AZTEC STORYLINES

CHAMPIONSHIP TIME: San Diego State plays tournament host and No. 4 seed Nevada on Friday at 2:00 p.m. in an elimination game. The Aztecs are in search of their seventh Mountain West Championship and 29th conference championship overall.

All Mountain West Championship games will air on the Mountain West Network. In addition, XTRA 1360 will broadcast all Aztec games in Reno, and links to watch, listen, and follow along with live stats are available on GoAztecs.com.

BACKS AGAINST THE WALL: After yesterday's loss against UNLV, San Diego State will play in its 19th elimination game in the Mountain West Championships since 2012. The Aztecs are an unprecedented 16-2 in their previous 18 games facing elimination.

REBOUNDING QUICKLY: The Aztecs are a perfect 7-0 in their last seven games following a loss in the Mountain West Championships. SDSU, the only program to appear in all 20 Mountain West Championships, have won at least one

game in every tournament except for 2010 where the No. 3-seeded Aztecs went 0-2.

NO. 2 SEED? NO PROBLEM: For the sixth time since joining the Mountain West, the Aztecs finished the regular season second in the conference. As the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament, the Aztecs are 18-5 overall and 11-3 in their last 14.

The No. 2 seed has won each of the last four Mountain West Championships, including the Aztecs in 2015, 2017, and 2018, and New Mexico in 2016.

BACK WHERE WE ARE COMFORTABLE: The Aztecs have won five of the last six Mountain West Championships and *are the only program in the country to have won five conference tournament titles in the last six years.*

San Diego State's six postseason Mountain West Championships are the most in league history, while the Aztecs are the only team in the Mountain West to have appeared in all 20 MW

NO ONE BETTER: The Aztecs are 23-7 in the Mountain West Championships since 2013. In addition, SDSU's 50 wins in the Mountain West Championships are the most in league history.

As head coach, Mark Martinez is 18-6 in the Mountain West Championships and last season, Martinez became the fastest coach in MW baseball history to win three postseason championships last season.

SERIES HISTORY WITH THE WOLF PACK: San Diego State has won nine of its last 15 games against the Wolf Pack, including a 4-2 mark in 2019. Over SDSU's six games against the Wolf Pack this season, the Aztec pitching staff has recorded a 3.29 ERA while the Nevada arms have been tagged at a 5.09 clip.

With both of SDSU's losses to Nevada in 2019 being by a one-run margin, the Aztecs have outscored the Wolf Pack 40-25 over their six 2019 meetings.

Nevada leads the all-time series, 29-22, while the series in the Mountain West Championships is tied up at 2-2. Nevada beat SDSU twice (13-5, 5-3) during the 2016 Mountain West Championships to eliminate the Aztecs from the tournament.

30-WIN MARK: SDSU secured its sixth 30+ win season in the last seven years in a 10-5 win over Brigham Young on May 6. The Aztecs are the only team in the Mountain West to have won 30 or more games six times in the last seven years.

SDSU's run of six 30+ wins over the last seven years marks the first time since 1992-98 that the Aztecs have recorded six 30+ win seasons over a seven-year span.

MIKE JARVIS HEATING UP: Mike Jarvis has recorded five multi-hit games over his last six and currently rides a season-best-game hitting streak where the junior transfer is 13-for-26 (.500).

With a .226 batting average after April 12, Jarvis has raised his batting average by .069 (currently .295) over the last five weeks, hitting a team-best .394

over the team's last 21 games. Jarvis is also third on the team over the team's last 20 games with 15 RBIs, trailing only Casey Schmitt and Angelo Armenta who are tied for the team-lead at 17.

TALE OF TWO SEASONS: Over the last 31 games, San Diego State relievers have combined for a 2.66 ERA, .239 opponent batting average, and have struck out 149 batters in 142.1 innings.

Over the first 25 games of the season, the SDSU bullpen owned a 5.17 ERA and .265 opponent batting average.

SCHMITT CLIMBING SDSU'S ALL-TIME SAVES LEADER CHART: With eight saves this season, Casey Schmitt is in a tie for fifth in program history with Mark Williamson with 17 career saves. In his second season as the Aztecs closer, Schmitt owns a career 2.40 ERA over 40 career appearances.

THE INJURY BUG: Arguably no other weekend starting rotation in the nation has suffered more tough luck than the Aztecs, as the team started the season with Logan Boyer, Harrison Pyatt, and Brad Wegman as their three weekend starters have needed to use 12 different starters in the 2019 season due to injuries suffered by all three. SDSU's 12 different starting pitchers used are tied for their most used since using 13 in 2010. The team also used 12 starting pitchers in 2011 and 2012.

Boyer, Pyatt, and Wegman have combined to miss 29 weekend starts due to their respective injuries this season. The 29 missed starts mark as the most missed starts by an opening weekend rotation across the country.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Since 2014, the Aztecs are tied with Stanford in win total among Division I California programs. Also, over that span, SDSU is 107-53 (.669) when playing teams based in California.

SEEING DOUBLE: SDSU leads the nation with 70 double plays turned this season and set a new Mountain West era Aztec record with their 68th double play of the season against UNLV on Thursday. Since the start of the 2017 season, SDSU's 196 double plays turned are the most among any team in the nation.

FROM THE TOP: Sophomore outfielder Matt Rudick has been SDSU's lead off hitter for all 55 games this season and leads the team with a .319 batting average.

Last Saturday against New Mexico, Rudick had a 12-game hitting streak and a 16-game on-base streak snapped. Rudick also had a 24-game on-base streak in home games snapped and a 39-game on-base streak in Mountain West games snapped.

Rudick's 24-game on-base streak in home games is SDSU's longest since Chase Calabuig finished his college career in 2018 with a Tony Gwynn Stadium record 54-game on-base streak in home games. The Scripps Ranch HS product's 39-game Mountain West on-base streak is the second longest by an Aztec in league history, trailing only Quintin Berry's 48-game streak (2005-06).

Rudick recorded a 21-game hitting streak from March 1 - April 3, hitting .376 over that span with a team-high seven extra-base hits and 17 RBIs. The streak stands as the 10th longest hitting streak in the country this season and the third-longest by an Aztec in the Mountain West era and tied for the longest by an Aztec since 2010.

Rudick has recorded a hit in 49 of 56 games this season and has reached base in 52 of 56 games in 2019. Interestingly enough, the Aztecs are just 1-6 in games where Rudick does not record a hit.

Finally, Rudick is the only hitter with more walks than strikeouts (28 BB, 20 K) and has struck out just once per 11.9 at bats -- good for the lowest rate in the Mountain West and 33rd lowest in the country. Rudick's one strikeout per 11.9 at bats is the lowest since Mitch Blackburn struck out once per 12.3 at bats in 2010.

STRANGE BUT TRUE: The Aztecs are going through an uncharacteristic season in terms of fielding, owning a .964 fielding percentage in 2019 -- the program's lowest since a .959 mark in 2012. However, the Aztecs have found ways to win games despite defensive miscues, as the Aztecs are 8-1 this season when recording three or more errors.

ADRIAN MARDUENO IS REALLY GOOD:

Including Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week, Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week, and Mountain West Pitcher of the Week awards received on April 8-9, Marudeno has been the Mountain West's most dominant arm during the 2019 season, leading the conference in ERA (1.48) and opponent batting average (.180).

Marudeno, who led the Aztecs in inherited runners stranded percentage as both a freshman and sophomore, leads the Aztecs once again as a junior, having stranded 78.2 percent (25 of 32) of his inherited base runners this season. Since April 2, Marudeno has stranded 16 of his last 17 inherited runners and each of his last 11.

Marudeno's ERA also stands as seventh best in the country, while his 5.46 hits allowed per nine innings is 16th best in the country. Marudeno is one of just five pitchers in the country to be in the top 12 of both ERA and hits allowed per nine innings, joined by Georgia's Emerson Hancock, UCLA's Ryan Garcia, Navy's Noah Song, and Missouri's TJ Sikkema. Of those five, Marudeno is the only one who has not allowed a home run this season.

Marudeno, who logged a 4-0 record and 0.82 ERA over 22 innings pitched in the month of April, was named a San Diego Sports Association Star of the Month for his efforts.

STRIKEOUTS GALORE: SDSU has recorded 26 games with 10 or more strikeouts this season, marking the most double-digit strikeout performances for the Aztecs in the Mountain West era (since 2000). SDSU passed the previous MW-era record of 23 set in 2009 in a 10-6 win on May 11 at Fresno State.

The Aztecs are 16-10 in their 26 games when striking out 10 or more batters.

SDSU has recorded 487 strikeouts, averaging 8.8 strikeouts per nine innings this season. With 489 strikeouts this season, the Aztecs are within striking distance of their first 500+ strikeout season since 2015

(510 strikeouts in 64 games). The Aztecs have had five previous seasons with 500 or more strikeouts in its 83-year history, including a program record of 581 in 1997.

SOME KEYS TO SUCCESS: Scoring the game's first run has proven to be important for the Aztecs in 2019, as the team is 19-6 when scoring first in comparison to a 13-18 mark when their opponent scores first.

FIVE, IT'S A MAGIC NUMBER: SDSU is 62-10 in their last 72 games when scoring five or more runs.

REBOUNDING QUICKLY: SDSU is 45-15 in their last 60 games following a loss.

UNDER PRESSURE: SDSU is 29-15 in their last 44 one-run games.

EYEING 2,500: With a 35-win season in 2019, the Aztecs would become the 27th team in Division I baseball to reach the 2,500-win threshold and become just the fourth California program to do so, joining USC, Fresno State, and Stanford.

IN THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION: The Aztecs are one of 18 teams in the country to have reached a regional five times in the last six seasons, one of 13 teams in the country to have won 39 or more games five times in the last six years, and one of nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons. SDSU is one of just three west coast programs to have played in five regionals since 2013, joined by only Oregon State and Cal State Fullerton.

JUNIOR RHP 5'10" 175 UPLAND, CALIFORNIA UPLAND, CALIF.

2019: Has steadily been one of the most dominant pitchers in the country throughout the season, being the only pitcher in Division I to have a sub-1.50 earned run average, allow 5.5 hits per nine innings or fewer, and have zero home runs allowed ... Currently leads the Mountain West in both ERA (1.48) and opponent batting average (.180)... Has a chance to become the first player in the Mountain West to lead the conference in both ERA and opponent batting average since UNLV's Erick Fedde did so in 2014... Would be the first Aztec to lead the conference in both ERA and opponent batting average since Stephen Strasburg in 2009... Named Collegiate Baseball National Player of the Week, Rawlings/Perfect Game National Pitcher of the Week, and Mountain West Pitcher of the Week on April 8-9 after throwing 11 shutout innings of relief with three hits allowed, 12 strikeouts, and a .091 opponent batting average against defending national champion Oregon State and Nevada on April 2 & April 7... Threw seven innings against No. 6/7 Beavers to help lead SDSU to its highest ranked victory since defeating #6 Oregon State on March 28, 2016... Leads SDSU in inherited runners stranded percentage for the third consecutive season, having left 25 of his 32 inherited runners on base this season, including 16 of his last 17 and each of his last 11.

SUMMER 2018: Named an All-Alaska Baseball League First Team honoree after a dominating summer with the Anchorage Bucs, posting a perfect 0.00 ERA over 15 appearances and 19.2 innings pitched... Logged seven saves and allowed just two unearned runs to score... Recorded 26 strikeouts against just five walks... Posted a .119 opponent batting average for the summer and allowed only one extra base hit... Pitched two innings of a combined 11-inning no-hitter against Chugiak, with Aztec teammate Casey O'Sullivan pitching the first nine innings of the no hitter.

Mark Martinez heads into his fifth season as head coach and 14th at SDSU in 2019 after being named the late Tony Gwynn's successor on August 20, 2014.

During his fourth season as head coach in 2018, Martinez became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to win three conference championships. In 2017, Martinez logged his 100th win as head coach and became the fastest head coach in program history to reach the century mark.

Martinez led SDSU to a 39-21 performance in 2018, leaving the Aztecs as one of 13 teams in the nation to have won 39 or more games four times in the past five years. Since the start of the 2014 season — Martinez's final year as SDSU's head assistant coach under Gwynn — the Aztecs have recorded 185 wins, the most among all Division I California programs.

San Diego State will enter the 2019 season as the only team in Division I baseball with five conference tournament championships in the last six seasons. SDSU is one of 18 programs in the nation to have played in five NCAA Regionals in the last six years and one of just two programs in California, joined by only Cal State Fullerton. Statistically, the Aztecs are one of just nine teams to have hit .300 or better in each of the last two seasons and will enter 2019 having led the MW in earned run average in back-to-back seasons.

Martinez, who has been a part of 1,030 collegiate baseball wins since starting his coaching career in 1984, enters his fifth season as a head coach with a record of 143-103 (.581). Under his watch, SDSU has reached its highest academic progress rate, highest team grade point average, and highest total of scholar-athletes in its 82-year history. Last April, Martinez received the Center for Community Solutions Champions Award, recognizing his efforts in starting healthy relationships and consent education training with SDSU baseball student-athletes and coaches.

Fifteen Aztecs have been selected by the MLB First-Year Player draft and 10 Aztecs have been named Mountain West scholar athletes (3.5 GPA or better) since 2015. Martinez has also directed 21 student-athletes to all-MW honors over the last four seasons, including back-to-back MW Pitchers of the Year (Brett Seeburger — 2017, Garrett Hill — 2018) and 2017 MW Player of the Year Danny Sheehan.

Martinez entered the start of his head coaching career with 31 years

of coaching experience as an assistant coach, split between nine years on Gwynn's Aztec staff (2006–2014), 17 years at New Mexico (1989–2005), and five seasons at his alma mater Mesa State (1984–1988). With Gwynn, Martinez helped SDSU end an 18-year drought from the NCAA postseason with an appearance in 2009.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had seven of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry, Lance Zawadzki, and Greg Allen).

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans. In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals.

The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-to-back 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons. Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well. During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season,

only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State. In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American. Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer. During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage. New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title. Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88. Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990. In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa, and a son, Cade

An inning later, Jacob Maekawa singled to left field and after the ball was mishandled by Bulldog left fielder Austin Chastain, Ryan Orr scored to give SDSU a 6-5 lead and put the Aztecs on top for good. The Aztecs crossed home a trio of important insurance runs in the top of the sixth, including another RBI single by Jarvis and a 2-RBI single by Orr.

After Michael Paredes delivered a five-inning start with seven hits, five runs and one walk allowed to earn his third win of the year, SDSU turned to Adrian Mardueno for the game's final four innings. Mardueno, who earned his second save of the year, finished another stellar outing one walk, no earned runs and five strikeouts.

Paredes and Mardueno teamed up for a span of 12 consecutive batters retired -- a streak that was snapped in Fresno State's one-run seventh that featured an unearned Bulldog run crossing the plate.

The San Diego State baseball team suffered an 8-3 loss to Fresno State in the series finale on Sunday afternoon. The Aztecs, now 2.5 games behind Fresno State for first place in the conference, are now 31-21 overall and 15-11 in the Mountain West.

The Aztecs quickly fell into a hole, with the Bulldogs scoring six runs in the first inning. Seven of the Bulldogs' first eight hitters reached base.

Jacob Flores, who relieved starter Aaron Eden in the first, performed well on a short-notice appearance. Flores pitched 4.2 innings, allowing just one run on three hits with four strikeouts and a walk.

The Bulldogs extended their lead to 7-0 in the second inning. SDSU broke through with a pair of runs of their own in the third, with Angelo Armenta driving in Matt Rudick on a fielder's choice to second base before Armenta later scored on a wild pitch to make it 7-2.

Goossen-Brown, in his final start at Tony Gwynn Stadium, allowed just four hits and one walk while striking out five in his second career complete game. Entering the ninth inning, Goossen-Brown had just two hits allowed over his first eight innings pitched but surrendered a pair of back-to-back singles to start the ninth. After New Mexico's Hayden Schilling flew out to centerfield Aztec second baseman Jacob Maekawa made a full-extension diving catch to his left to record the second out. Goossen-Brown finished his 111-pitch outing after Connor Mang flew out to left to seal Goossen-Brown's shutout.

SDSU started a streak of four consecutive frames with a run after taking the lead in the third with a two-run inning featuring RBI singles by Mike Jarvis and Angelo Armenta.

- Justin Goossen-Brown's complete game is the Aztecs' first since Goossen-Brown posted a complete game against San Jose State on May 12, 2018.

- Goossen-Brown's nine-inning shutout is the first by an SDSU player since Dominic Purpura threw a complete game shutout against San Jose State on May 19, 2016. It is the first complete game shutout with four or fewer hits allowed by an Aztec since current SDSU graduate assistant, Cody Thompson, allowed four hits in a shutout against San Diego on May 5, 2015.

- The Aztecs have won 10 of their last 11 home games for the first time since March 18, 2017 - April 11, 2017.

Making his second career start, Mardueno recorded a career-high eight strikeouts over five innings of work while allowing just one run on four hits with one walk. After Connor Mang led off the top of the second with a double, Mardueno retired each of the next four batters he faced via strikeout. The Lobos broke through with their first run in the top of the fourth, scoring a run on Reese O'Farrell's RBI single.

The Aztecs had multiple run-scoring opportunities throughout the game, including the third, fifth, and sixth innings where SDSU left multiple runners on base.

- The Aztec pitching staff recorded 14 strikeouts, good for the team's 25th double-digit strikeout performance of the season. SDSU had already previously broken their Mountain West era record with their 24th double-digit strikeout game last weekend at Fresno State.

- Matt Rudick had a 12-game hitting streak and 16-game on-base streak snapped. Rudick also had a 24-game on-base streak in home games snapped and a 39-game on-base streak in Mountain West games snapped. Rudick's 39-game in-conference on-base streak is the second-longest by an Aztec since joining the Mountain West.

New Mexico opened the game's scoring with a two-run second inning. In the home half of the second, SDSU cut the deficit in half with a Jacob Maekawa RBI ground out scoring Deron Johnson.

The Lobos pulled away from the Aztecs, scoring two in the third, a run in the fifth, and two in the ninth to gain a 7-1 edge.

The Aztecs, however, did not go quietly in the ninth inning. In his last Tony Gwynn Stadium plate appearance, Angelo Armenta drew a leadoff walk before being pinch ran for. Fellow senior Chad Bible then ripped a double into the left-field corner in his final Tony Gwynn Stadium at-bat.

Jacob Cruce drove in both runners on a well-hit RBI single through the middle of the infield to make it a 7-3 deficit. The Aztecs cut the deficit to just three after a Maekawa RBI double, but New Mexico reliever Malachi Emond closed the door after forcing Matt Rudick to ground out in the next at-bat. Mike Jarvis and Cruce led the Aztecs with both going 2-for-4 at the plate.

New Mexico's Nathaniel Garley earned the win, pitching eight innings with six hits, one run, and two walks allowed. Jacob Flores was handed the loss, allowing three runs on two hits in two innings pitched.

In his final Tony Gwynn Stadium appearance, Brad Wegman retired each of the two batters he faced in the eighth inning.

The Aztecs, meanwhile, ran into some tough luck in both the first and second innings, as a well-hit line drive by Mike Jarvis was caught by Edarian Williams and erased a Matt Rudick leadoff single after Williams doubled Rudick off at second.

An inning later, Ryan Orr hit a line drive with the bases loaded that had an opportunity to be extra-bases down the right-field line, but was caught by Rebel first baseman Austin Pfeifer and turned into a double play with his momentum carrying him towards first base.

The Rebels extended the lead to 7-0 with a Jack Thomas Wold leadoff home run and a Pfeifer RBI single in the top of the fifth.

- In 2015, the last time the Mountain West Championships were hosted in Reno, Nevada, the No. 2-seeded Aztecs lost their opener against No. 3 seed Fresno State, 15-7. From there, the Aztecs proceeded to win five consecutive games by a combined score of 41-20 to clinch the 2015 Mountain West title.

- San Diego State had a four-game winning streak in the Mountain West Championships snapped. The streak was SDSU's longest since winning seven in a row from 2016-17.

- San Diego State and UNLV combined for eight double plays turned, a new Mountain West Championships record.

- San Diego State did not strike out in a game for the first time since May 21, 2016, against San Jose State.
