OFF THE TOP (through games of Mon., Dec. 14)

- After climbing from No. 24 to No. 18 in the AP Top 25 Poll this week (the largest upward move in the poll), San Diego State returns home for a Friday matinee against long-time foe Brigham Young.
- San Diego State win streaks on the line Friday: 17-game win streak in non-conference regular-season (longest in the nation), 11-game non-conference homecourt win streak, eight-game win streak in games played in December, five-game homecourt win streak, five-game win streak overall and a four-game win streak against teams from the West Coast Conference.
- San Diego State is 5-0 this season, with victories over the teams picked to finish first (No. 22 UCLA by 15 points) and second (at No. 23 Arizona State by 12 points) in the Pac-12, a win over two-time defending Big West Conference champion (UC Irvine by 19 points) and a Pepperdine team that already owns a win over California.
- Of the 351 Division I teams, 319 have played at least one game. Of those, 58 have yet to lose a game. Last season, the Aztecs were the last team in the nation to suffer a loss, winning the first 26 games of the season before finally putting a one in the loss column on Feb. 22.
- San Diego State owns a 35-2 record since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is tops in the country (Gonzaga is second at 34-2).
- Through Monday's games, the Aztecs were ranked 4th in Strength of Record, 13th in Sagarin Ratings and 22nd in RPI.
- San Diego State is one of five teams in the nation to have two wins over AP Top 25 teams this season (the others: Kansas, Marquette, Missouri, Villanova).
- The Aztecs have outscored their opponents this season, 378-285, for a scoring margin of +18.6. That is tied for 42nd nationally but is tied for 18th among teams that have played at least five games despite SDSU's challenging early season schedule.
- SDSU's turnover margin of +6.0 is tied for 10th nationally among teams that have played at least five times and 25th nationally overall.
- San Diego State is again one of the elite defensive teams in the nation. The Aztecs are holding the opposition to 57.0 points per game (20th nationally), 37.5 percent field goal shooting and are forcing 17.2 turnovers per game. Kenpom has SDSU's defensive efficiency as the 19th best in the country.
- San Diego State has held three of its opponents this season to less than 40 percent field goal shooting. The Aztecs are 51-3 under Brian Dutcher with 29 consecutive wins holding the opponents at or below that shooting percentage.
- Last time out, San Diego State recorded its second victory over an AP Top 25 team this season, dominating 24th-ranked Arizona State, 80-68, in Tempe. The Aztecs led by as many as 20 points in the second half before settling for the 12-point win. SDSU held Arizona State to just seven two-point field goals in the game and had a 36-8 advantage in points in the paint.
- Senior guard **Jordan Schakel** earned Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors and was tabbed as the National Player of the Week by the NCAA's Andy Katz after scoring a career-high 25 points in San Diego State's victory at No. 23 Arizona State. The sharp-shooter connected on 9-of-15 field goal attempts, including 5-of-9 from bonus distance in the Aztec win.
- Junior forward **Nathan Mensah** had his best outing of the season, recorded his fourth career double-double with career-highs in points

- SDSU has advanced to postseason play in 12 of the last 14 seasons in which a champions was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 34 of last 35 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won 38 straight when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 11th nationally in winning percentage (.754) since the beginning of the 2010-11 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 12.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 11 appearances in its conference championship game are the second most in Division I.
- SDSU's 17 MW wins in 2019-20 are the most in MW history.

(17) and rebounds (15). He joins former Aztec Yanni Wetzell as the only Aztecs to produce a 15-15 game in the last 18 seasons.

REWIND, THE 2019-20 SEASON

- San Diego State is coming off a magical season that saw the Aztecs win their first 26 games of the season en route to a 30-2 record, a Mountain West Conference regular season title (record 12th league crown) and a climb to No. 4 in the Associated Press poll for five weeks before ending the campaign at No. 6. SDSU was the only team in the nation not to lose a road game in 2019-20, finishing the year 11-0 away from Viejas Arena.
- The USA Today National Coach of the Year last year, **Brian Dutcher** begins his fourth season at the helm of the San Diego State men's basketball program. He has an overall record of 77-26 in three-plus seasons and has led SDSU to the conference championship game in each of his three seasons. In 2018, he was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament and in 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat. In addition, Dutcher is the first Aztecs' men's basketball coach to win 20+ games in each of his first three seasons.
- Dutcher welcomes back three returning starters in seniors forward **Matt Mitchell** (12.2 pts., 4.8 rebs., 1.7 ast. in 2019-20) and guard **Jordan Schakel** (10.0 pts., 3.4 rebs, 43.6 percent three-point shooting) and junior forward **Nathan Mensah** (6.9 pts., 6.8 rebs., 1.6 blks.). Mitchell and Schakel played in all 32 games (Mitchell started the final 19 and Schakel started 31) with Mensah appearing 13 times, all starts, before in injury prematurely ended his season.
- The Aztecs are picked to finish in first place in the preseason poll of the Mountain West media. SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is also the 12th time in the last 16 seasons San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 12 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 16 years.

SCHAKEL NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

San Diego State men's basketball player Jordan Schakel has been named the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending on Dec. 13.

Schakel scored 25 points, grabbed six rebounds and had two steals in the Aztecs' lone game of the week, an 80-68 victory over No. 23/23 Arizona State at Desert Financial Arena in Tempe, Ariz. With the victory San Diego State improves its record to 5-0 this year and 35-2 since the start of the 2019-20 season.

The Torrance, Calif., native was 9-of-15 from the floor (.600), including 5-of-9 from beyond the three-point line (.556) and knocked down both his free throw attempts.

His 25 points were a game and career-high for the 6-6 guard, and his five threes equaled his career best.

Schakel drew an offensive foul on preseason All-American guard Remy Martin in then games second possession, and then started his offensive barrage.

In just over two minutes, from 18:08-to-15:57 in the first half, he grabbed an offensive rebound and turned it into his first three pointer and then did it again 30 seconds later for his second trey. He had a steal and knocked down a pair of free throws to stake the Aztecs to an early 12-2 lead. Arizona State battled back to take a 32-31 lead, but with 1:22 to go before halftime, Schakel grabbed a defensive board, went coast-to-coast, and scored on a layup to put the Aztecs back in front, a lead which it took into the intermission.

Coming out of the locker room, the teams played a back and forth game for the first five minutes of the second half. At the 15 minute mark, the Sun Devils led 43-42, but then Schakel erupted.

In the next 3:40 he knocked down three treys and a jumper in the point to help turn a one-point deficit into a 12-point lead, 57-45 with 11:20 to go. From the there, Arizona State was never able to cut the Aztecs lead to single digits. Schakel scored two more buckets down the stretch, including the team final two points, in the 12 point victory.

This is the first Mountain West weekly award of Schakel's career and the second for an Aztec, in the three weeks of the season.

TRENDING UP

Running its record to 5-0, following an 80-68 victory at No. 23 Arizona State last Thursday, San Diego State's men's basketball team moved up six spots, to No. 18, in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and made its debut in the USA Today Coaches Poll at No. 20. The Aztecs earned 455 points in the AP poll and garnered 209 points in the Coaches poll, and is the only Mountain West school ranked in either poll.

- The Aztecs are 5-0 for the second consecutive season and the third time in 10 seasons.
- SDSU is one of five teams with two victories over AP Top 25 teams (Gonzaga, Kansas, Missouri and Villanova).
- San Diego State's six spot jump in the AP is the largest move inside the poll this week.
- San Diego State appears in the AP Top 25 for the 83rd week since the start of the 2010-11 season and have been nationally ranked in 17 of the last 19 polls.
- San Diego State is ranked No. 18 for the sixth time in school history. SDSU has appeared in every position in the poll between No. 4 and No. 25, except for No. 12.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State begins this week ranked No. 18 and No. 20 in the AP and Coaches polls, respectively.
- The Aztecs were receiving votes in each poll from the outset of the 2020-21 season and first appeared in the AP poll, at No. 24, on Dec. 7, and made its debut in the Coaches poll this week.
- Last Thursday's game was the second time San Diego State has played a ranked Arizona State team. The previous match-up came on Nov. 18, 2008 in Tempe. The No. 15 Sun Devils defeated SDSU 59-52.
- San Diego State joins Gonzaga, Kansas and Villanova as the only teams with two victories this season against AP Top 25 teams.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher has a 7-4 record against top-25 competition, with the two most recent victories coming in the team's 2020-21 season opener, a 73-58 victory over No. 22 UCLA and its 80-68 win at No. 23 Arizona State.
- San Diego State spent 15 consecutive weeks in the AP Top-25 Poll last season, the program's third longest single season consecutive week streak trailing the 2010-11 squad which spent 19 straight weeks and the 2013-14 team which was spent 16 consecutive weeks ranked in the top-25.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight polls (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- Reaching No. 4 in the 2019-20 season, the Aztecs spent five weeks there establishing program records for consecutive weeks at that ranking and for the most weeks, in a season, at that rank.
- The Aztecs debuted at No. 25 on Dec. 9, 2019 and then went to 20 to 15 to 13 to 7 to 7 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 4 to 5 to 5 to 6 and finished at No. 6.
- San Diego State entered the top-25 in both the AP and Coaches polls on Dec. 9, 2019 at No. 25 and No. 24, respectively. It was the first time since Feb. 23, 2015, the team had been ranked in the AP poll.
- In total, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll for 82 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, which is tied for the 19th most appearances in the poll during the last 10 seasons.
- Prior to the 2019-20 season, the last time the Aztecs had been ranked in the Coaches Poll was March 9, 2015.
- Prior to last season, the Aztecs had been ranked in the top-5 of the AP poll four times. In 2019-20 they were ranked in the top-5 10 straight weeks.
- From the start of the 2010-11 season to the week of Dec. 14, 2020, San Diego State's 83 appearances in the AP poll are the most of any school in California and which also ranks as the 21st most nationally. The California program with the second most appearances in that time frame is UCLA with 45 and Saint Mary's 39 are the third most. Other than those three, no other men's basketball team in California has appeared in the AP poll more than 12 times.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING ON

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for 22 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time he experienced 386 victories, 10 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 13 postseason tournaments, including eight NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured two more Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament three times.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 20 games in each of his first three seasons.
- His 73 wins in his first three seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first three campaigns.

His 2019-20 team was arguably one of the best in program history:

- They opened with a 26-game winning streak, a program record and the longest streak in Division I last year, and were the last unbeaten team in the nation for all or part of 39 days.
- Spent 15 weeks ranked reaching No. 4 in both national polls, and remained there for a program-record five weeks, before finishing at No. 6.
- Went 17-1 in Mountain West action, a MW record for league wins, and opened with 15 straight MW victories, also a MW conference record.
- Finished with a 30-2 mark; the third most wins in program history and its two losses are the fewest for an SDSU team in its DI era (since 1970-71).
- The Aztecs were the only team to end the regular season with just one loss (28-1) and were one of three teams (Gonzaga & Dayton) to end the year with two losses.
- San Diego State's two losses came by a combined six points and 23 of its 30 wins came by 10 points or more.
- Following the 2019-20 season, Dutcher was named the *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, the NABC District 17 & USBWA District IX Coach of the Year, the Mountain West Coach of the Year (by votes of both the media and coaches) and was one of four finalist for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

- Is one of four player since the start of the 1996-97 season to have a FT percentage of at least .892 & to have hit 300 threes in his college career.
- Appeared in the 100th game of his college career vs. Pepperdine (12/6) and has started all but three games as a collegian.
- Among MW players is ranked No. 14 in three-point FG (1.80/g) and No. 1-15 in steals (2.0/g).
- One of only two active players to have made 300+three pointers (308 - Jhivvan Jackson , UTSA).

Senior Guard Trey Pulliam

Overall: 6.4 points, 3.2 assists, 2.2 rebounds, 44.8 FG%

- Has started each of the first five games after coming off the bench in all 32 games last season.
- Has an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.6:1 this season up from 2.1:1 last year.
- In his last 10 games has a 3.4:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Is averaging just 1.6 turnover per 40 minutes played this year (six turnovers in 128 minutes of action) and has a career average of 2.0 turnovers per 40 minutes (34 turnovers in 689 minutes).
- Assists per 40 minutes played is up to 5.0 this season from 4.3 last year.
- Ranks No. 4 in the MW (No. 96 nationally) in assist-to-turnover ratio and No. 11 in the MW in assists per game (3.2/g).
- Ranks third on the team in minutes (127:52) and minutes per game (25.6).

Sophomore Forward Keshad Johnson

Overall: 6.5 points, 3.0 rebounds, 1.0 assists, 56.3 FG%

- His 14 points vs. UC Irvine (11/27) are a career-high and 11 of them came in a 1:53 span early in the second half.
- Versus UC Irvine & St. Katherine (12/6), he was 8-of-14 (.571) from the floor, 3-of-7 (.429) from beyond the arc; last year, in 18 games, he was 12-of-34 (.353) and 4-of-18 (.222) from those to areas, respectively.
- Averaged 11.5 pts, 4.5 rebs, 1.0 assists in games against UC Irvine & St. Katherine.
- Five offensive rebounds ranks third on the team and his average per game is up to 3.0 in 2020-21 compared to 1.7 a year ago.
- Among all active players nationally, has played in the 3rd most games (22-0) without a loss.
- In two games (vs. UC Irvine & St. Katherine) averaged 11.5 pts, 4.5 rebs, 1.0 assists.
- Has two block in four appearances in 2020-21 compared to one in 18 games last season.

Senior Forward Joshua Tomaic

Overall: 5.4 points, 3.4 rebounds, 1.4 steals, 63.2 FG%

- A grad transfer from Maryland with one year of eligibility.
- In five games as an Aztec, is averaging 5.4 pts in 14.4 minutes per game and has four assists and seven steals. In three years at Maryland he averaged 5.7 minutes and 1.3 points per game, totaled eight assists and didn't have a steal.
- Last season at Maryland, Tomaic scored 18 points in 16 games, so far this year he has 27 points in five games.
- Among Aztecs who have double-digit shot attempts, his .632 FG percentage leads the team.
- Logged double-digit minutes in the first four games this year; the second longest streak of his career, trailing only a six-game run from Jan. 4-Jan. 22, 2018.

Junior Forward Ageuk Arop

Overall: 6.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 39.1 FG%

- Was the only player on the team to have more offensive than defensive rebounds in 2019-20. In a small sample size so far this year the trend continues; he has 11 offensive and 7 defensive boards.
- Second on the team, fifth in the Mountain West & No. 134 in offensive rebounds and ranks fourth on the squad in total boards (18). In the last 25 games has 37 offensive & 31 defensive rebounds.
- No. 7 in the Mountain West in offensive rebounds (2.75/g)
- Grabbed a career-high 7 rebounds vs. UC Irvine (11/27) and led the team in the category for the first time.
- In his first 31 appearances he averaged 7.2 rebounds per 40 minutes played, in the last 26 his average is up to 9.1.
- Has started the last four games he's dressed, after coming off the bench in the first 53 of his career.
- Missed the St. Katherine game due to injury.
- Pound-for-pound the strongest player on the team who can play from the three to the five.
- 6-7 tall with a 7-1 wingspan.

Junior Forward Nathan Mensah

Overall: 9.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.2 blocks, 52.9 FG%

- Established career-high with 17 points and 15 rebounds at No. 23 Arizona State (12/10).
- Defensive stopper on the back line who can erase mistakes by perimeter defenders.
- In 52 career games, his 67 blocks rank No. 16 on the program's career list.
- Through five games committed two turnover in 105 minutes this year (0.7 turnovers per 40 minutes played) and has a 1.5:1 assist to

turnover ratio.

- Led the nation in 2019-20 with a .617 field goal percentage among player who appeared in no more than 13 games and were on the court for at least 20 minutes per game.
- In 34 games in his freshman season (2018-19) he had four double digit rebounding games. Last season in 13 games he had three, including a then career-high 12 boards vs. San Jose State (12-8-19).
- In five games this year, he is shooting .529 (18-of-34) from the floor and has attempted the first three three-pointers of his career.
- Played the first 13 games in 2019-20 before an injury ended his season, but in that time he upped his rebounds and points per game from his freshman to sophomore season from 5.5-to-6.8 and 5.6-to-6.9, respectively. In Mountain West games the improvement was even more stark; rebounds went from 5.8-to-9.5 and points from 6.1-to-9.0.

Freshman Guard **Keith Dinwiddie Jr.**

Overall: 9.0 points, 0.5 rebounds, 54.5 3FG%

- Scored a season/career best 12 points vs. St. Katherine on 4-of-8 shooting from beyond the arc.
- In a total of 20:30 this season is 6-of 11 (.545) from distance and all his scoring is from three-point range.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 158-21 home record, winning 88.3 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2020-21 season underway here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 186 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 164-22 mark, including a 80-9 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 117-17 at home, including a 55-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (44-6 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 51-9 in their last 60 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- San Diego State is 25-2 in its last 27 home games dating back to Jan. 1, 2019.
- San Diego State ended the 2019-20 season 14-1 at home, with an average scoring margin of +16.0. Of the 15 home games, 12 were decided by at least nine points. In SDSU's first four home games this season, its margin of victory has been 20.3 points.
- Last season's 13-game home court win streak, snapped on Feb. 22, 2020, was tied for the eighth-longest in school history and longest since the school-record 29-game win streak from Nov. 20, 2013 and ended Feb. 28, 2015.
- The Aztecs are 22-2 in its 24 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

AMONG THE MOUNTAIN WEST'S BEST

San Diego State is pacing at an elite level in the Mountain West in games played through Dec.14.

- Among teams in the league that have faced at least two Division I competitors, the Aztecs lead the conference in scoring defense (57.00 ppg), scoring margin (+18.60), field goal percentage defense (.375), and steals (9.40).
- SDSU ranks second in scoring offense (75.6 ppg), field goal percentage (.443), assists (14.0/g), turnover margin (+6.00/g), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), defensive rebound percentage (.777), and rebounding defense (32.80).
- The Aztecs are third in the Mountain West in free throw percentage (.723), three-point field goals (8.60/g), offensive rebounds percentage (.290), offensive rebounds (10.2/g) and rebound margin (+4.60/g).

AZTEC PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- San Diego State has been picked to increase its conference-record number of Mountain West titles to 13 this year by nearly every media outlet. The Aztecs were picked to win the league by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West, *Lindy's Sports*, *Blue Ribbon Yearbook*, ESPN, Joe Lunardi, Myron Medcalf, John Gasaway and Jeff Borzello and Jon Rothstein.
- Senior forward **Matt Mitchell** has been the player most honored when the preseason predictors talk about San Diego State, he has been named first-team preseason All-Mountain West by the media who regularly cover the league, *Lindy's*, *Blue Ribbon* and John Rothstein. CBS Sports included him in the top-101 players (No. 61) and *Lindy's* ranked him at No. 124 in it's top-150. In addition, Mitchell has been included on the preseason watch list for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award.
- Senior guard **Terrell Gomez** was selected the Newcomer of the Year by *Blue Ribbon* and *Lindy's* predicted he would be a second-team All-MW selection, No. 131 among its top-150 as well as, among newcomers in the league, the most impactful newcomer, the best shooter, No. 1 signing coup and having the best shot at earning all-conference honors.
- **Jordan Schakel**, a senior guard, was selected a third-team All-MW performer and the best shooter in the Mountain West Conference by *Lindy's*.
- Freshman guard **Lamont Butler** was named the best playmaker/passers coming into the league by *Lindy's*.
- Assistant Coach **Dave Velasquez** was named one of the top-25 assistant coaches ready to lead their own program by The Athletic.
- Though not ranked in either the preseason AP or Coaches polls, San Diego State is receiving votes in both and is the only Mountain West program who is currently doing so.
- With the exception of Gonzaga, every team in both the AP and Coaches preseason polls are members of Power-5 conferences. So, *The Athletic* published its rankings of non-Power-5 programs and San Diego State was ranked No. 4 on that list.

AZTECS PREDICTED TO WIN 13TH MOUNTAIN WEST TITLE

- San Diego State has won a Mountain West-record 12 titles in men's basketball (seven regular season & five tournament), four more than its closest competitor, and nearly every preseason prediction has the Aztecs picking up its 13th crown in 2020-21.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last seven years. It is

SERIES HISTORY VS. BRIGHAM YOUNG

- San Diego State trails in the all-time series with Brigham Young, 48-25, and will be looking to even up its home record against the Cougars at 18-18 with a win on Friday.
- A win over Brigham Young on Friday would be the team's second in a row against the Cougars on its home floor. Since the series began, on Dec. 19, 1940, SDSU has been able to string together more than two home wins in a row just two times. The first was a three-game streak from Dec. 19, 1940-to-Dec. 23, 1977, which encompassed that first three games of the series and the second was a five-game run from Jan. 12, 2004-to-Feb. 23, 2008.
- The last match-up, on Nov. 19, 2019, resulted in a 76-71 win for the Aztecs in the Marriott Center. I was just the fourth win for SDSU on Brigham Young's home floor.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season the team have split eight games. In its four losses to the Cougars the Aztecs have been out scored by an average 10.5 points per game and have won four games by an average of 9.3 points.
- Friday's game will be the 14th time in the series that one or both teams have been nationally ranked at game time. San Diego State has been ranked in four of the games and has gone 2-2, winning each of the last two matchups in which they have been ranked. Brigham Young has been on 13 occasions when they've taken the floor against SDSU and has an 8-5 record in those games.
- SDSU is looking for its fifth consecutive win in the series, with the previous four victories coming in four different cities (Las Vegas, Nev., Lahaina, Maui, San Diego and Provo, Utah).

- The Aztecs have emerged the victor in its last four games against WCC opponents Brigham Young (12-22-18, 11-9-19), San Diego (11-20-19) & Pepperdine (12-6-20) by an average of 9.0 points per game.
- San Diego State is facing its second WCC teams this season, having defeated Pepperdine, 65-60, on Dec. 6, 2020.
- SDSU has won its last four meetings against WCC opponents by an average of 9.0 points per game.
- Overall San Diego State is 136-155 (H: 89-54, A: 39-95, N: 8-6) vs. current WCC teams.

PROVO, Utah - Jordan Schakel and KJ Feagin each drained a 3-pointer late to help San Diego State get past BYU 76-71 on Saturday.

Schakel hit 5 of 7 from deep and finished with 19 points and Malachi Flynn added 17 points while dishing out five assists for SDSU (2-0) which halted a six-game losing streak in Provo. Feagin finished with 12 points. Nathan Mensah had seven points to go with 11 rebounds.

SDSU was up 36-29 at the break. The Cougars started fast in the second half to go ahead 42-40 after Jake Toolson nailed a 3-pointer with 16:00 remaining. BYU pushed its advantage to 54-46 after a Toolson jumper with 12:48 remaining. The Cougars were still out front 65-60 with 4:18 left before the Aztecs rallied. Schakel and Aguek Arop hit back-to-back treys to tie it at 65-65 before Matt Mitchell made two free throws and Feagin drained his second 3-pointer to take the lead for good.

Toolson had 18 points to lead BYU (1-1) with TJ Haws adding 13 and Alex Barcello chipping in 11.

Big Notes

- San Diego State improves to 4-29 lifetime against Brigham Young in Provo. The five-point victory in Provo is SDSU's largest since a six-point win (77-71) on Jan. 31, 1985.
- Jordan Schakel scored a career-high 19 points. After intermission, he was a perfect 6-for-6 from the floor, 5-for-5 from three-point range and poured in 17 points.
- San Diego State opens 2-0 for the second consecutive season but just the second time in the last five seasons. The Aztecs have not won their first three games of a campaign since the 2014-15 NCAA tournament season.
- This marks the first time the Aztecs have started a season 2-0 with at least one road victory since the 2010-11 team opened the season with road wins at Long Beach State and No. 11/12 Gonzaga en route to a 20-0 start.
- San Diego State has defeated Brigham Young for the fourth straight meeting. This marks SDSU's longest win streak in the 73 all-time meetings against the Cougars.
- San Diego State breaks a six-game losing streak in games played at Brigham Young. Prior to today, the Aztecs last win in Provo came on Jan. 8, 2005 (5,418 days ago today).

TEMPE, Ariz. - San Diego State was so worried about Arizona State's fast break, it sent three players back on defense after every miss, leaving its two big men to work the offensive glass.

Two against five turned out to be pretty good odds for the hard-working Aztecs.

Jordan Schakel scored 25 points, Nathan Mensah had 17 points and 15 rebounds, and No. 24 San Diego State dominated inside to beat No. 23 Arizona State 80-68 Thursday night.

"We sent the center and the power forward to the offensive glass and those guys did a great job on their own," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "It was a real key to the game."

The Sun Devils (3-2) got volume-scoring guard Alonzo Verge Jr. back after he missed two games during to COVID-19 contact tracing but were without forward Marcus Bagley due to a lower left leg injury suffered Saturday against Cal.

San Diego State (5-0) already had a size advantage inside, and Bagley's absence turned it into an even bigger strength.

The Aztecs outscored Arizona State 36-9 in the paint and had 17 second-chance points on 11 offensive rebounds against the smaller Sun Devils. San Diego State pulled away with an 18-2 run in the second half to stretch the nation's longest road winning streak to 13 straight games.

"It was probably our closest to a complete game," said Schakel, who shot 5 of 9 from 3. "We still have a long way to go, but it was nice to put that kind of game together this early in the season."

The Sun Devils were pushed to the perimeter most of the night by the bigger Aztecs and, despite a couple of nice runs, didn't make enough outside shots. Arizona State shot 34% and missed 11 straight shots during a key stretch in the second half.

Verge led the Sun Devils with 25 points.

"Do we really care about how hard we've got to play? Do we know how hard we've got to play to beat a team like that?" Arizona State coach Bobby Hurley said. "There were a lot of examples of that tonight."

The Aztecs were without three players due to contact tracing, though only Keshad Johnson was expected to be part of the rotation.

Bagley's loss was a bigger one for the Sun Devils, leaving them without their top rebounder.

San Diego State took advantage, scoring 12 points off six offensive rebounds midway through the first half. The 6-10 Mensah had his way inside with 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first half to give the Aztecs a 35-33 lead.

Arizona State missed 11 of its first 15 shots before finding a better offensive rhythm and cleaned up the defensive glass better to rally from an early 12-point deficit.

The Sun Devils struggled against San Diego State's defensive pressure early in the second half and began turning the ball over, leading to a series of transition baskets during a 13-0 Aztecs run.

Arizona State had a stretch of eight minutes without a field goal as San Diego State extended the lead to 59-45.

"It was a combination of poor shot selection, careless turnovers, bad transition defense after mistakes," Hurley said. "We were still up two, 43-41, with 15 minutes left with all the things that I witnessed and we found a way to do worse than that, which is scary."

BIG PICTURE

San Diego State won its 17th straight non-conference game behind a big night by Schakel and a dominant performance inside.

Arizona State already lacks size inside and missing Bagley really hurt, particularly when the shots weren't falling in the second half.

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

- San Diego State owns the nation's longest road winning streak (13 games, dates back to the 2018-19 season) and had the longest road/neutral streak (16) in the nation snapped in its final game of the 2019-20 campaign.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State's 74-43 (.632) record in road games is the seventh best in the nation.
- Last season the Aztecs' 16 road/neutral road wins were the most in the nation.
- San Diego State's 11-0 road record last season was the best in the nation and its 11 true road wins were tied for the third most in the nation behind Vermont (12-3) and Stephen F. Austin (12-2).

AZTECS DEBUT AT NO. 24 IN AP POLL

Running its record to 4-0 after victories over No. 22 UCLA and UC Irvine, picked to win the Pac-12 and Big West Conferences in preseason polls, respectively, and a thrilling come from behind win against Pepperdine, San Diego State men's basketball made its 2020-21 debut in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll, coming in at No. 24. The Aztecs garnered 123 points and is the only Mountain West team in this week's poll.

Monday's initial appearances in AP poll, on Dec. 7, is two days earlier than last year's team, which went on to reach No. 4 for a program-record five weeks before finishing the season at No. 6. In addition, this appearance, after the second week of competition, is the earliest week San Diego State has appeared in the poll in a year in which it was not ranked in the preseason. In 2013-14, SDSU made its debut in the poll in the fourth week of competition (No. 24 on Dec. 2, 2013) and last year's team was initially ranked in the sixth week (No. 25 on Dec. 9, 2019).

San Diego State spent 15 weeks in the AP poll last year, the third most in a season for the program, trailing only the 2010-11 team, which was ranked for 19 weeks, and the 2013-14 team, which appeared in the poll for 16 weeks.

San Diego State appears in the poll for the 82nd time since the start of the 2010-11 season, easily outdistancing all other California schools in weeks being ranked in that time frame. UCLA has appeared in the poll for 45 weeks, Saint Mary's 39 weeks, USC 12, and California 11, since the start of the 2010-11 season.

MITCHELL NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward Matt Mitchell was named the Mountain West Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending on Nov. 29. In sweeping both games last week, 73-58 over No. 22 UCLA and 77-58 versus UC Irvine, Mitchell averaged 13.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals to help improve the Aztecs record to 2-0 this year and 32-2 in its last 34 games.

Against UCLA, he was one of the team leaders with 15 points. He knocked down three triples, and added two rebounds, two assists and two steals. It was the 44th time in his career he made multiple three pointers in a game, and the 15th time since the start of last season (33 games at the time). The game was the 100th of Mitchell's Aztec career, and he became the 33rd player in program history to reach the milestone.

Versus UC Irvine, the Riverside, Calif., native, finished with 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals. He scored six points in the first half, with four coming in the final two minutes of the period as the Aztecs pried open a nine-point advantage at halftime en route to a 77-58 victory.

For the week, Mitchell shot .391 from the floor (9-of-23), .364 from distance (4-of-11) and knocked down 4-of-5 from the line. After two games, he leads the Aztecs in scoring, steals (4), is second in assists (4) and fourth in rebounds (6).

MATT MITCHELL...DID YOU KNOW?

With 22 points against New Mexico on Feb. 11, 2020, senior **Matt Mitchell** became the 34th player in Aztec men's basketball to reach the 1,000-point career plateau.

BUT...DID YOU KNOW?

Mitchell enters the 2020-21 season on the precipice of even more rarefied Aztecs territory. He is on the verge of becoming just the third player in the 99-year history of the program to amass 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals in his Aztec career.

Having already surpassed 1,000 points last season and 100 career steals at Arizona State (12/10/20), Mitchell needs 55 rebounds and 18 assists to reach each of the target numbers.

When he does, he will join Trey Kell (2015-18) and Winston Shepard (2013-16) as the only Aztecs to ever post those numbers wearing an SDSU uniform.

ELITE LEADERS

In his first three-plus seasons, head coach Brian Dutcher has led the Aztecs to 78 wins, the most by any SDSU coach in the now 100th season of basketball on The Mesa.

Since the start of the 2017-18 season only three coaches, who were hired that year, have amassed at least 78 victories (through games of Dec. 13):

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- San Diego State has opened the 2020-21 season hosting three Division I in-state foes in UCLA, UC Irvine, and Pepperdine, has defeated each, and is scheduled to play a total of six regular-season games against California Division I schools.
- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 111-33 (.771) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but three of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 82 home games against the those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 72-11 (.866).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 445-323 (.579) overall, and SDSU has a winning record against 19 of those 24 programs.

FLYNN TAKEN BY RAPTORS AT NO. 29 IN NBA DRAFT

- Former San Diego State guard Malachi Flynn, was selected by the Toronto Raptors in the first round (29th selection) of the 2020 NBA Draft.
- Flynn is the second Aztec selected in the first round (Kawhi Leonard, San Antonio Spurs, 2011) since Head Coach Brian Dutcher came to San Diego State prior to the 1999-2000 season, and he is the third Aztecs overall to be selected in the first round (Michael Cage, Los Angeles Clippers, 1984).
- During his single season on The Mesa, Flynn led SDSU in points (564), points per game (17.6), field goals (184), field goal attempts (417), three-point field goals (76), three-point field goal attempts (204), free throws (120), free throw attempts (140), assists (163), assists per game (5.1) and steals (56), steals per game (1.8), assist-to-turnover ratio (2.86:1), minutes (1,072) and minutes per game (33.5). In addition, he was third on the team in rebounds (143) and rebounds per game (4.5).
- Following the 2019-20 campaign, Flynn became the most decorated Aztec in a single season. He was named a consensus second-team All-American after being recognized by The Associated Press, National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), United States Basketball Writers of America (USBWA) and The Sporting News. With that honor, he joined SDSU Hall of Famers Michael Cage and Kawhi Leonard as the third consensus All-American in program history. In addition, he garnered second-team All-American honors from CBS Sports, NBC Sports and The Athletic and first-team distinction from Sports Illustrated and STADIUM. He was the Most Valuable Player of both the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational and Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, an NABC first-team All-District 17 and USBWA All-District IX performer.
- Flynn was second Aztec to be named to the John R. Wooden Award All-American Team as well as a finalist for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year, Naismith National Player of the Year, and Lute Olson National Player of the Year Awards. He was first-team All-Mountain West in both the coaches and media polls. He earned the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, inclusion on the Mountain West All-Defensive Team in the coaches poll, and inclusion on the Mountain West All-Tournament Team. In the media poll he was Mountain West Newcomer of the Year in addition to twice garnering Mountain West Player of the Week honors and he capped his junior year being named the Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year.

MORE ABOUT THE 2019-20 CHAMPIONS

- San Diego State won the 2019-20 Mountain West Conference regular-season title by a record five games (the previous record was three games). The Aztecs five-game margin was the largest by any team in any conference last season.
- San Diego State clinched the outright regular-season title on Feb. 11, 2020. The Aztecs were the first team in the nation to clinch its regular-season title last season and became the first team in the nation to clinch its outright regular-season title with four games remaining since Steph Curry's Davidson team in 2007-08.
- San Diego State became the fourth team this century to clinch a regular season outright championship with four games to play.

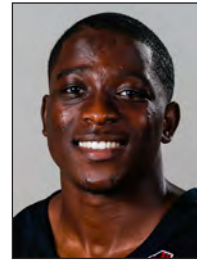

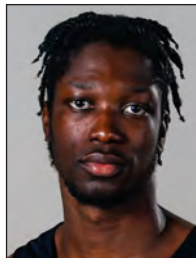

Fourth Season • 22nd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fourth season as San Diego State head coach after three years in which he led the Aztecs to three Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th and 12th Mountain West crowns and back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2015. He is the only coach in the 99-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first three seasons at the helm of the program, and over the summer signed a contract extension which will keep him on The Mesa through the 2025-26 season.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title, and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an

at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.

TEMPE, Ariz. - San Diego State was so worried about Arizona State's fast break, it sent three players back on defense after every miss, leaving its two big men to work the offensive glass. Two against five turned out to be pretty good odds for the hard-working Aztecs.

Jordan Schakel scored 25 points, Nathan Mensah had 17 points and 15 rebounds, and No. 24 San Diego State dominated inside to beat No. 23 Arizona State 80-68 Thursday night.

"We sent the center and the power forward to the offensive glass and those guys did a great job on their own," Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher said. "It was a real key to the game."

The Sun Devils (3-2) got volume-scoring guard Alanzo Verge Jr. back after he missed two games during COVID-19 contact tracing but were without forward Marcus Bagley due to a lower left leg injury suffered Saturday against Cal.

San Diego State (5-0) already had a size advantage inside, and Bagley's absence turned it into an even bigger strength.

The Aztecs outscored Arizona State 36-9 in the paint and had 17 second-chance points on 11 offensive rebounds against the smaller Sun Devils. San Diego State pulled away with an 18-2 run in the second half to stretch the nation's longest road winning streak to 13 straight games.

"It was probably our closest to a complete game," said Schakel, who shot 5 of 9 from 3. "We still have a long way to go, but it was nice to put that kind of game together this early in the season."

The Sun Devils were pushed to the perimeter most of the night by the bigger Aztecs and, despite a couple of nice runs, didn't make enough outside shots. Arizona State shot 34% and missed 11 straight shots during a key stretch in the second half.

Verge led the Sun Devils with 25 points.

"Do we really care about how hard we've got to play? Do we know how hard we've got to play to beat a team like that?" Arizona State coach Bobby Hurley said. "There were a lot of examples of that tonight."

The Aztecs were without three players due to contact tracing, though only Keshad Johnson was expected to be part of the rotation.

Bagley's loss was a bigger one for the Sun Devils, leaving them without their top rebounder. San Diego State took advantage, scoring 12 points off six offensive rebounds midway through the first half. The 6-10 Mensah had his way inside with 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first half to give the Aztecs a 35-33 lead.

Arizona State missed 11 of its first 15 shots before finding a better offensive rhythm and cleaned up the defensive glass better to rally from an early 12-point deficit.

The Sun Devils struggled against San Diego State's defensive pressure early in the second half and began turning the ball over, leading to a series of transition baskets during a 13-0 Aztecs run. Arizona State had a stretch of eight minutes without a field goal as San Diego State extended the lead to 59-45.

"It was a combination of poor shot selection, careless turnovers, bad transition defense after mistakes," Hurley said. "We were still up two, 43-41, with 15 minutes left with all the things that I witnessed and we found a way to do worse than that, which is scary."

BIG PICTURE
San Diego State won its 17th straight nonconference game behind a big night by Schakel and dominant performance inside.

Arizona State already lacks size inside and missing Bagley really hurt, particularly when the shots weren't falling in the second half.

POLL IMPLICATIONS
San Diego State entered the AP Top 25 for the first time this season and could climb considerably. Even with a win over Grand Canyon on Sunday, Arizona State could end up dropping out of the poll after being manhandled by the Aztecs inside.

QUIET REMY
Arizona State point guard Remy Martin didn't take his first shot until the 5:14 mark of the first half — a made 3-pointer — and wasn't much of a factor. The preseason AP All-American finished with nine points on 2-of-8 shooting with five rebounds and three assists.

"He had a little bit of a blank look on him, wasn't having that fire, that energy I'm used to seeing from Remy," Hurley said. "Overall, he's got to play better in these games, games like this where he's had a history of playing well."
