in the nation to have won 39 or more games four times in the past five years. Since the start of the 2014 season — Martinez's final year as SDSU's head assistant coach under Gwynn — the Aztecs have recorded 185 wins, the most among all Division I California programs.

San Diego State will enter the 2019 season as the only team in Division I baseball with five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons. SDSU is one of 18 programs in the nation to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years and one of just two programs in California, joined by only Cal State Fullerton. Statistically, the Aztecs are one of just nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons and will enter 2019 having led the MW in earned run average in back-to-back seasons.

Martinez, who has been a part of 1,030 collegiate baseball wins since starting his coaching career in 1984, enters his fifth season as a head coach with a record of 143-103 (.581). Under his watch, SDSU has reached its highest academic progress rate, highest team grade point average, and highest total of scholar-athletes in its 82-year history. Last April, Martinez received the Center for Community Solutions Champions Award, recognizing his efforts in starting healthy relationships and consent education training with SDSU baseball student-athletes and coaches.

Fifteen Aztecs have been selected by the MLB First-Year Player draft and 10 Aztecs have been named Mountain West scholar athletes (3.5 GPA or better) since 2015. Martinez has also directed 21 student-athletes to all-MW honors over the last four seasons, including back-to-back MW Pitchers of the Year (Brett Seeburger — 2017, Garrett Hill — 2018) and 2017 MW Player of the Year Danny Sheehan.

Martinez entered the start of his head coaching career with 31 years

of coaching experience as an assistant coach, split between nine years on Gwynn's Aztec staff (2006–2014), 17 years at New Mexico (1989–2005), and five seasons at his alma mater Mesa State (1984–1988). With Gwynn, Martinez helped SDSU end an 18-year drought from the NCAA postseason with an appearance in 2009.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had seven of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry, Lance Zawadzki, and Greg Allen).

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans. In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals.

The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons. Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well. During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season,

only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State. In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American. Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer. During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage. New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88. Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990. In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa, and a son, Cade

San Diego State snapped a three-game losing streak, as Jaden Fein led the Aztecs offensively, going 3-for-4 with a solo home run, three runs scored and a double, falling just a triple shy of the cycle. Casey Schmitt and Angelo Armenta also contributed multi-hit performances, with both going 2-for-4 with a pair of runs scored.

On the mound, Casey Schmitt earned his second win of the season, throwing five innings with four hits, one earned run, one walk allowed while striking out four.

- The all-time series between the Aztecs and Bulldogs is now tied at 101-101.
- SDSU has scored seven or more runs in each of the last four games that followed being shutout.

Mardueno was nearly perfect for the duration of his outing, allowing just two hits and one walk over his seven innings of relief. Mardueno, who retired 21 of the 24 Beaver batters he faced, recorded six strikeouts. Mardueno's seven innings pitched set a new career-high, while his six strikeouts is just one shy of his career-high of seven which he set on March 15 against Seattle.

Mardueno's biggest spot came upon entering the game, as Upland, Calif. product entered the third inning with a bases-loaded, no-out situation. Mardueno struck out George Mendazona, the first batter he faced, before forcing Troy Claunch into an inning-ending 6-4-3 double play to end the threat and keep it a 3-2 Aztec deficit.

- SDSU improves to 7-1 in its last 12 games and has won four straight against the Pac-12. Over that span, SDSU has won five one-run games.
- SDSU's win against No. 6/7 Oregon State is tied for the program's highest-ranked win since defeating No. 5 San Diego 15-2 on Feb. 23, 2008. The Beavers were also ranked No. 7 when SDSU beat Oregon State 6-5 in Corvallis on March 28, 2016.
- Since 2015, SDSU improves to 6-7 against teams that played in the College World Series the year prior.
- SDSU is 2-2 this season against nationally ranked teams.

The walk-off run came after a two-run top of the ninth for the Aztecs to tie the game, as a Deron Johnson pinch-hit single kick-started the late-inning rally. Johnson eventually came around to score after an error by Nevada left fielder Daniel Perry and Matt Rudick later scored the game-tying run to knot the game at 7-7.

Michael Paredes struck out a career-high nine in an impressive relief performance, allowing just four hits and two earned runs over the course of 5.2 innings pitched. After Paredes gave up two hits against the first three batters he faced in the bottom of the fourth, the freshman right-hander did not allow a hit until Joshua Zamora's lead-off double in the top of the ninth.

- Matt Rudick had a 21-game hitting streak come to a close, marking the third-longest hitting streak by an Aztec during the Mountain West era (since 2000).
