SDSU Women's Golf Set for NCAA Cle Elum Regional

The 47th-ranked San Diego State women's golf team begins its quest for postseason glory when it travels to the Pacific Northwest to compete in the NCAA Cle Elum Regional, May 6-8, at Suncadia Resort in Cle Elum, Wash. The Aztecs, who are making their sixth consecutive regional appearance and ninth in the last 10 years, will be among the field vying for a spot in the NCAA championship series, scheduled for May 17-22 in Fayetteville, Ark.

SDSU earned the 12th seed out of 18 teams in the Cle Elum Regional, securing one of 27 automatic bids to the NCAA tournament after winning its second Mountain West Championship on April 17. A total of 72 NCAA Division I schools received invitations to play in one of four regionals that will be held concurrently next week in Cle Elum, Wash. (Washington); Norman, Okla. (Oklahoma); East Lansing, Mich. (Michigan State) and Opelika, Ala. (Auburn).

Joining the Aztecs on the par-72, 6,306-yard Tumble Creek Club at Suncadia will be 17 other teams, including 13 opponents ranked in the top 50, along with six individual competitors (96 golfers overall). The top six squads and the three highest finishing individuals not on those teams will move on to nationals from each of the four regionals.

The field will complete 18 holes (54 total) of stroke play each of the three days following a practice round on Sunday, May 5. SDSU will tee off with Old Dominion and Iowa State for Monday's opening round, which is set to get underway at 9:20 a.m. PT on hole No. 10, while pairings for Tuesday and Wednesday will be based on team scores.

Aztec Regional Lineup

Eighth-year San Diego State head coach Leslie Spalding will accompany five golfers to the Evergreen State, led by 2019 first-team all-Mountain West honoree Gioia Carpinelli (Boppelsen, Switzerland), along with second-team all-conference selections Sara Kjellker (Hollviken, Sweden) and Fernanda Escauriza (Asunción, Paraguay), as well as Kitty Tam (Hong Kong, China) and Daniela Anastasi (La Jolla, Calif.).

Kjellker (55th, +7) and Carpinelli (T-79th, +14) are the lone returners from last season's regional squad, as SDSU tied for seventh out of 18 schools at TPC Harding Park in San Francisco, missing out on a potential sudden-death playoff for the regional's final national championship slot by just one stroke. On the other hand, Escauriza is back in the fold after tying for 45th as a freshman at the Lubbock Regional in 2017, while Tam and Anastasi are first-time participants.

Carpinelli, who is currently ranked 48th in the nation by Golfstat, leads the Aztecs with a 73.64 scoring average, followed closely by Kjellker (73.89), who checks in at No. 127. Carpinelli, Kjellker and Escauriza are the only three golfers who have competed in all 10 stroke-play events for SDSU this season.

SDSU At NCAA Regionals

The Aztecs will embark on their sixth straight trip to NCAA regionals and 12th overall as a team. SDSU earned team bids in 1999 (19th), 2001 (15th), 2004 (15th), 2010 (t-15th), 2011 (17th), 2012 (t-20th), 2014 (t-21st), 2015 (11th), 2016 (12th), 2017 (11th) and 2018 (T-7th). The program was also represented by individual golfers in 1996, 1997, 2000 and 2013.

This week marks the eighth time the Aztecs are participating in a western-based regional as a team, following the 1999, 2004, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2018 squads. SDSU has visited the Evergreen State for regional play on two previous occasions, finishing 17th out of 24 schools in 2011 at Washington National Golf Club in Auburn, Wash., before tying for 21st out of 24 squads at Tumble Creek Club in 2014. Including this season, SDSU will have played in 14 different cities and 10 different states in its NCAA regional history.

when she tied for 11th place at Stanford in 2004; Malin Enarsson and Mila Chaves registered 12th-place performances in 2010 and 2018, respectively; Sirene Blair sits in fourth with an 17th-place effort in 2016, while Chaves ranks fourth after tying for 18th in 2016.

The Competition

The Aztecs are one of 13 teams in the Cle Elum Regional ranked among the top 50 in the latest Golfstat rankings released April 30. Of those squads, eight reside in the top 30, including No. 1 USC, followed by Arkansas (8), South Carolina (9), Northwestern (16), Washington (19), Miami (23), Oregon (26) and San José State (26).

The Aztecs own a 14-18 record in head-to-head results against 10 of their 17 regional foes during the 2018-19 campaign, maintaining the upper hand against New Mexico State (3-0), Sacramento State (3-0) and Oregon State (1-0) while splitting four encounters vs. San José State (2-2).

A Look At The Course

The host site of the 2019 NCAA Women's Golf West Regional is the par-72, 6,306 yard Tumble Creek Club at Suncadia Resort in Cle Elum, Wash., located some 80 miles east of Seattle in the Cascade Mountains.

Nestled amongst rolling hills and sun-drenched meadows with views of soaring peaks, Tumble Creek was designed by Tom Doak, considered one of the finest living golf course architects in the world.

The Tumble Creek layout was modeled after the great parkland style golf clubs of the Northeast with the signature natural element to Doak's design philosophy, taking great care to emphasize the natural assets of the land.

The course is lined with native Douglass Fir and Ponderosa Pine trees and flows with the rolling mountain topography. Tumble Creek Club includes beautifully manicured bent grass fairways, 100 natural edge bunkers and green shapes with significant movement, designed to perfectly blend into the Northwest landscape. The strategy of the course lends to birdie and bogey opportunities with variety in length and difficulty of holes.

In addition to three golf courses, the Suncadia Resort features bicycling and hiking trails, summer boating, winter ice skating facilities, as well as a swim and fitness center and an outdoor amphitheater.

Backspin: 2018 San Francisco Regional

Despite recording its highest placement ever in a regional tournament, the San Diego State women's golf team fell just short in its bid for the first NCAA Championship appearance in program history after tying for seventh at the San Francisco Regional at TPC Harding Park Golf Course.

For the second time this week, the Aztecs established a school record for lowest 18-hole team score in a regional event, logging a collective 1-under-par 287 during the final round on the par-72, 6,369-yard layout. However, the Scarlet and Black ultimately finished one stroke shy of the coveted sixth-place cutoff mark, posting a three-day total of 6-over 870, as Colorado (+5) wrested the regional's final berth

in the NCAA Championships away from SDSU and Oklahoma State.

The Aztecs, who entered the day in 11th place, vaulted back into contention after draining a collective seven birdies against two bogeys over the first five holes. Weathering a mid-round stretch of seven counted bogeys and one double bogey, SDSU received spot-free performances from its top four players over the last six holes, but was unable to position itself for a possible playoff to determine the final spot.

Individually, the Aztecs boasted two top-15 golfers, including Mila Chaves, who finished alone in 12th place with a 2-under 214 after carding a 73. The 2018 Mountain West champion opened with a birdie on the 10th green, but suffered two hiccups with a bogey at the par-5 12th, followed by an untimely double bogey on the par-4, 317-yard No. 16, which knocked her out of the top five on the leaderboard. However, the SDSU senior regrouped with two additional birdies on the back nine, including a successful conversion at the par-3, 180-yard No. 8, which ranked as the fifth-toughest hole of the week.

With her total, Chaves set an Aztec individual record for lowest three-round score in a regional tournament, logging the team's highest finish in postseason competition since Malin Enarsson tied for the 12th spot at the Central Regional in 2010.

In addition, Haleigh Krause registered her highest placement of the year, tying for the 13th position with a 1-under 215 thanks to a final-round 70. The Aztec senior sank three birdies of her own, including an impressive make on the par-4, 380-yard No. 13, which ranked as the third-most difficult hole of the tournament. Krause also notched a team-high 14 pars, including eight straight down the stretch to jump eight places in the standings.

Similarly, fellow classmate Georgia Lacey logged her highest finish in four regional appearances, tying for 40th at 5-over 221 after shooting a 73. The Torrey Pines High product began her back-nine with an inopportune bogey at the par-4 No. 1, but played spot-free golf the rest of the way, collecting seven pars to go with a birdie on the par-4, 390-yard No. 6.

Meanwhile, Sara Kjellker rebounded from a shaky second round to tie her season-best with a 71. The Aztec freshman paced the squad with four birdies, including a three on her first five holes, capped by an impressive drain on the par-4, 400-yard 14th, which ranked as the sixth-toughest green of the round. Despite back-to-back bogeys at No. 2 and No. 3, Kjellker still leaped 17 places into the 55th position at 7-over 223.

The SDSU lineup also included Gioia Carpinelli, who tied for 79th at 14-over 230 in her initial regional appearance after shooting a final-round 78. The Aztec freshman opened with five straight pars and was just 2-over for the day at the turn, but could not regroup on the back nine where she suffered four additional bogeys.

Host Stanford (-8) captured the San Francisco Regional title with a four-shot victory over UCLA (-4), while Ole Miss (-1), Louisville (E), Kent State (+1) and the aforementioned Colorado squad punched their tickets to the NCAA Championships as well.

Three Aztecs Earn All-MW Honors

San Diego State's Gioia Carpinelli, Sara Kjellker and Fernanda Escariza each landed a spot on the all-Mountain West Women's Golf team, as announced by the league office on April 23. Carpinelli was a first-team selection, while Kjellker and Escariza received second-team recognition in a vote of the conference's nine head coaches.

With their honors, the Aztecs have garnered multiple all-MW accolades in nine consecutive seasons.

Carpinelli earned her first career all-conference honor after leading SDSU with a 73.64 scoring average during the 2019 and was the team's top finisher or was tied for the No. 1 spot in six stroke play tournaments. The Aztec sophomore won two events this spring, highlighted by her first collegiate victory at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational in Tucson, Ariz., where she fired a season-best 1-under-par 215 to merit MW Women's Golfer of the Week distinction. She also captured the medal round of SDSU's own Lamkin Invitational at The Farms Golf Club, where she was the lone competitor to break par with a 2-under 70, before posting a 2-0-1 record in match play to help the Aztecs to a third-place finish.

In addition, Carpinelli tied for second at the season-opening Branch Law Firm/Dick McGuire Invitational in Albuquerque, N.M., where she carded a collegiate-low 6-under 210, highlighted by a

career-best 68 in the final round. For the season, the Swiss native owns eight top-20 finishes and leads the Scarlet and Black with 10 rounds at or below par. She is currently ranked 54th nationally by Golfstat.

Kjellker, who picked up her second all-MW certificate, was the team's top golfer at the Mountain West Championship last week, tying for second with a 3-over 219 to help the Aztecs claim their second conference title in the last five years. The Aztec sophomore ranks second on the squad with a 73.89 scoring average and has five other top-20 placements to her credit this year. She was also the lone SDSU golfer to win all three of her matches at the aforementioned Lamkin Invitational.

Additionally, Kjellker landed in the fifth position as an individual competitor at the UC Irvine Invitational, highlighted by a career-best 66 in the opening round, which is tied for third for lowest 18-hole score in the San Diego State record book. For the season, she ranks second on the squad with eight rounds at or below par, including a team-best four in the 60s.

Escariza, meanwhile, received her second all-conference nod after collecting second-team honors as a freshman in 2017. The reigning South American Women's Amateur champion ranked third on the Aztecs with a 74.71 scoring average this season and posted her highest finish of the year when it mattered the most with a solo fourth-place effort of 5-over 221 at the MW Championship, where her par putt on the 18th green secured the Scarlet and Black's title by one shot over Nevada.

Escariza has logged three other top-20 finishes this year, including a third-place tie with Carpinelli (+8, 224) under adverse conditions in late February at the Bruin Wave Invitational in San Luis Obispo, Calif. She was also the team's top player earlier this month at the Silverado Showdown in Napa, Calif., landing in the 18th spot at 8-over 224. For the season, Escariza has compiled six rounds at or below par, highlighted by a 67 during the second round of the Branch/McGuire Invite, where she tied for 15th at 1-over 217.

Rewind: Aztecs Capture MW Championship

After three consecutive runner-up finishes, San Diego State celebrated its second conference title on April 17 after winning the 2019 Mountain West Championship by one stroke over Nevada at Mission Hills Country Club.

It wasn't easy, however, as the Aztecs endured some high drama to hold off a hard-charging Wolf Pack squad on the par-72, 6,240-yard Dinah Shore Tournament Course.

SDSU, which opened the day with a nine-shot advantage over San José State and a 10-stroke margin over Nevada, shot a collective 18-over-par 306 during the final round for a 54-hole total of 40-over 904. The Spartans (+48) slipped into fourth behind UNLV (+47), but the Wolf Pack (+41) gave the Aztecs all they could handle, posting a 9-over 297 over the final 18 holes to fall one shot short.

Leading by one stroke heading into the 18th green, SDSU counted three pars and one bogey on its team score, matching that of Nevada to secure its first league crown since 2015 and second overall. With its MW title, San Diego State also clinched the conference's automatic berth in the NCAA Regionals, scheduled for May 6-8 at four different venues.

"Today's win was a tough victory against some great competition," said San Diego State head coach Leslie Spalding. "We've fought hard in every tournament this season and it's so thrilling to finish as champions and make SDSU proud. Hopefully, this gives us some momentum when we prepare for regionals."

Individually, the Aztecs were paced by Sara Kjellker, who tied for second in the field with a 3-over 219 after shooting a 72. The SDSU sophomore offset two bogeys and one double bogey with four clutch birdies, including a critical make on the par-4, 370-yard No. 13, which gave the Scarlet and Black a huge boost after the Wolf Pack narrowed the gap. After a bogey at the par-4 15th, she rose to the occasion once again, closing with three consecutive pars.

With her score, Kjellker climbed two places on the leaderboard, finishing two shots behind Fresno State medalist Brigitte Thibault (+1), along with San José State's Natasha Andrea Oon.

In addition, Fernanda Escariza landed in the fourth spot at 5-over 221 after logging a final-round 76. The SDSU junior drained the team's two other birdies of the day at the par-5 11th and at No. 13 to offset four bogeys and a double bogey. Despite slipping two positions from the previous round, the 2017 MW medalist helped the Aztecs down the stretch with pars on her final two holes, including the 18th, where she stuck her approach safely on the green before putting out for an even-5.

Kitty Tam, who experienced a dearth of birdies in the final round, was also a model of consistency in crunch time, closing with five consecutive pars after making a double bogey and bogey on the 12th and 13th greens, respectively. Earlier, the SDSU senior weathered three additional bogeys on front nine before completing a card of 78 to finish the championship in a tie for 22nd at 19-over 235.

Elsewhere, fellow classmate Daniela Anastasi figured in the Aztecs' winning total after logging an 80 over the final 18 holes. The La Jolla High alumna was just 2-over for the day at the turn, but stumbled on the back nine with four bogeys and a double bogey to complete the tournament in a tie for 34th at 26-over 242.

The SDSU contingent also featured Gioia Carpinelli, who slipped nine places into a tie for 15th at 16-over 232 on the heels of an uncharacteristic 82. The Aztec sophomore was unable to regroup from a trio of bogeys before the turn, suffering six more blemishes on the back nine, including a double bogey at No. 13.

2018-19 Highlights

- Despite the loss of former all-MW honorees Mila Chaves and Georgia Lacey, while facing a schedule replete with high-level competition, San Diego State enjoyed another successful season in 2018-19, posting top-10 team finishes in eight of nine stroke-play events, highlighted by the program's second-ever conference championship to go with a pair of third-place performances at the Branch Law Firm Dick McGuire Invitational and in the medal round of the Aztecs' own Lamkin Invitational.
- The Aztecs opened the season last September at the aforementioned Branch/McGuire Invite in Albuquerque, N.M., where Gioia Carpinelli finished in a tie for the runner-up spot after carding a career-best 6-under 210, highlighted by a final-round 68.
- Carpinelli was also SDSU's top golfer at the Golfweek Conference Challenge in Wolcott, Colo., where she wound up a solo 12th at even-par 216.
- The Aztecs faced some robust competition in their next two events, finishing 13th at Northwestern University's Windy City Collegiate Classic just outside of Chicago, Ill., before rising to the eighth position at the Stanford Intercollegiate. Kjellker held her own in the former event, tying for 15th with a 3-over 219, before landing in the 20th position at Stanford, along with Carpinelli (+2).
- SDSU wrapped up its fall slate with seven individuals competing at the UC Irvine Invitational, where Kjellker tied for fifth place with a season-best 3-under 213.
- During the winter break, Escariza emerged victorious at the South American Women's Amateur Championship in Santiago, Chile, where she carded a collective 12-under 276 to win by eight strokes over fellow Paraguayan Sofia Garcia (-4). Escariza was the only golfer in the 51-player field to complete all four rounds below par (69-71-68-68).
- SDSU opened its second semester schedule at the Bruin Wave Invitational in San Luis Obispo, where only eight individuals finished in red figures for the tournament. The Aztecs were paced by Escariza and Carpinelli, who ended up in a four-way tie for third at 8-over 224, as the Scarlet and Black took sixth in the team standings.
- Carpinelli broke through for her first collegiate victory two weeks later at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational in Tucson, where she was the lone golfer in the 92-player field to finish below par for the tournament, posting a combined 1-under 215 to propel the Aztecs to a fifth-place team finish.
- Shortly thereafter, the Aztecs returned the Golden State to conduct their seventh annual home event, the Lamkin Invitational, which featured a match-play sequence for the fifth year in a row, following an opening round of stroke play. Carpinelli emerged triumphant for the second straight tournament, winning the medal phase with a 2-under 70 to help SDSU clinch the No. 3 seed in match play. The Aztecs shut out UC Irvine in their opening match, 5-0, before falling to Cal in



the second round 3.5-1.5. However, the Scarlet and Black rebounded with a 4-1 triumph over Sacramento State to claim third place. Individually, Kjellker (3-0) and Escariza (2-0-1) finished with unblemished records, while Carpinelli and April Ranches both went 2-1.

- San Diego State finished 10th at the Silverado Showdown in Napa, Calif., during its last event, as Escariza (18th, +6) and Kjellker (T-19th, +7) cracked the individual top 20.
- At San Diego State's annual scholar-athlete banquet on April 15, the Aztecs were presented with the award for highest women's team grade point average for the 2018 fall semester, marking the third straight term in which they have received such distinction.
- Last fall, head coach Leslie Spalding fortified the team's roster with the signing of international junior golf standout Bernice Olivarez Ilas to a National Letter of Intent. A native of Ayala Alabang, Philippines, Olivarez Ilas has posted 20 top-10 finishes since 2016, according to the World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR) website.

Just A Chip Shot Away

The top six teams and the three highest finishing individuals not on one of those squads will advance out of the NCAA Cle Elum Regional to the national championships, slated for May 17-22 in Fayetteville, Ark.

A total of 24 teams and 12 individuals will complete 54 holes of stroke play over a three-day span at the Blessings Golf Club, with the top 15 squads and nine highest placing individuals advancing to a fourth round of stroke play, which will determine the top eight schools for match play competition, as well as the 72-hole stroke play individual champion.

The top eight teams after 72 holes of play will be placed into a bracket with the No. 1 seed playing the No. 8 seed, the No. 2 seed playing the No. 7 seed, the No. 3 seed playing the No. 6 seed and the No. 4 seed playing the No. 5 seed in match play.

SDSU has previously sent an individual to the NCAA national tournament, but has never qualified as a team.

Head Coach Leslie Spalding

Leslie Spalding enters her eighth season as head coach at San Diego State in 2018-19, continuing her quest to establish the Aztecs as a national force in collegiate women's golf. A 10-year veteran of the LPGA Tour, Spalding arrived on The Mesa after serving as head coach at Montana State for four seasons from 2007-11.

Under Spalding's direction, SDSU has recorded 37 top-five placements, 10 event titles and seven team regional appearances, while her players have earned 21 all-Mountain West honors and collected 13 weekly/monthly awards from the league office. In addition, the Aztecs have posted the six lowest single-season team scoring averages in program history during her tenure.

Not to be outdone, Spalding's players have excelled in the classroom, garnering 24 all-academic accolades and 13 scholar-athlete certificates from the Mountain West to go with nine WGCA Scholar All-America recipients.

Spalding played on the LPGA Tour from 1996 to 2005, competing in 215 events and earning more than \$600,000 in prize money. She recorded seven top-10 finishes, including a career-best third-place showing at the 2001 ShopRite LPGA Classic, where she carded a career-low 64 in the final round. The Billings, Mont., native also tallied back-to-back top-10 performances in 2002 at the LPGA Corning Classic and the Kellogg-Keebler Classic, and came in sixth at the 2000 LPGA Corning Classic and the 1998 Weetabix Women's British Open.

As a collegian, Spalding attended the University of Alabama on a golf scholarship from 1987 to 1991 and received her bachelor's degree in telecommunication/film with a minor in marketing in 1992.
