AZTEC STORYLINES

FOUR IN FOUR: San Diego State plays four games in the next four days, hosting San Jose State for a three-game series beginning Friday night at 6:00 p.m. before facing Brigham Young at 6:00 p.m. on Monday night at Lake Elsinore Stadium.

Links to follow with live stats are available on GoAztecs.com, and in addition, Saturday's game will be broadcast on the Mountain West Network and Sunday's game will air on XTRA 1360.

SECOND PLACE ON THE LINE: The winner of the San Diego State-San Jose State series will claim sole possession of second place in the Mountain West standings. San Jose State (12-9), currently second place with a half-game lead over SDSU (11-9), is behind first-place Fresno State (12-7-1)

SERIES HISTORY WITH SJSU: The Aztecs are 12-2 in their last 14 games against the Spartans and lead the all-time series, 76-32.

SERIES HISTORY WITH BYU: The Aztecs and Cougars meet for the first time since 2015 and SDSU leads the all-time series, 74-60-1. SDSU and BYU are even at 3-3 over the last six meetings.

HEADING UP I-15: SDSU will play at Lake Elsinore Stadium, home of the Lake Elsinore Storm, single-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, for the fifth consecutive season this Monday against BYU. SDSU is 3-3 in Lake Elsinore the last five years including wins in each of its last two games. Last season, the Aztecs defeated Long Beach State, 5-1, relying on a strong start by Harrison Pyatt who took a no-hit bid into the eighth inning.

AZTEC STORYLINES

RECAPPING APRIL: The Aztecs recorded an 11-7 record over the month of April and saw a standout performance from the pitching staff. SDSU pitching posted a 3.56 ERA for the month and limited opposing hitters to a .248 batting average over their 18 games in April.

BULLPEN TURNING IT AROUND: Over the last 20 games, San Diego State relievers have combined for a 2.45 ERA, .224 opponent batting average, and have struck out 99 batters in 92 innings. Over the first 25 games of the season, the SDSU bullpen owned a 5.17 ERA and .265 opponent batting average.

BACK HOME: After playing just five home games the entire month of April, SDSU has six home games, three road games, and one neutral site game over its final 10 contests of the season.

PLAYING WELL DESPITE THE INJURY BUG: The Aztecs, who started the season with Logan Boyer, Harrison Pyatt, and Brad Wegman as their three weekend starters have needed to use 11 different starters in the 2019 season -- their most used since the 2012 Aztecs used 12.

Starters this season own a 3.96 ERA and .258 opponent batting average.

STRIKEOUTS GALORE: SDSU has recorded 22 games with 10 or more strikeouts, the most since recording 23 double-digit strikeout games in 2009. In 2009, Stephen Strasburg recorded 10 or more strikeouts in 13 of his 15 starts during his Golden Spikes Award-winning season.

The Aztecs are 15-7 in their 22 games when striking out 10 or more batters.

SDSU has recorded 404 strikeouts, averaging 9.1 strikeouts per nine innings (51st best in the nation) this season. Should the Aztecs continue that pace for the remainder of the regular season, SDSU would enter possible postseason play with 495 strikeouts over 55 games.

SDSU has not posted a 500+ strikeout season since 2015, where SDSU logged 510 punchouts over 64 games. The Aztecs have had five previous seasons with 500 or more strikeouts in its 83-year history,

including a program record of 581 in 1997.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Since 2014, the Aztecs lead all Division I California programs in win total. Also, over that span, SDSU is 103-51 (.671) when playing teams based in California.

SEEING DOUBLE: SDSU leads the nation with 54 double plays turned this season. Since the start of the 2017 season, SDSU's 180 double plays turned are the most among any team in the nation.

FROM TONY GWYNN STADIUM TO PETCO PARK: Former Aztec infielder Ty France (2013-15) was called up to the San Diego Padres from Triple-A El Paso on Wednesday morning, making him the third active SDSU alum currently on an MLB roster, joining Washington's Stephen Strasburg and Cleveland's Greg Allen. France was a three-time Mountain West Champion and a two-time All-Mountain West First Team selection during his three-year career on the Mesa, where he had a career .337 batting average with 14 home runs and 130 RBIs.

France is the 13th player in Aztec history to go on to play for the Padres.

STRANGE BUT TRUE: The Aztecs are going through an uncharacteristic season in terms of fielding, owning a .962 fielding percentage in 2019 -- the program's lowest since a .959 mark in 2012. However, the Aztecs have found ways to win games despite defensive miscues, as the Aztecs are 7-1 this season when recording three or more errors.

ADRIAN MARDUENO IS REALLY GOOD: Including Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week, Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week, and Mountain West Pitcher of the Week awards received on April 8-9, Marudeno has been the Mountain West's most dominant arm during the 2019 season, leading the conference in ERA (1.53) and opponent batting average (.172).

Mardueno, who led the Aztecs in inherited runners stranded percentage as both a freshman and sophomore, leads the Aztecs once again as a junior, having stranded 75 percent of his inherited base runners this season. Since April 2, Mardueno has stranded 12 of his last 13 inherited runners.

Mardueno's ERA also stands as 13th best in the country, while his 5.08 hits allowed per nine innings is 14th best in the country. Mardueno is one of just five pitchers in the country to be in the top 15 of both ERA and hits allowed per nine innings, joined by Georgia's Emerson Hancock, UCLA's Ryan Garcia, Navy's Noah Song, and Florida Gulf Coast's Mason Studstill.

Mardueno, who logged a 4-0 record and 0.82 ERA over 22 innings pitched in the month of April, was named a San Diego Sports Association Star of the Month for his efforts.

FIVE, IT'S A MAGIC NUMBER: SDSU is 56-10 in their last 65 games when scoring five or more runs.

REBOUNDED QUICKLY: SDSU is 42-13 in their last 55 games following a loss.

UNDER PRESSURE: SDSU is 29-15 in their last 44 one-run games.

EYEING 2,500: With a 35-win season in 2019, the Aztecs would become the 27th team in the na-

tion to reach the 2,500-win threshold and become just the fourth California program to do so, joining USC, Fresno State, and Stanford.

PRESEASON FAVORITES: Mountain West head coaches named SDSU the preseason favorite in the conference, collecting four first-place votes and 32 overall points. SDSU also placed Casey Schmitt, Logan Boyer, and Julian Escobedo on the all-MW preseason team, leaving SDSU in a tie with Nevada for most selections on the preseason all-conference team. SDSU is preseason favorites for the first time since 2014, when SDSU was co-preseason favorites with New Mexico.

In addition, both D1Baseball.com and Baseball America have also projected SDSU to win the Mountain West.

IN THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION: The Aztecs are one of 18 teams in the country to have reached a regional five times in the last six seasons, one of 13 teams in the country to have won 39 or more games five times in the last six years, and one of nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons. SDSU is one of just three west coast programs to have played in five regionals since 2013, joined by only Oregon State and Cal State Fullerton.

In his first SDSU start, struck out 10 while not surrendering a walk in 6.1 innings pitched against Michigan, becoming the first Aztec pitcher since Bubba Derby in 2015 to record 10 strikeouts with zero walks... Recorded SDSU's only complete game of the season against San Jose State on May 12, allowing just one run on six hits against the Spartans... Allowed more than one earned run in just four of his 19 appearances... Owned a 4-0 record and 2.30 ERA at home while holding opponents to a .205 batting average at Tony Gwynn Stadium... Owned a 2.51 ERA in his nine relief appearances.

Mark Martinez heads into his fifth season as head coach and 14th at SDSU in 2019 after being named the late Tony Gwynn's successor on August 20, 2014.

During his fourth season as head coach in 2018, Martinez became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to win three conference championships. In 2017, Martinez logged his 100th win as head coach and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach the century mark.

Martinez led SDSU to a 39-21 performance in 2018, leaving the Aztecs as one of 13 teams in the nation to have won 39 or more games four times in the past five years. Since the start of the 2014 season — Martinez's final year as SDSU's head assistant coach under Gwynn — the Aztecs have recorded 185 wins, the most among all Division I California programs.

San Diego State will enter the 2019 season as the only team in Division I baseball with five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons. SDSU is one of 18 programs in the nation to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years and one of just two programs in California, joined by only Cal State Fullerton. Statistically, the Aztecs are one of just nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons and will enter 2019 having led the MW in earned run average in back-to-back seasons.

Martinez, who has been a part of 1,030 collegiate baseball wins since starting his coaching career in 1984, enters his fifth season as a head coach with a record of 143-103 (.581). Under his watch, SDSU has reached its highest academic progress rate, highest team grade point average, and highest total of scholar-athletes in its 82-year history. Last April, Martinez received the Center for Community Solutions Champions Award, recognizing his efforts in starting healthy relationships and consent education training with SDSU baseball student-athletes and coaches.

Fifteen Aztecs have been selected by the MLB First-Year Player draft and 10 Aztecs have been named Mountain West scholar athletes (3.5 GPA or better) since 2015. Martinez has also directed 21 student-athletes to all-MW honors over the last four seasons, including back-to-back MW Pitchers of the Year (Brett Seeburger — 2017, Garrett Hill — 2018) and 2017 MW Player of the Year Danny Sheehan.

Martinez entered the start of his head coaching career with 31 years

of coaching experience as an assistant coach, split between nine years on Gwynn's Aztec staff (2006–2014), 17 years at New Mexico (1989–2005), and five seasons at his alma mater Mesa State (1984–1988). With Gwynn, Martinez helped SDSU end an 18-year drought from the NCAA postseason with an appearance in 2009.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had seven of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry, Lance Zawadzki, and Greg Allen).

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans. In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals.

The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons. Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well. During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season,

only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State. In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American. Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer. During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage. New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88. Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990. In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa, and a son, Cade

- The Aztecs are now 8-1 all-time at Fowler Park and 15-3 in their last 18 when playing against San Diego as the road team. SDSU has outscored USD 51-22 over the nine games at Fowler Park.

- SDSU improves to 11-6 in their last 17 games against the Toreros

- The Aztecs turned three double plays on the night, bringing their nation-leading season total to 50. It is the fifth time this season the Aztecs have recorded a season-high three double plays.

- SDSU improves to 13-4 and have won six in a row in games when hitting at least one home run.

- Adrian Mardueno earned his 13th career win (13-3 career record).

- Casey Schmitt recorded his 15th career save, good for sole possession of sixth in Aztec history.

The San Diego State baseball team used five home runs in an 11-4 win at UNLV at Earl E. Stadium. The five home runs hit by the Aztecs accounted for 10 of SDSU's 11 runs, as Mike Jarvis and Casey Schmitt both hit a pair while Julian Escobedo hit his fifth long ball of the season in the top of the first.

SDSU got a six-run sixth inning started with Schmitt's first home run -- a first-pitch solo shot to left -- before Jaden Fein singled home Chad Bible to make it a 4-1 advantage.

On the very next pitch Jarvis saw, the junior infielder launched his second home run and fourth of the season, pushing SDSU's lead to 9-2 in the eighth inning. Three batters later, Schmitt hit his second home run of the season -- a two-run home run to give SDSU its 10th and 11th runs of the game. Schmitt finished his day with a career-high five hits, going 5-for-5 with three RBIs. Schmitt's five hits are also the most by an Aztec this season.

The Aztecs went 8-for-16 with runners on base and 3-for-6 with runners in scoring position while holding the Rebels to a 6-for-24 success rate with runners on and a 2-for-10 mark with runners in scoring position.

Aaron Eden and Adrian Mardueno combined to allow just one earned run, but two errors allowed four unearned runs to score. After Eden surrendered a leadoff home run to Bryson Stott in the top of the first, the freshman settled in nicely, finishing his outing with five strikeouts in 5.1 innings while scattering seven hits.

Mardueno allowed two hits over his 2.2 innings and did not allow an earned run while striking out three. Mardueno and Eden held the Rebels hitless over 13 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

SDSU tied the game at 1-1 in the top of the third, using an Angelo Armenta sacrifice fly to left field to score Mike Jarvis. The errors committed by the Aztecs in the fifth and seventh innings allowed two runs to score on each play and brought the score to its final 5-1.

- SDSU's one run scored today is tied for its lowest total in Las Vegas since being shutout by the Rebels on March 28, 2003 (SDSU has been held to one run in Las Vegas just three times over its last 37 games).
