## OFF THE TOP (through games of Sunday, Nov. 29)

- After opening the season with a pair of comfortable victories over No. 22 UCLA, 73-58, and UC Irvine, 77-58, SDSU continues its four-game season-opening homestand on Wednesday against St. Katherine.
- San Diego State saw a major jump in both of the major polls, moving to No. 27 in the AP Top 25 Poll. The Aztecs spent the final 15 weeks in the poll last season, including the final 11 weeks in the top seven. SDSU climbed to No. 4 last season and ended the campaign ranked No. 6.
- San Diego State win streaks on the line Wednesday: 14-game win streak in non-conference regular-season, 11-game win streak in games played in November, nine-game win streak in non-conference home games, eight-game win streak against teams from California.
- San Diego State is 16-1 in its last 17 games played at Viejas Arena.
- On Monday, senior forward **Matt Mitchell** earned Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honor. Mitchell averaged 13.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 2.0 steals in the victories over No. 22 UCLA and UC Irvine.
- In the victory over the Bruins, Mitchell paced the Aztecs with 15 points, including three three-point field goals, two rebounds, two assists and two steals. In the victory over the Anteaters, Mitchell tallied 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals. It marked the eighth time in his career where he has scored in double figures with at least four rebounds while recording multiple assists and multiple steals (SDSU is 8-0 in those games).
- Sophomore forward **Keshad Johnson** scored a career-high 14 points against UC Irvine. The Aztecs improve to 20-0 in games in which he has played.
- San Diego State has forced 40 turnovers in its two games to date. That is tied for the 22nd most turnovers forced per game +20.0 and the Aztecs turnover margin of +10.0 per game is tied for 11th best nationally.
- San Diego State's 11.0 three-point field goals per game is tied for the 14th most nationally among teams that have played at least two games this season. Nine players have made a trey this season and three players have made at least four three-point field goals this season.
- San Diego State owns a 32-2 record since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the second best record nationally, trailing only Gonzaga's 33-2 mark.
- San Diego State is coming off a magical season that saw the Aztecs win their first 26 games of the season en route to a 30-2 record, a Mountain West Conference regular season title (record 12th league crown) and a climb to No. 4 in the Associated

- SDSU has advanced to postseason play in 12 of the last 14 seasons in which a champions was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 32 of last 33 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won 36 straight when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 11th nationally in winning percentage (.753) since

- the beginning of the 2010-11 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 12.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 11 appearances in its conference championship game are the second most in Division I.
- SDSU's 17 MW wins in 2019-20 are the most in MW history.

Press poll for five weeks before ending the campaign at No. 6. SDSU was the only team in the nation not to lose a road game in '19-20, finishing the year 11-0 away from Viejas Arena.

- The *USA Today* National Coach of the Year in 2019-20, **Brian Dutcher** begins his fourth season at the helm of the San Diego State men's basketball program. He has an overall record of 75-26 in three-plus seasons and has led SDSU to the conference championship game in each of his three seasons. In 2018, he was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament and in 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat. In addition, Dutcher is the first Aztecs' men's basketball coach to win 20+ games in each of his first three seasons.
- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in seniors forward **Matt Mitchell** (12.2 pts., 4.8 rebs., 1.7 asst. in 2019-20) and guard **Jordan Schakel** (10.0 pts., 3.4 rebs, 43.6 percent three-point shooting) and junior forward **Nathan Mensah** (6.9 pts., 6.8 rebs., 1.6 blks.). Mitchell and Schakel played in all 32 games (Mitchell started the final 19 and Schakel started 31) with Mensah appeared 13 times, all starts, before an injury prematurely ended his season.
- The Aztecs are picked to finish in first place in the preseason poll of the Mountain West media. SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is also the 12th time in the last 16 seasons San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 12 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 16 years.

### MITCHELL NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward Matt Mitchell was named the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 29. In sweeping both games last week, 73-58 over No. 22 UCLA and 77-58 versus UC Irvine, Mitchell averaged 13.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals to help improve the Aztecs record to 2-0 this year and 32-2 in its last 34 games.

Against UCLA, he was one of the team leaders with 15 points. He knocked down three triples, and added two rebounds, two assists and two steals. It was the 44th time in his career he made multiple three pointers in a game, and the 15th time since the start of last season (33 games at the time). The game was the 100th of Mitchell's Aztec career, and he became the 33rd player in program history to reach the milestone.

Versus UC Irvine, the Riverside, Calif., native, finished with 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals. He scored six points in the first half, with four coming in the final two minutes of the period as the Aztecs pried open a

## MATT MITCHELL...DID YOU KNOW?

With 22 points against New Mexico on Feb. 11, 2020, senior **Matt Mitchell** became the 34th player in Aztec men's basketball to reach the 1,000-point career plateau.

### BUT...DID YOU KNOW?

Mitchell enters the 2020-21 season on the precipice of even more rarefied Aztecs territory. He is on the verge of becoming just the third player in the 99-year history of the program to amass 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals in his Aztec career.

Having already surpassed 1,000 points last season, Mitchell needs 73 rebounds, 25 assists and 5 steals to reach each of the target numbers.

When he does, he will join Trey Kell (2015-18) and Winston Shepard (2013-16) as the only Aztecs to ever post those numbers wearing an SDSU uniform.

nine-point advantage at halftime en route to a 77-58 victory.

For the week, Mitchell shot .391 from the floor (9-of-23), .364 from distance (4-of-11) and knocked down 4-of-5 from the line. After two games, he leads the Aztecs in scoring, steals (4), is second in assists (4) and fourth in rebounds (6).

This is the first Mountain West weekly award of the season, the first for an Aztec this season, and the first of Mitchell's career.

- Ranks No. T-8 in the MW in offensive rebounds (2.0/g).
- Ranks third on the team in rebounds (7) and is one of two players who has more offensive than defensive boards.
- Among active players nationally, has played in 5th most games (20) without a loss.

Senior Forward **Joshua Tomaic**

- In two games as an Aztec, is averaging 7.0 pts in 15.5 minutes per game and has four assists and two steals. In three years at Maryland he averaged 5.7 minutes and 1.3 points per game, totaled eight assists and didn't have a steal.
- Last season at Maryland, Tomaic scored 18 points in 16 games, so far this year he has 14 points in two games.
- Ranks No. T-12 in the MW in steals (1.0/g).

### Junior Forward **Aguek Arop**

Overall: 7.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 33.3 FG%

- Was the only player on the team to have more offensive than defensive rebounds in 2019-20. In a small sample size so far this year the trend continues; he has 6 offensive and 5 defensive boards.
- Leads the Mountain West in offensive rebounds (3.0/g)
- Grabbed a career-high 7 rebounds vs. UC Irvine (11/27) and led the team in the category for the first time.
- In his first 31 appearances he averaged 7.2 rebounds per 40 minutes played, in the last 24 his average is up to 9.2.
- Has started the last two games after coming off the bench in the first 53 of his career.

### Junior Forward **Nathan Mensah**

Overall: 6.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 1.0 assists, 50.0 FG%

- Led the nation in 2019-20 with a .617 field goal percentage among player who appeared in no more than 13 games and were on the court for at least 20 minutes per game.
- In 34 games in his freshman season (2018-19) he had four double digit rebounding games. Last season in 13 games he had three, including a career high 12 boards vs. San Jose State (12-8-19).
- In two games this year, he is shooting .500 from the floor and against UCLA attempted the first three-pointer of his career.
- Played the first 13 games in 2019-20 before an injury ended his season, but in that time he upped his rebounds and points per game from his freshman to sophomore season from 5.5-to-6.8 and 5.6-to-6.9, respectively. In Mountain West games the improvement was even more stark; rebounds went from 5.8-to-9.5 and points from 6.1-to-9.0.

### AZTEC PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- San Diego State has been picked to increase its conference-record number of Mountain West titles to 13 this year by nearly every media outlet. The Aztecs were picked to win the league by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West, *Lindy's Sports*, *Blue Ribbon Yearbook*, ESPN, Joe Lunardi, Myron Medcalf, John Gasaway and Jeff Borzello and Jon Rothstein.
- Senior forward **Matt Mitchell** has been the player most honored when the preseason predictors talk about San Diego State, he has been named first-team preseason All-Mountain West by the media who regularly cover the league, *Lindy's*, *Blue Ribbon* and John Rothstein. CBS Sports included him in the top-101 players (No. 61) and *Lindy's* ranked him at No. 124 in its top-150. In addition, Mitchell has been included on the preseason watch list for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award.
- Senior guard **Terrell Gomez** was selected the Newcomer of the Year by *Blue Ribbon* and *Lindy's* predicted he would be a second-team All-MW selection, No. 131 among its top-150 as well as, among newcomers in the league, the most impactful newcomer, the best shooter, No. 1 signing coup and having the best shot at earning all-conference honors.
- **Jordan Schakel**, a senior guard, was selected a third-team All-MW performer and the best shooter in the Mountain West Conference by *Lindy's*.
- Freshman guard **Lamont Butler** was named the best playmaker/passers coming into the league by *Lindy's*.
- Assistant Coach **Dave Velasquez** was named one of the top-25 assistant coaches ready to lead their own program by *The Athletic*.
- Though not ranked in either the preseason AP or Coaches polls, San Diego State is receiving votes in both and is the only Mountain West program who is currently doing so.
- With the exception of Gonzaga, every team in both the AP and Coaches preseason polls are members of Power-5 conferences. So, *The Athletic* published its rankings of non-Power-5 programs and San Diego State was ranked No. 4 on that list.

### AZTECS PREDICTED TO WIN 13TH MOUNTAIN WEST TITLE

- San Diego State has won a Mountain West-record 12 titles in men's basketball (seven regular season & five tournament), four more than its closest competitor, and nearly every preseason prediction has the Aztecs picking up its 13th crown in 2020-21.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is also the 12th time in the last 16 years the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the preseason poll. The Aztecs have garnered at least one first-place vote in the preseason poll in six of the last seven years.
- In addition to the MW media, *Lindy's*, *Blue Ribbon*, ESPN, ESPN's Joe Lunardi, Myron Medcalf, Jeff Borzello and John Gasaway as well as College Hoops Today's Jon Rothstein have predicted the Aztecs will win the MW.

### TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State spent 14 consecutive week in the AP Top-25 Poll last season, the program's second longest single season consecutive week streak trailing only the 2010-11 squad which spent 19 straight weeks ranked in the top-25.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight polls (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Reaching No. 4 in the 2019-20 season, the Aztecs spent five weeks there establishing program records for consecutive weeks at that ranking and for the most weeks, in a season, at that rank.
- The Aztecs debuted at No. 25 on Dec. 9, 2019 and then went to 20 to 15 to 13 to 7 to 7 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 5 to 5 and finished at No. 6.

### CHASING AZTEC HISTORY

Senior **Jordan Schakel** entered the 2020-21 season on the precipice of Aztec history.

He has the opportunity to become just the second player in program history to amass at least 200 three-point field goals and to shoot over .400 from beyond the arc for his career.

At the start of this season, Schakel has 142 threes (No. 8 on the program's career list), knocked down four in the first two games of the year and now needs 54 more to become the fifth Aztec to make 200 for his career.

Schakel has shot .412 (145-of-352) in his three seasons and the 2020-21 opener, on The Mesa. But in the past two years has made 115-of-269 (.428) threes, including a career-best .436 (71-of-163) last season.

If he achieves the mark, he will join Tony Ross (1987-89) as the only Aztec to reach those combined numbers. Ross ranks No. 2 in made three pointers (270) and No. 1 in three-point field goal percentage at .458.

In the history of the program, SDSU is now a combined 18-23 against UCLA and UC Irvine.
- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 110-33 (.769) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but three of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 81 home games against the those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 71-11 (.866).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 444-323 (.579) overall, and SDSU has a winning record against 19 of those 24 programs.

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 157-21 home record, winning 88.2 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2020-21 season underway here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 184 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 162-22 mark, including a 78-9 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 115-17 at home, including a 53-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (43-6 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 49-9 in their last 58 non-conference home games.

## MORE HOME COOKING

- San Diego State is 23-2 in its last 25 home games dating back to Jan. 1, 2019.
- San Diego State ended the 2019-20 season 14-1 at home, with an average scoring margin of +16.0. Of the 15 home games, 12 were decided by at least nine points.
- Last season's 13-game home court win streak, snapped on Feb. 22, 2020, was tied for the eighth-longest in school history and longest since the school-record 29-game win streak from Nov. 20, 2013 and ended Feb. 28, 2015.
- The Aztecs are 22-2 in its 24 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

## SERIES HISTORY VS. ST. KATHERINE

- Wednesday's game will be the second time the Aztecs and Firebirds have met.
- San Diego State took the first meeting 118-35 on Dec. 27, 2013.
- Brian Dutcher has never faced St. Katherine as a head coach but was on the bench as an assistant coach in the first match-up.

## LAST TIME VS. ST. KATHERINE

**SAN DIEGO (AP)** - This game was an enormous mismatch when it was scheduled, tiny St. Katherine College in its inaugural season of basketball against San Diego State, which has played in the last four NCAA tournaments.

When it started, 6-foot-10 Skylar Spencer controlled the opening tip against 6-7 Jonathan Wood, the Firebirds' tallest starter, and the blowout was on.

Sophomore forward Winston Shepard scored a career-high 21 points and Wayne Polee had 19 points and 12 rebounds as No. 20 San Diego State overwhelmed St. Katherine College 118-35 on Friday night for its ninth straight win.

SDSU (10-1) finished a three-game stretch against out-manned teams. The competition gets considerably tougher when coach Steve Fisher's Aztecs open Mountain West Conference play at Colorado State on Wednesday and then visit No. 16 Kansas on Jan. 5.

The 83-point win was San Diego State's largest victory margin since moving to Division I in 1970-71. The previous largest

was 60 points, 128-68 over Morgan State on Dec. 1, 1984. The Aztecs became the first Division I team since Oregon State in 2000 to hold three straight opponents under 40 points.

It was the second-largest margin in the country this season. Utah - which hosts St. Katherine on Saturday afternoon - beat Evergreen State 128-44 on Nov. 8. It was the fifth-largest since the beginning of the 2009-10 season.

Polee said the Aztecs didn't feel sorry for St. Katherine College, located in northern San Diego County, as the lead reached 60, 70 and finally 80 points.

Matt Shrigley hit a 3-pointer off the opening tip and SDSU raced to leads of 13-1, 27-3 and 43-10.

The Firebirds made only 15 of 68 shots (22.1 percent) and were only 3 of 38 (7.9 percent) from behind the 3-point line.

St. Katherine College, a tiny orthodox Christian school, is playing its inaugural season of hoops. In their only other games against Division I teams, the Firebirds lost 107-36 at Weber State and 88-39 to Utah Valley.

Joshua White led the Firebirds (2-12) with nine points.

The Firebirds at least hit the rim on their first six shots, with their first air ball coming on their seventh shot, by White. St. Katherine's first point, a free throw by Alex Perez, pulled the Firebirds to 13-1. Their first field goal, a left-handed shot by Dante Miller, made it 20-3 with 12:30 to go in the first half.

The Aztecs led 63-17 at halftime. They played without Josh Davis, who had wisdom teeth pulled earlier in the week.

SDSU made it 100-31 on a 3-pointer by Aqeel Quinn with 6:09 to go.

Quinn scored 14 points, Shrigley 12 and Xavier Thames and Spencer 10 apiece for SDSU.

**SAN DIEGO** — Keshad Johnson came off the bench and tallied 14 points to carry San Diego State to a 77-58 win over UC Irvine on Friday.

Johnson scored 13 of his career-high 14 points in the second half on three 3-pters, also a career-best, a pair of free throws and a thunderous dunk. In addition to his point output the native of Oakland, Calif., had four rebounds and a steal.

After defeating No. 22/21 UCLA, 73-58, two nights earlier, the Aztecs took a little time to get going against the Anteaters.

UC Irvine led by as many as three points four times in the first 17 minutes and San Diego State didn't get more than a one-point advantage until a Trey Pulliam three with 3:37 to play in the half. The hoop sparked a 11-0 run and sent the teams to the intermission with SDSU up 34-25.

Matt Mitchell scored seven of his 11 points in the game, in the first 20 minutes for San Diego State (2-0). Pulliam also finished the half with seven points. Aqueel Arop added seven rebounds.

Returning to the floor after the break, the Aztecs pushed the lead to double digits in the first two minutes of the second half and never looked back. Within seven minutes the lead was up to 25 and the game was completed with SDSU ahead by 19 points.

The third stingiest defense in the nation last season, allowing just 59.5 points per game, has picked up right where it left off giving up 58 points in each of its first two games.

Jordan Schakel scored only three points despite coming into the contest as the Aztecs' second leading scorer at 15.0 points per game.

Brad Greene had 11 points and three assists for the Anteaters (0-2). Dawson Baker added 10 points. Collin Welp had 10 points.

## TIP-INS

- San Diego State opens 2-0 for the third consecutive season. The Aztecs have outscored their first two opponents – No. 22 UCLA and UC Irvine – by a combined 34 points.
- San Diego State forced 25 turnovers against UC Irvine and has forced 40 through two games. The Aztecs are 54-7 in the Dutcher era when forcing more turnovers than it commits.
- The 25 turnovers forced by SDSU is its most since forcing 25 turnovers on Nov. 28, 2017 at Loyola Marymount.
- Sophomore Keshad Johnson scored a career-high 14 points (entered the game with 36 career points) on the strength of three three-points (entered the game with four career three-point field goals).
- San Diego State connected on 13 treys. It marked the sixth time since the beginning of last season that the Aztecs have made at least 13 three-point field goals. Nine different players contributed to the total of 13.
- Brian Dutcher posts his 75th career win just two games into his fourth season (career record: 75-26).
- Eleven San Diego State players scored and 12 saw action in the game.

## FLYNN TAKEN BY RAPTORS AT NO. 29 IN NBA DRAFT

- Former San Diego State guard Malachi Flynn, was selected by the Toronto Raptors in the first round (29th selection) of the 2020 NBA Draft.
- Flynn is the second Aztec selected in the first round (Kawhi Leonard, San Antonio Spurs, 2011) since Head Coach Brian Dutcher came to San Diego State prior to the 1999-2000 season, and he is the third Aztecs overall to be selected in the first round (Michael Cage, Los Angeles Clippers, 1984).
- During his single season on The Mesa, Flynn led SDSU in points (564), points per game (17.6), field goals (184), field goal attempts (417), three-point field goals (76), three-point field goal attempts (204), free throws (120), free throw attempts (140), assists (163), assists per game (5.1) and steals (56), steals per game (1.8), assist-to-turnover ratio (2.86:1), minutes (1,072) and minutes per game (33.5). In addition, he was third on the team in rebounds (143) and rebounds per game (4.5).

- Following the 2019-20 campaign, Flynn became the most decorated Aztec in a single season. He was named a consensus second-team All-American after being recognized by The Associated Press, National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), United States Basketball Writers of America (USBWA) and The Sporting News. With that honor, he joined SDSU Hall of Famers Michael Cage and Kawhi Leonard as the third consensus All-American in program history. In addition, he garnered second-team All-American honors from CBS Sports, NBC Sports and The Athletic and first-team distinction from Sports Illustrated and STADIUM. He was the Most Valuable Player of both the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational and Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, an NABC first-team All-District 17 and USBWA All-District IX performer.
- Flynn was second Aztec to be named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team as well as a finalist for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year, Naismith National Player of the Year, and Lute Olson National Player of the Year Awards. He was a first-team All-Mountain West performer in both the coaches and media polls. He earned the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, inclusion on the Mountain West All-Defensive Team in the coaches poll, and inclusion on the Mountain West All-Tournament Team. In the media poll he was Mountain West Newcomer of the Year in addition to twice garnering Mountain West Player of the Week honors and he capped his junior year being named the Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year.

## 2019-20 CHAMPIONS

- San Diego State won the 2019-20 Mountain West Conference regular-season title by a record five games (the previous record was three games). The Aztecs five-game margin was the largest by any team in any conference last season.
- San Diego State clinched the outright regular-season title on Feb. 11, 2020. The Aztecs were the first team in the nation to clinch its regular-season title last season and became the first team in the nation to clinch its outright regular-season title with four games remaining since Steph Curry's Davidson team in 2007-08.
- San Diego State became the fourth team this century to clinch a regular season outright championship with four games to play.

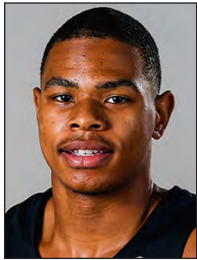

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Fourth Season • 22nd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fourth season as San Diego State head coach after three years in which he led the Aztecs to three Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th and 12th Mountain West crowns and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. He is the only coach in the 99-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first three seasons at the helm of the program, and over the summer signed a contract extension which will keep him on The Mesa through the 2025-26 season.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title, and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an

at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.

# GAME 1

## San Diego State 73 No. 22/21 UCLA 58

Nov. 25, 2020 | San Diego, Calif.

**SAN DIEGO (AP)** — Mick Cronin might not be so eager to bring UCLA back to San Diego State anytime soon after his short-handed Bruins were given a rude welcome by the deep, disruptive Aztecs coached by old friend Brian Dutcher.

Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel scored 15 points apiece and SDSU used a suffocating defense and 3-point shots to humble 22nd-ranked UCLA 73-58 on Wednesday night in the season opener for both teams.

Mitchell and Schakel hit 3s early in the second half to open a 40-28 lead and the Aztecs dominated the rest of the way at empty Viejas Arena. Aguek Arop and Terrell Gomez scored 10 points each for San Diego State, which was 30-2 last season and expecting its highest seed ever in the NCAA Tournament before it was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

UCLA, which played on SDSU's home court for the first time since December 1991, was without key players Jalen Hill and transfer Johnny Juzang. Chris Smith, the Bruins' only senior, committed his fourth foul midway through the second half and came out — and then fouled out with 4:47 to go. He scored 10 points, none after halftime.

Jaime Jacquez Jr. had 17 points for UCLA, and Cody Riley added 14 points and 12 rebounds. The game was part of a multi-team event that also includes Pepperdine and UC Irvine. UCLA and SDSU had been scheduled to play in a bubble in Orlando, but it fell apart. Longtime pals Dutcher and Cronin quickly put together this event.

Mitchell and Schakel each hit three 3-pointers, and the Aztecs, picked to repeat as Mountain West Conference regular-season champions, went 9 of 23 from behind the arc.

The Bruins, who went 19-12 last year and were picked to win the Pac-12 this season, played well for the first eight minutes before SDSU's defense began to take its toll.

Mitchell hit a jumper to start an 8-0 run midway through the first half that gave the Aztecs a 23-19 lead. Joshua Tomiac made a jumper and fellow senior transfer Gomez hit two free throws before Nathan Mensah sank a baseline jumper.

UCLA ended a six-minute drought when Smith made a one-handed jumper.

Jacquez made a layup to pull the Bruins to 30-28 and was fouled, but missed the free throw. Arop hit a layup and two free throws in the final minute for a 34-28 halftime lead.

### QUOTEABLE

"I just think we have great depth," Dutcher said. "We used a lot of guys, 10 guys, and we don't drop off much. This might be as deep a team as we've ever had. UCLA was short-handed. They were missing two players, potentially two starters, so I just think we wore them down. We picked them up full court the entire game and I think we just wore them down to the point where maybe they were on tired legs by the end of the game."

### CROWD NOISE

Asked if his players were bothered by the faux crowd noise at usually raucous Viejas Arena, Cronin said: "The problem wasn't the crowd noise. The problem was San Diego State, their toughness, their execution."

### BIG PICTURE

**UCLA:** Hill, a 6-10 swingman, has right knee tendinitis and is day-to-day. Juzang, a transfer from Kentucky, has a stress reaction in his right foot and isn't expected to play this week.

**San Diego State:** The Aztecs used their trademark tough defense during the first half to force UCLA into 10 turnovers and a scoring drought that allowed SDSU to take the lead.



# GAME 2

## San Diego State 77 UC Irvine 58

**SAN DIEGO** — Keshad Johnson came off the bench to tally 14 points to carry San Diego State to a 77-58 win over UC Irvine on Friday.

Johnson scored 13 of his career-high 14 points in the second half on three 3-pters, also a career-best, a pair of free throws and a thunderous dunk. In addition to his point output the native of Oakland, Calif., had four rebounds and a steal.

After defeating No. 22/21 UCLA 73-58 two nights earlier, the Aztecs took a little time to get going against the Anteaters.

UC Irvine led by as many as three points four times in the first 17 minutes and San Diego State didn't get more than a one-point advantage until a Trey Pulliam three with 2:55 to play in the half. The hoop sparked a 9-0 run and sent the teams to the intermission with SDSU up 34-25.

Matt Mitchell scored seven of his 11 points in the game, in the first 20 minutes for San Diego State (2-0). Pulliam also finished the half with seven points. Aguek Arop added seven rebounds.

Returning to the floor after the break, the Aztecs pushed the lead to double digits in the first two minutes of the second half and never looked back. Within seven minutes the lead was up to 25 and the game was completed with SDSU ahead by 19 points.

The third stingiest defense last season, allowing just 59.5 points per game, has picked up right where it left off giving up 58 points in each of its first two games.

Jordan Schakel scored only 3 points despite coming into the contest as the Aztecs' second leading scorer at 15.0 points per game. He shot 20% from behind the arc (1 of 5).

Brad Greene had 11 points and three assists for the Anteaters (0-2). Dawson Baker added 10 points. Collin Welp had 10 points.
