NEWS AND NOTES (through games of Jan. 9)

- San Diego State looks to extend the school's third-longest win streak and second-best start to a campaign on Saturday night when the Aztecs play host to Boise State.
- Saturday's game is sold out. It marks the 115th sellout in the venue for the Aztecs and the third straight game.
- The Aztecs, one of two undefeated Division I teams (Auburn), is off to its best start since the 2010-11 squad opened 20-0 en route to a 34-3 record and an appearance in the NCAA Sweet 16.
- The current 16-game win streak for the Aztecs is the third-longest in school history, trailing a pair of 20-game win streaks. The aforementioned 2010-11 start, of which two-time NBA Finals MVP Kawhi Leonard was a part of, and the 2013-14 squad led by Xavier Thames. That team also advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tourney.
- San Diego State is looking for just its third 6-0 conference start of the Mountain West era on Saturday night. The Aztecs last two outright regular-season titles have come following a 6-0 start to league play.
- The Aztecs enter Saturday with a 1 1/2-game lead in the conference standings (Nevada, New Mexico and UNLV are all 3-1 in conference play).
- San Diego State is 8-0 at home this season and the Aztecs have won 17 of its last 18 contests at Viejas Arena. During that 18-game stretch, the Aztecs have outscored the opposition by 293 points and owns an average scoring margin of +16.3.
- The Aztecs are 6-2 lifetime at home against the Broncos, but the seven games played in the venue between the teams since Boise joined the league have been decided by a total of 33 points (4.7 points per game) with one game decided by more than 10 points.**
- San Diego State jumped six spots in the Associated Press Top-25 Poll this week, from No. 13 to No. 7. Now nationally ranked for a fifth consecutive week, the Aztecs have their highest ranking in the poll since SDSU was ranked No. 6 on Feb. 17, 2014.
- San Diego State is enjoying its 71st appearance in the AP Top-25 Poll this week (all have occurred since the start of the 2010-11 campaign). Since the start of the '10-11 season, SDSU's 71 weeks in the top 25 are the 23rd most nationally.
- San Diego State's metrics continue to pace at an elite level. The Aztecs are currently 3rd in NET (San Diego State has been in the top three since the daily chart debuted Dec. 16), 1st in strength of record, 12th in Sagarin, 12th in BPI, 15th in KenPom and 16th in RPI.
- With the fast start, San Diego State finds itself ranked among the nation's elite in several statistical categories, including 3rd in scoring margin (+18.9), 3rd in three-point field goal percentage differential (+11.6), 5th in scoring defense (56.5), 6th in field goal percentage defense (36.4), 7th in three-point field goal defense (26.4), 8th in field goal percentage differential (+10.1), 13th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.39) and 27th in three-point field goal percentage (38.0).**
- San Diego State improved to 16-0 overall and 5-0 in conference play on Wednesday with a 72-52 victory at Wyoming. It was the second largest margin of victory for the Aztecs in 38 all-time meetings against the Cowboys in Laramie. Malachi Flynn scored a game-high 19 points and added four assists and three rebounds, while Yanni Wetzell made all seven of his field goal attempts en route to 17 points and four rebounds.

- ▶ SDSU has won 22 straight gms. when leading at the half.
- ▶ SDSU is 12th nationally in winning percentage since the beginning of the 2010-11 season.
- ▶ Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 11.

- ▶ San Diego State did not trail in the second half marking the 13th time in 16 games this season that the Aztecs did not face a second-half deficit. The Aztecs claimed their seventh victory by 20 or more points this season.
- ▶ San Diego State has four players averaging in double figures (10.3 points or more) and six players averaging 6.9 points or more. Six Aztec players have scored 13 or more points in a game this season.
- ▶ Junior guard **Malachi Flynn** has been one of the best players in the nation through the opening two months of the season. A transfer from Washington State, Flynn leads the Aztecs in scoring (16.1), assists (5.0) and steals (1.7). **He is the only player in the nation to average 16 and five while owning an assist-to-turnover ratio of 3.30 or better.** He is currently eighth in the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio at 3.33 (80 assists, 24 turnovers).
- ▶ Despite coming off the bench in 13-of-16 games this season, junior forward **Matt Mitchell** is second on the team in scoring (11.3) and is third on the team in rebounding (4.8), while shooting 39.6 percent from three-point range. He is averaging career bests in all three of those categories.
- ▶ Senior **Yanni Wetzell** has reached double figures in 10 of his last 13 games after doing so nine times all of last season at Vanderbilt. The transfer is averaging 11.1 points and 6.0 rebounds (second on the team), while shooting 60.2 percent from the field. In his last 13 games he is averaging 12.2 points, 5.8 rebounds and has made 66-of-103 field goal attempts (64.1 percent).
- ▶ Against the Cowboys, **Wetzell** was a perfect 7-for-7 from the field and produced 17 points, four rebounds and two assists. He became the fourth Aztec player during the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era to make at least seven field goals in a game without a miss - joining Nathan Mensah, Aerick Sanders and Billy White.
- ▶ Junior **Jordan Schakel** has eight or more points in nine of his last 10 games (double figure in seven of those contests). Not only is reaching double figures good for Schakel, it's good for the Aztecs. When Schakel scores 10 or more points in his career, SDSU is 18-2 with 11 straight victories. The Aztecs are 12-0 at Viejas when the he reaches double figures. The sharpshooter has made 35-of-76 attempts from bonus distance (46.1 percent).

FLYNN NAMED TO THE WOODEN AWARD MIDSEASON WATCH LIST

Junior guard **Malachi Flynn** was one of 25 players in Division I men's college basketball to be named to the John R. Wooden Award midseason watch list, which was announced on Jan. 8.

▶ Flynn is the third Aztec men's basketball player to be included in the Wooden Watch. Previously Kawhi Leonard was named to the list in 2011 and Jamaal Franklin was selected for the 2013 watch list.

▶ Flynn is one of three juniors on the list and the only player from a Mountain West Conference school.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State is spending its fifth consecutive week in the AP Top-25 Poll this week, moving up to No. 7.
- At No. 7, the Aztecs have their highest ranking in the AP Poll since a No. 6 ranking on Feb. 17, 2014.
- The Aztecs debuted at No. 25 in the poll back on Dec. 9. SDSU has moved from 25 to 20 to 15 to 13 to 7 (this week).
- This is the 71st week that the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- San Diego State entered the top-25 in both the AP and Coaches polls on Dec. 9 at No. 25 and No. 24, respectively. It was the first time since Feb. 23, 2015, the team had been ranked by the AP.
- The Aztecs have been ranked as high No. 4 (Jan. 24, 2011).
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight polls (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Prior to this season, the last time the Aztecs were ranked in the Coaches Poll was March 9, 2015.

BEST EVER?

- Having completed a perfect regular-season non-conference campaign for just the fourth time in school history and second time in the last 89 seasons, comparisons can be made between this season and the 2010-11 and 2013-14 teams that advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16.
- In comparison, the 2019-20 squad appears to have the lead in accomplishments at this point in the season. It is worth noting that the 2013-14 squad posted a road win at Kansas on Jan. 5.

STREAKING

- San Diego State has a couple of win streaks on the line Saturday. Among those:
 - **16-game winning streak** - Longest active streak in the nation... 3rd longest in school history... Longest of the Dutcher era... Previous two winning streaks that went longer resulted in NCAA Sweet 16 seasons.
 - **8-game homecourt win streak** - San Diego State has won eight in a row at home and is 17-1 in its last 18 games at Viejas Arena. Other streaks not on the line Saturday:
 - **8-game road/neutral win streak** - Most road/neutral wins without a loss in the nation this season... The fourth longest win streak in school history... Longest road/neutral win streak for the Aztecs in eight years.
 - **12-game regular season non-conference win streak** - This is the third longest win streak in school history.

NET NATIONAL RANKING

- The NCAA announced its first NET (NCAA Evaluation Tool) rankings on Monday, Dec. 16, and San Diego State slotted comfortably at No. 3, behind only Ohio State (No. 1) and Kansas (No. 2).
- Since its initial rankings, the Aztecs, as of Jan. 9, 2020, have been No. 1 for 18 days (including 17 days in a row from 12/22/19 to 1/7/20), No. 2 for four days and No. 3 for three days.
- The NET replaced RPI last year as the primary sorting tool for evaluating teams during the season. NET relies on game results, strength of schedule, location, scoring margin, net offensive and defensive efficiency, and the quality of wins and losses to create its rankings.

...AND THEN THERE WERE FOUR...THREE...TWO

- ▶ When the season started on Nov. 5, all 353 schools that compete at the Division I level were undefeated.
- ▶ After games on Jan. 1, there were two Division I schools that remained unbeaten (San Diego State and Auburn).
- ▶ According to KenPom, which rates SDSU No. 15, the Aztecs have the best chance to remain unbeaten for the remainder of the year.
- ▶ Staying with the KenPom rankings, SDSU will be favored in every game for the rest of the regular season.
- ▶ SDSU's 16-0 start is the second-best start to a season, trailing only 20 straight to start the 2010-11 season.
- ▶ San Diego State's 16-game winning streak is the longest in the nation this year.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons and has a NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 143-20 home record, winning 87.7 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2019-20 season underway, here are a few statistics to keep an eye on.

- ▶ In its last 235 home games, SDSU has compiled a 206-29 mark, including 118-16 against conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- ▶ Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, the Aztecs are 138-19 at home, including a 56-8 record in conference home contests during that stretch.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 49-7 in their last 56 conference home games.

NEXT SIGNPOST IS 1,000 POINTS

- ▶ San Diego State has one player who is on the precipice of the 1,000 career-points plateau in **Matt Mitchell**.
- ▶ Mitchell, a junior forward began 2019-20 with 695 points, and after totaling 180 in the first 16 games, is now 125 from the milestone.
- ▶ If Mitchell continues to score at his career pace (10.5 points per game), he will pass 1,000-career points in the team's regular-season home finale vs. Colorado State (Feb. 25).
- ▶ When Mitchell reaches 1,000-career points, he will be the 34th Aztec in program history to reach quadruple digits. He will be the third player in as many years to reach 1,000-points in an Aztecs uniform (Jeremy Hemsley passed 1,000 points in 2018 and finished his career on The Mesa in 2019 with 1,392 points & Malik Pope reached 1,000 points, finishing with 1,111, in his senior season of 2018).

SERIES HISTORY vs. BOISE STATE

- ▶ The game between San Diego State and Boise State will mark the 20th in the series.
- ▶ The Aztecs hold a five-game edge over the Broncos in the all-time series, 12-7, and the squads have split the last eight meetings. San Diego State has controlled the games played on its home court (6-2), losing games in 2015 & 2016. In games played in Boise, SDSU is 3-5, and has dropped the last three meetings.
- ▶ The Broncos ended longest home court winning streak in San Diego State basketball history. The 29-game run began on Nov. 20, 2013 and was snapped with a 56-46 victory on Feb. 28, 2015.
- ▶ In the eight meetings in San Diego, the Aztecs have won six w/ an average margin of victory of 5.0 ppg, in the Broncos wins in that time frame their average margin of victory is 6.5 ppg and only twice has the winning margin exceeded 10 points. During the series, 14 of the games have been decided by 10 points or less. The Aztecs largest margin of victory in the series was a 19-point win (87-68) in the quarterfinal round of the 2017 Mountain West Tournament. Boise State's best performance was last season in an 88-64 decision in Boise.
- ▶ **Matt Mitchell** averages 10.8 points and 4.0 rebounds in his four games against Boise State. The junior has connected on 16-of-36 field goals (44.4 percent), is 10-of-11 (90.9 percent) from the charity stripe, has five steals and a 2.33 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- ▶ **Nathan Mensah** averages 7.0 points, on 6-of-11 from the floor (54.5 percent) and grabs 5.5 rebounds per game against Boise State.

SAN DIEGO — Devin Watson paced San Diego State with 19 points, Jalen McDaniels added 18 and teammates Matt Mitchell and Nathan Mensah also scored in double figures as the Aztecs beat Boise State, 71-65, on Saturday.

SDSU (16-9, 8-4 Mountain West) won for the sixth time in its last seven outings and ran its home conference winning streak to 12 games in splitting the season series with the Broncos (11-15, 6-7).

Earlier this year Boise State embarrassed SDSU with a 24-point win in the conference opener, was led by Justinian Jessop's 19 points.

SDSU, after a sluggish first half, went ahead 45-35 with 14 minutes remaining when Watson hit his second three-pointer in three minutes, with his two free throws separating his long-range shots. The Aztecs outscored the Broncos 14-2 over a four-minute span to enjoy their biggest cushion of the game.

The Broncos mounted a few charges at the Aztecs, but SDSU countered them by handling the ball better and improving its aim.

Boise State pulled to within four points with 45 seconds to play on RJ Williams' put-back and then a free throw by Pat Dembley, who replaced an injured Williams. Jessop's three-pointer later sliced it to 68-65 before Watson's free throw helped seal the win.

Boise State bolted to a 5-0 lead as it was clear the Aztecs were in for an uneven first half. They would take a one-point lead some five minutes in but then they went nearly five more minutes before converting another field goal.

SDSU missed on nine of its initial 13 shots from the floor. Twelve minutes into the game the Aztecs had more turnovers (six) than field goals (four). McDaniels was among those misfiring, hitting but one of his first six shots.

But the Broncos couldn't take advantage with the Aztecs staying close thanks to their work at the free-throw line, sinking six of their first seven attempts. When McDaniels, who paced the Aztecs with eight first-half points, sank his second straight shot SDSU took the lead, 23-22, three minutes before halftime.

Boise State went on 6-0 run as again the Aztecs were sloppy with the basketball, with Jessup's three-pointer pushing the Broncos ahead 29-24 before they exited with a four-point advantage.

In the opening 20 minutes, SDSU was 9 of 25 (36 percent) with 10 turnovers, which is more than it had in the entirety of two of its last four games.

They planned ahead to deal with the 7,220-foot elevation, which can quickly sap a player's strength. They had no intention of being upset by the Wyoming Cowboys, who have beaten ranked Aztecs teams before, but not this night.

Malachi Flynn scored 19 points, Yanni Wetzell added 17 and the the Aztecs beat Wyoming 72-52 on Wednesday night to remain one of the nation's two undefeated teams.

San Diego State (16-0, 5-0 Mountain West) continued its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time, finishing a school-record 34-3.

Jordan Schakel added 11 points for the Aztecs, whose 16-game winning streak is the longest in the country. San Diego State and Auburn are the nation's only undefeated teams. Auburn beat Vanderbilt on Wednesday night to improve to 14-0.

To combat the elevation, coach Brian Dutcher had the Aztecs return home Sunday after winning at Utah State on Saturday night. They then took a charter flight to Wyoming on Tuesday night.

"I thought a couple of our guys looked tired here in the first half and they were winded," Dutcher said. "It's hard playing at altitude. And so I'm not one of those coaches who tries to say it's in your head. No, it's not in your head. I know what it is."

The plan worked. San Diego State was a little sloppy early and let Wyoming get within three points on Hunter Maldonado's 3-pointer with just less than eight minutes left in the first half.

San Diego State then closed the half on a 14-6 run to take a 32-21 lead. Wetzell grabbed Flynn's missed 3 for a dunk and then fed Adam Seiko for a layup. Schakel hit two 3-pointers while Seiko and Flynn each added a bucket.

"It's a matter of coming and executing," said Wetzell, a graduate transfer from Vanderbilt. "We don't think too much about the record, we don't think about the ranking. We just try to come hard and play every day.

"We can't take anyone lightly with the situation that we've put ourselves in, in a Top 10 ranking," the big New Zealander added. "We know everyone's going to give us their best effort."

San Diego State lost the last two times it played in Laramie while in the Top 25, 68-62 as the fifth-ranked team on Feb. 11, 2014, and 58-45 as No. 15 on Jan. 19, 2013.

Flynn, Schakel and KJ Feagin each hit a 3-pointer in the first four minutes of the second half to push the lead to 47-30.

Hunter Maldonado scored 18 points for Wyoming (5-11, 0-5), the conference's last-place team. Hunter Thompson added 15 for the Cowboys, who lost their third straight.

- ▶ San Diego State won just its 11 game in 38 tries in Laramie.

FLYNN CRUISES PASSED 1,000-CAREER POINTS

- ▶ Junior guard Malachi Flynn began the game versus Fresno State (1/1) eight points away from reaching 1,000 for his career.
- ▶ With a layup, which put the Aztecs up 37-27 at the 12:24 mark in the second half, Flynn reached 1,000 career points. He added eight more in the game to finish with 16 and enters the team's game at Utah State with 1,008-career points.
- ▶ Flynn scored 302 points as a freshman and 489 points as a sophomore at Washington State. He enters the game against Utah Stat with 217 points with the Aztecs this season.

MULTI-TEAM EVENT SUCCESS

- ▶ Since the start of the 2010-11 season San Diego State has competed in 12 Multi-Team Events (MTE).
- ▶ San Diego State has played 32 games in those events and has compiled a 27-5 record.
- ▶ San Diego State has been crowned champion in seven of the 11 MTEs its competed in since 2010-11, including the 2019 Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational late last month.

FLYNN NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Malachi Flynn, a junior transfer from Washington State, was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 1. In three games, Flynn hit 19-of-40 from the floor (.475) averaging 20.0 points to go along with 3.7 assists, 2.7 rebounds, 2.3 steals and had a 1.6:1 assist to turnover ratio. In two games in the Las Vegas Invitational, he totaled 49 points on 15-of-27 shooting, including six threes, and had seven rebounds, seven assists and five steals. The Tacoma, Wash., native, led SDSU in scoring all three games and was the overall leading scorer in two of three contests the team played that week.

- ▶ **Trailing by nine points starting the second half against Iowa in the LVI Championship game, Flynn went 8-of-13 from the field, 3-of-7 from distance and 9-of-9 from the line, scoring 28 points in the half, en route to being named the tournament's MVP.**

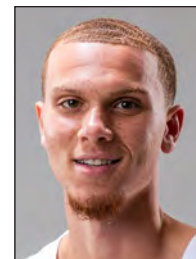

Third Season • 21st Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, begins his third season as head coach. Dutcher completed his first year at the helm in 2017-18, following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Last season, Dutcher guided San Diego State to a 21-13 record which included multiple victories over nationally ranked Nevada. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first two seasons and for the second year in a row directed his squad to the championship game of the Mountain West Championship tournament.

In his first season, Dutcher led the Aztecs to the 2018 Mountain West tournament title and the NCAA tournament, the program's first appearance in three seasons. He was the only first-year head coach in the NCAA tournament and SDSU ultimately finished the year with a 22-11 record.

Over the course of his 20-year career at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the post-season 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 14 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next year, SDSU was an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tourney, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, SDSU won three games and qualified for the NIT semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

In his final season as associate head coach/head coach in waiting (2016-17), San Diego State posted a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan

Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.

SAN DIEGO -- The first 20 minutes of San Diego State's season was a thing of beauty. Jordan Schakel and newcomer Malachi Flynn scored 15 points apiece and Nathan Mensah had 11 rebounds for San Diego State, which ran past Texas Southern 77-42 Tuesday night.

San Diego State led the entire game and was up 40-10 with just less than four minutes to play in the first half. It was 48-13 at halftime, after SDSU made nine 3-pointers and outrebounded Texas Southern 30-16.

SDSU didn't keep up the intensity in the second half. "Then the second half was just tough to get through," Dutcher said. "We had 10 assists at half then we only had two assists in the second half. I think the thing that would have made it easier is if we'd made some free throws. Games like this, you make your free throws the lead stays what it is, but we missed so many free throws."

Overall, though, Dutcher was pleased. "This is a good team, a good group of guys that appears to be able to defend at a pretty high level. Our defense has been pretty solid and at the end of the day that's how we're going to win, with our defense and our rebounding."

The Tigers of the SWAC didn't crack 20 points until Yahuza Rasas made a layup with 11 minutes to go to make it 57-21.

Texas Southern coach Johnny Jones was ejected after being called for his second technical of the game, with 7:14 to go.

The Aztecs won the opening tipoff and Schakel drained the first of his four 3-pointers in the first half to get the rout started. The junior guard made another shot from behind the arc two minutes later. Flynn's first points with the Aztecs came on a corner 3 for a 15-6 lead. Freshman Keshad Johnson's first points also came on a 3 to give the Aztecs their 40-10 lead.

"It felt pretty good," Schakel said of the hot start. "I was glad that it happened in the first couple minutes to get us off to a good start. I think we played well in the first half. It's always devastating when you're able to make 3s at a high clip like that. We have a lot of good shooters on this team and when we move the ball like that it's bound to happen."

SAN DIEGO -- First a win at BYU and then finally, a win against pesky Grand Canyon. It's been a big five-day stretch for San Diego State, which dominated inside and outside against Grand Canyon to win 86-61 Tuesday night. Malachi Flynn and Nathan Mensah each scored 14 points.

KJ Feagin added 13 points for SDSU (3-0), which was coming off a big 76-71 win at former conference rival BYU on Saturday. Grand Canyon (0-3) had won its previous two games against the Aztecs in San Diego, plus the most recent game in the series, a 76-72 victory in Phoenix on Dec. 7, 2016.

"Coach Dutch (Brian Dutcher) was really on edge coming into this game," Feagin said. "I knew he wanted this win. Coach Dave (Velasquez) talked about how we'd never beat them before and being a part of the team that got the win at BYU, now let's turn around and get Grand Canyon, so I'm happy that we accomplished both missions."

Dutcher said the win was "very satisfying. We knew that we'd lost, since we've been here, Coach (Steve) Fisher and I, twice to Grand Canyon, both important, critical games. At the time it doesn't seem that way but when the season finishes up you have that loss on your record and we knew it hurt us. We wanted to come out and play at a high level because we knew they were a very good opponent."

Dutcher succeeded Fisher as head coach after the 2016-17 season. Leading 15-14, SDSU got hot from inside and outside and raced to a 30-18 lead. Matt Mitchell hit a 3-pointer and a fall-away jumper during the big run.

The Aztecs twice hit consecutive 3-pointers in the first half. Feagin and Mitchell did it early on and then Adam Seiko and Keshad Johnson did it to give SDSU a 36-22 lead with six minutes before halftime.

GCU went scoreless for the final five minutes of the first half as SDSU jumped to a 40-24 lead.

"Offensively when you have 35 baskets and 25 assists, you're playing the game the right way," Dutcher said. "Overall, offensively we shared the ball as well as we have all year. We ended up outrebounding them for the game, which pleased me."

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State was a second away from its first loss when Malachi Flynn let fly with a long 3-pointer. It found nothing but net, sending Viejas Arena into a frenzy and continuing the Aztecs' remarkable start.

Flynn hit a 3-pointer with nine-tenths of a second left to give the cold-shooting Aztecs a thrilling 59-57 victory over San Jose on Sunday for the Aztecs' first 10-0 start in nine seasons.

SDSU (2-0 Mountain West Conference) is off to its best start since opening 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11. That team finished 34-3 after reaching the Sweet 16 for the first time.

But Matt Mitchell hit two free throws with 41.3 seconds to go. Knight missed two free throws and Mitchell rebounded KJ Feagin's missed 3-pointer with about 10 seconds left. After an SDSU timeout, the Aztecs retained possession following a held ball. Jordan Schakel passed to Flynn for his big shot.

Mitchell finished with 13 points, Nathan Mensah 12 points and 12 rebounds, and Schakel 11 points.

Knight had 15 for the Spartans while Ivey had 13 and Ralph Agee 12.

The Aztecs shot just 32% and let the Spartans pull within four points three times midway through the second half.

The Spartans got consecutive 3-pointers by Knight and Christian Anigwe to pull to 52-49 and silence the crowd with 4:18 to go.

SAN DIEGO -- No. 20 San Diego State got the laughter it needed to ease back into action after a 10-day layoff for finals.

Yanni Wetzell scored 17 points and the Aztecs beat NAIA San Diego Christian 92-48 on Wednesday night to remain undefeated. It was the 13th-largest margin of victory in school history.

SDSU (11-0) hadn't played since beating San Jose State by two points by home on Dec. 8. The Aztecs were playing for the first time since jumping into The Associated Press Top 25. They moved up five spots Monday despite not playing last week.

The Aztecs are off to their best start since opening 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard in 2010-11, when they reached the Sweet 16 for the first time and finished 34-3. They are one of four remaining undefeated teams.

The Aztecs used it to get their legs back after the long layoff and to prepare for Saturday's game against Utah at Staples Center in Los Angeles. That's the last of four big non-conference games the Aztecs are hoping will bolster their resume for an at-large NCAA Tournament bid in case they don't win the Mountain West Conference tournament and the automatic bid that comes with it.

SDSU has already won at BYU, and beat Creighton and Iowa to win the Las Vegas Invitational.

SDSU had 24 assists, led by Feagin with eight. The Aztecs had a lot of slam dunks and worked on their press against the outmanned Hawks.

Bryce Parsons gave the Hawks a 2-0 lead before the Aztecs went on a 14-0 run. The Hawks pulled within single digits before SDSU used an 8-0 run to take control for good. Wetzell had another slam and a free throw, and Matt Mitchell converted a three-point play for a 27-16 lead. SDSU led 45-27 at halftime.

San Diego Christian's Marc Combs scored all 14 of his points in the first half.

LOGAN, Utah -- Stout defense is a cornerstone of success for San Diego State this season. It certainly helped the No. 13 Aztecs extend their unbeaten start in a tough road environment.

San Diego State made six straight baskets to stay in front after the Aggies started to hit shots. Trey Pulliam capped the stretch with a jumper to give the Aztecs their largest first-half lead at 34-23.

Many of their first-half baskets came after executing high ball screens to perfection. San Diego State forced Utah State to defend late into the shot clock on possession after possession.

The Aztecs eventually built a 16-point lead early in the second half, going up 53-37 when Jordan Schakel buried a 3-pointer to cap a string of three straight San Diego State baskets.

Diogo Brito and Merrill nailed successive 3s to spark a 12-3 run. Queta finished it off with a dunk that cut the Aztecs' lead to 56-49.

Mitchell scored back-to-back baskets to keep the Aggies from getting closer. They helped San Diego State open a 63-50 lead with 5:41 left.

San Diego State outrebounded Utah State 34-30 and had four players with at least five rebounds. Mitchell led the way with a team-high seven. The Aztecs have finished with more rebounds than 11 of their 15 opponents this season.

LARAMIE, Wyo. -- The seventh-ranked and undefeated San Diego State Aztecs were ready for whatever awaited them in Laramie.

They planned ahead to deal with the 7,220-foot elevation, which can sap a player's strength. They had no intention of being upset by the Wyoming Cowboys, who have beaten ranked Aztecs teams before, but not this night.

Malachi Flynn scored 19 points, Yanni Wetzell added 17 and the the Aztecs beat Wyoming 72-52 on Wednesday night to remain one of the nation's two undefeated teams.

San Diego State (16-0, 5-0 Mountain West) continued its hottest start since 2010-11, when it opened 20-0 behind Kawhi Leonard and reached the Sweet 16 for the first time, finishing a school-record 34-3.

Jordan Schakel added 11 points for the Aztecs, whose 16-game winning streak is the longest in the country. San Diego State and Auburn are the nation's only undefeated teams. Auburn beat Vanderbilt on Wednesday night to improve to 14-0.

To combat the elevation, coach Brian Dutcher had the Aztecs return home Sunday after winning at Utah State on Saturday night. They then took a charter flight to Wyoming on Tuesday night.

The plan worked. San Diego State was a little sloppy early and let Wyoming get within three points on Hunter Maldonado's 3-pointer with just less than eight minutes left in the first half.

San Diego State then closed the half on a 14-6 run to take a 32-21 lead. Wetzell grabbed Flynn's missed 3 for a dunk and then fed Adam Seiko for a layup. Schakel hit two 3-pointers while Seiko and Flynn each added a bucket.

San Diego State lost the last two times it played in Laramie while in the Top 25, 68-62 as the fifth-ranked team on Feb. 11, 2014, and 58-45 as No. 15 on Jan. 19, 2013.

Flynn, Schakel and KJ Feagin each hit a 3-pointer in the first four minutes of the second half to push the lead to 47-30.

Hunter Maldonado scored 18 points for Wyoming (5-11, 0-5), the conference's last-place team. Hunter Thompson added 15 for the Cowboys, who lost their third straight.
