## OFF THE TOP (through games of Wed., Nov. 25)

- Having recorded a season opening victory for the eighth consecutive campaign and secured a victory in its 16th straight home lid lifter, on Saturday afternoon San Diego State plays its second game in three days against UC Irvine.
- The Aztecs are playing just 44 1/2-hours after posting a 73-58 victory over No. 22 UCLA on Wednesday. Seniors **Matt Mitchell** and **Jordan Schakel** each tallied 15 points in the Aztec win.
- San Diego State and UC Irvine are meeting for the 18th time but the first since 1997. The two schools separated by 82 miles have not played during the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era (est. 1999-00). The Aztecs own a 10-7 lead in the series.
- Current win streaks on the line Friday: 13-game regular-season non-conference win streak, 10-game win streak in games played in November, 8-game non-conference homecourt win streak, 7-game win streak against teams from California and a 2-game homecourt win streak (15-1 in its last 16 home games).
- The Aztecs have won their last four matchups with teams from the Big West Conference (with two of those wins coming by exactly one point). The last time San Diego State faced a Big West opponent was Dec. 19, 2011, when SDSU defeated UC Riverside, 80-55, at Viejas.
- The Aztecs 15-point win over UCLA was its largest since 1939 and gives SDSU a two-game winning streak over the Bruins for the first time since 1940. It matches UCLA's largest margin of defeat in a non-conference game since losing at Cincinnati, 93-64, on Dec. 19, 2018.
- San Diego State's defense was on full display Wednesday, limiting UCLA to 58 points (41 in the final 34:03) and 39.5 percent shooting from the field while forcing 15 turnovers. The Aztecs improve to 49-3 in the Brian Dutcher era with 27 straight victories when the Aztecs hold their opponent to 40 percent field goal shooting or less.
- In the Brian Dutcher era, since the start of the 2018-19 season, San Diego State owns a 6-4 record against AP Top 25 teams. The Aztecs are seventh nationally in winning record against AP Top 25 teams during that span.
- San Diego State is coming off a magical season that saw the Aztecs win their first 26 games of the season en route to a 30-2 record, a Mountain West Conference regular season title (record 12th league crown) and a climb to No. 4 in the Associated Press poll for five weeks before ending the campaign at No. 6. SDSU was the only team in the nation not to lose a road game in '19-20, finishing the year 11-0 away from Viejas Arena.
- The *USA Today* National Coach of the Year last year, **Brian Dutcher** begins his fourth season at the helm of the San Diego State men's basketball program. He has an overall record of 74-26 in three seasons and has led SDSU to the conference championship game in each of his three seasons. In 2018, he was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament and in 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat. In addition, Dutcher is the first Aztecs' men's basketball coach to win 20+ games in each of his first three seasons.
- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in seniors forward **Matt Mitchell** (12.2 pts., 4.8 rebs., 1.7 asst. in 2019-20) and guard **Jordan Schakel** (10.0 pts., 3.4 rebs, 43.6 percent three-point shooting) and junior forward **Nathan Mensah** (6.9 pts., 6.8 rebs., 1.6 blks.). Mitchell and Schakel played in all 32 games (Mitchell started the final 19 and Schakel started 31) with Mensah appearing 13 times, all starts, before in injury prematurely ended his season.

- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 12.

- SDSU's 17 MW wins in 2019-20 are the most in MW history.

- The Aztecs are picked to finish in first place in the preseason poll of the Mountain West media. SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is also the 12th time in the last 16 seasons San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 12 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 16 years.

## AZTEC PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- San Diego State has been picked to increase its conference-record number of Mountain West titles to 13 this year by nearly every media outlet. The Aztecs were picked to win the league by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West, *Lindy's Sports*, *Blue Ribbon Yearbook*, ESPN, Joe Lunardi, Myron Medcalf, John Gasaway and Jeff Borzello and Jon Rothstein.
- Senior forward **Matt Mitchell** has been the player most honored when the preseason predictors talk about San Diego State, he has been named first-team preseason All-Mountain West by the media who regularly cover the league, *Lindy's*, *Blue Ribbon* and John Rothstein. CBS Sports included him in the top-101 players (No. 61) and *Lindy's* ranked him at No. 124 in its top-150. In addition, Mitchell has been included on the preseason watch list for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award.
- Senior guard **Terrell Gomez** was selected the Newcomer of the Year by *Blue Ribbon* and *Lindy's* predicted he would be a second-team All-MW selection, No. 131 among its top-150 as well as, among newcomers in the league, the most impactful newcomer, the best shooter, No. 1 signing coup and having the best shot at earning all-conference honors.
- Jordan Schakel**, a senior guard, was selected a third-team All-MW performer and the best shooter in the Mountain West Conference by *Lindy's*.
- Freshman guard **Lamont Butler** was named the best playmaker/passing coming into the league by *Lindy's*.
- Assistant Coach **Dave Velasquez** was named one of the top-25 assistant coaches ready to lead their own program by The Athletic.
- Though not ranked in either the preseason AP or Coaches polls, San Diego State is receiving votes in both and is the only Mountain West program who is currently doing so.
- With the exception of Gonzaga, every team in both the AP and Coaches preseason polls are members of Power-5 conferences. So, *The Athletic* published its rankings of non-Power-5 programs and San Diego State was ranked No. 4 on that list.

## AZTECS PREDICTED TO WIN 13TH MOUNTAIN WEST TITLE

- San Diego State has won a Mountain West-record 12 titles in men's basketball (seven regular season & five tournament), four more than its closest competitor, and nearly every preseason prediction has the Aztecs picking up its 13th crown in 2020-21.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is also the 12th time in the last 16 years the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the preseason poll. The Aztecs have garnered at least one first-place vote in the preseason poll in six of the last seven years.

## MATT MITCHELL...DID YOU KNOW?

With 22 points against New Mexico on Feb. 11, 2020, senior **Matt Mitchell** became the 34th player in Aztec men's basketball to reach the 1,000-point career plateau.

### BUT....DID YOU KNOW?

Mitchell enters the 2020-21 season on the precipice of even more rarefied Aztecs territory. He is on the verge of becoming just the third player in the 99-year history of the program to amass 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals in his Aztec career.

Having already surpassed 1,000 points last season, Mitchell needs 73 rebounds, 25 assists and 5 steals to reach each of the target numbers.

When he does, he will join Trey Kell (2015-18) and Winston Shepard (2013-16) as the only Aztecs to ever post those numbers wearing an SDSU uniform.

## CHASING AZTEC HISTORY

Senior **Jordan Schakel** entered the 2020-21 season on the precipice of Aztec history.

He has the opportunity to become just the second player in program history to amass at least 200 three-point field goals and to shoot over .400 from beyond the arc for his career.

At the start of this season, Schakel has 142 threes (No. 8 on the program's career list), knocked down three against UCLA and now needs 55 more to become the fifth Aztec to make 200 for his career.

Schakel has shot .412 (145-of-352) in his three seasons and the 2020-21 opener, on The Mesa. But in the last two years has made 115-of-269 (.428) threes, including a career-best .436 (71-of-163) last season.

If he achieves the mark, he will join Tony Ross (1987-89) as the only Aztec to reach those combined numbers. Ross ranks No. 2 in made three pointers (270) and No. 1 in three-point field goal percentage at .458.

- In addition to the MW media, *Lindy's*, *Blue Ribbon*, ESPN, ESPN's Joe Lunardi, Myron Medcalf, Jeff Borzello and John Gasaway as well as College Hoops Today's Jon Rothstein have predicted the Aztecs will win the MW.
- Complete Mountain West media preseason predicted order of finish in located in the column on page 5.

## TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State spent 14 consecutive week in the AP Top-25 Poll last season, the program's second longest single season consecutive week streak trailing only the 2010-11 squad which spent 19 straight weeks ranked in the top-25.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight polls (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Reaching No. 4 in the 2019-20 season, the Aztecs spent five weeks there establishing program records for consecutive weeks at that ranking and for the most weeks, in a season, at that rank.
- The Aztecs debuted at No. 25 on Dec. 9, 2019 and then went to 20 to 15 to 13 to 7 to 7 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 5 to 5 and finished at No. 6.
- San Diego State entered the top-25 in both the AP and Coaches polls on Dec. 9, 2019 at No. 25 and No. 24, respectively. It was the first time since Feb. 23, 2015, the team had been ranked in the AP poll.
- In total, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll for 79 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- Prior to the 2019-20 season, the last time the Aztecs had been ranked in the Coaches Poll was March 9, 2015.
- Prior to last season, the Aztecs had been ranked in the top-5 of the AP poll four times. In 2019-20 they were ranked in the top-5 10 straight weeks.
- From the start of the 2010-11 season to the end of the 2019-20 season, San Diego State's 79 appearances in the AP poll are the most of any school in California and which also ranks as the 21st most nationally. The California program with the second most appearances in that time frame is UCLA with 45 and Saint Mary's 39 are the third most. Other than those three, no other men's basketball team in California has appeared in the AP poll more than 12 times.

## SEASON DEBUTS

- San Diego State opened its 100th season of basketball and the 51st at the Division I level on Nov. 25 with a 73-58 victory over No. 22/21 UCLA.
- In 100 years of basketball at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 67-33 (.670) in season opening games.
- In the 51st season of Division I basketball at San Diego State and the Aztecs are 32-19 (.627) in D I season-opening games.
- San Diego State has won its last 16 home openers, regardless of if the game was the season opener.
- The Aztecs have won eight consecutive season openers, regardless of location.

## CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'

- San Diego State opens the 2020-21 season hosting a pair of in state foes in UCLA and UC Irvine and has already beaten the Bruins 73-58 on Wednesday night and is scheduled to play a total of six regular season games against California Division I schools. In the history of the program, SDSU is now a combined 17-23 against UCLA and UC Irvine.
- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 109-33 (.768) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but three of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 80 home games against the those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 70-11 (.864).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 443-323 (.578) overall, and SDSU has a winning record against 19 of those 24 programs.

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 157-21 home record, winning 88.2 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2020-21 season underway here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 183 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 161-22 mark, including a 77-9 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 114-17 at home, including a 52-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (43-6 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 48-9 in their last 57 non-conference home games.

## MORE HOME COOKING

- San Diego State is 22-2 in its last 24 home games dating back to Jan. 1, 2019.
- San Diego State ended the 2019-20 season 14-1 at home, with an average scoring margin of +16.0. Of the 15 home games, 12 were decided by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs 13-game home court win streak, snapped on Feb. 22, was tied for the eighth-longest in school history and longest since the school-record 29-game win streak from Nov. 20, 2013 and ended Feb. 28, 2015.
- The Aztecs are 22-2 in its 24 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

## FLYNN TAKEN BY RAPTORS AT NO. 29 IN NBA DRAFT

- Former San Diego State guard Malachi Flynn, was selected by the Toronto Raptors in the first round (29th selection) of the 2020 NBA Draft.
- Flynn is the second Aztec selected in the first round (Kawhi Leonard, San Antonio Spurs, 2011) since Head Coach Brian Dutcher came to San Diego State prior to the 1999-2000 season, and he is the third Aztecs overall to be selected in the first round (Michael Cage, Los Angeles Clippers, 1984).

- During his single season on The Mesa, Flynn led SDSU in points (564), points per game (17.6), field goals (184), field goal attempts (417), three-point field goals (76), three-point field goal attempts (204), free throws (120), free throw attempts (140), assists (163), assists per game (5.1) and steals (56), steals per game (1.8), assist-to-turnover ratio (2.86:1), minutes (1,072) and minutes per game (33.5). In addition, he was third on the team in rebounds (143) and rebounds per game (4.5).
- Following the 2019-20 campaign, Flynn became the most decorated Aztec in a single season. He was named a consensus second-team All-American after being recognized by The Associated Press, National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), United States Basketball Writers of America (USBWA) and The Sporting News. With that honor, he joined SDSU Hall of Famers Michael Cage and Kawhi Leonard as the third consensus All-American in program history. In addition, he garnered second-team All-American honors from CBS Sports, NBC Sports and The Athletic and first-team distinction from Sports Illustrated and STADIUM. He was the Most Valuable Player of both the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational and Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, an NABC first-team All-District 17 and USBWA All-District IX performer.
- Flynn was second Aztec to be named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team as well as a finalist for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year, Naismith National Player of the Year, and Lute Olson National Player of the Year Awards. He was a first-team All-Mountain West performer in both the coaches and media polls. He earned the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, inclusion on the Mountain West All-Defensive Team in the coaches poll, and inclusion on the Mountain West All-Tournament Team. In the media poll he was Mountain West Newcomer of the Year in addition to twice garnering Mountain West Player of the Week honors and he capped his junior year being named the Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year.

### SERIES HISTORY VS. UC IRVINE

- When the Aztecs play UC Irvine it will mark the 18th time in the series.
- San Diego State holds a three-game edge over the Anteaters in the all-time series, 10-7, and have won five of the last seven. SDSU owns a 6-3 lead in games played in San Diego, including wins in three of the last four meetings. In games played in Irvine, the teams have split eight meetings. The programs have never met on a neutral court.
- In San Diego State's six wins over Irvine in San Diego, the average margin of victory is 15.2 points and in its three losses the margin of defeat has been 4.3 points.
- The Aztecs started the series in 1968 by dropping the first two meetings. As the series progressed, SDSU went on to win five of the next six matchups, going up to 1978. The teams then split the next four game, between 1982 and 1988. Since the 1989 season, San Diego State has taken three of the last five, including the last meeting, a 69-66 win in the 1997-98 campaign.
- Brian Dutcher has never faced UC Irvine as a head coach nor as an assistant coach.

**IRVINE, Calif.** (LA Times) - Both teams nearly ran out of players, and UC Irvine certainly ran out of time in a 69-66 loss to San Diego State on Saturday night at Irvine.

Still, even though Jason Flowers missed a three-point shot with four seconds left, Irvine Coach Pat Douglass was almost smiling afterward. "We didn't get beat by 25 points," Douglass said. "They had a couple lucky shots that went in. I can't be disconsolate with the effort."

Not in the final five minutes, anyway. The Anteaters (1-5) came from 12 points down and had clear shots at winning baskets in the final minute.

Flowers, a walk-on, had the last one. He played only one minute and was only in the game because four Irvine players fouled out, but picked up a deflected pass in the corner and threw up a line-drive three-pointer that hit the front of the rim. Flowers grabbed the long rebound and attempted to find an open Irvine player, but threw the ball away.

With that, San Diego State (3-4) survived a furious rally. The Aztecs led, 59-47, with 4 minutes 56 seconds left, but the Anteaters' Junior Bond made consecutive three-pointers to start an 11-1 run.

Irvine's Adam Stetson made a three-pointer and was fouled with 33 seconds left. His free throw cut the Aztec lead to 66-64.

It was 67-66 after Malachi Edmond's layup with 21 seconds left. San Diego State's David Kaplansky, a walk-on, made two free throws with 13 seconds left.

The Aztecs, who have nine players on their roster, were without Stephen Clark--who was studying for finals--and lost Josko Visnjik for part of the game with a bruised shoulder.

### LAST TIME OUT

**SAN DIEGO STATE 73, No. 22/21 UCLA 58**

**Nov. 25, 2020 | Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena (San Diego, Calif.) | San Diego State Thanksgiving Classic**

**SAN DIEGO** - Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel scored 15 points apiece and SDSU used a suffocating defense and three-point shots to humble 22nd-ranked UCLA 73-58 on Wednesday night in the season opener for both teams.

Mitchell and Schakel hit threes early in the second half to open a 40-28 lead and the Aztecs dominated the rest of the way. Aguek Arop and Terrell Gomez scored 10 points each for San Diego State, which was 30-2 last season and expecting its highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament before it was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

UCLA, which played on SDSU's home court for the first time since December 1991, was without key players Jalen Hill and transfer Johnny Juzang. Chris Smith, the Bruins' only senior, committed his fourth foul midway through the second half and came out — and then fouled out with 4:47 to go. He scored 10 points, none after halftime. Jaime Jacquez Jr. had 17 points for UCLA, and Cody Riley added 14 points and 12 rebounds.

### TIP-INS

- The Aztecs have won consecutive games against the Bruins (for the first time since 1940 (Dec. 6-7) and have won two straight in the series after dropping the previous eight games.
- This marks the first time in school history that San Diego State has defeated a UCLA team that was ranked in the AP Top 25 Poll at the time of the game.

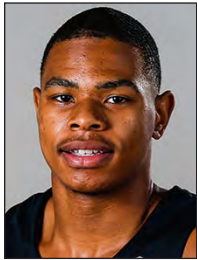

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Fourth Season • 22nd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fourth season as San Diego State head coach after three years in which he led the Aztecs to three Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th and 12th Mountain West crowns and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. He is the only coach in the 99-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first three seasons at the helm of the program, and over the summer signed a contract extension which will keep him on The Mesa through the 2025-26 season.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title, and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an

at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.

**SAN DIEGO (AP)** — Mick Cronin might not be so eager to bring UCLA back to San Diego State anytime soon after his short-handed Bruins were given a rude welcome by the deep, disruptive Aztecs coached by old friend Brian Dutcher.

Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel scored 15 points apiece and SDSU used a suffocating defense and 3-point shots to humble 22nd-ranked UCLA 73-58 on Wednesday night in the season opener for both teams.

Mitchell and Schakel hit 3s early in the second half to open a 40-28 lead and the Aztecs dominated the rest of the way at empty Viejas Arena. Aguek Arop and Terrell Gomez scored 10 points each for San Diego State, which was 30-2 last season and expecting its highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament before it was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

UCLA, which played on SDSU's home court for the first time since December 1991, was without key players Jalen Hill and transfer Johnny Juzang. Chris Smith, the Bruins' only senior, committed his fourth foul midway through the second half and came out — and then fouled out with 4:47 to go. He scored 10 points, none after halftime.

Jaime Jacquez Jr. had 17 points for UCLA, and Cody Riley added 14 points and 12 rebounds. The game was part of a multi-team event that also includes Pepperdine and UC Irvine. UCLA and SDSU had been scheduled to play in a bubble in Orlando, but it fell apart. Longtime pals Dutcher and Cronin quickly put together this event.

Mitchell and Schakel each hit three 3-pointers, and the Aztecs, picked to repeat as Mountain West Conference regular-season champions, went 9 of 23 from behind the arc.

The Bruins, who went 19-12 last year and were picked to win the Pac-12 this season, played well for the first eight minutes before SDSU's defense began to take its toll.

Mitchell hit a jumper to start an 8-0 run midway through the first half that gave the Aztecs a 23-19 lead. Joshua Tomiac made a jumper and fellow senior transfer Gomez hit two free throws before Nathan Mensah sank a baseline jumper.

UCLA ended a six-minute drought when Smith made a one-handed jumper.

Jacquez made a layup to pull the Bruins to 30-28 and was fouled, but missed the free throw. Arop hit a layup and two free throws in the final minute for a 34-28 halftime lead.

#### QUOTEABLE

"I just think we have great depth," Dutcher said. "We used a lot of guys, 10 guys, and we don't drop off much. This might be as deep a team as we've ever had. UCLA was short-handed. They were missing two players, potentially two starters, so I just think we wore them down. We picked them up full court the entire game and I think we just wore them down to the point where maybe they were on tired legs by the end of the game."

#### CROWD NOISE

Asked if his players were bothered by the faux crowd noise at usually raucous Viejas Arena, Cronin said: "The problem wasn't the crowd noise. The problem was San Diego State, their toughness, their execution."

#### BIG PICTURE

**UCLA:** Hill, a 6-10 swingman, has right knee tendinitis and is day-to-day. Juzang, a transfer from Kentucky, has a stress reaction in his right foot and isn't expected to play this week.

**San Diego State:** The Aztecs used their trademark tough defense during the first half to force UCLA into 10 turnovers and a scoring drought that allowed SDSU to take the lead.
