NEWS AND NOTES

HOME SWEET HOME: After opening the season last weekend in Florida, San Diego State returns to "America's Finest City" to co-host the SDSU/USD Invitational, Sept. 6-7, at Aztec Court. San Diego State commences its 2019 home schedule on Friday when it battles West Virginia, beginning at 6 p.m. PT, before facing Arkansas and Arizona in a day-night doubleheader on Saturday, starting at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m., respectively. All three matches will feature live stats, while streaming video will also be available for Friday's Aztecs-Mountaineers clash via the Mountain West Network.

The first 100 fans in attendance on Friday night will receive a free SDSU/Mountain West t-shirt, while the first 200 fans arriving for Saturday's match vs. Arizona will receive a free clear tote bag.

SERIES RECORDS: The West Virginia and Arkansas matches will represent the first-ever meetings for San Diego State against those respective programs, while the Aztecs own a 20-9 record vs. Arizona.

SDSU is 25-19 all-time against seven of the nine current members of the Big 12 Conference that sponsor volleyball, having never played WVU or Kansas State. The Aztecs last faced a Big 12 opponent in 2015 when it suffered a 3-0 setback to TCU at home in the SDSU/USD Challenge.

Arkansas is also one of three current Southeastern Conference teams SDSU has never met, along with Auburn and South Carolina. The Aztecs are 16-10 against 10 remaining SEC volleyball affiliates, with their last encounter resulting in a 3-0 defeat at the hands of then-No. 2 Florida at the 2015 Outrigger Resorts Challenge in Honolulu, Hawaii.

San Diego State faced Arizona last year at the Cactus Classic, dropping a 3-0 decision on the road in Tucson (25-22, 25-19, 25-17). Hannah Turnlund is the Aztecs' top returner from the match when she knocked down eight kills and hit .273, while Sam McGrath posted 10 digs. In addition, Serena Hodson and Lexie Hamrick got into the act with three block assists each. SDSU held the lead in all three sets, but the Wildcats used timely runs to gain the upper hand in each frame. The Aztecs are 105-135 against the current Pac-12 alignment, having played every team in the circuit with the exception of Washington State

HOME OPENERS: San Diego State is 6-4 in home openers since the 2009 campaign, but will be looking to reverse a two-match slide in fter falling to CSU Bakersfield (2018) and Eastern Kentucky (2017) in consecutive lid-lifters at Aztec Court. SDSU is 28-15 in home openers since the program's inception in 1976.

SCOUTING THE OPPOSITION: West Virginia captured the tournament championship at the Delaware Classic last weekend, opening with a four-set triumph over the host Blue Hens, followed by consecutive sweeps of Coppin State and Binghamton. Middle blocker Briana Lynch was named the event's most valuable player, while outside hitter Kristina Jordan and setter Lacey Zerwas each earned a spot on the all-tournament team. Lynch hit .381 for the weekend, averaging 2.9 kills per set (29 overall) to go with five total blocks, while Jordan finished at a .284 clip, launching 3.33 kills per set (30 overall) to go with 19 digs. Not to be outdone, Zerwas averaged 10.80 assists and 3.20 digs per frame, while outside hitter Kristin Lux figured prominently in the Mountaineers' success as well, averaging 3.50 kills (35 overall) and 2.50 digs (25 overall) per set . Jordan is a San Diego native who prepped at Liberty Charter High School.

The Razorbacks also claimed the tournament crown at home in the Arkansas Classic last week after sweeping past Northwestern State and Little Rock, followed by a five-set victory over Montana State in the finals. Additionally, the Razorbacks

boasted their own MVP in outside hitter Jillian Gillen, who averaged 4.36 kills (48 overall) and 2.36 digs (26 overall in 11 sets last weekend, collecting SEC Freshman of the Week accolades in the process. Arkansas also received steady performances from outside hitter Maggie Cartwright (2.73 kills/set, 1.73 digs per set, 6 service aces), setters Rachel Rippee (5.91 assists/set, 2.45 digs/set) and Gracie Ryan (4.55 assists/set, 2.09 digs/set), along with middle blocker Elizabeth Pamphile (22 kills, 9 total blocks, .271 hitting pct.).

Arizona, which is receiving votes in the latest AVCA Top-25 Coaches Poll, posted a 2-1 record at its own Cactus Classic last weekend, sweeping Appalachian State and Loyola Marymount before falling to Samford in the title match. The Wildcats were led by the trio of outside hitters in Paige Whipple (2.91 kills/set), Katie Smoot (2.82 kills/set) and Elizabeth Shelton (2.36 kills/set, .346 attack pct.), while libero Kamaile Hiapo topped the squad in digs (2.91/set). For her efforts, Shelton earned a spot on the all-tournament team, along with middle blocker Shardonee Hayes (9 total blocks, .250 attack pct.).

FLORIDA WRAP: San Diego State finished with a 3-1 record at the FGCU Homewood Suites Fort Myers Classic last weekend in Florida. The Aztecs opened with a pair of sweeps over Akron (25-20, 25-19, 25-18) and Bryant (25-22, 25-16, 25-13) before falling short against host Florida Gulf Coast in a tough five-set battle (25-22, 23-25, 23-25, 25-22, 11-15). SDSU was led by outside hitter Hannah Turnlund (3.73 kills/set) and setter Camryn Machado (11.55 assists/set, 3.82 digs/set), who each earned a spot on the all-tournament team. Machado logged three straight double-doubles, while middle blocker Tamia Reeves hit .431 to go with 2.55 kills and 1.27 blocks per set. In addition, the Scarlet and Black was bolstered by the play of outside hitter Victoria O'Sullivan (3.45 kills/set, 0.73 blocks/set) and libero Loren Teter (4.64 digs/set). Collectively, the Aztecs outhit the opposition .272 to .148 at the tournament while maintaining the upper hand in kills (149-123), digs (188-158) and total blocks (27.0-19.0). The Scarlet and Black also registered 16 fewer errant attacks than their foes (47-63) and did not commit a ball-handling error in three matches.

With their victories over Akron and Bryant, SDSU started a season 2-0 for the first time since the 2013 campaign. All three matches last weekend marked the Aztecs' first-ever meetings against those respective opponents.

Turnlund posted a career-high 24 kills and scooped up 16 digs in the finale against FGCU for her second straight double-double and sixth of her career. She also tallied 10 put-aways and 11 digs vs. Bryant. In addition, the Morgan Hill, California, native hit .412 against Akron, launching seven kills with no errors in 17 attempts while adding three total blocks.

MACHADO COLLECTS MW HONORS: Thanks to her all-round performance, Camryn Machado was named Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 2. Against, Florida Gulf Coast, the SDSU redshirt sophomore established career highs with 55 assists and 20 digs to go with a personal-best five service aces. Earlier, she opened the year with 35 assists and 12 digs vs. Akron, before notching 37 helpers and 10 digs against Bryant.

AZTEC VETERANS: With the graduation of four-time all-Mountain West honoree Deja Harris, senior Hannah Turnlund is the lone San Diego State veteran to have started all 31 matches during the 2018 campaign. The Aztec outside hitter finished second on the squad last year with 2.78 kills per set (339 overall), blasting double-digit put-aways in 19 matches. In the penultimate contest of the regular season vs. Nevada, Turnlund became the second SDSU player in the Mountain West era to post a 20-20 performance with a career-high 23 kills and 23 digs, fueling a 3-1 win for the Scarlet and Black.

In addition, the Aztecs welcome back senior Tamia Reeves and junior Erin Gillcrist, who ranked second and third on the squad last year with 72 and 57 total blocks in the middle, respectively. Reeves owns SDSU's top returning hitting percentage from last year after posting a .273 clip, while Gillcrist (197) and sophomore outside hitter Victoria O'Sullivan (109) each surpassed the 100-kill plateau.

Redshirt juniors Loren Teter (2.65 digs/set) and Sam McGrath (2.43 digs/set) provided much of the support in the back row during the 2018 campaign. Teter ranked eighth in Mountain West play last year with 3.23 digs per set, logging double-digit scoops in 14 matches, including five straight to end the season. In a five-set victory at Utah State, the Redondo Beach, California, product came through with a career-high 22 digs, matching McGrath's personal-best total accomplished on two occasions during the season vs. Idaho and at Air Force.

Redshirt sophomore Camryn Machado will look for increased playing time at setter this season after appearing in only eight matches last year due to injury. A local product from La Costa Canyon High School, Machado originally signed with Utah following her prep career, where she averaged 3.05 assists per set off the bench as a freshman in 2017, as the Utes advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

MEET THE NEWCOMERS: San Diego State landed a pair of transfers during spring practice last year in setter Ashley Vanderpan and middle blocker Abby Pugh, who join true freshmen Nya Blair, Alexis Durand, Elise Park and Gabriella Spaething.

A native of Elk Grove, California, Vanderpan sat out the 2018 campaign as a redshirt at Syracuse and will retain freshman status this fall. She twice captured her squad's Most Valuable Player award at Elk Grove High School, garnering first-team all-conference accolades on two occasions.

Pugh, meanwhile, will have junior eligibility this fall after spending two years at Wichita State. A native of Brenham, Texas, Pugh averaged 1.46 kills and hit .289 in over 120 career sets for the Shockers. In 2018, she started 22 of 30 matches, averaging 1.53 kills per set (150 overall) while hitting at a .282 clip and totaling 58 blocks.

TURNING THINGS AROUND: After battling numerous injuries to start the 2018 campaign at 1-14, San Diego State regrouped over its last 16 matches, posting a 9-7 record over the latter half of the season. What follows is a statistical comparison between the Aztecs' first 15 matches and their final 16 encounters last year:

STAFF ADDITION: Isabel Miller has joined the Aztec staff as a volunteer assistant coach. A native of Phoenix, Arizona, Miller played at Boise State (2013-14) and San Diego Mesa College (2015-16) before completing her collegiate career at Arizona State in 2017. She graduated from Arcadia High School in Phoenix, where she was a three-time all-state selection in volleyball. As a prep, Miller also garnered first-team all-conference honors all four years and was named league MVP during her sophomore season.

AZTEC VOLLEYBALL EARNS PUBLIC RECOGNITION FROM NCAA: Last spring, the San Diego State volleyball program was publicly recognized by the NCAA for outstanding academic achievements, along with the Aztec women's tennis and cross country teams. The recognition came on the heels of the most recent multiyear Academic Progress Rates (APR) in which all three programs were among the top 10 percent of their respective sports nationally. With these squads earning NCAA public recognition last season, San Diego State has now received such distinction a total of 18 times in school history, matching its record of three teams set during the 2011-12 academic year. The SDSU volleyball program received public recognition for the third straight season and fourth time overall, while the Aztec women's tennis team garnered the accolade for the second year in a row and fifth time in the last six seasons. In addition, the San Diego State cross country squad merited public recognition for the sixth time in school history.

NOTHING LIKE HOME COOKIN': In head coach Deitre Collins-Parker's tenure, the Aztecs have amassed a 83-44 (.654) record at home, highlighted by a 14-0 mark during the 2012 season when SDSU captured the Mountain West chanpionship.

ON THE HORIZON: San Diego State heads to the desert next weekend for three matches at the GGU Invitational in Phoenix, Arizona. The Aztecs will battle UC Riverside on Friday, Sept. 13 (4:30 p.m. PT) before facing two opponents on Saturday, Sept. 14 - Eastern Washington (10 a.m. PT) and host Grand Canyon (7 p.m. PT).

Deitre COLLINS-PARKER Head Coach - 12th season

Deitre Collins-Parker, a two-time national collegiate player of the year and AVCA Hall of Fame member, was named the head volleyball coach at San Diego State on Jan. 30, 2009. She became just the fourth head coach since the Aztecs began collegiate play in 1976. She replaced Mark Warner, who retired at the end of the 2008 campaign after 13 years at the helm of the women's program.

Following an injury-plagued start to the 2018 season, Collins-Parker's squad regrouped, posting a 9-7 record over the final 16 matches of the campaign, highlighted by its first victory over crosstown foe San Diego since 2012 and its first road win at Boise State since 2013. Individually, Deja Harris garnered all-Mountain West accolades for the fourth year in a row and completed her illustrious Aztec career ranked eighth on the school's all-time charts with a .322 hitting percentage.

In 2017, Collins-Parker directed SDSU to its second consecutive winning season and a fourth-place Mountain West finish. A quartet of Aztecs were named all-MW (Deia Harris, Devyn Pritchard, Baylee Little, Alexis Cage) -- tied for the program's largest number of honorees since the team joined the league in 2000.

During the summer of 2014 she led a Mountain West all-star team on a tour of Europe that concluded with a bronze medal third-place finish at the 2014 European Global Challenge in Pula, Croatia.

In 2012 she led her Aztec squad to a 23-8 mark and a 13-3 ledger in the Mountain West as the Aztecs claimed their first-ever Mountain West title. It was SDSU's best conference record and league finish since the 1996 season and top overall record since 1995. In addition, she produced a pair of All-America honorees (Andrea Hannasch and Johnna Fouch) along with a total of three all-conference selections (Raegan Shelton) and the conference Newcomer of the Year (Michelle Waber).

Collins-Parker arrived at San Diego State after five seasons as the head coach at Cornell, where she led the Big Red to three Ivy League titles and two NCAA tournament appearances. Under her tutelage, the Big Red had seven players named first-team All-Ivy, including two-time Ivy League Player of the Year and honorable mention All-American, Elizabeth Bishop (2007).

Prior to taking over at Cornell in 2004, Collins-Parker spent the previous eight seasons as head coach at UNLY, earning Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 1998 after taking a dormant volleyball program and leading the Lady Rebels to a 23-8 record and a WAC tournament semifi nal appearance. Before her stint at UNLY, Collins-Parker served as an assistant coach at South Alabama, Northern Arizona and Houston for one year each. She also has plenty of international coaching experience as well. She served as head coach of the 1998 U.S. junior national team, directing her squad to a gold medal in the national qualifier. She served in the same capacity during the summer of 2000 (silver medal) and 2001 (bronze medal).

A former member of the U.S. national team and a three-time AVCA All-American at the University of Hawai'i, Collins-Parker was the starting middle blocker for the 1988 Olympic Team in Seoul, South Korea, and was an alternate for the 1992 team in Barcelona, Spain. She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and the 1987 Pan-Am Games.

As a collegian, Collins-Parker was a two-time Broderick Award honoree as the national player of the year (1983, 1984) after leading the Rainbow Wahine to consecutive national titles and a 110-5 record in her final three seasons. Collins capped off her career by becoming the first volleyball player to be awarded the Broderick Cup recipient, given to the nation's best collegiate athlete in all sports. She was twice named to the NCAA all-tournament team and still holds the record for solo blocks in one NCAA tournament (15 in 1982). She was one of six players named to the NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball 25th Anniversary Team in October 2005. Collins-Parker went on to compete at the national level and played in the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games and was also an alternate for the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain, She played in over 130 international matches and earned bronze medals at the 1986 Goodwill Games and 1987

Pan-Am Games. She played professionally in the

Italian League (1988-89) and the French League (1989-91), capturing the French League Championship twice and the European Cup of Champions in 1990.

Collins-Parker received the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award during the 2009 NCAA Convention in Washington, D.C. The award honors former student-athletes who successfully completed collegiate careers in various sports and have excelled in their chosen professions on their 25th anniversary of completing their athletic eligibility. Collins-Parker was inducted into the AVCA Hall of Fame in the fall of 2008. She currently serves as a member of the AVCA Board of Directors and the chairperson on the AVCA Minority Coaches Committee. She currently has membership with the AVCA, Coaches Accreditation Program, Kaepa Gold Medal Clinics, Black Coaches Association, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes. A 1995 graduate of Hawai'i with a bachelor of arts in broadcast communications, Collins-Parker is a member of the USA Volleyball Coaching Accreditation Program and is a CAP level III accredited coach.

Collins-Parker is married to Dale Parker, formerly an assistant coach for the Cornell women's basketball team for three seasons and served as an assistant at nearby San Diego Christian College during the 2012-13 season.
