Aztecs Notes

- San Diego State opens the 2019 Mountain West Conference schedule this week with games at Wyoming and home against Colorado State.
- The Aztecs have played the Cowgirls 22 times darting back to the 1999 season and lead the all-time series 17-3-2. In the Friesen era, SDSU is 12-2-1 against Wyoming, including 3-1-1 in games contested in Laramie. San Diego State is unbeaten in its last six meeting against the Cowgirls.
- SDSU and Colorado State have met six times dating back to the 2013 season with San Diego State holding a 5-0-1 advantage in the series. The Aztecs are 3-0-0 in games played on the Sports Deck and have never been scored upon by the Rams on its home field.
- In 20 years as a member of the Mountain West, San Diego State is 11-5-4 in conference openers. In Mountain West openers which are on the road, the Aztecs are 3-3-1 and two of those three losses coming at Wyoming (in 2003 & 2005). The meeting in Laramie is the first time since 2015 that SDSU starts conference play on the road.
- In 20 years as a member of the Mountain West, San Diego State is 5-2-0 in its conference home opener after playing its first MW game on the road.
- The Aztecs game against Long Beach State on Sept. 22 was canceled. There is no make-up date this year and no game is scheduled in its place.
- Freshman Kiera Utush (Fr., MF, Rocklin, Calif.) has scored twice this season, each time on a penalty kick. She is the first Aztecs to have multiple successful PKs in a season, since current volunteer assistant coach Victoria Barba put four penalty kicks in the back of the net in the 2016 season. Since the 2003 season, an Aztecs has scored multiple PKs in a season eight times.
- On goals against No. 22 Texas Tech and at Miami (FL), and with an assist on the Frisch game-winner against LIU, freshman Kiera Utush (Fr., MF. Rocklin, Calif.) leads the team with five points. Utush is just the second freshman in the last 10 years to score the team's season-opening goal (vs. No. 22 Texas Tech). The other freshman to tally a goal in her first collegiate game in that time frame is Taylor Moorehead (So., F, Valencia, Calif.) who had the game-winner in a 1-0 victory over New Mexico State in the 2018 season.

- With eight shots on goal to lead the team, Malia Kaleiohi (Jr., MF/F, San Diego, Calif.) has already surpassed her single-season high of four, which she set last year. She produced two shots on goal in each of the team's first three games as well as against San Diego (9/13), which are single-game highs for her career. In addition, Kaleiohi has produced 12 shots, good for second on the team and a single-season high for the junior.
- Brooke Lisowski (Sr., GK, Los Gatos, Calif.), a transfer from California, has played every minute in goal for SDSU and
 has a 1-5-1 record. In 650 minutes, she has surrendered 13 goals (1.80 GAA) and has made 26 saves (.667 save
 percentage). If you remove the four goals given up in the first half of the season-opener against No. 22 Texas Tech,
 Lisowski's GAA goes down to 1.68 (nine goals allowed in 605 minutes) and her save percentage goes up to .743 (26
 saves on 35 shots which reached her line).
- Brooke Lisowski (Sr., GK, Los Gatos, Calif.) ranks eighth in saves (26) and seventh in saves per game at 3.71. In addition, Lisowski's seven saves at Miami (FL) equaled the fourth most in a game by a Mountain West keeper this year.
- So far this season the Aztecs played three Power-5 schools. Over the last 10 years, SDSU has played a minimum of three Power-5 squads per season. In 2011, San Diego State took the pitch a single-season high six times against current Power-5 schools and posted a 4-2 record. Among those four wins, SDSU notched victories over Arizona (1-0), Minnesota (2-1) Texas (1-0).
- Outside of the first half of the season-opener, in which No. 22 Texas Tech tallied four goals, the Aztecs defense has been up to
 the challenge giving up slightly more than one goal per game (1.29). However, the offense is what has been missing. Due to
 several factors, SDSU has found the back of the net just three this year. With the Kiera Utush (Fr., MF, Rocklin, Calif.) goal at
 43:22 at Miami (FL), the team snapped a 225:06 scoreless drought dating to the game-winner against LIU, which came at the
 88:22 mark.
- Head Coach Mike Friesen is in his 13th campaign leading the Mountain West's most dominant women's soccer program. Friesen
 has guided his squads to nine Mountain West championships (five tournament and four regular season), and five NCAA Tournament
 appearances. In 12 seasons of conference play, Friesen has a 72-19-15 record. His 72 victories are double that of the next closest
 conference coach...Wyoming's Peter Cuadrado and Boise State's Jim Thomas have won 36 games each in Mountain West play.

- Friesen's 141 victories (141-85-33) since the start of the 2007 season, the year he took control of the program, are the most by any coach in the Mountain West. Colorado College's Geoff Bennett ranks second on the list with 129 victories through last weekend.
- San Diego State is picked to finish fourth in the MW coaches' preseason poll. This marks the first time in 10 seasons the Aztecs
 have been picked to finish lower than second place. The last time SDSU was lower than second place in the preseason poll was at
 the beginning of the 2009 season, a year in which the team went 15-4-5, was undefeated in the Mountain West (5-0-2) and
 reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Having won four of the last seven regular season titles, SDSU slotted into the No. 4 spot in the Mountain West preseason coaches'
 poll, which snaps a six-year run of being the favorite in the eyes of the conference's head coaches.
- The Aztecs have won eight of the last 13 MW trophies (regular season and tournament), all of which have come under the
 direction of head coach Mike Friesen. In total, the 13th-year head coach has guided San Diego State to nine conference crowns.
- San Diego State brings back its top seven point-earners from last year, including 2018 Mountain West Newcomer of the Year
 Laura Fuentes (So., MF, Newark, Calif.). The midfielder tallied three goals and an assist as a true freshman. Fuentes finished
 with seven points on the year, one behind another freshman, team leader Chloe Frisch (Jr., MF/F, Solana Beach, Calif.) who
 totaled eight (two goals & four assists).
- Joining Frisch and Fuentes as the top returning point-getters are Taylor Moorehead (So., F, Valencia, Calif.), Phoebe Leitch (Jr., D/MF, Forest Row, England) and Darcy Weiser (Sr., F, Huntington Beach, Calif.) who each tallied three goals and six points in 2018. Sarah Broacha (Jr., D, Pleasanton, Calif.) and Mia Root (Jr., F, Placerville, Calif.) totaled a goal and two assists each for four points.

The Cowgirls enter the game against San Diego State with a 3-2-3 record after losing to South Dakota 3-2 last week at a neutral site...

Wyoming is 3-1-0 at home this year, with its lone setback coming against Baylor... The Cowgirls were picked to finish in fifth place among 12 teams in the preseason Mountain West coaches poll... Indianna Asimus lead her squad with four goals and eight points...

The defense is anchored by keeper Hannah Lee, who has appeared each of the team's eight games and has as 1.19 GAA and a .758 save percentage with one shutouts and a 3-1-2 record.... Wyoming is coached by Peter Cuadrado, who is in his eighth season leading the program and brought a 66-55-19 record in Laramie into the 2019 season.

Colorado Stato

The Rams enter the week with a 5-2-1 record and host New Mexico on Friday afternoon before traveling to San Diego for its match with the Aztecs on Sunday... Colorado State was picked to finish in 10th place among 12 teams in the preseason Mountain West coaches poll... The Rams are 2-2-1 in games away from Fort Collins, which includes victories at Grand Canyon and Valparaiso... Caeley Lordermann and Kristen Noonan lead the team with five goals, an assist and 11 points each... Gabi McDonald has played every minute in goal this season posting a 5-2-1 record, 0.83 GAA and .868 save percentage... Colorado State is coached by Bill Hempen, who is in his seventh season in Fort Collins and brought a 22-76-16 record at CSU into the 2019 season.
